FARMERS WARNED OF DANGEROUS INSECTICIDE

* * * * *

THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT TODAY CALLED ON FARMERS WHO ARE IN POSSESSION OF A DANGEROUS INSECTICIDE WHICH CARRIES THE CHINESE NAME +LUNG BO+ (FARMER'S TREASURE) AND A SQUARE-IN-A-CIRCLE TRADE MARK, TO SURRENDER IT IMMEDIATELY.

HOWEVER, WHILE THE INSECTICIDE CAN BE DANGEROUS TO THOSE WHO COME INTO DIRECT CONTACT WITH IT, THERE IS NO NEED FOR THE PUBLIC TO BE WORRIED.

THE INSECTICIDE DEGRADES VERY RAPIDLY AND ANY CROPS THAT MAY HAVE BEEN SPRAYED UNDERGO A THOROUGH WASHING PROCESS WHICH, ACCORDING TO AFD EXPERTS, REDUCES ANY POTENTIAL RISK FACTOR TO ONE OF +EXTREME REMOTENESS+.

THE INSECTICIDE IS PACKED IN 250-MILLILITRE ALUMINIUM BOTTLES.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID THE BOTTLES CONTAIN PARATHION-METHYL, A DEADLY POISON, INSTEAD OF +ELSAN+ AS CLAIMED IN THE LABEL.

THIS TOXIC INSECTICIDE HAS BEEN RESPONSIBLE FOR A NUMBER OF DEATHS WORLDWIDE AND HAS BEEN BANNED IN HONG KONG SINCE 1955.

+IT POSES A PARTICULARLY HIGH RISK TO THE FARMER AND HIS IMMEDIATE FAMILY WHO COME INTO CONTACT WITH THE INSECTICIDE IN THE COURSE OF THEIR WORK AS IT CAN CAUSE SICKNESS, OR DEATH IN SERIOUS CASES, WHEN ABSORBED THROUGH THE SKIN OR THROUGH INHALATION,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THE UNREGISTERED INSECTICIDE CAME TO LIGHT DURING A RECENT INVESTIGATION IN WHICH SOME 200 BOTTLES OF THE INSECTICIDE WERE SEIZED IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

POSSESSION OF AN UNREGISTERED AGRICULTURAL PESTICIDE IS AN OFFENCE UNDER THE AGRICULTURAL PESTICIDE ORDINANCE AND CARRIES A MAXIMUM PENALTY OF A \$50 000 FINE AND ONE YEAR'S IMPRISONMENT.

AS USERS MIGHT HAVE BEEN MISLED BY THE LABELLING ON THE INSECTICIDE, THEY ARE GIVEN TWO WEEKS WITHIN WHICH TO SURRENDER THEIR STOCKS TO THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE SAID THOSE POSSESSING THIS INSECTICIDE SOLELY FOR THEIR OWN USE WILL NOT BE PROSECUTED IF THEY SURRENDER IT BY APRIL 9 (MONDAY).

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD THE INSECTICIDE BE THROWN AWAY OR LEFT LYING AROUND THEIR FARMS OR PREMISES, HE ADDED.

ALL FARMERS ARE ADVISED TO CHECK THEIR SUPPLIES OF PESTICIDES CAREFULLY AND TO SURRENDER THE UNREGISTERED INSECTICIDE, IF ANY, IMMEDIATELY TO THE NEAREST AFD FARM OR LIAISON OFFICE IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

GOOD CAREER OPPORTUNITIES FOR CUSTOMS AND EXCISE STAFF

THE COMMISSIONER OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE, MR DOUGLAS JORDAN, TODAY (SATURDAY) TOLD MEMBERS OF THE SERVICE THAT WITH THE MAJOR RE-ORGANISATION IN THE PAST FEW YEARS, THEY NOW HAD GOOD CAREER OPPORTUNITIES.

HE WAS ADDRESSING A PASSING-OUT PARADE OF 27 INSPECTORS AND 71 CUSTOMS OFFICERS AT THE SERVICE'S TRAINING SCHOOL IN TAI LAM CHUNG BEFORE HIS RETIREMENT IN MAY.

+MEMBERS OF THE CUSTOMS OFFICER GRADE NOW HAVE VERY MUCH MORE OPPORTUNITY TO ADVANCE THROUGH THEIR OWN RANKS UP TO CHIEF CUSTOMS OFFICERS. BUT MORE THAN THIS, THERE ARE MUCH BETTER OPPORTUNITIES FOR THEM TO BECOME MEMBERS OF THE INSPECTORATE,+ HE SAID.

AS AN EXAMPLE, HE POINTED OUT THAT AMONG THE INSPECTORS AT THE PARADE WERE TWO LADIES WHO HAD BEEN FORMER MEMBERS OF THE CUSTOMS OFFICER GRADE.

+FOR THE INSPECTORS LIKEWISE,+ MR JORDAN SAID, +THE PROMOTION PYRAMID HAS SUBSTANTIALLY WIDENED AND PROSPECTS GREATLY INCREASED RIGHT UP TO THE MOST SENIOR LEVELS. IN THE COMING MONTHS WE HOPE TO SEE THE TOP OF THE PYRAMID WIDENED AND EXTENDED EVEN FURTHER BY THE CREATION OF THE THIRD ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER POST.+

BUT HE ADDED THAT PROMOTION WAS ONLY PART OF WHAT MADE FOR JOB SATISFACTION.

+IN THE CAREER YOU HAVE CHOSEN THE SPAN OF YOUR WORK IS VERY WIDE. THIS MAKES FOR VARIETY. IT WILL SUSTAIN YOUR INTEREST AND GIVE YOU GREAT SATISFACTION,+ HE TOLD THE RECRUITS.

SPEAKING ON THE INTERNATIONAL RECOGNITION GIVEN TO THE HONG KONG CUSTOMS AND EXCISE SERVICE, MR JORDAN ASKED THE NEW RECRUITS TO UPHOLD THE SERVICE'S REPUTATION.

+A SUCCESSFUL CUSTOMS SERVICE MUST BE THOROUGHLY PROFESSIONAL FROM TOP TO BOTTOM. OTHERWISE IT BECOMES JUST ANOTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT LOSING ITS UNIQUE IDENTITY AND WITH IT, ITS ABILITY TO MEET THE SPECIAL DEMANDS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AND THE VARIOUS PARTICULAR RESPONSIBILITIES OF A CUSTOMS SERVICE,+ HE SAID.

+THE REPUTATION OF A SERVICE ALSO RESTS ON ITS DISCIPLINE. WE ARE A SERVICE DISCIPLINED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ORDINANCE WHICH AMONG OTHER THINGS GOVERNS OUR BEHAVIOUR.

+BUT THE BEST FORM OF DISCIPLINE IS MAINTAINED BY LOYALTY AND RESPECT FOR THE SERVICE AND FOR ONE ANOTHER AND NOT BY THE LAW ALONE.

+I ASK YOU TO REMEMBER ALL THESE POINTS IN WHAT I REGARD AS THE IMPORTANT CONTRIBUTION YOU MUST MAKE TO THE REPUTATION AND PROFESSIONALISM OF THE SERVICE,+ MR JORDAN SAID.

SCHOOL LABORATORY SAFETY DISCUSSED

* * * *

CHEMISTRY TEACHING IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS HAS UNDERGONE CHANGES IN RECENT YEARS, WITH GREATER EMPHASIS BEING PLACED ON THE EXPERIMENTAL APPROACH WHERE STUDENTS ENGAGE IN MORE PRACTICAL WORK.

THE CHANGES ALSO MEAN THERE IS A GREATER CHANCE OF LABORATORY ACCIDENTS, THE PRINCIPAL INSPECTOR (CHEMISTRY) OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, MR W.M. TANG, SAID THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING.

SPEAKING AT A SEMINAR ON LABORATORY SAFETY FOR CHEMISTRY TEACHERS HELD AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG, MR TANG NOTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN AN ANNUAL AVERAGE OF FOUR REPORTED ACCIDENTS IN SCHOOL LABORATORIES IN THE PAST FEW YEARS.

AGAINST THE TOTAL NUMBER OF ABOUT 500 SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN HONG KONG, THE NUMBER OF ACCIDENTS WAS RELATIVELY SMALL, HE SAID.

BUT MOST OF THESE ACCIDENTS COULD HAVE BEEN PREVENTED BY PRECAUTIONS AND THOUGHTFUL PLANNING IN CONDUCTING EXPERIMENTS, BY MAKING ONESELF BETTER INFORMED OF HAZARDOUS CHEMICALS AND THEIR REACTIONS, AND BY PROPER LABORATORY MANAGEMENT, MR TANG ADDED.

HE POINTED OUT THAT THE PREVENTION OF ACCIDENTS IN THE LABORATORY WAS THE DUTY OF ALL LABORATORY USERS, INCLUDING TEACHERS, TECHNICIANS AND PUPILS.

+EDUCATION IN SAFE PRACTICE IS BY NO MEANS A CLOSE-END SUBJECT. NEW LABORATORY PROCEDURES, NEW DEVICES AND NEW CHEMICALS ALL INVOLVE NEW POTENTIAL HAZARDS. SAFETY TRAINING MUST THEREFORE BE REGARDED AS A CONTINUING PROCESS, EVEN FOR EXPERIENCED WORKERS,+ HE SAID.

TO PROVIDE SCHOOL TEACHERS AND LABORATORY TECHNICIANS WITH UP-TO-DATE INFORMATION ON LABORATORY SAFETY, THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT HAS RECENTLY REVISED THE PAMPHLET +SAFETY IN THE LABORATORY+.

THERE ARE CONSIDERABLE CHANGES AND ADDITIONS IN THE NEW EDITION, WHICH SHOULD BE HELPFUL TO LABORATORY USERS.

THE REVISED PAMHPLET IS NOW BEING PRINTED AND WILL BE AVAILABLE SOON.

THE TAI PO COUNTRY TRAIL, A 25-KILOMETRE SYSTEM OF DISTRICT TRAILS AND FOOTPATHS, HAS PROVED TO BE A FAVOURITE WITH HIKERS.

A MAJOR RECREATIONAL FACILITY FUNDED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD, THE TRAIL RUNS FROM TAI PO KAU AND LAI CHI SHAN TO TAI PO VALLEY, GOING OVER THE HIGH RIDGES OVERLOOKING TAI PO AND DESCENDING TO MA WO AND PUN CHUNG YUEN.

IT ALSO LINKS UP WITH THE MACLEHOSE TRAIL AND THE TAI PO SHAN AND SHING MUN COUNTRY PARKS.

TOMORROW, THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR NEW TERRITORIES, MR IAN MACPHERSON, WILL OFFICIALLY OPEN THE TRAIL AND A PANORAMIC VIEWSCAPE WHICH ILLUSTRATES AND NAMES THE MANY LANDMARKS OF TAI PO AND TOLO HARBOUR.

THE VIEWSCAPE ON AN ENGRAVED METAL PLATE AND SURROUNDING SEATING AT LAI CHI SHAN HILL WERE BUILT WITH A DONATION BY THE LIONS CLUB OF CASTLE PEAK.
