GOVERNMENT COMMITTED TO DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SCHEME

* * * * *

THE CHIEF SECRETARY, SIR PHILIP HADDON-CAVE, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY) WHEN HE OPENED THE CONFERENCE ON DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, THE GOVERNMENT IS ENTIRELY COMMITTED IN ITS SUPPORT OF THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SCHEME.

HE SAID THE DISTRICT BOARDS HAVE ADDED A WHOLE NEW DIMENSION TO HONG KONG'S UNIQUE SYSTEM OF GOVERNMENT BY CONSULTATION AND CONSENSUS.

THE BOARDS CONSTITUTED THE LARGEST EVER ADVISORY BODY WITH AN ELECTED ELEMENT IN HONG KONG, AND HAD FORGED MORE EFFECTIVE LINKS BETWEEN AN INCREASINGLY COMPLEX CENTRAL GOVERNMENT AND THE MAN IN THE STREET, HE SAID.

+THEY HAVE ALREADY MANY ACHIEVEMENTS TO THEIR CREDIT AND ARE WELL REGARDED BY RESIDENTS,+ HE SAID.

THE CONFERENCE ON DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION — ORGANISED BY THE CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION — BROUGHT TOGETHER FOR THE FIRST TIME MEMBERS OF ALL 18 BOARDS TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON MATTERS OF COMMON CONCERN AND TO DISCUSS THE ROLE AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE DISTRICT BOARDS.

SOME 300 UNOFFICIAL AND OFFICIAL MEMBERS TOOK PART, AND SPEAKERS INCLUDED EDUCATORS, LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL MEMBERS AND GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

SIR PHILIP SAID THE INTERACTION BETWEEN UNOFFICIALS AND OFFICIALS ON MATTERS OF DISTRICT MANAGEMENT HAD PRODUCED MOST BENEFICIAL RESULTS.

WHEREAS FORMERLY THERE WAS LITTLE PUBLIC SUPPORT OR EVEN INTEREST IN THE GOVERNMENT'S EFFORTS IN STREET MANAGEMENT, +IT IS NOW THE UNOFFICIALS ON THE DISTRICT BOARDS WHO ARE URGING THE GOVERNMENT TO DO MORE TO RID OUR STREETS OF RUBBISH, OBSTRUCTIONS AND STRUCTURES AND TO REQUIRE A RADICAL CHANGE IN THE ENVIRONMENT,+ HE SAID.

+NOW IT IS THE RESIDENTS AND THEIR REPRESENTATIVES WHO ARE PRESSING FOR THE PROVISION OF VARIOUS SERVICES AND MAKING SUGGESTIONS TO IMPROVE TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT AND TRANSPORT FACILITIES, OR TAKING AN ACTIVE PART IN THE PROMOTION OF SPORTS, RECREATIONAL AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES.

+THIS IS OF COURSE EXACTLY AS IT SHOULD BE.

+SO, NOW, OFFICIALS INDEPENDENTLY AND VIA DISTRICT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEES CAN CONCENTRATE THEIR ENERGIES ON RESPONDING TO RESIDENTS' PROPOSALS, AND PROPOSALS FORMULATED BY RESIDENTS ARE MUCH MORE LIKELY TO REFLECT LOCAL LIVING CONDITIONS.

/+BUT THESE

+BUT THESE ARE EARLY DAYS AND IT WOULD BE FOOLISH FOR ANY OF US TO ASSUME THAT THERE IS NO ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT IN THE CONTRIBUTION OF THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SCHEME TO THE GOOD GOVERNMENT OF OUR COMMUNITY.+

THE STRONG TEAMS OF SENIOR GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES ON DISTRICT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEES, HE SAID, WAS SURE EVIDENCE OF THE GOVERNMENT'S DESIRE TO SEE TO IT THAT, WHEREVER PRACTICABLE, THE BOARDS' ADVICE IS ACTED UPON WITH DESPATCH, WITH IMAGINATION AND WITH DUE REGARD TO THE NEEDS AND ASPIRATIONS OF THE PEOPLE IN THE DISTRICTS, AND THAT PROMPT EXPLANATIONS ARE GIVEN IF SOLUTIONS TO DEEP-SEATED PROBLEMS AND DEFICIENCIES ARE NOT READILY AVAILABLE.

SIR PHILIP SAID IT WAS IMPORTANT TO REALISE THAT THE 18 DISTRICT BOARDS TOGETHER MADE UP THE LARGEST ADVISORY BODY WITH AN ELECTED ELEMENT. OF THE 489 SEATS, 132 WERE HELD BY ELECTED MEMBERS, 27 BY RURAL COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN, AND 30 BY URBAN COUNCILLORS MOST OF WHOM WERE ELECTED, PLUS 135 APPOINTED UNOFFICIALS AND 165 OFFICIALS.

+TOGETHER THEY PROVIDE A WELL-BALANCED AND REPRESENTATIVE PLATFORM FOR CONSULTATION AND ADVICE ON A WIDE RANGE OF MATTERS,+ HE SAID.

FUN AND GAMES GALORE TO MARK QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY * * * * *

THE QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY WILL BE CELEBRATED IN HONG KONG ON JUNE 11 THIS YEAR, A PUBLIC HOLIDAY, WITH A WIDE RANGE OF CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL AND SPORT ACTIVITIES.

TO LEAD THE CELEBRATIONS, THE GOVERNOR, SIR EDWARD YOUDE, WILL GIVE A RECEPTION AT GOVERNMENT HOUSE ON JUNE 9. ABOUT 450 GUESTS WILL BE INVITED, COMPRISING MEMBERS FROM THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL, LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, URBAN COUNCIL, DISTRICT BOARDS AND HEUNG YEE KUK, AS WELL AS REPRESENTATIVES OF VARIOUS ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMITTEES.

THE PROGRAMME ON JUNE 11 WILL CONSIST OF MORE THAN 100 CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL AND SPORT EVENTS AT 37 LOCATIONS THROUGHOUT HONG KONG. IT IS ORGANISED BY THE MUSIC OFFICE AND THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE, WITH THE PARTICIPATION OF THE BRITISH FORCES.

THE GOVERNOR AND LADY YOUDE WILL ATTEND AN EVENING CONCERT IN THE TSUEN WAN TOWN HALL, TO BE PERFORMED BY THE MUSIC OFFICE'S HONG KONG YOUTH SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA (A) AND HONG KONG YOUTH CHINESE ORCHESTRA.

EARLIER IN THE AFTERNOON, THE MUSIC OFFICE'S HONG KONG YOUTH SYMPHONIC BAND WILL GIVE A MATINEE CONCERT AT THE LANDMARK IN CENTRAL AT 3 PM.

IN KOWLOON, THE CHIEF SECRETARY, SIR PHILIP HADDON-CAVE, WILL OFFICIATE AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE CELEBRATIONS AT MORSE PARK AT 9 AM FOLLOWING A MILITARY BAND DISPLAY. THERE WILL BE A FOLK DANCE DEMONSTRATION, A PARACHUTING PERFORMANCE, POTTED SPORTS FOR CHILDREN, TELE-GAMES FOR THE AGED, AND A +THOUSAND SWIM+.

THE CELEBRATIONS AT KOWLOON PARK WILL BEGIN WITH A POLICE BAND PERFORMANCE AT 8.30 AM, TO BE FOLLOWED BY AN OPENING CEREMONY BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE URBAN COUNCIL, MR HILTON CHEONG-LEEN. THE PROGRAMME WILL INCLUDE A MINI PRIX, A WHEELCHAIR BASKETBALL COMPETITION, A TABLE-TENNIS-FOR-ALL AND A PARACHUTING PERFORMANCE.

THERE WILL ALSO BE A ROLLER SKATING FUN DAY AT KOWLOON TSAI PARK, A TENNIS FUN DAY AT WAH YAN COLLEGE AND A BADMINTON FUN DAY AT CHEUNG SHA WAN GAMES HALL.

ON HONG KONG ISLAND, OUTDOOR CELEBRATIONS WILL BE HELD MAINLY IN VICTORIA PARK.

THEY WILL BEGIN WITH A MILITARY BAND DISPLAY AT 8.30 AM, TO BE FOLLOWED BY AN OPENING CEREMONY BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE AMATEUR SPORTS FEDERATION AND OLYMPIC COMMITTEE OF HONG KONG, MR A. DE O. SALES. EVENTS WILL INCLUDE POTTED SPORTS FOR CHILDREN AND THE ELDERLY, A DISCO-FOR-ALL, A BASKETBALL COMPETITION, A MOTOR CYCLING DEMONSTRATION, A SWIMMING GALA AND A ROUND-THE-PARK RACE. THE CELEBRATIONS WILL END WITH A PARACHUTING DISPLAY AT 11.30 AM.

OTHER OUTDOOR EVENTS ON THE ISLAND WILL INCLUDE A MINI-SOCCER MARATHON AT SOUTHOORN PLAYGROUND AND POTTED SPORTS FOR CHILDREN AT FORBES STREET PLAYGROUND.

CELEBRATIONS IN THE NEW TERRITORIES WILL TAKE PLACE MAINLY AT RECREATION GROUNDS IN THE NEW TOWNS.

AN UNOFFICIAL LEGISLATIVE COUNCILLOR, MR CHEUNG YAN-LUNG, WILL START THE PROGRAMME FOR EASTERN NEW TERRITORIES AT FANLING RECREATION GROUND AT 10 AM. THERE WILL BE A MILITARY BAND PERFORMANCE, A MODEL AIRCRAFT DEMONSTRATION, A PONY RIDE, A TRAMPOLINING-FOR-ALL, POTTED SPORTS FOR CHILDREN AND THE ELDERLY AND DISCO ROLLER-SKATING.

IN WESTERN NEW TERRITORIES, AN OPENING CEREMONY WILL BE HELD AT THE YUEN LONG SWIMMING POOL WHERE THE CHAIRMAN OF THE HEUNG YEE KUK, MR LAU WONG-FAT, WILL OFFICIATE AT 10 AM. EVENTS WILL INCLUDE A MILITARY BAND DISPLAY, A WATER CARNIVAL AND A PARACHUTING PERFORMANCE.

THROUGHOUT THE DAY IN THE NEW TOWNS, COMPETITIONS WILL BE ORGANISED FOR VARIOUS SPORTS INCLUDING FOOTBALL, BASKETBALL, TENNIS, BADMINTON, AND TABLE-TENNIS.

APPLICATIONS FOR NT SITES

THE LANDS DEPARTMENT IS INVITING APPLICATIONS FROM REGISTERED OWNERS OF LAND EXCHANGE ENTITLEMENTS (LETTERS A AND B) FOR 15 SITES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

OF THESE SITES, SIX ARE IN SHA TIN NEW TOWN, FOUR IN YUEN LONG, TWO IN TUEN MUN NEW TOWN AND ONE EACH IN TAI PO NEW TOWN, SAI KUNG AND LANTAU.

THREE OF THE SHA TIN SITES ARE FOR PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES AND MEASURE ABOUT 18 800, 7 181 AND 5 415 SQUARE METRES RESPECTIVELY.

TWO SITES OF 327.4 AND 326.9 SQUARE METRES ARE FOR NON-INDUSTRIAL PURPOSES AND THE OTHER SITE OF 3 834 SQUARE METRES IS FOR INDUSTRIAL AND/OR GODOWN PURPOSES.

THE FOUR YUEN LONG SITES, ALL IN THE TUNG TAU INDUSTRIAL AREA, ARE FOR INDUSTRIAL/GODOWN PURPOSES. THEY ARE OF 1 889, 1 736, 1 524, AND 911.6 SQUARE METRES RESPECTIVELY.

ONE OF THE TWO TUEN MUN SITES WITH AN AREA OF 10 240 SQUARE METRES, IS FOR PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL PURPOSE. THE OTHER ONE, OF 464.5 SQUARE METRES, IS FOR NON-INDUSTRIAL USE.

THE TAI PO SITE, MEASURING ABOUT 9 016 SQUARE METRES, IS FOR NON-INDUSTRIAL PURPOSE.

THE REMAINING TWO SITES ARE BOTH FOR PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES.

ONE OF THEM IS IN SHA HA, SAI KUNG, WITH AN AREA OF ABOUT 1 282 SQUARE METRES, AND THE OTHER IS IN CHEUNG SHA ON LANTAU ISLAND, WITH AN AREA OF ABOUT 3 625 SQUARE METRES.

REMAINS IN NT PUBLIC CEMETERIES DUE FOR EXHUMATION

THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT TODAY URGED THE PUBLIC TO TAKE IMMEDIATE ACTION TO EXHUME THEIR RELATIVES' REMAINS BURIED IN 1976 IN FOUR PUBLIC CEMETERIES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE FOUR CEMETERIES ARE THE WO HOP SHEK, SANDY RIDGE, SANDY RIDGE URN AND CHEUNG CHAU CEMETERIES, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NTSD SAID.

IF NO SUCH ACTION IS TAKEN, THE REMAINS WILL BE EXHUMED AND CREMATED BY NTSD OFFICIALS FOR REBURING IN THE SANDY RIDGE URN OR SOME OTHER URN CEMETERIES.

THIS PROCEDURE IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CHEUNG CHAU CEMETERY, SANDY RIDGE CEMETERY, SANDY RIDGE URN CEMETERY AND WO HOP SHEK CEMETERY (REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF HUMAN REMAINS) ORDER 1983, PUBLISHED IN THE LATEST GOVERNMENT GAZETTE.

TO CARRY OUT THE EXHUMATION AND REBURIAL, MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC SHOULD APPLY FOR AN EXHUMATION PERMIT AT THE CEMETERIES AND CREMATORIA OFFICE OF THE NTSD AT NO. 6 CHEONG HANG ROAD, HUNG HOM, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE EXHUMED REMAINS MAY BE REBURIED IN THE URN SECTION OF A PUBLIC CEMETERY.

THEY MAY ALSO BE CREMATED FOR STORAGE IN A NICHE IN A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE COLUMBARIUM OR FOR KEEPING AT HOME.

THE PLAN ALSO INCLUDES THE CONSTRUCTION OF A LOCAL ROAD TO PROVIDE VEHICULAR AND PEDESTRIAN ACCESS TO THE FUTURE HOUSING AND INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENTS AND OTHER FACILITIES IN THE SOUTHERN PART OF FANLING NEW TOWN.

THE PROJECT FORMS PART OF A CONTINUING PROGRAMME FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF FANLING NEW TOWN.

A NOTICE CONCERNING THE PROPOSED WORKS IS PUBLISHED IN THE LATEST GOVERNMENT GAZETTE.
