ROAD TRAFFIC (TAXIS, PUBLIC OMNIBUSES AND PUBLIC CARS) REGULATIONS, 1964.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 3, 4 and 5A of the Road Traffic Ordinance, 1957, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

PART I.

CITATION, INTERPRETATION AND APPLICATION.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Taxis, Public Omnibuses and Public Cars) Regulations, 1964, and shall come into operation on the commencement of the Road Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance, 1964. Citation and commencement. (23 of 1964).

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation.
 "Authority" means the Commissioner of Police or any person who is declared by any enactment to be the authority for the purposes of these regulations and any person to whom the powers and functions of the Authority have been delegated by him;

"company" has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the Companies Ordinance; (Cap. 32).

"driver" means the driver of a taxi or of a public omnibus or of a public car or of a dual purpose vehicle as the case may be;

"driving licence" has the meaning assigned to it by the Ordinance;

"Hong Kong taxi" means a taxi designated as a Hong Kong taxi in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of regulation 7;

"Kowloon taxi" means a taxi designated as a Kowloon taxi in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of regulation 7;

"New Territories taxi" means a taxi designated as a New Territories taxi in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of regulation 7;

"New Territories taxi stand" means a taxi stand designated as a New Territories taxi stand in accordance with the provisions of regulation 14;

"Public car" includes a dual purpose vehicle licensed for use as a public car and as a goods vehicle;

"registered", "registered owner" and "registration mark" have the meaning assigned to them by regulation 2 of the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) Regulations, 1956; (G.N.A. 89/56).

"reserved taxi stand" means a taxi stand designated as a reserved taxi stand in accordance with the provisions of regulation 13;

"taxi" includes a dual purpose vehicle registered for use as a taxi and as a goods vehicle;

"taxi stand" means a place set aside by the Authority in exercise of the powers conferred on him by regulation 12 as a place where taxis may stand or ply for hire and be available for hire and includes a New Territories taxi stand and a reserved taxi stand.

Application.

3. These regulations shall apply to a public omnibus and to a public car only when such vehicle is being hired or intended to be hired for the carriage of passengers under a contract express or implied, other than a hire purchase agreement, for the use of the vehicle as a whole at or for a fixed or agreed rate or sum.

PART II.

ISSUE AND REVOCATION OF VEHICLE LICENCES.

Prohibition of issue of licences. (G.N.A. 89/56).

4. The Authority shall not issue a vehicle licence in respect of a motor vehicle as a taxi, as a public omnibus or as a public car in accordance with the provisions of the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) Regulations, 1956, unless he is satisfied that—

- (a) the motor vehicle is constructed and maintained in accordance with the provisions of every enactment relating to the construction and maintenance of such motor vehicles;
- (b) the applicant has made suitable arrangements to the satisfaction of the Authority for the maintenance of the motor vehicle;
- (c) the applicant has provided suitable accommodation to the satisfaction of the Authority for the motor vehicle or has made such arrangements as will enable him to provide such accommodation within twelve months of the date of the application for the vehicle licence;
- (d) the applicant is of good business repute and has financial resources adequate for the purposes of maintaining the vehicle in accordance with the foregoing requirements of this regulation and of providing and maintaining, with the vehicle, an efficient taxi service, public omnibus service or public car service, as the case may be; and
- (e) the motor vehicle can be licensed for the carriage of not less than three passengers.

Refusal to issue licence

5. The Authority may refuse to issue a vehicle licence in respect of a motor vehicle as a taxi, as a public omnibus or as a public car if—

- (a) the applicant has been convicted of an indictable offence;

- (b) the applicant appears to the Authority to be unfit to hold such a vehicle licence by reason of the fact that he or any person in partnership with him or any company of which he was at the material time a responsible official—

(i) has been convicted of an offence in relation to the use of a motor vehicle as a taxi, as a public omnibus or as a public car or for the carriage of passengers for hire or reward; or

(ii) was the registered owner of a taxi, a public omnibus or a public car, the vehicle licence in respect of which was revoked by reason of his conviction of any offence against any enactment under which the vehicle licence was granted, failure on the part of the registered owner to comply with any conditions contained in the vehicle licence or conviction of the registered owner of an indictable offence; or

- (c) the Authority is satisfied that by reason of the number of motor vehicles in respect of which vehicle licences as taxis, as public omnibuses or as public cars generally or as taxis, as public omnibuses or as public cars of the carrying capacity of the motor vehicle for which a licence is sought had been issued or for any other reason it would not be in the public interest that the motor vehicle should be so licensed.

6. (1) The Authority may at any time revoke the vehicle licence in respect of a motor vehicle as a taxi, as a public omnibus or as a public car if— Revocation of licence.

- (a) the registered owner or, where the registered owner is a partnership, one of the partners or, where the registered owner is a company, a responsible officer of the company has been convicted of any offence in connexion with the use of a motor vehicle as a taxi, as a public omnibus or as a public car or for the carriage of passengers for hire or reward;
- (b) the registered owner has been convicted of an indictable offence;
- (c) the registered owner has been declared a bankrupt or has committed an act of bankruptcy or, where the registered owner is a company, has gone into liquidation; or
- (d) drivers of vehicles owned by the registered owner for more than twelve months prior to the date of revocation have been convicted of offences in connexion with the use of the vehicles as taxis, as public omnibuses or as public cars in such manner as would indicate that the registered owner is not exercising or has not exercised adequate control over such drivers.

(2) On any such revocation, the Authority shall serve by registered post, addressed to the last known address of the registered owner, notice in writing of such revocation and on the posting of such notice, the vehicle licence which has been revoked shall thereupon become null and void and of no effect:

Provided that on any such revocation the Authority may make a refund of a portion of the fee paid for the vehicle licence as if the vehicle licence had been surrendered to him, in accordance with the provisions of regulation 13 of the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) Regulations, 1956.

7. (1) On the issue of a vehicle licence in respect of a motor vehicle as a taxi, the Authority shall designate the vehicle as—

- (a) a Hong Kong taxi;
- (b) a Kowloon taxi; or
- (c) a New Territories taxi,

and shall endorse the vehicle licence, in English and in Chinese characters, with such designation and may at any time thereafter alter or amend such designation.

(2) No person as registered owner or as driver shall cause or permit a taxi to stand or to ply for hire or to be available for hire in any area or place other than in an area or place shown in the third column of the First Schedule opposite the designation of that taxi shown in the second column of that Schedule or in contravention of the provisions of that Schedule.

(3) No person as registered owner or as driver shall use or cause or permit to be used a tax for the carriage of a passenger from any place where that taxi is not permitted to stand or ply for hire to any other place whether in that area or in another area.

(4) Nothing in this regulation shall prevent a taxi from being used for the carriage of a passenger to a destination in an area where that taxi is not permitted to stand or ply for hire or to be available for hire if the taxi was hired in an area or at a place where it is so permitted.

8. On the issue of a vehicle licence in respect of a motor vehicle as a taxi, as a public omnibus or as a public car or at any time during which the vehicle licence is valid, the Authority may impose such conditions as he shall consider necessary as to—

- (a) in the case of a taxi, the place at which or from which the taxi shall stand or ply for hire;
- (b) in the case of a public omnibus or a public car, the place where the vehicle shall be available for hire;

- (c) the colour of the vehicle;
- (d) in the case of a taxi, the badge or other means of identification which shall be supplied by the person to whom the vehicle licence is issued to the driver of the taxi and the display thereof by the driver; and
- (e) in the case of a taxi, the exhibition of a plate or an inscription showing the designation of the taxi in accordance with the provisions of regulation 7 and whether the vehicle licence in respect of the vehicle is endorsed in accordance with the provisions of regulations 9, in such manner as the Authority shall consider necessary.

9. (1) On the issue of a vehicle licence in respect of a motor vehicle as a taxi or at any time thereafter the Authority on the application of the owner of the motor vehicle and on payment of an additional licence fee of one hundred dollars for each year of the licence or a proportionate part of such fee calculated in accordance with the provisions of the first part of the Fourth Schedule to the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) Regulations, 1956, may endorse the vehicle licence with the words "PERMITTED TO USE RESERVED TAXI STANDS" in English and the characters "准予使用指定之計程汽車停車處" and at any time thereafter may cancel any such designation without refund of such fee or any part thereof.

(2) Any taxi the vehicle licence in respect of which is endorsed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) may stand or ply for hire or be available for hire in a reserved taxi stand.

(3) No person as registered owner or as driver shall cause or permit a taxi to stand or ply for hire or to be available for hire in a reserved taxi stand unless the vehicle licence in respect of the taxi is endorsed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1).

10. The powers and duties conferred on the Authority by regulations 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 shall apply on the transfer of the ownership of a motor vehicle registered as a taxi, as a public omnibus or as a public car as if the person to whom the ownership of the motor vehicle has been transferred was applying for the issue to him of a vehicle licence in respect of the vehicle.

11. No fee shall be charged for the endorsement of a vehicle licence in accordance with the provisions of regulation 7 or for the amendment or cancellation of any endorsement made in accordance with the provisions of that regulation or of regulation 9.

PART III.

TAXI STANDS.

Setting aside
taxi stands.

12. (1) The Authority may set aside any part of a road as a place where taxis may stand or ply for hire.

(2) Every place so set aside shall be delineated by a line four inches wide, composed of sections alternately yellow and white, each three feet long, enclosing the place on all sides to which access could lawfully be obtained by a motor vehicle and by affixing at the end of the place nearest to the on-coming traffic and facing the on-coming traffic a sign in the form shown in diagram 1 of the Second Schedule and, where the place is more than thirty feet in length, a similar sign at the opposite end, facing in the opposite direction.

(3) The Commissioner may cause to be affixed to a post, on which a sign is erected in accordance with paragraph (2) or with regulation 13, a notice restricting the setting aside to such hours as may be stipulated in the notice and, in such event, at all times not within such hours, the place to which such sign refers shall be deemed to have been designated as a parking place in accordance with regulation 4 of the Road Traffic (Parking and Waiting) Regulations, 1958.

(4) On any such line, studs may be placed not less than ten inches nor more than twenty-eight inches apart, each stud being white, silver or light grey in colour and square or circular in plan and the size of a square stud not being less than three and seven-eighth inches nor more than four and one quarter inches in length and the diameter of a circular stud not being less than three and seven-eighth inches nor more than four and one quarter inches and each stud being so fixed that it does not project more than five-eighths of an inch above the road at its highest point nor more than one quarter of an inch at its edge.

13. The Authority may designate any taxi stand as a reserved taxi stand by affixing, in substitution for the sign affixed or to be affixed in accordance with the provisions of regulation 12, a sign in the form shown in diagram 2 of the Second Schedule.

14. The Authority may designate any taxi stand in Kowloon or in New Kowloon as a New Territories taxi stand by affixing, in substitution for the sign affixed or to be affixed in accordance with the provisions of regulation 12, a sign in the form shown in diagram 3 of the Second Schedule.

Saving,

15. (1) A taxi stand shall not be deemed to have ceased to be delineated in accordance with the provisions of regulation 12 or to have been designated in accordance with the provisions of regulation 13 or of

regulation 14 by reason only of the imperfection or partial displacement or discolouration of any line indicating the taxi stand or of any sign so long as the general indication of the taxi stand is not thereby materially impaired.

(2) Any place which, immediately preceding the coming into operation of these regulations, is, under the Road Traffic (Taxis and Hire Cars) Regulations, 1960, a place set aside as a place where taxis may stand or ply for hire or a place designated as a reserved taxi stand or as a New Territories taxi stand, shall be deemed to have been so set aside or designated, as the case may be, under these regulations. (G.N.A. 27/60).

(3) Every vehicle which, immediately preceding the coming into operation of these regulations, is a vehicle designated as a Hong Kong taxi, a Kowloon taxi or a New Territories taxi under regulation 6 of the Road Traffic (Taxis and Hire Cars) Regulations, 1960, shall be deemed to have been so designated under regulation 7 of these regulations and the vehicle licence endorsed accordingly; and any condition imposed in the case of any vehicle under regulation 7 of, and any endorsement of a vehicle licence under regulation 8 of, the Road Traffic (Taxis and Hire Cars) Regulations, 1960, in force or valid immediately preceding the coming into operation of these regulations, shall be deemed to have been imposed or endorsed under regulation 8 or 9, as the case may be, of these regulations. (G.N.A. 27/60).

(4) In any proceedings for a contravention of these regulations in respect of a taxi stand, the taxi stand shall be deemed to have been set aside and delineated in accordance with the provisions of regulation 12 and, where the taxi stand is a reserved taxi stand or a New Territories taxi stand, to have been designated in accordance with the provisions of regulation 13 or 14, as the case may be, unless the contrary is proved.

(5) The Authority may at any time revoke, amend or temporarily suspend the delineation of a taxi stand or the designation of a reserved taxi stand or of a New Territories taxi stand by the removal of or defacement of any signs erected thereon or by the erection of appropriate signs.

PART IV.

EQUIPMENT AND USE OF TAXIS.

16. (1) Every taxi shall be fitted with a taximeter of a design and construction approved by the Authority and which in every respect complies with the provisions of these regulations. Taximeter.

(2) Every taximeter shall be fitted to the taxi in such position and in such manner as may be approved by the Authority.

(3) No taximeter shall be fitted to a taxi without the prior approval of the Authority.

(4) If the registered owner of a taxi removes the taximeter from a taxi or ceases to use the taximeter, he shall notify the Authority within twenty-four hours of such removal or cessation.

Construction of taximeter.

17. (1) Every taximeter shall be—

- (a) so constructed that it may be effectually sealed to the satisfaction of the Authority; and
- (b) clearly marked on the exterior thereof with the measurement of the diameter of the road wheel, with fully inflated tyre thereon, by which the taximeter is driven and the number of teeth on the driving pinion which operates the taximeter.

(2) Every taximeter shall be provided with an indicator (hereinafter referred to as the "flag") of a size not less than two inches by one inch showing the words "for hire" or the word "taxi".

(3) Every taximeter shall be so constructed that the flag can be placed in any one of the following positions—

- (a) the flag is raised in such manner that it is clearly visible by any person standing in front of a taxi at a distance of not more than twenty yards and, at all times during which the lights of the taxi are required to be illuminated, the flag is adequately illuminated and the mechanism of the taximeter is not in motion;
- (b) the flag is lowered to the recording position in such manner that it is not visible outside the taxi and the mechanism of the taximeter is in motion; and
- (c) the flag is placed in the non-recording position in such manner that it is not visible outside the taxi and the mechanism of the taximeter is not in motion.

Sealing and testing of taximeters.

18. (1) Every taximeter shall be—

- (a) tested by the Authority before it is fitted to a taxi and at intervals of not more than six months thereafter; and
- (b) stamped and sealed by the Authority after every such test.

(2) The registered owner of every taxi shall cause the taxi to be made available at such place and time as the Authority may from time to time require for the purpose of inspecting, testing and regulating the taximeter fitted therein.

Lighting of taximeter.

19. (1) Every taxi shall be provided with a lamp so placed on the taximeter as to render the readings on the dial of the taximeter easily legible at all times of the day and night and such lamp shall be maintained in proper working order and condition.

(2) The driver shall keep such lamp properly lit through any part of a hiring which is during such time as the lights on the taxi are required to be illuminated and shall light such lamp during a hiring at any other time at the request of a hirer so as to enable the hirer to read the dial of the taximeter.

20. No person as registered owner or as driver shall use or permit or suffer to be used a taxi if—

Offences in relation to taximeter.

- (a) the stamp or seal of the Authority on the taximeter has been broken;
- (b) the taximeter has not been tested by the Authority within the previous six months;
- (c) the road wheel of the taxi by which the taximeter is driven is, with fully inflated tyre thereon, of a diameter different from that for which the taximeter has been designed, geared and tested or that marked on the taximeter;
- (d) the taximeter was affixed thereon without the prior approval of the Authority; or
- (e) the taximeter does not comply in every way with the provisions of these regulations.

21. (1) The driver of a taxi shall ensure that—

Use of taximeter.

- (a) if the taxi is available for hire, the flag is raised;
- (b) if the taxi is hired, the flag is lowered to the recording position; and
- (c) if the taxi is neither hired nor available for hire, the flag is placed in the non-recording position in such manner that it is not visible outside the taxi.

(2) The driver of a taxi as soon as the taxi has been hired shall lower the flag to the recording position and as soon as the hiring has terminated shall raise the flag or lower it to the non-recording position.

(3) For the purposes of paragraph (2) the hiring of the taxi shall commence from the time at which the journey begins or the time at which the taxi is first made immediately available to the hirer at the time and place appointed by the hirer, whichever first occurs.

(4) If the taximeter should record a fare clearly higher than is as proportioned to the mileage covered, the hirer of the taxi shall not be obliged to pay to the driver more than the legal fare chargeable in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.

Equipment.

22. When a taxi is standing or plying for hire there shall be displayed so as to be clearly visible to any passenger travelling in the taxi and legible by him—

- (a) a plate or plates showing the registration mark of the taxi, the number of passengers permitted to travel in the taxi and the designation of the taxi in accordance with the provisions of regulation 7;
- (b) a card or other device exhibiting, to the satisfaction of the Authority, a photograph of the driver, his full name in English and in Chinese characters and the number of his driving licence; and
- (c) a table showing the scale of fares chargeable in respect of the use of the taxi.

Soliciting.

23. No driver or person acting or purporting to act on behalf of the driver of a taxi standing or plying for hire shall by speaking, making any noise, sounding any instrument or by any other means attract or endeavour to attract any person in order to induce such person to make use of the taxi.

Standing and plying for hire.

24. No driver shall ply or stand for hire on a road except—

- (a) when the taxi is on a taxi stand; or
- (b) when hailed by an intending passenger while proceeding, after the conclusion of a hire, to a taxi stand; or
- (c) when hailed by an intending passenger while proceeding to or from a place where the taxi is garaged.

Hiring.

25. (1) The driver of each of the first two taxis on a taxi stand shall sit in or stand beside his taxi and shall be ready to be hired at once by any person.

(2) The driver of every taxi on a taxi stand shall move up his taxi as vacancies occur.

(3) If a person wishes to engage a taxi, the driver of the first taxi on the taxi stand shall accept the hire and, unless the drivers of all the taxis ahead of him in the taxi stand have either been hired or are not in or near their taxis, the driver of a taxi shall not accept a hire:

Provided that where both taxis licensed for the carriage of three passengers and taxis licensed for the carriage of more than three passengers are in the same taxi stand and such person wishes to engage a taxi licensed for the carriage of more than three passengers the provisions of this paragraph shall apply only to taxis licensed to carry more than three passengers.

26. The driver shall not without reasonable excuse—

- (a) refuse or neglect to drive the taxi to any place indicated by the hirer;
- (b) refuse or neglect to carry such number of passengers, not exceeding the number specified in the vehicle licence in respect of the taxi, as he may be required to carry by the hirer;
- (c) when hired to drive to a specified destination, drive to such destination other than by the most direct practicable route;
- (d) at the termination of a hiring, fail to return forthwith by the shortest practicable route either to a taxi stand or to the garage provided for the taxi; or
- (e) when his taxi is hired, permit any person other than the hirer to enter the taxi without the consent of the hirer.

Obligation of taxi driver.

27. (1) The scales of fares for the hiring of taxis shall be as set forth in the Third Schedule.

(2) No registered owner or driver of a taxi shall charge for the hiring of the taxi a fare exceeding the appropriate scale of fares set forth in the Third Schedule.

(3) Light baggage, that is to say, light suitcases, parcels, hat boxes, attache cases and similar articles may be carried inside the taxi and if so carried will be carried free of charge.

28. No person shall—

- (a) hire a taxi, knowing or having reason to believe that he cannot pay the legal charge and with intent to avoid payment of the legal charge; or
- (b) fraudulently endeavour to avoid payment of a legal charge lawfully due from him; or
- (c) having failed or refused to pay the charge demanded by the driver of a taxi, either refuse to give to the driver of the taxi an address at which he can be found or give with intent to deceive, a false address.

Offences by hirers of taxis.

29. (1) A driver shall—

- (a) not carry on the taxi a number of passengers in excess of the number shown in the vehicle licence in respect of the taxi;
- (b) not carry on the taxi any goods other than hand baggage and personal effects except that goods up to a weight not exceeding the weight stipulated in the vehicle licence in respect of the taxi may be carried on a properly constructed carrier of a design and construction previously approved of by the Authority or, in the case of a dual purpose vehicle registered for use

as a taxi and as a goods vehicle in that part of the vehicle set aside for the carriage of goods;

- (c) ensure that any goods carried in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (b) are at all times properly secured;
- (d) not knowingly carry on the taxi any person who is suffering from an infectious or contagious disease or in a dirty condition;
- (e) maintain and keep the interior and exterior of the taxi and all parts thereof including the roof, springs, wheels, cushions, lining, panels, doors, windows and appointments clean and in good order and repair.

(2) Nothing in this regulation shall require the driver of a taxi to carry on the taxi any article or baggage in any part of the taxi in any case where, in the opinion of the driver—

- (a) the nature or condition of the article makes it likely that damage would be caused to the taxi or its furniture; or
- (b) the article cannot be conveniently or safely carried.

30. A driver, when in charge of a taxi, shall—

- (a) be clean in his person and clothing and adequately clothed;
- (b) behave in a civil and orderly manner;
- (c) not smoke on or near the vehicle during a journey or when there are passengers in the vehicle;
- (d) take all reasonable precautions to procure the safety of passengers in or on or alighting from or boarding the vehicle;
- (e) not wilfully deceive or refuse to inform a passenger or intending passenger as to the proper fare and route to any place;
- (f) not congregate or assemble with other drivers to the annoyance of the general public; and
- (g) at all times when the taxi is available for hire or hired, carry not less than nine dollars in notes or in coins of a denomination of one dollar and not less than one dollar in coins of a denomination of ten cents.

31. A driver, when in charge of a taxi, shall—

- (a) while the taxi is not hired, not, without reasonable cause, park his taxi other than in a taxi stand;
- (b) while the taxi is not hired, not loiter or stop elsewhere than on a taxi stand except through accident or unavoidable cause;
- (c) while conveying passengers to or picking passengers up from any place of public amusement or assembly, draw up in order of arrival as near to the door or entrance thereto as is reason-

ably practicable and, subject to any direction by a police officer in uniform, drive the taxi away immediately after the passengers have alighted from or boarded the taxi in such manner as to cause the minimum of obstruction and congestion.

32. (1) No animal other than a dog or a cat and no bird other than a pet bird may be carried in a taxi. Animals in taxis.

(2) No animal or bird may be carried in a taxi unless it is securely caged to the satisfaction of the driver in such manner that it is unable to escape from the cage, to foul the interior of the taxi by any means or to interfere by any means with the interior of the taxi.

(3) No animal or bird may be carried in a taxi if it emits an offensive smell.

(4) The hirer of a taxi shall be responsible for and shall pay for any damage caused to the taxi by any animal or bird carried in the taxi.

PART V.

PUBLIC OMNIBUSES AND PUBLIC CARS.

33. The registered owner or the driver of a public omnibus or a public car shall not cause, permit or suffer the vehicle to stand or ply for hire in any public place or in any place other than the place in which the vehicle is normally accommodated. Public car not to stand or ply for hire.

34. (1) The registered owner of a public omnibus or a public car may hire the vehicle to any person at a rate of hire based on the time during which the vehicle is hired with or without additional charge in respect of the mileage travelled by the vehicle while it is so hired. Hire rate and record of certain particulars.

(2) Before a public omnibus or a public car is hired, the registered owner and hirer shall complete and sign two copies of a document in such form as shall be approved by the Authority which shall contain the following particulars—

- (a) the rate or scale of charges applicable to the hiring;
- (b) a statement of the particulars of the third party risks insurance in respect of the vehicle;
- (c) the names and addresses of the persons who are permitted to drive the vehicle while it is the subject of the hiring and the numbers of the driving licences of such persons.

(3) The registered owner shall retain one copy of the document and shall produce it on demand made by any police officer within three months after the commencement of the hiring.

(4) The hirer shall retain one copy of the document and shall produce it on demand made by a police officer during the continuance of the hiring.

Insurance
and driving
licence.

35. The registered owner of a public omnibus or a public car shall not hire the vehicle to any person unless he is satisfied that—

(a) during the continuance of the hiring there shall be in force in relation to the user of the vehicle by each person whose name appears on the document referred to in regulation 34 as a person permitted to drive the vehicle, such policy of insurance or such a security in respect of third party risks as complies with the Motor Vehicles (Third Party Risks) Ordinance, 1951;

(b) every such person is, in the case of a public omnibus, in possession of a valid driving licence entitling him to drive a public omnibus, and, in the case of a public car, in possession of a valid driving licence entitling him to drive a car of the class specified in regulation 37.

Paid driver.

36. (1) A condition of the hiring of a public omnibus or a public car may be that it shall be driven only by a person in the employ of the registered owner of the vehicle or that such a person is provided to drive the vehicle.

(2) If a public omnibus or a public car is being driven by a person in the employment of the registered owner, such person shall be subject to the provisions of regulation 29 and paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (d) of regulation 30 as if he were the driver of a taxi.

Driving
licences.

37. (1) Subject to paragraph (2), any person may be permitted to drive a public car if he is in possession of a driving licence entitling him to drive a private car.

(2) The registered owner of a public car and any person in the employment of such registered owner may drive a public car only if he is in possession of a driving licence permitting him to drive public cars or taxi.

Overloading.

38. No person shall carry in a public omnibus or a public car a number of passengers or a weight of goods or a number of passengers and a weight of goods in excess of the number and weight shown in the vehicle licence in respect of the vehicle.

PART VI.

LOST PROPERTY.

Finding.

39. (1) Any person who finds any property accidentally left in a taxi, in a public omnibus or in a public car shall immediately hand the same to the driver.

(2) Immediately after the termination of every hiring of a taxi, of a public omnibus or of a public car the driver or, in the case of a public car hired without the services of a driver, the person to whom the public car was returned at the termination of the hiring, shall carefully search the vehicle, or, if careful search is then impracticable, shall look inside the vehicle to ascertain whether any property has been accidentally left therein and if he does not carefully search the vehicle at the termination of the hiring he shall do so as soon as is practicable thereafter.

40. (1) Any driver who finds any property left in a taxi, a public omnibus or a public car or any person to whom any such property is handed shall, within six hours, deposit such property at a police station in the state in which it was found by or handed to him and shall truly state the particulars of such finding: Disposal.

Provided that if such property is sooner claimed by the owner thereof and satisfactory proof of ownership is given, it shall be restored to the owner forthwith instead of being deposited at a police station.

(2) Any property deposited in a police station in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of sections 35, 36 and 38 of the Police Force Ordinance. (Cap. 232).

PART VII.

MISCELLANEOUS, PENALTIES AND REVOCATION.

41. (1) Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Authority made in accordance with the provisions of these regulations within fourteen days of the notification to him by the Authority of such decision, or within such greater period as may be allowed by the Governor in Council, may appeal, by petition, to the Governor in Council and, so far as is practicable, the operation of such a decision shall be suspended until the petition has been heard and determined by the Governor in Council. Appeal.

(2) On any such appeal, the Governor in Council may confirm, amend or reverse the decision of the Authority.

42. (1) Any police officer in uniform of the rank of inspector or above may inspect, at any reasonable time, any taxi, any public omnibus and any public car and the place where the vehicle is normally kept when not hired. Powers of
inspection.

(2) The Director of Fire Services or any officer of the Fire Services Department authorized in writing by him may inspect at any reasonable time any place where a taxi, a public omnibus or a public car is normally kept when not hired.

(3) No person shall obstruct a police officer, the Director of Fire Services or an officer of the Fire Services Department authorized as aforesaid while he is exercising the powers conferred by paragraph (1) or (2).

Offences and penalties.

43. (1) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of regulation 20, 21, 23, 24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 31, 33, 35, 38 or 39 or paragraph (2) or (3) of regulation 7, paragraph (3) of regulation 9, paragraph (4) of regulation 16, paragraph (2) of regulation 18, paragraph (2) of regulation 19, paragraph (2) of regulation 27, paragraph (2), (3) or (4) of regulation 34, paragraph (1) of regulation 40 or paragraph (3) of regulation 42 shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Where by these regulations a motor vehicle is required to comply with any specification or standard or any fitting, device, mark, apparatus or thing is required to be provided, carried or used on a vehicle or the motor vehicle is prohibited from being used either generally or in any specified manner, place or time in accordance with the conditions contained in a licence issued in respect of the motor vehicle, then, and in every such case, if the motor vehicle is upon or used in any road in contravention of the terms of such regulations or of any such conditions, the registered owner, driver and person in charge of the vehicle at the time of such contravention shall be guilty of an offence.

(3) Any person who commits any offence referred to in this regulation shall be liable, in the case of a first conviction for that offence, to a fine of five hundred dollars and imprisonment for three months and, in the case of a second or subsequent conviction for that offence, to a fine of one thousand dollars and imprisonment for six months.

Explanatory Note.

(This Note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

By the Road Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance, 1964, two categories of motor vehicles, namely, hire omnibuses and hire cars, were combined with the existing categories of public omnibuses and public cars under the general heading of public omnibuses and public cars, respectively. This results in the need for consequential alterations in the provisions of the Road Traffic (Taxis and Hire Cars) Regulations, 1960. The present regulations, accordingly, revoke and replace the Road Traffic (Taxis and Hire Cars) Regulations, 1960, by substantially similar provisions in which the consequential changes are made and a new regulation, regulation 3, is added to provide that the provisions should continue to apply, as regards public cars, only to those public cars, which hitherto were known as hire cars, when hired as a whole, but, as regards omnibuses, to extend the regulations to public omnibuses when hired as a whole for the carriage of passengers. This extension to public omnibuses hired as a whole is new. The revoked regulations did not apply to such omnibuses.

2. The opportunity is taken to make one other alteration of substance. Regulation 12(3) enables the Commissioner to authorize the parking of private vehicles in taxi ranks during those periods when the taxis themselves do not use the ranks.

3. Minor typographical errors and omissions in the revoked regulations have been corrected, and regulation 34 (which corresponds to regulation 33) has been reworded to make it clear, as the Road Traffic Ordinance, 1957, does, that a hire agreement itself does not have to be in writing.

BUILDING (VENTILATING SYSTEMS) REGULATIONS, 1964.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 26 of the Buildings Ordinance, 1955, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Building (Ventilating Systems) Regulations, 1964, and shall come into operation on the 23rd day of October, 1964. Citation and commencement.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
“Director” means the Director of Fire Services. Interpretation.

3. (1) Save as provided in paragraph (2) of this regulation and in regulation 7, these regulations shall apply to every ventilating system that embodies the use of ducting or trunking, which passes through any wall, floor or ceiling of the building in which the ventilating system is installed, from one compartment of such building to another. Ventilating systems to which regulations apply.

(2) These regulations shall not apply to any ventilating system in buildings which are scheduled premises for the purposes of the Public Health and Urban Services Ordinance, 1960. (30 of 1960).

4. (1) Save as provided in paragraph (2) of this regulation and in regulation 7, every ventilating system, to which these regulations apply, shall comply with the following provisions— Requirements with respect to ventilating systems.

(a) all moving parts thereof shall be securely fenced;

(b) every part thereof shall be accessible for the purposes of inspection, and, in particular—

(i) the spindle of every fan shall be so sited that its guard may be removed and a tachometer applied thereto; and

(ii) every air intake and exhaust shall be accessible for the purposes of measurement;

(c) no air intake for the ventilating system shall be sited in any place—

(i) which in the opinion of the Director constitutes a fire hazard; or

(ii) where waste or rubbish is likely to accumulate;

(d) the opening of every air intake shall be fitted with a screen constructed of corrosion-resistant material having a mesh not greater than half an inch;

- (e) every duct shall—
- (i) be wholly constructed of non-combustible material having a strength and durability not less than that of galvanized sheet-iron or steel;
 - (ii) be accessible for the purposes of cleaning throughout its entire length;
 - (iii) where its size is sufficient to allow any person to enter therein, be fitted with access openings to allow a person to enter the same and shall be constructed to bear the weight of any person who has so entered;
 - (iv) at the point where it passes through any floor, wall or ceiling, be fitted with a damper which shall be operated by fusible links of a type approved by the Director, and designed to operate up to a temperature of 155°F., and be so constructed or protected as to resist the action of fire for a period not less than the period for which the floor, wall or ceiling through which it passes is designed to resist the action of fire;
- (f) no duct shall serve more than one building;
- (g) every filter shall be wholly constructed of non-combustible material, other than steel wool; and
- (h) every electrostatic filter or precipitator shall be of a type approved by the Director.

(2) Where he thinks fit and subject to such conditions as he may specify, the Director may by notice in writing exempt any ventilating system in respect of which application in writing in that behalf is made from compliance with all or any of the provisions of paragraph (1).

Annual inspection of dampers, filters and precipitators.

5. Every damper, filter and precipitator in any ventilating system to which these regulations apply shall be inspected at intervals not exceeding twelve months by an officer of the Fire Services Department authorized in writing by the Director.

Power of authorized officer.


6. For the purposes of these regulations, any officer of the Fire Services Department authorized in writing by the Director may carry out such tests of any ventilating system to which these regulations apply, as may be necessary to ascertain whether or not the same is in safe and efficient working order.

Existing ventilating systems.

7. Where a ventilating system to which these regulations apply has been installed in any building before the commencement of these regulations there shall be no requirement to comply with the provisions of regulation 4 unless and until—

- (a) the ventilating system has been removed or is altered in any way; or

- (b) the Director is of the opinion that the ventilating system constitutes a fire hazard.



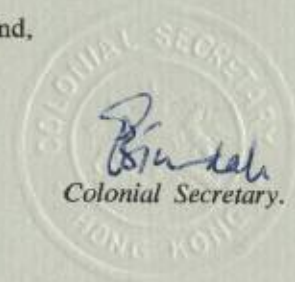
AUTHORIZATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

- (a) by Article XIII of the Hong Kong Letters Patent 1917 to 1960 it is provided that—
- (i) the Governor may make and execute grants and dispositions of any lands within the Colony; and
 - (ii) the powers conferred on the Governor by that Article may be exercised on behalf of the Governor by any person authorized by the Governor; and
- (b) the Governor is now desirous that all persons for the time being holding the office of District Officer should be authorized to exercise on behalf of the Governor the powers conferred by the said Article XIII:

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by Article XIII of the Hong Kong Letters Patent 1917 to 1960, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to authorize all persons for the time being holding the office of District Officer to make and execute grants and dispositions of any lands within the Colony that may be lawfully granted or disposed of by the Governor.

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DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 190).

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 2.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom applied the provisions of the Convention on Privileges and Immunities of the Specialized Agencies to the International Atomic Energy Agency by Order in Council made on the 17th day of January, 1961, under the International Organizations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950, by which said Order it was declared that the International Atomic Energy Agency is an Organization of which Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the governments of foreign sovereign Powers are members:

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Diplomatic Privileges Ordinance, His Excellency the Governor (Cap. 190) hereby declares and provides as follows—

PART I.

THE AGENCY.

1. The International Atomic Energy Agency (hereinafter referred to as the Agency) is an organization to which the Diplomatic Privileges Ordinance applies. (Cap. 190)
2. The Agency shall have the legal capacities of a body corporate and, except in so far as in any particular case it has expressly waived its immunity, immunity from suit and legal process. No waiver of immunity shall be deemed to extend to any measure of execution.
3. The Agency shall have the like inviolability of official archives and premises occupied as offices as is accorded in respect of the official archives and premises of an envoy of a foreign sovereign Power accredited to Her Majesty.
4. The Agency shall have the like exemption or relief from taxes and rates, other than taxes on the importation of goods, as is accorded to a foreign sovereign Power.
5. The Agency shall have exemption from taxes on the importation of goods directly imported by the Agency for its official use in Hong Kong or for exportation, or on the importation of any publications of the Agency directly imported by it, such exemption to be subject to compliance with such conditions as the Director of Commerce and Industry may prescribe for the protection of the Revenue.



6. The Agency shall have exemption from prohibitions and restrictions on importation or exportation in the case of goods directly imported or exported by the Agency for its official use and in the case of any publications of the Agency directly imported or exported by it.

7. The Agency shall have the right to avail itself, for telegraphic communications sent by it and containing only matter intended for publication by the press or for broadcasting (including communications addressed to or despatched from places outside Hong Kong), of any reduced rates applicable for the corresponding service in the case of press telegrams.

PART II.

REPRESENTATIVES.

8. (i) Except in so far as in any particular case any immunity or privilege is waived by the Government of the member state whom he represents, a representative of a member state of the Agency on any of its organs at meetings convened by it shall enjoy—

- (a) In respect of words spoken or written and all acts done by him in his official capacity, the like immunity from suit and legal process as is accorded to an envoy of a foreign sovereign Power accredited to Her Majesty;
- (b) While exercising his functions and during his journeys to and from the place of meeting, the like immunity from personal arrest or detention and from seizure of his personal baggage and the like inviolability for all papers and documents as is accorded to an envoy of a foreign sovereign Power accredited to Her Majesty.

(ii) Where the incidence of any form of taxation depends upon residence, any period during which a representative to whom this Article applies is present in Hong Kong for the exercise of his functions shall, for the purpose of determining his liability to taxation, be treated as not being a period of residence in Hong Kong.

(iii) Part IV of the Schedule to the Ordinance shall not operate so as to confer any immunity or privilege on members of the official staff of a representative to whom this Article applies other than alternates, advisers, technical experts and secretaries of delegations.

(iv) Neither the provisions of the preceding paragraphs of this Article nor those of Part IV of the Schedule to the Ordinance shall operate so as to confer any immunity or privilege on any person as the representative of Her Majesty's Government in Hong Kong or as a member of the official staff of such a representative or on any person who is a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies.

PART III.

OFFICERS.

9. Except in so far as in any particular case any immunity or privilege is waived by the Agency the Director General of the Agency and four Deputy Directors General of the Agency shall enjoy the like immunity from suit and legal process, the like inviolability of residence and the like exemption or relief from taxes, other than income tax, as is accorded to an envoy of a foreign sovereign Power accredited to Her Majesty, and exemption from income tax in respect of emoluments received by them as officers of the Agency: provided that the provisions of this Article shall not apply to any person who is a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies.

10. Except in so far as in any particular case any immunity or privilege is waived by the Agency, all members of the staff of the Agency except those who are locally recruited and assigned to hourly rates shall enjoy—

- (a) Immunity from suit and legal process in respect of words spoken or written and all acts done by them in the course of the performance of their official duties;
- (b) Exemption from income tax in respect of emoluments received by them as officers of the Agency.

PART IV.

PERSONS ON MISSIONS.

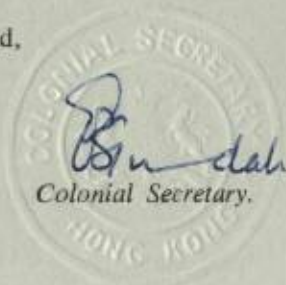
11. (i) Except in so far as in any particular case any immunity or privilege is waived by the Agency, experts (other than officers of the Agency) who are members of any committee of the Agency or who are employed on missions on behalf of the Agency and officers of the Agency who are employed on missions as inspectors or project examiners on behalf of the Agency shall, so far as is necessary for the effective exercise of their functions, enjoy—

- (a) In respect of words spoken or written or acts done by them in the performance of their official duties, the like immunity from suit and legal process as is accorded to an envoy of a foreign sovereign Power accredited to Her Majesty;
- (b) While exercising their functions and during their journeys in connexion with service on such committees or missions, the like inviolability for all papers and documents as is accorded to an envoy of a foreign sovereign Power accredited to Her Majesty;

(c) While exercising their functions and during their journeys in connexion with service on such committees or missions, the like immunity from personal arrest or detention and from seizure of their personal baggage as is accorded to an envoy of a foreign sovereign Power accredited to Her Majesty: Provided that the provisions of this sub-paragraph shall not apply to any person who is a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies.

(ii) Part IV of the Schedule to the Ordinance shall not operate so as to confer any immunity or privilege on the official staff of persons to whom the provisions of paragraph (i) of this Article apply.







- (a) has, within the preceding period of three years, been vaccinated against smallpox;
- (b) has, within the preceding period of one year, been inoculated against the enteric group of fevers; and
- (c) is immunized against such other disease as may be so specified.

(2) Failure by the proprietor of any food business, or, as the case may be, of any such food business as may be so specified, on demand to obtain the production of, or to produce, for inspection by any health inspector or health officer a valid certificate of vaccination against smallpox or



ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, 1957.

(No. 39 of 1957).

ROAD TRAFFIC (TAXIS, PUBLIC OMNIBUSES AND PUBLIC CARS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1964.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Road Traffic Ordinance, 1957, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Taxis, Public Omnibuses and Public Cars) (Amendment) Regulations, 1964. Citation.

2. The Road Traffic (Taxis, Public Omnibuses and Public Cars) Regulations, 1964, are amended by the addition, after regulation 3, of the following new regulation— Addition of new regulation 3A. (L.N. 134/64).

"Tenders for registration of taxis.

(G.N.A. 89/56).

3A. (1) The Authority may call for tenders for the registration of taxis on the payment of a premium.

(2) The premium shall be in addition to the registration and licence fee payable under the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) Regulations, 1956 and shall not be refundable in any circumstances.


(3) The Authority shall allocate the taxis pursuant to any such tender in lots of ten or multiples of ten and not more than one hundred taxis to any one person for Hong Kong and Kowloon.

(4) Subject to paragraph (5) the Authority may register the number of taxis allocated pursuant to any such tender only to a person whose tender the Authority has accepted.

(5) (a) Any person whose tender has been accepted and who fails to pay the premium within fourteen days of notification of acceptance of his tender shall forfeit the right to register the number of taxis allocated to him and any deposit paid by him.

(b) Any person who fails to register the number of taxis allocated to him within nine months of the notification of acceptance of his tender shall forfeit the right to register the number of taxis not then registered.

- (c) Any person who transfers his right to register any number of taxis allocated to him shall forfeit the right to register the number so allocated and any deposit and premium paid by him."



"(4) The Chief Inspector of Accidents may in writing delegate to any officer of the Civil Aviation Department by name or office either generally or for any particular occasion such of his powers and functions under paragraph (2) as he considers necessary:

Provided that no delegation made hereunder shall preclude the Chief Inspector of Accidents from exercising or performing at any time any of the powers or functions so delegated."






