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HONG KONG A POTENTIAL MARKET FOR US FABRICS  
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THE SECRETARY FOR TRADE AND INDUSTRY, MR E.P. HO TODAY (TUESDAY) INVITED AMERICAN TEXTILES MANUFACTURERS TO TAKE A GREATER SHARE OF HONG KONG'S GROWING MARKET FOR FABRICS AND FURNISHINGS.

HE WAS OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE SECOND US HOME FURNISHINGS EXHIBITION, ORGANISED BY THE AMERICAN TEXTILE MANUFACTURERS INSTITUTE, AT THE HILTON HOTEL.

WELCOMING BACK LEADING MEMBERS OF THE INSTITUTE WHO VISITED HONG KONG IN FEBRUARY LAST YEAR TO ASSESS HOW BEST TO PROMOTE SALES OF US TEXTILE PRODUCTS IN HONG KONG, MR HO SAID: +ALTHOUGH THE WORLD ECONOMIC RECESSION, FROM WHICH HONG KONG HAS ENJOYED NO IMMUNITY, COMBINED WITH THE EFFECTS OF A STRONG US DOLLAR, HAS SINCE PROVIDED A DIFFICULT CLIMATE FOR US EXPORTS TO HONG KONG, THE GROUNDWORK HAS BEEN LAID AND SHOULD YIELD POSITIVE RESULTS IN THE BETTER TIMES WHICH WE BELIEVE SHOULD LIE AHEAD.

+AS HONG KONG IS ONE OF THE WORLD'S LARGEST IMPORTERS OF YARNS AND FABRICS - TAKING US\$2.6 BILLION WORTH IN 1982 - I FEEL SURE THAT ATMI MEMBERS WILL WISH TO PERSEVERE IN THEIR EFFORTS HERE.+

MR HO ASSURED THE MISSION MEMBERS, WHOSE EXHIBITION CONCENTRATED ON HOME FURNISHINGS AND FLOOR COVERINGS, THAT HONG KONG PROVIDED A SIZEABLE MARKET FOR THESE PRODUCTS, WITH 1982 IMPORTS VALUED AT OVER US\$219 MILLION.

+THE US MARKET SHARE IS SMALL BUT GROWING. TO ILLUSTRATE THE POTENTIAL FOR GROWTH, I WOULD MENTION THAT BETWEEN NOW AND THE END OF 1985 EIGHT NEW HOTELS ARE EXPECTED TO OPEN IN HONG KONG, PROVIDING 2 360 ADDITIONAL ROOMS.+

MR HO STRESSED THAT ALTHOUGH HONG KONG HAD AN IMPORTANT HOME FURNISHINGS INDUSTRY, THE GOVERNMENT AFFORDED IT NO PROTECTION OR SPECIAL ADVANTAGE WITHIN THE HONG KONG MARKET. +ALL OUR TRADING PARTNERS HAVE UNRESTRICTED ACCESS TO OUR MARKET AS WELL AS EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN IT,+ HE ADDED.

TURNING TO HONG KONG'S TEXTILE TRADE HE NOTED THAT IT DID NOT ENJOY THE SAME UNRESTRICTED ACCESS TO ITS MAIN EXPORT MARKETS OVERSEAS.

+OF COURSE, WE ARE REALISTIC ENOUGH TO RECOGNISE THAT THE TYPE OF RESTRAINTS WE HAVE LIVED WITH FOR MANY YEARS ON OUR OWN EXPORTS OF TEXTILES AND GARMENTS ARE NOT LIKELY TO BE REMOVED OVERNIGHT.

+WHAT IS OF CONCERN, HOWEVER, IS THAT THE CURRENT GENERATION OF BILATERAL RESTRAINT AGREEMENTS, NEGOTIATED IN THE DEPTHS OF ECONOMIC RECESSION, HAVE GREATLY REDUCED THE POTENTIAL FOR DEVELOPMENT OF THOSE HONG KONG INDUSTRIES WHICH ACCOUNT FOR ONE THIRD OF OUR DOMESTIC EXPORTS AND EMPLOY 40 PER CENT OF OUR INDUSTRIAL WORK FORCE.

/+NATURALLY, WE .....

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+NATURALLY, WE HOPE THAT 1983 WILL BRING THE PROSPECT OF AN IMPROVED ECONOMIC CLIMATE. WE ALSO HOPE THAT THIS WILL ENABLE BOTH THE US TEXTILE MANUFACTURERS AS WELL AS THE HONG KONG GARMENT MANUFACTURERS TO INCREASE THEIR PRODUCTION AND EXPORT PERFORMANCE.

+FOR OUR PART, WE REMAIN CONVINCED THAT THE SUREST FOUNDATION FOR PROSPERITY LIES IN THE EXPANSION OF WORLD TRADE AND NOT IN ITS CONTRACTION,+ MR HO STRESSED.

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### TSB CHAIRMAN MEETS TEXTAB MEMBERS

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AMBASSADOR MARCELO RAFFAELLI, CHAIRMAN OF THE GENEVA-BASED TEXTILES SURVEILLANCE BODY WHICH SUPERVISES THE OPERATION OF THE MULTI-FIBRE ARRANGEMENT (MFA), TODAY (TUESDAY) MET MEMBERS OF THE HONG KONG TEXTILES ADVISORY BOARD (TEXTAB).

AT THE MEETING, CHAIRED BY MR E.P. HO, THE SECRETARY FOR TRADE AND INDUSTRY, MR RAFFAELLI WAS BRIEFED ON THE STATE OF HONG KONG'S TEXTILES AND GARMENT INDUSTRY. SUBJECTS DISCUSSED INCLUDED THE WORKINGS OF THE MFA AND HONG KONG'S VARIOUS BILATERAL TEXTILES ARRANGEMENTS.

MR RAFFAELLI, WHO ARRIVED LAST WEEKEND (MARCH 5) FOR A WEEK-LONG VISIT TO HONG KONG, HAD EARLIER HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH MR E.P. HO AND THEN WITH THE DIRECTOR OF TRADE, MR HAMISH MACLEOD, AND SENIOR STAFF OF THE TRADE DEPARTMENT. HE ALSO VISITED SHA TIN NEW TOWN AND THE TAI PO INDUSTRIAL ESTATE YESTERDAY.

HE WILL MEET THE DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE TRADE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL, MR GEORGE BLANEY TOMORROW FOLLOWED BY A LUNCH MEETING WITH THE ACTING GOVERNOR, SIR PHILIP HADDON-CAVE, AT GOVERNMENT HOUSE. IN THE AFTERNOON HE WILL VISIT SAN'S CLOTHING FACTORY LTD. AND LUKS ELECTRONICS CO. LTD. AT TO KWA WAN, KOWLOON.

ON THURSDAY, HE WILL CALL ON THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, MR JOHN BREMRIDGE. BEFORE DEPARTING ON FRIDAY, MR RAFFAELLI WILL MEET MEMBERS OF THE PRESS.

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COMPANIES (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983 FOR LEGCO  
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THE COMPANIES (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, COMPLETING THE PROGRAMME OF LEGISLATION COMMENCED IN 1974 TO IMPLEMENT THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMPANIES LAW REVISION COMMITTEE (SECOND REPORT), WILL BE INTRODUCED IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY).

DEBATE ON THE BILL WILL RESUME ON A DATE TO BE NOTIFIED.

ANOTHER BILL, THE INLAND REVENUE (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL 1983, WHICH AIMS TO EXCLUDE FROM THE CHARGE TO PROFIT TAX UNDER PART FOUR OF THE PRINCIPAL ORDINANCE THE PROFITS ON THE DISPOSAL OF SECURITIES BY TRUSTEES UNDER AN AUTHORISED UNIT TRUST, WILL ALSO BE INTRODUCED.

DEBATE ON THIS BILL IS EXPECTED TO RESUME ON APRIL 13 OR 14.

FOUR OTHER BILLS ARE DUE TO GO THROUGH SECOND AND FINAL READINGS, AND A NUMBER OF UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL WILL BE SPEAKING ON THEM.

THE BILLS ARE:

- \* INLAND REVENUE (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, BASING PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT ON ACTUAL RENTS RECEIVED, INSTEAD OF ON VALUATION;
- \* PROTECTION OF INVESTORS (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, PROVIDING SELECTIVE CONTROLS OVER PAPER GOLD TRADING SCHEMES, MAINLY AT RETAIL LEVEL;
- \* MATRIMONIAL CAUSES (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, WHICH CLARIFIES THE DUTIES AND EXTENDS THE POWERS OF COURTS IN RELATION TO MAKING OF ORDERS FOR THE WELFARE OF CHILDREN OF A FAMILY INVOLVED IN MATRIMONIAL PROCEEDINGS; AND
- \* REGISTRATION OF PERSONS (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, PROVIDING A STATUTORY FRAMEWORK FOR MORE SECURE IDENTITY CARDS TO BE ISSUED.

AN UNOFFICIAL MEMBER'S BILL TO AMEND THE COUNCIL OF ST PAUL'S CO-EDUCATIONAL COLLEGE INCORPORATION ORDINANCE AND TO VALIDATE THE ACQUISITION BY THE CORPORATION OF CERTAIN PROPERTY, WILL BE MOVED THROUGH THE FIRST AND SECOND READINGS BY THE HON MARIA TAM. RESUMPTION OF THE READING IS EXPECTED TO TAKE PLACE ON APRIL 13 OR 14.

TWELVE QUESTIONS WILL BE ASKED BY UNOFFICIALS ON A WIDE RANGE OF MATTERS.

SENIOR UNOFFICIAL MEMBER, THE HON ROGER LOBO, WILL ASK ABOUT ACTION BEING TAKEN BY THE GOVERNMENT TO DISCOURAGE VIETNAMESE REFUGEES FROM TRYING TO GET TO HONG KONG BY BOAT DURING THE COMING MONTHS.

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OTHER QUESTIONS BY UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS WILL DEAL WITH SUCH MATTERS AS THE POSSIBILITY OF AN INSURANCE FUND TO PROTECT DEPOSITORS, THE WORK ON STABILISING DANGEROUS SLOPES, BICYCLISTS AND ROAD SAFETY, DENTAL TREATMENT FOR CHILDREN, AND THE TIME TAKEN FOR ASSESSMENT OF LAND PROPERTY VALUES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

QUESTIONS WILL ALSO BE ASKED ABOUT ACCIDENTS CAUSED BY WING MIRRORS OF GOODS VEHICLES, FIRE SAFETY IN RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS, THE CONSULTANTS STUDY ON THE KAI TAK INSTRUMENT LANDING SYSTEM, AND DEATHS FROM CARBON MONOXIDE POISONING.

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#### INVESTIGATION INTO EDA INVESTMENTS LTD

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THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, MR JOHN BREMRIDGE, ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT THE SECURITIES COMMISSION HAD APPOINTED INSPECTORS TO INVESTIGATE THE AFFAIRS OF EDA INVESTMENTS LTD. AND ITS SUBSIDIARIES AND ASSOCIATED COMPANIES.

THE INSPECTORS ARE MR ROBERT CHING TANG, BARRISTER-AT-LAW, AND MR MICHAEL J. JOHNSON, FELLOW OF THE HONG KONG SOCIETY OF ACCOUNTANTS AND OF THE INSTITUTE OF CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS OF ENGLAND AND WALES. THE INVESTIGATION WILL TAKE SOME MONTHS TO COMPLETE AND THE SECURITIES COMMISSION MAY PUBLISH THE REPORT OF THE INSPECTORS IN WHOLE OR IN PART.

MR BREMRIDGE WELCOMED THE APPOINTMENT, WHICH HE SAID WAS CONSISTENT WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE REGULATORY STEPS IN THE FINANCIAL SECTORS FORESHADOWED IN HIS BUDGET SPEECH.

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#### VEHICLE INSPECTION PROGRAMME EXTENDED

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THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT'S COMPULSORY VEHICLE INSPECTION PROGRAMME IS BEING EXTENDED TO INCLUDE ALL GOODS VEHICLES MANUFACTURED IN 1972 AND 1973, AND ALL PRIVATE CARS MANUFACTURED IN 1971.

ANNOUNCING THIS TODAY (TUESDAY), A SPOKESMAN SAID VEHICLES IN THE ABOVE CATEGORIES WILL BE REQUIRED TO UNDERGO EXAMINATION ONLY IF THEIR NEW LICENCES COMMENCE ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 1983.

THE YEAR OF MANUFACTURE OF A VEHICLE IS STATED IN THE VEHICLE REGISTRATION DOCUMENT.

AS TO GOODS VEHICLES MANUFACTURED PRIOR TO 1972 WHICH HAD UNDERGONE INSPECTIONS PREVIOUSLY, THE SPOKESMAN SAID THEY WOULD BE EXEMPTED FROM EXAMINATION FROM JULY 1, 1983 UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

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THE KOWLOON BAY VEHICLE EXAMINATION CENTRE AT 2 CHEUNG YIP STREET IS NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR EXAMINATION APPOINTMENTS FROM APPROPRIATE VEHICLE OWNERS, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

APPOINTMENT FORMS ARE AVAILABLE FROM ALL LICENSING OFFICES AND VEHICLE EXAMINATION CENTRES OF THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT. ENQUIRIES MAY BE MADE ON 3-7597505.

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#### HONG KONG STAMPS FOR COMMONWEALTH FUND

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THE HONG KONG POST OFFICE WILL DONATE 23 000 SETS OF FOUR COMMEMORATIVE STAMPS ON MARCH 14 IN SUPPORT OF THE COMMONWEALTH FUND FOR TECHNICAL COOPERATION, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE POST OFFICE SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).

THE FOUR STAMPS, IN DENOMINATIONS OF 30 CENTS, \$1, \$1.30 AND \$5 WILL BE ISSUED THAT DAY TO MARK THIS YEAR'S COMMONWEALTH DAY.

BOTH THE STAMP ISSUE AND THE DONATION ARE IN RESPONSE TO A DECISION MADE BY THE COMMONWEALTH HEADS OF GOVERNMENT IN MELBOURNE IN 1981, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE COMMONWEALTH, WHICH COMPRISES 47 MEMBER COUNTRIES AND 11 ASSOCIATED STATES AND DEPENDENT TERRITORIES, HAS A QUARTER OF THE WORLD'S POPULATION.

ONE OF THE LONG-STANDING AIMS OF THE COMMONWEALTH IS TO PROMOTE DEVELOPMENT AMONG ITS MEMBER COUNTRIES WHO VOLUNTARILY SUBSCRIBE TO THE COMMONWEALTH FUND FOR TECHNICAL COOPERATION, HE POINTED OUT.

MEANWHILE, FIRST-DAY COVERS FOR THE STAMP ISSUE ARE NOW ON SALE AT ALL POST OFFICES AT 50 CENTS EACH, AND ADVANCE ORDERS FOR SERVICING THE COVERS ARE BEING ACCEPTED UNTIL 5 PM TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY).

SPECIAL COUNTERS WILL BE SET UP AT A NUMBER OF POST OFFICES FOR NORMAL POSTAL BUSINESS ON THE DAY OF THE NEW ISSUE, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

ON HONG KONG ISLAND, THEY ARE THE GENERAL POST OFFICE AND THE BEACONSFIELD HOUSE, CAUSEWAY BAY, HENNESSY ROAD, MORRISON HILL, NORTH POINT, QUEEN'S ROAD AND SHEUNG WAN POST OFFICES.

IN KOWLOON AND THE NEW TERRITORIES, THEY ARE THE KOWLOON CENTRAL, CHEUNG SHA WAN, GILLIES AVENUE, KOWLOON CITY, KWUN TONG, MONG KOK, SHAM SHUI PO, TSIM SHA TSUI AND TSUEN WAN POST OFFICES.

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BUILDING PLANS APPROVED IN JANUARY  
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THIRTY-SIX NEW BUILDING PLANS WERE APPROVED BY THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE OF THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IN JANUARY THIS YEAR, COMPARED WITH 84 IN THE SAME MONTH LAST YEAR.

OF THESE NEW PLANS, 15 WERE FOR NEW BUILDINGS ON HONG KONG ISLAND, FIVE FOR KOWLOON AND 16 FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THEY INCLUDE THREE SCHOOLS IN SASSOON ROAD, GUILDFORD ROAD AND SHA TIN AND A FOOTBRIDGE AT THE JUNCTION OF WATERLOO ROAD, JUNCTION ROAD AND KAM SHING ROAD.

THE DECLARED COST OF THE NEW BUILDINGS COMPLETED DURING THE MONTH WAS \$501.2 MILLION COMPARED WITH \$499.2 MILLION IN JANUARY LAST YEAR.

THE USABLE FLOOR AREA TOTALLED 150 713.9 SQUARE METRES, COMPRISING 113 293.8 SQUARE METRES OF NON-DOMESTIC AND 37 420.1 SQUARE METRES OF DOMESTIC FLOOR AREA.

IN THE SAME MONTH, THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE ALSO GAVE CONSENT FOR WORK TO COMMENCE 40 PROJECTS, INCLUDING FIVE RADIO TELEPHONE STATIONS AT MOUNT DAVIS, MOUNT PARKER, BEACON HILL, FEI NGO SHAN AND TUEN MUN, THREE SCHOOLS AT CLOUDVIEW ROAD, PRICE ROAD AND CLEARWATER BAY ROAD AND A SWIMMING POOL AND A PLANT ROOM IN SHEUNG SHUI.

ALTOGETHER, 51 OCCUPATION PERMITS WERE ISSUED FOR NEWLY-COMPLETED BUILDINGS IN JANUARY, INCLUDING A HOSPITAL EXTENSION IN NAM LONG SHAN ROAD, A WELFARE/HEALTH CENTRE IN JUNCTION ROAD, A HOME FOR THE AGED AT WAN TAU STREET IN TAI PO, AND A HOLIDAY CENTRE AT CASTLE PEAK ROAD IN PING SHAN.

THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE ALSO GAVE PERMISSION FOR 24 BUILDINGS TO BE DEMOLISHED.

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AWARDS FOR CAS CADETS  
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A TOTAL OF 103 CIVIL AID SERVICES CADETS WILL RECEIVE THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARDS AT A PARADE TO BE HELD AT THE CAS KOWLOON TRAINING CENTRE ON FRIDAY (MARCH 11).

ON PARADE WILL BE FOUR SQUADS FORMED BY THESE CADETS. THIRTY-ONE OF THEM WILL RECEIVE THE SILVER AWARDS AND 72 THE BRONZE AWARDS.

TAKING THE SALUTE AT THE PARADE WILL BE MR STEPHEN YOW MOK-SHING, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PUBLICITY AND PROMOTIONS SUB-COMMITTEE OF THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARDS SCHEME, WHO WILL ALSO PRESENT THE SILVER AWARDS.

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THE BRONZE AWARDS WILL BE PRESENTED BY MR PHILLIP WONG, CHAIRMAN OF THE SCOUT ASSOCIATION OPERATING AUTHORITY, MR NELSON LEE CHUEN-YAN, PANEL CONVENER OF THE SCHEME'S PHYSICAL RECREATION SECTION, AND MRS MARIA LEUNG, EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARDS SCHEME OFFICE.

THE BAND OF THE CIVIL AID SERVICES WILL BE IN ATTENDANCE DURING THE PARADE.

A DISPLAY OF EQUIPMENT AND PHOTOGRAPHS AS WELL AS DEMONSTRATIONS OF VARIOUS ACTIVITIES OF THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARDS SCHEME WILL ALSO BE HELD IN THE CLASSROOMS OF THE TRAINING CENTRE.

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BOOKLET ON STATISTICAL DEVELOPMENT ON SALE  
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AN ANNUAL BOOKLET ENTITLED "AN OUTLINE OF STATISTICAL DEVELOPMENT, 1983+" IS NOW ON SALE.

THE BOOKLET, PUBLISHED BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT, CONTAINS TWO PARTS.

PART I DESCRIBES THE ORGANISATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT WHILE PART II DELINEATES THE MAIN LINES OF CURRENT STATISTICAL ACTIVITY AS WELL AS FORESEEN DEVELOPMENTS IN THE NEAR FUTURE. MATERIAL DESCRIPTIVE OF THE PAST AND THROUGH THE CONTINUING PRESENT IS ALSO INCLUDED.

THE DISPOSITION OF STATISTICAL STAFF AND A LIST OF STATISTICAL PUBLICATIONS ARE GIVEN IN THE ANNEXES.
