DO NOT STORE TOO MUCH WATER OVERNIGHT

\* \* \* \* \*

THE P.W.D.'S DIRECTOR OF WATER SUPPLIES, MR. WILLIAM TUCKER, TODAY AGAIN APPEALED TO CONSUMERS NOT TO STORE TOO MUCH WATER OVERNIGHT SO AS TO AVOID WASTAGE.

SPEAKING ON THE DAY AFTER THE SUCCESSFUL LAUNCHING OF INITIAL RESTRICTIONS, HE STRESSED THAT ONLY A COMPARATIVELY SMALL PERCENTAGE OF PEOPLE ACTUALLY NEEDED TO STORE MUCH WATER, BECAUSE THEY WORKED LATE OR STARTED WORK EARLY.

+FOR MOST PEOPLE,+ HE SAID, +THERE SHOULD BE LITTLE OR NO NEED TO STORE WATER DURING THE SHORT PERIOD OF NIGHT-TIME RESTRICTIONS.

+TOO MANY PEOPLE TEND TO STORE WATER IN BUCKETS OR BATHS, JUST BECAUSE THERE ARE RESTRICTIONS IN FORCE -- EVEN THOUGH THEY DON'T REALLY NEED THE WATER,+ HE SAID. +THEN THEY SIMPLY EMPTY THE WATER OUT THE FOLLOWING MORNING, RESULTING IN VERY CONSIDERABLE WASTAGE.+

HE EMPHASISED THAT IF SOME CONSUMERS FOUND IT NECESSARY TO STORE WATER, ONLY ENOUGH SHOULD BE STORED FOR OVERNIGHT NEEDS. +AFTER ALL, FULL SUPPLIES WILL RETURN VERY EARLY IN THE MORNING,+ HE SAID.

MR. TUCKER ALSO REMINDED CONSUMERS OF THE ADVISABILITY OF BOILING ALL DRINKING WATER, PARTICULARLY WATER STORED IN CONTAINERS SUCH AS TANKS, BUCKETS OR BINS.

+ALTHOUGH THE WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT IS TAKING EXTRA PRECAUTIONS TO ENSURE THE PURITY OF MAINS SUPPLY -- BY SUCH MEASURES AS BY INCREASING CHLORINATION AND INTENSIFYING THE MONITORING OF THE QUALITY AT SERVICE RESERVOIRS AND CONSUMER TAPS -- THERE IS ALWAYS A SLIGHT RISK OF CONTAMINATION AT TIMES WHEN SUPPLY IS CUT OFF,+ HE SAID.

LAST NIGHT HONG KONG WENT THROUGH ITS FIRST NIGHT OF WATER RESTRICTIONS WITH RELATIVELY FEW PROBLEMS, SAID MR. TUCKER.

+MOST CONSUMERS APPEARED TO TAKE THE EIGHT-HOUR CUT IN SUPPLIES IN STRIDE AND ON THE WHOLE THERE SEEMED TO HAVE BEEN LITTLE INCONVENIENCE, EXCEPT IN A FEW ISOLATED CASES,+ HE SAID.

+AS WAS EXPECTED, HOWEVER, WE DID RECEIVE A NUMBER OF REPORTS FROM CONSUMERS IN HIGH-RISE BUILDINGS WHO FOUND THEIR TAPS RUNNING DRY EVEN BEFORE WE HAD STARTED SWITCHING OFF THE MAINS AT 10 P.M.

+THIS IS NOT UNUSUAL AND HAPPENS EVERY TIME WATER RESTRICTIONS ARE INTRODUCED, BUT LAST NIGHT'S REPORTS WERE FEWER THAN IN PREVIOUS YEARS AND WERE CONFINED MAINLY TO SOME PREMISES IN TO KWA WAN AND KWUN TONG,+ HE SAID.

MR. TUCKER SAID THAT THE MAIN REASON UPPER-FLOOR TENANTS OF THE AFFECTED BUILDINGS FOUND THEIR SUPPLY RUNNING OUT EARLIER THAN 10 O'CLOCK WAS PROBABLY OVER-REACTION ON THE PART OF SOME PEOPLE WHO ALL DECIDED TO DRAW WATER TO SEE THEM THROUGH THE HOURS OF NO SUPPLY.

+IT IS ALSO POSSIBLE THAT THE PLUMBING CANNOT COPE WITH SIMULTANEOUS DEMAND FROM EVERYONE IN THE BUILDING WITH THE RESULT THAT THE TENANTS BELOW RECEIVE A GOOD SUPPLY, WHILE THOSE LIVING ON TOP MAY BE ONLY GETTING A TRICKLE OR NONE AT ALL.+

MR. TUCKER ADVISED BUILDING MANagements TO CONTACT A LICENSED PLUMBER IF THIS PROBLEM PERSISTED IN ORDER TO MAKE A THOROUGH CHECK OF THE SYSTEM AND CORRECT ANY DEFECTS.

REFERRING TO REPORTS THAT SOME PREMISES HAD CONTINUED RECEIVING FULL SUPPLY DURING THE RESTRICTION HOURS, MR. TUCKER SAID THESE PREMISES APPARENTLY HAD BEEN DRAWING WATER FROM STORAGE TANKS ON THE ROOFS OF THE BUILDINGS.

+THE MANagements OF THESE BUILDINGS ARE REMINDED OF THEIR RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT THESE TANKS ARE SHUT OFF DURING THE RESTRICTION HOURS,+ SAID MR. TUCKER.

IN OTHER CASES, HE SAID, A FEW PREMISES HAD ALSO RECEIVED ALL-NIGHT SUPPLY BECAUSE OF THEIR LOCATION WITHIN INDUSTRIAL ZONES WHILE A FEW OTHERS, SUCH AS TELEVISION STATIONS, RECEIVED FULL SUPPLY BECAUSE OF THE NATURE OF THEIR OPERATIONS.

+ALSO, SOME PEOPLE UNDOUBTEDLY CONTINUED RECEIVING WATER WELL AFTER THE MAINS WERE CLOSED AS OBVIOUSLY SOME WATER REMAINS IN THE PIPING SYSTEM AND FOR A WHILE WILL CONTINUE TO FEED SOME PREMISES IN LOW-LYING AREAS,+ HE ADDED.

MR. TUCKER SAID THAT EVERY ATTEMPT WAS BEING MADE TO ENSURE THAT SUPPLIES WERE STOPPED AT 10 O'CLOCK EACH EVENING AND RESTORED PROMPTLY AT 6 O'CLOCK THE FOLLOWING MORNING.

MR. TUCKER SAID THAT WHILE EVERY ATTEMPT WAS BEING MADE TO ADHERE AS CLOSELY AS POSSIBLE TO THE APPOINTED TIMES OF SWITCHING OFF THE MAINS, CONSUMERS SHOULD NOT EXPECT THEIR SUPPLIES TO BE STOPPED AT PRECISELY 10 P.M.

+IN SOME CASES, THE SWITCH-OFF TIME WILL VARY BY MINUTES FROM PLACE TO PLACE AS OUR TURNCOCK STAFF WORK THEIR WAY FROM ONE VALVE TO THE NEXT.

+THE SAME APPLIES TO THE RESUMPTION OF SUPPLIES AT 6 A.M. AND CONSUMERS SHOULD NOT GET OVERLY CONCERNED IF THEIR SUPPLIES RETURNS A FEW MINUTES LATE,+ HE SAID.

+IN ANY EVENT, IF ANYONE EXPERIENCES ANY DIFFICULTY OR HAS ANY QUERY HE SHOULD CALL 5-726311 IF HE LIVES ON THE ISLAND OR 3-948261 FOR KOWLOON AND THE NEW TERRITORIES WHICH ARE MANNED 24 HOURS A DAY,+ HE SAID.

THERE WERE 74 LICENSED BANKS IN HONG KONG AT THE END OF APRIL.

## APPLY EARLY FOR PASSPORT

THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT HAS ADVISED PEOPLE INTENDING TO APPLY FOR PASSPORTS TO DO SO EARLY TO AVOID LAST MINUTE RUSH.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT SAID THAT DURING THE LONG SUMMER VACATION, THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE TRAVELLING OUTSIDE HONG KONG WOULD BE MUCH INCREASED.

THERE WILL BE STUDENTS GOING ABROAD TO STUDY AND PARENTS TAKING THEIR FAMILY ON OVERSEAS TOURS, HE ADDED.

IT NORMALLY TAKES 10 DAYS TO ISSUE A BRITISH (HONG KONG) PASSPORT, BUT IT MIGHT TAKE LONGER DURING THE PEAK PERIOD, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE ALSO REMINDED STUDENTS AND VISITORS INTENDING TO GO TO THE UNITED KINGDOM TO SEND IN THEIR APPLICATION FOR VISAS IN GOOD TIME.

TENDERS FOR 300 HONG KONG AND KOWLOON TAXI LICENCES  
\* \* \* \* \*

THREE HUNDRED HONG KONG AND KOWLOON TAXI LICENCES ARE BEING OFFERED TO THE PUBLIC BY SEALED TENDERS.

THE TENDER WILL BE IN THE FORM OF A PREMIUM IN RESPECT OF ONE OR MORE HONG KONG AND KOWLOON TAXIS.

A TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT A TENDERER MAY SUBMIT ONE TENDER FORM FOR ONE OR MORE LICENCES BUT NOT EXCEEDING 300.

HE MAY ALSO SUBMIT MORE THAN ONE TENDER FORM, BUT IF A TENDER FOR MORE THAN ONE LICENCE IS SUBMITTED, ONLY ONE FIXED UNIT PREMIUM SHOULD BE OFFERED.

+ IF THE NUMBER OF AVAILABLE LICENCES IS LESS THAN THE NUMBER REQUIRED BY A TENDERER, + THE SPOKESMAN SAID, + A SMALLER NUMBER OF LICENCES MAY BE ALLOCATED TO HIM AS APPROPRIATE. +

HE SAID THAT A PUBLIC BALLOT MAY BE HELD TO DETERMINE THE ACCEPTANCE OF THOSE TENDERS IF THE UNIT PREMIA WHICH THEY OFFERED ARE IDENTICAL.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT TENDER FORMS PLUS FULL PARTICULARS MAY BE OBTAINED IN PERSON ONLY FROM 2 P.M. TOMORROW (FRIDAY) FROM THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT'S HONG KONG LICENSING OFFICE ON THE GROUND FLOOR OF THE MURRAY ROAD MULTI-STOREY CAR PARK, OR FROM THE KOWLOON LICENSING OFFICE, GROUND FLOOR, PUI CHING ROAD, HO MAN TIN.

COMPLETED TENDER FORMS IN DUPLICATE TOGETHER WITH THE ORIGINAL TENDER DEPOSIT RECEIPTS MUST BE SUBMITTED IN SEALED ENVELOPES, ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY, CENTRAL TENDER BOARD, AND PLACED IN THE SECRETARIAT TENDER BOX SITUATED IN THE ENTRANCE HALL ON THE GROUND FLOOR OF THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT, CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES (MAIN WING), LOWER ALBERT ROAD, HONG KONG, BEFORE NOON ON FRIDAY, JUNE 17, 1977.

LATE TENDERS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

FURTHER TAXI LICENCES ARE LIKELY TO BE ISSUED IN 1978 AFTER THE PROPOSED CONVERSION OF PUBLIC CARS WHICH WAS ANNOUNCED RECENTLY.

VERSATILE FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT FOR F.S.D.

\* \* \* \*

A HIGHLY VERSATILE PIECE OF FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT HAS BEEN ADDED TO THE OPERATIONAL FLEET OF THE FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO COPE WITH THE INCREASING FIRE FIGHTING AND RESCUE OPERATIONS.

THE NEW EQUIPMENT, A 50-METRE (164-FOOT) TURNTABLE LADDER, IS THE FIRST CONSIGNMENT OF AN ORDER FOR THREE SUCH EQUIPMENT PLACED BY THE DEPARTMENT WITH A WEST GERMAN COMPANY IN 1975.

A FIRE SERVICES SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THE SECOND APPLIANCE IS DUE TO ARRIVE IN ABOUT A WEEK'S TIME AND THE THIRD TWO WEEKS THEREAFTER.

THE TURNTABLE LADDER, TOGETHER WITH VEHICLE CHASSIS AND ENGINES, COSTS ABOUT \$1.3 MILLION. IT HAS A SEATING CAPACITY FOR THREE PERSONS.

THE LADDER CONSISTS OF SIX SECTIONS AND IS HYDRAULICALLY AND ELECTRONICALLY OPERATED. THE INDIVIDUAL SECTIONS ARE GUIDED WITHIN THEMSELVES BY MEANS OF ROLLERS SO AS TO REDUCE FRICTION AND TO ENSURE THAT THEY RUN SMOOTHLY UNDER ALL CONDITIONS.

THE MAXIMUM EXTENSION IS 50 METRES AND THE MAXIMUM ELEVATION IS 72 DEGREES. IT WILL BE POSSIBLE TO ROTATE THE LADDER THROUGH 360 DEGREES.

THE NEW APPLIANCE HAS A NUMBER OF FEATURES, INCLUDING AN ELEVATOR CAPABLE OF CARRYING TWO FIREMEN OR 180 KG (APPROXIMATELY 400 POUNDS) AT ABOUT ONE METRE PER SECOND. IT IS RAISED AND LOWERED BY WAY OF A STEEL CABLE. IF THIS CABLE SHOULD TEAR OR THE MECHANISM FAIL, SPRING PRESSURE WILL OPERATE THE +ECCENTRIC STOPPING+ CAMS, WHICH LOCK IN SUCH A MANNER THAT THE ELEVATOR WILL COME TO A STANDSTILL.

COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THE OPERATOR ON THE GROUND AND THE FIREMEN AT THE HEAD OF THE LADDER IS FACILITATED BY THE INTER-COMMUNICATION SYSTEM. THROUGH THIS SYSTEM, THE MEN AT THE TOP CAN REPORT THEIR OBSERVATIONS DOWN TO THE CONTROL POSITION CONSTANTLY.

THE APPLIANCE IS ALSO FITTED WITH A REMOTE CONTROL UNIT WHICH ENABLES THE OPERATOR TO EFFECT LADDER MOVEMENTS FROM A DIFFERENT LOCATION.

ANOTHER USEFUL FEATURE OF THE LADDER IS ITS HYDRAULICALLY-POWERED LIFTING DEVICE WHICH HAS A MAXIMUM LIFTING CAPACITY OF 3,000 KG (APPROXIMATELY 6,600 POUNDS). IT CAN BE USED FOR LIFTING SMALL LOADS IN CASE OF ACCIDENTS OR OTHER CONTINGENCIES.

AT PRESENT, THE LONGEST LADDER IN SERVICE IS 30 METRES (100 FEET) AND CAN REACH UP TO THE NINTH FLOOR OF A BUILDING.

+WITH THIS NEW EQUIPMENT WE WILL BE ABLE TO EXTEND OUR LADDER OPERATIONS UP TO THE 15TH FLOORS,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE GALLANT ACTION OF A GOVERNMENT SECONDARY SCHOOL TEACHER, MISS LEE SIU-LAN, IN RESCUING TWO PREGNANT WOMEN ON MARCH 2 FOLLOWING A COLLISION BETWEEN A FERRY AND A HYDROFOIL OFF CHEUNG CHAU, HAS BEEN RECOGNISED BY THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR. KENNETH TOPLEY.

MISS LEE, A SPORTS MISTRESS AND A TEACHER OF CHINESE LANGUAGE AT THE CHEUNG CHAU GOVERNMENT MIDDLE SCHOOL, WILL BE PRESENTED WITH THE DIRECTOR'S LETTER OF APPRECIATION AND THE HONG KONG LIFE GUARD CLUB'S +HONG KONG RESCUE STAR+ BY MR. TOPLEY TOMORROW EVENING.

THE PRESENTATION WILL BE MADE BEFORE A DINNER GIVEN IN HER HONOUR BY THE CLUB.

MISS LEE AND THE TWO PREGNANT WOMEN, BOTH OF WHOM ARE HER COLLEAGUES, WERE ON BOARD THE FERRY WHEN THE ACCIDENT OCCURRED. SHE OBTAINED LIFE JACKETS FOR HER COLLEAGUES, BOTH NON-SWIMMERS, AND TOGETHER WITH THEM JUMPED INTO THE WATER BEFORE THE FERRY +MAN TAK+ SANK.

MISS LEE THEN TOOK HER COLLEAGUES IN TOW AND SWAM TOWARDS AN APPROACHING FERRY, +MAN TAO+, ON WHICH THEY RETURNED TO HONG KONG.

ON MAY 23 MISS LEE RECEIVED THE HONG KONG LIFE GUARD CLUB'S +VALUABLE SERVICES AWARD+ FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE URBAN COUNCIL, MR. A. DE O. SALES.

MISS LEE JOINED THE CHEUNG CHAU GOVERNMENT MIDDLE SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER 1976 AFTER TEACHING FOR ONE YEAR AT THE SHUN TAK FRATERNAL ASSOCIATION SEAWARD WOO COLLEGE.

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT SCHEME IN TSUEN WAN CENTRAL AREAS

A NUMBER OF TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS WILL COME INTO EFFECT FROM 10 A.M. ON MONDAY (JUNE 6), IN TSUEN WAN IN ORDER TO IMPROVE THE TRAFFIC CONDITION IN THE CENTRAL PART OF TSUEN WAN TOWN, THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED TODAY.

THE NEW MEASURES ARE AS FOLLOWS =

- \* HAM TIN STREET BETWEEN YEUNG UK ROAD AND SHA TSUI ROAD WILL BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY SOUTHBOUND=
- \* CHUEN LUNG STREET BETWEEN YEUNG UK ROAD AND HO PUI STREET WILL BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY SOUTHBOUND=
- \* HO PUI STREET BETWEEN CHUNG ON STREET AND SAI LAU STREET WILL BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY WESTBOUND=
- \* SAN TSUEN STREET BETWEEN TAI UK STREET AND WO TIK STREET WILL BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY WESTBOUND= AND
- \* 24-HOUR CLEARWAY RESTRICTION WILL BE IMPOSED ON PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES ON THE ROADS MENTIONED BELOW : -
  - (A) CHUNG ON STREET=
  - (B) SHA TSUI ROAD FROM TEXACO ROAD TO TAI HO ROAD=
  - (C) TEXACO ROAD BETWEEN CASTLE PEAK ROAD AND SHA TSUI ROAD=
  - (D) CHUEN LUNG STREET BETWEEN HO PUI STREET AND YEUNG UK ROAD= AND
  - (E) WO TIK STREET BETWEEN HO PUI STREET AND YEUNG UK ROAD.
