SLIGHT DROP IN MANUFACTURING EMPLOYMENT

A TOTAL OF 773,746 PEOPLE WERE EMPLOYED IN MANUFACTURING ESTABLISHMENTS IN HONG KONG AS AT DECEMBER 1976, ACCORDING TO THE LATEST EMPLOYMENT SURVEY CONDUCTED BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT IN THE LAST QUARTER OF 1976.

THIS REPRESENTED A SLIGHT DROP OF 5,042 PERSONS OR 0.6 PER CENT COMPARED WITH THE FIGURE OF 778,788 FOR SEPTEMBER 1976.

WHEN COMPARED WITH A TOTAL OF 678,857 PERSONS ENGAGED IN DECEMBER 1975, MANUFACTURING EMPLOYMENT IN DECEMBER 1976 WAS HIGHER BY 94,889 PERSONS OR 14 PER CENT.

IN TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT, THE FIVE LARGEST INDUSTRY GROUPS REMAINED WEARING APPAREL, TEXTILES, ELECTRICAL MACHINERY, APPLIANCES AND SUPPLIES, PLASTIC PRODUCTS AND FABRICATED METAL PRODUCTS.

PRINCESS ALEXANDRA TO OPEN SAI KUNG OUTDOOR RECREATION CENTRE  
\* \* \* \* \*

HRH PRINCESS ALEXANDRA WILL OFFICIALLY OPEN THE SAI KUNG OUTDOOR RECREATION CENTRE ON FEBRUARY 7 - THE SIXTH DAY OF HER VISIT TO HONG KONG.

BUILT ON THE SITE OF A FORMER ARMY CAMP, THE CENTRE, COVERING AN AREA OF MORE THAN 25 ACRES, IS THE FIRST OUTDOOR HOLIDAY RESORT OF ITS KIND MADE AVAILABLE BY THE GOVERNMENT TO OFFER RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES TO BOTH THE ABLE-BODIED AND THE HANDICAPPED ON A LARGE SCALE. IT IS OPERATED BY THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

AFTER UNVEILING A PLAQUE TO COMMEMORATE HER VISIT TO THE CENTRE, THE PRINCESS WILL SEE YOUNGSTERS TAKING PART IN VARIOUS ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING CYCLING, TRADITIONAL CHINESE DANCING, ARCHERY AND ROPE WORK.

HER ROYAL HIGHNESS WILL ALSO START AN ORIENTEERING RACE AND VISIT ONE OF THE COMFORTABLE AND BRIGHTLY-COLOURED DORMITORIES WHICH HAVE BEEN CONVERTED FROM NISSEN HUTS.

THE SAI KUNG OUTDOOR RECREATION CENTRE IS THE PROTOTYPE OF SIX OTHER RECREATION CENTRES THE GOVERNMENT PLANS TO BUILD SOON.

AT PRESENT, THE CENTRE IS CAPABLE OF ACCOMMODATING ABOUT 200 CAMPERS. IT WILL BE EXPANDED LATER TO CATER FOR 400.

CAMPERS ONLY HAVE TO PAY \$5 EACH FOR LODGING AND \$4 FOR A MEAL AND FOR DAY CAMPERS, A NOMINAL FEE OF \$1 EACH IS CHARGED.

IN ADDITION TO LARGE ROOMS FOR BOWLING, BILLIARDS AND SOCIAL GATHERING, THE CENTRE OFFERS A WIDE RANGE OF FACILITIES FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION. THESE INCLUDE A SWIMMING POOL, A ROLLER SKATING RINK, A BASKETBALL COURT AND A GAMES AREA FOR SMALL CHILDREN.

FREE COACHING SERVICE FOR VARIOUS SPORTS IS PROVIDED BY THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE.

A FEATURE OF THE CENTRE IS THAT ALL THE ACTIVITIES ARE DESIGNED BOTH FOR THE ABLE-BODIED AND THE HANDICAPPED.

A FIELD STUDY CENTRE WILL BE BUILT NEAR THE AREA SET ASIDE FOR ECOLOGICAL STUDY.

OPENING OF PROBATION AND CORRECTIONS SERVICE EXHIBITION  
\* \* \* \* \*

REPORTS MADE BY PROBATION OFFICERS ARE OF 'INESTIMABLE VALUE' TO THE SENTENCING COURT WHEN DEALING WITH YOUNG OFFENDERS.

THIS WAS STATED BY THE CHIEF JUSTICE, SIR GEOFFREY BRIGGS, AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE EXHIBITION ON PROBATION AND CORRECTIONS SERVICE HELD AT THE OCEAN TERMINAL THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING.

SIR GEOFFREY SAID: +THE MERE RETRIBUTIVE ASPECT OF THE PUNISHMENT OF OFFENDERS IS NOWADAYS BUT LITTLE REGARDED. THE COURT ALWAYS HOPES THAT AN OFFENDER, PARTICULARLY A YOUNG OFFENDER, WILL MEND HIS WAYS OR LEARN A LESSON BY REASON OF THE PUNISHMENT AWARDED TO HIM OR THE SENTENCE IMPOSED UPON HIM.

+IN THIS AREA, THE PROBATION OFFICER MAKES A MOST REAL AND VALUABLE CONTRIBUTION.+

+IN HIS REPORT, THE REPORTING OFFICER INVARIABLY PAINTS A BALANCED AND FAIR PICTURE OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE OFFENDER AND HE NEVER ATTEMPTS TO USURP THE FUNCTIONS OF THE JUDGE,+ HE ADDED.

POINTING OUT THAT THE WORK OF THE PROBATION OFFICERS DOES NOT STOP AFTER HE HAS MADE HIS REPORT TO THE COURT, THE CHIEF JUSTICE SAID: +IF A PROBATION ORDER IS MADE THE PROBATION OFFICER HAS THE DUTY OF SUPERVISING THE LIFE OF THE PERSON IN RESPECT OF WHOM THE ORDER IS MADE.

+THE PROBATION OFFICER, IN EFFECT, ACTS IN LOCO PARENTIS TO THAT PERSON= HE IS A SORT OF TEACHER CUM PARENT. HE TRIES TO ENSURE THAT ANY UNDESIRABLE ACQUAINTANCES ARE DROPPED= ANY PREVIOUS BAD HABITS ARE GIVEN UP.+

+HE ATTEMPTS, AND OFTEN WITH GREAT SUCCESS, TO GAIN THE RESPECT AND CONFIDENCE OF THAT PERSON AND SO FAR AS HE IS ABLE, TO POINT THE WAY TO A MORE BALANCED AND RESPECTABLE WAY OF LIFE,+ HE CONTINUED.

SIR GEOFFREY SAID THAT PROBATION OFFICERS HAD TO BE FIRM AS WELL AS TACTFUL AS MANY OF THEM WERE REQUIRED TO DEAL WITH ARROGANT YOUNGSTERS WHO MAY BE ADDICTED TO DRUGS, THUGGERY OR GAMBLING.

THE CHIEF JUSTICE PRAISED THE CORRECTIONS INSTITUTES, MANAGED BY THE PROBATION AND CORRECTIONS DIVISION OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

HE SAID THAT THEY WERE EXPERTLY RUN AND THAT THE GREATEST POSSIBLE INDIVIDUAL CARE WAS TAKEN OF EACH INMATE.

SPEAKING AT THE SAME CEREMONY, THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR. THOMAS LEE, SAID THAT THE AIM OF THE PROBATION AND CORRECTIONS SERVICE WAS TO HELP PROBATIONERS TO REFORM THEMSELVES AND THE METHODS USED WERE BASED ON SOCIAL WORK PRINCIPLES.

+SOCIAL WORKERS FIRMLY BELIEVE THAT BEHAVIOUR CAN BE CHANGED AND THAT DEFIANT BEHAVIOUR CAN BE MODIFIED IN A MILIEU CONDUCTIVE TO REHABILITATION THROUGH TRAINING AND COUNSELLING,+ HE SAID.

+WITH HELP AND UPON ACQUIRING NECESSARY SOCIAL SKILLS, PROBATIONERS CAN REGAIN THEIR SELF-RESPECT, SO WILL THEY LEARN TO LIVE HARMONIOUSLY WITH OTHERS AND BECOME LAW-ABIDING CITIZENS.+

MR. LEE POINTED OUT THAT MANY PEOPLE MIGHT THINK PROBATION MEANS SETTING OFFENDERS FREE. +THIS IS NOT TRUE. IN FACT, THE COURT RETAINS THE POWER OF RECALLING PROBATIONERS BACK TO COURT,+ HE STRESSED.

+IF A PROBATIONER MISBEHAVES OR FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE ADVICE OF THE PROBATION OFFICER DURING THE PERIOD, HE IS LIABLE TO BE SENTENCED FOR BREACH OF A PROBATION ORDER OR TO BE DEALT WITH FOR THE ORIGINAL OFFENCE.+

MR. LEE NOTED THAT THE EFFORTS OF THE PROBATION OFFICERS ALONE WERE NOT ENOUGH. +THE SUCCESS OF THIS TYPE OF WORK DEPENDS ON THE SUPPORT AND UNDERSTANDING OF THE PUBLIC, THUS ENSURING THAT PROBATIONERS THAT ARE DETERMINED TO TURN OVER A NEW LEAF ARE NOT DESPISED OR REJECTED BY THE COMMUNITY.+

+WITHOUT SUCH ASSISTANCE AND SUPPORT OF THE PUBLIC, PROBATIONERS CAN HARDLY REGAIN SELF-RESPECT AND HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE POSITIVE CONTRIBUTIONS TO SOCIETY,+ HE ADDED.

CONSULTATIONS ON TEXTILES AGREEMENTS BETWEEN CANADA AND HK

THE TEXTILES SURVEILLANCE BODY HAS CONCLUDED ITS DELIBERATIONS ON THE REFERENCE MADE TO IT BY HONG KONG CONCERNING THE SUPERSESSION BY CANADA IN NOVEMBER 1976 OF BILATERAL TEXTILES AGREEMENTS BETWEEN CANADA AND HONG KONG.

THE TSB NOTED THAT THE AGREEMENTS CONTAINED PROVISIONS FOR CONSULTATIONS, SHOULD DIFFICULTIES ARISE IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THOSE AGREEMENTS. IT THEREFORE RECOMMENDED THAT +THE TWO PARTIES SHOULD HOLD CONSULTATIONS WITH A VIEW TO REVOLVING ANY PROBLEMS THAT MAY HAVE ARISEN OR MIGHT ARISE, AND TO REPORT ON THOSE CONSULTATIONS TO THE TSB WITHIN THIRTY DAYS.+

LADY MACLEHOSE TO VISIT SCHOOL AND CHILDREN'S RECEPTION CENTRE

LADY MACLEHOSE WILL VISIT THE TSZ WAN SHAN RED CROSS SCHOOL AND THE CHUK YUEN CHILDREN'S RECEPTION CENTRE IN KOWLOON ON MONDAY (JANUARY 31) MORNING.

THE SCHOOL AIMS TO PROVIDE A SECURE ENVIRONMENT IN WHICH HANDICAPPED CHILDREN CAN LEARN AND EXPLORE, ADJUST AND INTEGRATE

MANAGED BY THE HONG KONG RED CROSS, THE SCHOOL HAS, AT PRESENT, A CAPACITY OF 90 PUPILS.

CLASSES ARE CONDUCTED IN GROUPS OF 10 TO 20 CHILDREN, RANGING FROM SEPCIAL CLASSES, JUNIOR 1 TO 6. THE SPECIAL CLASSES ARE SET UP TO MEET THE NEED OF MULTIPLE-HANDICAPPED CHILDREN.

LADY MACLEHOSE WILL BE MET ON HER ARRIVAL BY MR. T.C. CHENG, CHAIRMAN OF THE SCHOOLS MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE OF THE HONG KONG RED CROSS= MRS. GENNIE LEE, SUPERVISOR OF THE SCHOOL AND MRS. LAM MA FUNG-YAN, PRINCIPAL.

AFTER SPENDING ABOUT HALF AN HOUR TOURING THE SCHOOL, LADY MACLEHOSE WILL PROCEED TO THE CHUK YUEN CHILDREN'S RECEPTION CENTRE. THERE SHE WILL BE RECEIVED BY MR. JIMMY SWEETMAN, DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, AND TAKEN ON A TOUR OF THE PREMISES BY MRS. LU CHENG YUK-YIP, SUPERINTENDENT OF THE CENTRE.

OPERATED BY THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, THE CENTRE PROVIDES TEMPORARY CARE FOR A CAPACITY OF 80 CHILDREN UNDER EIGHT YEARS OLD.

THE CHILDREN INCLUDE THOSE WHO ARE ABANDONED, FOUND WANDERING ON THE STREET, ILLEGITIMATE BABIES, AND CHILDREN IN NEED OF CARE AND PROTECTION.

NEW HONORARY AIR COMMODORE FOR RHKAAF

\* \* \* \* \*

WHEN THE ROYAL HONG KONG AUXILIARY AIR FORCE CARRIES OUT ITS 1,000TH CASUALTY AIRLIFT A FEW WEEKS FROM NOW, THE EVENT WILL HAVE A SPECIAL SIGNIFICANCE FOR WING COMMANDER GORDON BELL WHO WAS LAST WEEK APPOINTED AS THE NEW HONORARY AIR COMMODORE.

FOR IT WAS IN 1958 WHEN MR. BELL WAS -- IN RECOGNITION OF HIS SERVICES -- AWARDED AN AIR EFFICIENCY AWARD THAT TWO HELICOPTERS WERE ADDED TO A FLEET OF AIRCRAFT TO IMPROVE THE AUXILIARY AIR FORCE'S CAPABILITY IN AIRLIFTING SICK AND INJURED FROM ISOLATED AREAS TO HOSPITAL.

MR. BELL'S ASSOCIATION WITH THE RHKAAF STARTED IN 1951 AFTER BEING TRANSFERRED FROM THE HONG KONG ROYAL NAVAL VOLUNTARY RESERVE.

ELEVEN YEARS LATER HE WAS APPOINTED COMMANDING OFFICER OF THE RHKAAF WITH THE RANK OF WING COMMANDER.

HE RECEIVED THE FIRST CLASP TO THE AIR EFFICIENCY AWARD IN 1965. IT WAS ALSO IN THAT YEAR THE AUXILIARY AIR FORCE REPLACED ITS TWO AGING WIDGEON HELICOPTERS BY TWO ALOUETTES.

CURRENTLY, THREE ALOUETTES PROVIDE TWO INVALUABLE SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY: THE 24-HOUR AIR-AMBULANCE SERVICE AND THE WEEKLY +FLYING DOCTOR+ SERVICE.

PO KONG VILLAGE INTERCHANGE

\* \* \* \* \*

THE NEW INTERCHANGE, KNOWN AS PO KONG VILLAGE INTERCHANGE, LOCATED AT THE JUNCTION OF PO KONG VILLAGE ROAD AND LUNG CHEUNG ROAD WILL COME INTO OPERATION ON 10 A.M. ON TUESDAY (FEBRUARY 1).

ANNOUNCING THIS TODAY, THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SAID THAT 24-HOUR URBAN CLEARWAY RESTRICTIONS WOULD BE IMPOSED ON ALL THE CARRIAGEWAYS AT THIS INTERCHANGE AND ALSO ON THE SECTION OF PO KONG VILLAGE ROAD BETWEEN FUNG TAK ROAD AND CHOI HUNG ROAD.

ALL VEHICLES EXCEPT FRANCHISED BUSES WILL BE PROHIBITED FROM STOPPING IN THE RESTRICTED ZONE TO PICK UP OR SET DOWN PASSENGERS OR TO LOAD AND UNLOAD GOODS.
