GOVERNOR VISITS RHKAAF CAMP

THE GOVERNOR, SIR EDWARD YOUDE, TODAY VISITED THE ROYAL HONG KONG AUXILIARY AIR FORCE AT THEIR ANNUAL CAMP IN SEK KONG.

SIR EDWARD WAS FLOWN BY AN RHKAAF DAUPHIN HELICOPTER TO THE SEK KONG AIRSTRIP, WHERE THE UNIT IS AT ANNUAL CAMP AND CARRYING OUT INTENSIVE FLYING.

HE WAS MET ON ARRIVAL BY WING COMMANDER A.P. ASPREY, COMMANDING OFFICER; SQUADRON LEADER J.G. SHAWCROSS, CHIEF STAFF OFFICER AND SQUADRON LEADER P.D. YIP, O.C. FLYING.

SIR EDWARD PRESENTED AIR EFFICIENCY DECORATIONS TO SIX MEMBERS WHO BETWEEN THEM HAD PUT IN MORE THAN 80 YEARS OF VOLUNTEER SERVICE. HE ALSO MET MEMBERS OF THE FLYING, ENGINEERING AND ADMINISTRATION SQUADRONS.

SIR EDWARD THEN HAD LUNCH ON THE AIRSTRIP WITH A NUMBER OF EMPLOYERS OF VOLUNTEERS WHO HAD RELEASED THEIR STAFF MEMBERS FOR DUTY WITH THE UNIT DURING THE YEAR TO ENABLE THE RHKAAF TO RESPONSE WITH ALL ITS SEVEN AIRCRAFTS FOR SEARCH AND RESCUE OPERATIONS.

SERVICES TO HELP REHABILITATE HANDICAPPED

THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR JOHN CHAMBERS, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY) THAT THE MAIN OBJECTIVE OF THE GOVERNMENT'S REHABILITATION SERVICES WAS TO HELP HANDICAPPED PEOPLE DEVELOP THEIR CAPABILITIES TO THE FULLEST EXTENT AND TO INTEGRATE THEM INTO THE COMMUNITY.

HE WAS SPEAKING AT THE JOINT CHRISTMAS PARTY OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT'S ABERDEEN REHABILITATION CENTRE AND KAI CHI CHILDREN'S CENTRE.

HE SAID, +CHRISTMAS INDEED IS A SEASON OF JOY, A TIME WHEN PEOPLE SHOULD THINK MORE OF OTHERS THAN OF THEMSELVES, AND MORE OF GIVING THAN OF RECEIVING.+

IN THE PAST YEARS, HE SAID, THE TWO CENTRES HAD HELPED MANY DISABLED PEOPLE GAIN THEIR CONFIDENCE AND DEVELOP THEIR SKILLS.

+THE TRAINING PROGRAMMES, THE SHELTERED WORKSHOP, THE WORK ACTIVITY GROUPS AND THE RECREATIONAL, COUNSELLING AND RESIDENTIAL SERVICES, ALL WORK TO THIS END,+ HE SAID.

THE CHRISTMAS PARTY INCLUDED AN ENTERTAINMENT PROGRAMME AND A DINNER RECEPTION FOR THE 270 TRAINEES AT THE CENTRES.

MR CHAMBERS THANKED ROUND TABLE NO. 3 (VICTORIA) FOR THEIR FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO THE DINNER AS WELL AS THEIR ENTHUSIASTIC PARTICIPATION, WHICH HE SAID, +DEMONSTRATES THEIR GENUINE CONCERN FOR THE LESS FORTUNATE MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY.+

KEEPING HK CLEAN IS AN ON-GOING EFFORT

KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN AND GREEN IS AN ON-GOING COMMITMENT BY BOTH THE PUBLIC AND THE GOVERNMENT, SAID AN UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE NEW TERRITORIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE OF THE CLEAN HONG KONG CAMPAIGN, MR WAI HON-LEUNG, TODAY (SATURDAY).

MR WAI MADE THIS REMARK AFTER SEEING SOME OF THE CLEANSING SERVICES IN SHA TIN AND THE PLANTING PROJECTS AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS IN THE NEW TOWN DURING A TWO-HOUR TOUR.

ACCOMPANYING MR WAI ON THE TOUR WERE THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (OPERATIONS) OF THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES, MR DAVID WEEKS, AND THE URBAN SERVICES OFFICER OF SHA TIN, MR NG YING-NEEN.

THE PARTY FIRST VISITED SIU LEK YUEN TO SEE A CONCRETE VILLAGE FOOTPATH BUILT IN OCTOBER 1981 TO FACILITATE REFUSE COLLECTION.

MR WAI WAS BRIEFED ON THE IMPORTANCE OF THE 1200-METRE FOOTPATH IN KEEPING SIU LEK YUEN AND SIX ADJACENT VILLAGES CLEAN.

AT NGAU PEI SHA, MR WAI WAS IMPRESSED WITH ITS REFUSE COLLECTION AND OTHER RELATED FACILITIES.

LATER HE VISITED PEI TAU VILLAGE AND SAW THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT'S CLEAN-UP OPERATIONS.

MR WAI URGED VILLAGERS TO MAKE FULL USE OF A TEMPORARY REFUSE AND JUNK COLLECTION FACILITY SET UP THERE RECENTLY.

THE PARTY THEN TOURED FOUR NEWLY-BUILT ROADSIDE AMENITY PLOTS WHERE MORE THAN 60 000 PLANTS HAD BEEN GROWN.

PES HANDLING WIDE RANGE OF ENQUIRIES

MATTERS CONCERNING THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT TOPPED THE LIST OF ENQUIRIES MADE AT THE 59 PUBLIC ENQUIRY SERVICE (PES) CENTRE OF THE CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION DURING THE LAST FINANCIAL YEAR.

THIS WAS FOLLOWED BY HOUSING, RATING AND VALUATION, GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT AND IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENTS.

A CNTA SPOKESMAN SAID THE PES CENTRES HANDLED 449 105 ENQUIRIES ABOUT EDUCATION, 23 PER CENT OF WHICH CONCERNED OVERSEAS STUDIES AND 25 PER CENT ON PRIMARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION.

AMONG THE 339 209 ENQUIRIES ON THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT, MORE THAN 45 PER CENT WERE ABOUT APPLICATION FOR PUBLIC HOUSING AND 24 PER CENT ON THE HOME OWNERSHIP SCHEME.

FOR THE RATING AND VALUATION DEPARTMENT, 18 PER CENT OF THE 289 280 ENQUIRIES CONCERNED RENT INCREASES AND 17 PER CENT ON EVICTION AND RECOVERY OF PREMISES.

OF THE 271 479 ENQUIRIES ON GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT, 68 PER CENT RELATED TO JOBS AND VACANCIES, 5.5 PER CENT ON VERIFICATION OF MARITAL STATUS AND FAMILY RELATIONSHIP, AND 26.5 PER CENT ON MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

THERE WERE 270 067 ENQUIRIES ABOUT IMMIGRATION MATTERS, WITH 12.6 PER CENT ON EMIGRATION AND OVERSEAS VISITS, AND 9.7 PER CENT ON MARRIAGE CERTIFICATES.

THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT THE NUMBER OF PES CENTRES HAD NOW BEEN INCREASED TO 63 THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY, PROVIDING A WIDE RANGE OF FREE SERVICES, SUCH AS DISTRIBUTION OF GOVERNMENT AND SOME NON-GOVERNMENT FORMS, GENERAL PUBLIC ENQUIRIES, ADMINISTERING OF STATUTORY DECLARATIONS AND FREE LEGAL ADVICE.

IN ADDITION, CONSUMER COUNCIL'S ENQUIRY COUNTERS AND RENT OFFICERS ARE ALSO ATTACHED TO SEVERAL OF THE PES CENTRES.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT FOR HANDICAPPED URGED  
\* \* \*

A SENIOR OFFICER OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT TODAY (SATURDAY) CALLED FOR COMMUNITY SUPPORT FOR THE HANDICAPPED TO HELP THEM GAIN COMPLETE REHABILITATION.

THE APPEAL CAME FROM THE REGIONAL OFFICER (EAST KOWLOON), MR KWOK KA-CHI, WHEN HE OPENED A SEMINAR ON +INTEGRATION OF THE HANDICAPPED+ AT THE KWUN TONG COMMUNITY CENTRE.

MR KWOK SAID SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE DISABLED BY BOTH THE GOVERNMENT AND VOLUNTARY AGENCIES WOULD NOT BE ENOUGH.

+TO HELP THEM TOWARDS COMPLETE REHABILITATION, WE NEED THE SUPPORT OF THE COMMUNITY TO TREAT THEM EQUALLY AND TO GIVE THEM A CHANCE TO PARTICIPATE IN COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES,+ HE SAID.

HE SAID IT WAS ENCOURAGING TO NOTE THAT QUITE A NUMBER OF EMPLOYERS IN THE MANUFACTURING SECTOR HAD BEEN HELP  
NG THE DISABLED  
BY GIVING THEM JOBS OR BY PLACING ORDERS WITH SHELTERED WORKSHOPS.  
MR KWOK EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT MORE EMPLOYERS WOULD FOLLOW SUIT.

A COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC EDUCATION IN REHABILITATION HAD BEEN SET UP BY THE GOVERNMENT AFTER THE 1981 INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF DISABLED PERSONS, HE SAID, ADDING THAT THE SEMINAR TODAY WAS TO PROMOTE THIS WORK.

THE SEMINAR FORMS PART OF THE TERRITORY-WIDE PUBLICITY PROGRAMME CO-ORDINATED BY THE COMMITTEE.

FIVE SPEAKERS, FROM THE FIELDS OF SOCIAL WORK, PSYCHIATRY AND PSYCHOLOGY, INCLUDING A MEMBER OF THE REHABILITATION DEVELOPMENT CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE, GAVE TALKS ON THE DISABLED PEOPLE.

THE PANEL DISCUSSION, CHAIRED BY DR NELSON CHOW, A SENIOR LECTURER IN SOCIAL WORK, THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG, WAS FOLLOWED BY AN OPEN FORUM.

NEW MARKET AND RECREATIONAL COMPLEX FOR EASTERN WONG TAI SIN  
\* \* \* \* \*

A NEW MARKET TO BE BUILT OVER CHOI HUNG MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY STATION WILL INCLUDE FACILITIES FOR SPORT, RECREATION AND CULTURE.

THE ARCHITECTURAL OFFICE OF THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IS SEEKING TENDERS FOR THE COMPLEX WHICH WILL BE BUILT ON A 4 000-SQUARE-METRE SITE AT CLEAR WATER BAY ROAD, NGAU CHI WAN.

ALTHOUGH THERE ARE SIMILAR COMPLEXES IN HONG KONG, THIS WILL BE THE FIRST TO HAVE AN AUDITORIUM.

THERE WILL BE A 397-STALL MARKET RETAILING MEAT, FISH, POULTRY, VEGETABLES, FRUIT AND DRY GOODS.

IT WILL ACCOMMODATE ELIGIBLE HAWKERS FROM THE VICINITY WHO HAVE BEEN SURVEYED BY THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

THERE WILL ALSO BE A REFUSE COLLECTION CHAMBER, AN ICE STORE, OFFICES AND PUBLIC TOILETS.

BESIDES THE TWO-STOREY MARKET PODIUM, THERE WILL BE AN AUDITORIUM BLOCK, A MAIN BUILDING AND, ON TOP OF THE PODIUM, AN INDOOR GAMES HALL.

A COOKED FOOD CENTRE WITH 17 STALLS WILL BE HOUSED IN THE MAIN BUILDING AND WILL BE LINKED TO THE MARKET BY ESCALATORS.

UPPER FLOORS OF THE MAIN BUILDING WILL BE OCCUPIED BY A LIBRARY, OFFICES AND SPACE FOR CULTURAL ACTIVITIES.

THERE WILL BE A LECTURE HALL, FOUR MUSIC PRACTICE ROOMS, A PAINTING STUDIO AND AN EXHIBITION HALL.

ADJACENT TO THE MAIN BUILDING WILL BE THE AUDITORIUM WHICH WILL BE SIMILAR IN DESIGN TO THE CITY HALL. IT WILL HAVE 430 SEATS.

THE INDOOR GAMES HALL WILL OCCUPY AN AREA OF MORE THAN 720 SQUARE METRES.

IT WILL HAVE A STANDARD VOLLEYBALL OR BASKETBALL COURT AND FOUR BADMINTON COURTS.

THERE WILL ALSO BE FACILITIES FOR GYMNASTIC ACTIVITIES.

RAMPS WILL BE CONSTRUCTED SO THAT THE DISABLED WILL BE ABLE TO ENTER THE MARKET.

A FOOTBRIDGE WILL ALSO BE BUILT TO CONNECT PING SHEK ESTATE AND THE MARKET AT THE FIRST FLOOR LEVEL.

WORK ON THE PROJECT WILL START NEXT FEBRUARY AND BE COMPLETED IN MID-1986.

THE MARKET COMPLEX WILL SERVE FOUR ESTATES IN EASTERN WONG TAI SIN WHICH HAVE A COMBINED POPULATION OF ABOUT 80 000.

YOUTH GROUPS PRAISED FOR ANTI-NARCOTICS WORK

MEMBERS OF THE YOUTH VOLUNTEER GROUP OF THE ACTION COMMITTEE AGAINST NARCOTICS (ACAN) WERE PRAISED FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTION TOWARDS ANTI-NARCOTICS WORK.

THE TRIBUTE WAS PAID BY THE PRINCIPAL INFORMATION OFFICER OF THE NARCOTICS DIVISION, MR HANDRICK NG WHILE SPEAKING AT THE ANTI-NARCOTICS CREATIVE ACTIVITIES 1983 PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY-CUM-VARIETY SHOW HELD AT THE WO CHE COMMUNITY HALL IN SHA TIN THIS (SATURDAY) EVENING.

+THROUGH DIRECT PARTICIPATION IN ACAN'S COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT WORK AND THEIR SELF-INITIATED PROJECTS OVER THE PAST YEARS, THE YOUTH VOLUNTEERS HAVE CONTRIBUTED SIGNIFICANTLY TOWARDS A WORTHY SOCIAL CAUSE,+ MR NG SAID.

THEY HELPED SPREAD THE ANTI-NARCOTICS MESSAGE TO THE YOUNG PEOPLE WHO ARE MOST AT RISK OF BEING LURED INTO TAKING DRUGS OR TRAFFICKING IN DRUGS, HE ADDED.

THE ANTI-NARCOTICS CREATIVE ACTIVITIES 1983, SPONSORED MAINLY BY THE LIONESSE CLUB OF MT. PHOENIX, HONG KONG, WAS ORGANISED BY THE ACAN YOUTH VOLUNTEER GROUP AS ITS MAJOR PROJECT FOR THE YEAR.

THE PURPOSE OF THE PROJECT WAS TO SPREAD THE ANTI-NARCOTICS MESSAGES THROUGH PROMOTION OF HEALTHY ACTIVITIES AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE.

THE TWO-MONTH LONG PROJECT WAS LAUNCHED IN OCTOBER WITH A SERIES OF COMPETITIONS, INCLUDING BOOKMARK AND SLOGAN DESIGN, DRAMA SCRIPT WRITING, LYRIC WRITING AND ON-THE-SPOT DRAWING. THE THEME OF THE COMPETITIONS WAS 'STRIVE FOR A BRIGHT FUTURE, DONT'T TAKE DRUGS'.

THE COMPETITIONS WERE OPEN TO YOUTHS RESIDING IN SHA TIN, TAI PO, FANLING AND SHEUNG SHUI DISTRICTS. ABOUT 500 ENTRIES WERE RECEIVED.

+IT IS HOPED THAT THROUGH PARTICIPATION IN THESE COMPETITIONS, YOUNG PEOPLE CAN LEARN MORE ABOUT THE HARMFUL EFFECTS OF ILLICIT DRUGS AND WILL STEER AWAY FROM THEM,+ MR NG SAID.

THE VARIETY SHOW, WHICH ATTRACTED MORE THAN 400 YOUTHS, FEATURED LION DANCES, A PIANO SOLO, FOLK DANCING AND SINGING.

WINNERS OF THE DRAMA SCRIPT AND LYRIC WRITING COMPETITIONS ALSO STAGED PERFORMANCES AT THE SHOW.

HORTICULTURE CLASS FOR TUEN MUN RESIDENTS

A FREE HORTICULTURE CLASS COVERING A BROAD RANGE OF PLANTING TECHNIQUES WILL BE HELD IN TUEN MUN, STARTING FROM THE END OF THIS MONTH.

THIS IS THE SECOND HORTICULTURE CLASS IN THE NEW TOWN ORGANISED BY THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT THIS YEAR.

LOCAL RESIDENTS AGE 16 OR ABOVE ARE WELCOME TO APPLY, A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

AMONG OTHER TOPICS, THE FIVE-SESSION COURSE WILL COVER BASIC KNOWLEDGE OF SOIL, SEED SOWING, CUTTING AND FERTILISING, PROPAGATION METHODS AND GENERAL PLANT MAINTENANCE.

EXPERTS OF THE HONG KONG ORCHID CLUB WILL BE INVITED TO GIVE TALKS DURING THE COURSE WHICH WILL BE CONDUCTED BETWEEN 10 AM AND 12 NOON ON FIVE CONSECUTIVE SATURDAYS, STARTING ON DECEMBER 31.

FIELD VISITS AND PRACTICAL WORK WILL ALSO BE ARRANGED.

THE CLASS WILL BE HELD AT THE TUEN MUN URBAN SERVICES OFFICE ON THE FIRST FLOOR OF 'TOP COURT', 60-70 TAK CHING COURT, WITH PRACTICAL WORK TO BE CONDUCTED AT THE HUNG CHEUNG ROAD SITTING OUT AREA.

FOR THE COMING TWO WEEKS, THE SHA TIN ARTS ASSOCIATION HAS WORKED OUT A FULL PROGRAMME OF 23 PERFORMANCES OF SINGING, DANCING AND DRAMA FOR THE RESIDENTS.

THE PERFORMING GROUPS WILL INCLUDE THE POP ORCHESTRA, HONG KONG CHINESE ORCHESTRA, HONG KONG REPERTORY THEATRE, HONG KONG ACADEMY OF BALLET AND THE PAN-ASIA SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA.

THE ARTS FORTNIGHT WILL COST \$500 000, WITH THE DISTRICT BOARD CONTRIBUTING \$300 000.

IT IS JOINTLY PRESENTED BY THE SHA TIN ARTS ASSOCIATION, THE CULTURAL SERVICE DEPARTMENT, THE RECREATION AND CULTURE DEPARTMENT, THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, AND VOLUNTARY AGENCIES IN THE DISTRICT.
