REPORT TAXI DRIVERS WHO OVERCHARGE

\* \* \* \*

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT TODAY (FRIDAY) ADVISED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO REPORT TAXI DRIVERS WHOSE METERS ARE NOT SHOWING THE PROPER CURRENT FARE.

THIS FOLLOWS COMPLAINTS RECEIVED BY THE DEPARTMENT THAT SOME TAXI METERS WERE SHOWING FARES OTHER THAN THOSE CURRENTLY IN FORCE.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID THE PROPOSED NEW FARES ANNOUNCED BY THE SECRETARY FOR THE ENVIRONMENT IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL RECENTLY HAVE NOT BEEN FORMALLY IMPLEMENTED.

HE SAID : +CERTAIN PROCEDURES STILL HAVE TO BE COMPLIED WITH BEFORE THE NEW FARES ARE INTRODUCED.+

THE SPOKESMAN SAID DETAILS OF THE NEW FARES, THE STARTING DATE, AND CONVERSION TABLE SHOWING THE OLD AND THE NEW FARES WOULD BE ANNOUNCED IN DUE COURSE.

+UNTIL THEN, TAXI DRIVERS SHOULD NOT CHARGE FARES OTHER THAN THOSE CURRENTLY IN FORCE,+ HE SAID.

HE URGED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO REPORT TO POLICE IF OVERCHARGED BY TAXI DRIVERS.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID ONE MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC TELEPHONED AND COMPLAINED THAT THE METER IN THE TAXI HE WAS TRAVELLING IN WAS JUMPING 50 CENTS INSTEAD OF 20 CENTS FOR EVERY ONE-FIFTH OF A MILE.

AMBITIOUS EXPANSION PLANS FOR POK OI HOSPITAL

\* \* \* \* \*

THE GOVERNMENT HAS APPROVED IN PRINCIPLE A SEVEN-YEAR DEVELOPMENT PLAN WHICH WILL ENABLE THE POK OI HOSPITAL TO EXPAND ITS MEDICAL SERVICES TO CATER FOR THE FUTURE NEEDS OF THE NORTH WEST NEW TERRITORIES, THE SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR. DAVID AKERS-JONES, SAID TODAY (FRIDAY).

THE EXPANSION PLAN, DRAWN UP IN LINE WITH THE GROWTH IN POPULATION IN THE AREA, IS SCHEDULED FOR IMPLEMENTATION IN THE COMING FINANCIAL YEAR.

THE PROGRAMME, MR. AKERS-JONES TOLD THE HOSPITAL'S ANNUAL DINNER, WAS DIVIDED INTO THREE PHASES -- THE FIRST INVOLVING THE CONSTRUCTION OF STAFF QUARTERS FOR DOCTORS AND NURSES, THE SECOND TO PROVIDE ANOTHER 200 BEDS, AN OPERATING THEATRE SUITE AND BACK-UP FACILITIES.

THE THIRD PHASE INVOLVED THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN ENLARGED OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT, A NEW CASUALTY WARD AND ADDITIONAL STAFF QUARTERS, MR. AKERS-JONES SAID.

A SITE HAS BEEN RESERVED IN AU TAU FOR THE FIRST STAGE WHICH IS EXPECTED TO COST ABOUT \$5 MILLION. MR. AKERS-JONES SAID CONSTRUCTION WOULD START AS SOON AS APPROVAL IS OBTAINED FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

+IN ITS SUBMISSION TO GOVERNMENT,+ MR. AKERS-JONES SAID, +THE HOSPITAL HAS APPLIED FOR A CAPITAL SUBVENTION OF THREE TO ONE TO FINANCE ITS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME.+

HE SAID THAT THIS FORMULA, IF APPROVED, WOULD REQUIRE THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO RAISE A QUARTER OF THE CAPITAL COST -- AT LEAST \$1 MILLION A YEAR IN THE NEXT SEVEN YEARS.

HOWEVER, HE POINTED OUT, IN THIS AGE OF RISING COSTS THE ACTUAL REQUIREMENT WOULD PROBABLY TURN OUT TO BE MORE.

+THIS AMBITIOUS BUT REALISTIC PROGRAMME IS TYPICAL OF THE WHOLE HISTORY OF POK OI HOSPITAL,+ MR. AKERS-JONES SAID.

+IT IS THE HISTORY OF GENERATIONS OF LOCAL PEOPLE DEVOTING THEIR TIME AND RESOURCES TOWARDS THE BETTERMENT OF THEIR COMMUNITY.

+AND IT DEMONSTRATES AN INDEPENDENT SPIRIT AND A CONCERN FOR THOSE THINGS WHICH RELIEVE HARDSHIP AND PROVIDE A BETTER LIFE FOR THE PEOPLE,+ HE ADDED.

HE RECALLED THAT POK OI HOSPITAL OPENED IN 1919 AS A SMALL CHINESE HERBALIST CLINIC DEPENDENT WHOLLY ON PRIVATE DONATIONS AND, NOW AS A GOVERNMENT SUBVENTED DISTRICT HOSPITAL WITH 218 BEDS, IT WAS PLAYING AN IMPORTANT PART IN THE OVERALL PROVISION OF MEDICAL SERVICES IN THE WHOLE OF THE NORTH WEST NEW TERRITORIES.

THREE LOTS OF CROWN LAND WILL BE PUT UP FOR SALE BY THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT'S CROWN LANDS AND SURVEY OFFICE AT AN AUCTION IN THE SHOUSON THEATRE OF THE HONG KONG ARTS CENTRE ON FEBRUARY 2, 1979, AT 11 A.M.

ONE OF THE SITES OFFERED FOR SALE IS IN HONG NING ROAD, KWUN TONG. MEASURING ABOUT 2,050 SQUARE METRES, IT IS INTENDED FOR PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES.

ANOTHER SITE, COMPRISING 3,587 SQUARE METRES IN SZE SHAN STREET, YAU TONG, KOWLOON, IS FOR CARGO CONSOLIDATION FOR CONTAINERS AND ANCILLARY GODOWN PURPOSES.

THE LAST LOT IN YIP KAN STREET, WONG CHUK HANG, HONG KONG, IS FOR INDUSTRIAL AND/OR GODOWN PURPOSES. IT MEASURES 2,150 SQUARE METRES.

FOUR MORE INDUSTRIAL SITES AVAILABLE AT FO TAN

THE GOVERNMENT IS SELLING FOUR MORE INDUSTRIAL SITES AT FO TAN IN SHA TIN NEW TOWN TO HOLDERS OF LAND EXCHANGE ENTITLEMENTS ISSUED BY THE NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION.

TENDERS FOR THE FIRST TWO SITES, OF 1,710 AND 1,856 SQUARE METRES, CLOSE ON JANUARY 12, WHILE TENDERS FOR THE OTHER TWO LOTS, OF 1,671 AND 1,669 SQUARE METRES, WILL REMAIN OPEN UNTIL NOON ON JANUARY 26.

A SHA TIN DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (FRIDAY) HE EXPECTED KEEN INTEREST IN THE SITES, WITH FO TAN RAPIDLY DEVELOPING AS THE TOWN'S FIRST MAJOR LIGHT INDUSTRIAL AREA.

+THE CONDITIONS OF SALE ALLOW FOR MULTI-STOREY FACTORY DEVELOPMENT ALONG THE LINES OF THE BUILDINGS ALREADY OPERATING IN THE AREA,+ HE SAID.

+FO TAN IS GROWING FAIRLY QUICKLY AND THERE HAS BEEN KEEN COMPETITION FOR SITES FROM BUYERS AT BOTH PUBLIC AUCTIONS AND THROUGH TENDER PROCEDURES.+
