GOVERNOR'S OPERATION SUCCESSFUL

THE GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID WILSON, WAS DISCHARGED FROM QUEEN MARY HOSPITAL SHORTLY AFTER 8 PM TODAY (TUESDAY).

HE WAS OPERATED ON THIS MORNING. HIS CHEEKBONE WAS BROKEN IN THREE PLACES. THE OPERATION WAS 100 PER CENT SUCCESSFUL AND THE CHEEKBONE HAS BEEN SUCCESSFULLY RE-POSITIONED.

THIRD ROUND OF AIRPORT TALKS TO START SOON

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN ANNOUNCED TODAY (TUESDAY) THAT THE THIRD ROUND OF EXPERT TALKS ON THE NEW AIRPORT AND RELATED PROJECTS WILL BE HELD IN PEKING FROM FEBRUARY 21 TO 23.

THE HONG KONG TEAM WILL BE LED BY THE SECRETARY FOR THE TREASURY, MR HAMISH MACLEOD, WHILE THE CHINESE TEAM WILL BE LED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE RESEARCH INSTITUTE OF THE HONG KONG AND MACAU AFFAIRS OFFICE OF THE STATE COUNCIL, MR LUO JIAHUAN.

SPECIAL CHECK-IN FACILITY FOR CHINESE NEW YEAR PERIOD

* * * * *

THE CIVIL AVIATION DEPARTMENT (CAD) WILL, AS IN PREVIOUS YEARS, PROVIDE SPECIAL CHECK-IN FACILITIES FOR PASSENGERS TRAVELLING ON FLIGHTS BOUND FOR XIAMEN, HAIKOU AND GUILIN DURING THE FORTHCOMING CHINESE NEW YEAR HOLIDAY PERIOD.

A SPOKESMAN FOR CAD SAID THERE WILL BE A TOTAL OF 10 CHECK-IN COUNTERS AT A SPECIAL CHECK-IN AREA LOCATED AT THE DEPARTURE HALL OF THE AIRPORT PASSENGER TERMINAL BUILDING JUST ADJACENT TO THE HONGKONG BANK.

THESE SPECIAL COUNTERS WILL BE IN OPERATION FOR EIGHT DAYS FROM TODAY (TUESDAY) UNTIL FEBRUARY 19, CATERING FOR ABOUT 130 FLIGHTS AND 14,500 PASSENGERS BOUND FOR THE THREE REGIONAL DESTINATIONS IN CHINA WHICH ACCOUNT FOR ABOUT 70 PER CENT OF THE PASSENGERS TRAVELLING ON EXTRA FLIGHTS TO CHINA FOR THE NEW YEAR HOLIDAY.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED THAT IN ADDITION TO THE NORMAL 930 DEPARTING FLIGHTS, AIRLINES WOULD BE OPERATING ABOUT 345 EXTRA FLIGHTS TO VARIOUS DESTINATIONS ABROAD BETWEEN FEBRUARY 12 AND 19, REPRESENTING AN INCREASE OF ABOUT 20 PER CENT OVER THE NUMBER FOR LAST YEAR.

THE NUMBER OF DEPARTING PASSENGERS IS EXPECTED TO REACH A PEAK BETWEEN FEBRUARY 13 AND 15 WHEN ABOUT 47,000 PASSENGERS ARE EXPECTED TO DEPART ON MORE THAN 180 FLIGHTS EACH DAY.

TO ASSIST DEPARTING PASSENGERS TO LOCATE THEIR AIRLINE CHECK-IN COUNTERS, SPECIAL DIRECTIONAL SIGNS WILL BE DISPLAYED AT PROMINENT LOCATIONS AT THE DEPARTURE HALL.

AS THE AIRPORT AREA IS EXPECTED TO BE VERY CROWDED DURING THE CHINESE NEW YEAR HOLIDAY PERIOD, TRAVELLERS ARE ADVISED TO USE PUBLIC TRANSPORT WHEREVER POSSIBLE AND TO AVOID BRINGING THEIR PRIVATE CARS TO THE AIRPORT.

TAXI TRADE ASSOCIATIONS HAVE BEEN ADVISED TO SEND MORE TAXIS TO THE AIRPORT TO COPE WITH THE INCREASED PASSENGER TRAFFIC.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO ADVISED DEPARTING PASSENGERS THAT IN ORDER TO AVOID MISSING FLIGHTS, THEY SHOULD ARRIVE AT THE AIRPORT EARLY, PREFERABLY TWO HOURS BEFORE THE FLIGHT DEPARTURE, CHECK IN AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AND PROCEED IMMEDIATELY TO IMMIGRATION AFTER CHECK-IN.

FAREWELLERS AND GREETERS ARE ADVISED NOT TO COME TO THE AIRPORT DURING THIS PERIOD.

AIRPORT BUILDING REFURBISHMENT WORK PROGRESSING ON SCHEDULE

* * * * *

REFURBISHMENT WORK TO THE OLD SECTION OF THE PASSENGER TERMINAL BUILDING AT THE HONG KONG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT IS PROGRESSING ON SCHEDULE.

PHASES I AND II OF THE PROGRAMME HAVE BEEN COMPLETED AND ALL FACILITIES HAVE BEEN BROUGHT BACK INTO OPERATION.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE CIVIL AVIATION DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (TUESDAY) THAT NO REFURBISHMENT WORK WOULD BE CARRIED OUT DURING THE CHINESE NEW YEAR PEAK PERIOD IN ORDER THAT THE OPERATION OF THE TERMINAL BUILDING IS NOT AFFECTED.

"PHASE III WORK WILL START ON MARCH 1," HE SAID.

"THE PROGRAMME WILL ALSO ENSURE THAT ALL TERMINAL FACILITIES WILL BE REINSTATED TO CATER FOR THE 1992 CHINESE NEW YEAR PEAK PERIOD," HE ADDED.

HE POINTED OUT THAT THE REFURBISHMENT PROGRAMME, COSTING \$289 MILLION, WOULD ENABLE KAI TAK TO MEET FORECAST AIR PASSENGER DEMAND OVER THE NEXT SIX YEARS.

IT WILL ALSO UPGRADE THE STANDARD OF EQUIPMENT AND FACILITIES TO THAT PROVIDED IN THE EXTENSION TO THE PASSENGER TERMINAL WHICH WAS COMPLETED IN DECEMBER 1988.

"THE PHASED APPROACH HAS BEEN ADOPTED WITH THE WORK BEING UNDERTAKEN IN FIVE SEPARATE STAGES EACH LASTING APPROXIMATELY FIVE AND A HALF MONTHS," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

AS WELL AS INTERNAL RENOVATION OF BUILDING FINISHES, INCLUDING CEILINGS AND FLOORS, AND IMPROVEMENTS TO EXISTING LIGHTING, THE PROJECT WILL ALSO REFURBISH AND UPGRADE THE VARIOUS SYSTEMS ESSENTIAL TO THE OPERATION OF THE TERMINAL BUILDING.

THE AIR CONDITIONING SYSTEM WILL BE IMPROVED TO PROVIDE A MORE BALANCED COVERAGE AND VARIOUS BUILDING SERVICES, SUCH AS THE FIRE PROTECTION, DRAINAGE, PLUMBING AND POWER SUPPLIES, WILL BE UPGRADED.

THE DEPARTURE AND INTERLINE BAGGAGE HANDLING SYSTEM WILL BE IMPROVED TO FURTHER ENHANCE BAGGAGE DESPATCH RELIABILITY WHILE AN ELECTRONIC DISPLAY SYSTEM WILL BE INTRODUCED AT CHECK-IN TO IMPROVE DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION TO PASSENGERS.

PASSENGER ACCESS BETWEEN ARRIVALS, DEPARTURES AND THE MULTI-STOREY CARPARK WILL BE IMPROVED BY THE INSTALLATION OF ADDITIONAL LIFTS AND ESCALATORS.

THE WHOLE REFURBISHMENT PROJECT IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED AROUND THE MIDDLE OF 1992.

SPECIAL MARINE TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS FOR FIREWORKS DISPLAY

SPECIAL MARINE TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS IN VICTORIA HARBOUR WILL BE IMPLEMENTED BY THE MARINE DEPARTMENT TO FACILITATE THE LUNAR NEW YEAR FIREWORKS DISPLAY ON SATURDAY (FEBRUARY 16).

ACTING SENIOR MARINE OFFICER (SEARCH AND RESCUE) OF THE MARINE DEPARTMENT, MR TREVOR BERRY, TODAY (TUESDAY) SAID: "FROM 2 PM TO 9 PM ON SATURDAY, THE STRETCH OF WATER ONE NAUTICAL MILE OFF THE WAN CHAI WATERFRONT FROM WAN CHAI TO KELLETT ISLAND WILL BE CLOSED TO ALL MARINE TRAFFIC EXCEPT MARINE POLICE, FIRE SERVICES AND MARINE DEPARTMENT LAUNCHES AND VESSELS DIRECTLY INVOLVED IN THE FIREWORKS DISPLAY."

MR BERRY SAID THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC PIERS AND LANDING STEPS ON BOTH SIDES OF THE HARBOUR WOULD ALSO BE CLOSED TO NORMAL MARINE TRAFFIC ON SATURDAY EVENING TO EFFECT CROWD CONTROL:

* HONG KONG ISLAND

- QUEEN'S PIER FROM 7.30 PM TO 8.30 PM
- BLAKE PIER FROM 7.30 PM TO 8.30 PM
- LUNG KING STREET STEPS FROM 6 PM TO 8.30 PM
- WAN CHAI WEST FERRY STEPS FROM 6 PM TO 8.30 PM

* KOWLOON

- KOWLOON PUBLIC PIER WESTERN BERTHS FROM 7 PM TO 8.30 PM
- KOWLOON PUBLIC PIER SOUTHERN BERTHS FROM 6 PM TO 8.30 PM
- ALL MARINE ACCESS POINTS OF EAST TSIM SHA TSUI PROMENADE FROM 6.30 PM TO 8.30 PM

MR BERRY URGED ALL OWNERS AND OPERATORS OF SMALL CRAFT WISHING TO VIEW THE FIREWORKS DISPLAY FROM THE HARBOUR TO PAY PARTICULAR ATTENTION TO MARINE SAFETY AND NOT TO OVERLOAD THEIR CRAFT.

MR BERRY SAID: "THE FIREWORKS DISPLAY IS FOR ALL TO ENJOY DURING THE FESTIVE SEASON AND OWNERS AND OPERATORS OF SMALL CRAFT SHOULD EXERCISE SELF-DISCIPLINE AND BE CONSIDERATE TO OTHER BOAT USERS.

"THEY SHOULD FOLLOW THE ADVICE OF MARINE POLICE OFFICERS SPECIALLY TASKED TO PATROL THE HARBOUR."

IN ADDITION, A TEMPORARY UNLIT MOORING BUOY WILL BE LAID 0.6 NAUTICAL MILE NORTHWEST OF THE WAN CHAI FERRY PIER ON THURSDAY (FEBRUARY 14) TO FACILITATE THE MOORING OF THE BARGE FROM WHICH THE FIREWORKS WILL BE DISCHARGED AND VESSELS NAVIGATING IN THE AREA SHOULD PROCEED WITH CAUTION.

SIGNBOARD TO SEND NEW YEAR GREETINGS

A GIANT SIGNBOARD LIT UP THE VICTORIA PARK FLOWER FAIR TONIGHT (TUESDAY), SENDING LUNAR NEW YEAR WISHES TO RESIDENTS.

MEASURING 15 METRES BY 11 METRES, THE SIGNBOARD WAS PUT UP BY THE EASTERN DISTRICT BOARD AT A COST OF ABOUT \$82,000.

THE DESIGN OF THE LIGHTS PORTRAYS THREE VIBRANT RAMS STROLLING ON A GREEN PASTURE WITH NEW YEAR GREETINGS FROM THE DISTRICT BOARD AND THE URBAN COUNCIL.

THE LIGHTS WILL BE TURNED ON DAILY FROM 6 PM TO 11 PM UNTIL MARCH 3. DURING THE THREE NIGHTS PRECEDING THE LUNAR NEW YEAR'S DAY, THE LIGHTS WILL BE ON UNTIL 6 AM.

THE SWITCHING-ON CEREMONY WAS OFFICIATED BY EASTERN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR STEVE BARCLAY; THE DISTRICT BOARD CHAIRMAN, MR SHUM CHOI-SANG; URBAN COUNCILLOR MS CHRISTINA TING; AND THE POLICE DISTRICT COMMANDER, MRS WONG LEUNG KAM-SHAN.

EPD REFUTES ADVERTISEMENT CLAIMS

* * * * *

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DEPARTMENT (EPD) TODAY (TUESDAY) EXPRESSED EXTREME CONCERN ABOUT ADVERTISEMENTS WHICH APPEARED ON TELEVISION AND IN NEWSPAPERS PUBLICISING PRODUCTS RELATING TO THE USE OF UNLEADED PETROL (ULP).

THE PRODUCTS ARE CLAIMED TO BE ABLE TO REDUCE DRAMATICALLY EXHAUST EMISSIONS AND ENABLE ALL VEHICLES TO OPERATE ON ULP.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EPD SAID TO THE BEST OF HIS KNOWLEDGE, THERE IS NO HARD SCIENTIFIC EVIDENCE TO BACK UP THE CLAIMS OF THESE PRODUCTS.

"ALL THESE CLAIMS IN THE ADVERTISEMENTS SEEM TO BE PREYING ON UNFOUNDED FEARS THAT SOME VEHICLE OWNERS HAVE ABOUT THE SWITCH TO ULP," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

"AS A MATTER OF FACT," HE CONTINUED, "ACCORDING TO THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CAR MANUFACTURERS THEMSELVES, ABOUT 70 PER CENT OF ALL CURRENT PETROL VEHICLES CAN USE ULP WITHOUT ANY ADJUSTMENT WHATSOEVER, AND UNLEADED PETROL WILL HAVE NO EFFECT ON CAR PERFORMANCE OR FUEL ECONOMY.

"A FURTHER 24 PER CENT OF ALL PETROL VEHICLES REQUIRES ONLY ATTENTION AS DESCRIBED IN 'THE MOTORISTS GUIDE TO UNLEADED PETROL' PUBLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

"THIS LEAVES ONLY SIX PER CENT OF ALL VEHICLES UNABLE TO USE ULP AT ALL. FORTUNATELY, THESE VEHICLES WILL BE ABLE TO CONTINUE AS AT PRESENT AND USE LEADED PETROL, WHICH WILL CONTINUE TO BE AVAILABLE IN HONG KONG," HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN URGED CAR OWNERS TO CHECK THE REQUIREMENTS OF THEIR OWN VEHICLE IN 'THE MOTORISTS GUIDE TO UNLEADED PETROL', WHICH HAS BEEN SENT BY MAIL TO ALL PETROL VEHICLE OWNERS.

IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT THAT OWNERS STILL ARE NOT CLEAR WHAT TO DO, THEY CAN CALL THE ULP HOTLINE 183 8383.

TWO BUILDINGS IN JUNCTION ROAD DECLARED DANGEROUS

* * * * *

THE BUILDING AUTHORITY HAS DECLARED THE BUILDINGS AT NOS. 3 AND 8C LAI CHI YUEN, JUNCTION ROAD, LIABLE TO BECOME DANGEROUS.

THE PRINCIPAL GOVERNMENT BUILDING SURVEYOR, SAID NO. 3 LAI CHI YUEN WAS A PRE-WAR DOMESTIC BUILDING WHICH COMPRISED A TWO-STOREY MAIN BLOCK CONSTRUCTED OF LOADBEARING MASONRY WALLS WITH TIMBER FLOOR AND TILTED PITCHED ROOF.

IT ALSO COMPRISES A SINGLE-STOREY STRUCTURE WITH REINFORCED CONCRETE ROOF AND MASONRY WALLS AT THE REAR, AND A SINGLE-STOREY STRUCTURE CONSTRUCTED OF TIMBER AND METAL SHEETING AT THE FRONT.

NUMBER 8C LAI CHI YUEN COMPRISES A SINGLE-STOREY DOMESTIC STRUCTURE CONSTRUCTED OF TIMBER AND METAL SHEETING, WHICH IS ATTACHED TO THE SIDE WALL OF NO. 3.

INSPECTION REVEALED THAT NO. 3 WAS SHOWING MARKED SIGNS OF DETERIORATION.

THE MASONRY FLANK WALL OF THE MAIN BLOCK APPEARS TO BE CRACKED RIGHT THROUGH AT THE JUNCTION WITH THE MAIN FRONT WALL FOR ITS FULL HEIGHT, AND THE FRONT WALL HAS ALSO FRACTURED NEAR WINDOW OPENINGS.

MEANWHILE, THE ROOF IS SHOWING EXCESSIVE DEFLECTION AND SEVERAL TIMBER ROOF JOISTS HAVE BECOME ROTTEN OR SPLIT AND ARE SAGGING.

EXTENSIVE SPALLED CONCRETE AND CRACKED BEAMS ARE FOUND IN THE CONCRETE ROOF OF THE SINGLE-STOREY STRUCTURE AT THE REAR.

THE SINGLE-STOREY STRUCTURE AT THE FRONT IS IN A DILAPIDATED CONDITION AND IS LIABLE TO BECOME DANGEROUS UPON DEMOLITION OF THE MAIN BLOCK AT NO. 3 WHILE NO. 8C, THE ROOF BOARDING AND TIMBER SUPPORTS ARE GENERALLY IN A DECAYING STATE AND THE ROOF IS SAGGING AT SEVERAL LOCATIONS.

THESE BUILDINGS ARE CONSIDERED TO HAVE DETERIORATED TO THE EXTENT THAT THEY ARE BEYOND ECONOMIC REPAIR AND SHOULD BE CLOSED AND DEMOLISHED AS BEING LIABLE TO BECOME DANGEROUS.

NOTICES OF INTENTION TO APPLY FOR CLOSURE ORDERS FROM THE HONG KONG DISTRICT COURT ON APRIL 8, HAVE BEEN POSTED ON THE BUILDINGS.
