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PUBLIC URGED TO REPORT CHILD ABUSE

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A PUBLIC EDUCATION AND PUBLICITY PROGRAMME WILL BE LAUNCHED IN JULY TO RAISE COMMUNITY AWARENESS OF THE PROBLEM OF CHILD ABUSE AND TO ENCOURAGE THE REPORTING OF SUSPECTED CASES.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (SATURDAY) THAT THE PROGRAMME, FOCUSED MAINLY ON EARLY DETECTION, WAS CONSIDERED AN IMPORTANT MEASURE IN THE PREVENTION OF CHILD ABUSE CASES.

IT AROSE FROM THE RECOMMENDATIONS BY THE WORKING GROUP ON CHILD ABUSE SET UP LAST YEAR FOLLOWING CONCERN OVER THE PROBLEM.

THE WORKING GROUP COMPRISED REPRESENTATIVES OF VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS AND THE VOLUNTARY SECTOR.

+PROMPT ACTION IN REPORTING CHILD ABUSE MAY NOT ONLY SAVE THE LIFE OF A CHILD BUT COULD ALSO ASSIST THE FAMILY BY BRINGING THEIR DIFFICULTIES TO THE ATTENTION OF THE AUTHORITIES WHO ARE IN A POSITION TO HELP THEM,+ THE SPOKESMAN EMPHASISED.

+CHILD ABUSE RESULTS NOT ONLY FROM PHYSICAL INJURY OR SEXUAL EXPLOITATION,+ HE SAID. +IT MAY ALSO BE CAUSED BY GROSS NEGLECT, OR PSYCHOLOGICAL OR EMOTIONAL ABUSE.+

AN EXPLANATORY LEAFLET FOR DISTRIBUTION TO THE PUBLIC HAS BEEN PREPARED IN CHINESE AND ENGLISH, OUTLINING SIGNS OF CHILD ABUSE TO LOOK OUT FOR, THE NEED TO REPORT AND WHERE TO REPORT.

IT PROVIDES THE ADDRESSES OF 41 FAMILY SERVICES CENTRES RUN BY THE GOVERNMENT AND VOLUNTARY AGENCIES WHERE PEOPLE CAN REPORT SUSPECTED CASES.

THE PUBLIC IS ALSO ADVISED TO MAKE REPORTS TO THE SWD'S HOT LINE AT 3-432255 AND THE AGAINST CHILD ABUSE HOT LINE AT 3-7551122.

COPIES OF THE LEAFLET CAN BE OBTAINED FROM THE 41 FAMILY SERVICES CENTRES, AS WELL AS FROM DISTRICT OFFICES OF THE CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION, HOUSING DEPARTMENT OFFICES, KINDERGARTENS, CHILD CARE CENTRES, SCHOOLS, HOSPITALS AND POLICE STATIONS.

PUBLICITY POSTERS WILL BE MOUNTED IN THESE OFFICES AS WELL AS AT GOVERNMENT POSTER SITES.

+IN CASE OF EMERGENCY, PEOPLE SHOULD CALL THE POLICE FOR ASSISTANCE,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

TO SUPPLEMENT THESE PUBLICITY MATERIALS, SHORT MESSAGES URGING THE PUBLIC TO REPORT CHILD ABUSE CASES WILL BE BROADCAST ON RADIO AND TELEVISION.

/IN ADDITION,

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IN ADDITION, AN EPISODE IN A TELEVISION DRAMA SERIES PRODUCED BY RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG, WILL BE SCREENED LATER IN THE MONTH. IT WILL PORTRAY FAMILY SITUATIONS WHICH MIGHT LEAD TO CHILD ABUSE.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE PUBLIC EDUCATION EFFORTS WERE DIRECTED NOT ONLY AT THE GENERAL PUBLIC BUT ALSO AT PROFESSIONALS SUCH AS DOCTORS, NURSES AND NURSERY AND SCHOOL TEACHERS, WHO HAVE REGULAR AND FREQUENT CONTACT AND DEALINGS WITH CHILDREN.

SIXTY-EIGHT NEW CASES WERE KNOWN TO THE SWD AND THE VOLUNTARY AGENCIES IN THE FIRST THREE MONTHS OF THIS YEAR. LAST YEAR, A TOTAL OF 412 NEW CASES WAS RECORDED.

AS AT THE END OF MARCH THIS YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT AND THE VOLUNTARY SECTOR WERE HANDLING 372 ACTIVE CASES, INVOLVING 482 CHILDREN.

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NEW TENANCY LAW COMING INTO FORCE
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THE LANDLORD AND TENANT (CONSOLIDATION) (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE 1984, GAZETTED ON JUNE 15, 1984, WILL BE IN FORCE FROM TOMORROW (SUNDAY).

HOWEVER, THOSE PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE FURTHER DECONTROL OF LUXURY PREMISES AND THE REVISED RENT INCREASE SYSTEM UNDER PART II OF THE ORDINANCE WILL NOT BECOME OPERATIVE UNTIL DECEMBER 19, 1984.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE RATING AND VALUATION DEPARTMENT SAID THAT, FOLLOWING THE ENACTMENT OF THE AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, A NUMBER OF FORMS FOR USE UNDER THE NEW PROVISIONS HAVE BEEN SPECIFIED AND EXPLANATORY PAMPHLETS, IN ENGLISH AND CHINESE, HAVE BEEN PUBLISHED.

THESE ARE NOW AVAILABLE FREE OF CHARGE FROM THE RATING AND VALUATION DEPARTMENT OR THE DISTRICT OFFICES.

ANY PERSON WHO HAS DIFFICULTY IN OBTAINING SPECIFIED FORMS OR EXPLANATORY PAMPHLETS MAY CONTACT MR CHAU KAM-CHING OF THE RATING AND VALUATION DEPARTMENT AT 5-7957858.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED THAT ANYONE HAVING QUERIES ON THE PROVISIONS OF THE ORDINANCE COULD OBTAIN ASSISTANCE FROM THE RENT OFFICERS OF THE DEPARTMENT OR THE STAFF OF THE DISTRICT OFFICES.

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REMINDER ON TYPHOON ARRANGEMENTS
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THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT TODAY (SATURDAY) ADVISED EMPLOYERS THAT THEY SHOULD REACH PRIOR AGREEMENT WITH THEIR EMPLOYEES ON WORKING ARRANGEMENTS ON THE APPROACH OF OR DURING A TROPICAL STORM.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE AGREEMENT SHOULD INCLUDE RULES FOR WORK, RELEASE FROM WORK, THE METHOD OF CALCULATING WAGES UNDER VARIOUS CIRCUMSTANCES.

+ALTHOUGH THE LAW DOES NOT LAY DOWN ANY PARTICULAR PROCEDURES TO FOLLOW, IT IS BASICALLY A MATTER OF DECISION BETWEEN EACH EMPLOYER AND HIS EMPLOYEES, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THE NATURE OF EMPLOYMENT AND THE INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYEE'S PLACE OF RESIDENCE, AVAILABILITY OF TRANSPORT AND OTHER FACTORS,+ HE ADDED.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT CONFUSION, OR EVEN DISPUTES, COULD ARISE IF THERE WAS NO PRIOR UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES AS TO WHAT TO DO DURING A TYPHOON.

HE SAID THAT ON SUCH OCCASIONS, PRIOR CONSIDERATION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE EMPLOYEES' SAFETY, BOTH AT THE PLACE OF WORK AND DURING THE JOURNEY TO AND FROM HOME.

+FOR EXAMPLE, EMPLOYERS SHOULD SEND THEIR EMPLOYEES HOME WHEN TYPHOON SIGNAL NUMBER EIGHT OR HIGHER IS HOISTED, OR WHEN PUBLIC TRANSPORT IS ABOUT TO STOP.

+OF COURSE, EMPLOYEES WHO ARE REQUIRED TO PERFORM ESSENTIAL AND EMERGENCY DUTIES DURING A TYPHOON WOULD BE EXCEPTIONS,+ HE ADDED.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID EMPLOYERS MIGHT APPROACH THE LABOUR RELATIONS SERVICE OF THE DEPARTMENT FOR ADVICE WHEN DRAFTING OR PREPARING AGREEMENTS CONCERNING TYPHOON ARRANGEMENTS.

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MORE BOARD MEMBERS TO SERVE KWUN TONG
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THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT BOARD WILL HAVE EIGHT MORE ELECTED MEMBERS TO SERVE THE DISTRICT AFTER NEXT MARCH ELECTIONS, THE ASSISTANT DISTRICT OFFICER, MR CLAYMON LAI, SAID THIS (SATURDAY) EVENING.

+THE NUMBER OF ELECTED MEMBERS WILL BE INCREASED FROM 12 TO 20, WITH EIGHT CONSTITUENCIES EACH HAVING TWO ELECTED MEMBERS AND THE OTHER FOUR CONSTITUENCIES ONE EACH,+ HE SAID.

/HE EXPLAINED

HE EXPLAINED THAT THE INCREASE IS IN LINE WITH THE RECENT GOVERNMENT'S DECISION TO FURTHER DEVELOP LOCAL ADMINISTRATION WHICH INCLUDES THE GRADUAL DOUBLING OF ELECTED SEATS IN DISTRICT BOARDS.

MR LAI WAS SPEAKING AT THE DISTRICT'S AMATEUR SINGING CONTEST HELD AT THE LEUNG SHEK CHEE COLLEGE TONIGHT.

HE SAID TO MAKE THE BOARD MORE REPRESENTATIVE AND MORE CAPABLE OF ATTENDING TO LOCAL PEOPLE'S NEEDS, EVERY ELIGIBLE RESIDENT IN KWUN TONG SHOULD EXERCISE HIS CIVIC RIGHT BY TAKING PART IN THE ELECTIONS.

+THEY SHOULD FIRST REGISTER AS VOTERS WHEN THE SIX-WEEK REGISTRATION EXERCISE BEGINS ON AUGUST 15,+ HE SAID.

+THEY SHOULD THEN VOTE ON MARCH 7 TO ELECT THOSE WHO CAN TRULY REPRESENT THEM AND CONTRIBUTE TO THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF THE DISTRICT.+

CITING SQUATTER AREA IMPROVEMENT AND COMMUNITY BUILDING PROJECTS AS EXAMPLES, MR LAI SAID THE JOINT EFFORTS OF THE DISTRICT BOARD AND GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS HAD IMPROVED THE DISTRICT CONSIDERABLY SINCE THE BOARD WAS SET UP IN APRIL 1981.

+HOWEVER, THE BOARD NEEDS THE SUPPORT AND PARTICIPATION OF EVERYONE IN THE DISTRICT TO CONTINUE WITH ITS FINE WORK,+ HE STRESSED.

TONIGHT'S EVENT WAS PART OF A TERRITORY-WIDE AMATEUR SINGING CONTEST JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE 18 DISTRICT OFFICES, RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG AND SING TAO NEWSPAPERS LIMITED.

THE CHAMPION OF THE NIGHT WILL REPRESENT THE DISTRICT IN A SEMI-FINAL ON AUGUST 11.

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SWIMMERS URGED TO FOLLOW SAFETY RULES
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BEACHGOERS ARE BEING WARNED TO STAY OUT OF THE WATER AT PUBLIC BEACHES WHERE A RED FLAG IS HOISTED.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT EXPLAINED THAT THIS SIGNAL, WHICH MEANS IT IS EXTREMELY DANGEROUS TO ENTER THE WATER, WILL BE HOISTED WHEN THE WIND IS STRONG OR THE SEA ROUGH.

FOR THEIR OWN SAFETY, SWIMMERS ARE ALSO URGED TO STAY WITHIN THE AREA MARKED BY BUOY LINES.

/A 25-YEAR-OLD

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A 25-YEAR-OLD MAN WAS DROWNED OUTSIDE THE DEMARCATED SWIMMING AREA AT THE OLD CAFETERIA BEACH IN TUEN MUN RECENTLY WHEN A RED FLAG WAS HOISTED, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+ONE OF THE GOLDEN RULES IS TO KEEP WITHIN YOUR LIMITS AND NEVER TO SWIM ALONE,+ HE SAID.

+IF YOU CAN'T SWIM, DON'T GO FURTHER THAN WAIST-DEEP WATERS. AND ALWAYS TELL YOUR COMPANIONS WHERE YOU WILL BE SWIMMING SO THAT THEY CAN WATCH OUT FOR YOUR SAFETY,+ HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO URGED BEACHGOERS TO SWIM ONLY AT GAZETTED BEACHES WHERE LIFEGUARDS ARE PROVIDED.

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YOUNG WOMEN REMINDED TO GET NEW I.D. CARDS
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WOMEN BORN IN 1961 AND 1962 WHO HAVE NOT YET OBTAINED NEW IDENTITY CARDS, WERE REMINDED TODAY (SATURDAY) TO APPLY FOR THEM BEFORE JULY 14.

GREEN-SEAL CARD HOLDERS IN THE SAME AGE GROUPS SHOULD ALSO APPLY FOR NEW CARDS BEFORE THAT DATE.

THE EIGHT ISSUE OFFICES ARE OPEN FROM 8 AM TO 9.30 PM, MONDAYS TO SATURDAYS.

+DURING THE EVENING RUSH, IT USUALLY TAKES MORE TIME TO PROCESS AN APPLICATION. THEREFORE, THOSE WHO DON'T HAVE TO WORK IN THE DAY ARE ADVISED TO COME DURING NORMAL OFFICE HOURS SO THAT THEIR APPLICATIONS CAN BE PROMPTLY HANDLED,+ AN IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

APPLICANTS SHOULD BRING ALONG THEIR OLD I.D. CARDS TO THE ISSUE OFFICES.

+THOSE WHO WISH TO CHANGE THEIR LAST NAMES AS A RESULT OF A CHANGE IN MARITAL STATUS WILL BE REQUIRED TO SHOW THEIR MARRIAGE OR DIVORCE CERTIFICATES,+ HE ADDED.

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KEEPING HONG KONG CLEAN AND GREEN

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THE TASK OF KEEPING HONG KONG CLEAN AND GREEN WAS AN ON-GOING COMMITMENT BY THE PUBLIC AND GOVERNMENT AGENCIES, AN UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE CLEAN HONG KONG NEW TERRITORIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE, MR KWONG PING-YAU, SAID TODAY.

HE WAS SPEAKING AFTER VISITING VARIOUS LOCATIONS ON LANTAU ISLAND IN THE COURSE OF A TOUR OF ISLANDS DISTRICT +TO SEE CLEANSING FACILITIES AND THE RESULTS OF TREE PLANTING+.

WITH MR KWONG ON THE TOUR WERE THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (HEADQUARTERS) OF THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT, MR LI TIN-MING, AND THE URBAN SERVICES OFFICER OF ISLANDS, MR IP KI-TIT.

THE GROUP ALSO VISITED THE VILLAGE TYPE REFUSE INCINERATORS AT MUI WO, LOWER KEUNG SHAN AND PO CHUE TAM TO SEE HOW REFUSE ON THE ISLAND IS DISPOSED OF.

DURING THE VISIT, MR KWONG LEARNED THAT THE GOVERNMENT WAS PLANNING TO BUILD A MODERN INCINERATOR AT MUI WO, TO REPLACE THE EXISTING OLD INCINERATORS.

THE GOVERNMENT WAS ALSO LOOKING INTO THE FEASIBILITY OF BARGING OUT REFUSE OF MUI WO FOR DISPOSAL.

THE PARTY ALSO PROCEEDED TO A SITE ON THE WATERFRONT AREA, EARMARKED FOR THE BUILDING OF A COOKED FOOD CENTRE - TO ACCOMMODATE ALL ELIGIBLE COOKED FOOD OPERATORS, THEREBY IMPROVING HYGIENE IN THE AREA.

IT THEN WENT TO TAI O TOWN AREA TO INSPECT THE CLEANSING FACILITIES BEING PROVIDED TO RESIDENTS.

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THE FIRST MANPOWER SURVEY REPORT ON THE ELECTRONIC DATA PROCESSING (EDP) INDUSTRY IS ON SALE AT THE GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS CENTRE, GPO BUILDING, CENTRAL.

THE SURVEY WAS CONDUCTED BY THE COMMITTEE ON ELECTRONIC DATA PROCESSING TRAINING OF THE VOCATIONAL TRAINING COUNCIL IN JUNE LAST YEAR.

THE REPORT CONTAINS DETAILED STATISTICAL INFORMATION ON THE EMPLOYMENT STRUCTURE OF THE EDP INDUSTRY, THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES IN EACH PRINCIPAL JOB, A FORECAST OF THE INDUSTRY'S TRAINING NEEDS AND RECOMMENDATIONS ON HOW TO MEET THESE NEEDS.

THE REPORT, IN CHINESE AND ENGLISH, COSTS \$8.5 A COPY.

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COURSES FOR TECHNICAL AND COMMERCIAL TEACHERS

THE COURSES, TO BE CONDUCTED BY THE TECHNICAL TEACHERS' COLLEGE OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, WILL COVER THE TEACHING OF TYPEWRITING, COMMERCE AND ACCOUNTING= BASIC PRODUCT DESIGN RENDERING AND PRESENTATION= AND THE TEACHING OF METALWORK, WOODWORK, ENAMELLING, ELECTRICITY AND ELECTRONICS.

THERE WILL ALSO BE AN INTRODUCTORY COURSE IN SAND CASTING AND IN PERSPECTIVE DRAWING FOR DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY TEACHERS, AS WELL AS A PROGRESSIVE COURSE IN GLASSFIBRE REINFORCEMENT PLASTICS AND RESIN CASTING FOR DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY TEACHERS.

THE ASSISTANT DISTRICT OFFICER, MR RAYMOND WONG; THE RECREATION AND SPORT OFFICER, MR ALBERT THUMB; THE AMENITIES OFFICER OF NTSD, MR NG BING-SUM; THE HONORARY PRESIDENT OF THE ISLANDS DISTRICT SPORTS ASSOCIATION, MR YOUNG WING-YAU; AND THE VICE-CHAIRMAN OF THE HEUNG YEE KUK, MR TSANG LIN, WILL OFFICIATE AT AN OPENING CEREMONY AT 10.45 AM.

A PRIZE PRESENTATION CEREMONY WILL BE HELD AT 3.45 PM.

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NEW ROAD AND FLYOVER IN CENTRAL OPEN
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A NEW ACCESS ROAD LEADING TO THE VICTORIA BARRACKS IN CENTRAL, ALONG WITH A FLYOVER ACROSS QUEENSWAY NEAR THE POLICE MARRIED QUARTERS, WILL BE OPEN TO TRAFFIC FROM 8 AM ON MONDAY (JULY 2).

NO VEHICLES OTHER THAN FRANCHISED BUSES MAY STOP FOR PASSENGERS OR GOODS AT ANY TIME ON THE NEW ROAD OR THE FLYOVER, AND NO PUBLIC LIGHT BUS WILL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER.

THE FLYOVER WILL ALSO BE PROHIBITED TO CYCLISTS AND PEDESTRIANS.

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URBAN CLEARWAYS FOR CENTRAL
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FROM 10 AM ON MONDAY (JULY 2), THE FOLLOWING ROAD SECTIONS IN CENTRAL WILL BE MADE URBAN CLEARWAYS FROM 7 AM TO 10 AM AND FROM 4 PM TO 7 PM DAILY:

- * UPPER ALBERT ROAD EASTBOUND FROM ARBUTHNOT ROAD TO ABOUT 70 METRES EAST OF GLENEALY;
- * ARBUTHNOT ROAD BETWEEN ITS JUNCTION WITH UPPER ALBERT ROAD AND A POINT ABOUT 25 METRES NORTH OF THE SAME JUNCTION.

WITHIN THESE SECTIONS, NO MOTOR VEHICLES OTHER THAN FRANCHISED BUSES WILL BE ALLOWED TO STOP FOR PASSENGERS OR GOODS DURING THE RESTRICTED PERIODS.

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
