HEAVY FINES FOR UNAUTHORISED BUILDING WORKS

\* \* \* \* \*

THE BUILDING AUTHORITY TODAY (SUNDAY) REITERATED THAT ANYONE WHO CARRIED OUT UNAUTHORISED BUILDING WORKS MIGHT FACE HEFTY FINES.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE (BOO) OF THE BUILDINGS AND LANDS DEPARTMENT SAID APART FROM PAYING THE FINES, THE OWNER WOULD HAVE TO REMOVE THE ILLEGAL STRUCTURES CONCERNED.

THE REMINDER FOLLOWED A RECENT COURT CASE IN WHICH A FLAT OWNER WAS CONVICTED TWICE AND FINED A TOTAL OF \$22,560 FOR HAVING CARRIED OUT BUILDING WORKS WITHOUT AUTHORITY AND FAILED TWICE TO COMPLY WITH A REMOVAL ORDER.

THE DEFENDANT, MR KONG FUK-SHING, WAS FIRST CONVICTED AND FINED \$6,360 IN MARCH LAST YEAR FOR FAILING TO COMPLY WITH AN ORDER TO REMOVE AN ILLEGAL STRUCTURE ERECTED ON THE FLAT-ROOF ADJOINING HIS FLAT IN HORSE SHOE LANE, KOWLOON.

HE WAS TAKEN TO COURT AGAIN LAST MONTH AND WAS FINED \$16,200 AFTER BOO STAFF FOUND THE ILLEGAL STRUCTURE HAD NOT YET BEEN DEMOLISHED.

THE CASE CAME TO LIGHT IN JUNE 1991 WHEN BOO STAFF FOUND DURING AN INSPECTION THAT AN ILLEGAL STRUCTURE WAS BUILT ON THE FLAT-ROOF ADJOINING THE DEFENDANT'S FLAT ON THE SECOND FLOOR OF LAI YUE BUILDING AT 3 HORSE SHOE LANE, KOWLOON.

THE UNAUTHORISED BUILDING WORKS WAS A METAL FRAME STRUCTURE COVERED BY CANVAS ON THE PARAPET WALLS. THE AREA COVERED BY THE STRUCTURE WAS ABOUT 20 SQUARE METRES.

A REMOVAL ORDER WAS ISSUED TO THE DEFENDANT IN OCTOBER THAT YEAR REQUIRING HIM TO REMOVE THE ILLEGAL STRUCTURE WITHIN 27 DAYS. THE REMOVAL ORDER EXPIRED ON NOVEMBER 18, 1991.

THE DEFENDANT WAS CONVICTED ON MARCH 10 LAST YEAR AT THE KWUN TONG MAGISTRACY FOR NOT COMPLYING WITH THE REMOVAL ORDER AND WAS FINED \$3,000 PLUS A DAILY FINE OF \$30 FOR EACH OF THE 112 DAYS SINCE THE EXPIRY OF THE STATUTORY ORDER.

HE WAS TAKEN TO COURT AGAIN NINE MONTHS LATER WHEN BOO STAFF FOUND THE ILLEGAL STRUCTURE CONCERNED HAD NOT YET BEEN REMOVED. THE COURT HEARD THAT BOO STAFF INSPECTED THE BUILDING ON JUNE 17 AND SEPTEMBER 30 AND FOUND THAT THE REMOVAL ORDER HAD NOT YET BEEN COMPLIED WITH.

THIS TIME, HE WAS FINED \$6,000 PLUS A DAILY FINE OF \$50 FOR EACH OF THE 204 DAYS SINCE HIS LAST CONVICTION FOR THE OFFENCE.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID RECENT INSPECTION OF THE BUILDING REVEALED THAT WORKS HAD ALREADY BEEN STARTED TO DEMOLISH THE ILLEGAL STRUCTURE CONCERNED.

HE EMPHASISED THAT HAD SUCH REMOVAL WORKS NOT BEEN STARTED, ARRANGEMENTS WOULD HAVE BEEN MADE FOR THE GOVERNMENT CONTRACTOR TO CARRY OUT THE WORKS WITH THE COSTS TO BE RECOVERED FROM THE OWNER.

FOUR LOTS OF GOVERNMENT LAND WILL BE OFFERED FOR SALE BY PUBLIC AUCTION ON TUESDAY (JANUARY 12).

THE AUCTION WILL BE HELD IN THE THEATRE OF THE CITY HALL AT 2.30 PM.

THE FIRST LOT IS LOCATED IN COX'S ROAD, KOWLOON.

WITH AN AREA OF ABOUT 1,395 SQUARE METRES, IT IS INTENDED FOR PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES.

THE SECOND LOT IS LOCATED AT THE JUNCTION OF SHUNG LING STREET AND YI LUN STREET, SAN PO KONG, KOWLOON. IT HAS AN AREA OF ABOUT 3,093 SQUARE METRES EARMARKED FOR NON-INDUSTRIAL (EXCLUDING GODOWN, HOTEL AND PETROL FILLING STATION) PURPOSES.

THE THIRD LOT IS LOCATED IN AREA 29A, TAI LIN PAI ROAD, KWAI CHUNG, NEW TERRITORIES.

WITH AN AREA OF ABOUT 916 SQUARE METRES, IT IS DESIGNATED FOR INDUSTRIAL AND/OR GODOWN PURPOSES.

THE REMAINING LOT, LOCATED IN TOWN PARK ROAD SOUTH, YUEN LONG, NEW TERRITORIES, HAS AN AREA OF ABOUT 10,500 SQUARE METRES AND IS EARMARKED FOR PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES.

REFORMS A STEP FORWARD IN REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT

THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT OFFICER, MR WONG HON-HO, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY) THAT THE GOVERNOR'S PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL REFORMS REPRESENTED A STEP FORWARD IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE TERRITORY'S REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT.

MR WONG MADE THESE REMARKS AT THE DISTRICT'S FIGHT CRIME CARNIVAL ON THE HONG NING ROAD PLAYGROUND.

SINCE THE PUBLICATION IN 1981 OF THE WHITE PAPER ON THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION IN HONG KONG, THE GOVERNMENT HAD ALL ALONG BEEN ACTIVELY PROMOTING THE AWARENESS OF, AND PARTICIPATION IN, COMMUNITY AFFAIRS AMONG PEOPLE FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE, HE SAID.

SUBSEQUENTLY, THE GOVERNMENT ISSUED TWO OTHER WHITE PAPERS IN 1984 AND 1988 TO OUTLINE THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT.

NOW, MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC HAVE MORE OPPORTUNITIES TO AIR THEIR VIEWS AND INFLUENCE THE GOVERNMENT'S POLICIES, MR WONG SAID.

HE ADDED THAT ONE OF THE PRIME OBJECTIVES OF THE GOVERNOR'S CONSTITUTIONAL PROPOSALS WAS TO FURTHER ENCOURAGE PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN COMMUNITY AFFAIRS.

HE STRESSED THAT CONSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENTS WERE CLOSELY RELATED TO THE INTERESTS OF HONG KONG PEOPLE.

"THEREFORE, RESIDENTS SHOULD GRASP THE PRESENT OPPORTUNITY TO EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS ON THE GOVERNOR'S PROPOSALS.

"THE GOVERNMENT WELCOMES BOTH THE SUPPORTIVE AND OPPOSITE VIEWS OR EVEN SUGGESTIONS FOR AMENDMENTS," MR WONG SAID.

THE FIGHT CRIME CARNIVAL WAS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE DISTRICT'S FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE, THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND THE KWUN TONG AND SAU MAU PING POLICE DISTRICTS.

A HOST OF GAME STALLS AND ENTERTAINMENT PROGRAMMES WERE FEATURED IN THE CARNIVAL, ATTRACTING MORE THAN 2,000 PARTICIPANTS.

#### GOVT WELCOMES ALTERNATIVE PROPOSALS

THE GOVERNMENT IS GENUINELY INTERESTED IN AND WELCOMES ALTERNATIVE PROPOSALS ON THE GOVERNOR'S POLITICAL REFORM PACKAGE FROM ANY INTERESTED PARTIES, EASTERN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR STEVE BARCLAY, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE EASTERN DISTRICT ARTS CARNIVAL IN VICTORIA PARK, HE SAID MANY OF THE COUNTER-PROPOSALS THAT HAD BEEN PUT FORWARD WERE IN BROAD AND NON-SPECIFIC TERMS.

"IT WOULD BE VERY HELPFUL IF ANY ALTERNATIVE PROPOSALS COULD BE STATED IN CLEAR AND SPECIFIC TERMS," HE SAID.

TURNING TO THE ORGANISER - THE EASTERN DISTRICT ARTS COUNCIL, MR BARCLAY SAID IT HAD DEVOTED ITSELF TO PROMOTING ARTS AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES IN THE DISTRICT SINCE ITS INCEPTION IN 1985.

THESE ACTIVITIES AND THE MANY TRAINING CLASSES WHICH THE COUNCIL ORGANISED HAVE BENEFITED PEOPLE OF ALL AGES AND GREATLY ENCOURAGED PEOPLE'S PARTICIPATION IN COMMUNITY AFFAIRS, HE NOTED.

ON THE RECENT RELOCATION OF THE COUNCIL'S HEADQUARTERS TO YUE WAN COMMUNITY HALL IN CHAI WAN, HE SAID THE AVAILABILITY OF MORE FACILITIES AND SPACE WOULD ENSURE THAT ITS EXCELLENT WORK WOULD CONTINUE FOR MANY YEARS TO COME.

ALSO SPEAKING AT THE CEREMONY, CHAIRMAN OF THE ARTS COUNCIL, MS CHRISTINA TING, SAID MORE NON-PROFIT MAKING INTEREST CLASSES WOULD BE HELD TO PROMOTE ARTS.

THE COUNCIL IS TO HOLD A LARGE-SCALE ARTS FESTIVAL WHICH FEATURES A CHINESE ORCHESTRAL CONCERT FROM FEBRUARY 19 TO MARCH 7, SHE ADDED.

POLITICAL REFORMS COMPATIBLE WITH JOINT DECLARATION

THE GOVERNOR'S CONSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROPOSALS ARE COMPATIBLE WITH THE SINO-BRITISH JOINT DECLARATION AND THE BASIC LAW, THE SHAM SHUI PO DISTRICT OFFICER, MISS LINDA LAI, SAID THIS (SUNDAY) AFTERNOON.

OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF A BUILDING MANAGEMENT CARNIVAL, MISS LAI SAID THE PACKAGE WOULD ENSURE MODERATE DEVELOPMENT IN THE TERRITORY'S POLITICAL SYSTEM.

SHE STRESSED THAT THIS WAS FORMULATED IN ACCORDANCE TO THE WISHES OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

"WE HOPE THAT THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THESE PROPOSALS WILL ENCOURAGE PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN COMMUNITY AFFAIRS AND STRENGTHEN HONG KONG'S RULE OF LAW AND PEOPLE'S SCRUTINY ON THE GOVERNMENT.

"AND THESE ARE THE PREREQUISITES TO THE STABILITY AND PROSPERITY OF HONG KONG," MISS LAI SAID.

SHE ALSO URGED THE PUBLIC TO EXERCISE THEIR CIVIC DUTY BY EXPRESSING THEIR VIEWS ON THE POLITICAL REFORM PACKAGE THROUGH VARIOUS CHANNELS.

REFORMS ENCOURAGE COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

THE GOVERNOR'S PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL PACKAGE AIMS TO ALLOW HONG KONG PEOPLE TO PARTICIPATE MORE IN RUNNING THEIR OWN AFFAIRS, THE YAU TSIM AND MONG KOK DISTRICT OFFICER, MR BART IRELAND, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF YAU TSIM DISTRICT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT CAMPAIGN, MR IRELAND SAID THE PROPOSALS WOULD CERTAINLY BE TO HONG KONG'S BENEFIT.

"THE COMMUNITY HAS SAID THAT IT WANTS A GREATER MEASURE OF DEMOCRACY; OUR PROPOSED PACKAGE WILL, WE ARE CONVINCED, GIVE YOU WHAT YOU WANTED," HE CONTINUED.

"IT IS IMPORTANT, OF COURSE, THAT WHAT YOU ENJOY NOW YOU WOULD STILL ENJOY IN FUTURE, AFTER 1997 - THERE SHOULD BE A SMOOTH TRANSITION."

MR IRELAND BELIEVED THAT THE GOVERNOR'S PROPOSALS WOULD ALLOW HONG KONG TO ACHIEVE A SMOOTH TRANSITION IN 1997 AND WOULD CONTRIBUTE TO THE TERRITORY'S CONTINUED PROSPERITY AND STABILITY.

NOTING THAT MANY SUCH PROPOSALS EXPRESSED WERE JUST BROAD PRINCIPLES, HE URGED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS AND PUT FORWARD ALTERNATIVE PROPOSALS IN MORE SPECIFIC TERMS.

THE ANNUAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT CAMPAIGN, JOINTLY FUNDED BY THE YAU TSIM DISTRICT BOARD AND THE URBAN COUNCIL, AIMS TO MAKE THE DISTRICT A CLEANER, HEALTHIER AND MORE ATTRACTIVE PLACE TO LIVE AND WORK.

THIS YEAR'S PROGRAMME INCLUDED CLEAN-UPS IN STREETS, BACK-LANES BUILDINGS AND MARKETS, TREE-PLANTING, EXHIBITIONS AND A POSTER DESIGN COMPETITION.

FUTURE MANAGEMENT OF COMMUNITY CENTRES LIES WITH DBS

THE MANAGEMENT OF COMMUNITY CENTRES MAY LIE WITH THE DISTRICT BOARD RATHER THAN THE GOVERNMENT IN THE FUTURE, SHA TIN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR DAVID BROWNING, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF HIN KENG NEIGHBOURHOOD COMMUNITY CENTRE (NCC) IN SHA TIN, MR BROWNING SAID DETAILS OF THE ARRANGEMENTS ARE BEING WORKED OUT.

CURRENTLY, THE BOOKING AND MANAGEMENT OF COMMUNITY CENTRE ARE UNDER THE SHA TIN DISTRICT OFFICE.

FOR HIN KENG NCC, THE POK OI HOSPITAL GROUP IS PROVIDING THE DAILY MANAGEMENT OF THE CENTRE.

MR BROWNING POINTED OUT THAT THE PURPOSE OF THIS CENTRE IS TO PROVIDE A VENUE FOR LOCAL SOCIAL ACTIVITIES.

"THROUGH THOSE ACTIVITIES, A COMMUNITY SPIRIT AND AN IDENTIFICATION WITH THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WILL BE ENHANCED AND RESIDENTS WILL COME TO KNOW EACH OTHER BETTER.

"THE REAL AIM IS THEREFORE TO BUILD UP A SENSE OF BELONGING IN THE COMMUNITY," MR BROWNING SAID.

ON CONSTITUTIONAL PROPOSALS, MR BROWNING SAID HE WAS ENCOURAGED TO SEE ALTERNATIVES TO PROPOSALS COMING FORWARD.

/HE BELIEVED .....

HE BELIEVED THAT THE ALTERNATIVES WOULD BE STUDIED CAREFULLY AND WOULD BE HELPFUL WHEN THE DEBATE TAKE PLACE IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

HE POINTED OUT THAT THE PROPOSALS REPRESENTED A VERY MODEST STEP IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT. THEY ARE ALSO A LOGICAL STEP TOWARDS A FULLY ELECTED LEGISLATURE.

THE PROPOSALS ARE COMPLYING WITH THE JOINT DECLARATION AND THE BASIC LAW AND MADE IN RESPONSE TO THE COMMUNITY'S ASPIRATIONS, HE SAID.

"THEY WILL HELP HONG KONG PEOPLE TO PARTICIPATE MORE FULLY IN RUNNING THEIR OWN AFFAIRS AND WILL ENSURE THE CONTINUITY OF AN ACCOUNTABLE ADMINISTRATION AND THE RULE OF LAW.

"WE ARE ALL COMMITTED TO THE CONTINUED PROSPERITY AND STABILITY OF HONG KONG AND TO THE 'ONE COUNTRY AND TWO SYSTEMS' CONCEPT," MR BROWNING SAID.

MR BROWNING ALSO PAID TRIBUTE TO THE SHA TIN DISTRICT BOARD FOR CONTINUOUSLY PUTTING FORWARD THE VIEWS OF LOCAL RESIDENTS, IMPROVING THE LIVELIHOOD OF THE RESIDENTS AND MAINTAINING THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE STANDARD OF SERVICE.

#### YOUTH VOLUNTEERS RECOGNISED

PARTICIPATION IN VOLUNTARY SERVICES PROVIDES OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE TO CULTIVATE THEIR RELATIONS WITH THE COMMUNITY AND TO SHOW THEIR CARE FOR THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE HONG KONG FEDERATION OF YOUTH GROUPS, MS ROSANNA WONG, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE 1992 SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME (SYP) SCHOLARSHIPS PRESENTATION CEREMONY, MS WONG SAID TAKING PART IN VOLUNTARY WORK WAS A REWARDING LEARNING PROCESS WHERE YOUNG PEOPLE DERIVED GREAT SATISFACTION THROUGH SERVING OTHERS.

SHE SAID THROUGH COMMUNITY SERVICE, YOUNG PEOPLE WOULD BUILD UP THEIR SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY AND BELONGING TOWARDS THE SOCIETY.

"IT IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT AT A TIME WHEN HONG KONG NEEDS MORE YOUTHS TO TAKE PART IN COMMUNITY AFFAIRS," MS WONG SAID.

SHE PAID TRIBUTE TO THE YOUTH VOLUNTEERS FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS TOWARDS THE 1992 SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME WHICH ORGANISED MORE THAN 13,000 EVENTS FOR MORE THAN 1.36 MILLION YOUTHS.

AT THE PRESENTATION CEREMONY, A TOTAL OF 22 YOUNG PEOPLE WERE AWARDED SCHOLARSHIPS BY THE SYP COMMITTEE IN RECOGNITION OF THEIR VOLUNTARY SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY.

THE SCHOLARSHIPS SPONSORED BY THE ROYAL HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB ARE FOR THE LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING COURSES PROVIDED BY THE HONG KONG OUTWARD BOUND SCHOOL.

A SYP COMMITTEE SPOKESMAN SAID: "FOUR OF THE AWARD RECIPIENTS WILL GO ON A 18-DAY INTERNATIONAL COURSE TO JAPAN, SEVEN WILL ATTEND A 18-DAY SEA/LAND DIPLOMA COURSE AND THE OTHERS WILL ATTEND A 10-DAY COURSE IN HONG KONG".

A RECORD NUMBER OF 70 NOMINATIONS WERE RECEIVED BY THE SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION BOARD FROM MEMBER ORGANISATIONS INVOLVED IN THE SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME ACTIVITIES.

"THE BOARD FOUND IT VERY DIFFICULT TO SELECT THE WINNERS BECAUSE ALL NOMINEES ARE OUTSTANDING VOLUNTEERS FROM THEIR ORGANISATIONS," HE ADDED.

THE 48 NOMINEES WHO WERE NOT AWARDED WITH THE SCHOLARSHIPS WERE PRESENTED WITH A CERTIFICATE OF APPRECIATION AT THE CEREMONY.

ALSO ATTENDING THE CEREMONY ARE CHAIRMAN OF SYP COMMITTEE, MR PETER LEE, CHAIRMAN OF THE SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION BOARD, MR KWOK KA-MING AND PRINCIPAL ASSISTANT SECRETARY (YOUTH), MISS SUSIE HO.

WELFARE STAFF CARRY NAME TAG

ALL STAFF MEMBERS WORKING IN SERVICE UNITS OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT ARE NOW CARRYING NAME TAG FOR EASY IDENTIFICATION BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

"IT IS ONE OF OUR MEASURES TO IMPROVE PUBLIC SERVICE," THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

HOWEVER, HE STRESSED THAT THE NAME TAG SHOULD NOT BE CONSIDERED AS REPLACEMENTS FOR GOVERNMENT IDENTITY CARDS.

LIKE OTHER CIVIL SERVANTS, OFFICERS OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT WERE ISSUED WITH A GOVERNMENT IDENTITY CARD, HE SAID.
