TEACHERS' ASSESSMENTS AND MONITORING DEVICE TO
REPLACE SECONDARY SCHOOL ENTRANCE EXAMINATION
* * * * *

THE SECONDARY SCHOOL ENTRANCE EXAMINATION WILL BE REPLACED FROM 1978 ONWARDS BY TEACHERS' ASSESSMENTS OF PUPILS IN THE FIFTH AND SIXTH YEARS OF THEIR PRIMARY EDUCATION, AND BY A PUBLICLY CONDUCTED MONITORING DEVICE WHICH WILL SCALE ASSESSMENTS TO PERMIT RATIONAL ALLOCATION OF PUPILS WITHIN A SYSTEM OF SECONDARY SCHOOL NETS.

THESE MEASURES WERE ANNOUNCED TODAY BY THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR. KENNETH TOPLEY, AFTER CAREFUL CONSULTATION WITH A WIDE CROSS-SECTION OF EDUCATIONAL OPINION INCLUDING THE MAJOR SCHOOL COUNCILS, HEADS OF SCHOOLS AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION ON THE REPORT OF THE WORKING PARTY ON THE REPLACEMENT OF THE S.S.E.E.

IT WILL BE REMEMBERED THAT THE PROPOSALS OF THE WORKING PARTY RECEIVED WIDE PUBLICITY AND ACTIVE DISCUSSION BY ALL INTERESTED EDUCATIONAL PARTIES AND THE PUBLIC AT EVERY LEVEL.

COMMENTS WERE CAREFULLY STUDIED BEFORE THE DIRECTOR MADE FURTHER PROPOSALS TO THE MAJOR SCHOOL COUNCILS AND EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATIONS. IN THE LIGHT OF THIS FURTHER CONSULTATION THE DIRECTOR WAS ABLE TO GO TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION YESTERDAY (MONDAY) WHERE HIS RECOMMENDATIONS, WHICH HAD BEEN ENDORSED BY THE MAJORITY OF THE SCHOOL COUNCILS AND ASSOCIATIONS, WERE ACCEPTED BY THE BOARD WHO ADVISED THAT THESE INTERIM MEASURES BE ACTIVELY REVIEWED AT THE END OF 1980.

MR. TOPLEY SAID: +THE KEY THINGS IN THE NEW ALLOCATION PROCEDURE WILL BE PUPILS' ATTAINMENT OVER A PERIOD OF TIME MEASURED BY TEACHERS IN INDIVIDUAL SCHOOLS AND MONITORED BY A PUBLIC TEST= AND PARENTAL CHOICE OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS WITHIN REGIONS.+

IT IS WIDELY BELIEVED THAT PUPILS' ATTAINMENT SHOULD BE GAUGED OVER A PERIOD OF TIME RATHER THAN MEASURED IN ONE AFTERNOON AS IS THE PRACTICE WITH THE S.S.E.E.= BUT IT IS ALSO FELT THAT TEACHERS' ASSESSMENTS OF PUPILS' ATTAINMENT MAY BE SUBJECTIVE AND OPEN TO WIDE VARIATION FROM PRIMARY SCHOOL TO PRIMARY SCHOOL.

ACCORDINGLY, AN OBJECTIVE MONITORING DEVICE BECOMES NECESSARY TO SCALE DOWN THE SUBJECTIVE ELEMENTS AND VARIATIONS OF INTERNAL ASSESSMENT, AND THIS WILL TAKE THE FORM OF A PUBLICLY CONDUCTED APTITUDE TEST IN WHICH VERBAL AND NUMERICAL REASONING POWERS WILL BE **THE CHIEF FACTORS.**

THE DIRECTOR STRESSED THAT THE APTITUDE TEST WAS PRIMARILY A MONITORING DEVICE TO ENSURE A FAIR BASIS FOR ALLOCATION OF PUPILS TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS.

+IT WILL DIFFER FROM OTHER SCHOOL AND PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS SUCH AS THE S.S.E.E. IN THAT IT WILL MEASURE ACADEMIC APTITUDE NOT ATTAINMENT, IN LAY TERMS INTELLIGENCE NOT INDUSTRY.

+PUPILS WILL NOT BE REQUIRED TO STUDY FOR THE APTITUDE TEST, AS THEY DO AT PRESENT FOR THE S.S.E.E., AND THIS SHOULD REMOVE THE PRESSURE OF THE PUBLIC EXAMINATION WHICH IS FELT BY SO MANY TO BE INTOLERABLE. NOR WILL THE APTITUDE TEST DISTORT TEACHING IN THE LAST YEARS OF PRIMARY SCHOOLS, AS THE S.S.E.E. IS CLAIMED TO DO. THERE WILL BE NO SYLLABUS FOR THE APTITUDE TEST WHICH WILL BE DEvised AND CONDUCTED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT. SCHOOLS, HOWEVER, WILL RECEIVE AMPLE NOTICE AND INFORMATION OF THE TEST,+ MR. TOPLEY SAID.

IN ARRIVING AT THE CONCLUSION THAT TEACHERS' ASSESSMENTS OF PUPILS IN VARYING PRIMARY SCHOOLS REQUIRED A MONITORING DEVICE OF THE TYPE DESCRIBED, THE DIRECTOR WAS VERY CONSCIOUS OF THE EXTREMES OF OPINION PROVOKED BY THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WORKING PARTY ON THE REPLACEMENT OF THE S.S.E.E.

SOME BODIES CALLED FOR THE COMPLETE RANDOMISATION OF SELECTION, OTHERS FOR THE RETENTION OF THE S.S.E.E. BETWEEN THESE EXTREMES LAY AN AWARENESS OF THE VALUE OF INTERNAL ASSESSMENT BALANCED IN SOME WAY TO PROVIDE A BASIS OF THE ALLOCATION WHICH WAS FAIR, BOTH TO PUPIL AND TO SCHOOL. THE NEW SYSTEM ANNOUNCED TODAY IS BELIEVED TO BE FAIR AND WILL BE REVIEWED IN THE LIGHT OF EXPERIENCE. AS IN THE WORKING PARTY REPORT STUDENTS WILL BE DIVIDED INTO FIVE BANDS OF ABILITY BUT THE MONITORING DEVICE WILL ENSURE THAT THE BANDS WILL ADEQUATELY REFLECT TRUE ABILITY AND THIS COULD NOT BE ACHIEVED IN THE SYSTEM RECOMMENDED BY THE WORKING PARTY. HOWEVER, THE PRINCIPLE PROPOSED BY THE WORKING PARTY THAT ALL STUDENTS WITHIN A BAND WERE TO BE TREATED EQUALLY IS FULLY RETAINED IN THE NEW SYSTEM.

WITH THIS IMPORTANT QUALIFICATION, THE DIRECTOR HAS ACCEPTED THE OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WORKING PARTY.

ALLOCATION TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS WILL BE ON A REGIONAL BASIS PERMITTING PARENTAL CHOICE OF SECONDARY SCHOOL WITHIN SCHOOL NETS= THERE WILL BE DISTRICT COUNCILS AS SUGGESTED TO SEE FAIR PLAY, AND THERE WILL BE A MODIFICATION OF THE FEEDER SCHOOL SYSTEM WHICH WILL BE SUBJECT TO REVIEW IN THREE YEARS' TIME.

AT PRESENT, FEEDER SCHOOLS ENJOY 85 PER CENT PREFERENCE IN ALLOCATION TO THEIR PARENT SECONDARY SCHOOLS. THIS PERCENTAGE WILL BE REDUCED TO 50 PER CENT IN RESPECT TO CHILDREN ENTERING PRIMARY 1 OF THESE SCHOOLS IN SEPTEMBER 1977, SO AS TO PERMIT WIDER ACCESS TO PARENT SECONDARY SCHOOLS FOR PUPILS FROM OTHER PRIMARY SCHOOLS. THE SITUATION WILL BE REVIEWED IN 1980.

THE REPLACEMENT OF THE S.S.E.E. IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POLICY OF THE WHITE PAPER ON THE EXPANSION OF SECONDARY EDUCATION AND FOLLOWS CONSULTATION WITH A WIDE VARIETY OF EDUCATIONAL OPINION.

OF NECESSITY, ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE SUBJECT TO REVIEW IN THE LIGHT OF EXPERIENCE, BUT THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION BELIEVES THAT THE CHANGES ENVISAGED, TOGETHER WITH THE EXTENSION OF EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY BY WHICH ALL PRIMARY SCHOOL LEAVERS ARE ASSURED OF ENTRY INTO SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN SEPTEMBER 1978, THE SCHOOL BUILDING PROGRAMME AND THE ENRICHING OF THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION BY CURRICULUM REFORM AND THE INTRODUCTION OF EDUCATIONAL TELEVISION TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS THIS YEAR, REPRESENT SIGNIFICANT SOCIAL AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRESS WHICH MUST BE WELCOMED.

THE WORKING PARTY ON THE REPLACEMENT OF THE S.S.E.E. WAS APPOINTED BY THE DIRECTOR IN 1975 AND THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WORKING PARTY HAVE BEEN PUBLISHED AND WIDELY DISCUSSED.

HEADS OF SCHOOLS, TEACHERS, EDUCATIONAL BODIES AND COUNCILS WERE INVITED TO COMMENT, AND THESE COMMENTS, WITH THOSE OF THE INTERESTED PUBLIC, WERE CAREFULLY EVALUATED BEFORE ARRIVING AT FIRM PROPOSALS WHICH WERE THEN REFERRED BY THE DIRECTOR TO SCHOOL COUNCILS AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AS AN IMPORTANT PART OF THE CONSULTATIVE PROCESS.

+THE RESULT HAS BEEN A CAREFUL DECISION BASED ON EDUCATIONAL, SOCIAL AND PRACTICAL GROUNDS,+ MR. TOPLEY SAID.

THE DIRECTOR EXPRESSED HIS GRATITUDE TO MEMBERS OF THE WORKING PARTY FOR THEIR VALUABLE REPORT WITHOUT WHICH HE WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN ABLE TO ARRIVE AT A DECISION.

HE ALSO WISHED TO THANK ALL THOSE WHO HAD COMMENTED ON THE WORKING PARTY'S REPORT FOR THEIR VIEWS WHICH HAD PERMITTED HIM TO MAKE PROPOSALS ACCEPTABLE TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

CHILD CARE CENTRES APPLICATION FORMS
* * * * *

ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN CHILD CARE CENTRES HAVE OBTAINED APPLICATION FORMS FOR REGISTRATION WITH THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT SINCE THE CHILD CARE CENTRES ORDINANCE CAME INTO OPERATION A MONTH AGO.

COMMENTING ON THE ENCOURAGING RESPONSE, THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR. JIMMY SWEETMAN SAID: +OF THESE, 19 HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED THE FORMS AND FORWARDED THEM TO THE FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT, THE HOUSING AUTHORITY AND THE BUILDING AUTHORITY TO SEE WHETHER OR NOT STRUCTURAL ALTERATIONS OF THEIR PREMISES ARE NECESSARY FOR SAFETY, HEALTH AND SANITATION REASONS.+

HE URGED THOSE WHO HAD NOT YET TAKEN ANY STEPS TO REGISTER TO DO SO AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

+THIS WILL ENABLE THE DEPARTMENTS CONCERNED TO INSPECT THE PREMISES AT AN EARLIER DATE AND SO THE APPLICANTS WILL HAVE MORE TIME TO MAKE ANY NECESSARY ADJUSTMENTS TO COMPLY WITH THE CODE OF PRACTICE, NOW THAT THE GRACE PERIOD HAS ONLY 11 MONTHS LEFT.+

MEANWHILE, A SET OF APPLICATION FORMS HAS BEEN SENT TO CENTRES WHOSE ADDRESSES ARE KNOWN TO THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT TOGETHER WITH A LETTER ASKING THEM TO COMPLETE THE FORMS AND TO SEND THEM TO THE APPROPRIATE AUTHORITIES WITHOUT DELAY.

+IF AN OPERATOR FAILS TO REGISTER HIS CENTRE WITH US BY MAY 31, 1977, HE WILL BE OBLIGED TO CEASE OPERATION TO THE DETRIMENT OF THE CHILDREN ALREADY ENROLLED IN THE NURSERY. THERE IS ABSOLUTELY NO QUESTION OF ALLOWING UN-REGISTERED CHILD CARE CENTRES TO CARRY ON AFTER THAT DATE,+ MR. SWEETMAN STRESSED.

FOR THE CONVENIENCE OF THOSE WHO MIGHT HAVE DIFFICULTIES IN UNDERSTANDING THE ENGLISH VERSION OF THE LAW, HE NOTED THAT AN EXPLANATION OF THE CHILD CARE CENTRES ORDINANCE AND REGULATIONS IN CHINESE WILL SOON BE READY.

SEWAGE TREATMENT WORKS FOR TAI PO INDUSTRIAL ESTATE
* * * * *

THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT IS ABOUT TO BUILD A SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT AT TAI PO TO COPE WITH TRADE WASTES FROM THE FUTURE INDUSTRIAL ESTATE PLANNED IN THE AREA.

TENDERS FOR THE CIVIL ENGINEERING WORKS FOR THE PLANT ARE NOW BEING INVITED AND CONSTRUCTION IS SCHEDULED TO BEGIN IN AUGUST. THE PLANT SHOULD BE READY BY THE BEGINNING OF 1978.

MR. CHAN YAN, CHIEF ENGINEER OF THE P.W.D.'S CIVIL ENGINEERING OFFICE DRAINAGE WORKS DIVISION, SAID TODAY THE PLANT WOULD INCORPORATE PURIFICATION SYSTEM TO PREVENT ENVIRONMENTAL POLLUTION IN THE AREA.

+INITIALLY,+ HE SAID, +THE PLANT WILL SERVE THE STAGE ONE DEVELOPMENT OF THE TAI PO INDUSTRIAL ESTATE, BUT ALLOWANCE IS MADE TO EXPAND IT LATER ON TO SERVE THE WHOLE OF TAI PO DISTRICT.+

THE SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT IS TO BE BUILT ON A THREE-HECTARE (7.4-ACRE) SITE ON PART OF NEW LAND NOW BEING RECLAIMED BY THE P.W.D.'S DEVELOPMENT AND AIRPORT DIVISION.

THE RECLAMATION BEGAN EARLY THIS YEAR AND WILL PROVIDE A TOTAL OF 24 HECTARES (60 ACRES) OF LAND BY THE END OF NEXT YEAR FOR STAGE ONE OF THE INDUSTRIAL ESTATE.

THE FIRST SITES IN THE ESTATE ARE EXPECTED TO BECOME AVAILABLE FOR DEVELOPMENT NEXT MONTH, AND IT IS ENVISAGED THAT THE FIRST INDUSTRIAL PLANTS WILL BE IN OPERATION BY THE SECOND HALF OF NEXT YEAR.

MR. CHAN SAID THE SEWAGE TREATMENT WORKS WOULD PROVIDE ADEQUATE SEWAGE TREATMENT FACILITIES IN THE AREA.

+IT WILL PROVIDE COMPLETE SEWAGE PURIFICATION USING WHAT IS KNOWN AS THE ACTIVATED SLUDGE PROCESS. SEWAGE FIRST PASSES THROUGH GRIT CHANNELS AND SETTLING TANKS TO REMOVE GRIT AND SUSPENDED SOLIDS AND THEN THROUGH AERATION TANKS FOR BIOLOGICAL REDUCTION OF ORGANIC MATERIALS.

+THE QUALITY OF THE CLARIFIED EFFLUENT WILL THEREFORE BE SUCH THAT TOLO HARBOUR WILL NOT BE ADVERSELY AFFECTED,+ HE SAID.

OTHER WORKS IN CONNECTION WITH THE SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT WOULD INCLUDE STAFF QUARTERS AND AN ADMINISTRATION BUILDING.

THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT TODAY ANNOUNCED THAT ITS LABOUR RELATIONS SERVICE +HOT-LINE+ FOR URGENT CONSULTATIONS, AFTER OFFICE HOURS, HAS BEEN CHANGED. THE NEW NUMBER IS 5-764720.

THE CHANGE TOOK EFFECT WHEN MR. CHAN SIU-TUNG, SENIOR LABOUR OFFICER (LABOUR RELATIONS) TOOK OVER FROM MR. TO SAU-HONG, LABOUR OFFICER, WHO HAD DEALT WITH EMERGENCY EMPLOYER-EMPLOYEE MATTERS FROM HIS HOME IN THE PAST SEVEN MONTHS.

TWO PRE-WAR BUILDINGS CONDEMNED

THE BUILDING AUTHORITY TODAY DECLARED NO. 559 CANTON ROAD, KOWLOON LIABLE TO BECOME DANGEROUS, AND ORDERED THAT THE BUILDING SHOULD BE DEMOLISHED.

THE PRINCIPAL GOVERNMENT BUILDING SURVEYOR SAID THAT THIS THREE STOREY PRE-WAR BUILDING HAD REINFORCED CONCRETE FLOORS AND ROOF AND LOAD-BEARING MASONRY AND BRICK WALLS.

THE ADJACENT BUILDING AT NO. 561 CANTON ROAD WAS RECENTLY THE SUBJECT OF AN EMERGENCY CLOSURE ORDER, AFTER A MAIN WALL WAS FOUND TO BE SERIOUSLY BULGED AND FRACTURED.

+IT IS CONSIDERED THAT NO. 559 CANTON ROAD WOULD BE ADVERSELY AFFECTED BY THE DEMOLITION OR COLLAPSE OF NO. 561, WITH WHICH IT SHARES A COMMON STAIRCASE AND SEVERAL STRUCTURAL MEMBERS,+ HE SAID.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO APPLY FOR A CLOSURE ORDER IN KOWLOON DISTRICT COURT AT 9.30 A.M. ON AUGUST 3, 1976 WAS POSTED TODAY.

ALSO DECLARED TO BE IN A DANGEROUS CONDITION AND ORDERED TO BE DEMOLISHED WAS NO. 25A WING ON STREET, PENG CHAU.

THE PRINCIPAL GOVERNMENT BUILDING SURVEYOR SAID THAT THIS SINGLE STOREY PRE-WAR BUILDING WAS CONSTRUCTED WITH A PITCHED TIMBER ROOF ON LOAD-BEARING WALLS.
