PUBLICATION IS PERMITTED IN HONG KONG NEWSPAPERS TOMORROW (SATURDAY), BUT NO NEWS AGENCY OR OVERSEAS RADIO TRANSMISSION OF THE ANNOUNCEMENT MAY CARRY THE INFORMATION WITHOUT THE EMBARGO QUALIFICATION.

THE NEWS MAY BE BROADCAST FROM 6 AM ONWARDS TOMORROW OVER THE LOCAL RADIO AND TELEVISION STATIONS.

ON NO ACCOUNT SHOULD ANY OF THE RECIPIENTS OF HONOURS BE CONTACTED FOR INTERVIEWS, OR FOR INFORMATION RELATED TO THEIR CAREERS, OR BE APPROACHED IN ANY WAY IN CONNECTION WITH THEIR AWARDS BEFORE THESE HAVE BEEN PUBLICLY ANNOUNCED.

PROVISIONS OF MENTAL HEALTH LAW TAKE EFFECT TODAY

* * * * *

THE GOVERNOR HAS APPOINTED DECEMBER 29, 1989 (TODAY) AS THE DATE ON WHICH THE MENTAL HEALTH (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE 1988, WHICH BRINGS ABOUT EXTENSIVE CHANGES TO THE EXISTING MENTAL HEALTH ORDINANCE, IS TO COME INTO EFFECT, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE NEW SECTION 49 OF THE AMENDED ORDINANCE.

TWO SETS OF RELATED REGULATIONS, NAMELY, THE MENTAL HEALTH (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1989 AND THE MENTAL HEALTH (GUARDIANSHIP) REGULATIONS 1989, COME INTO OPERATION TOGETHER WITH THE AMENDMENT ORDINANCE.

"THE MENTAL HEALTH (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE PROVIDES REVISED PROCEDURES FOR ADMISSION INTO MENTAL HOSPITALS; THE INTRODUCTION OF A GUARDIANSHIP SCHEME FOR MENTALLY DISORDERED PATIENTS AGED 18 AND ABOVE; THE PROVISION OF CONDITIONAL DISCHARGE OF PATIENTS WITH THE POWER OF RECALL; AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MENTAL HEALTH REVIEW TRIBUNAL TO REPLACE THE EXISTING HOSPITAL ORDER APPEAL TRIBUNAL," A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

/"THE BRINGING

"THE BRINGING INTO OPERATION OF THE AMENDMENT ORDINANCE HAS BEEN HELD BACK TO AWAIT THE MAKING OF THE MENTAL HEALTH (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS AND THE MENTAL HEALTH (GUARDIANSHIP) REGULATIONS, WHICH ARE ESSENTIAL FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF VARIOUS PROVISIONS IN THE ORDINANCE," HE EXPLAINED.

THE NEW SECTION 49 OF THE AMENDED ORDINANCE PROVIDES THE COURT THE POWER, UPON APPLICATION BY THE DIRECTOR OF HOSPITAL SERVICES ON MEDICAL GROUNDS, TO MAKE A HOSPITAL ORDER AUTHORISING THE CONTINUED DETENTION OF A PERSON IN THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT PSYCHIATRIC CENTRE AFTER THE EXPIRATION OF HIS SENTENCE.

"THIS SECTION CANNOT BE PUT INTO OPERATION AT PRESENT AS THE JUDICIARY WILL STILL NEED TO DRAW UP CERTAIN PROCEDURAL RULES GOVERNING THE RECEIPT AND CONSIDERATION OF SUCH APPLICATIONS," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

PRIOR TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SECTION 49, SUCH A PERSON, IF FOUND TO BE MEDICALLY UNFIT TO RETURN TO THE COMMUNITY, WILL BE DETAINED IN A MENTAL HOSPITAL THROUGH THE NORMAL CHANNELS PROVIDED IN OTHER PROVISIONS OF THE AMENDED ORDINANCE.

THE MENTAL HEALTH (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1989 CONTAIN 12 BILINGUAL STATUTORY FORMS DEALING WITH ADMISSION, DETENTION, GUARDIANSHIP, DISCHARGE, AND SO ON. THESE FORMS ARE NECESSARY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE VARIOUS PROVISIONS IN THE ORDINANCE.

THE MENTAL HEALTH (GUARDIANSHIP) REGULATIONS 1989 SET OUT IN DETAIL THE RESPECTIVE DUTIES OF PRIVATE GUARDIANS AND OF THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE AND THE PROCEDURES RELATING TO THE TRANSFER OF GUARDIANSHIP.

A GUIDE TO THE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF A GUARDIAN HAS BEEN PREPARED BY THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE.

THE GUARDIANSHIP SCHEME IS TO BE OPERATED UNDER THE GENERAL SUPERVISION OF THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE.

PATIENTS AGED 18 AND ABOVE SUFFERING FROM MENTAL DISORDER MAY BE PLACED UNDER THE GUARDIANSHIP OF EITHER THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE OR ANOTHER PERSON ACCEPTABLE TO THE DIRECTOR.

THE INTRODUCTION OF THE SCHEME WILL ENABLE SUCH PERSONS TO BE ADEQUATELY CARED FOR, REDUCING THE NEED FOR THE PATIENT TO BE ADMITTED INTO A MENTAL HOSPITAL.

THE APPLICATION FOR GUARDIANSHIP MAY BE MADE TO THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE BY A RELATIVE OF THE PATIENT, A REGISTERED MEDICAL PRACTITIONER OR A PUBLIC OFFICER IN THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, SUPPORTED BY THE MEDICAL OPINION OF TWO MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS.

UPON APPOINTMENT, THE GUARDIAN WILL HAVE THE POWER TO SPECIFY A PLACE OF RESIDENCE FOR THE PATIENT AND TO REQUIRE ACCESS TO THE PATIENT TO BE GIVEN THERE TO ANY REGISTERED MEDICAL PRACTITIONER, APPROVED SOCIAL WORKER AND OTHER SPECIFIED PERSONS. HE ALSO HAS THE POWER TO REQUIRE THE PATIENT TO ATTEND SPECIFIED PLACES FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT, OCCUPATION OR EDUCATION.

PROVISION HAS BEEN INCLUDED FOR TRANSFER OF GUARDIANSHIP IN THE INTEREST OF THE PATIENT. TO ENSURE THAT THERE WILL BE REGULAR REVIEWS, ALL GUARDIANSHIP ARRANGEMENTS WILL LAPSE AT THE END OF TWO YEARS FROM THE DATE OF COMMENCEMENT, UNLESS RENEWED BY FURTHER APPLICATION.

"IT IS ESTIMATED THAT AN ADDITIONAL 53 POSTS AT AN ANNUAL COST OF ABOUT \$16 MILLION IS REQUIRED IN THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT AND THE HOSPITAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT IN CONNECTION WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE GUARDIANSHIP SCHEME. ADEQUATE FUNDS HAVE BEEN EARMARKED FOR THIS PURPOSE," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

MATURE STUDENT SCHEME IN NURSE TRAINING

* * * * *

AMENDMENTS TO THE NURSES (REGISTRATION AND DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE) REGULATIONS WERE GAZETTED TODAY (FRIDAY) TO GIVE THE NURSING BOARD OF HONG KONG A WIDER DISCRETION IN CONSIDERING THE SUITABILITY OF CANDIDATES FOR TRAINING IN NURSING COURSES.

"THE NURSES (REGISTRATION AND DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE) (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) REGULATIONS 1989 ENABLE THE BOARD TO IMPLEMENT A MATURE STUDENT SCHEME," A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE PURPOSE OF THE MATURE STUDENT SCHEME IS TO ENABLE PERSONS WITH APPROPRIATE PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE, BUT WHO DO NOT POSSESS THE NORMAL ACADEMIC ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AT THE HONG KONG SCHOOL CERTIFICATE LEVEL, TO TRAIN TO QUALIFY AS REGISTERED NURSES.

AS A START, ENTRANTS UNDER THE MATURE STUDENT SCHEME WILL BE ENROLLED NURSES AND REGISTERED MIDWIVES WITH SEVERAL YEARS' NURSING EXPERIENCE AND THE APTITUDE TO UNDERGO FURTHER TRAINING.

"THE SCHEME WILL HELP TO ALLEVIATE THE SHORTAGE OF REGISTERED NURSES BY PROVIDING AN AVENUE FOR PERSONS WITH THE APPROPRIATE EXPERIENCE BUT WHO ARE NOT IN POSSESSION OF THE REQUISITE ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS TO BE ADMITTED INTO TRAINING AS REGISTERED NURSES," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

/"IN ADDITION

"IN ADDITION, THE SCHEME WILL ENHANCE THE CAREER PROSPECTS OF ENROLLED NURSES AND REGISTERED MIDWIVES AND THUS IMPROVE THEIR MORALE," HE SAID.

THE SCHEME HAS THE FULL SUPPORT OF THE NURSING AND ALLIED GRADES REVIEW COMMITTEE CHAIRED BY THE HOSPITAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, COMPRISING MEMBERS FROM THE MANAGEMENT, INCLUDING REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND STAFF-SIDE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NURSING GRADES.

FULL DETAILS OF THE OPERATION OF THE SCHEME WILL BE ANNOUNCED SHORTLY BY THE NURSING BOARD. APPLICATIONS WILL THEN BE INVITED FOR ACCEPTANCE INTO THE SCHEME.

EXTENSION OF TRIAD RENUNCIATION SCHEME

THE GOVERNMENT TODAY (FRIDAY) ANNOUNCED THAT ON THE ADVICE OF THE FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE, THE TRIAD RENUNCIATION SCHEME WILL BE EXTENDED FOR ONE YEAR UP TO DECEMBER 8, 1990.

"ANY FURTHER EXTENSION WOULD BE SUBJECT TO ANOTHER REVIEW IN MID-1990," A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

"THE DECISION TO EXTEND THE SCHEME WAS MADE HAVING REGARD TO THE CONTINUING INFLOW OF APPLICATIONS.

"THE PROCEDURES OF THE TRIAD RENUNCIATION TRIBUNAL WILL BE STREAMLINED TO EXPEDITE THE PROCESSING OF APPLICATIONS."

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE TRIAD RENUNCIATION SCHEME PROVIDED A MEANS WHEREBY A PERSON COULD RENOUNCE FORMALLY HIS MEMBERSHIP OF A TRIAD SOCIETY IN RETURN FOR A STAY OF PROSECUTION FOR OFFENCES RELATED TO TRIAD MEMBERSHIP UNDER THE SOCIETIES ORDINANCE.

"THE SCHEME WAS FORMALLY LAUNCHED ON DECEMBER 8 LAST YEAR AND THE RESPONSE TO THE SCHEME HAS BEEN ENCOURAGING," HE SAID.

"UP TO MID-DECEMBER THIS YEAR, A TOTAL OF 2,976 ENQUIRIES AND 665 APPLICATIONS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED.

"UP TO THE SAME DATE, A TOTAL OF 150 GENUINE TRIAD MEMBERS HAVE SUCCESSFULLY RENOUNCED THEIR TRIAD MEMBERSHIP."

MRS FAN APPOINTED CHAIRMAN OF EDUCATION COMMISSION

* * * * *

THE GOVERNMENT TODAY (FRIDAY) ANNOUNCED APPOINTMENTS TO THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE EDUCATION COMMISSION AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, AS WELL AS CHANGES TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMISSION.

MRS RITA FAN WILL SUCCEED SIR QUO-WEI LEE AS CHAIRMAN OF THE EDUCATION COMMISSION WITH EFFECT FROM JANUARY 1, 1990. MR TIMOTHY HA WILL BECOME CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN PLACE OF MRS FAN FROM THE SAME DATE.

THE PRESENT TERMS OF OFFICE OF SIR QUO-WEI LEE AND MISS MARIA TAM WILL EXPIRE ON DECEMBER 31, 1989, WHILE TWO NEW MEMBERS WILL BE APPOINTED: MRS SELINA CHOW AND MR SZETO WAH.

THE GOVERNMENT PAID TRIBUTE TO SIR QUO-WEI LEE FOR HIS OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCE AS CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION SINCE ITS ESTABLISHMENT IN 1984.

"SIR QUO-WEI WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN SETTING UP THE COMMISSION AND IN THE PUBLICATION OF ITS FIRST THREE REPORTS," A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

"THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN THESE REPORTS, NEARLY ALL OF WHICH HAVE BEEN ACCEPTED BY THE GOVERNMENT, HAVE RESULTED IN A WIDE RANGE OF MAJOR EDUCATIONAL REFORMS.

"THESE INCLUDE THE STRENGTHENING OF THE SIXTH FORM CURRICULUM, THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE OPEN LEARNING INSTITUTE, THE PLANNED INTRODUCTION OF A UNIFIED POINT OF ENTRY INTO TERTIARY INSTITUTIONS AND THE SETTING-UP OF THE NEW DIRECT SUBSIDY SCHEME FOR PRIVATE SCHOOLS.

"UNDER SIR QUO-WEI'S GUIDANCE, THE COMMISSION HAS ALSO LAID THE FOUNDATIONS NOT ONLY FOR ITS FORTHCOMING REPORT ON NINE YEARS' FREE AND COMPULSORY EDUCATION, BUT ALSO FOR A LONG-TERM PROGRAMME OF WORK TO TAKE IT INTO THE 1990'S."

THE NEW CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION, MRS RITA FAN, IS ALREADY FAMILIAR WITH EDUCATION POLICY-MAKING AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL.

"SHE HAS BEEN A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION SINCE 1984, ITS CHAIRMAN SINCE 1987 AND AN EX-OFFICIO MEMBER OF THE EDUCATION COMMISSION FROM THE SAME DATE," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

"SHE IS CONVENER OF THE OMELCO STANDING PANEL ON EDUCATION AND HAS EXTENSIVE EXPERIENCE OF EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION AT THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC. MRS FAN IS A MEMBER OF BOTH THE EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE COUNCILS."

/MR TIMOTHY

MR TIMOTHY HA, WHO IS ALREADY A MEMBER OF THE EDUCATION COMMISSION IN HIS PERSONAL CAPACITY, WILL RETAIN AN EX-OFFICIO PLACE ON THE COMMISSION AFTER TAKING OVER FROM MRS RITA FAN AS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

MR HA, WHO IS PRINCIPAL OF ST PAUL'S COLLEGE, IS A DISTINGUISHED EDUCATIONALIST WITH A NOTABLE RECORD OF PUBLIC SERVICE. HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION FROM 1979 UNTIL JUNE 1989 AND IS ALSO A MEMBER OF THE UNIVERSITY AND POLYTECHNIC GRANTS COMMITTEE.

MR HA HAS BEEN CHAIRMAN OF THE HONG KONG GRANTS SCHOOLS COUNCIL SINCE 1973 AND OF THE HONG KONG ASSOCIATION OF SPONSORING BODIES OF SCHOOLS SINCE JULY 1988.

MISS MARIA TAM'S TERM OF APPOINTMENT TO THE EDUCATION COMMISSION WILL ALSO EXPIRE AT THE END OF THIS YEAR.

THE GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT MISS TAM WAS CONCERNED THAT HER INCREASINGLY HEAVY COMMITMENTS IN OTHER POLICY AREAS, IN PARTICULAR THAT OF TRANSPORT, WOULD MAKE IT DIFFICULT FOR HER TO CONTINUE TO DEVOTE SUFFICIENT TIME TO EDUCATION COMMISSION BUSINESS.

AS A FOUNDER MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION, HE SAID, MISS TAM'S MATURE AND BALANCED ADVICE HAD BEEN INVALUABLE TO MEMBERS IN DISCUSSING MANY IMPORTANT AND CONTROVERSIAL ISSUES.

THE TWO NEW MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ARE MRS SELINA CHOW AND MR SZETO WAH, BOTH OF WHOM HAVE BEEN APPOINTED IN THEIR PERSONAL CAPACITIES.

MRS CHOW IS DIRECTOR AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF ASIA TELEVISION LIMITED AND A MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL. SHE HAS SERVED ON A WIDE VARIETY OF GOVERNMENT COMMITTEES AND IS A MEMBER OF THE OMELCO STANDING PANEL ON EDUCATION.

MR SZETO WAH IS HEADMASTER OF GCE PAST STUDENTS ASSOCIATION KWUN TONG PRIMARY SCHOOL AND PRESIDENT OF THE HONG KONG PROFESSIONAL TEACHERS UNION. HE HAS A WIDE BACKGROUND OF PUBLIC SERVICE AND HAS BEEN CHAIRMAN OF THE CHINESE TEXTBOOKS COMMITTEE SINCE 1986.

MORE IMPROVEMENTS IN EMPLOYMENT LAW PROPOSED

* * * * *

AN AMENDMENT BILL SEEKING TO IMPROVE PROTECTION FOR WORKERS AND TO CLARIFY SOME EXISTING PROVISIONS IN THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE WAS PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE TODAY (FRIDAY).

THE EMPLOYMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL 1989 WILL BE INTRODUCED INTO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL NEXT MONTH.

UNDER THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS, THE DISTINCTION BETWEEN MANUAL AND NON-MANUAL EMPLOYEES WILL BE REMOVED SO THAT ALL EMPLOYEES WILL BE PROTECTED BY THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE.

THIS WILL ALSO HAVE THE EFFECT OF EXTENDING THE COVERAGE OF THE ORDINANCE TO ALL NON-MANUAL EMPLOYEES REGARDLESS OF THE LEVEL OF THEIR WAGES.

BUT FOR THE PURPOSE OF CALCULATING LONG SERVICE PAYMENT AND SEVERANCE PAYMENT, WAGES IN EXCESS OF \$15,000 A MONTH FOR ANY EMPLOYEE WILL NOT BE TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT.

THE BILL ALSO AMENDS THE DEFINITION OF "CONTINUOUS EMPLOYMENT" TO COVER ALL EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE WORKED A TOTAL OF 18 HOURS A WEEK IN ANY PERIOD OF FOUR CONSECUTIVE WEEKS.

THIS WILL EXTEND THE PROTECTION OF THE ORDINANCE TO THE MAJORITY OF REGULAR PART-TIME EMPLOYEES.

FOR GREATER FLEXIBILITY AND TO SET A TIME LIMIT ON PROLONGED SHORT-TIME WORK, THE DEFINITION OF "LAY-OFF" WILL ALSO BE AMENDED.

AN EMPLOYEE WILL BE DEEMED TO BE LAID OFF IF HE IS NOT PROVIDED WITH WORK ON MORE THAN HALF OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF NORMAL WORKING DAYS IN FOUR CONSECUTIVE WEEKS, OR ON MORE THAN ONE-THIRD OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF WORKING DAYS IN 26 CONSECUTIVE WEEKS.

THE BILL ALSO SEEKS TO REMOVE THE CAUSE OF UNNECESSARY DISPUTES ARISING OUT OF MISUNDERSTANDING OR UNCERTAINTY OVER THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT, WHICH HAVE BEEN AGREED IN WRITING.

IF A CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT IS IN WRITING THE EMPLOYER WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE A COPY OF THE WRITTEN CONTRACT TO HIS EMPLOYEE.

ON MATERNITY PROTECTION, IT IS PROPOSED THAT A QUALIFYING PERIOD OF 12 WEEKS OF CONTINUOUS SERVICE WILL BE REQUIRED BEFORE A PREGNANT EMPLOYEE WHO HAS GIVEN NOTICE OF HER INTENTION TO TAKE MATERNITY LEAVE IS PROTECTED FROM TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

THE BILL ALSO CLARIFIES THE DEFINITION OF PAY FOR A STATUTORY HOLIDAY. THE NEW DEFINITION IS THAT THE PAY SHALL BE A SUM EQUIVALENT TO THE WAGES EARNED BY THE EMPLOYEE ON A FULL WORKING DAY.

FURTHERMORE, THE BILL PROPOSES TO ALLOW FOR THE OFF-SETTING OF AN EMPLOYER'S CONTRIBUTION TO ALL FORMS OF RETIREMENT SCHEMES FROM HIS SEVERANCE PAYMENT OR LONG SERVICE PAYMENT.

SWD PUBLISHES GUIDE FOR PRIVATE GUARDIANS
* * * * *

THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT (SWD) HAS PRODUCED A GUIDE FOR PRIVATE GUARDIANS IN CONNECTION WITH THE MENTAL HEALTH (GUARDIANSHIP) REGULATIONS 1989, WHICH COME INTO OPERATION TODAY (FRIDAY).

A SWD SPOKESMAN SAID THE GUARDIANSHIP SCHEME IS A NEW PROVISION IN THE MENTAL HEALTH ORDINANCE. ITS PURPOSE IS TO PROMOTE THE WELFARE OF PATIENTS WITH A MENTAL DISORDER AND TO PROTECT OTHER PERSONS IN THE COMMUNITY.

"UNDER THE SCHEME, IF IT IS CONSIDERED NECESSARY BY THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE THAT IT IS IN THE INTERESTS OF THE WELFARE OF A MENTALLY DISORDERED PATIENT WHO IS AGED 18 AND ABOVE OR FOR THE PROTECTION OF OTHER PERSONS, THE PATIENT MAY BE RECEIVED INTO GUARDIANSHIP," HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED THAT A GUARDIAN HAD THE POWERS TO REQUIRE THE PATIENT TO LIVE AT A SPECIFIED PLACE; TO REQUIRE THE PATIENT TO ATTEND MEDICAL TREATMENT, OCCUPATION, EDUCATION OR TRAINING; AND TO REQUIRE ACCESS TO THE PATIENT TO BE GIVEN, AT ANY PLACE WHERE THE PATIENT WAS LIVING, TO ANY REGISTERED MEDICAL PRACTITIONER, APPROVED SOCIAL WORKER OR OTHER SPECIFIED PERSON.

HE SAID A RELATIVE OR A FRIEND OF THE PATIENT MAY APPLY TO BE A GUARDIAN PROVIDED THE PERSON:

- UNDERSTANDS THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF A GUARDIAN AND IS WILLING TO SHOULDER SUCH RESPONSIBILITIES;
- IS ABOVE THE AGE OF 25;
- IS MATURE WITH REASONABLE MENTAL AND PHYSICAL HEALTH;
- HAS NO FINANCIAL AND SELF INTEREST IN THE PATIENT;
- HAS A FIXED ADDRESS; AND
- IS LIKELY TO LIVE IN HONG KONG DURING THE TWO-YEAR GUARDIANSHIP PERIOD.

"THE GUARDIAN HAS NO POWER TO MANAGE OR CONTROL THE PATIENT'S FINANCIAL MATTERS OR PROPERTY. HOWEVER, A GUARDIAN MAY, WHERE NECESSARY, APPLY TO THE HIGH COURT FOR AN ORDER TO ARRANGE THE PROPERTY AND ESTATE OF THE PATIENT SUBJECT TO THE DIRECTION OF THE HIGH COURT," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

"THE GUARDIANSHIP WILL REST IN THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE IF THE GUARDIAN DIES OR GIVES WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE DIRECTOR TO RELINQUISH HIS FUNCTIONS.

/"THE POWER

"THE POWER OF GUARDIAN WILL BE SUSPENDED WHEN THE PATIENT IS ADMITTED INTO OR IS DETAINED IN A MENTAL HOSPITAL AS A VOLUNTARY PATIENT."

THE SPOKESMAN FURTHER EXPLAINED A PRIVATE GUARDIAN WHO WITHOUT REASONABLE EXCUSE, CONTRAVENED OR FAILED TO CARRY OUT THE DUTIES OF A GUARDIAN WAS LIABLE TO A FINE OF \$1,000 AND IMPRISONMENT FOR THREE MONTHS.

"WHEN A SUITABLE GUARDIAN IS NOT AVAILABLE, A SOCIAL WORKER OF SWD CAN ACT AS A GUARDIAN," HE NOTED.

MEANWHILE, THE SWD HAS CREATED 14 SOCIAL WORKER POSTS TO CARRY OUT NEW PROVISIONS IN THE MENTAL HEALTH ORDINANCE. ADDITIONAL POSTS WILL BE CREATED AS THE NEED ARISES.

Knight Bachelor

The Honourable Mr Justice Derek CONS

Mr Justice Cons was born in the United Kingdom and joined the Hong Kong Government as a magistrate in 1955. He became a District Judge in 1966, a High Court Judge in 1972 and a Justice of Appeal in 1980. He was appointed Vice-President of the Court of Appeal in 1986.
