FEBRUARY ORDERS-ON-HAND, EMPLOYMENT, PAYROLL FIGURES OUT

IN FEBRUARY 1987 THE AVERAGE VOLUME OF ORDERS-ON-HAND (IN TERMS OF MONTHS) AS REPORTED BY THE 200 LARGEST FIRMS IN THE MANUFACTURING SECTOR INCREASED COMPARED WITH BOTH JANUARY 1987 AND FEBRUARY 1986, ACCORDING TO THE RESULTS OF A SURVEY RELEASED BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT.

COMPARING FEBRUARY 1987 WITH THE SAME MONTH IN 1986, SIGNIFICANT INCREASES IN THE VOLUME OF ORDERS-ON-HAND WERE RECORDED IN THE TEXTILES AND FABRICATED METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES AND, TO A LESSER EXTENT, IN THE WEARING APPAREL INDUSTRY.

COMPARED WITH JANUARY 1987 THE ORDERS POSITION IN THE TEXTILES, PLASTIC PRODUCTS AND ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES IMPROVED, WHILE THAT IN THE WEARING APPAREL INDUSTRY DROPPED SLIGHTLY.

IN GENERAL, THE EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS FIGURES FOR THE MONTHS OF JANUARY AND FEBRUARY 1987 IN THE SECTORS SURVEYED WERE AFFECTED BY THE TIMING OF THE CHINESE NEW YEAR HOLIDAYS. CERTAIN SIGNIFICANT PERCENTAGE CHANGES SHOWN IN THIS RELEASE SHOULD, THEREFORE, BE INTERPRETED WITH CAUTION.

EMPLOYMENT IN THE MANUFACTURING SECTOR IN FEBRUARY 1987 REMAINED AT ABOUT THE SAME LEVEL AS IN JANUARY 1987, BUT DROPPED SLIGHTLY BELOW THE LEVEL IN FEBRUARY 1986.

COMPARED WITH JANUARY 1987 THE INCREASE IN EMPLOYMENT IN THE TEXTILES INDUSTRY WAS OFFSET BY THE DECREASES RECORDED IN THE PLASTIC PRODUCTS AND FABRICATED METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES. COMPARED WITH FEBRUARY 1986 EMPLOYMENT IN THE WEARING APPAREL AND PLASTIC PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES DROPPED SIGNIFICANTLY, WHILE THAT IN ALL OTHER INDUSTRIES SURVEYED ROSE.

ALL MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES SURVEYED RECORDED SUBSTANTIAL DECREASES IN PAYROLL AND IN PER CAPITA EARNINGS IN FEBRUARY 1987 COMPARED WITH JANUARY 1987 DUE TO THE AWARD OF DOUBLE PAY AND YEAR-END BONUSES IN JANUARY 1987.

COMPARED WITH FEBRUARY 1986 MOST INDUSTRIES RECORDED SOME INCREASES IN PAYROLL, EXCEPT FOR THE PLASTIC PRODUCTS AND FABRICATED METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES. PER CAPITA EARNINGS IN THESE TWO INDUSTRIES ALSO DECLINED, ALONG WITH THOSE IN THE TEXTILES INDUSTRY.

IN THE CONSTRUCTION SECTOR, EMPLOYMENT IN FEBRUARY 1987 INCREASED SLIGHTLY COMPARED WITH JANUARY 1987. THE INCREASE WAS MORE SIGNIFICANT WHEN COMPARED WITH FEBRUARY 1986. HOWEVER, PAYROLL AND PER CAPITA EARNINGS DECREASED SUBSTANTIALLY OVER BOTH JANUARY 1987 AND FEBRUARY 1986.

IN THE SERVICES SECTORS, OVERALL EMPLOYMENT IN FEBRUARY 1987 WAS SIMILAR TO THAT IN THE PREVIOUS MONTH, WHILE PAYROLL AND PER CAPITA EARNINGS DECREASED SUBSTANTIALLY. AMONG THE SERVICES SECTORS SURVEYED, A SLIGHT DECREASE IN EMPLOYMENT AND THE MOST SIGNIFICANT DECREASES IN PAYROLL AND IN PER CAPITA EARNINGS WERE RECORDED IN HOTELS. COMPARED WITH FEBRUARY 1986, THE SERVICES SECTORS TAKEN TOGETHER SHOWED A SLIGHT INCREASE IN EMPLOYMENT, AND MODERATE INCREASES IN PAYROLL AND IN PER CAPITA EARNINGS.

THE PERCENTAGE CHANGES IN ORDERS-ON-HAND, EMPLOYMENT AND PER CAPITA EARNINGS ARE SHOWN IN TABLES BELOW.

THE SURVEY COVERED A PANEL OF THE 200 LARGEST MANUFACTURING COMPANIES AND THE 50 LARGEST COMPANIES IN THE CONSTRUCTION AND SELECTED SERVICES SECTORS, CHOSEN BY REFERENCE TO THEIR EMPLOYMENT IN MARCH 1983.

AS THE SAMPLE WAS NOT DRAWN ON A RANDOM BASIS, THE DEPARTMENT CAUTIONED THAT THE MAGNITUDE OF CHANGE INDICATED BY THE SURVEY MIGHT NOT REFLECT THE EXPERIENCE OF THE ECONOMY AS A WHOLE.

NEVERTHELESS, THESE RESULTS ARE EXPECTED TO PROVIDE A USEFUL INDICATION OF THE DIRECTION OF CHANGE FOR A QUICK ASSESSMENT OF DEVELOPMENTS IN THE ECONOMY IN THE SHORT TERM.

ENVIRONMENT WORKING GROUPS FORMED IN MONG KOK
 * * * *

FOUR WORKING GROUPS HAVE BEEN FORMED UNDER THE MONG KOK DISTRICT BOARD ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE TO MONITOR SPECIFIC ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES IN THE DISTRICT.

THESE WORKING GROUPS WILL FOCUS ON THE DISTRICT'S AGEING PROBLEM, TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT, DRAINAGE PROBLEM AND ELECTRICITY SUPPLY TO TUNG CHOI STREET HAWKER PERMITTED PLACE.

THE DETERIORATION OF BUILDINGS IN SOME PARTS OF MONG KOK HAS BEEN A MATTER OF SERIOUS CONCERN AMONG RESIDENTS.

THE WORKING GROUPS FORMED TO DEAL WITH THIS PROBLEM WILL TRY TO ASSESS THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE SITUATION AND TO STUDY THE SOCIAL PROBLEMS RELATED TO URBAN DECAY.

UP TILL NOW, ALL TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT MATTERS ARE DISCUSSED AND CO-ORDINATED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD'S ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE.

THE WORKING GROUP SET UP TO CONSIDER TRANSPORT MATTERS WILL CONDUCT INDEPTH STUDY AND CONSULTATION ON ISSUES OF WIDER SCOPE.

A THIRD WORKING GROUP WAS FORMED FOLLOWING LAST YEAR'S SURVEY ON SEWERAGE PROBLEM WHICH HAD IDENTIFIED A LARGE NUMBER OF FLOODING SPOTS AND LEAKING PIPES IN THE DISTRICT.

IT WILL FOLLOW UP ON THE SURVEY REPORT, IN ORDER TO WORK OUT WAYS TO ALLEVIATE ENVIRONMENTAL AND HYGIENIC NUISANCES CAUSED BY DRAINAGE BLOCKAGE.

ILLEGAL TAPPING OF ELECTRICITY SUPPLY IN TUNG CHOI STREET HAWKER PERMITTED PLACE HAD ALSO CREATED SERIOUS ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS.

CHINA LIGHT AND POWER CO LTD HAD RECENTLY PROPOSED A NEW SCHEME OF PROVIDE INDIVIDUAL METER SUPPLY FOR HAWKER STALLS IN THE SECTION OF TUNG CHOI STREET BETWEEN NELSON STREET AND SHANGTUNG STREET.

THE WORKING GROUP WILL CO-ORDINATE AND MONITOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SCHEME.

MEMBERS OF THE WORKING GROUPS WILL SOON MEET TO DEFINE THEIR TERMS OF REFERENCE AND TO MAP OUT PLANS TO BRING A BETTER ENVIRONMENT AND MORE PLEASANT LIVING CONDITIONS TO THE RESIDENTS.

IN ADDITION, THERE ARE THREE EXISTING WORKING GROUPS UNDER THE ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE TO OVERSEE MATTERS CONCERNING TENDER AWARD, FLOODLIGHT INSTALLATION TO THE DISTRICT BOARD LANDMARK, AND THE NELSON STREET AMENITY PROJECT.

ARTS, CULTURAL ACTIVITIES IN SOUTHERN PROGRAMMED

TWELVE PROJECTS COMPRISING 18 ARTS AND CULTURAL PROGRAMMES WITH SPONSORSHIP OF \$115 000 FROM THE DISTRICT BOARD ARE BEING PLANNED BY THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT ARTS AND CULTURE ASSOCIATION THIS YEAR, A SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (MONDAY).

HE SAID THE BOARD'S COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE INITIALLY ENDORSED \$69 100 TO SPONSOR SEVEN PROJECTS TO BE HELD BETWEEN APRIL AND AUGUST.

THE ASSOCIATION'S 1987-88 PROGRAMME CONTAINS A GREAT VARIETY OF PERFORMANCES, RANGING FROM CONCERTS, DRAMA, DANCE TO CANTONESE OPERA, TO MEET THE DIVERSE INTERESTS OF RESIDENTS.

A BALANCED SPREAD OF ACTIVITIES WILL BE HELD IN THE DISTRICT'S SIX CONSTITUENCIES TO PROMOTE COMMUNITY SPIRIT AMONG RESIDENTS.

TWO LARGE-SCALE PROGRAMMES ARE INTRODUCED THIS YEAR, THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OUTSTANDING STUDENTS VARIETY SHOW TO BE HELD IN JUNE OR JULY AND A CHILDREN'S ARTS WEEK IN OCTOBER.

THE VARIETY SHOW WILL FEATURE SPEECH, SINGING AND DANCE PERFORMANCES BY LOCAL STUDENTS, WHILE THE ARTS WEEK WILL INCLUDE PAINTING AND HANDICRAFT COMPETITIONS, MAGIC AND ACROBATIC SHOWS, A CHILDREN'S BOOKS EXHIBITION AND A CARNIVAL WITH ARTS STAFFS AND PERFORMANCES.

WHILE THE DISTRICT'S YOUTH CHOIR AND CHILDREN'S CHOIR, BOTH FORMED UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE DISTRICT BOARD, WILL EACH GIVE A NUMBER OF CONCERTS, PROFESSIONAL GROUPS SUCH AS THE HONG KONG CHINESE ORCHESTRA AND THE HONG KONG DANCE COMPANY WILL BE INVITED TO PERFORM.

IN ADDITION TO TWO OUTDOOR AND TWO INDOOR FORMAL CONCERTS, THE YOUTH CHOIR WILL ALSO GIVE CONCERTS AT FOUR ELDERLY AND REHABILITATION CENTRES.

MOST PROGRAMMES WILL BE PRESENTED JOINTLY WITH THE URBAN COUNCIL, AND SOME ALSO WITH THE MUSIC OFFICE AND THE DISTRICT'S SCHOOL LIAISON COMMITTEE. THE ASSOCIATION'S PROGRAMMES LAST YEAR HAD ATTRACTED AN AUDIENCE OF MORE THAN 6 500 PEOPLE.

A CONSULTANCY STUDY ON PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT OF SOUTH LANTAU WILL START TOMORROW (TUESDAY) FOLLOWING THE COMMISSIONING OF THE STUDY BY THE TERRITORY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT.

THE PURPOSE OF THE STUDY IS TO FORMULATE A DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY TO GUIDE DEVELOPMENTS IN SOUTH LANTAU TO MEET SET OBJECTIVES IN RECREATION, CONSERVATION AND INFRASTRUCTURAL IMPROVEMENTS.

THE STUDY IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED IN 12 MONTHS.

THE GOVERNMENT PROPOSES TO REVISE THE ORIGINAL INTERNAL ROADS LAYOUT FOR TAI PO INDUSTRIAL ESTATE STAGE III WHICH WAS AUTHORISED IN THE GOVERNMENT GAZETTE ON MAY 4, 1984.

THE REVISIONS INCLUDE PARTIAL DELETION OF THE MAIN EAST-WEST DISTRIBUTOR ROAD, ROAD+11+, CURTAILMENT OF TWO CULS-DE-SAC AND THE ADDITION OF TWO CULS-DE-SAC.

THE ROADS LAYOUT HAS TO BE REVISED DUE TO THE CHANGE IN LAND USE AND THE SUB-DIVISION OF INDUSTRIAL LOTS.

THE ROADS INVOLVED WILL SERVE THE USERS OF THE INDUSTRIAL LOTS, GOVERNMENT FACILITIES, PUBLIC FACILITIES AND OPEN SPACE TO BE PROVIDED ON THE RECLAMATION AREA.

A NOTICE CONCERNING THE PROPOSED REVISION WAS PUBLISHED IN THE LATEST ISSUE OF THE GOVERNMENT GAZETTE.

OBJECTIONS TO THE PROPOSED REVISION SHOULD BE SENT IN WRITING TO THE SECRETARY FOR TRANSPORT BY JUNE 15.

DENTAL CLINIC TO SERVE TUEN MUN STUDENTS

A DENTAL CLINIC TO SERVE ABOUT 60 000 PRIMARY SCHOOL STUDENTS IS BEING BUILT IN TUEN MUN NEW TOWN.

THE ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT HAS AWARDED A \$16.47 MILLION CONTRACT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE FOUR-STOREY CLINIC BUILDING AT TSUN WEN ROAD.

THE LOWER TWO FLOORS WILL ACCOMMODATE THE CLINIC WHILE THE UPPER TWO FLOORS WILL BE FOR GOVERNMENT OFFICES.

THE CLINIC WILL CONSIST OF 30 DENTAL CHAIRS, SURGERY ROOMS AND OFFICES.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO TAKE ABOUT 17 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

WAN CHAI DISTRICT BOARD WILL MEET TOMORROW (TUESDAY) TO DISCUSS THE CONSULTATIVE DOCUMENT ON THE CONTROL OF UNAUTHORISED BUILDING WORKS.

MEMBERS WILL ALSO EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS ON THE DRAFT NOISE CONTROL BILL, THE PUBLIC ORDER (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, THE POLICY STATEMENT ON LONG TERM HOUSING STRATEGY AND THE FILM CENSORSHIP BILL 1987.

IN ADDITION, MEMBERS WILL ASK A QUESTION REGARDING GOVERNMENT'S ATTITUDE TOWARDS ROOFTOP DWELLERS WHO ARE EVICTED FROM BUILDINGS DECLARED TO BE DANGEROUS OR SUBJECT TO DEMOLITION.
