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'RESPONSE TO UK CAMPAIGN ON REFUGEES FAVOURABLE'

BRITAIN IS CONDUCTING A VIGOROUS DIPLOMATIC CAMPAIGN TO PERSUADE OTHER COUNTRIES TO FOLLOW ITS EXAMPLE IN SOLVING THE VIETNAMESE REFUGEE PROBLEM IN HONG KONG, THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH AFFAIRS, MR TIMOTHY RENTON, SAID TODAY (MONDAY).

SPEAKING TO REPORTERS AFTER TOURING THE BOWRING CLOSED CENTRE IN TUEN MUN, MR RENTON SAID THERE HAD ALREADY BEEN SOME FAVOURABLE REACTIONS FROM OTHER COUNTRIES FOLLOWING BRITAIN'S ANNOUNCEMENT THAT IT WOULD TAKE IN 500 MORE VIETNAMESE REFUGEES.

+WE HAVE AN INDICATION ALREADY FROM THE AUSTRALIANS THAT THEY WILL TAKE A SUBSTANTIALLY GREATER NUMBER. WE HAVE SOME FAVOURABLE INDICATIONS FROM OTHER COUNTRIES AT THE MOMENT, SUCH AS SCANDINAVIA,+ HE SAID.

MR RENTON SAID IT WAS DIFFICULT TO SAY NOW HOW MANY VIETNAMESE REFUGEES WOULD BE ACCEPTED FOR RESETTLEMENT BY OTHER COUNTRIES. +AFTER ALL, WE ONLY ANNOUNCED OUR DECISION IN THE LAST WEEK OF SEPTEMBER AND WE ARE GOING TO CONTINUE VERY HARD WITH THE PROGRAMME,+ HE SAID.

+WE HAVE TAKEN A POSITIVE INITIATIVE IN THE LAST FEW WEEKS OF ACCEPTING ANOTHER 500 OURSELVES AND WE ARE BUILDING ON THAT VERY MUCH TO PERSUADE OTHER COUNTRIES THAT THEY SHOULD TAKE MORE TOO,+ MR RENTON SAID.

NOTING THAT BRITAIN HAD ALREADY TAKEN IN A GREAT NUMBER OF VIETNAMESE REFUGEES, MR RENTON SAID THE EXTRA 500 WAS A VERY POSITIVE LEAD WHICH WAS VERY MUCH WELCOMED BY THE UNHCR AND THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY.

MR RENTON ALSO PAID TRIBUTE TO THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT AND VOLUNTARY AGENCIES IN PROVIDING THE VARIOUS FACILITIES FOR VIETNAMESE REFUGEES.

+I AM PARTICULARLY IMPRESSED BY THE EMPHASIS ON TRAINING FOR THE ADULTS, THE PLAY GROUP FOR THE VERY YOUNG CHILDREN AND THE EDUCATION FOR THE OTHER CHILDREN THAT SEEMS TO ME TO BE WELL ORGANISED,+ MR RENTON SAID.

+AND IN THAT CONTEXT I WOULD LIKE TO SAY HOW IMPRESSED I AM BY THE EFFORTS BY THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT AND BY THE VOLUNTARY AGENCIES LIKE THE SAVE THE CHILDREN FUND WHO ARE HERE AT THE BOWRING CAMP TO DO ALL THEY CAN TO MAKE LIFE OF THE REFUGEES BETTER,+ HE ADDED.

+I AM PRIVILEGED TO BE HERE THIS AFTERNOON, GIVEN THE SAD CIRCUMSTANCES OF REFUGEES, I AM IMPRESSED BY WHAT I HAVE SEEN.

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+AND I VERY MUCH HOPE THAT THERE WILL BE A CONCERTED INTERNATIONAL EFFORT TO DIMINISH SOME OF THIS PROBLEM THAT HONG KONG HAS BRAVELY TAKEN ON ITSELF,+ HE SAID.

IN REPLY TO A QUESTION WHETHER HONG KONG SHOULD ABOLISH THE CLOSED CAMP POLICY FOR VIETNAMESE REFUGEES, MR RENTON SAID BOTH THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT AND BRITAIN WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE CLOSED CAMP POLICY ABOLISHED.

+BUT ONE HAS TO BE VERY CONSCIOUS OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES THAT EXIST AND THE CIRCUMSTANCES THAT EXIST IN HONG KONG. AND I THINK GIVEN THOSE IT IS NOT VERY REALISTIC AT THE MOMENT TO ASSUME THAT THE CLOSED CAMPS WILL BE ABOLISHED,+ HE SAID.

+I THINK WHAT IS IMPORTANT IS THERE SHOULD BE AS MUCH EDUCATION AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING WITHIN THE CLOSED CAMPS IN ORDER TO MAKE THE BETTER OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE REFUGEES INSIDE WHEN THEY EVENTUALLY GET RESETTLEMENT,+ MR RENTON SAID.

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STATE MINISTER VISITS REFUGEE CAMPS

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THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH AFFAIRS, MR TIMOTHY RENTON, VISITED TWO VIETNAMESE REFUGEE CENTRES THIS (MONDAY) AFTERNOON.

ACCOMPANIED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF CORRECTIONAL SERVICES, MR CHAN WA-SHEK, AND PRINCIPAL ASSISTANT SECRETARY FOR SECURITY (OPERATIONS AND REFUGEES), MR KEN WOODHOUSE, MR RENTON FIRST FLEW BY HELICOPTER TO THE BOWRING CLOSED CENTRE IN TUEN MUN.

HE WAS MET ON ARRIVAL BY CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER, SECURITY BRANCH (REFUGEES DIVISION), MR SIMON SIT; THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE CENTRE, MR FRANCIS YANG; THE FIELD DIRECTOR OF THE SAVE THE CHILDREN FUND, HONG KONG, COLONEL ROBERT REESE, AND THE CO-ORDINATOR (SOCIAL AND EDUCATIONAL SERVICE) OF THE CENTRE, MRS SHIRLEY FOZZARD.

MR RENTON SPENT ABOUT AN HOUR TOURING THE VARIOUS FACILITIES PROVIDED AT THE CENTRE FOR ABOUT 950 VIETNAMESE REFUGEES BEFORE LEAVING FOR THE KAI TAK TRANSIT CENTRE.

THERE, MR RENTON WAS MET BY THE CHARGE DE MISSION OF THE UNHCR IN HONG KONG, MR FAZLUL KARIM; THE DEPUTY CHARGE DE MISSION, MR PETER MEIJER; THE CHAIRMAN OF THE HONG KONG RED CROSS TRANSIT CENTRE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE, MR J.W. SWEETMAN, AND THE MANAGER OF THE CENTRE, MR HENRY LOKE.

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EMPHASIS ON DESIGN, WORKMANSHIP CALL TO MANUFACTURERS

GARMENT MANUFACTURERS SHOULD PUT MORE EMPHASIS ON ORIGINAL DESIGN, FINE WORKMANSHIP AND THE ADOPTION OF ADVANCED MANAGEMENT AND PRODUCTION TECHNIQUES, THE DIRECTOR OF INDUSTRY, MR JOHN YAXLEY, SAID TODAY (MONDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE WOOL FAIR 1986, WHICH DISPLAYED THE LATEST COLLECTION OF WOOL APPAREL MADE IN HONG KONG AND OTHER SOUTHEAST ASIA COUNTRIES, HE SAID THAT TO MEET THE EVER-CHANGING MARKET DEMANDS, HONG KONG SHOULD ENSURE THAT ITS ADVANCED MANAGEMENT AND PRODUCTION TECHNIQUES WERE GEARED TOWARD FLEXIBILITY AND ADAPTABILITY.

+WE ARE INCREASINGLY SELLING BRAIN WORK AND CRAFTMANSHIP IN ADDITION TO PRODUCTION CAPACITY.

+THE EMERGENCE OF YOUNG, TALENTED AND INNOVATIVE FASHION DESIGNERS AND THE CONSISTENTLY HIGH LEVEL OF WORKMANSHIP HAVE HELPED TO ESTABLISH HONG KONG'S REPUTATION INTERNATIONALLY AS A MAJOR SUPPLIER OF QUALITY FASHION AT COMPETITIVE PRICES.

+IN THE FACE OF INCREASINGLY STRINGENT QUOTA RESTRICTIONS AND KEEN COMPETITIONS IN THE WORLD MARKET, OUR MANUFACTURERS HAVE SUCCEEDED IN MOVING UP-MARKET BY MAKING HIGHER VALUE AND MORE FASHIONABLE PRODUCTS.

+OUR MANUFACTURERS WERE ABLE TO MAINTAIN AN INCREASE OF 22 PER CENT IN VALUE TERMS,+ HE ADDED, REFERRING TO THE EXPORT OF WOOL APPAREL IN 1984.

APART FROM BEING THE LARGEST EXPORTER OF CLOTHING IN THE WORLD HE SAID HONG KONG WAS ALSO THE WORLD'S NO. 2 WOOL KNITWEAR APPAREL EXPORTER JUST BEHIND ITALY, WITH THE WOOLLEN CLOTHING SECTOR HAVING AN AVERAGE INCREASE OF 18 PER CENT IN VALUE IN DOMESTIC EXPORTS OVER THE PAST FIVE YEARS.

+THE CLOTHING INDUSTRY IS HONG KONG'S NO. 1 EMPLOYER AND ALSO OUR TOP FOREIGN EXCHANGE EARNER AMONG ALL LOCALLY MANUFACTURED PRODUCTS AND IN 1984 THE VALUE OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS OF CLOTHING AMOUNTED TO \$47 BILLION OR 34 PER CENT OF HONG KONG'S TOTAL DOMESTIC EXPORTS IN THAT YEAR.+

MR YAXLEY ALSO PRAISED THE INTERNATIONAL WOOL SECRETARIAT (IWS) FOR ITS EFFORTS IN PROMOTING THE FREE TRADE OF WOOL PRODUCTS AMIDST CALLS FOR PROTECTIONISM EVERYWHERE IN THE WORLD.

+THE SETTING UP OF THE IWS OFFICE IN HONG KONG FOR SOUTHEAST ASIAN COUNTRIES IS AN ESSENTIAL ENDORSEMENT OF THE IMPORTANCE OF HONG KONG AS A REGIONAL WOOL BUSINESS CENTRE,+ HE SAID.

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NEED FOR SAFETY AT WORK STRESSED

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MANY INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENTS WOULD HAVE BEEN AVOIDED IF MORE ATTENTION HAD BEEN PAID TO SAFETY AT WORK, THE DEPUTY COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR DARWIN CHEN SAID TODAY (MONDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF A PLASTICS INDUSTRY SAFETY SEMINAR ORGANISED BY THE PLASTICS INDUSTRY SAFETY SUB-COMMITTEE, MR CHEN SAID A TOTAL OF 725 ACCIDENTS WERE RECORDED IN THE TRADE DURING THE FIRST HALF OF THIS YEAR, AGAINST 2 196 CASES FOR THE WHOLE OF LAST YEAR.

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INVESTIGATIONS BY THE DEPARTMENT SHOWED THAT 440 OF THE 725 REPORTED ACCIDENTS, OR ABOUT 60 PER CENT, HAD BEEN DUE TO PERSONAL NEGLIGENCE.

+MANY OF THESE ACCIDENTS WOULD HAVE BEEN AVOIDED IF WE HAD PAID MORE ATTENTION TO SAFETY AT WORK,+ HE SAID.

FOR THIS REASON, THE PLASTICS INDUSTRY SAFETY SUB-COMMITTEE HAD RECENTLY PREPARED A CODE OF PRACTICE ON WORK SAFETY FOR THE TRADE.

HE HOPED THAT THROUGH PUBLICATION OF SAFETY BOOKLETS AND ORGANISATION OF SAFETY SEMINARS AND TALKS, MORE PEOPLE - BOTH EMPLOYERS AND WORKERS - WOULD BECOME AWARE OF THE IMPORTANCE OF SAFETY AT WORK.

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CROSS-BORDER LINK IMPROVEMENTS TO BE DISCUSSED
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PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT WORKS TO THE CROSS-BORDER TRAFFIC LINK AT MAN KAM TO WILL BE DISCUSSED AT THE NORTH DISTRICT BOARD MEETING ON THURSDAY (OCTOBER 31).

A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE TAI PO AND FANLING DEVELOPMENT OFFICE WILL ALSO BRIEF MEMBERS ON A TOWN PARK TO BE BUILT NEXT TO FANLING WAI IN THE CENTRE OF THE NEW TOWN.

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POLICE DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS FOR TSING YI
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THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS AND DIVISIONAL POLICE STATION ON A 1 950-SQUARE-METRE SITE AT TSING YI'S HEUNG TSZ WUI ROAD.

THE PROJECT WILL CONSIST OF A 16-STOREY TOWER BUILDING AND A SINGLE-STOREY ANCILLARY BLOCK ON A PODIUM WHICH IS THREE STOREYS HIGH.

FACILITIES TO BE PROVIDED INCLUDE A CAR PARK, CELLS, OFFICES, PUBLIC REPORTING FACILITIES, BARRACKS AND A CANTEEN.

A SPRINKLER TANK, STOREROOMS AND DOG KENNELS WILL BE HOUSED IN THE ANCILLARY BLOCK.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO START IN JANUARY 1986 AND BE COMPLETED BY OCTOBER 1987.

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PEDESTRIAN ACCESS TO PARK TO BE BUILT
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THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A GRADE-SEPARATED PEDESTRIAN ACCESS ROUTE LINKING HOUSING ESTATES TO THE PLANNED KWAI CHUNG PARK IN HA KWAI CHUNG, TSUEN WAN.

THE ROUTE WILL CONSIST OF A SUBWAY AT KWAI FUK ROAD AND TWO COVERED FOOTBRIDGES ACROSS KWAI HEI STREET AND TSUEN WAN ROAD.

THE PROJECT, WHICH IS THE FIRST OF THE TWO SCHEMES INTENDED TO SERVE KWAI CHUNG PARK, WILL PROVIDE A SAFE AND CONVENIENT ROUTE BETWEEN THE PARK AND NEARBY HOUSING ESTATES.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO START IN JANUARY NEXT YEAR AND TAKE ABOUT A YEAR TO COMPLETE.

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COOK FROGS THOROUGHLY TO ENSURE SAFETY
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THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT AND THE REGIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT TODAY URGED THE PUBLIC TO COOK FROGS THOROUGHLY BEFORE CONSUMPTION IN ORDER TO ENSURE SAFETY.

A SPOKESMAN SAID THE RSD RECEIVED TWO COMPLAINTS OF SUSPECTED PARASITES IN FROGS LAST MONTH AND SUBSEQUENT TESTS CONFIRMED THE COMPLAINTS.

+SO FAR, THE USD AND THE RSD HAVE COLLECTED 50 SAMPLES FROM SEVERAL MARKETS IN THE URBAN AREAS AND THE NEW TERRITORIES AND PARASITES WERE FOUND IN 23 OF THEM,+ HE SAID.

+THE FINDINGS HAVE BEEN PASSED ON TO THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT, AND THE USD AND THE RSD WILL CONTINUE TO MONITOR THE SITUATION.+

THE SPOKESMAN STRESSED THAT THE PUBLIC SHOULD NOT BE ALARMED BY THE FINDINGS OF THE TESTS AS IT WAS NOT UNCOMMON TO FIND PARASITES IN FROGS.

+AS LONG AS FROGS ARE COOKED THOROUGHLY, PREFERABLY AT 60 DEGREE CELSIUS, THE PARASITES WILL DIE AND WILL DO NO HARM TO CONSUMERS,+ HE ADDED.

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RESTRICTED ZONES SET UP IN CENTRAL
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SEVERAL ROAD SECTIONS IN CENTRAL WILL BE MADE PROHIBITED ZONES FROM 10 AM ON THURSDAY (OCTOBER 31).

THESE ARE:

- * THE ACCESS ROAD TO THE MACAU FERRY TERMINAL WILL BE PROHIBITED TO ALL PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES.
- * THE SOUTHERN ACCESS ROAD TO THE PODIUM OF THE MACAU FERRY TERMINAL WILL BE PROHIBITED TO ALL GOODS VEHICLES.
- * THE NORTHERN SECTION OF THE MACAU FERRY TERMINAL LOOP ROAD WILL BE PROHIBITED TO ALL VEHICLES EXCEPT BUSES; WHILE THE REMAINING SECTION OF THE LOOP ROAD WILL BE PROHIBITED TO ALL VEHICLES EXCEPT BUSES AND TAXIS.

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IN ADDITION, THE FOLLOWING ROAD SECTIONS WILL BE DESIGNATED 24-HOUR URBAN CLEARWAYS FOR ALL VEHICLES:

- * A 25-METRE SECTION OF THE EASTBOUND CARRIAGEWAY OF THE MACAU FERRY TERMINAL INTERNAL ROAD NEAR ITS JUNCTION WITH THE SOUTHBOUND CARRIAGEWAY OF THE SAME ROAD.
- * THE EASTBOUND CARRIAGEWAY OF THE MACAU FERRY TERMINAL INTERNAL ROAD FROM ITS JUNCTION WITH PIER ROAD TO A POINT OF ABOUT 100 METRES WEST OF THE SAME JUNCTION.
- * THE SOUTHBOUND CARRIAGEWAY OF THE MACAU FERRY TERMINAL INTERNAL ROAD.
- * BOTH THE EASTERN AND WESTERN ENDS OF THE MACAU FERRY TERMINAL LOOP ROAD; EACH MEASURING 36 METRES.
- * THE UNNAMED ROAD IN FRONT OF THE MACAU FERRY TERMINAL (BETWEEN ITS JUNCTION WITH CLEVERLY STREET AND THE RUMSEY STREET MULTI-STOREY CAR PARK) EXCEPT FOR A 42-METRE SECTION ON ITS NORTHERN KERBSIDE LANE.

WITHIN THESE ROAD SECTIONS, NO VEHICLE OTHER THAN FRANCHISED BUSES WILL BE ALLOWED TO STOP FOR PASSENGERS OR GOODS DURING THE RESTRICTED PERIODS.

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TRAFFIC RE-ROUTEING IN YAU MA TEI

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A NUMBER OF STREETS IN YAU MA TEI WILL BE RE-ROUTED FOR ABOUT ONE MONTH TO FACILITATE WATER MAINLAYING WORK FROM 10 AM ON FRIDAY (NOVEMBER 1).

THEY ARE:

- * TUNG KUN STREET BETWEEN CANTON ROAD AND CHING PING STREET WILL BE RE-ROUTED FROM ONE-WAY WESTBOUND TO ONE-WAY EASTBOUND.
- * CHING PING STREET BETWEEN TUNG KUN STREET AND LEE TAT STREET WILL BE RE-ROUTED FROM ONE-WAY SOUTHBOUND TO ONE-WAY NORTHBOUND.

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TRAFFIC ON CANTON ROAD NORTHBOUND HEADING FOR CHING PING STREET AND TUNG KUN STREET WILL BE DIVERTED TO USE LEE TAT STREET AND CHING PING STREET.

MEANWHILE, THE EXISTING 24-HOUR PUBLIC LIGHT BUS RESTRICTED ZONE ON WAI KEK STREET BETWEEN TAI LOONG STREET AND SHEK LEI STREET IN KWAI CHUNG WILL BE EXTENDED FURTHER SOUTHWARDS TO THE JUNCTION OF WAI KEK STREET AND SHEK PAI STREET FROM 10 AM ON FRIDAY (NOVEMBER 1).

WITHIN THE RESTRICTED ZONE, ALL PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO STOP FOR PASSENGERS AND GOODS.

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FIRING PRACTICE IN NOVEMBER
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FIRING PRACTICE WILL TAKE PLACE AT THE HA TSUEN-CASTLE PEAK RANGE ON 25 DAYS IN NOVEMBER.
