INTER-DEPARTMENTAL COMMITTEE SET UP  
TO MONITOR DELINQUENT BEHAVIOUR IN SCHOOLS  
\* \* \* \*

THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION HAS SET UP AN INTER-DEPARTMENTAL COMMITTEE TO MONITOR UNRULY AND DELINQUENT BEHAVIOUR IN SCHOOLS.

IT WILL BE CHAIRED BY THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION AND WILL INCLUDE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, HOME AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT, POLICE, NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION, THE ICAC, AND THE COMMISSIONER FOR TELEVISION AND ENTERTAINMENT LICENSING.

THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION HAS ALSO ISSUED GUIDELINES FOR THE INCULCATION OF MORAL EDUCATION IN SCHOOLS IN THE CONTEXT OF CONCERN EXPRESSED BY COMMUNITY AND RELIGIOUS LEADERS, HEADS OF SCHOOLS AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN RECENT MONTHS.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE SAID THAT THESE INITIATIVES BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WERE AMONG A NUMBER OF STEPS BEING TAKEN OR PLANNED BY VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS TO COUNTER JUVENILE DELINQUENCY FOLLOWING THE REPORT SUBMITTED LAST APRIL BY THE WORKING GROUP ON JUVENILE CRIME.

CONCERN HAD BEEN EXPRESSED IN THE REPORT OVER THE APPROPRIATENESS OF SCHOOL CURRICULA FOR THE LESS ACADEMICALLY INCLINED CHILD. TO MEET THIS PROBLEM, THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WILL CONTINUE TO BROADEN THE CURRICULUM FOR JUNIOR SECONDARY FORMS, A MAJOR COMPONENT OF THE BROADENING BEING THE EXPANSION OF THE TEACHING OF PRACTICAL SUBJECTS.

IT IS ALSO PLANNED TO DOUBLE THE NUMBER OF PREVOCATIONAL SCHOOL PLACES OVER THE NEXT THREE YEARS, WITH PROVISION FOR FURTHER EXPANSION.

FROM SEPTEMBER 1982, THE SPOKESMAN SAID, ALL GOVERNMENT AND AIDED SECONDARY SCHOOLS WILL HAVE ADDITIONAL TEACHERS FOR THE TEACHING OF CHINESE AND ENGLISH. +THIS WOULD ENABLE THE CREATION OF SMALLER REMEDIAL GROUPS FOR LANGUAGE TEACHING. THE ADDITIONAL TEACHERS WILL BE PROVIDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH A FORMULA BASED ON TWO ADDITIONAL TEACHERS PER STANDARD SIZE SCHOOL.+

PLANS WERE ALSO IN TRAIN TO INCREASE FURTHER THE NUMBERS OF TEACHERS IN SCHOOLS, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE NOTED THAT PLANS FOR PRIMARY SCHOOLS WERE OUTLINED IN THE WHITE PAPER ON PRIMARY EDUCATION AND PRE-PRIMARY SERVICES TABLED IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL LAST MONTH, AND SAID THAT PLANS FOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS WERE NOW BEING CONSIDERED IN THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

THE AIM IS TO IMPROVE THE CLASS:TEACHER RATIO IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS SO THAT MORE TEACHERS CAN BE SPARED FOR COUNSELLING, CAREERS GUIDANCE AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY, HE SAID.

/MEANWHILE .....

MEANWHILE, THE SOCIAL SERVICES BRANCH WILL REVIEW THE STANDARDS AND PRIORITIES FOR THE PROGRAMME PLAN ON PERSONAL SOCIAL WORK AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE, AS RECOMMENDED IN THE REPORT.

A WORKING GROUP UNDER SOCIAL SERVICES BRANCH IS ALSO LOOKING INTO WAYS OF MEETING THE SHORTFALL IN TRAINED SOCIAL WORKERS AND WILL REPORT EARLY NEXT YEAR.

IN LINE WITH RECOMMENDATIONS IN THE REPORT FOR IMPROVING FACILITIES AND ACTIVITIES OF YOUTH AND COMMUNITY CENTRES, A WORKING GROUP HAS SUBMITTED PROPOSALS IN RESPECT OF COMMUNITY CENTRES AND VOLUNTARY BODIES AND LOCAL COMMUNITIES ARE BEING CONSULTED.

A GROUP APPOINTED BY THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE IS EXAMINING WAYS TO IMPROVE THE ATTRACTIVENESS OF YOUTH CENTRES AND EXPECTED TO SUBMIT THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS LATER THIS YEAR.

THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT, HE SAID, WAS ALSO LOOKING INTO THE POSSIBILITY OF EXPANDING RECREATIONAL FACILITIES IN HOUSING ESTATES BY UTILISING PODIA AND ROOF AREAS.

+THESE MEASURES ARE NOT A PANACEA IN THEMSELVES BUT IT IS HOPED THAT THEY WILL PROVIDE A FIRM DIRECTION AND ATTRACTION AWAY FROM CRIME FOR JUVENILES AT RISK,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+BY FAR THE GREATEST HELP CAN BE GIVEN BY PARENTS THEMSELVES. THE FAMILY IS THE GREATEST SINGLE INFLUENCE IN A CHILD'S EMOTIONAL AND MORAL DEVELOPMENT AND THERE IS OFTEN NO SUBSTITUTE TO PARENTAL GUIDANCE AND CARE IN MOULDING THE CHILD'S PERCEPTION OF WHAT IS RIGHT OR WRONG,+ HE ADDED.

#### CALL TO VOTE IN D.B. ELECTIONS

\* \* \* \*

ON THE EVE OF THE START OF REGISTRATION OF VOTERS FOR NEW TERRITORIES DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS, A SENIOR OFFICER OF THE NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION HAS CALLED ON ALL WHO ARE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE TO PUT THEIR NAMES DOWN.

REGISTRATION STARTS TOMORROW (TUESDAY) AND CONTINUES UNTIL OCTOBER 12.

ELECTIONS TO DISTRICT BOARDS IN THE EIGHT NEW TERRITORIES DISTRICTS WILL BE HELD ON MARCH 4 NEXT YEAR.

SPEAKING TO THE NEW TERRITORIES ROTARY CLUB, AN ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF THE NTA, MISS REGINA LAU, SAID THAT WITH DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS THE PUBLIC WAS BEING PROVIDED WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE DIRECTLY IN DISTRICT MANAGEMENT THROUGH VOTING, OR STANDING FOR ELECTION AND BEING A BOARD MEMBER.

+THE MAIN PURPOSES OF THE NEW PATTERN OF DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION ARE TO INCREASE THE SENSE OF BELONGING AMONG LOCAL RESIDENTS AND TO AROUSE PUBLIC INTEREST ABOUT DISTRICT AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS,+ SHE SAID.

REGISTRATION FORMS ARE OBTAINABLE FROM ANY DISTRICT OFFICE, CITY DISTRICT OFFICE, MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY STATION AND THE MAIN AND BRANCH OFFICES OF THE HONG KONG AND SHANGHAI BANKING CORPORATION AND THE CHARTERED AND HANG SENG BANKS.

+THE FORMS ARE PRE-STAMPED AND SHOULD BE RETURNED AFTER FILLING IN NAME, IDENTITY CARD NUMBER AND RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS,+ MISS LAU SAID.

THERE WAS NOTHING DIFFICULT ABOUT FILLING THEM IN.

HOWEVER, CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN WHEN WRITING IN THE ADDRESS AS THIS DETERMINED THE CONSTITUENCY IN WHICH A PERSON WAS REGISTERED TO VOTE, SHE STRESSED.

MISS LAU SAID STAFF OF THE DISTRICT OFFICES WOULD ALSO CALL ON INDIVIDUAL HOUSEHOLD TO DISTRIBUTE REGISTRATION FORMS AND HELP COMPLETE THEM.

SHE SAID ALTHOUGH RESIDENTS OF URBAN AREAS COULD ALSO REGISTER AS VOTERS DURING THE NEXT SIX WEEKS ONLY NT RESIDENTS WOULD BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN THE NT ELECTIONS.

URBAN REGISTERED VOTERS WOULD HOWEVER BE ABLE TO STAND AS CANDIDATES FOR NT DISTRICT BOARDS.

MISS LAU SAID URBAN DWELLERS WHO REGISTERED AS VOTERS NOW WOULD NOT HAVE TO RE-REGISTER NEXT YEAR FOR THEIR OWN DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS.

SHE SAID A REGISTERED VOTER WHO MOVED AFTER SENDING IN HIS APPLICATION SHOULD COMPLETE A CHANGE OF ADDRESS FORM BY NOT LATER THAN NOVEMBER 30. THESE FORMS WOULD BE AVAILABLE FROM DISTRICT OFFICES, CITY DISTRICT OFFICES AND POST OFFICES.

APPLICATION TO BE INCLUDED IN THE FINAL REGISTER AFTER THE REGISTRATION PERIOD ENDS MAY BE MADE BETWEEN NOVEMBER 21 AND DECEMBER 7, 1981.

THESE APPLICATIONS ARE TO BE MADE IN PERSON TO THE REGISTRATION OFFICER AT ROOM 9, BLOCK AA, FIRST FLOOR, EX-VICTORIA BARRACKS. AN IDENTITY CARD MUST BE PRODUCED.

THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR VOTERS FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES AND URBAN DISTRICT BOARDS AND THE URBAN COUNCIL WILL BE THE SAME.

ANYONE WHO IS AGED 21 YEARS OR OVER, HOLDS A HONG KONG IDENTITY CARD AND WHO HAS LIVED IN HONG KONG FOR AT LEAST SEVEN YEARS IS QUALIFIED.

A HONG KONG BELONGER AND AN URBAN COUNCIL ELECTOR WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE, EVEN THOUGH THEY DO NOT MEET THE RESIDENCE REQUIREMENT.

ANY REGISTERED VOTER WHO HAS BEEN ORDINARILY RESIDENT IN HONG KONG FOR 10 OR MORE YEARS CAN STAND FOR ELECTION. REGISTRATION OF CANDIDATES FOR THE NT DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS WILL START NEXT JANUARY.

12 COMMONWEALTH COUNTRIES OFFER SCHOLARSHIPS

A NUMBER OF COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIPS FOR POST-GRADUATE STUDY OR RESEARCH AT UNIVERSITIES ARE BEING OFFERED TO RESIDENTS IN HONG KONG.

THESE SCHOLARSHIPS ARE OFFERED UNDER THE COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIP AND FELLOWSHIP PLAN, AND ARE INTENDED FOR PERSONS WHO ARE EXPECTED TO MAKE A SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTION TO LIFE IN HONG KONG ON THEIR RETURN FROM STUDY ABROAD.

COUNTRIES OFFERING SCHOLARSHIPS ARE THE UNITED KINGDOM, CANADA, AUSTRALIA, NEW ZEALAND, TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO, NIGERIA, MALAYSIA, JAMICA, UGANDA, SIERRA LEONE, GHANA AND SRI LANKA.

THE COURSE OF STUDY NORMALLY EXTENDS OVER A PERIOD OF TWO ACADEMIC YEARS.

THE EMOLUMENTS WILL COVER APPROVED EXPENSES FOR TRAVEL, LIVING AND STUDY DURING THE TENURE OF THE SCHOLARSHIP.

APPLICANTS SHOULD BE COMMONWEALTH CITIZENS NORMALLY RESIDENT IN HONG KONG AND NOT MORE THAN 35 YEARS OF AGE AT THE TIME THE SCHOLARSHIP COMMENCES. THEY SHOULD ALSO BE GRADUATES OF RECOGNISED UNIVERSITIES OR HOLDERS OF EQUIVALENT QUALIFICATIONS.

SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS WHO ARE RECOMMENDED FOR THE AWARDS MUST SATISFY CERTAIN LANGUAGE, HEALTH AND IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS.

TWO EXECUTIVES FROM THE LOCAL INDUSTRY HAVE BEEN INVITED TO SPEAK AT A ONE-DAY SEMINAR ON INDUSTRIAL SAFETY FOR SENIOR MANAGEMENT TO BE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 25, 1981 AT THE HOLIDAY INN.

THEY ARE MR J.P. LEE, SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE CHINESE MANUFACTURERS' ASSOCIATION OF HONG KONG, AND MR ANTHONY Y.H. LAI, CHIEF SAFETY OFFICER, HONG KONG UNITED DOCKYARDS LIMITED.

MR LEE WILL SPEAK ON +INDUSTRIAL SAFETY PROMOTION -- EMPLOYERS' VIEWS+, WHILE MR LAI'S TALK WILL BE +INDUSTRIAL SAFETY MANAGEMENT+.

FRESH WATER SUPPLY TO A NUMBER OF PREMISES IN SHEK KIP MEI DISTRICT WILL BE TURNED OFF FOR SIX HOURS FROM MIDNIGHT ON WEDNESDAY (SEPTEMBER 2) TO 6 AM THE FOLLOWING DAY FOR LEAKAGE TEST.

NT REFUSE COLLECTION POINTS TO GET TIDYING UP

ALL TEMPORARY REFUSE COLLECTION POINTS AND BIN SITES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES WILL BE GIVEN A \$1 MILLION FACE-LIFT BEFORE THE CLEAN HONG KONG CAMPAIGN STARTS IN OCTOBER.

A TOTAL OF 160 TEMPORARY REFUSE COLLECTION POINTS AND BIN SITES AT RURAL AREAS WHICH ARE WOODEN OR CORRUGATED-IRON CUBICLES WITH OR WITHOUT ROOFS AND ENCLOSURES WILL BE REFURBISHED, SAID A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

IMPROVEMENT WORKS INCLUDE THE BUILDING OF CEMENT CONCRETE GROUND SURFACE, SETTING UP OR REPAIRING HOARDING OF WOODEN BOARDS OR CORRUGATED IRON SHEETS AND PAINTING THE HOARDINGS.

THE REFURBISHMENT IS PART OF THE +HOUSE TIDYING+ EFFORTS OF THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO ENSURE THAT CLEANSING FACILITIES ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE STANDARDS SET FOR THE CAMPAIGN, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

IT WOULD ALSO IMPROVE THE ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE AND SANITARY CONDITIONS OF THE TEMPORARY CLEANSING FACILITIES, HE ADDED.

IN CONNECTION WITH THIS, THE SPOKESMAN URGED PRIVATE REFUSE COLLECTORS AND LOCAL RESIDENTS TO MAKE FULL USE OF THE FACILITIES AVAILABLE AT THE TEMPORARY REFUSE COLLECTION POINT AND BIN SITE.

A MULTI-MILLION-DOLLAR SWIMMING POOL COMPLEX WILL SOON BE BUILT ON A 7 000-SQUARE-METRE SITE AT KWAI CHUNG.

TENDERS FOR THE SITE FORMATION AND PILING WORKS FOR THE PROJECT ARE NOW BEING INVITED BY THE ARCHITECTURAL OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

THE COMPLEX, SITUATED NEXT TO SHEK YAM ESTATE AT WO YI HOP ROAD, WILL HAVE A MAIN POOL, A TEACHING/TRAINING POOL, A DIVING POOL AND A PADDLING POOL.

OTHER FACILITIES WILL INCLUDE CHANGING ROOMS AND A LIGHT REFRESHMENT CAFE.

WORK ON THE SITE FORMATION AND PILING WILL START IN OCTOBER AND TAKE ABOUT SIX MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

WIND SURFING AND CANOE TRAINING AT TAI PO

MEMBERS OF TAI PO SPORTS ASSOCIATION ARE TO BE GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO LEARN WIND-SURFING AND CANOEING.

THE ASSOCIATION IS ORGANISING TRAINING COURSES IN THESE TWO SPORTS OVER THE NEXT FEW MONTHS IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE.

THE WIND-SURFING COURSE, WHICH LASTS FIVE DAYS, WILL BE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 6, 12, 13, 19 AND 20, WHICH ARE EITHER SATURDAYS OR SUNDAYS.

FRESH WATER SUPPLY TO A NUMBER OF PREMISES IN MID-LEVELS WILL BE TURNED OFF FOR EIGHT HOURS FROM 10 PM ON THURSDAY (SEPTEMBER 3) TO 6 AM THE FOLLOWING DAY FOR WORK ON THE SUPPLY SYSTEM.
