NEW STUDENT TRAVEL SCHEME FOR HALF MILLION

*** * * * ***

MORE THAN HALF A MILLION STUDENTS WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR CHEAPER TRAVEL ON BUSES, FERRIES, TRAINS AND TRAMS UNDER A NEW STUDENT TRAVEL SCHEME UNVEILED TODAY BY THE GOVERNMENT.

THE SCHEME IS SET TO BEGIN OPERATING IN SEPTEMBER, AND IS EXPECTED TO COST THE GOVERNMENT ABOUT \$230 MILLION A YEAR.

IT WILL BE OPEN TO ALL STUDENTS AGED FROM 12 TO 25 ENROLLED IN FULL-TIME COURSES RANGING FROM PRIMARY THROUGH TO FIRST-DEGREE UNIVERSITY AND WHO HAVE A VALID HONG KONG IDENTITY CARD.

CONCESSIONARY FARES OFFERED UNDER THE SCHEME WILL BE GENERALLY SET AT HALF THE FULL ADULT FARE AND APPLY THROUGHOUT THE YEAR TO TRANSPORT SERVICES PROVIDED BY:

THE CONCESSIONARY FARES WILL BE AVAILABLE TO ELIGIBLE STUDENTS WHO HAVE A STUDENT TRAVEL CARD ISSUED BY THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT.

ANNOUNCING DETAILS OF THE NEW SCHEME, THE DEPUTY COMMISSIONER FOR TRANSPORT, MR PETER LEEDS, SAID: +STUDENTS WHO WISH TO APPLY FOR A STUDENT TRAVEL CARD MUST COMPLETE AN APPLICATION FORM, MARKED TD206, WHICH WILL BE AVAILABLE FROM THEIR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION AT THE BEGINNING OF THE NEW ACADEMIC YEAR IN SEPTEMBER.

+AFTER FILLING IN THE FORM, STUDENTS SHOULD HAND IT IN TO THEIR INSTITUTION, TOGETHER WITH THREE PHOTOGRAPHS OF THEMSELVES AND \$10 TO COVER ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS.

+APPLICATIONS WILL THEN BE FORWARDED TO THE STUDENT TRAVEL OFFICE OF THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT, WHICH WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ISSUING THE CARDS AND ADMINISTERING THE SCHEME.+

MR LEEDS SAID STUDENT TRAVEL CARDS WOULD BE VALID FROM SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH TO SEPTEMBER 30 THE FOLLOWING YEAR.

EACH CARD WOULD BE SECURITY PRINTED AND LAMINATED, AND BEAR THE NAME, SEX, IDENTITY CARD NUMBER, SIGNATURE AND PHOTOGRAPH OF THE HOLDER.

MR LEEDS SAID THAT STUDENTS MUST PRODUCE THEIR CARDS WHEN PAYING FARES AND WARNED THAT STUDENT TRAVEL CARDS WERE NOT TRANSFERABLE AND WOULD BE CANCELLED IF THEY WERE MISUSED OR IF FRAUD WAS INVOLVED.

+CARDS MUST BE SURRENDERED TO THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT FOR CANCELLATION ONCE THE HOLDER CEASES TO BE A FULL-TIME STUDENT,+ HE SAID.

+BUT STUDENTS LEAVING SCHOOL AT THE END OF AN ACADEMIC YEAR MAY CONTINUE TO USE A CARD UNTIL IT EXPIRES.+

MR LEEDS SAID THE NEW STUDENT TRAVEL SCHEME WOULD COVER ALL ROUTES AND SERVICES EXCEPT THE FOLLOWING:

- * CROSS-HARBOUR BUS ROUTES,
- * EXPRESS COACH SERVICES,
- * SPECIAL BUS SERVICES ON RACE DAYS AND ON FESTIVAL DAYS,
- * SOME DESIGNATED 'RECREATIONAL' BUS ROUTES,
- * SOME CHINA MOTOR BUS (CMB) EXPRESS ROUTES,
- * HONGKONG AND YAUMATI FERRY DE-LUXE CLASS AND HOVER-FERRY SERVICES WHERE CHEAPER ALTERNATIVE SERVICES ARE PROVIDED,
- * STAR FERRY SECOND-CLASS SERVICES, AND
- * KOWLOON-CANTON RAILWAY (KCR) THROUGH-PASSENGER AND SPECIAL SERVICES TO THE SHA TIN RACECOURSE.

ALL KCR SERVICES AND SOME CMB ROUTES WILL ALSO BE EXCLUDED FROM THE SCHEME ON SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

DETAILS OF EXCLUDED ROUTES AND SERVICES ARE LISTED IN A GUIDE TO THE STUDENT TRAVEL SCHEME+, WHICH WILL BE DISTRIBUTED SOON THROUGH CITY DISTRICT OFFICES, EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND THE STUDENT TRAVEL OFFICE.

MORE TAKING TO OUTDOOR SPORTS

* * * * *

MORE PEOPLE IN HONG KONG ARE MAKING BETTER USE OF THEIR LEISURE HOURS BY ENGAGING IN A WIDE VARIETY OF OUTDOOR AND OTHER ACTIVITIES THROUGH THE HELP AND EFFORT OF THE GOVERNMENT'S RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE.

THROUGH ITS 19 DISTRICT OFFICES OPERATING IN ALL PARTS OF THE URBAN AREAS AND THE NEW TERRITORIES, THE SERVICE STAGES MANY PROGRAMMES, RANGING FROM DANCE AND FITNESS CLASSES TO TEAM GAMES AND ATHLETIC MEETS.

LAST YEAR, MORE THAN 560 000 PEOPLE STEPPED OUT OF THEIR HOUSES TO TAKE PART IN THESE ACTIVITIES, AND SUCH WAS THE DEMAND FOR PLACES THAT THOUSANDS OF OTHERS HAD TO MISS OUT ON THEIR CHANCES, THE PRINCIPAL RECREATION AND SPORTS OFFICER, MR DICKEN YUNG SAID.

+ENCOURAGING RESPONSE FROM THE PEOPLE HAS LED TO THE OPENING OF MORE CLASSES,+ HE SAID.

+HENCE, CONVENIENT SPOTS SUCH AS SPACES UNDER FLYOVERS OR AT THE PIER AND EXISTING UNDERUSED BUILDINGS HAVE BEEN CONVERTED INTO TRAINING GROUNDS TO ENABLE CLASSES TO BE HELD.

+THEY ARE ARRANGED AT DIFFERENT TIMES OF THE DAY TO SUIT PEOPLE OF ALL CONDITIONS SUCH AS THE PROFESSIONALS, FACTORY AND OFFICE WORKERS, AND HOUSEWIVES.+

MR YUNG EMPHASISED THAT IN THE PROGRAMME DEVISED, NO-ONE IS MEANT TO BE LEFT OUT.

+FOR INSTANCE, THERE ARE WATER SAFETY COURSES FOR BABIES AND SWIMMING CLASSES FOR THE ELDERLIES, AND THE HANDICAPPED AND THE INFIRM HAVE ALWAYS BEEN INCLUDED IN THE RECREATION PLANS,+ HE SAID.

THE SERVICE HAS ALSO BEEN MAKING VIGOROUS EFFORTS TO BRING THE MORE EXPENSIVE SPORTS TO AS MANY PEOPLE AS POSSIBLE.

WHILE SUCH ACTIVITIES AS SCUBA-DIVING, SAILING AND HORSE-RIDING ARE NORMALLY BEYOND THE MEANS OF MANY, MORE PEOPLE CAN NOW ENJOY THESE SPORTS WITH ONLY A MINIMAL CHARGE.

MR YUNG POINTED OUT THAT AMONG SOME 4 664 PROGRAMMES ORGANISED IN 1980/81, THE MOST POPULAR EVENTS WERE HIKING, EXCURSION, SAILING AND CANOEING, AND RESIDENTIAL CAMPING AT THE OUTDOOR RECREATION CENTRES.

+THE OPENING OF THE LADY MACLEHOSE VILLAGE CENTRE AT SAI KUNG HAS CREATED MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR PEOPLE TO DIVERT THEIR EXCESSIVE ENERGY IN HEALTHY OUTLETS AND TO ENJOY EXPERIENCES THAT ARE DIFFERENT FROM THEIR ROUTINE ACTIVITY WORK,+ HE SAID.

/EE WAS

HE WAS PARTICULARLY PLEASED TO SEE THE SUCCESSFUL PENETRATION OF THE SERVICE INTO EVERY LEVEL AND SEGMENT OF THE COMMUNITY, HE SAID. ARES AND WARNED THAT STUDENT TRAVEL CARDS WERE NOT TRANSFERABLE AND WOULD BE CANCELLED IF THEY WERE MISUSED OR IF FRAUD SUCH AS THE WIDE INVOLVEMENT OF THE COMMUNITY THAT EVEN PIER WORKERS AND HAWKERS FROM THE VEGETABLE AND FRUIT MARKETS ARE AMONG THE KEEN SUPPORTERS OF THE SERVICE'S OUTDOOR PURSUITS AND BALL GAME ACTIVITIES. HE SAID.

HOWEVER, MR YUNG POINTED OUT THAT THE AIM OF THE PROGRAMME IS NOT MERELY TO ATTRACT LARGE NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS TO ENGAGE IN ITS ACTIVITIES. THE OBJECT IS TO DEVELOP IN THE PEOPLE A LONG-LASTING DESIRE TO ENGAGE IN ACTIVE RECREATION.

MR LEEDS SAID THE NEW STUDENT TRAVEL SCHEME WOULD COVER ALL ROUTES TO ATTAIN THESE GOALS. THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE CONTACTS SPORTS ASSOCIATIONS AND ENLISTS THEIR SUPPORT IN ENCOURAGING MORE PEOPLE TO ENJOY THE RECREATION AND BENEFITS OF THE MANY ACTIVITIES.

* EXPRESS COACH SERVICES.

IT ALSO OFFERS TRAINING PROGRAMMES TO THESE BODIES AND PEOPLE OVER THE YEARS. ABOUT 5,000 QUALIFIED INSTRUCTORS HAVE BEEN SO TRAINED AND THIS HAS ENABLED THE SERVICE TO EXPAND ITS ACTIVITIES, HE SAID.

* SOME DESIGNATED 'RECREATIONAL' BUS ROUTES.

APART FROM THAT, THE SERVICE ALSO CONTACTS VOLUNTARY ASSOCIATIONS AND LOCAL BUSINESS FIRMS.

* THROUGH SUCH CONNECTIONS, THE SERVICE HELPS TO COORDINATE ACTIVITIES FOR MEMBERS OF THESE ORGANISATIONS AND, IN RETURN, THESE ORGANISATIONS OFTEN PROVIDE MANPOWER AND SPONSORSHIP FOR MAJOR EVENTS HELD, HE SAID.

* STAR FERRY SECOND-CLASS SERVICES, AND

THESE VARIED ACTIVITIES NOT ONLY PROVIDE BOTH PHYSICAL BENEFIT AND RECREATION FOR THE INDIVIDUAL, BUT THEY ALSO COMBINE, THROUGH THE CLOSER CONTACTS AMONG THE PEOPLE, TO ESTABLISH GREATER COMMUNITY BENEFIT FOR ALL CONCERNED, MR YUNG SAID. ALL KCR SERVICES AND SOME CMB ROUTES WILL ALSO BE EXCLUDED FROM THE SCHEME ON SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

LABOUR RELATIONS WORKSHOPS HELD

* * * *

THE THIRD IN A SERIES OF WORKSHOPS ON LABOUR RELATIONS ORGANISED BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT BEGAN AT QUEEN ELIZABETH STADIUM, WAN CHAI, TODAY (TUESDAY).

MR DONALD CHAN, CHIEF LABOUR OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE DEPARTMENT'S LABOUR RELATIONS SERVICE, TOLD PARTICIPANTS THAT THE SERIES OF WORKSHOP FORMED PART OF A YEAR-LONG LABOUR AND STAFF RELATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROJECT ORGANISED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME.

THE PROJECT, HE SAID, WAS AIMED AT PROVIDING PARTICIPANTS WITH TRAINING ON LABOUR RELATIONS AND RELATED SUBJECTS WITH THE HOPE OF ENSURING THE HARMONIOUS DEVELOPMENT OF THE ECONOMY AND SOCIAL PROGRESS IN HONG KONG.

MR CHAN WENT ON TO SAY THAT INDUSTRIAL CONFLICTS WERE ROOTED IN THE CONFLICTING INTERESTS OF EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES.

HE SAID THAT THE MOST COMMON OBJECTIVE OF BUSINESS ORGANISATIONS WAS TO BE PRODUCTIVE AND PROFITABLE WHILE THAT OF THE EMPLOYEES WAS STEADY EMPLOYMENT WITH FAIR WAGES AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT.

THEIR COMPETING EFFORTS TO ACHIEVE THEIR TARGETS USUALLY ENDED UP IN LABOUR DISPUTES, HE ADDED.

DESPITE THE LATENT CONFLICT IN INTERESTS, MR CHAN WENT ON, EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES ALSO HAD MUTUAL OBJECTIVES -- THE MOST COMMON ONE BEING THE PROSPERITY OF THE ORGANISATION.

TO PROMOTE LABOUR RELATIONS, HE CALLED ON THE THREE PARTIES -- MANAGEMENT, INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYEES AND TRADE UNIONS TO ENDEAVOUR TO WIDEN THIS MUTUAL AREA AND MAINTAIN A HARMONIOUS RELATIONSHIP.

OTHER SPEAKERS AT THE OPENING WERE MR WHELAN WONG, PRESIDENT OF THE HONG KONG INSTITUTE OF PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT AND MR WU LANG-MENG, LABOUR OFFICER (LABOUR RELATIONS).

SPEAKERS AT THE WORKSHOP'S OTHER SESSIONS WILL BE MR LAM WAH-HUI, CHAIRMAN OF GOVERNMENT SCHOOL NON-GRADUATE TEACHERS' UNION, MR MAK SAI-YIU, ACTING SENIOR LABOUR OFFICER, MR HOUDINI H.T. HO, SENIOR LABOUR OFFICER, AND MR FRED K.Y. LAM, PERSONNEL MANAGER (STAFF RELATIONS) OF THE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY CORPORATION.

MORE TSUEN WAN PEOPLE SEEK FREE LEGAL ADVICE
* * * * *

MORE PEOPLE IN TSUEN WAN ARE MAKING USE OF THE LOCAL FREE LEGAL ADVICE CENTRE.

IN JUNE, THE NUMBER OF CASES HANDLED WAS 40, ALMOST DOUBLE THE NUMBER DEALT WITH WHEN THE CENTRE FIRST OPENED IN MAY LAST YEAR.

SINCE OPENING A TOTAL OF 455 CASES HAVE BEEN HANDLED, AN AVERAGE OF MORE THAN 32 EACH MONTH.

MARCH WAS THE BUSIEST MONTH WITH 46 CASES.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION WELCOMED THE RISE IN THE NUMBER OF CASES WHICH SHOWED, HE SAID, INCREASING AWARENESS OF THE SCHEME.

THE CENTRE IS ON THE FIRST FLOOR OF TSUEN WAN TOWN MANAGEMENT OFFICE IN HOI PA STREET, AND IS MANNED BY TWO LAWYERS ON TUESDAY EVENINGS FROM 6.30 PM - 9.30 PM.

IT IS ONE OF SIX CENTRES OPERATED BY THE LAW SOCIETY TO HELP PEOPLE SEEKING LEGAL ADVICE.

THE DUTY LAWYERS ADVISE THE PUBLIC ON STEPS WHICH MAY BE OPEN TO THEM, BUT THEY CAN NOT REPRESENT THEM IN COURT.

ANYONE WISHING TO SEEK LEGAL ADVICE SHOULD FIRST APPROACH THEIR LOCAL DISTRICT OFFICE OR PUBLIC ENQUIRY SERVICE CENTRE WHERE DETAILS OF THEIR CASE ARE TAKEN DOWN AND APPOINTMENTS WITH THE LAWYERS MADE.

THE NATURE OF CASES HANDLED INCLUDES MATRIMONIAL AND EMPLOYMENT MATTERS, LAND AND LANDLORD AND TENANT DISPUTES, CRIMINAL CASES, AND COMMERCIAL AND PROPERTY DISPUTES.

THE OTHER FREE LEGAL ADVICE CENTRES ARE AT MONG KOK, WONG TAI SIN, WAN CHAI, EASTERN DISTRICT AND SHA TIN.

KINDERGARTEN SUPERVISOR SEVERELY WARNED

* * * *

THE SUPERVISOR OF THE KOWLOON TONG SHUI FONG KINDERGARTEN WAS STERNLY WARNED THIS (TUESDAY) MORNING BY DISTRICT EDUCATION OFFICERS THAT HE CANNOT ACCEPT PUPILS FOR THE ENGLISH SECTION WHICH HAS STILL TO BE APPROVED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

HIS ATTENTION WAS ALSO DRAWN TO THE EDUCATION REGULATIONS GOVERNING FEES WHERE HE HAD INCREASED THE MONTHLY FEES IN RESPECT OF THE EXISTING CHINESE SECTION WITHOUT EVEN APPLYING FOR APPROVAL FROM THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION.

+THIS IS A SERIOUS CONTRAVENTION OF EXISTING REGULATIONS AND THE SUPERVISOR WILL BE ASKED TO EXPLAIN HIS ACTION,+ AN EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE SUPERVISOR OF THE SHUI FONG KINDERGARTEN WROTE TO THE DEPARTMENT IN EARLY JULY APPLYING FOR A CHANGE OF SUPERVISOR WHICH WAS GRANTED.

IN MID-JULY, HE AGAIN WROTE IN REQUESTING PERMISSION TO ESTABLISH AN ENGLISH SECTION. THE ADVISORY INSPECTORATE OF THE DEPARTMENT IS NOW STUDYING THE PROPOSED CURRICULUM.

AN APPLICATION FOR A CHANGE OF NAME TO YORK KINDERGARTEN WAS RECEIVED ON JULY 30 AND THIS TOO WAS BEING CONSIDERED.

+AS CAN BE SEEN, THE TWO LATTER APPLICATIONS WERE SUBMITTED WITHIN THE PAST TWO WEEKS, BOTH OF WHICH HAVE TO BE CAREFULLY CONSIDERED BY THE DEPARTMENT,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.
