SHA TIN HAS UNDERGONE RAPID DEVELOPMENT OVER THE PAST 10 YEARS TRANSFORMING THE SMALL VILLAGE TOWN WITH BEAUTIFUL SCENIC SPOTS INTO A COMPREHENSIVE MODERN NEW TOWN WITH A POPULATION OF SOME 370 000, THE SECRETARY FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, MR DONALD LIAO, SAID TODAY.

IMPROVING LIFE FOR LEI YUE MUN RESIDENTS
* * * * *

A NUMBER OF GOVERNMENT PROJECTS SCHEDULED FOR COMPLETION THIS YEAR WILL RESULT IN A MUCH IMPROVED LIVING ENVIRONMENT FOR RESIDENTS OF THE LEI YUE MUN AREA IN KWUN TONG, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION SAID TODAY (THURSDAY).

+THROUGH THE COMBINED EFFORTS OF DEPARTMENTS CONCERNED, ALL THE ESSENTIAL AMENITIES AND SERVICES WILL HAVE BEEN PROVIDED TO THE 7 000 RESIDENTS OF THE AREA WHICH CONSISTS OF FOUR SQUATTER VILLAGES,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+IMPROVEMENT WORKS ARE CURRENTLY BEING CARRIED OUT UNDER THE SQUATTER AREA IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME OF THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT.

+THESE INCLUDE THE INSTALLATION OF PUMPING SYSTEMS AND NETWORKS FOR METERED WATER SUPPLY; IMPROVEMENTS TO FOOTPATHS AND DRAINAGE; PREVENTIVE MEASURES TO STABILISE GEOTECHNICALLY UNSTABLE SLOPES; PROVISION OF A SITTING-OUT AREA, BIN SITES AND REFUSE COLLECTION POINTS; PUBLIC LIGHTING; AND FIRE MAINS FOR FIRE FIGHTING.+ HE SAID.

A PUBLIC TOILET AND BATHHOUSE FUNDED BY THE URBAN COUNCIL WAS ALSO BEING BUILT IN THE AREA, THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

IN ADDITION, CONSTRUCTION WORK STARTED LAST MONTH ON THE SAM KA TSUEN DEVELOPMENT STAGE IV WHICH WOULD PROVIDE A PROMENADE AND RECLAIMED LAND FOR THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF A MARKET AND MULTI-STOREY CARPARK, AS WELL AS A 200-METRE-LONG, 4.5-METRE-WIDE EMERGENCY ACCESS ROAD INTO THE VILLAGES.

+THE PROJECT, SCHEDULED TO BE COMPLETED IN JUNE 1988, WILL PROVIDE CONSIDERABLE OPEN SPACE, IMPROVE PEDESTRIAN ACCESS FROM SHUNG SHUN STREET, AND ALSO IMPROVE THE SANITARY AND DRAINAGE CONDITIONS AROUND THE TSAU WAN BAY AREA,+ THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

DB MEMBERS INSPECT BUILDING IMPROVEMENT WORKS

MONG KOK DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS SAW PROGRESS OF REPAIR WORKS AT A MULTI-STOREY BUILDING IN TAI KOK TSUI EARLIER THIS WEEK.

MEMBERS LEARNED THAT CHERRY MANSION WAS ONE OF THE 16 TARGET BUILDINGS IDENTIFIED BY THE MONG KOK DISTRICT BUILDING MANAGEMENT CO-ORDINATION TEAM THAT REQUIRED IMPROVEMENT TO ITS BUILDING MANAGEMENT QUALITY.

THE BUILDING SUFFERED FROM POOR SANITARY CONDITIONS, DILAPIDATION OF CONCRETE STRUCTURES AND PLASTERS, BROKEN UNDERGROUND SEWERS, CHOKED MANHOLES AND BLOCKED FIRE EXITS.

THE TEAM HELPED THE OWNERS' CORPORATION OF THE BUILDING TO MOBILISE OWNERS AND CO-ORDINATE GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS' EFFORTS TO BRING ABOUT CHANGES.

IN FIVE MONTHS, MARKED IMPROVEMENTS WERE BROUGHT ABOUT WHICH INCLUDED THE REPLACEMENT OF DEFECTIVE SEWERS, CLEARANCE OF CHOKED MANHOLES, AND RESURFACING OF REAR AND SIDE LANES.

MEMBERS SAW THE BUILDING WAS WHITE-WASHED AND THAT BLOCKAGES AND OBSTRUCTIONS, WHICH HAD TAKEN UP COMMUNAL AREAS AND FIRE ESCAPE ROUTES, HAD BEEN REMOVED.

OLD LETTER BOXES WERE REPLACED WITH ALUMINIUM ONES TO ENSURE MAIL SECURITY.

APART FROM VISIBLE CHANGES, MEMBERS LEARNED THAT THE TEAM HAD ALSO HELPED UPGRADE VARIOUS ASPECTS OF BUILDING MANagements, LIKE SUPERVISING OF CARETAKER'S DUTIES, ADVISING ON THE PROPER WAY TO COLLECT MANAGEMENT FEES.

+WE ARE VERY IMPRESSED WITH THE HARD WORK OF THE TEAM AND SIMILARLY PLEASED WITH THE CO-OPERATION OF THE OWNERS' CORPORATION,+ DISTRICT BOARD CHAIRMAN, MR CHOW CHUN-FAI, SAID DURING THE VISIT.

+WE WOULD ALSO LIKE TO URGE MORE BUILDING MANAGEMENT BODIES TO JOIN THE TEAM TO ENSURE A MORE HEALTHY AND PLEASANT LIVING ENVIRONMENT IN THE DISTRICT,+ HE SAID.

THE TEAM WOULD CONTINUE TO WORK ON OTHER PROBLEMS OF THE BUILDING UNTIL MOST DEFECTS WERE RECTIFIED.

INITIALLY THE TEAM HAVE SELECTED 16 BUILDINGS IN THE DISTRICT FOR IMPROVEMENT. THE DISTRICT BOARD ADDED ANOTHER 23 BUILDINGS AS TARGETS FOR IMPROVEMENT AT A MEETING EARLIER THIS MONTH.

TWENTY-FIVE CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS TODAY (THURSDAY) RECEIVED CERTIFICATES AFTER COMPLETING A 10-WEEK IN-SERVICE TRAINING COURSE IN SOCIAL WORK AND AFTERCARE.

SUCH EXTENSION COURSES ARE REGULARLY PROVIDED BY THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT (CSD) TO PROMOTE STAFF KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS IN DEALING WITH AND REHABILITATING OFFENDERS.

THE COURSE WAS ORGANISED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC, AND SPECIALLY TAILORED FOR CSD STAFF OF OFFICER RANK.

AREAS IT COVERED INCLUDED SOCIAL WORK METHODS, SOCIAL GROUP WORK, COMMUNITY WORK, HUMAN BEHAVIOUR, CRIMINOLOGY AND PSYCHO-SOCIAL PATHOLOGY.

MORE THAN 150 OFFICERS AND ASSISTANT OFFICERS OF THE CSD HAVE COMPLETED SIMILAR COURSES SINCE 1978 AND MORE ARE EXPECTED TO BE HELD AS THE DEPARTMENT PLANS TO EXPAND ITS AFTERCARE SERVICE.

OFFICERS FROM THE HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT WILL PRESENT CONSULTATIVE PAPERS ON BOTH TOPICS, CONTAINING BACKGROUND INFORMATION, PRELIMINARY PLANNING AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR MEMBERS' CONSIDERATION.

THE COMMITTEE WILL ALSO ASK CHINA MOTOR BUS COMPANY WHETHER THE SAME BUS MODEL INVOLVED IN TUEN MUN WAS USED ON THE ISLAND.

MEMBERS OF THE YAU MA TEI DISTRICT BOARD AND THE COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE TODAY (THURSDAY) VISITED A DORMITORY FOR SINGLETONS AND DISTRIBUTED NEW YEAR GIFTS TO THEM.

LOCATED AT 221 TEMPLE STREET, THE FIVE-STOREY DORMITORY WITH 30 BEDSPACES, WAS SET UP BY THE HONG KONG HOUSING SOCIETY IN 1984 TO PROVIDE ACCOMMODATION FOR SINGLETONS FROM THE LOW-INCOME GROUP.

AFTER A BRIEFING ON THE HOSTEL'S OPERATIONS AND A FRIENDLY CHAT WITH SOME OF THE RESIDENTS, THE GROUP LEFT FOR AN ELDERLY DAY CENTRE RUN BY THE ASIAN WOMEN'S LEAGUE AT THE HENRY G. LEONG YAU MA TEI COMMUNITY CENTRE.

THE CENTRE OFFERS INTEREST GROUPS AND SOCIAL SERVICES FOR MORE THAN 400 ELDERLY CITIZENS IN THE DISTRICT.

THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT REMINDED EMPLOYERS TODAY (THURSDAY) THAT THE LUNAR NEW YEAR'S DAY AND THE SECOND AND THE THIRD DAY OF THE NEW YEAR, WHICH FALLS IN JANUARY 29, 30 AND 31, ARE STATUTORY HOLIDAYS FOR WORKERS.

UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE, ALL MANUAL WORKERS AND THOSE NON-MANUAL WORKERS WITH MONTHLY SALARY NOT EXCEEDING \$10 500 ARE ENTITLED TO THE HOLIDAYS AND MUST BE PAID FOR THE DAYS OFF IF THEY HAVE WORKED CONTINUOUSLY FOR THREE MONTHS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE STATUTORY HOLIDAYS.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT HOLIDAY PAY SHOULD BE EQUIVALENT TO AN EMPLOYEE'S EARNINGS ON A NORMAL DAY AND SHOULD INCLUDE BASIC WAGES AS WELL AS ALLOWANCES THAT CAN BE EXPRESSED IN MONEY TERMS SUCH AS MEALS AND COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCES.

MOTORISTS REPORTING DEFECTIVE PARKING METERS TO THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ARE URGED TO GIVE SUFFICIENT DETAILS IN ORDER THAT PROBLEM METERS CAN BE IDENTIFIED AND REPAIRED PROMPTLY.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN REMINDED MOTORISTS THAT THEY SHOULD MAKE USE OF THE METER COMPLAINTS UNIT'S HOTLINE -- 5-298611 -- IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER THE DEFECTIVE METERS ARE ON HONG KONG ISLAND, IN KOWLOON OR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE HOTLINE IS MANNED BETWEEN 8 AM TO MIDNIGHT FROM MONDAYS TO SATURDAYS, AND BETWEEN 10 AM AND 10 PM ON SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.
