GOVERNOR RETURNING TOMORROW

THE GOVERNOR, SIR EDWARD YOUDE, WILL RETURN TO HONG KONG TOMORROW (SUNDAY) AFTER ATTENDING ANOTHER TWO DAYS OF SINO-BRITISH TALKS ON THE FUTURE OF HONG KONG.

SIR EDWARD WILL BE TRAVELLING ON FLIGHT CA 101, ETA 11.45 AM.

A FACILITY HAS BEEN LAID ON FOR PHOTOGRAPHERS AND CAMERAMEN TO COVER SIR EDWARD'S RETURN. MEDIA REPRESENTATIVES WISHING TO MAKE USE OF THE FACILITY ARE REQUESTED TO ASSEMBLE IN THE AIRPORT PRESS CONFERENCE ROOM NOT LATER THAN 10.45 AM.

GIS OFFICERS WILL BE ON HAND TO ASSIST.

PERSUASION MORE POWERFUL THAN COMPULSION - BRAY  
\* \* \* \*

THE POWER OF PERSUASION IS GREATER THAN THAT OF COMPULSION IN CONSUMER PROTECTION AND EDUCATION, THE SECRETARY FOR HOME AFFAIRS, MR DENIS BRAY, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING ON THE GOVERNMENT'S ROLE IN CONSUMER PROTECTION AT A SEMINAR ON CONSUMER RIGHTS, MR BRAY SAID THAT HONG KONG WAS A FREE ECONOMY MARKET WITH MINIMUM GOVERNMENT INTERVENTION.

+WITHIN THIS ENVIRONMENT OF A FREE SOCIETY AND A FREE ECONOMY, GOVERNMENT SEEKS TO ASSIST THE CONSUMER COUNCIL BY WAY OF A SUBVENTION,+ HE SAID.

THE PROPOSED SUBVENTION FOR 1984-85, AT \$10.1 MILLION, IS A FOURFOLD INCREASE OVER THE \$2 MILLION ALLOTTED TO THE COUNCIL WHEN IT WAS ESTABLISHED IN 1974.

+THIS INCREASE DEMONSTRATES A VOTE OF CONFIDENCE IN THE ABILITY OF THE COUNCIL IN SERVING THE PUBLIC AND IN THE ABILITY OF THE COUNCIL, ACTIVELY SUPPORTED BY THE GENERAL PUBLIC, TO FUND SOME OF ITS ACTIVITIES IN RESPONSE TO POPULAR DEMAND, SUCH AS THE ISSUE OF CHOICE,+ HE SAID.

MR BRAY RECALLED THAT THE COUNCIL WAS SET UP IN RESPONSE TO THREE NEEDS IDENTIFIED BY THE GOVERNMENT:

- (1) THE NEED FOR THE BUILDING UP AND THE MAINTENANCE OF A STOREHOUSE OF INFORMATION ON PRICES OF A SELECTED RANGE OF COMMODITIES ;
- (2) THE NEED FOR AN ORGANISATION WHICH COULD ACT AS A CLEARING HOUSE FOR COMPLAINTS AND DRAWING ATTENTION TO WHAT WERE CLEAR CASES OF PROFITEERING ;  
AND

/(3) THE NEED .....

- (3) THE NEED FOR A BODY TO BE SET UP WHICH COULD BE A SOUNDING BOARD FOR CONSUMER OPINIONS TO ARRIVE AT A REASONABLE IDEA OF WHAT PEOPLE REGARDED AS UNSCRUPULOUS PRACTICE.

+IT IS THROUGH THE INDIRECT HELP OF GOVERNMENT IN SUBSIDISING SOME OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COUNCIL, THAT THE COUNCIL IS ABLE TO BE MOST EFFECTIVE IN CONSUMER PROTECTION AND IN EDUCATING THE PUBLIC THROUGH THE DISSEMINATION OF REGULAR, IMPARTIAL AND OBJECTIVE INFORMATION AND VIEWPOINTS,+ HE SAID.

MORE SCHOOLS IN TAI PO PLANNED  
\* \* \* \*

THERE ARE PLANS TO BUILD NINE PRIMARY AND EIGHT SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN TAI PO BY 1990 TO MEET THE DEMAND FOR EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES, THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR NEW TERRITORIES, MR IAN MACPHERSON, SAID THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING.

OF THESE, A PRIMARY SCHOOL IN KWONG FUK ESTATE WILL BE COMPLETED IN JULY THIS YEAR AND IS EXPECTED TO START OPERATION IN SEPTEMBER.

MR MACPHERSON WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE TAI PO PUBLIC SCHOOL IN KWONG FUK ESTATE.

HE SAID TAI PO WAS UNDERGOING RAPID DEVELOPMENT, AND THE TRANSFORMATION OF AN OLD MARKET TOWN INTO A NEW TOWN WAS ACCOMPANIED BY AN INFLUX OF RESIDENTS FROM OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT.

KWONG FUK ESTATE, FOR INSTANCE, IS ONE OF THE NEW PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES IN TAI PO AND WILL EVENTUALLY HAVE A POPULATION OF 35 000 OF WHICH ONE THIRD WILL BE OF SCHOOL AGE.

MR MACPHERSON SAID THIS DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTIC WAS LIKELY TO BE TYPICAL FOR THE DISTRICT AS A WHOLE.

HE SAID THE ADDITIONAL SCHOOLS WOULD PROVIDE TAI PO'S CHILDREN WITH PROPER EDUCATIONAL PREMISES AND FACILITIES TO PREPARE THEM FOR A FULL ROLE IN SOCIETY.

HE SAID THAT THE RE-OPENING OF THE TAI PO PUBLIC SCHOOL -- WHICH HAS A LONG HISTORY DATING BACK TO 1946 -- IN KWONG FUK ESTATE POPULATED MAINLY BY NEW RESIDENTS FROM OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT WAS ALL THE MORE MEANINGFUL.

THIS WAS BECAUSE A LOCAL TRADITIONAL ORGANISATION WAS TAKING THE LEAD IN PROMOTING SOCIAL INTEGRATION BETWEEN THE OLD AND NEW RESIDENTS HERE, HE SAID.

+THIS SPIRIT IS MOST ESSENTIAL FOR A DEVELOPING NEW TOWN AS IT FOSTERS SOCIAL HARMONY AND A SENSE OF IDENTITY WHICH WOULD HELP DEVELOP THE SORT OF HAPPY COMMUNITY WE ALL AIM FOR,+ HE SAID.

ATHLETIC TRAINING SCHEME TO START SOON

\* \* \* \* \*

A 10-MONTH ATHLETIC TRAINING SCHEME FOR RESIDENTS OF THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT ON HONG KONG ISLAND WILL START NEXT MONTH.

SOME 3 000 YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN ARE EXPECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SCHEME WHICH IS AIMED AT IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL TRACK AND FIELD STARS.

KNOWN AS THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OUTSTANDING ATHLETIC SCHEME, IT IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE RECREATION AND SPORTS SERVICE (RSS) OF THE RECREATION AND CULTURE DEPARTMENT AND THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT RECREATION AND SPORTS COUNCIL, WITH SAN MIGUEL AS THE SPONSOR.

THE RECREATION AND SPORT OFFICER OF THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE OF THE RSS, MR LEE SHEK-YUE, DESCRIBED THE SCHEME AS A MAJOR EVENT FOR THE DISTRICT.

+IT IS A COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAMME WITH VARIOUS TRAINING SESSIONS AND PERSONAL EVALUATION OF PROGRESS AND RECORDS TO ENSURE THAT PARTICIPANTS HAVE UNDERGONE CONTINUOUS TRAINING BEFORE TAKING PART IN COMPETITIONS,+ MR LEE SAID.

THOSE WITH GOOD RESULTS WILL BE AWARDED CERTIFICATES OF MERIT.

TRAINING WILL BE PROVIDED FOR 100- AND 800-METRE RUNS, LONG JUMP, HIGH JUMP, SHOT PUT AND AEROBIC EXERCISES.

PARTICIPANTS WILL BE DIVIDED INTO SIX GROUPS ACCORDING TO THEIR AGES AND SEX.

MR LEE SAID THAT FOLLOWING INTENSIVE TRAINING, THE TOP 10 FROM EACH GROUP WILL MEET IN OPEN COMPETITIONS EARLY NEXT YEAR FOR THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT +IRON MAN+ AND +IRON WOMAN+ TITLES.

+BESIDES GETTING A TROPHY, THE CHAMPION OF EACH GROUP WILL BE RECOMMENDED FOR ADVANCED TRAINING AT THE JUBILEE SPORTS CENTRE,+ HE SAID.

THE OPENING CEREMONY FOR THE TRAINING SCHEME WILL BE HELD ON APRIL 1 AT THE ABERDEEN SPORTS GROUND WHERE MEMBERS OF THE HONG KONG AMATEUR ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION WILL GIVE A DEMONSTRATION OF VARIOUS TRACK-AND-FIELD EVENTS.

A TOTAL OF 268 CORRECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT OFFICERS RECEIVED WELCOME NEWS LAST (FRIDAY) NIGHT WHEN THEY WERE TOLD OF THEIR PROMOTION FROM ASSISTANT OFFICERS II TO ASSISTANT OFFICERS I WITH IMMEDIATE EFFECT.

THE ANNOUNCEMENT WAS MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF CORRECTIONAL SERVICES, MR THOMAS GARNER, AT THE FIRST ANNUAL STAFF DINNER OF THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES OFFICERS' ASSOCIATION HELD AT A CHINESE RESTAURANT IN CENTRAL.

VILLAGERS URGED TO BOIL WELL WATER BEFORE DRINKING

VILLAGERS IN REMOTE AREAS IN THE NEW TERRITORIES AND OUTLYING ISLANDS ARE BEING ADVISED TO BOIL ALL WATER DRAWN FROM WELLS AND STREAMS BEFORE DRINKING.

WELL AND STREAM WATER MIGHT CONTAIN BACTERIA HARMFUL TO HEALTH, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT SAID.

HE ALSO WARNED PICNICKERS AND OTHER VISITORS TO THE AREAS ABOUT THE DANGER.

POLLUTION OF THE WATER HAD BEEN CAUSED BY CARELESS DUMPING OF AGRICULTURAL WASTE AND RUBBISH AND POOR SANITATION IN THE SURROUNDING AREA OF WELLS, HE SAID.

NTSD STAFF ARE CARRYING A DAILY CHLORINATION OF SOME 160 WELLS LIKELY TO BE USED BY VILLAGERS, HE ADDED.

WARNING SIGNS ARE ALSO BEING PUT UP NEAR WELLS WHERE NECESSARY, AND HEALTH INSPECTORS ARE CONSTANTLY VISITING VILLAGERS TO GIVE THEM ADVICE ABOUT DRINKING WATER OTHER THAN MAINS WATER WHERE STANDPIPES ARE AVAILABLE.

COPIES OF INFORMATION LEAFLET ON THE SAFE USE OF WELL WATER ARE ALSO BEING DISTRIBUTED TO THE VILLAGERS DURING THE VISITS, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

NEW BUS TERMINUS FOR BRAEMAR HILL ROAD

A BUS TERMINUS IS TO BE BUILT ON BRAEMAR HILL ROAD NEAR THE SHOPPING CENTRE AT BRAEMAR HILL MANSIONS.

IT WILL CONSIST OF THREE 100-METRE-LONG BAYS, TWO PASSENGER PLATFORMS, FOOTWAYS AND A REGULATOR'S KIOSK.

A 60-METRE-LONG ACCESS ROAD FROM BRAEMAR HILL ROAD WILL ALSO BE BUILT.

THE TERMINUS WILL BE FOR THE USE OF RESIDENTS OF THE BRAEMAR HILL AND TIN HAU TEMPLE AREAS WHICH DO NOT HAVE ONE AT PRESENT.

THESE AREAS ARE SERVED BY TWO CIRCULAR BUS ROUTES FROM CENTRAL AND NORTH POINT.

WORK ON THE PROJECT WILL START IN AUGUST AND BE COMPLETED BY EARLY 1985.

A NOTICE CONCERNING THE PROPOSED BUS TERMINUS PROJECT IS PUBLISHED IN THE LATEST GOVERNMENT GAZETTE.
