By His Excellency CLAUD SEVERN, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies :

Whereas by a proclamation dated the 11th day of February 1916 a licence was granted by His Excellency the Governor permitting, in certain circumstances, the payment of fees and agents' charges and expenses in respect of patents, trade marks and designs, payable in an enemy country or on behalf of an enemy :

And whereas it has been deemed desirable to amend the terms of the said licence :

Now therefore I, CLAUD SEVERN, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies, acting on behalf of His Majesty and in pursuance of all powers thereunto me enabling, do hereby amend the said licence dated the 11th day of February 1916 as follows, that is to say :—

The said licence shall have effect subject to the following amendments :—

- (a) The words "person" or "persons" respectively wherever they occur in clauses 1 and 2 thereof shall mean a person or persons being of British, Allied or Neutral nationality :
- (b) In clauses 1 (b) and 2 (b) of the said licence there shall be added immediately after the words "the Colony of Hongkong" wherever they occur, the words "or of Allied territory not in hostile occupation" :

The following provisos shall be added, *viz.* :—

Provided always that as regards payments on behalf of an enemy under clause 2 of the said licence as amended hereby the same may be made by the person making the same only out of moneys—


- (a) remitted by or on behalf of such enemy, or
- (b) held for or on account of such enemy,

and subject to the provisions of next paragraph hereof nothing in the said licence or herein shall permit any payments to be made on behalf of an enemy by way of gift or by way of advancement or loan to or on account of such enemy :

Provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent persons of British, Allied or Neutral nationality residing, carrying on business or being in the Colony of Hongkong who have an interest in or under a patent or design belonging in whole or in part to an enemy from paying out of their own moneys fees payable in the Colony of Hongkong for obtaining the renewal of such patent or for obtaining the renewal of the registration of such design, or from paying agents in the Colony of Hongkong (including themselves) their charges and expenses (if any) in relation to such matters.

By His Excellency Sir FRANCIS HENRY MAY Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same :

Whereas by section 189 of the Army Act it is enacted that where the Governor of a Colony in which any of His Majesty's forces are serving declares at any time or times that by reason of the imminence of active service or of the recent existence of active service it is necessary for the public service that the forces in the Colony should be temporarily subject to the said Act as if they were on active service then on the publication in general orders of any such declaration the forces to which the declaration applies shall be deemed to be on active service for the period mentioned in the declaration so that the period mentioned in any one declaration do not exceed three months from the date thereof :

And Whereas by Proclamations made on the 4th day of November 1914, 3rd February, 30th April, 30th July, and 29th October 1915, 2nd February, 2nd May, 28th July, and 27th October 1916, 2nd February, 2nd May, and 2nd August 1917 the said declaration was renewed for a period of three months from time to time :

And Whereas by a Proclamation made on the 2nd day of November 1917 the said declaration was renewed for a period of three months from the 3rd day of November 1917 :

By His Excellency Sir FRANCIS HENRY MAY Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same :

Whereas by section 12 of the Fugitive Offenders Act 1881 it is provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to direct that Part II of the said Act shall apply to the group of British possessions mentioned in the Order and to limit the application of the said part of the said Act by such conditions exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient :

And whereas by Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council made on the 12th day of December 1885 it was ordered that Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act 1881 should apply to the group of possessions therein mentioned that is to say the Straits Settlements Hongkong and Labuan :

And whereas by section 1 of the Fugitive Offenders (Protected States) Act 1915 it was provided that His Majesty by Order in Council might direct that the Fugitive Offenders Act 1881 should apply as if subject to the conditions exceptions and qualifications (if any) contained in the Order any place or group of places over which His Majesty extends his protection named in the Order were a British Possession :

And whereas by the Straits Settlements and Protected States Fugitive Offenders Order in Council 1916 it was ordered that subject to the provisions of that Order the Fugitive Offenders Act 1881 should apply as if the Federated Malay States and the States of Johore Kedah and Perlis Kelantan Brunei and North Borneo were British Possessions :

And whereas by the Straits Settlements and Protected States Fugitive Offenders Order in Council 1917 it was ordered that subject to the provisions of the said Order and to the provisions of the Straits Settlements and Protected States Fugitive Offenders Order in Council 1916 the Fugitive Offenders Act 1881 should apply as if the States of Sarawak and Trengganu were British Possessions :

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council issued on the 2nd day of January 1918 and to come into operation on the 1st day of February 1918 it is provided that on and after the 1st day of February 1918 the hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the 12th day of December 1885 shall be revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder or to any proceedings commenced before the said date and that Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act 1881 shall apply to the group of British Possessions and Protected States hereunder mentioned that is to say British India

Ceylon Hongkong the Straits Settlements the Federated Malay States Johore Kedah and Perlis Kelantan Trengganu Brunei North Borneo and Sarawak and that the Governor General of India and the Governors of Ceylon Hongkong and of the Straits Settlements shall cause the said Order to be proclaimed in the territories and colonies under their respective government :

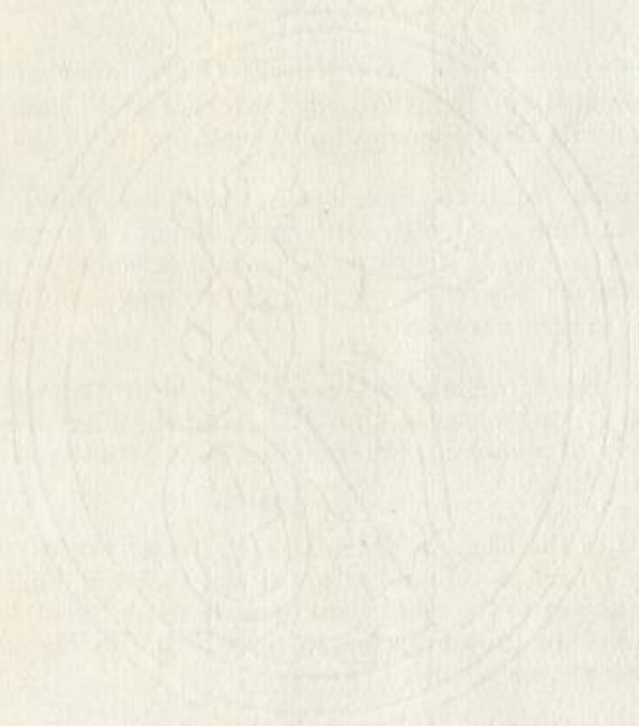

By His Excellency Sir FRANCIS HENRY MAY Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same :

WHEREAS by Section 3 of the Prize Courts Act, 1894, His Majesty in Council is authorized to make Rules of Court for regulating, subject to the provisions of the Naval Prize Act, 1864, and the said Act, the procedure and practice of Prize Courts, within the meaning of the Naval Prize Act, 1864, and the duties and conduct of the Officers of the Courts, and of the Practitioners therein, and for regulating the fees to be taken by the Officers thereof, and the costs, charges, and expenses to be allowed to the Practitioners therein :

And whereas in pursuance of the Prize Courts Act, 1894, certain Rules were made by His Majesty's Order in Council dated the 5th day of August, 1914, and amended by His Majesty's Orders in Council of the 30th day of September, 1914, the 28th day of November, 1914, and the 23rd day of March, 1915, respectively, which said Rules and amended Rules were by the said Orders in Council directed to take effect *provisionally* in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, from the date of the said Orders in Council respectively :

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, were complied with in respect of the said Rules, and amended Rules, and the same were *finally* made by the Orders of His Majesty in Council dated respectively the 17th day of September, 1914, the 28th day of November, 1914, the 3rd day of February, 1915, and the 29th day of April, 1915 :

And whereas by Order XLVI of the said Rules it is provided that so far as the said Rules apply to a Court in a British Possession outside the United Kingdom they shall not come into operation until they are proclaimed in the Possession by the Governor thereof :

And whereas the said Rules and the amendments thereof were duly proclaimed in the Colony of Hongkong by Proclamations dated respectively the 9th day of October, 1914, and the 29th day of January, and the 1st and 21st days of April, 1915 :

And whereas by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 16th day of November, 1917, it was ordered as follows :—

That in Appendix B of the Prize Court Rules, 1914, Item 48, the following words should be omitted, *viz.* :—

“ On retaining possession of a ship with or without cargo, or of a ship's cargo without a ship, to include the cost of a shipkeeper if required, per day, £0 5s. 0d.

“ Any sum above this amount which has necessarily been incurred in the payment of a shipkeeper shall also be recoverable.”

and in lieu thereof the following words should be substituted, viz. :—

“ On retaining possession of a ship with or without cargo, the expenses per day in respect of a shipkeeper ”:

And that the said Order should take effect *provisionally* in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, from the date thereof :

And whereas it is expedient that the said amendment made provisionally by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 16th day of November, 1917, should be brought into operation in this Colony :

NOW THEREFORE I Sir FRANCIS HENRY MAY Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same do hereby proclaim the said amendment of the said Rules in this Colony.

Now therefore I Sir FRANCIS HENRY MAY Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Governor and Commander in Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same do hereby prescribe that the respective maximum prices for which the following articles of food may be sold by retail shall be as follows :—

A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO TRADING WITH THE ENEMY.

WHEREAS it is advisable to amend the Proclamation of the 20th day of July, 1916, called "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, Hongkong, 1916, No. 3":

Now therefore I, SIR FRANCIS HENRY MAY, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same, have thought fit, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of this Colony, to issue this Proclamation declaring, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. As from the date hereof there shall be inserted in Paragraph 5 (a) of the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, Hongkong, 1916, No. 3, next after the words "Marine Insurance" the words "or of Fire Insurance."

2. As from the date hereof there shall be added, next after Paragraph 5 (a) of the said Proclamation, the following paragraph:—

"(aa) Any person or body of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the Colony of Hongkong, from re-insuring for any Company or Firm, who is engaged in any non-enemy Country in the business of Fire Insurance, and is not an Enemy Company or Firm, or the branch of an Enemy Company or Firm, or mentioned in the Statutory List, any fire risk insured by that Company or Firm for any person or body of persons mentioned in the Statutory List, if and so far as the re-insurance of such risk is obligatory under the conditions of any Treaty or Contract of Re-insurance current on the 31st day of December, 1917, or under the conditions of any renewal or revision of a Treaty or Contract of Re-insurance so current, if such renewal or revision has been approved by the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department of the Foreign Office;"

3. As from the date hereof there shall be added, next after Paragraph 5 of the said Proclamation, the following Paragraphs:—

"6. Where by any Proclamation for the time being in force any paragraphs, or words are directed to be added to, or omitted from, this Proclamation, or to be substituted for any other paragraphs or words in this Proclamation, or where by any Proclamation, or Order in Council, for the time being in force any variation in, or addition to, the Statutory List is made, copies of this Proclamation, printed under my authority after such direction takes effect, or after such variation or addition is made, may be printed with the paragraphs or words added, or omitted, or substituted for other paragraphs or words, as such direction requires, or with such variation in, or addition to, the Statutory List; and this Proclamation

shall be construed as if it had, on the date at which such direction takes effect, or variation or addition is made, been issued with such addition, omission, substitution or variation as such direction, variation or addition requires, and with the paragraphs thereof numbered in accordance with such direction."

"7. A reference in any Order in Council, or other document, to this Proclamation, or to the Statutory List shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed to refer to this Proclamation, or to the Statutory List as amended by any Proclamation or Order in Council for the time being in force."

4. As from the date hereof Paragraph 6 of the said Proclamation shall be numbered 8, and the figures and letters "1916, No. 3" omitted therefrom.

5. This Proclamation shall be read as one with the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, Hongkong, 1916, No. 3.

LICENCE.

Licence (covering acts to be done within the Colony of Hongkong) to Insurance Companies engaged in non-Enemy countries in the business of Insurance to fulfil, complete and carry into effect Fire Insurance Contracts made in such countries prior to the fifth day of April, 1918, with, or through the agency of, any person or body of persons mentioned in the Statutory List.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN.

I, Sir FRANCIS HENRY MAY, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same, hereby give and grant unto every person or body of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the Colony of Hongkong, who, being engaged in any non-enemy country in the business of Insurance, did in that country prior to the 5th day of April, 1918, make any contract of Fire Insurance with, or through the agency of, any person or body of persons mentioned in the Statutory List of persons, with whom trading is forbidden by any Proclamation issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Ordinance, 1916, full licence and authority, so far as relates to any acts to be done within the Colony of Hongkong, to have commercial intercourse, and to transact all necessary business with regard to such contract and to all matters arising thereout, with, and to receive and to pay all sums of money payable under such contract from, or to, the person or body of persons with whom such contract has been made, and generally to do all things necessary for fulfilling, completing and carrying into effect such contract, in as full and ample a manner as if permission to carry on the business of fire insurance with, or through the agency of, any person or body of persons mentioned in the Statutory List had not been withdrawn by the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation issued on the 5th day of April, 1918.

By His Excellency Sir FRANCIS HENRY MAY, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same :

Whereas by the Military Stores (Exportation) Ordinance, 1862, it is enacted that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council by Proclamation to prohibit, for such period as should be mentioned in such Proclamation, either to be exported from the Colony of Hongkong, or to be carried coastwise within the said Colony (amongst other things) Arms, Ammunition, Gunpowder, and Military and Naval Stores, and any articles which His Excellency may judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of Military or Naval Stores, or any or either of such Arms, Ammunition, Gunpowder, Stores, Goods or Articles respectively, subject to any permission that may be obtained under Section 3 of the Ordinance :

And whereas, by various Proclamations issued from time to time, such exportation and carriage coastwise were prohibited, and remain prohibited until the 27th day of May, 1918, and it is expedient to continue such prohibition :

Now, therefore, I, Sir FRANCIS HENRY MAY, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of this Colony, do, by this Proclamation, prohibit for a further period of one year from and including the 28th day of May, 1918, either to be exported from the Colony of Hongkong, or to be carried coastwise within the said Colony, Arms, Ammunition, Gunpowder, Military and Naval Stores, Sulphur and Saltpetre, the last two being articles which I judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of Military or Naval Stores, or any or either of such Arms, Ammunition, Gunpowder, Stores, Goods or Articles respectively, unless this Proclamation shall, in the meantime, be revoked, or unless permission shall have been obtained under Section 3 of the Ordinance above mentioned.

Whereas by section 189 of the Army Act it is enacted that where the Governor of a Colony in which any of His Majesty's forces are serving declares at any time or times that by reason of the imminence of active service or of the recent existence of active service it is necessary for the public service that the forces in the Colony should be temporarily subject to the said Act as if they were on active service then on the publication in general orders of any such declaration the forces to which the declaration applies shall be deemed to be on active service for the period mentioned in the declaration so that the period mentioned in any one declaration do not exceed three months from the date thereof :

And Whereas by declaration made on the 5th day of August 1914 it was declared by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* dated the 5th day of August 1914 to be necessary for the public service that His Majesty's forces in the Colony be subject to the said Act for the period of three months from the date thereof as if they were on active service :

FEEs AND AGENTS' CHARGES IN RESPECT OF PATENTS, DESIGNS AND TRADE MARKS.

WHEREAS by a Licence dated the 11th day of February, 1916, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by certain Royal Proclamations relating to Trading with the Enemy, authorised all persons in the Colony of Hongkong, subject to the limitations therein specified, to pay any fees necessary for obtaining the grant, registration or renewal of Patents, Designs or Trade Marks in an enemy country and to pay to enemy agents their charges and expenses in relation to such matters and also to pay on behalf of an enemy fees payable in the Colony or in His Majesty's Dominions on applications for the grant, registration or renewal of Patents, Designs or Trade Marks and to pay the charges and expenses of agents in relation thereto :

And whereas the said Licence was amended by a further Licence issued by me on the 30th day of November, 1917 :

And whereas it appears to me that such payments as aforesaid should no longer be authorised :

Now, therefore, I, CLAUD SEVERN, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony of Hongkong and its Dependencies, hereby revoke the said Licences and give notice that



all such payments as aforesaid are from the date hereof prohibited under the Proclamations relating to Trading with the Enemy.
