MAKING TAX SYSTEM MORE PRODUCTIVE  
\* \* \* \*

THE COROLLARY OF KEEPING THE TAX RATES AS LOW AS POSSIBLE IS THAT THE TAX SYSTEM SHOULD BE AS PRODUCTIVE AS POSSIBLE AT THOSE RATES, THE COMMISSIONER OF INLAND REVENUE, MR. R.V. GIDDY, SAID TODAY (MONDAY).

IN A SPEECH TO THE ROTARY CLUB (VICTORIA), MR. GIDDY, WHO IS DUE TO RETIRE SHORTLY AFTER 17 YEARS IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, SAID HE CONSIDERED THAT THE PRINCIPAL AIM OF THE TAX SYSTEM SHOULD BE TO PRODUCE REVENUE TO MEET THE GOVERNMENT'S COMMITMENTS.

HIGH TAXATION TENDED TO +FEED ON ITSELF+, MR. GIDDY SAID.

+ONCE TAXES ARE INCREASED, EXPENDITURE IN A FISCAL VERSION OF PARKINSON'S LAW TENDS TO INCREASE TO MEET THEM. CLAIMS FOR CONCESSIONS AND RELIEF MULTIPLY- TAX AVOIDANCE AND EVASION BECOME FLOURISHING INDUSTRIES,+ MR. GIDDY SAID.

+AS A RESULT, TAX RATES HAVE TO BE FURTHER INCREASED TO COMPENSATE FOR THESE LOSSES AND IN THE END ONE FINISHES UP WITH A TAX BURDEN WHICH STRANGLES ALL INITIATIVE AND DESTROYS INCENTIVE AND ALTHOUGH IT MAY LEAVE THE RICH POORER AND EVEN THAT IS ARGUABLE, IT LEAVES THE POOR POORER,+ HE ADDED.

MR. GIDDY OFFERED A FEW SUGGESTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION IN MAKING THE PRESENT TAX SYSTEM OF HONG KONG MORE PRODUCTIVE.

FIRSTLY, HE SAID NON-CORPORATE OWNERS OF PROPERTY WERE ONLY PAYING TAX ON ESTIMATED RENTAL VALUES AT APRIL 1, 1976, NOT ON THE NET RENT RECEIVED BY THEM.

+THE LONG-TERM ANSWER SEEMS TO BE TO BASE ASSESSMENTS ON ACTUAL RENT RECEIVED. THIS WOULD BRING LANDLORDS INTO LINE WITH RECIPIENTS OF OTHER FORMS OF HONG KONG INCOME, INCLUDING CORPORATIONS WHO RECEIVE RENT,+ HE SAID.

+SECONDLY, THERE IS STILL SOMETHING DISTINCTLY UNSATISFACTORY ABOUT THE FACT THAT HUNDREDS OF MILLIONS OF DOLLARS OF INTEREST PAYMENTS ARE BEING CHARGED AGAINST HONG KONG PROFITS FOR PROFITS TAX PURPOSES BUT BECAUSE OF THE WAY IN WHICH THE LOANS WERE RAISED NO HONG KONG TAX IS PAID BY THE RECIPIENTS OF THE INTEREST,+ MR. GIDDY SAID.

+THERE IS A SUBSTANTIAL SUM OF REVENUE TO BE OBTAINED FROM THIS SOURCE,+ HE ADDED.

THE THIRD SUGGESTION, ACCORDING TO MR. GIDDY, WOULD BE TO OBTAIN A POTENTIAL ADDITIONAL YIELD FROM THE SHIPPING INDUSTRY WITHOUT COMPLETELY RESTRUCTURING THE INLAND REVENUE ORDINANCE, BY REMOVING THE SO-CALLED +CORPORATE VEIL+.

FOURTHLY, MR. GIDDY SAID HE WAS STILL AN ADVOCATE OF A COMPULSORY RETURN AND ASSESSMENT OF TOTAL INCOME DERIVED FROM HONG KONG.

HE SAID THE EXISTING SYSTEM OF VOLUNTARY ELECTION TO PERSONAL ASSESSMENT COUPLED WITH PROPERTY TAX WAS AN +ADMINISTRATIVE ABOMINATION+ AND THIS COULD BE CONVENIENTLY COUPLED WITH THE RENTAL BASIS FOR INCOME FROM PROPERTY MENTIONED IN THE FIRST SUGGESTION.

+THE DIRECT YIELD FROM THIS MEASURE IS NOT LIKELY TO BE MUCH BUT IT WOULD HAVE THE ADDITIONAL ADVANTAGE OF ASSISTING THE DEPARTMENT IN THE DETECTION OF TAX EVASION,+ MR. GIDDY SAID.

LOOKING BACK OVER THE 17 YEARS IN THE DEPARTMENT, MR. GIDDY SAID THE TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL REVENUE INCREASED FROM \$312 MILLION TO AN ESTIMATED \$6 735 MILLION THIS YEAR, WITH THE CORRESPONDING INCREASES IN STAFF FROM 352 TO 2 520.

+WHICHEVER WAY ONE LOOKS AT THIS, AND, EVEN ALLOWING FOR INFLATION, THIS REPRESENTS A REMARKABLE DEGREE OF GROWTH AND MANY OF THE ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE SOCIAL WELFARE, EDUCATION AND HOUSING FIELDS WOULD SIMPLY NOT HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE WITHOUT IT,+ MR. GIDDY SAID.

AS REGARDS THE FUTURE, MR. GIDDY SAID SOME OF THE DEPARTMENT'S OFFICES HAD MOVED TO NEW PREMISES WHILE THE REST WOULD BE MOVING LATER TO FURTHER IMPROVED SERVICES TO THE PUBLIC.

ON THE NEVER-ENDING BATTLE AGAINST TAX EVASION, MR. GIDDY POINTED OUT THAT OVER THE LAST THREE YEARS THE SIZE OF THE INVESTIGATION SECTION HAD MORE THAN DOUBLED AND YIELDS HAD GONE UP FROM \$12 MILLION TO \$40 MILLION.

HOWEVER, THERE WAS A LIMIT AT WHICH A SPECIALIST SECTION COULD BE SET UP, HE SAID.

+TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE IS VITAL IN THIS FIELD AND DILETTANTISM WOULD NOT BE TOLERATED BY THE PUBLIC- THERE COULD BE NOTHING WORSE FOR LONG-TERM PROGRESS THAN THE SECTION OVER-REACHING ITSELF AND FALLING FLAT ON ITS FACE,+ MR. GIDDY SAID.

+THE OTHER FACTOR WHICH IS OFTEN OVERLOOKED IS THAT DETECTION, AND WHAT IS MORE IMPORTANT, THE QUANTIFICATION OF EVASION IS A LABORIOUS, TIME-CONSUMING AND EXPENSIVE BUSINESS.+

FURTHER ISSUE OF 300 TAXI LICENCES

\* \* \* \* \*

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT WILL BE INVITING TENDERS FOR A FURTHER BATCH OF 300 HONG KONG AND KOWLOON TAXI LICENCES ON FRIDAY (SEPTEMBER 14).

THIS FOLLOWS THE RECENT MONTHLY MEETING OF THE TRANSPORT ADVISORY COMMITTEE AT WHICH IT WAS DECIDED FOR THE TIME BEING THAT THERE SHOULD BE NO CHANGE IN THE CURRENT ARRANGEMENTS FOR ISSUING REGULAR BATCHES OF TAXI LICENCES.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SAID THAT THE DECISION WAS REACHED AFTER THE COMMITTEE COMPLETED ITS REVIEW OF THE TAXI TRADE.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT TENDER FORMS WOULD BE AVAILABLE FOR COLLECTION FROM FRIDAY FROM EITHER THE HONG KONG LICENSING OFFICE, NO. 2 MURRAY ROAD, OR FROM THE KOWLOON LICENSING OFFICE, PARK-IN COMMERCIAL CENTRE, DUNDAS STREET.

HE SAID THAT THE TENDER FORMS FOR THIS EXERCISE WILL BE LIGHT GREEN IN COLOUR AND ADVISED INTENDING TENDERERS NOT TO USE ANY OTHER TYPE OF FORMS ISSUED PREVIOUSLY OTHERWISE THEIR TENDERS WILL BE DECLARED VOID.

THE TENDER WILL BE IN THE FORM OF A PREMIUM IN RESPECT OF ONE OR MORE HONG KONG AND KOWLOON TAXIS.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT A TENDERER MAY SUBMIT ONE TENDER FORM FOR ONE OR MORE LICENCES BUT NOT EXCEEDING 300. THE TENDERER MAY ALSO SUBMIT MORE THAN ONE TENDER FORM, BUT IF A SINGLE TENDER FORM IS SUBMITTED FOR MORE THAN ONE LICENCE THEN THE PREMIUM OFFERED FOR EACH LICENCE MUST BE THE SAME.

HE ADDED: +IF THE NUMBER OF AVAILABLE LICENCES IS LESS THAN THE NUMBER REQUIRED BY A TENDERER THEN A SMALLER NUMBER OF LICENCES MAY BE ALLOCATED TO HIM AS APPROPRIATE.+

A PUBLIC BALLOT MAY BE HELD TO DETERMINE THE ACCEPTANCE OF THOSE TENDERS IF THE UNIT PREMIA WHICH THEY OFFERED ARE IDENTICAL.

COMPLETED TENDER FORMS TOGETHER WITH THE ORIGINAL DEPOSIT RECEIPTS MUST BE SUBMITTED IN SEALED ENVELOPES, ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY, CENTRAL TENDER BOARD, AND PLACED IN THE SECRETARIAT TENDER BOX SITUATED IN THE ENTRANCE HALL ON THE GROUND FLOOR OF THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT, CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES (MAIN WING), LOWER ALBERT ROAD, HONG KONG BEFORE 12 NOON ON SEPTEMBER 28, 1979.

LATE TENDERS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

SUCCESSFUL TENDERERS WOULD BE ISSUED TAXI LICENCES AT THE RATE OF 100 PER MONTH STARTING FROM NOVEMBER WITH THE HIGHEST TENDERS RECEIVING PRIORITY.

### STUDENTS AWARDED SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

FOUR HONG KONG STUDENTS WERE PRESENTED WITH SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS TO FURTHER THEIR STUDIES IN FISHERIES AND AGRICULTURAL SUBJECTS BY THE DIRECTOR OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, MR. TED NICHOLS TODAY (MONDAY).

ANOTHER FOUR STUDENTS, WHO RECEIVED BURSARIES LAST YEAR, HAD THEIR AWARDS EXTENDED FOR A FURTHER TERM.

ONE STUDENT, MISS ANNIE CHEUNG WAS AWARDED A \$3 000 SCHOLARSHIP FROM THE MARINE FISH SCHOLARSHIP FUND TO ASSIST HER IN HER PH.D IN COMPARATIVE ENDOCRINOLOGY AND THE ENDOCRINE BASIS OF FISH BREEDING AND CULTURE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG.

ALSO UNDER THE MARINE FISH SCHOLARSHIP FUND WAS A LOAN OF \$4 000 TO MR. CHU KA-LOK WHO IS STUDYING NAVAL ARCHITECTURE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF STRATHCLYDE, U.K.

FROM THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS SCHOLARSHIP FUND, MR. CHAN HON-CHEUNG WAS AWARDED A GRANT OF \$7 500 AND A LOAN OF \$7 500. MR. CHAN IS STUDYING AGRICULTURAL SCIENCE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NOTTINGHAM, U.K. ALSO FROM THE SAME FUND, MR. TERENCE LAM PO-SUM WAS AWARDED A GRANT OF \$7 500 FOR HIS STUDIES IN ADVANCE PIG HUSBANDRY AT NORFOLK COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE AND HORTICULTURE, U.K.

THE RENEWAL OF SCHOLARSHIPS, GRANTS AND LOANS TO LAST YEAR'S SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES AMOUNTED TO ALMOST \$30 000 FROM THE TWO FUNDS.

AT TODAY'S PRESENTATION CEREMONY, MR. NICHOLS SAID THE TWO FUNDS WERE LAUNCHED LAST YEAR WITH A TOTAL CAPITAL OF \$2 MILLION.

HE SAID THE FUNDS WERE DESIGNED TO ENABLE DESERVING LOCAL STUDENTS TO FURTHER THEIR CAREER IN AGRICULTURAL AND FISHERIES INDUSTRIES. ONE OF THE CONDITIONS OF THE SCHOLARSHIPS IS THAT THE SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES MUST SPEND SOME TIME IN HONG KONG AT THE END OF THEIR STUDIES IN THE RELATED INDUSTRY.

MR. NICHOLS SAID THAT WITH ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY IN TODAY'S PRIMARY PRODUCTION IT WAS NECESSARY FOR FISHERMEN AND FARMERS TO KEEP ABREAST WITH DEVELOPMENTS TO ENSURE MAXIMUM YIELDS OF PRODUCE.

### STUDENTS URGED TO JOIN SCHOOL MEDICAL SCHEME

THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT TODAY (MONDAY) URGED STUDENTS IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS AND FORMS OR MIDDLE I, II AND III TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SCHOOL MEDICAL SERVICE SCHEME.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID THE PURPOSE OF THE SCHEME WAS TO PROVIDE SUBSIDISED ECONOMICAL MEDICAL TREATMENT FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN WHO DESIRE IT.

+IT ALSO AIMS TO SERVE THE SPECIAL NEEDS OF STUDENTS BY ALLOWING FOR THE EARLY DETECTION AND DIAGNOSIS OF DEFECTS AND CONTINUED MEDICAL SUPERVISION,+ HE SAID.

PARTICIPATION FEE IS \$5 FOR 12 MONTHS FROM THE DATE OF ENTRY, AND ALL COLLECTED FEES WILL GO TO THE SCHOOL MEDICAL SERVICE BOARD.

A DOCTOR WILL BE CHOSEN BY THE SCHOOL FROM A LIST PROVIDED BY THE BOARD, AND PARTICIPATING STUDENTS ARE ENTITLED TO VISIT THE DOCTOR FREE OF CHARGE DURING THE 12-MONTH PERIOD.

THE SCHOOLS WILL ISSUE PARTICIPATING CARDS TO PUPILS ON ANY DAY OF THE SCHOOL YEAR ON WHICH THEY WISH TO JOIN.

### MONTH-LONG ANTI-DRUG CAMPAIGN FOR WAN CHAI

A MONTH-LONG ANTI-DRUG CAMPAIGN WILL BE LAUNCHED IN WAN CHAI THIS SATURDAY (SEPTEMBER 15) TO FURTHER PROMOTE THE ANTI-DRUG MESSAGE TO ABOUT 230 000 RESIDENTS IN THE DISTRICT.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE WAN CHAI DISTRICT ANTI-DRUG CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE, MR. CHAM SUI-LUEN, ANNOUNCING THIS AT A PRESS CONFERENCE TODAY (MONDAY), SAID THE PUBLICITY DRIVE WOULD ALSO BE AIMED AT THE WHOLE POPULATION IN HONG KONG.

MR. CHAM SAID THE OPENING CEREMONY WOULD BE PERFORMED BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ACTION COMMITTEE AGAINST NARCOTICS (ACAN), SIR ALBERT RODRIGUES AT SOUTHOEN PLAYGROUND, FOLLOWED BY A TWO-HOUR VARIETY SHOW FEATURING TOP ARTISTS.

+MORE THAN 10 000 RESIDENTS FROM WAN CHAI, CAUSEWAY BAY, HAPPY VALLEY AND TAI HANG, ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND THE EVENT.+

TODAY'S PRESS CONFERENCE WAS ALSO ATTENDED BY THE COMMISSIONER FOR NARCOTICS, MR. PETER LEE AND THE ACTING CITY DISTRICT OFFICER (WAN CHAI), MR. POON PONG-HON.

/MR. CHAM.....

MR. CHAM SAID THAT DURING THE NEXT FOUR WEEKS LOCAL RESIDENTS WOULD BE ENTERTAINED TO A TOTAL OF 80 PROGRAMMES, INCLUDING ANTI-DRUG EXHIBITIONS, LECTURES, SEMINARS, COMPETITIONS, FILM SHOWS, VARIETY SHOWS, RECREATIONAL AND ATHLETIC EVENTS, AND VISITS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND TREATMENT AND REHABILITATION INSTITUTIONS.

COLOURFUL ANTI-DRUG BANNERS AND POSTERS WILL BE ON DISPLAY THROUGHOUT THE DISTRICT.

MORE THAN 50 000 ANTI-DRUG LEAFLETS AND BULLETINS WILL ALSO BE DISTRIBUTED DURING THE CAMPAIGN PERIOD.

+THE WAN CHAI DISTRICT ANTI-DRUG CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE HAS DEVOTED MORE THAN THREE MONTHS' HARD WORK IN THE PLANNING AND ORGANISATION OF THE PROGRAMMES AND HAS MOBILISED THE MANPOWER AND RESOURCES OF PRACTICALLY ALL LEADING ASSOCIATIONS, SCHOOLS, YOUTH AND COMMUNITY CENTRES AND COMMERCIAL ORGANISATION IN THE DISTRICT.

+THE COMMITTEE, OF COURSE, WORKS CLOSELY WITH AND HAS THE FULL SUPPORT AND ASSISTANCE FROM ACAN AND VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS CONCERNED WITH ANTI-DRUG EFFORTS.

+I AM CONFIDENT THAT THE CAMPAIGN WILL BE A TREMENDOUS SUCCESS,+ MR. CHAM SAID.

MR. PETER LEE, WHO WAS ALSO SPEAKING AT THE CONFERENCE, SAID THAT THE OBJECTIVES OF THE CAMPAIGN WERE TO APPEAL FOR COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND SUPPORT IN THE FIGHT AGAINST THE DRUG ABUSE PROBLEM, TO DISSUADE YOUNG PEOPLE FROM EVER EXPERIMENTING WITH DRUGS AND TO URGE ADDICTS TO COME FORWARD FOR TREATMENT.

DURING THE CAMPAIGN PERIOD, INTENSIVE PUBLICITY WILL BE MOUNTED ON TELEVISION, RADIO AND IN THE PRESS TO GIVE A WIDER COVERAGE TO THE ANTI-DRUG MESSAGE, PARTICULARLY TREATMENT FACILITIES AVAILABLE AT THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT'S 20 METHADONE TREATMENT CENTRES CONVENIENTLY LOCATED ON HONG KONG ISLAND, IN KOWLOON AND THE NEW TERRITORIES.

HE SAID THE WAN CHAI CAMPAIGN WILL BE THE FIRST OF THREE INTENSIVE DISTRICT COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT CAMPAIGNS TO BE ORGANISED THIS YEAR (1979/80) BY THE ACAN.

+THE SECOND ANTI-DRUG DISTRICT CAMPAIGN WILL BE HELD IN MONG KOK, KOWLOON, BETWEEN OCTOBER AND NOVEMBER AND THE THIRD IN TSUEN WAN IN THE NEW TERRITORIES BETWEEN NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER.

+THIS YEAR'S CAMPAIGN WILL AGAIN BE TARGETED AT MORE THAN 1 000 000 RESIDENTS LIVING IN THE THREE DISTRICTS,+ MR. LEE SAID.

PARENTS URGED TO SUPPORT CHILDREN'S CHOIR FOR SHA TIN

SHA TIN PARENTS WERE TODAY (MONDAY) URGED TO ENCOURAGE THEIR CHILDREN AGED BETWEEN SEVEN AND TEN TO JOIN THE CHILDREN'S CHOIR BEING FORMED IN THE NEW TOWN.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE SHA TIN DISTRICT OFFICE SAID: +WE ARE LOOKING FOR BRIGHT, ENERGETIC CHILDREN WITH A FLAIR FOR SINGING TO JOIN WHAT IS REGARDED AS THE PILOT ATTEMPT TO BRING 'MUSIC FOR MILLIONS' TO SHA TIN.

+WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE PARENTS, WE HOPE TO BE ABLE TO SELECT 40 TO 60 SUITABLE CHILDREN AND MAKE THE CHOIR ONE OF BEST IN HONG KONG AND A PRIDE TO THE DISTRICT.+

THE MUSICAL GROUP, TO BE KNOWN AS THE SHA TIN CHILDREN'S CHOIR, IS BEING FORMED BY THE SHA TIN DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MUSIC ADMINISTRATOR'S OFFICE AS PART OF ITS CONTINUING PROGRAMME TO PROMOTE CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES IN THE DISTRICT.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID JOINING THE CHOIR WOULD PROVE TO BE A MEANINGFUL EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY TO DEVELOP THE MUSICAL POTENTIAL OF LOCAL CHILDREN.

ASSURING THAT IT WOULD IN NO WAY AFFECT THEIR SCHOOLING, HE SAID TRAINING WOULD BE GIVEN BY INSTRUCTORS FROM THE MUSIC ADMINISTRATOR'S OFFICE DURING SATURDAYS IN A LOCAL SCHOOL.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED THAT THE CHOIR WAS EXPECTED TO GIVE ITS FIRST CONCERT IN MARCH NEXT YEAR.
