GOVERNOR ATTENDS NATIONAL DAY RECEPTION

FOLLOWING IS THE TEXT OF THE SPEECH BY THE GOVERNOR, SIR EDWARD YOUDE, AT THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA NATIONAL DAY RECEPTION AT THE WORLD TRADE CENTRE THIS (TUESDAY) EVENING:

+DIRECTOR XU, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

+I AM DELIGHTED TO BE WITH YOU ONCE AGAIN TO CELEBRATE THE OCCASION OF YOUR NATIONAL DAY AND TO OFFER OUR CONGRATULATIONS ON THE 37TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA.

+1986 HAS BEEN ANOTHER BUSY AND USEFUL YEAR. THROUGH A WIDE RANGE OF CONTACTS INCLUDING TRADE AND ECONOMIC CO-OPERATION, OUR RELATIONSHIP IS BECOMING INCREASINGLY BENEFICIAL TO BOTH SIDES.

+CO-OPERATION OVER THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE JOINT DECLARATION HAS ALSO MADE MUCH PROGRESS. OVER THE PAST 12 MONTHS, THE SINO-BRITISH JOINT LIAISON GROUP HAS REACHED AGREEMENT ON SEVERAL ISSUES VITAL TO HONG KONG'S FUTURE STABILITY AND PROSPERITY, INCLUDING AGREEMENT ON HONG KONG'S NEW STATUS IN THE GATT.

+THE LAND COMMISSION TOO HAS MET MANY TIMES, AND HAS PROVIDED AN EXCELLENT DEMONSTRATION OF HOW WELL THE TWO SIDES CAN WORK TOGETHER TO RESOLVE COMPLEX ISSUES IN A PRACTICAL WAY.

+I SHOULD LIKE TO PROPOSE A TOAST TO THE HEALTH OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA, TO THE HEALTH OF DIRECTOR XU, AND THE HEALTH OF ALL GUESTS PRESENT.+

CIVIL SERVICE ID CARDS TO BE STANDARDISED * * * * *

THE GOVERNMENT WILL BE INTRODUCING STANDARDISED IDENTITY AND WARRANT CARDS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE.

ANNOUNCING THIS TODAY (TUESDAY), A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT OVER THE PAST FEW YEARS THERE HAD BEEN NUMEROUS CHANGES IN THE SCOPE AND STRUCTURE OF GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS AND THE TIME WAS NOW RIGHT TO INTRODUCE STANDARDISED IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENTS FOR THEM.

+THIS WILL ENABLE THE PUBLIC TO READILY IDENTIFY A GOVERNMENT STAFF AND, WITH THE WARRANT CARD, TO ASCERTAIN THE POWERS DELEGATED TO HIM UNDER THE LAWS OF HONG KONG,+ HE SAID.

HOWEVER, HE POINTED OUT THAT THE DISCIPLINED SERVICES WOULD STILL MAINTAIN THEIR UNIQUE AND DISTINCTIVE CARDS.

THESE SERVICES INCLUDE THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE, THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION AGAINST CORRUPTION, FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT, CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT, IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT, THE ROYAL HONG KONG AUXILIARY AIR FORCE AND THE ROYAL HONG KONG REGIMENT (THE VOLUNTEERS).

DESCRIBING THE NEW CARDS, THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE IDENTITY CARD WOULD BE PRINTED IN BLUE AND THE WARRANT CARD IN RED. FOR THE WARRANT CARD, THE POWERS DELEGATED TO THE HOLDER ARE ALSO ENUMERATED ON THE REVERSE SIDE.

+THE NEW CARDS WILL BE ISSUED TO GOVERNMENT SERVANTS ONLY UNDER TIGHT SECURITY CONDITIONS,+ HE SAID.

+HOWEVER, ANY DOUBT ABOUT THE AUTHENTICITY OF THE HOLDER MAY BE VERIFIED BY CHECKING AGAINST HIS HONG KONG IDENTITY CARD, THE NUMBER OF WHICH IS SHOWN ON THE NEW GOVERNMENT IDENTITY CARDS AND WARRANT CARDS,+ HE ADDED.

THE ISSUING EXERCISE IS EXPECTED TO TAKE SEVERAL MONTHS. DURING THE TRANSITIONAL PERIOD, EXISTING CARDS WILL STILL BE USED. BUT BY THE END OF MARCH 1987, THEY WILL BE COMPLETELY PHASED OUT AND ONLY THE NEW CARDS WILL BE VALID.

GOOD LABOUR RELATIONS ESSENTIAL IN DISTRICT GROWTH

THE IMPORTANCE OF MAINTAINING HARMONIOUS LABOUR RELATIONSHIP WAS BECOMING MORE PROMINENT WITH RAPID INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENTS IN NORTH DISTRICT, THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MR MATTHEW CHEUNG, SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF A SEMINAR ON LABOUR RELATIONS, MR CHEUNG SAID INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT IN THE DISTRICT WOULD BE IN FULL SWING WITH ITS ABUNDANT SUPPLY OF LABOUR FORCE AND OTHER FAVOURABLE FACTORS SUCH AS A GOOD TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM.

ON ITS COMMERCIAL VIABILITY, MR CHEUNG SAID THAT A SITE LOCATED CLOSE TO THE FANLING RAILWAY STATION AND FOR PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT HAD BEEN SOLD.

SUCH DEVELOPMENT, PROVIDING 2 500 RESIDENTIAL FLATS AND 27 500 SQUARE METRES FOR SHOPS, PARKING SPACES, RECREATIONAL AREAS AND COMMUNITY FACILITIES, WAS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND IN THE DISTRICT, HE SAID.

+ALL THESE ARE BOUND TO CREATE MORE JOB OPPORTUNITIES LOCALLY AND THEREFORE THE NEED FOR GOOD LABOUR RELATIONS WOULD ALSO BE APPARENT,+ HE SAID.

QUOTING A RECENT SURVEY ON LOCAL EMPLOYMENT SITUATION, MR CHEUNG SAID THAT DISSATISFACTION HAD BEEN EXPRESSED TOWARDS LABOUR WELFARE AND PROMOTION PROSPECT AMONG WORKERS INTERVIEWED.

+THIS REFLECTS THE NEED FOR BETTER COMMUNICATION BETWEEN EMPLOYER AND EMPLOYEE WHICH CAN BE ACHIEVED THROUGH MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING,+ HE SAID.

TODAY'S SEMINAR, WITH ITS EMPHASIS ON IMPROVING LABOUR RELATIONS THROUGH A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE, WOULD BE BENEFICIAL TO BOTH EMPLOYER AND EMPLOYEE, MR CHEUNG SAID, ADDING THAT MORE SEMINARS AND ACTIVITIES OF SIMILAR NATURE WOULD BE ORGANISED IN THE FUTURE.

ALSO ATTENDING THE CEREMONY WILL BE SIX EMPLOYERS WHO HAVE MADE SPECIAL EFFORTS, SUCH AS REDEPLOYING THEIR EXISTING STAFF, USING MODERN TECHNICAL AIDS AND MAKING ALTERATIONS TO OFFICE PREMISES, TO FACILITATE THE EMPLOYMENT OF THE DISABLED. THEY WILL RECEIVE CERTIFICATES OF APPRECIATION.

A LABOUR DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT OVER THE PAST FIVE YEARS THE SELECTIVE PLACEMENT SERVICE HAD FOUND JOBS FOR MANY DISABLED EMPLOYEES.

+MANY EMPLOYERS HAVE BEEN TAKING ON DISABLED EMPLOYEES REGULARLY THROUGH THE SERVICE AFTER A SUCCESSFUL FIRST PLACEMENT,+ HE SAID.

+THESE EMPLOYERS ARE HAPPY BECAUSE THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DISABLED WORKERS IS OFTEN ON A PAR WITH THEIR ABLED-BODIED EMPLOYEES.+

HE APPEALED TO EMPLOYERS WHO WANTED TO EMPLOY DISABLED PERSONS AND DISABLED PERSONS LOOKING FOR JOBS TO CONTACT THE SELECTIVE PLACEMENT SERVICE.

CENTRES HELP CHILDREN TO DEVELOP

THERE ARE 38 WELFARE AGENCIES ENGAGING IN YOUTH WORK IN HONG KONG AND THEY OPERATE 170 CHILDREN AND YOUTH CENTRES WITH SUBVENTION FROM THE GOVERNMENT, THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MRS ANSON CHAN, SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).

SHE WAS OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE SHAN KING CHILDREN AND YOUTH CENTRE OPERATED BY THE HONG KONG-MACAU CONFERENCE OF SEVENTH-DAY ADVENTISTS IN TUEN MUN.

+THE PURPOSE OF SETTING UP CHILDREN AND YOUTH CENTRES IS TO ENABLE YOUNG PEOPLE TO DEVELOP THEIR INTERESTS, CHARACTER AND POTENTIAL THROUGH PARTICIPATION IN GROUP RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES AND ALSO TO WIDEN THEIR HORIZON AND ENHANCE THEIR SOCIALISATION SKILLS,+ MRS CHAN SAID.

SHE NOTED THAT MORE THAN 900 YOUTH SOCIAL WORKERS WERE SERVING IN THESE CENTRES WHICH HAD ABOUT 150 000 MEMBERS.

THE SHAN KING CHILDREN AND YOUTH CENTRE, WHICH OPENED IN 1984, WAS ESTABLISHED WITH AN ALLOCATION OF \$740 000 FROM THE GOVERNMENT LOTTERIES FUND AND HAS BEEN RECEIVING GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE TOWARDS ITS RECURRENT EXPENSES SINCE OCTOBER LAST YEAR.

SPECIAL TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE IMPLEMENTED IN HUNG HOM FROM 10 AM ON THURSDAY (OCTOBER 2) IN CONNECTION WITH THE RECONSTRUCTION OF CHATHAM ROAD NORTH BETWEEN PAK KUNG STREET AND CHI KIANG STREET.

WITH THE COMPLETION OF STAGE II OF THE RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT, THE WESTERN CARRIAGEWAY OF CHATHAM ROAD NORTH FROM PAK KUNG STREET TO CHI KIANG STREET WILL BE REOPENED TO TRAFFIC.

NORTHBOUND TRAFFIC IN CHATHAM ROAD NORTH HEADING FOR CHI KIANG STREET WEST OF MA TAU WAI ROAD WILL BE DIVERTED TO CHATHAM ROAD NORTH, ANHUI STREET AND KO SHAN ROAD; OR TO CHATHAM ROAD NORTH, MA TAU WAI ROAD, KIANG SU STREET AND KAU PUI LUNG ROAD.
