**MANUAL DEFINES JOB STANDARDS
IN SHIPBUILDING AND SHIP REPAIRS INDUSTRY**

A MANUAL SETTING OUT THE MINIMUM JOB STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE 24 PRINCIPAL JOBS AT CRAFT AND TECHNICIAN LEVELS IN THE SHIPBUILDING AND SHIP REPAIRS INDUSTRY HAS JUST BEEN PUBLISHED AND IS NOW ON SALE AT THE GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS CENTRE AT THE STAR FERRY CONCOURSE, HONG KONG.

THE MANUAL, IN ENGLISH AND CHINESE, IS THE WORK OF THE DEFUNCT SHIPBUILDING AND SHIP REPAIRS INDUSTRIAL COMMITTEE OF THE INDUSTRIAL TRAINING ADVISORY COMMITTEE, WHICH HAS RECENTLY BEEN REPLACED BY THE SHIPBUILDING AND SHIP REPAIRS INDUSTRY TRAINING BOARD OF THE HONG KONG TRAINING COUNCIL.

THE MANUAL AIMS TO :-

- * INTRODUCE GENERAL ACCEPTABLE STANDARDS OF SKILLS FOR THE PRINCIPAL JOBS AT CRAFT AND TECHNICIAN LEVELS IN THE INDUSTRY=
- * ASSIST EMPLOYERS IN THE INDUSTRY IN THEIR ASSESSMENT OF WORKERS AND IN DRAWING UP SYSTEMATIC PRACTICAL ON-THE-JOB TRAINING PROGRAMMES=
- * HELP VARIOUS ORGANIZATIONS TO PLAN TRAINING COURSES TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE INDUSTRY=
- * STANDARDIZE THE NOMENCLATURE ALREADY IN USE IN THE INDUSTRY= AND
- * PROVIDE CAREER GUIDANCE OFFICER WITH INFORMATION ON THE JOB REQUIREMENTS OF THE INDUSTRY.

IT IS HOPED THAT THE MANUAL WILL BE A USEFUL REFERENCE TO THOSE WHO ARE ENGAGED IN TRAINING WORKERS IN AND FOR THE SHIPBUILDING AND SHIP REPAIRS INDUSTRY.

THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR. THOMAS LEE, TODAY PAID WARM TRIBUTE TO THE HONG KONG AND KOWLOON KAIFONG WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION FOR THE GUIDANCE IT WAS GIVING YOUNG PEOPLE TO HELP THEM MAKE USE OF THEIR SPARE TIME AND DEVELOP THEIR CHARACTERS.

ALTHOUGH THE ASSOCIATION WAS A WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION OF MANY YEARS' STANDING, IT HAD NOT CONFINED ITS SERVICES TO WOMEN ONLY, HE NOTED.

APART FROM CARRYING OUT WELFARE PROJECTS SUCH AS ORGANISING A HOME SAFETY MOVEMENT AND HELPING THE POOR, THE ASSOCIATION ALSO HAD TWO YOUTH CENTRES, ONE IN HONG KONG AND ONE IN KOWLOON, WHICH WERE OPENED IN 1966.

THE CENTRES PROVIDE ACTIVITIES AND TRAINING COURSES TO ASSIST YOUTH TO PUT THEIR SPARE TIME TO GOOD USE AND AT THE SAME TIME HELP TO MOULD THEIR CHARACTERS.

MR. LEE SAID SINCE THAT YEAR THE ASSOCIATION HAD ALSO ORGANISED AN ANNUAL YOUTH CAMPAIGN AND THIS YEAR WAS THE NINTH OCCASION ON WHICH IT HAD BEEN HELD.

MR. LEE WAS SPEAKING AT THE PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY AT THE CLOSING OF THIS YEAR'S CAMPAIGN HELD AT THE KIANGSU AND CHEKIANG PRIMARY SCHOOL IN NORTH POINT. MRS. LEE PRESENTED THE PRIZES.

CLEARANCE OF ILLEGAL KOWLOON BAY HUTS RESUMES
* * * * *

SQUATTER CONTROL STAFF OF THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT TODAY MOVED INTO KOWLOON BAY TO CLEAR THE REMAINING ILLEGAL SQUATTER HUTS IN THE AREA.

ABOUT 400 ILLEGAL STRUCTURES ARE STILL STANDING AND IT WILL TAKE A FEW WEEKS TO CLEAR THEM.

THE CLEAR ED LAND IS REQUIRED FOR DEVELOPMENT AND ROAD WORKS AND FOR GENERAL INDUSTRIAL USE.

IN TODAY'S ACTION, ABOUT 45 NEWLY BUILT STRUCTURES WERE DEMOLISHED AND A TOTAL OF 200 PEOPLE CLAIMING TO BE OCCUPANTS WERE REGISTERED.

ABOUT 120 PEOPLE, CLAIMING TO BE HOMELESS, WERE OFFERED TEMPORARY TRANSIT ACCOMMODATION. DEPARTMENTAL TRANSPORT WAS USED TO HELP THEM TO REMOVE THEIR PERSONAL BELONGINGS.

A PRELIMINARY SURVEY AND REGISTRATION OF THE REMAINING STRUCTURES WAS ALSO CARRIED OUT TODAY AND DETAILED REGISTRATION OF THE OCCUPANTS WILL BE DONE IN THE NEXT THREE DAYS.

THE ILLEGAL STRUCTURES WILL BE DEMOLISHED DURING THE NEXT FEW WEEKS AFTER LICENSED AREA SITES HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED TO THE SQUATTERS.

JAPANESE "YOUTH AMBASSADORS" ARRIVE TOMORROW

NOTE TO EDITORS:

THE DIRECTOR OF THE WELFARE DEPARTMENT OF NAGANO PREFECTURE IN TOKYO, JAPAN, MR. TOSHIO TAKEMATSU, WILL BE PAYING A FRIENDLY VISIT TO MR. THOMAS LEE, THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY).

MR. TAKEMATSU IS TRAVELLING ON THE JAPANESE YOUTH SHIP, "YOUNG HOPE SHIP OF NAGANO", WHICH IS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE IN HONG KONG EARLY TOMORROW.

DURING HIS VISIT TO THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT HE WILL ALSO PRESENT SOUVENIRS TO REPRESENTATIVES OF 10 ORGANIZATIONS ENGAGED IN YOUTH WORK HERE AS A SIGN OF GOODWILL BETWEEN YOUNG PEOPLE OF JAPAN AND THEIR HONG KONG COUNTERPARTS.

MR. TAKEMATSU, WHO WILL BE ACCOMPANIED BY REPRESENTATIVES OF YOUNG PEOPLE ON THE SHIP, WILL CALL ON MR. LEE AT 11 A.M.

YOU ARE WELCOME TO HAVE THE VISIT COVERED. PRESS REPRESENTATIVES SHOULD MEET AT THE DEPARTMENT'S PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICE IN ROOM 528A, 5TH FLOOR, LEE GARDENS, HONG KONG, AT 10.45 A.M.

HOUSING SQUADS SURVEY LICENSED AREAS

* * * * *

TWO SPECIAL SQUADS, EACH COMPRISING FIVE TECHNICAL STAFF OF THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT, ARE CONDUCTING A PRELIMINARY SURVEY OF EXISTING LICENSED AREAS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT'S PLAN TO PROVIDE LEGAL POWER SUPPLIES TO THE OCCUPANTS.

THESE SQUADS STARTED THEIR ROUNDS IN SAM KA TSUEN LICENSED AREA TODAY. THE SURVEY OF THIS LICENSED AREA ALONE WILL TAKE ABOUT THREE DAYS TO COMPLETE. THE TEAMS WILL THEN MOVE ON TO KOWLOON BAY, WANG TAU HOM, JUNCTION ROAD, CHAI WAN, CHEUNG SHA WAN, HIP WO STREET, LEI MUK SHUE, SHEK YAM, TUEN MUN AND TAI PO IN TURN.

APART FROM SURVEYING THESE LICENSED AREAS THE SQUADS WILL ALSO ADVISE THE LICENSEES ON HOW TO AVOID DANGEROUS ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS AND HOW TO USE ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES PROPERLY.

MEANWHILE, WORK ON THE INSTALLATION OF A LEGITIMATE ELECTRICITY SUPPLY SYSTEM IS PROGRESSING AT CHEUNG SHA WAN LICENSED AREA AND TENDERS FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A SIMILAR SYSTEM AT KOWLOON BAY LICENSED AREA STAGE ONE WILL BE INVITED TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY).

DETAILED PLANNING OF THE OTHER PROJECTS IS WELL IN HAND AND TENDERS WILL BE INVITED PROGRESSIVELY AS SOON AS DOCUMENTS FOR EACH AREA ARE PREPARED.

THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT TODAY APPOINTED ANOTHER COMMUNITY AND YOUTH OFFICER FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

HE IS MR. PAUL WONG TIN-SANG, WHO WILL BE C.Y.O. FOR YUEN LONG. HIS OFFICE WILL BE LOCATED AT THE YUEN LONG TOWN HALL.

MR. WONG, 33, HAS BEEN WITH THE DEPARTMENT FOR 10 YEARS AND HOLDS A DEGREE IN SOCIAL SCIENCE. PRIOR TO HIS APPOINTMENT AS C.Y.O. HE WAS SENIOR PROBATION OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE DEPARTMENT'S NEW TERRITORIES PROBATION OFFICE.

HIS APPOINTMENT BRINGS TO 12 THE NUMBER OF CYO'S WHICH THE DEPARTMENT NOW HAS IN DIFFERENT DISTRICTS THROUGHOUT HONG KONG.

THE OTHERS ARE IN TSUEN WAN, KWUN TONG, KOWLOON CITY, MONG KOK, WONG TAI SIN, SHAM SHUI PO, YAU MA TEI, CENTRAL, WESTERN, EASTERN AND WAN CHAI.

THE C.Y.O. SCHEME WHICH WAS INAUGURATED LAST DECEMBER, IS ONE OF THE PROJECTS IN THE FIVE-YEAR PLAN FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE SERVICES IN HONG KONG.

INTEGRATED SCIENCE COURSE FOR TEACHERS

ABOUT SIXTY SECONDARY SCHOOL TEACHERS AND LECTURERS WILL BE ATTENDING AN IN-SERVICE COURSE ON INTEGRATED SCIENCE BEGINNING TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY) MORNING.

THEY COMPRISE TEACHERS FROM THE TWENTY PILOT SCHOOLS, TEACHERS FROM OTHER SECONDARY SCHOOLS AND SOME LECTURERS FROM THE THREE COLLEGES OF EDUCATION.

THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION (CHIEF INSPECTOR OF SCHOOLS), MR. ARTHUR BROWN, WILL OPEN THE COURSE AT THE NORTHCOTE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION.

THIS IN-SERVICE COURSE IS BEING ORGANISED BY THE ADVISORY INSPECTORATE OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT TO ENABLE TEACHERS WHO DID NOT HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO ATTEND THE COURSE RUN BY SCOTTISH TUTORS, TO GO THROUGH THE FIRST PART OF THE COURSE BEFORE ADOPTING INTEGRATED TEACHING IN THEIR SCHOOLS IN THE NEW ACADEMIC YEAR.

ON THE FIRST DAY, PARTICIPANTS WILL BE GIVEN THE BACKGROUND AND HISTORY OF INTEGRATED SCIENCE, ITS PHILOSOPHY, AND AN OUTLINE OF THE CONTENTS.

THIS WILL BE FOLLOWED BY TWO THREE-AND-A-HALF-HOUR PRACTICAL SESSIONS ON THURSDAY AND FRIDAY, AFTER WHICH FURTHER SESSIONS WILL BE HELD EVERY SATURDAY OVER AN EIGHT-WEEK PERIOD BEGINNING FROM SEPTEMBER 7.
