COMMISSION OF INQUIRY BEGINS HEARING NEXT MONTH

THE FIRST PUBLIC HEARING OF THE COMMISSION OF INQUIRY INTO THE LEUNG WING-SANG CASE WILL BEGIN IN COURT NO. 11 OF THE VICTORIA DISTRICT COURT AT 10 A.M. ON MONDAY, MARCH 1.

SINCE THE APPOINTMENT OF THE ONE-MAN COMMISSION, MR. JUSTICE T.L. YANG HAS HAD TWO MEETINGS WITH THE COUNSEL TO THE COMMISSION, MR. H.J. SOMERVILLE, AND MRS. ALICE WONG, SECRETARY TO THE COMMISSION, ON PROCEDURAL MATTERS.

THE COMMISSION WAS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL. THE APPOINTMENT FOLLOWED RECENT RENEWED ALLEGATIONS IN RELATION TO THE CASE IN WHICH LEUNG WAS CONVICTED OF MURDER ON JUNE 9, 1974.

THE COMMISSION'S TERMS OF REFERENCE ARE TO INQUIRE INTO:

- (I) THE CIRCUMSTANCES LEADING UP TO AND SURROUNDING THE ARREST AND CHARGING OF LEUNG WING-SANG, AND
- (II) WHETHER OR NOT THESE CIRCUMSTANCES MIGHT HAVE PREJUDICED LEUNG'S TRIAL.

MR. JUSTICE YANG SAID TODAY THAT PART OF THE INQUIRY MIGHT BE HELD IN CAMERA, AND THAT A NUMBER OF OLD FILES HAD TO BE PERUSED.

IN THE MEANTIME, ANY PERSON WHO FEELS THAT HE CAN GIVE USEFUL INFORMATION ON THE CASE IS INVITED TO DO SO BY WRITING TO THE SECRETARY, COMMISSION OF INQUIRY INTO THE LEUNG WING-SANG CASE, VICTORIA DISTRICT COURT, HONG KONG. THE SECRETARY'S TELEPHONE NUMBER IS 5-249512.

TEACHER - PUPIL RELATIONSHIPS

THE QUALITY OF TEACHER-PUPIL RELATIONSHIPS INFLUENCES PROFOUNDLY THE INTELLECTUAL, EMOTIONAL AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT OF CHILDREN, THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR. KENNETH TOPLEY SAID TONIGHT AT THE SILVER JUBILEE DINNER OF THE GRANTHAM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION.

+ALTHOUGH THERE ARE MANY WAYS OF BEING A GOOD TEACHER, THERE ARE SOME CRITERIA BY WHICH THE GOOD TEACHER CAN BE IDENTIFIED. HE IS A VITAL, BALANCED, WHOLESOME PERSON TO WHOM PARENTS ARE HAPPY TO ENTRUST THEIR CHILDREN,+ MR. TOPLEY SAID.

THE TEACHER MUST BE AWARE OF HIS POWER AND INFLUENCE.

THE DIRECTOR STRESSED THAT THE TEACHER MUST GROW NOT ONLY IN KNOWLEDGE OF THE SUBJECTS TAUGHT, IN KNOWLEDGE OF THE LEARNER AND THE LEARNING PROCESS, BUT ALSO IN UNDERSTANDING OF HIMSELF AND THE NEED FOR THE ENRICHMENT OF HIS OWN CULTURE AND PERSONALITY.

THE TEACHER SHOULD HAVE A STRONG SENSE OF PURPOSE, OF THE WORTHWHILENESS OF HIS WORK, AND OF THE VITAL AND IMPORTANT PLACE HE OCCUPIES IN THE COMMUNITY.

THE GRANTHAM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, WHICH WAS FOUNDED IN 1951, STARTED WITH AN ENROLMENT OF 64 IN TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION AT KING'S COLLEGE.

IT MOVED INTO PERMANENT PREMISES IN GASCOIGNE ROAD, KOWLOON, EARLY IN 1952. THE COLLEGE NOW HAS, AMONG ITS MANY FACILITIES, A LECTURE THEATRE, A GAMES HALL AND AN ANNEXE IN HUNG HOM.

IN THE CURRENT YEAR THE COLLEGE HAS ON ITS ROLL 470 FULL-TIME STUDENTS, IN ADDITION TO 740 TEACHERS ATTENDING IN-SERVICE COURSES.

+FURTHER, AS THE COLLEGE IS FREQUENTLY USED AS A VENUE FOR CONFERENCES AND EXHIBITIONS, IT PLAYS AN IMPORTANT PART IN THE EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL LIFE OF HONG KONG,+ MR. TOPLEY SAID.

• SIR ALEXANDER GRANTHAM, AFTER WHOM THE COLLEGE IS NAMED, SENT A MESSAGE TO MARK THE OCCASION AND CONGRATULATED ALL THOSE WHO, OVER THE YEARS, HAD HELPED TO MAKE THE COLLEGE A COMPLETE SUCCESS.

THE FORMER GOVERNOR, DESCRIBING HIMSELF AS A +GUEST IN ABSENTIA+, SAID THAT THIS SUCCESS BENEFITED THE GRADUATES FIRST, THEN THE CAUSE OF EDUCATION IN GENERAL AND FINALLY THE COMMUNITY AT LARGE.

ANOTHER MESSAGE WHICH WAS READ AT THE DINNER CAME FROM MR. CHEUNG WING-MIN, THE FIRST PRINCIPAL OF THE COLLEGE.

MR. CHEUNG SAID: +IT WAS THE ENDEAVOUR AND EFFICIENCY OF THE PRINCIPALS WHO SUCCEEDED ME TOGETHER WITH ALL THE LECTURERS THAT BUILT UP AND GAINED A REPUTATION FOR THE COLLEGE.

+SO I TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO EXPRESS MY SINCERE CONGRATULATIONS TO THEM ALL. I WOULD ALSO LIKE TO PRAISE THE STUDENTS WHO HAVE STUDIED HARD AND SERVED THE COLONY WELL, FOR IT IS BY THEIR PERFORMANCE THAT THE SUCCESS OF THE COLLEGE IS MEASURED.+

NEW TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS IN KOWLOON

NEW TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE INTRODUCED ON LUNG CHEUNG ROAD NEAR HAMMER HILL ROAD IN KOWLOON ON TUESDAY (FEBRUARY 10).

THE ARRANGEMENTS ARE TO IMPROVE TRAFFIC IN THE AREA DURING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SECTION OF THE METRO BETWEEN DIAMOND HILL AND CHOI HUNG STATIONS.

STARTING FROM 10 O'CLOCK THAT MORNING, THE EXISTING 24-HOUR URBAN CLEARWAY RESTRICTION ON THE WESTBOUND CARRIAGEWAY OF LUNG CHEUNG ROAD WILL BE EXTENDED FROM THE JUNCTION OF LUNG CHEUNG ROAD AND HAMMER HILL ROAD TO A POINT 200 METRES EAST OF THE SAME JUNCTION.

ALL MOTOR VEHICLES, EXCEPT FRANCHISED BUSES, WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO STOP ON THIS SECTION OF LUNG CHEUNG ROAD TO PICK UP OR SET DOWN PASSENGERS OR TO LOAD AND UNLOAD GOODS.

AT THE SAME TIME, RIGHT-TURN MOVEMENTS FROM HAMMER HILL ROAD INTO LUNG CHEUNG ROAD WESTBOUND AND FROM LUNG CHEUNG ROAD INTO HAMMER HILL ROAD NORTHBOUND WILL BE PROHIBITED.

APPROPRIATE SIGNS WILL BE PUT IN THE VICINITY TO GUIDE MOTORISTS.
