FITTING OUT OF WELFARE PREMISES TO BE EXPEDITED
* * * * *

THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT HAS REACHED AN AGREEMENT WITH THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT TO HAVE FITTING-OUT WORKS OF WELFARE PREMISES INCLUDED IN THE MAIN CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT IN FUTURE SO THAT SUCH FITTING OUT COULD BE FINISHED SIMULTANEOUSLY WITH THE COMPLETION OF THE PREMISES, THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MRS ANSON CHAN, SAID TODAY (WEDNESDAY).

+COMPARED WITH THE CURRENT PRACTICE OF HAVING PREMISES FITTED OUT AFTER THEY ARE HANDED OVER BY THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT, THIS WILL MEAN A SAVING OF SIX TO NINE MONTHS,+ SHE SAID.

MRS CHAN WAS OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING OF THE TUNG WAH GROUP OF HOSPITALS FONG WONG WOON TEI HOSTEL FOR THE ELDERLY IN CHEUNG WAH ESTATE, FANLING, ONE OF THE FIRST BATCH OF 25 WELFARE PROJECTS ENTRUSTED TO THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT FOR FITTING OUT.

SHE SAID AT PRESENT FOUR TYPES OF SERVICES WERE INCLUDED IN THIS FITTING-OUT PROGRAMME. THESE WERE NURSERY, CHILDREN AND YOUTH CENTRE, SOCIAL CENTRE FOR THE ELDERLY AND HOSTEL FOR THE ELDERLY.

SHE ADDED THAT THE TWO DEPARTMENTS WERE DISCUSSING FOR CARE AND ATTENTION HOMES IN PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES TO BE INCLUDED IN THIS PROGRAMME.

+IT IS HOPED THAT THROUGH THE CO-OPERATION OF THE TWO DEPARTMENTS, MORE WELFARE FACILITIES CAN BE PROVIDED AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE PUBLIC,+ SHE SAID.

MRS CHAN THANKED THE TUNG WAH GROUP OF HOSPITALS FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTION TO THE WELFARE SERVICES.

SHE NOTED THAT THE NEW HOSTEL WOULD PROVIDE 115 MEAL PLACES AND 34 SELF-CARE PLACES, BRINGING THE TOTAL PROVISION FOR THE ELDERLY POPULATION TO 4917 MEAL PLACES AND 2 148 SELF-CARE PLACES.

LATER IN THE AFTERNOON, MRS CHAN OPENED THE CHEUNG WAH DAY NURSERY RUN BY THE TUNG WAH GROUP OF HOSPITALS IN THE SAME ESTATE.

OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING, SHE SAID THAT THE GOVERNMENT WAS REVIEWING THE POLICY ON PRE-PRIMARY SERVICES IN THE LIGHT OF THE PUBLIC'S VIEWS ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN THE EDUCATION COMMISSION'S REPORT NO 2.

+THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT IS STILL PLANNING TO EXPAND NURSERY SERVICES AND ABOUT 1 500 MORE PLACES WILL BE PROVIDED IN THE COMING FINANCIAL YEAR,+ SHE SAID.

SHE SAID THAT CHEUNG WAH ESTATE HAD A POPULATION OF 23 000 AND THE NEW NURSERY SHOULD MEET THE NEEDS OF YOUNG CHILDREN AND THEIR PARENTS IN THE AREA.

THE TUNG WAH GROUP OF HOSPITALS OPERATES A TOTAL OF TEN DAY NURSERIES WITH OVER 1 000 PLACES.

JAPANESE TOLD TO CONTINUE INVESTING IN HONG KONG

* * * * *

THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF INDUSTRY, MR TONY EASON, TODAY (WEDNESDAY) TOLD JAPANESE BUSINESSMEN IN OSAKA THAT HONG KONG OFFERED AN EXCELLENT OFFSHORE LOCATION FOR JAPANESE MANUFACTURERS.

SPEAKING AT AN INDUSTRIAL INVESTMENT PROMOTION SEMINAR JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT, THE OSAKA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY AND JETRO (JAPAN EXTERNAL TRADE ORGANISATION), HE SAID NOW WAS THE TIME TO INVEST.

MR EASON, IN HIS SPEECH +HONG KONG'S ECONOMY AND THE INDUSTRIAL INVESTMENT ENVIRONMENT+, SAID THAT CIRCUMSTANCES NOW WERE ESPECIALLY FAVOURABLE FOR NEW JAPANESE MANUFACTURING INVESTMENTS.

+WHY ARE WE SEEING, IN 1986 AND 1987, A CONSIDERABLE AMOUNT OF INVESTMENT INTEREST FROM JAPAN?

+THE STRONG YEN AND THE THREAT OF PROTECTIONISM ARE EXERTING PRESSURE ON MANY JAPANESE FIRMS; BUT WHY SHOULD HONG KONG BE CONSIDERED A SUITABLE OFFSHORE LOCATION?+ HE ASKED.

MR EASON NOTED THAT CLEARLY NOT ALL JAPANESE MANUFACTURERS WOULD FIND HONG KONG A SUITABLE OFFSHORE LOCATION SINCE, FOR EXAMPLE, THE TERRITORY LACKED THE EXPANSE OF LAND REQUIRED FOR HEAVY INDUSTRY.

+BUT FOR MOST KINDS OF LIGHT AND MEDIUM INDUSTRY, HONG KONG COMPARES VERY FAVOURABLY WITH OTHER LOCATIONS IN THE REGION, IN TERMS OF MANPOWER TRAINING AND INDUSTRIAL SUPPORT SERVICES.

+ONE INDICATOR OF THIS IS GIVEN BY THE PROJECTS WHICH MY DEPARTMENT HAS ASSISTED OVER THE PAST FOUR YEARS.

+OUT OF 61 MANUFACTURING PROJECTS WHICH HAVE ALREADY SUCCESSFULLY SET UP IN HONG KONG, OR ARE IN THE PROCESS OF BEING SET UP, NO LESS THAN 32 BROUGHT WITH THEM TECHNOLOGY IN THEIR FIELD WHICH WAS HIGHER THAN THE LEVEL EXISTING IN HONG KONG AT THE TIME THEY SET UP. AND 18 OF THESE ALSO INTRODUCED SIGNIFICANT NEW PRODUCTS TO THE ALREADY WIDE RANGE PRODUCED BY HONG KONG INDUSTRY.+

MR EASON SAID HONG KONG OFFERED AN INVESTMENT CLIMATE SECOND TO NONE IN THE REGION WITH ITS EXCELLENT INFRASTRUCTURE FOR MANUFACTURING, A BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT WHICH MUST BE THE BEST IN THE WORLD AND A HARDWORKING, TRAINABLE AND PRAGMATIC WORKFORCE.

POINTING TO THE 800 JAPANESE BUSINESSES THAT HAVE BEEN SET UP IN THE TERRITORY, HE SAID THEIR PRESENCE LENT CREDENCE TO HIS ASSESSMENT. THESE BUSINESSES COVERED EVERY BRANCH OF THE ECONOMY - FROM BANKING AND RETAILING TO CONSTRUCTION AND MANUFACTURING.

ACCORDING TO JAPAN'S MINISTRY OF INTERNATIONAL TRADE AND INDUSTRY (MITI), HONG KONG HAD RECEIVED 15 PER CENT OF ALL JAPANESE INVESTMENTS IN ASIA, MORE THAN IN ANY ASIAN COUNTRY EXCEPT INDONESIA, AND MORE THAN IN ANY EUROPEAN COUNTRY EXCEPT THE UNITED KINGDOM.

+IN FACT ONLY SIX COUNTRIES IN THE WORLD HAVE RECEIVED MORE JAPANESE INVESTMENT THAN HONG KONG,+ HE SAID.

WHILE MUCH OF THIS INVESTMENT IS IN THE FINANCIAL SECTOR, A SURVEY JUST PUBLISHED BY THE INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT SHOWED THAT IN MARCH 1986, JAPAN WAS HONG KONG'S SECOND LARGEST SOURCE OF OVERSEAS MANUFACTURING INVESTMENT WITH ABOUT 20 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL.

BETWEEN SEPTEMBER 1984 AND MARCH 1986 THE AMOUNT INVESTED BY JAPANESE MANUFACTURERS INCREASED BY 35 PER CENT, TO REACH U.S. \$420 MILLION. DURING THE 12 MONTHS SINCE THE SURVEY, SOME SUBSTANTIAL NEW JAPANESE PROJECTS HAD COME ON STREAM, AND THE DEPARTMENT KNEW OF MORE THAN A DOZEN PROJECTS WHERE JAPANESE FIRMS WERE IN THE PROCESS OF SETTING UP HONG KONG FACTORIES AT THE MOMENT.

MR EASON SAID HONG KONG WELCOMED JAPANESE FIRMS COMING IN TO THE MANUFACTURING SECTOR BECAUSE THEY BROUGHT VALUABLE SKILLS AND A CONCEPT OF QUALITY CONSCIOUSNESS TO THE LOCAL INDUSTRY.

+I MAY ADD ONE OTHER ADVANTAGE: AS MORE JAPANESE GOODS ARE PRODUCED IN HONG KONG FOR EXPORT BACK TO JAPAN, THE DOUBTS AMONG JAPANESE CONSUMERS ABOUT THE QUALITY OF HONG KONG-MADE PRODUCTS SHOULD GRADUALLY DIMINISH,+ HE SAID.

MR EASON SAID THAT WHILE HONG KONG WELCOMED ALL INTEREST IN ITS INDUSTRY, IT PARTICULARLY VALUED MANUFACTURING INVESTMENT WHICH INVOLVED NEW PRODUCTION TECHNOLOGY, NEW PRODUCTS, AND MANAGEMENT STYLES DEDICATED TO ENSURING HIGH STANDARDS OF QUALITY.

+BY ATTRACTING SUCH INVESTMENTS WE CAN HELP TO BROADEN THE RANGE OF HONG KONG PRODUCED GOODS, UPGRADE OUR TECHNOLOGY LEVELS, AND STIMULATE OUR LOCAL MANUFACTURERS TO UPGRADE THEIR OWN OPERATIONS,+ HE SAID.

GREATER EMPHASIS ON CIVIL SERVICE MANAGEMENT TRAINING
* * * * *

GREATER ATTENTION HAS BEEN FOCUSED ON MANAGEMENT TRAINING IN THE CIVIL SERVICE IN THE LAST THREE TO FIVE YEARS, THE SECRETARY FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE, MR HARNAM GREWAL, SAID TODAY (WEDNESDAY).

HE WAS SPEAKING TO DIRECTORATE STAFF FROM MORE THAN 50 DEPARTMENTS AT A PREVIEW OF A TRAINING PACKAGE +THE EFFECTIVE MANAGER+, DESIGNED BY THE CIVIL SERVICE TRAINING CENTRE FOR JUNIOR MANAGERS AND SUPERVISORS.

NOTING THAT IT WAS POLICY OBJECTIVE THAT ALL DIRECTORATE STAFF AND OFFICERS ON MPS POINTS 38-47 SHOULD RECEIVE TRAINING IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF MANAGEMENT SKILLS, MR GREWAL SAID IT HAD BEEN A PROBLEM OFFERING SUCH TRAINING FOR OFFICERS ON MPS POINTS 20-37 BECAUSE OF THE LARGE NUMBER OF STAFF INVOLVED AND INADEQUATE TRAINING RESOURCES.

HOWEVER, HE ADDED, THE TRAINING CENTRE HAD DESIGNED AND PRODUCED A TRAINING PACKAGE FOR SUCH A GROUP OF JUNIOR MANAGERS.

+A TEAM OF CSTC TRAINERS IS NOW READY TO HELP YOU SET UP DEPARTMENTAL MANAGEMENT TRAINING PROGRAMMES.

+THE CENTRE WILL HELP ANALYSE TRAINING NEEDS, DRAW UP IMPLEMENTATION PLANS, ADAPT TRAINING MATERIALS, TRAIN TRAINERS AND EVALUATE THE PROGRAMME.+

MR GREWAL CALLED ON HIS AUDIENCE TO FOSTER A CLIMATE CONDUCIVE TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF THEIR JUNIOR MANAGERS, TO ENCOURAGE THEIR TRAINERS TO TAKE UP THE TASK, TO RELEASE STAFF TO ATTEND COURSES AND TO MONITOR MANAGEMENT DEVELOPMENT AS A CONTINUING COMMITMENT.

+I BELIEVE THERE IS A LOT OF TALENT AND POTENTIAL IN THE JUNIOR RANKS, AND THAT WE CAN AND SHOULD MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO TRAIN AND DEVELOP THEM. WE NEED TO INCULCATE THE RIGHT ATTITUDES AND VALUES TOWARDS PROVIDING SERVICE, AND MANAGING STAFF AS WELL AS OTHER RESOURCES.

+WE NEED TO IMPRESS UPON THEM WHAT 'GOOD MANAGEMENT' IS, AND GIVE THEM THE CONCEPTS AND SKILLS TO MANAGE EFFECTIVELY.+

\$300 000 BOOST FOR SIR EDWARD YOUDE FUND

THE SECRETARY FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, MR DONALD LIAO, TODAY (WEDNESDAY) RECEIVED A CHEQUE FOR \$300 000 FROM SHAM SHUI PO DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER MR TAI TUNG-NGOK AS DONATION TO THE SIR EDWARD YOUDE FUND.

IN ACCEPTING THE DONATION, MR LIAO SAID IT SIGNIFIED THE ENTHUSIASTIC SUPPORT TO THE FUND FROM DISTRICT AND GRASSROOT LEVELS.

HE NOTED THAT SINCE THE FUND WAS SET UP LAST DECEMBER, RESPONSE FROM DISTRICT BOARDS AND DISTRICT ORGANISATIONS HAD BEEN ENCOURAGING.

UP TO YESTERDAY, A TOTAL OF \$11 812 441 HAVE BEEN RECEIVED BY DISTRICT OFFICES THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY. AT THE SAME TIME, STUDENTS AND TEACHERS OF ABOUT 300 SCHOOLS HAVE DONATED \$976 859 TO THE FUND.

AN ILLEGAL STRUCTURE ON THE CANOPY OF THE FIRST FLOOR OF 479 NATHAN ROAD, KOWLOON, IS TO BE REMOVED.

THE BUILDING AUTHORITY IS TO APPLY TO THE DISTRICT COURT ON MAY 12 FOR A CLOSURE ORDER IN RESPECT OF THE STRUCTURE.

IT PLACED NOTICES OF ITS INTENTION ON CONSPICUOUS PARTS OF THE STRUCTURE TODAY (WEDNESDAY).

AN ORDER TO DEMOLISH THE STRUCTURE WAS ISSUED UNDER THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE A YEAR AGO, BUT NO ACTION HAD BEEN TAKEN.

THE BUILDING AUTHORITY WILL NOW GET COURT BACKING TO CLOSE THE STRUCTURE BEFORE DEMOLITION WHICH CAN THEN BE CARRIED OUT WITHOUT DANGER TO OCCUPANTS OR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC.
