DUCHESS OF KENT TO OPEN PRINCE OF WALES HOSPITAL

\* \* \* \*

THE PRINCE OF WALES HOSPITAL IN SHA TIN, AN ULTRA-MODERN INSTITUTION OF INTERNATIONAL STANDARDS, WILL BE OFFICIALLY OPENED BY HER ROYAL HIGHNESS, THE DUCHESS OF KENT, ON NOVEMBER 1.

IT WILL BE THE FIRST FULLY AIR-CONDITIONED GOVERNMENT HOSPITAL IN HONG KONG, PROVIDING A WIDE RANGE OF MEDICAL SERVICES TO THE INCREASING POPULATION IN THE EASTERN PART OF THE NEW TERRITORIES.

INCORPORATED IN THE LARGE COMPLEX ARE A 1 448-BED HOSPITAL, A SPECIALIST CLINIC, STAFF QUARTERS AND A NURSE TRAINING SCHOOL.

THE COMPLEX WITH A TOTAL AREA OF 10.22 HECTARES WILL ALSO PROVIDE TEACHING FACILITIES FOR THE MEDICAL STUDENTS OF THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (MONDAY) THAT THE REGIONAL HOSPITAL WILL HAVE COMPREHENSIVE FACILITIES COVERING GENERAL MEDICINE, SURGERY, OBSTETRICS, GYNAECOLOGY, ORTHOPAEDICS, GERIATRICS AND PAEDIATRICS.

THERE WILL ALSO BE SPECIALIST UNITS FOR PSYCHIATRY, CLINICAL ONCOLOGY, PHYSICAL MEDICINE, INTENSIVE CARE, RENAL DIALYSIS, BURNS AND PAEDIATRIC SURGERY, THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

SUPPORTING SERVICES FOR THE HOSPITAL INCLUDE CLINICAL PATHOLOGY, X-RAY, OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY, PHYSIOTHERAPY AND PROSTHETIC-ORTHOTIC SERVICES.

THE COMPLEX WILL HAVE 10 OPERATING THEATRES, THREE UNITS FOR DENTAL SURGERY AND 50 PLACES EACH FOR A PSYCHIATRIC HOSPITAL AND A GERIATRIC DAY HOSPITAL.

A SPECIALIST CLINIC NEXT DOOR WILL PROVIDE OUT-PATIENT SERVICES FOR THOSE DISCHARGED FROM THE HOSPITAL, AS WELL AS FOR REFERRAL CASES FROM GOVERNMENT AND PRIVATE CLINICS.

THE HOSPITAL WILL ALSO BE EQUIPPED WITH A COMPUTERISED BODY SCANNER, ADVANCED X-RAY MACHINES AND REMOTE-CONTROLLED OPERATING TABLES.

THE NURSE TRAINING SCHOOL, THE FOURTH SUCH GOVERNMENT INSTITUTION, WILL HAVE THREE INTAKES OF 60 STUDENT NURSES EACH PER YEAR.

THE TOTAL COST OF THE HOSPITAL COMPLEX IS ESTIMATED AT ABOUT \$776 MILLION.

THE PRINCE OF WALES HOSPITAL IS EXPECTED TO BECOME OPERATIONAL IN PHASES FROM THE SECOND HALF OF 1983.

CONSUMER PRICE INCREASE SLOWING DOWN  
\* \* \* \*

THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT TODAY (MONDAY) PUBLISHED THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEXES FOR SEPTEMBER 1982. THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (A) AND CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (B) FOR SEPTEMBER 1982 WERE BOTH 132.

COMPARED WITH THE PRECEDING MONTH, C.P.I. (A) REMAINED UNCHANGED BUT C.P.I. (B) INCREASED BY ONE POINT OR 0.8 PER CENT.

WHEN COMPARED WITH THE SAME MONTH IN 1981, C.P.I. (A) INCREASED BY 11 POINTS OR 9.1 PER CENT AND C.P.I. (B) BY 12 POINTS OR 10 PER CENT. THIS REPRESENTS A SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENT UPON THE INCREASE OF 15 PER CENT RECORDED IN 1981.

DURING THE MONTH, FOOD PRICES, ESPECIALLY CHARGES FOR MEALS IN RESTAURANTS, INCREASED. PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATE RENTALS, JEWELLERY PRICES AND SCHOOL BUS FARES ALSO WENT UP.

THE C.P.I. (A) AND C.P.I. (B) ARE BASED ON THE EXPENDITURE PATTERNS OF 50 PER CENT AND 30 PER CENT, RESPECTIVELY, OF URBAN HOUSEHOLDS IN HONG KONG, WHICH WERE DERIVED FROM THE 1979/80 HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE SURVEY. THE C.P.I. (A) REFERRED TO HOUSEHOLDS SPENDING BETWEEN \$1 000 AND \$3 499 A MONTH AND THE C.P.I. (B) TO HOUSEHOLDS SPENDING BETWEEN \$3 500 AND \$6 499 A MONTH AT THAT TIME.

THE INDEXES FOR SEPTEMBER 1982 IN RESPECT OF THE NINE COMMODITY/SERVICE SECTIONS IN THE TWO CONSUMER PRICE INDEXES ARE GIVEN BELOW, TOGETHER WITH THOSE FOR AUGUST 1982 AND SEPTEMBER 1981.

THE INDEX FOR FOODSTUFFS INCREASED BY ONE POINT IN BOTH C.P.I. (A) AND C.P.I. (B). THE AVERAGE RETAIL PRICES OF LIVE POULTRY WENT UP AS A RESULT OF INCREASED DEMAND FOR CHICKEN FOR THE MID-AUTUMN FESTIVAL. RISES WERE ALSO RECORDED IN THE AVERAGE RETAIL PRICES OF MOON CAKES AND FRESH VEGETABLES, AND IN THE AVERAGE CHARGES FOR MEALS IN RESTAURANTS. THE EFFECT OF THE MOVEMENTS IN THE RETAIL PRICES OF OTHER FOOD ITEMS ON THE INDEX FOR FOODSTUFFS WAS INSIGNIFICANT.

THE ONE-POINT INCREASE IN THE INDEX FOR HOUSING IN BOTH C.P.I. (A) AND C.P.I. (B) WAS ATTRIBUTABLE TO INCREASED RENTS IN SOME HOUSING AUTHORITY GROUP A ESTATES.

THE INDEX FOR CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR INCREASED BY ONE POINT EACH IN C.P.I. (A) AND C.P.I. (B) AS A RESULT OF HIGHER PRICES OF OUTERCLOTHING.

HIGHER PRICES OF JEWELLERY CAUSED THE INDEX FOR MISCELLANEOUS GOODS TO INCREASE BY THREE POINTS IN C.P.I. (A) AND BY FOUR POINTS IN C.P.I. (B).

THE INDEX FOR TRANSPORT AND VEHICLES INCREASED BY ONE POINT IN C.P.I. (A) OWING TO HIGHER FARES FOR SCHOOL BUS.

PRICE MOVEMENTS IN THE OTHER SECTIONS WERE INSIGNIFICANT.

CONSULTANCY ON TESTING LABORATORY SERVICES  
\* \* \* \* \*

MR J. GILMOUR, REGISTRAR OF THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF TESTING AUTHORITIES (NATA), ARRIVED IN HONG KONG YESTERDAY (SUNDAY) FOR A SECOND VISIT TO CONTINUE CONSULTANCY WORK ON TESTING LABORATORY SERVICES AND ACCREDITATION OF TESTING LABORATORIES IN HONG KONG.

HE WAS ACCOMPANIED BY MR A.J. RUSSELL, PROJECT MANAGER ASSIGNED BY NATA FOR THE CONSULTANCY.

MR J. GILMOUR FIRST CAME HERE IN MARCH 1982 AT THE INVITATION OF THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT TO CARRY OUT A PRELIMINARY STUDY OF THE PROJECT.

THE CONSULTANCY, ENDORSED BY THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD, WAS COMMISSIONED BY THE GOVERNMENT FOLLOWING A RECOMMENDATION BY THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON DIVERSIFICATION TO BUILD AN IMPROVED AND MORE CLEARLY INDEPENDENT RANGE OF QUALITY CERTIFICATION SERVICES IN HONG KONG.

DURING THEIR STAY, THE CONSULTANTS WILL HOLD IN-DEPTH DISCUSSIONS WITH GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND OTHER INTERESTED PARTIES TO GATHER INFORMATION.

THEY WILL LOOK INTO THE VARIOUS OPTIONS FOR THE ACCREDITATION SYSTEM AND DISCUSS THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN AUTHORITY OF THE SYSTEM.

THE CONSULTANTS WILL ALSO EXPLORE THE POSSIBILITY OF RECRUITING FULL-TIME STAFF TO PROVIDE EXECUTIVE AND TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT SUPPORT TO THE SYSTEM; AND TO DEVELOP FURTHER PROPOSALS FOR THE CONSULTANCY.

BUSY YEAR FOR CAS  
\* \* \*

MEMBERS OF THE CIVIL AID SERVICES PERFORMED 657 COMMUNITY SERVICE AND OTHER RELATED OPERATIONS DURING THE YEAR ENDING MARCH 1982, ACCORDING TO THE LATEST CAS ANNUAL REPORT JUST PUBLISHED.

THE OPERATIONS INVOLVING 26 752 MAN-DAYS RANGED FROM CROWD CONTROL, COUNTRYSIDE FIRE PROTECTION, AND PROVIDING PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT, TO MOUNTAIN RESCUE WORK AND MANAGEMENT OF VIETNAMESE REFUGEES.

CROWD CONTROL AND GENERAL ASSISTANCE FOR COMMUNITY FUNCTIONS TOOK UP 9 897 MAN-DAYS, A 37 PER CENT INCREASE OVER THE PREVIOUS YEAR, INVOLVING 824 MEMBERS AND CADETS OF THE SERVICES.

CROWD CONTROL WAS PROVIDED ESPECIALLY AT RAILWAY STATIONS DURING THE CHINESE NEW YEAR AND OTHER MAJOR CHINESE FESTIVALS WHEN LARGE NUMBERS OF LOCAL RESIDENTS TRAVELLED BY TRAIN TO CHINA AND THE NEW TERRITORIES.

LAST YEAR CAS VOLUNTEERS CONTINUED TO ASSIST THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT IN THE MANAGEMENT OF REFUGEES CENTRES AND THE REPATRIATION OF VIETNAMESE REFUGEES, SPENDING A TOTAL OF 6 058 MAN-DAYS.

THE CAS WAS HEAVILY INVOLVED IN COUNTRYSIDE FIRE PROTECTION AND RURAL AREA CONTROL, DEPLOYING MORE THAN 7 700 VOLUNTEERS FOR THESE TASKS, THE REPORT SAID.

ON THE ENTERTAINMENT SIDE, IT PROVIDED PUBLIC PERFORMANCES OF BICYCLING AND MOTORCYCLING DEMONSTRATIONS, AND BAND MUSIC.

CAS MOUNTAIN RESCUE TEAMS WERE ON STANDBY DUTY ON SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR AND RESCUED OVER 100 PEOPLE ON 19 OCCASIONS, A 47 PER CENT INCREASE OVER THE NUMBER OF OPERATIONS DURING THE PRECEDING YEAR.

IT DEPLOYED 1 000 MEMBERS TO HELP THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT IN RABIES CONTROL.

DESPITE ITS HEAVY OPERATIONAL DUTIES, THE CAS PROVIDED 103 FULL-TIME COURSES ON A BROAD RANGE OF SUBJECTS FOR ITS ADULT MEMBERS, WHO ALSO ATTENDED ANTI-POLLUTION COURSES CONDUCTED BY THE MARINE DEPARTMENT.

FOR CADET CORPS THE CAS CONDUCTED 128 FULL- AND PART-TIME COURSES IN ADDITION TO TRAINING ORGANISED BY INDIVIDUAL CADET UNITS.

OVERSEAS TRAINING WAS ALSO ORGANISED LAST YEAR FOR PERMANENT STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS TO PROMOTE OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCY, THE REPORT SAID.

A LIST IS ALSO ATTACHED TO THE CIRCULAR CONTAINING SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES WHICH CAN BE UNDERTAKEN BY PUPILS IN THE CLASSROOM, IN THE SCHOOL AND IN THE COMMUNITY TO HELP CLEAN OUR CITY.

THESE INCLUDE ORGANISING +CLEAN THE SCHOOL+ AND +BEAUTIFY THE SCHOOL+ EVENTS, ELECTING A PUPIL WHO IS MOST ACTIVE IN CLEAN HONG KONG ACTIVITIES AND GIVING HIM AN APPROPRIATE AWARD, AND TAKING PART IN COMMUNITY PROJECTS ON CLEAN HONG KONG ORGANISED BY DISTRICT OFFICES AND OTHER ORGANISATIONS.

LORRY OWNERS WARNED AGAINST DUMPING OF DEBRIS

REGISTERED OWNERS OF GOODS VEHICLES ARE NOW HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR INDISCRIMINATE DUMPING OF BUILDING DEBRIS BY THE DRIVERS, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT MADE THIS WARNING TODAY (MONDAY) AFTER THE DEPARTMENT SERVED SUMMONSES ON OWNERS OF 13 GOODS VEHICLES LAST WEEK FOR ALLOWING THEIR DRIVERS TO DISCARD BUILDING RUBBLE IN SHA TIN.

OWNERS WILL APPEAR IN LITTER COURTS WITHIN THE NEXT SEVERAL WEEKS.

LAW ENFORCEMENT STAFF NOW HAVE WIDER POWERS TO TAKE ACTION AGAINST THE REGISTERED OWNER OF A LORRY FOR INDISCRIMINATE DUMPING BY ITS DRIVER, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE ADDED THAT UNDER THE NEW REGULATIONS, IT IS NO LONGER NECESSARY TO CATCH THE DRIVER IN THE ACT OF COMMITTING THE OFFENCE.

THE PUBLIC ARE URGED TO HELP STAMP OUT THIS MALPRACTICE BY REPORTING THE REGISTRATION NUMBER OF AN OFFENDING VEHICLE TO THE POLICE, THE LANDS DEPARTMENT OR THE NTSD.

A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$5 000 AND SIX MONTHS' IMPRISONMENT MAY BE IMPOSED FOR THIS OFFENCE.

MEANWHILE, THE SPOKESMAN URGED CONTRACTORS AND LORRY DRIVERS TO MAKE USE OF PUBLIC DUMPS SPECIALLY SET ASIDE FOR THEM AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS THROUGHOUT THE NEW TERRITORIES.

PUBLIC DUMP AT MA ON SHAN

THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED TODAY (MONDAY) THAT A PUBLIC DUMP AT THE MA ON SHAN RECLAMATION WILL BE OPENED FROM OCTOBER 29.

ACCESS TO THE DUMPING AREA WILL BE FROM SHA TIN, AND THE EXACT ROUTING AND LOCATIONS OF THE DUMP SITES WILL BE INDICATED ON SKETCHES TO BE ISSUED TOGETHER WITH DUMPING LICENCES.

DUMPING LICENCES MAY BE OBTAINED FREE OF CHARGE ON APPLICATION TO THE SHA TIN DEVELOPMENT OFFICE, 6 TUNG LO WAN HILL ROAD, SHA TIN.

LICENCES WOULD ONLY BE ISSUED FOR THE DUMPING OF APPROVED SOFT EARTH WHICH MAY CONTAIN UP TO 25 PER CENT ROCK AND LIMITED TO 250 MILLIMETRES IN SIZE AND EVENLY DISTRIBUTED THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE MASS OF THE MATERIAL.

APPLICANTS ARE REQUIRED TO SUPPLY INFORMATION ON VEHICLE REGISTRATION NUMBERS, POSTAL ADDRESS OF THE LICENSEE, AND THE ORIGIN, TYPE AND APPROXIMATE QUANTITY OF MATERIALS TO BE DUMPED.

DUMPING, WHICH MUST BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE INSTRUCTION OF THE DUMP SUPERVISOR, CAN ONLY BE CARRIED OUT BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 8.30 AM AND 4.30 PM MONDAYS TO SATURDAYS. NO DUMPING WILL BE PERMITTED ON SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CANCEL DUMPING LICENCES AT ANY TIME OR TO CLOSE THE DUMP WITHOUT PRIOR NOTICE.
