THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, MR MICHAEL THOMAS, TODAY (SATURDAY) TOLD A GROUP OF NEWLY GRADUATED FIRE OFFICERS AND FIREMEN TO CONTINUE THE FIRE SERVICES' FINE TRADITION IN SERVING THE PUBLIC EFFICIENTLY AND SELFLESSLY.

MR THOMAS WAS ADDRESSING A PASSING OUT PARADE OF 14 PROBATIONARY STATION OFFICERS AND 87 FIREMEN HELD AT THE FIRE SERVICES TRAINING SCHOOL AT PAT HEUNG, NEW TERRITORIES.

MR THOMAS SAID THAT FIREMEN'S WORK WAS A FINE AND RESPECTED SERVICE, AND THE MEN SHOULD TAKE PRIDE IN IT.

CALL TO FURTHER REDUCE TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE TAI PO ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN ORGANISING COMMITTEE, MR CHEUNG HOK-MING, TODAY (SATURDAY) URGED RESIDENTS TO HELP FURTHER REDUCE THE NUMBER OF TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS IN THE DISTRICT.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE TAI PO DISTRICT ROAD SAFETY DAY AT THE TAI PO COMMUNITY CENTRE, MR CHEUNG SAID THE NUMBER OF TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS IN TAI PO DROPPED SIGNIFICANTLY IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF THIS YEAR WHEN COMPARED WITH THE CORRESPONDING FIGURE LAST YEAR.

THERE WERE 67 TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS IN THE DISTRICT IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF THIS YEAR WHILE THERE WERE 95 CASES DURING THE SAME PERIOD LAST YEAR.

ALTHOUGH THERE WAS A MARKED DECREASE, RESIDENTS SHOULD CONTINUE TO DO THEIR BEST TO BRING THE TRAFFIC ACCIDENT TOLL DOWN FURTHER, HE ADDED.

MR CHEUNG SAID THAT THE ROAD SAFETY DAY WHICH MARKED THE LAUNCHING OF THE TAI PO DISTRICT ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN THIS YEAR WAS TO REMIND RESIDENTS OF THE IMPORTANCE OF THE SAFE USE OF THE ROAD.

TODAY'S PROGRAMMES INCLUDED A ROAD SAFETY QUIZ CONDUCTED BY DISC JOCKEYS FROM RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG, A MINI-ROAD SAFETY TOWN, COMPUTER GAMES, GAMES STALLS AND AN EXHIBITION ON ROAD SAFETY.

THERE WAS ALSO A PRIZE PRESENTATION TO WINNERS OF A RECENTLY HELD SELECTION OF MODEL PEDESTRIANS AND DRIVERS.

OTHER ACTIVITIES TO PROMOTE ROAD SAFETY IN TAI PO DURING THE CAMPAIGN INCLUDE CYCLING SAFETY DAYS TO BE HELD AT TAI MEI TUK AND AT THE CYCLE TRACK ALONG THE TOLO HIGHWAY; ROAD SAFETY DAYS AT THE TAI YUEN ESTATE AND THE KWONG FUK ESTATE; MINI-EXHIBITIONS CUM GAMES AT SCHOOLS IN TAI PO AND VISITS TO HOMES FOR THE AGED IN THE DISTRICT.

CARNIVAL OPENS YUEN LONG SPORTS FESTIVAL

YUEN LONG STADIUM WAS THE VENUE FOR AN ACTION-PACKED PROGRAMME TODAY (SATURDAY) WHEN MORE THAN 5 000 CHILDREN TOOK PART IN A CARNIVAL TO MARK THE BEGINNING OF THE YUEN LONG SPORTS FESTIVAL.

THE PROGRAMME INCLUDED A VARIETY OF EVENTS SUCH AS TELEMATCHES, AND A HIGHLIGHT WAS A GYMNASTICS DISPLAY BY MEMBERS OF THE HONG KONG AMATEUR GYMNASTICS ASSOCIATION WHO PERFORMED FOR THE QUEEN AT THE HONG KONG COLISEUM LAST TUESDAY.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY, THE SECRETARY FOR MUNICIPAL SERVICES, MR AUGUSTINE CHUI KAM, SAID IT WAS THE GOVERNMENT'S INTENTION TO PROVIDE SPORTS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES IN YUEN LONG TO COPE WITH THE DEMAND FOR HEALTHY LEISURE ACTIVITIES POSED BY ITS GROWING POPULATION.

HE NOTED THAT SINCE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE REGIONAL COUNCIL, FACILITIES SUCH AS SQUASH COURTS, TENNIS COURTS, A JOGGING TRACK AND A FIVE-A-SIDE SOCCER PITCH HAD BEEN COMPLETED SPEEDILY IN YUEN LONG.

THERE WERE MANY MORE LARGE-SCALE PROJECTS IN THE PIPELINE FOR THE DISTRICT. THESE INCLUDED A \$10 MILLION INDOOR GAMES HALL AT FUNG KAM STREET TO BE COMPLETED EARLY NEXT YEAR, ANOTHER HALL IN THE NEW LONG PING ESTATE, A TOWN SQUARE IN THE YUEN LONG TOWN CENTRE, AND A SQUASH CENTRE AT TAI TONG ROAD.

IN ADDITION, WORK ON THE YUEN LONG TOWN PARK AT SHUI NGAI LING WAS ALSO EXPECTED TO START EARLY NEXT YEAR.

MR CHUI NOTED THAT, UNDER THE AEGIS OF THE YUEN LONG DISTRICT BOARD AND THE REGIONAL COUNCIL ALONE, THERE WERE MORE THAN 300 SPORTS AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES ORGANISED IN THE DISTRICT EVERY YEAR, INCLUDING MANY TRAINING PROGRAMMES.

+THESE HAVE NOT ONLY PROVIDED A PROPER MEANS FOR SPORTS PROMOTION BUT ALSO CALL FOR PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT AND PARTICIPATION, THUS ENHANCING A SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY TO THE COMMUNITY,+ HE SAID.

THIS YEAR, THE YUEN LONG SPORTS FESTIVAL WILL HAVE 21 EVENTS ORGANISED TO SUIT THE INCLINATION OF EVERYONE AS WELL AS TO MAXIMISE THE USE OF EXISTING SPORTS FACILITIES IN THE DISTRICT.

THE TWO-WEEK FESTIVAL IS EXPECTED TO ATTRACT AROUND 20 000 RESIDENTS WHO WILL TAKE PART IN ACTIVITIES SUCH AS BALL GAMES, A BALLROOM DANCE NIGHT, AND TAI CHI. AN EXHIBITION OF SPORTS AND CAMPING EQUIPMENT WILL BE HELD DURING THE FESTIVAL.

IN ORDER TO PROMOTE THE FESTIVAL IN REMOTE VILLAGES, THE ORGANISERS HAVE ARRANGED A SERIES OF +RURAL SPORTS SCHEMES+ FOR RURAL AREAS.

ONE OF THESE RURAL EVENTS IS A +DAY OF SPORTS FOR EVERYONE+ TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 2 AT FAIRVIEW PARK.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY WERE YUEN LONG DISTRICT OFFICER, MR ALAN WONG; DISTRICT BOARD CHAIRMAN, MR TAI KUEN; AND THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SPORTS FESTIVAL CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE, MADAM LEUNG SING-TAK.

THE SPORTS FESTIVAL HAS BEEN JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE YUEN LONG DISTRICT BOARD, THE YUEN LONG DISTRICT OFFICE, THE REGIONAL COUNCIL IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE YUEN LONG DISTRICT SPORTS ASSOCIATION, AND THE NEW TERRITORIES SCHOOLS SPORTS ASSOCIATION AND THE ASSOCIATION'S YUEN LONG BRANCH AND SECONDARY SCHOOL (WEST) BRANCH.
