GOVERNOR ON MR ZHOU NAN'S VISIT
* * * *

THE GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID WILSON, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY) THAT HE WAS VERY GLAD TO HAVE HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO EXCHANGE VIEWS WITH MR ZHOU NAN DURING THE CHINESE VICE FOREIGN MINISTER'S VISIT TO HONG KONG.

SPEAKING TO REPORTERS AT THE COMMUNITY CHEST KOWLOON WALK, THE GOVERNOR SAID HE HAD MET MR ZHOU MANY TIMES BEFORE.

"THIS TIME WAS SPECIAL BECAUSE IT GAVE HIM A CHANCE TO SEE SOMETHING OF HONG KONG," SIR DAVID SAID.

"I DO BELIEVE IT'S VERY IMPORTANT FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE DEALING WITH HONG KONG AFFAIRS TO COME AND SEE HONG KONG FOR THEMSELVES, SEE HOW WE'VE DEVELOPED THINGS IN HONG KONG, AND MEET FOR THEMSELVES SOME OF THE LEADING PERSONALITIES IN HONG KONG," HE SAID.

"SO I WAS VERY GLAD MR ZHOU NAN HAD THAT CHANCE TO DO IT," HE ADDED.

SIR DAVID HAD A BRIEF MEETING AT FANLING LODGE WITH MR ZHOU BEFORE THE VICE FOREIGN MINISTER LEFT HONG KONG FOR SHENZHEN.

THE GOVERNOR ALSO SAID HE WILL BE GOING TO LONDON TO ATTEND THE HEARINGS OF THE FOREIGN AFFAIRS COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS.

"THEY WILL BE HAVING HEARINGS WITH THE FOREIGN SECRETARY, SIR GEOFFREY HOWE, AND WITH ME ON THE SAME DAY WHICH IS MARCH 22," HE SAID.

"I WAS VERY ANXIOUS TO HAVE A CHANCE TO TALK TO THE COMMITTEE RIGHT AT THE BEGINNING OF ITS WORK IN ORDER TO SET THE SCENE FOR THEIR WORK BEFORE THEY COME TO HONG KONG," SIR DAVID ADDED.

HOME SAFETY CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED IN SHA TIN

ACCIDENTS IN THE HOME CLAIMED 115 LIVES IN THE TERRITORY LAST YEAR.

THIS FIGURE WAS GIVEN BY THE DIRECTOR OF INFORMATION SERVICES, MRS IRENE YAU, AT THE LAUNCHING OF THE 1988-89 HOME SAFETY CAMPAIGN IN NEW TOWN PLAZA, SHA TIN, THIS (SUNDAY) AFTERNOON.

MRS YAU NOTED THAT FALLS, BURNS AND CHOKING ON FOOD WERE THE MAIN CAUSES OF THE FATAL ACCIDENTS, AND OVER HALF THE VICTIMS WERE SMALL CHILDREN AND ELDERLY PEOPLE.

"MANY ACCIDENTS OCCUR IN THE HOME BECAUSE OF CARELESSNESS AND IGNORANCE," SHE SAID.

"TO AVOID THESE TRAGEDIES, WE SHOULD TRY TO GIVE MORE ATTENTION TO OUR CHILDREN AND THE ELDERLY AT HOME, AND PROTECT THEM FROM POTENTIAL ACCIDENTS.

"IT IS INDEED THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PARENTS TO TEACH THEIR FAMILY MEMBERS AND DOMESTIC HELPERS ABOUT HOME SAFETY MATTERS AND TO ASK THEM TO PAY ATTENTION TO HIDDEN DANGERS."

TURNING TO PUBLICITY, MRS YAU POINTED OUT THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD BEEN MAKING A CONTINUOUS EFFORT TO PROMOTE HOME SAFETY IN RECENT YEARS.

"THE FOCUS OF THIS YEAR'S PUBLICITY IS TO PREVENT ACCIDENTS IN THE KITCHEN AND IN THE BATHROOM - TWO DANGER AREAS IN THE HOME," SHE SAID.

ANOTHER OFFICIATING GUEST, LEGISLATIVE COUNCILLOR MR EDWARD HO, ALSO EMPHASISED THAT ALL MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY, ESPECIALLY ADULTS, SHOULD MAKE CONCERTED EFFORTS TO BUILD A SAFE HOME.

HE ADVISED PARENTS NOT TO LEAVE THEIR CHILDREN ALONE IN THE HOUSE OR TO LET THEM STAY IN THE KITCHEN UNATTENDED.

"ELDERLY PEOPLE ARE SLOW IN ACTION AND RESPONSE; WE SHOULD NOT LET THEM MOVE HEAVY OBJECTS," HE ADDED.

TODAY'S PROGRAMME INCLUDED A HOME SAFETY RADIO VARIETY SHOW, WHICH WAS BROADCAST LIVE ON COMMERCIAL RADIO 1 BETWEEN 4 PM AND 5 PM.

ANOTHER HIGHLIGHT WAS AN EXHIBITION ON SAFETY IN THE KITCHEN. EACH VISITOR TO THE EXHIBITION WAS GIVEN A NEW AND COMPREHENSIVE HOME SAFETY HANDBOOK.

AT THE CEREMONY, MR HO PRESENTED A SOUVENIR TO A REPRESENTATIVE OF KWONG SUN HONG GODOWN LTD. AND KWONG SUN FOOD PRODUCTS CO LTD. WHICH SPONSORED THE PRINTING OF THE HANDBOOK.

ALSO RECEIVING A SOUVENIR WAS A REPRESENTATIVE OF LION AND GLOBE PEANUT OIL WHICH HAD SPONSORED THE PRINTING OF HOME SAFETY "FAI CHUN" FOR THE LUNAR NEW YEAR AND DONATED PRIZES FOR THE RADIO QUIZ DURING TODAY'S VARIETY SHOW.

TO DRIVE HOME THE HOME SAFETY MESSAGE, A SERIES OF 20 FIVE-MINUTE DRAMATIC SEGMENTS WILL BE BROADCAST ON COMMERCIAL RADIO 1 AT 10.50 AM FROM MONDAY TO FRIDAY BETWEEN MARCH 6 AND 31.

TODAY'S EXHIBITION WILL BE REPEATED AT NINE DIFFERENT HOUSING ESTATES AND SHOPPING ARCADES IN THE TERRITORY ON NINE CONSECUTIVE SUNDAYS STARTING FROM MARCH 19.

CALL TO PAY ATTENTION TO HOME SAFETY

* * * * *

THE REGIONAL SOCIAL WELFARE OFFICER (NEW TERRITORIES), MR CARLOS LEUNG, TODAY (SUNDAY) CALLED ON THE PUBLIC TO ATTACH IMPORTANCE TO HOME SAFETY.

SPEAKING AT A NEW YEAR VARIETY SHOW AND PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY ORGANISED BY THE TAI PO COMMUNITY CENTRE, MR LEUNG NOTED THAT RECENTLY THERE WERE A NUMBER OF MEDIA REPORTS ON DOMESTIC ACCIDENTS SUCH AS FIRE, FOOD POISONING AND CHILDREN FALLING FROM HEIGHTS.

HE POINTED OUT THAT MANY OF THESE ACCIDENTS COULD HAVE BEEN AVOIDED.

HE CALLED ON PARENTS AND FAMILY MEMBERS TO PAID PARTICULAR ATTENTION TO POTENTIAL DANGERS AT HOME SUCH AS LOOSELY-FITTED WINDOW GRILLS, IMPROPER STORAGE OF MEDICINES AND SHARP OBJECTS, SLIPPERY FLOOR, FURNITURES WITH SHARP CORNERS AND BROKEN TOYS WHICH COULD BE THREATS TO THE SAFETY OF THE ELDERLY AND THE YOUNG.

MR LEUNG REFERRED TO RECENT ACCIDENTS INVOLVING YOUNG CHILDREN FALLING FROM HEIGHTS BEING INJURED OR EVEN KILLED PARTLY BECAUSE THEY WERE LEFT UNATTENDED AT HOME.

"I HOPE PARENTS AND FAMILY MEMBERS WOULD AVOID TAKING THE RISK OF LEAVING YOUNG CHILDREN UNATTENDED AT HOME.

"THEY SHOULD SEEK ASSISTANCE FROM NEIGHBOURS OR RELATIVES FOR THE TEMPORARY CARE OF THEIR CHILDREN IF THEY HAVE TO LEAVE HOME FOR A SHORT WHILE AND SHOULD RESORT TO CHILD CARE CENTRES AS A LONG-TERM MEASURE," HE SAID.

MR LEUNG POINTED OUT THAT BOTH THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT AND VOLUNTARY AGENCIES HAD MADE A LOT OF EFFORTS IN PROMOTING THE CONCEPT OF HOME SAFETY.

"THE DEPARTMENT WILL IN THE COMING MONTHS ORGANISE EXHIBITIONS, SEMINARS AND TALENT SHOWS TO FURTHER PROMOTE PUBLIC AWARENESS OF THIS ISSUE," HE SAID.

PLAN FOR TECHNICAL INSTITUTE APPROVED

* * * * *

THE PLAN FOR A TECHNICAL INSTITUTE AT WOOD ROAD, WAN CHAI, WAS APPROVED BY THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE LAST DECEMBER.

IT WAS AMONG 49 PLANS APPROVED DURING THE MONTH, COMPRISING 19 FOR HONG KONG ISLAND, NINE FOR KOWLOON AND 21 FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE APPROVED PLANS INCLUDED 17 FOR APARTMENT, APARTMENT/COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENCE AND 10 FOR COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENTS.

CONSENT TO START WORK WAS GIVEN FOR 23 PROJECTS. THE TOTAL FLOOR AREA OF THESE PROJECTS WAS 149,986.1 SQUARE METRES, OF WHICH 59,421.9 SQUARE METRES WERE FOR DOMESTIC AND THE REMAINDER FOR NON-DOMESTIC PURPOSES.

THE TOTAL DECLARED COST OF NEW BUILDINGS COMPLETED DURING THE MONTH WAS ABOUT \$1,853.6 MILLION.

THE TOTAL FLOOR AREA OF THESE BUILDINGS WAS 487,776.8 SQUARE METRES, OF WHICH 284,449.7 SQUARE METRES WERE FOR DOMESTIC AND THE REMAINDER FOR NON-DOMESTIC PURPOSES.

DURING THE MONTH, THE OFFICE ISSUED A TOTAL OF 58 OCCUPATION PERMITS, OF WHICH 16 WERE FOR HONG KONG ISLAND, 10 FOR KOWLOON AND 32 FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

IN ADDITION, THE OFFICE ISSUED 27 DEMOLITION CONSENTS AFFECTING 65 BUILDINGS.

THE CONTROL AND ENFORCEMENT DIVISION RECEIVED 621 COMPLAINTS ON ILLEGAL BUILDING WORKS, CARRIED OUT 811 INSPECTIONS AND ISSUED 99 REMOVAL ORDERS.

THE DANGEROUS BUILDINGS SECTION INSPECTED 399 BUILDINGS AND ONE CLOSURE ORDER WAS OBTAINED.

OUTFALL BETWEEN MIDDLE BAY AND SOUTH BAY PROPOSED

* * * * *

THE GOVERNMENT INTENDS TO CONSTRUCT AN OUTFALL WITHIN AN AREA OF ABOUT TWO SQUARE METRES OF FORESHORE AND SEABED AT THE HEADLAND BETWEEN MIDDLE BAY AND SOUTH BAY.

THIS IS TO PROVIDE FIRST AID MEASURES OF POLLUTION ABATEMENT IN STORMWATER DRAINS AT MIDDLE BAY BEACH.

ON THE OTHER HAND, THE GOVERNMENT INTENDS TO GRANT A TENANCY TO THE HONG KONG TRADE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL WITHIN AN AREA OF APPROXIMATELY 920 SQUARE METRES OF FORESHORE AND SEABED AT WAN CHAI FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A LANDSCAPED PEDESTRIAN PROMENADE.

THE EXTENTS OF THE AREAS AFFECTED WERE DESCRIBED IN THE LATEST ISSUE OF THE GAZETTE.

ANY PERSON WHO CONSIDERS THAT HE HAS AN INTEREST, RIGHT OR EASEMENT IN OR OVER THE FORESHORE AND SEABED INVOLVED MAY SUBMIT AN OBJECTION IN WRITING TO THE DIRECTOR OF BUILDINGS AND LANDS ON OR BEFORE MAY 2.

INSURANCE FOR WORKERS MANDATORY

THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT TODAY (SUNDAY) REMINDED EMPLOYERS TO TAKE OUT INSURANCE POLICIES FOR THEIR EMPLOYEES FOR THE PURPOSE OF COMPENSATION IN CASE OF WORK ACCIDENTS.

THIS FOLLOWS A NUMBER OF RECENT COURT CONVICTIONS IN WHICH THE EMPLOYERS OF TWO GARMENT FACTORIES, TWO SHOPS AND A GOLD ORNAMENT WORKSHOP WERE FOUND TO HAVE FAILED TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISION UNDER THE EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION ORDINANCE.

THEY WERE EACH FINED BETWEEN \$4,000 AND \$4,500.

IN ANOTHER CASE, A DECORATION CONTRACTOR WHO FAILED TO INSURE FOR HIS WORKER WHO WAS INJURED IN AN INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENT LAST YEAR WAS FINED \$5,000 EARLIER THIS MONTH.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT UNDER THE EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION ORDINANCE, ALL EMPLOYERS ARE REQUIRED TO TAKE OUT INSURANCE POLICIES TO COVER THEIR FULL LIABILITIES TO COMPENSATE THEIR EMPLOYEES FOR INJURIES OR DEATH SUSTAINED AT WORK.

"ANY EMPLOYER WHO CONTRAVENES THE REGULATION IS LIABLE TO A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$50,000 AND IMPRISONMENT FOR TWO YEARS," HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN NOTED THAT THERE WAS A SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE IN PROSECUTIONS MADE BY THE DEPARTMENT IN THE PAST TWO YEARS FOR CONTRAVENTION OF THE VARIOUS PROVISIONS OF THE ORDINANCE.

LAST YEAR, 175 PROSECUTIONS WERE TAKEN OUT UNDER THE ORDINANCE COMPARED WITH 127 IN THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

OF THE 175 PROSECUTIONS MADE LAST YEAR, 136 RELATED TO FAILURE TO TAKE OUT INSURANCE POLICIES AND THE REST CONCERNED FAILURE TO DISPLAY, IN A CONSPICUOUS PLACE ON THE PREMISES WHERE ANY EMPLOYEE IS EMPLOYED, A NOTICE SHOWING THE PARTICULARS OF THE INSURANCE POLICIES AND TO PRODUCE THE POLICIES FOR INSPECTIONS BY LABOUR INSPECTORS.

THE FINES IN THESE TWO CATEGORIES AMOUNTED TO \$189,650 AND \$37,950 RESPECTIVELY.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO REMINDED EMPLOYERS THAT THEY MUST BEAR THE FULL COST OF THE POLICIES AND ARE NOT ALLOWED TO DEDUCT IT FROM THEIR EMPLOYEES' EARNINGS.

THE FINDINGS OF A SURVEY ON PUBLIC BUS AND GREEN MINIBUS SERVICES IN EASTERN DISTRICT WILL BE DISCUSSED AT THE MEETING OF THE EASTERN DISTRICT BOARD'S TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT COMMITTEE ON TUESDAY (MARCH 7).

THE SURVEY, CONDUCTED UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF THE COMMITTEE'S WORKING GROUP ON TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT SURVEY, WAS ASSISTED BY MORE THAN 100 VOLUNTARY SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS IN THE DISTRICT.
