ROLE OF DISTRICT ORGANISATIONS AFFIRMED

* * * * *

DISTRICT ORGANISATIONS HAVE AN IMPORTANT ROLE TO PLAY IN THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION STRUCTURE AND GOOD COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THEM WILL FURTHER PROMOTE THE WELL-BEING OF RESIDENTS, THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR T.H. CHAU, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

OPENING A SEMINAR AIMED AT ENHANCING COMMUNICATIONS AND WORKING RELATIONS AMONG LOCAL BODIES IN KWUN TONG, MR CHAU SAID IT WAS HIS PERSONAL EXPERIENCE IN ATTENDING DISTRICT BOARD MEETINGS THAT SUCH BODIES PLAYED AN EFFECTIVE ROLE IN REFLECTING LOCAL OPINION, IMPROVING DISTRICT ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS AND PROMOTING LOCAL ACTIVITIES.

+AT THE SAME TIME, DISTRICT BOARDS HAVE ALWAYS DISCUSSED AND REFLECTED VIEWS FROM AREA COMMITTEES, MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES AND OWNERS' CORPORATIONS,+ HE ADDED.

+FROM THIS, WE CAN SEE LOCAL ORGANISATIONS HAVE A DEFINITE ROLE IN REFLECTING GRASSROOTS OPINIONS AND HANDLING LOCAL PROBLEMS,+ MR CHAU SAID.

SPEAKING TO THE PARTICIPANTS AT THE END OF THE SEMINAR, THE DEPUTY REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR KEVIN MAK, SAID MORE THAN 70 PER CENT OF HONG KONG'S POPULATION LIVED IN BUILDINGS SERVED BY OWNERS' CORPORATIONS OR MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES.

HE SAID A WORKING PARTY IN THE CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION HAD RECENTLY COMPLETED A REVIEW OF THE ROLE PLAYED BY DISTRICT ORGANISATIONS.

MR MAK SAID THE REVIEW HAD CONCLUDED THAT THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR ACTIVITIES ORGANISED BY AREA COMMITTEES AND THE PRACTICE THAT THEY COULD RECEIVE SPONSORSHIP FROM DISTRICT BOARDS SHOULD CONTINUE.

HE ALSO SAID THE WORKING PARTY HAD RECOMMENDED WAYS TO IMPROVE TRAINING AND SALARY OF PART-TIME COMMUNITY ORGANISERS.

ABOUT 300 REPRESENTATIVES FROM DISTRICT ORGANISATIONS INCLUDING AREA COMMITTEES, OWNERS' CORPORATIONS AND MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES TOOK PART IN THE SEMINAR WHICH WAS ORGANISED BY THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT BOARD.

A SIMILAR SEMINAR WAS ORGANISED LAST YEAR BY THE DISTRICT BOARD TO EXAMINE THE RELATION BETWEEN THE DISTRICT BOARD AND AREA COMMITTEES.

**NEW TITLE FOR CISAP

THE LABOUR ADVISORY BOARD'S COMMITTEE ON INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AND ACCIDENT PREVENTION (CISAP) WILL OPERATE UNDER A NEW NAME BEGINNING NEXT MONTH.

THE NEW TITLE, INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AND HEALTH COMMITTEE, REFLECTS MORE ACCURATELY THE COMMITTEE'S SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES AND AIMS TO PAVE THE WAY FOR ITS EVENTUAL DEVELOPMENT INTO A STATUTORY OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH COUNCIL.

FOLLOWING THE CHANGE, THE COMMITTEE WILL HAVE A REDUCED NUMBER OF MEMBERS TO FACILITATE EFFECTIVE OPERATION. HOWEVER, IT WILL HAVE THE POWER TO CO-OPT OTHER MEMBERS WHERE NECESSARY.

THE NEW COMMITTEE WILL CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

- * THE DEPUTY COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR (CHAIRMAN)
- * THREE EMPLOYEES' REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE LAB
- * THREE EMPLOYERS' REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE LAB
- * CHAIRMAN OF THE SIX INDUSTRY-BASED SAFETY SUB-COMMITTEES FORMED UNDER THE PRESENT CISAP
- * THREE MEMBERS FROM ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS AND PROFESSIONAL BODIES WITH EXPERTISE IN THE FIELD OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AND HEALTH, TO BE APPOINTED BY THE COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR
- * AN ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR
- * THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH CONSULTANT OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT
- * THE CHIEF FACTORY INSPECTOR OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT

THE CHANGES WERE ENDORSED BY THE LABOUR ADVISORY BOARD AT ITS LAST MEETING EARLY THIS MONTH.

**COMPULSORY INSPECTION OF PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES

ALL PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES WHICH REQUIRE A NEW VEHICLE LICENCE COMMENCING ON OR AFTER APRIL 1, 1987 WILL HAVE TO BE EXAMINED BY THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT PRIOR TO LICENCE RENEWAL WITH EFFECT FROM JANUARY 2 NEXT YEAR.

AT PRESENT, ONLY PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES MANUFACTURED BEFORE 1983 ARE REQUIRED TO PASS A TEST BEFORE RELICENSING.

+THE REQUIREMENT FOR ALL PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES TO BE EXAMINED IS NOT NEW AND HAS ALWAYS BEEN THE GOVERNMENT'S OBJECTIVE,+ THE ACTING SENIOR ENGINEER (MOTOR VEHICLES) OF THE DEPARTMENT, MR JOHN BLAY, SAID.

+THE MEASURE WAS SHELVED IN JULY, 1984 BECAUSE OF LIMITED STAFF RESOURCES AND OTHER PRIORITIES IN VEHICLE EXAMINATION THEN,+ HE EXPLAINED.

+GRADUAL IMPROVEMENT IN THE STAFF SITUATION AT THE KOWLOON BAY VEHICLE EXAMINATION CENTRE HAS ALLOWED US TO INCLUDE PRE-1983 PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES IN THE ANNUAL INSPECTION SCHEME SINCE JANUARY THIS YEAR AND NOW THE AVAILABILITY OF RESOURCES FURTHER PERMIT US TO EXTEND THE SCHEME TO ALL PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES IRRESPECTIVE OF AGE,+ HE WENT ON.

NOTING THAT SOME 1 600 OUT OF THE 2 200 PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES IN HONG KONG WERE BEING USED TO CARRY SCHOOL CHILDREN, MR BLAY SAID IT WAS CERTAINLY A PRIORITY TASK TO ENSURE THE ROADWORTHINESS OF THIS TYPE OF VEHICLE.

OWNERS OF PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES MAY ARRANGE INSPECTION APPOINTMENTS AT THE KOWLOON BAY VEHICLE EXAMINATION CENTRE AT CHEUNG YIP STREET, KOWLOON, AND DIAL 3-7597573 FOR ENQUIRIES. THE INSPECTION FEE IS \$200.

A CERTIFICATE OF ROADWORTHINESS WILL BE ISSUED TO PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES WHICH HAVE PASSED THE INSPECTION. THE CERTIFICATE, WHICH WILL ONLY BE VALID FOR FOUR MONTHS FROM THE DATE OF ISSUE, SHOULD BE PRODUCED FOR LICENCE RENEWAL APPLICATIONS.

FLYOVER TO BE BUILT AT YUEN LONG

THE YUEN LONG NORTHERN BYPASS IS TO BE FURTHER EXTENDED WITH CONSTRUCTION OF A 170-METRE-LONG FLYOVER AT ITS EASTERN JUNCTION WITH CASTLE PEAK ROAD.

IT WILL CARRY THROUGH TRAFFIC ON THE BYPASS TO AU TAU TO IMPROVE TRAFFIC FLOW AT THIS HIGH CAPACITY SIGNAL CONTROLLED JUNCTION.

WORK WILL INVOLVE CONSTRUCTION OF A TWO-WAY REINFORCED CONCRETE FLYOVER, ABOUT 15.35 METRES WIDE, WITH CENTRAL DIVIDER AND ASSOCIATED RAMPS AND ROAD WORKS.

ALSO INCLUDED IN THE PROJECT IS CONSTRUCTION OF A TERMINUS AT FOOK HONG STREET TO ACCOMMODATE PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES FROM THE EXISTING ON-STREET TERMINI. THIS WILL HELP IMPROVE THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC WITHIN YUEN LONG NEW TOWN.

TENDERS ARE BEING INVITED FOR THE PROJECT, CONSTRUCTION OF WHICH WILL START IN FEBRUARY AND TAKE 18 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

SITE FORMATION FOR DIAMOND HILL DEVELOPMENT
* * * * *

ABOUT THREE MILLION CUBIC METRES OF SOIL AND ROCK ARE TO BE REMOVED TO FACILITATE DEVELOPMENTS AT DIAMOND HILL IN KOWLOON.

THE CIVIL ENGINEERING SERVICES DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR SITE FORMATION, INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO QUARRY STONE, AT PO KONG VILLAGE ROAD.

WITH A TOTAL AREA OF 19 HECTARES, THE SITE WILL BE USED FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF DIAMOND HILL PARK AND OTHER GOVERNMENT AND INSTITUTIONAL USES.

APART FROM CREATING DESIRABLE DEVELOPMENT LAND IN THE AREA, THE WORKS WILL ALSO GENERATE GOVERNMENT REVENUE.

MUCH NEEDED AGGREGATE WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY.

THE WORK IS EXPECTED TO START NEXT MONTH AND BE COMPLETED IN DECEMBER 1991.

STRICT ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION CONTROL MEASURES ARE INCLUDED IN THE CONTRACT TO LIMIT DUST AND NOISE NUISANCE.

THE MEASURES WILL ALSO ENSURE THAT THE WORK DOES NOT INTERFERE WITH PUBLIC TRANQUILLITY.

AMS STAGES GRAND PARADE

MORE THAN 2 400 MEMBERS OF THE AUXILIARY MEDICAL SERVICES (AMS) TURNED OUT IN SMART NEW UNIFORMS FOR A GRAND PARADE AT VICTORIA PARK THIS (SUNDAY) MORNING.

MORE THAN 400 MEMBERS FROM 18 DISTRICTS TOOK PART IN THE PARADE WHILE 2 000 OTHER MEMBERS ATTENDED AS SPECTATORS.

THE 18 TEAMS WERE INSPECTED BY THE COMMISSIONER, DR K.L. THONG, WHO ALSO PRESENTED A SHIELD IN HIS NAME TO THE BEST TEAM IN THE PARADE.

IN A SPEECH, DR THONG PAID TRIBUTE TO THE SMART TURNOUT OF THOSE TAKING PART.

HE BELIEVED THAT THE PARADE WOULD HELP TO PROMOTE BETTER TEAM SPIRIT AMONG MEMBERS AND THUS IMPROVE EFFICIENCY IN SERVING THE COMMUNITY.

DR THONG ALSO SAID THAT IN VIEW OF THE INCREASING COMMITMENTS OF THE SERVICE, STEPS WERE BEING TAKEN TO ENABLE IT TO PLAY A MORE IMPORTANT ROLE SO AS TO MEET CHANGING NEEDS.

DURING THE EVENT, FOUR AMS MEMBERS WHO HAD EACH GIVEN 27 YEARS OF EFFICIENT SERVICE WERE AWARDED CIVIL DEFENCE LONG SERVICE CLASPS.

ANOTHER 17 MEMBERS WHO HAD EACH SERVED FOR 15 YEARS RECEIVED CIVIL DEFENCE LONG SERVICE MEDALS.

BEFORE THE PARADE, MEMBERS REPRESENTING 18 DISTRICTS TOOK PART IN THE FINALS OF AN INTER-REGIONAL COMPETITION. EVENTS INCLUDED FIRST AID, SQUAD DRILL AND HOME NURSING.

TROPHIES WERE PRESENTED TO WINNING TEAMS.

AIDED SECONDARY SCHOOLS WHICH HAVE NOT INTRODUCED COMPUTER STUDIES IN THEIR SENIOR SECONDARY FORMS WILL HAVE THE CHANCE TO DO SO NEXT YEAR.

THESE SCHOOLS ARE BEING INVITED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT TO JOIN A COMPUTER STUDIES SCHEME. THIS IS DESIGNED TO GIVE STUDENTS A BASIC UNDERSTANDING OF THE FUNCTIONS OF THE MICROCOMPUTER AND ITS APPLICATIONS.

UNDER THE SCHEME, EACH PARTICIPATING SCHOOL WILL RECEIVE FREE EQUIPMENT INCLUDING 11 MICROCOMPUTERS WITH VISUAL DISPLAY UNITS, 12 DISC DRIVES AND TWO PRINTERS WITH INTERFACES.

IN ADDITION, A GOVERNMENT SUBSIDY OF UP TO \$25 000 WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO EACH SCHOOL FOR FURNISHING AND CONVERTING A ROOM INTO A COMPUTER CLASSROOM.

COMPUTER STUDIES WERE INTRODUCED IN 30 PUBLIC SECTOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN 1982 AND WERE INCLUDED AS AN EXAMINATION SUBJECT BY THE HONG KONG EXAMINATIONS AUTHORITY IN 1984. THE SCHEME HAS BEEN EXTENDED TO 265 SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN THE PUBLIC SECTOR.

SCHOOLS INTERESTED IN JOINING THE COMPUTER STUDIES SCHEME SHOULD CONFIRM THEIR INTENTION TO THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT BY JANUARY 16.
