SAI LAU KOK CLEARANCE
* * * * *

FOLLOWING A TOP-LEVEL REVIEW OF THE COMPENSATION AND REHOUSING ARRANGEMENTS MADE FOR THE OWNERS OF FLATS IN THE SEVEN TENEMENT BLOCKS AT SAI LAU KOK, THE GOVERNMENT HAS DECIDED THAT IT CANNOT VARY THE BASIC TERMS OF ITS OFFER.

HOWEVER, IT HAS AGREED TO EXTEND THE +SETTING-UP+ ALLOWANCE OF \$10 000 TO ALL FLAT OWNERS WHO PURCHASE A NEW FLAT AND TO INTRODUCE A NEW +SETTING-UP+ ALLOWANCE OF \$20 000 FOR GROUND FLOOR SHOPOWNER-LANDLORDS WHO BUY ALTERNATIVE BUSINESS PREMISES.

THE SETTING-UP ALLOWANCES ARE DESIGNED TO COVER THE COSTS OF CONVEYANCING, STAMP DUTY AND LEGAL FEES INVOLVED IN THE PURCHASE OF A NEW PROPERTY AND WERE PREVIOUSLY AVAILABLE ONLY TO DOMESTIC FLAT OWNERS WHO OPTED TO BUY A NEW FLAT RATHER THAN TAKE UP A GOVERNMENT OFFER OF PUBLIC HOUSING.

ANNOUNCING THE EXTENSION OF THE ALLOWANCES TODAY (THURSDAY), THE ACTING SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR. JOHN TODD, SAID THE GOVERNMENT BELIEVED IT HAD GONE AS FAR AS IT COULD REASONABLY GO IN MEETING THE DEMANDS OF THE SMALL GROUP OF FLAT OWNERS — REPRESENTING NO MORE THAN 20 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL NUMBER INVOLVED — WHO HAVE STILL NOT ACCEPTED THE GOVERNMENT'S COMPENSATION.

+THE VALUATION OF THE SAI LAU KOK FLATS IS TIED BY LAW TO NOVEMBER 12 LAST YEAR WHEN THE PROPERTY REVERTED TO THE CROWN AND THE 80 PER CENT OF FLAT OWNERS WHO AGREED TO THE GOVERNMENT'S TERMS ON OR AROUND THAT DATE WERE ABLE TO DO WELL FOR THEMSELVES.

+IT IS UNFORTUNATE FOR THE REMAINING GROUP THAT THEY HAVE SINCE BEEN CAUGHT ON A RISING PROPERTY MARKET AND ARE NOW FINDING IT MUCH MORE DIFFICULT TO OBTAIN THE SAME KIND OF ALTERNATIVE FLATS AT THE PRICES PAID BY THE MAJORITY WHO LEFT SAI LAU KOK EARLIER THIS YEAR.

+HOWEVER, THEY WERE WARNED OF THIS DANGER ALL ALONG.+

MR. TODD ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT THE GOVERNMENT WAS FIRM IN ITS INTENTION TO HAND OVER THE SAI LAU KOK SITE TO MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY CORPORATION CONTRACTORS BY THE END OF THE MONTH.

HE SAID CLEARANCE TEAMS WOULD MOVE INTO SAI LAU KOK NEXT WEDNESDAY (SEPTEMBER 26) MORNING TO ENSURE THAT THE REMAINING FOUR BLOCKS WERE VACATED IN TIME FOR THE HANDOVER TO DEMOLITION CONTRACTORS.

+THERE IS STILL TIME FOR THE REMAINING 36 OWNER-OCCUPIERS TO MAKE ARRANGEMENTS FOR PUBLIC HOUSING AND TO NEGOTIATE WITH THE MASS TRANSIT OFFICE OVER THE COMPENSATION FOR THEIR FLATS WITH A VIEW TO BUYING ALTERNATIVE ACCOMMODATION.

/+WE HAVE.....

+WE HAVE SUPPLIED THE REMAINING OWNERS WITH A LIST OF MORE THAN 80 FLATS AVAILABLE FOR SALE IN TSUEN WAN, MANY OF WHICH ARE STILL WITHIN THE PRICE RANGE OF THE FLAT OWNERS WHO HAVE STILL NOT YET SETTLED.+

HE POINTED OUT THAT THE GOVERNMENT'S OFFER TO SAI LAU KOK FLAT OWNER-OCCUPIERS WAS THE OPEN MARKET VALUE OF THE RESUMED FLAT AT NOVEMBER, 1978 PRICES, INTEREST EARNED ON THE VALUATION FROM THEN UNTIL THE TIME OF PAYMENT, A DISTURBANCE ALLOWANCE BASED ON THE OCCUPIED FLOOR AREA WHICH HAD AVERAGED OUT AT AROUND \$6 300, PLUS PUBLIC HOUSING -- MOSTLY IN THE RECENTLY-COMPLETED CHEUNG SHAN ESTATE.

ALTERNATIVELY, THOSE WHO DO NOT WANT PUBLIC HOUSING ARE PAID THE \$10 000 SETTING-UP ALLOWANCE AND A \$1 500 PER MONTH RENTAL ALLOWANCE WHILE WAITING TO MOVE INTO THEIR NEW FLATS.

IN ADDITION, IF THEY WANT TO BUY A MORE EXPENSIVE FLAT, THEY ARE OFFERED THE EQUIVALENT OF AN INTEREST-FREE LOAN COVERING THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN VALUATION AND PURCHASE PRICE.

THIS IS PAID AS A LUMP SUM BASED ON CURRENT INTEREST RATES, WHICH ARE PRESENTLY 15.5 PER CENT, AND WORKS OUT TO BE 54.9 PER CENT THE DIFFERENCE.

THUS, HE SAID, AN OWNER RECEIVING \$150 000 IN COMPENSATION WHO BUYS A NEW FLAT FOR \$200 000 WOULD BE PAID \$27 450.

MR. TODD SAID THE REMAINING 36 OWNER-OCCUPIERS HAD BEEN GIVEN INDICATIONS THAT THEIR FLATS WOULD BE VALUED AT PRICES RANGING BETWEEN \$110 000 AND \$220 000 WHILE 27 ABSENTEE OWNERS WHO HAD STILL NOT SETTLED WERE GIVEN INDICATIONS ALSO BETWEEN \$110 000 AND \$220 000.

+THESE INDICATED OFFERS ARE JUST THAT -- INDICATIONS OF LIKELY VACANT POSSESSION VALUE OF THE FLATS AND THE MASS TRANSIT OFFICE IS OPEN TO NEGOTIATION ON EVERY ONE OF THEM,+ HE SAID.

+IF AGREEMENT CANNOT BE REACHED THEN THE GOVERNMENT IS PREPARED TO PAY ITS OFFER WITHOUT PREJUDICE AND TO PAY THE EXPENSES OF THE OWNERS' TO OBTAIN AN INDEPENDENT ASSESSMENT AND THEN, IF THEY WISH TO GO TO THE LANDS TRIBUNAL, TO MEET THEIR COSTS IN DOING SO.

+THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF SUBMISSIONS MADE TO THE GOVERNMENT ON BEHALF OF THE REMAINING GROUP OF OWNERS AND THE GOVERNMENT IS GRATEFUL FOR THESE ATTEMPTS TO HELP SOLVE WHAT HAS BEEN A LONG AND DIFFICULT CLEARANCE.

+ALL OF THESE SUBMISSIONS HAVE BEEN CAREFULLY CONSIDERED BUT THE GOVERNMENT FEELS THAT ITS OFFER IS FAIR AND THE FACT THAT 80 PER CENT OF THE OWNERS HAVE ALREADY SETTLED AND HAVE MOVED INTO NEW HOMES OR ARE WAITING TO DO SO SUGGESTS THAT THEY AGREE WITH THIS ASSESSMENT.

+THE TIME IS SHORT NOW, BUT WITH GOODWILL ON BOTH SIDES THE GOVERNMENT BELIEVES IT CAN STILL HELP THOSE REMAINING TO MOVE FROM SAI LAU KOK INTO NEW AND BETTER HOUSING.+

F.C.O. MINISTER TO VISIT HONG KONG

MR. PETER BLAKER, MINISTER OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH AFFAIRS, WILL ARRIVE IN HONG KONG BY AIR ON SUNDAY (SEPTEMBER 23) AFTERNOON ON A TWO-DAY FAMILIARISATION VISIT.

HE WILL BE MET ON ARRIVAL BY THE GOVERNOR, SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE.

MR. BLAKER WILL BE ACCOMPANIED BY MR. D.F. MURRAY, ASSISTANT UNDER SECRETARY, FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH OFFICE.

DURING HIS STAY, MR. BLAKER WILL HAVE TALKS WITH SIR MURRAY AND SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AS WELL AS UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS OF EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE COUNCILS. HE WILL ALSO CALL ON THE URBAN COUNCIL AND MEET MEMBERS OF THE HONG KONG GENERAL CHAMBER OF COMMERCE.

THE COMMANDER BRITISH FORCES, MAJOR-GENERAL SIR ROY REDGRAVE, WILL BRIEF MR. BLAKER ABOUT THE WORK OF THE BRITISH SERVICES IN HONG KONG SOME OF WHOM HE WILL BE VISITING.

MR. BLAKER, ACCOMPANIED BY THE GOVERNOR, WILL VISIT THE GOVERNMENT DOCKYARD AND A VIETNAMESE REFUGEE CAMP TO SEE THE BOAT REFUGEE SITUATION AT FIRST HAND.

THE MINISTER WILL ALSO VISIT PUBLIC HOUSING IN SHA TIN FOLLOWED BY A BRIEFING IN TAI PO ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF AN INDUSTRIAL ESTATE THERE.

MR. BLAKER WILL GIVE A PRESS CONFERENCE ON TUESDAY (SEPTEMBER 25) AFTERNOON BEFORE LEAVING HONG KONG THE SAME EVENING.

VISITING MP TOURS SECONDARY SCHOOLS

VISITING CONSERVATIVE MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT, MR. FERGUS MONTGOMERY TODAY (THURSDAY) TOURED TWO SECONDARY SCHOOLS TO OBTAIN SOME INFORMATION ON HONG KONG'S EDUCATION AT GRASS-ROOT LEVEL.

MR. MONTGOMERY, WHO WAS LAST HERE 10 YEARS AGO, WAS ACCOMPANIED BY THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR. KENNETH TOPLEY WHEN HE VISITED QUEEN'S COLLEGE IN CAUSEWAY BAY.

THEY WERE MET ON ARRIVAL BY THE PRINCIPAL OF THE COLLEGE, MR. TIMOTHY YUNG, WHO TOOK THEM AROUND TO SEE CLASSES IN SESSION. MR. MONTGOMERY ALSO TALKED TO TEACHERS AND STUDENTS AT AN ART CLASS, A SCIENCE CLASS AND AN ENGLISH CLASS.

IN THE FORM 7 SCIENCE CLASS MR. MONTGOMERY MET MR. YAU TZE-KOK, WHO GAINED NINE DISTINCTIONS IN THE 1978 CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION EXAMINATION. MR. YAU TOLD THE VISITOR THAT HE PLANNED TO GO ON TO STUDY MEDICINE.

NEXT MR. MONTGOMERY WENT TO SHA TIN NEW TOWN IN THE COMPANY OF THE PRINCIPAL EDUCATION OFFICER (NEW TERRITORIES), MR. DAVID LEUNG TO VISIT THE NEWLY OPENED TUNG WAH GROUP OF HOSPITALS' FUNG WONG FUNG TING COLLEGE.

MR. MONTGOMERY, A FORMER TEACHER, WAS PARLIAMENTARY PRIVATE SECRETARY TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EDUCATION AND SCIENCE IN 1973-74.

TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS FOR HAPPY VALLEY RACING

MOTORISTS AND RACEGOERS ARE ADVISED THAT THROUGHOUT THE RACING SEASON STARTING ON SATURDAY (SEPTEMBER 22) TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE IMPLEMENTED IN THE HAPPY VALLEY AREA TWO HOURS BEFORE THE BEGINNING OF EACH MEETING. THIS APPLIES TO BOTH DAY AND NIGHT RACING.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ADVISED MOTORISTS TO NOTE THAT TRAFFIC DIVERSIONS WILL BE IMPLEMENTED TWO HOURS BEFORE THE START OF THE FIRST RACE OF EACH MEETING IN THE FOLLOWING ROADS:-

MORRISON HILL ROAD, TIN LOK LANE, LEIGHTON ROAD,
CANAL ROAD EXTENSION, BROADWOOD ROAD, SING WOO ROAD,
TSOI TAK STREET, SHAN KWONG ROAD, SPORTS ROAD,
OI KWAN ROAD AND WONG NEI CHUNG ROAD.

TRAFFIC SIGNS WILL BE SET UP AND TRAFFIC POLICEMEN WILL BE ON HAND TO GUIDE MOTORISTS.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT PARKING WILL BE SUSPENDED FOR CERTAIN TIMES IN THE FOLLOWING ROADS -- WONG NEI CHUNG ROAD, SPORTS ROAD, KING KWONG STREET, VILLAGE ROAD BETWEEN SHAN KWONG ROAD AND THE HONG KONG SANATORIUM, PERCIVAL STREET (WEST SIDE ONLY), OI KWAN ROAD EXCEPT FOR THE METERED SECTION IN FRONT OF THE MORRISON HILL SWIMMING POOL AND SUNG TAK STREET, AND TUNG LO WAN ROAD.

SIGNS ADVISING MOTORISTS OF THE PERIOD OF SUSPENSION WILL BE PLACED IN POSITION 48 HOURS PRIOR TO THE TIME OF SUSPENSION.

THE SPOKESMAN WARNED MOTORISTS THAT VEHICLES PARKED ILLEGALLY WILL BE TOWED AWAY.

THE BUS STOP OPPOSITE THE JOCKEY CLUB'S MAIN ENTRANCE WILL BE SUSPENDED ONE HOUR BEFORE THE FIRST RACE STARTS AND REINSTATED 15 MINUTES AFTER THE FIRST RACE HAS FINISHED. THE STOP WILL BE SUSPENDED AGAIN 30 MINUTES BEFORE THE FINAL RACE AND REINSTATED AS SOON AS TRAFFIC IS BACK TO NORMAL.

WESTBOUND BUSES WHICH NORMALLY USED THE +BUS ONLY+ LANE IN LEIGHTON ROAD WILL BE RE-ROUTED ROUND WONG NEI CHUNG ROAD DURING THE RACE DAY +ONE-WAY SYSTEM+.

ONE HOUR BEFORE THE LAST RACE ADDITIONAL CROSS HARBOUR BUSES WILL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER SPORTS ROAD FROM THE EASTERN END AND QUEUE UP EAST OF THE ENTRANCE TO THE ROYAL HONG KONG REGIMENT (THE VOLUNTEERS) PREMISES AND WAIT ON THE WESTSIDE OF WONG NEI CHUNG ROAD SOUTH OF HAU TAK LANE TO THE JOCKEY CLUB'S BOX ENTRANCE.

CANAL ROAD EXTENSION WILL BE CLOSED TO ALL TRAFFIC ONE HOUR BEFORE THE LAST RACE AND ONLY FRANCHISED BUSES WILL BE PERMITTED TO ENTER FROM MORRISON HILL ROAD AND QUEUE UP FACING NORTH. ONCE FULL, THE BUSES WILL ENTER LEIGHTON ROAD.

THE TRAM STOP AT MORRISON HILL ROAD AND QUEEN'S ROAD EAST WILL BE SUSPENDED ONE HOUR BEFORE THE FIRST RACE AND REINSTATED ONE HOUR AFTER THE LAST RACE.

HALF AN HOUR PRIOR TO THE LAST RACE, UP TO 30 TRAMS WILL BE PERMITTED TO LINE UP UNDER THE DIRECTION OF INSPECTORS FROM THE HONG KONG TRAMWAYS BETWEEN THE ENTRANCE TO THE MEMBERS' STAND AND THE TRAM TERMINI IN WONG NEI CHUNG ROAD OR SING WOO ROAD.

\$6 MILLION CONTRACT FOR LANTAU COUNTRY PARK DEVELOPMENT

THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, MR. JOHN RIDDELL-SWAN, WILL SIGN TOMORROW (FRIDAY) A CONTRACT WORTH ALMOST \$6 MILLION FOR FACILITIES IN THE LANTAU COUNTRY PARK.

THE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME IN THE CONTRACT ALLOWS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO MANAGEMENT CENTRES, A TOILET BLOCK AND CAMPSITE FACILITIES.

THE CONTRACT IS BEING AWARDED TO HUNG YUE AND COMPANY OF WAN CHAI AND WILL BE SIGNED TOMORROW BY THE MANAGER MR. CHENG WAH.

THE MANAGEMENT CENTRES WILL BE CONSTRUCTED AT TUNG CHUNG AND TAI O, THE TOILET BLOCK AND CAMPSITE FACILITIES WILL BE AT NAM SHAN.

THE TERMS OF THE CONTRACT STIPULATE THAT THE WORKS BE COMPLETED IN 18 MONTHS.
