\$920 000 RAISED IN HOSPITAL FUND COMPETITION

A BLOCK-TO-BLOCK CLEAN-UP OPERATION IS BEING CARRIED OUT IN MONG KOK TO RID BUILDINGS OF WASTE AND UNWANTED ARTICLES.

THE OPERATION, LAUNCHED BY THE KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN COMMITTEE, WILL LAST TWO MONTHS. CLEANSING STAFF OF THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT ARE BEING DEPLOYED TO COLLECT REFUSE AND WASTE FOR DISPOSAL.

ELDERLY WOMEN MAY SEEK ID CARD EXEMPTION
* * * * *

THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT TODAY (WEDNESDAY) REMINDED APPLICANTS IN THE CURRENT PHASE OF THE IDENTITY CARD RENEWAL EXERCISE THAT THEY MAY APPLY FOR A CERTIFICATE OF EXEMPTION.

AS THESE APPLICANTS ARE WOMEN OVER 70 YEARS OLD, SOME OF THEM MIGHT BE IN POOR HEALTH, AND IT COULD CAUSE THEM OF HARDSHIP AND INCONVENIENCE TO GO TO THE ISSUE OFFICES, A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

+AN APPLICANT CAN MAKE HER APPLICATION IN THE FORM OF A LETTER WRITTEN BY HERSELF OR BY HER REPRESENTATIVE FAMILY MEMBER, RELATIVE, SOCIAL WORKER OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT OR A REGISTERED MEDICAL DOCTOR LOOKING AFTER HER CASE,+ HE EXPLAINED.

THE LETTER SHOULD INCLUDE APPLICANT'S NAME, IDENTITY CARD NUMBER AND GROUNDS FOR APPLYING FOR EXEMPTION. IT SHOULD BE ACCOMPANIED BY A MEDICAL CERTIFICATE FROM A REGISTERED MEDICAL DOCTOR CERTIFYING THE APPLICANT'S STATE OF HEALTH, A PHOTOCOPY OF THE APPLICANT'S IDENTITY CARD AND TWO RECENT PASSPORT-SIZE PHOTOGRAPHS.

A MEDICAL CERTIFICATE IS NOT REQUIRED IF THE APPLICANT IS AGED 75 OR OVER.

THE APPLICATION SHOULD BE POSTED TO THE REGISTRATION OF PERSONS CERTIFICATE OFFICE, EIGHTH FLOOR, PARK COMMERCIAL CENTRE, 6-10 SHELTER STREET, CAUSEWAY BAY, HONG KONG.

+IT IS HELPFUL IF THE APPLICANT ALSO GIVES HER CONTACT ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER SO THAT WE MAY CONTACT HER AS SOON AS POSSIBLE WHEN THE CERTIFICATE OF EXEMPTION IS TO BE ISSUED,+ THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

ONCE A CERTIFICATE OF EXEMPTION IS ISSUED, THE ORIGINAL IDENTITY CARD OF THE HOLDER WILL BE WITHDRAWN. CERTIFICATES OF EXEMPTION ARE ISSUED FREE OF CHARGE.

URBAN CLEARWAY RESTRICTIONS IN CENTRAL, NORTH POINT

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED THAT FROM 10 AM ON SATURDAY (SEPTEMBER 27), CERTAIN ROAD SECTIONS IN CENTRAL AND NORTH POINT WILL BE DESIGNATED EITHER RESTRICTED ZONE OR URBAN CLEARWAYS.

DETAILS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- * THE EASTERN KERBSIDE LANE OF PEDDAR STREET FROM A POINT ABOUT 25 METRES NORTH OF ITS JUNCTION WITH QUEEN'S ROAD CENTRAL TO A POINT ABOUT 15 METRES SOUTH OF ITS JUNCTION WITH DES VOEUX ROAD CENTRAL WILL BE MADE A 7 AM TO 7 PM DAILY RESTRICTED ZONE FOR TAXIS AND GOODS VEHICLES. NO TAXI OR GOODS VEHICLE WILL BE ALLOWED TO STOP WITHIN THIS ROAD SECTION FOR PASSENGERS OR GOODS.

SHOPPERS AND SHOPKEEPERS ALIKE WILL HAVE THE CHANCE TO SEE THE QUEEN WHEN SHE MAKES ONE OF HER BY-NOW-FAMOUS WALKABOUTS THROUGH SHA TIN'S NEW TOWN PLAZA ON OCTOBER 22.

SINCE IT OPENED IN JANUARY 1985, THE SHOPPING AND ENTERTAINMENT COMPLEX HAS BECOME ONE OF HONG KONG'S BIGGEST ATTRACTIONS. DURING HER BRIEF VISIT, HER MAJESTY WILL SEE FOR HERSELF WHY A QUARTER OF A MILLION PEOPLE A DAY VISIT THE PLAZA ON WEEKENDS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

ON HER ARRIVAL, AFTER VISITING THE LUNG HANG HOUSING ESTATE, THE QUEEN WILL BE GREETED BY THE SECRETARY FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, MR DONALD LIAO. HE WILL PRESENT THE SHA TIN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR LEO KWAN= MR KWOK TAK-SENG, THE CHAIRMAN OF SUN HUNG KAI PROPERTIES WHICH BUILT AND RUN THE PLAZA= AND THE MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE KOWLOON-CANTON RAILWAY CORPORATION, MR PETER QUICK.

HER MAJESTY WILL TAKE THE ESCALATOR TO THE FOURTH LEVEL OF THE COMPLEX WHERE MR LIAO WILL EXPLAIN AN EXHIBITION OF PHOTOGRAPHS SHOWING THE DEVELOPMENT OF SHA TIN.

THE QUEEN WILL THEN WALK THROUGH A SHOPPING ARCADE WHERE SHE WILL CHAT TO SOME OF THE SHOPKEEPERS AND VISITORS TO THE PLAZA.

THE 120 700 SQUARE METRES PLAZA WAS DESIGNED TO BRING A RANGE OF COMPREHENSIVE SHOPPING, RECREATIONAL AND LEISURE FACILITIES UNDER ONE ROOF, THE FIRST TIME THIS HAS BEEN DONE ON SUCH A SCALE IN HONG KONG.

IT INCLUDES A NUMBER OF DESIGNS AND INSTALLATIONS WHICH ARE UNIQUE IN THE TERRITORY AND ARE THE LATEST OF THEIR KIND IN ASIA.

AMONG THOSE WHICH THE QUEEN WILL SEE ARE THE ROMAN-STYLE ARENA ON THE FIRST LEVEL WITH ITS SOLAR SHELTER AND FOUNTAIN. A FRAME CAN BE LOWERED ON TO THE FOUNTAIN TO CONVERT IT INTO A STAGE FOR PUBLIC PERFORMANCES.

FROM LEVEL FOUR, HER MAJESTY WILL SEE THE MUSICAL FOUNTAIN. THE 18-METRE BY 9-METRE OVAL STRUCTURE IS THE LARGEST OF ITS KIND IN ASIA AND THE FIRST IN HONG KONG. IT CAN BE PROGRAMMED BY COMPUTER TO PRODUCE UNLIMITED COMBINATIONS OF MUSIC, WATER AND LIGHTING PATTERNS.

AFTER WALKING THROUGH THE SHOPPING ARCADE, THE QUEEN WILL MAKE A BRIEF VISIT TO NEIGHBOURING KCR HOUSE BEFORE CONTINUING HER TOUR OF SHA TIN.
