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INVESTIGATOR'S REPORT PUBLISHED

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THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, SIR HAMISH MACLEOD, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY) HE HAD ALREADY SENT COPIES OF THE FULL REPORT, PRODUCED BY THE INSPECTOR APPOINTED TO INVESTIGATE CERTAIN TRANSACTIONS RELATED TO THE TOMSON PACIFIC LTD AND WORLD TRADE CENTRE GROUP LTD, TO THOSE COMPANIES INVOLVED IN THE INVESTIGATION.

"AN ABRIDGED VERSION OF THE REPORT HAS BEEN PUBLISHED AND IS AVAILABLE FOR SALE TODAY," HE SAID.

SIR HAMISH SAID THE STANDARDS OF COMMERCIAL AND CORPORATE CONDUCT AS REVEALED IN THE REPORT GAVE CAUSE FOR CONCERN.

HE SAID THE REPORT HAD BEEN REFERRED TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND REGULATORY BODIES.

IN DELIVERING THE REPORT TO THE COMPANIES CONCERNED, SIR HAMISH HAD URGED THEIR DIRECTORS TO STUDY ITS CONTENTS CAREFULLY AND TO TAKE SUCH ACTION AS IS NECESSARY IN THE SHAREHOLDERS' INTEREST.

"IN PUBLISHING THE ABRIDGED VERSION OF THE REPORT, OUR AIM IS TO BALANCE THE NEED TO GIVE AS MUCH INFORMATION AS POSSIBLE TO SHAREHOLDERS AS WELL AS THE WIDER COMMUNITY, WHILE AT THE SAME TIME AVOIDING PREJUDICE TO PENDING LEGAL PROCEEDINGS OR POSSIBLE FUTURE LEGAL PROCEEDINGS.

"IT IS INTENDED THAT THE REMAINDER OF THE REPORT WILL BE PUBLISHED WHEN THE RISK OF PREJUDICE HAS PASSED," HE SAID.

SIR HAMISH SAID THIS INVESTIGATION ILLUSTRATED GOVERNMENT'S DETERMINATION TO ACT AS NECESSARY TO FIND OUT THE FACTS BEHIND ANY APPARENT MALPRACTICES IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN THE INTEGRITY OF THE FINANCIAL MARKETS.

THE INSPECTOR, MR JOHN LEES OF FERRIER HODGSON AND MARFAN, WAS APPOINTED UNDER SECTION 143(1) (C) OF THE COMPANIES ORDINANCE ON AUGUST 28, 1992 TO INVESTIGATE THE AFFAIRS OF TOMSON PACIFIC LTD AND WORLD TRADE CENTRE GROUP LTD AND RELATED COMPANIES.

THE INSPECTOR SUBMITTED HIS REPORT TO THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY ON MAY 28 THIS YEAR.

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\$20M GRANTED FOR DISASTER RELIEF IN CHINA

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THE DISASTER RELIEF FUND ADVISORY COMMITTEE TODAY (SATURDAY) RECOMMENDED THAT, SUBJECT TO THE FINANCE COMMITTEE'S APPROVAL, THREE GRANTS TOTTALLING \$20 MILLION BE MADE FROM THE DISASTER RELIEF FUND FOR DISASTER RELIEF IN CHINA.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE GRANTS WERE MADE IN RESPONSE TO AN APPEAL MADE BY HONG KONG RED CROSS AND TWO APPLICATIONS FROM WORLD VISION HONG KONG AND MEDECINS SANS FRONTIERES HONG KONG.

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"THE THREE RELIEF ORGANISATIONS HAVE SUBMITTED THEIR RESPECTIVE PROPOSALS ON PROVIDING RELIEF SERVICES FOR THE FLOOD-AFFECTED PEOPLE IN CHINA FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE," HE SAID.

"THE COMMITTEE IS SATISFIED THAT THE THREE PROPOSALS ARE IN LINE WITH THE GUIDELINES FOR GRANTS FROM THE FUND. IT CONSIDERS THAT EACH PROPOSAL HAS ITS OWN MERITS AND CAN CATER FOR DIFFERENT NEEDS OF THE AFFECTED POPULATION."

HAVING REGARD TO THE NATURE OF THE RELIEF SERVICES AND THE LIKELY NUMBER OF BENEFICIARIES OF EACH PROPOSAL, THE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDED THAT THE FOLLOWING GRANTS BE MADE:

HONG KONG RED CROSS	\$12 MILLION
WORLD VISION HONG KONG	\$ 5.5 MILLION
MEDECINS SANS FRONTIERES HONG KONG	\$ 2.5 MILLION

APPROVAL WILL NEED TO BE OBTAINED FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL FOR THE GRANT TO HONG KONG RED CROSS. THIS WILL BE SOUGHT AT THE COMMITTEE'S NEXT MEETING ON JULY 8.

"THE COMMITTEE BELIEVES THAT THESE GRANTS ARE AN APPROPRIATE MEANS TO EXPRESS SYMPATHY AND OFFER ASSISTANCE ON THE COMMUNITY'S BEHALF TO THE FLOOD VICTIMS.

"THE COMMITTEE HOPES THAT THIS WILL STIMULATE FURTHER RESPONSE FROM THE PUBLIC AT LARGE," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

TO ENSURE THAT THE GRANTS WILL BE USED FOR THE DESIGNATED PURPOSES, HONG KONG RED CROSS, WORLD VISION HONG KONG AND MEDECINS SANS FRONTIERES WILL BE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT TO THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT AN EVALUATION REPORT AND AN AUDITED ACCOUNT ON THE USE OF THE GRANT.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THIS WAS THE SECOND TIME THAT GRANTS HAD BEEN MADE FROM THE FUND SINCE ITS ESTABLISHMENT IN DECEMBER 1993.

LAST MONTH, A GRANT OF \$2 MILLION WAS MADE TO OXFAM HONG KONG IN SUPPORT OF ITS RELIEF PROGRAMME FOR THE RWANDAN REFUGEES.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED THAT PUBLIC DONATIONS AND APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE GENERAL REVENUE WERE THE MAIN SOURCES OF THE FUND.

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ARE WELCOME TO DONATE TO THE FUND FOR GENERAL RELIEF PURPOSES, HE SAID.

THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE IS CHAIRED BY THE CHIEF SECRETARY. OTHER MEMBERS ARE MS ROSANNA WONG, DR RAYMOND CH'IEN, MRS ELSIE TU, MR HUI YIN-FAT, THE SECRETARY FOR HEALTH AND WELFARE AND THE SECRETARY FOR THE TREASURY.

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STEPPED-UP MEASURES AGAINST CHOLERA
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THE GOVERNMENT HAS STEPPED UP VARIOUS MEASURES TO CONTROL CHOLERA IN HONG KONG.

THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF HEALTH AND CHAIRMAN OF THE INTERDEPARTMENTAL COORDINATING COMMITTEE ON THE CONTROL OF CHOLERA, DR PAUL SAW, STATED THIS AT A PRESS CONFERENCE HELD TODAY (SATURDAY).

HE SAID: "THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH HAS ESTABLISHED AN EFFECTIVE DISEASE SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM TO MONITOR COMMUNICABLE DISEASES CLOSELY.

"A CLUSTER OF FIVE CASES OF CHOLERA WAS NOTIFIED SINCE LATE JUNE. THOROUGH INVESTIGATION WAS IMMEDIATELY CARRIED OUT AFTER NOTIFICATION OF THE FIRST CASE.

"A WATER SAMPLE TAKEN FROM A FISH TANK IN A SEAFOOD RESTAURANT IN SOUTHERN DISTRICT WAS FOUND TO CONTAIN CHOLERA BACTERIA YESTERDAY AFTERNOON AND IMMEDIATE ACTION HAS BEEN TAKEN.

"ON THE ADVICE OF THE HEALTH STAFF, THE RESTAURANT OPERATOR VOLUNTARILY SURRENDERED ALL THE SEAFOOD FOR DESTRUCTION AND CLEANSED ALL THE FISH TANKS AND OTHER AREAS IN THE RESTAURANT.

"A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE INTER-DEPARTMENTAL CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE ON THE CONTROL OF CHOLERA WAS HELD THIS MORNING TO CONSIDER ADDITIONAL CONTROL MEASURES.

"HEALTH INSPECTORS WOULD STEP UP INSPECTIONS OF LICENSED FOOD PREMISES AND TAKE ACTION AGAINST ILLEGAL FOOD HAWKERS."

RESTAURANT OPERATORS MUST NOT USE SEA WATER TAKEN FROM POLLUTED AREAS SUCH AS TYPHOON SHELTERS AND THE VICINITY OF SEWAGE OUTFALLS.

"MEANWHILE, GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS ARE ACTIVELY CONSIDERING WAYS TO ENSURE THE QUALITY OF SEA WATER FOR KEEPING LIVE FISH."

DR SAW STRESSED THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH WOULD CONTINUE DISEASE SURVEILLANCE AND INTENSIFY THE TESTING OF FOOD AND WATER SAMPLES.

HE ADDED: "SOME PATIENTS HAD PATRONISED THE FOOD SAMPANS IN THE ABERDEEN TYPHOON SHELTER. A JOINT OPERATION WAS CARRIED OUT BY THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT AND THE MARINE DEPARTMENT ON JUNE 30 TO STOP THE SALE OF PERISHABLE FOOD ON THESE SAMPANS. CLEANSING OF THE IDENTIFIED SAMPANS WERE CARRIED OUT DURING THE OPERATION."

DR SAW URGED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO OBSERVE GOOD PERSONAL, ENVIRONMENTAL AND FOOD HYGIENE TO PREVENT DIARRHOEAL DISEASES.

HE SAID: "SEAFOOD SHOULD BE THOROUGHLY COOKED. CROSS-CONTAMINATION OF RAW AND COOKED FOOD SHOULD BE AVOIDED."

"PEOPLE SUFFERING FROM ACUTE DIARRHOEA SHOULD SEEK EARLY MEDICAL TREATMENT. CHOLERA IS READILY TREATABLE.

"IN HONG KONG, THE NECESSARY PREVENTIVE MEASURES ARE WELL IN PLACE AND THE HEALTH CARE FACILITIES ARE ADEQUATE AND EASILY ACCESSIBLE.

"VACCINATION AGAINST CHOLERA AND RESTRICTIONS ON TRAVEL ARE INEFFECTIVE MEASURES TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF CHOLERA," HE SAID.

SO FAR THIS YEAR, NINE CASES OF CHOLERA HAVE BEEN NOTIFIED.

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846,000 VOTER REGISTRATION FORMS RECEIVED

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IN RESPONSE TO PRESS ENQUIRIES, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE REGISTRATION AND ELECTORAL OFFICE SAID TODAY (SATURDAY) THAT ABOUT 846,000 VOTER REGISTRATION FORMS WERE RECEIVED DURING THE THREE-MONTH CAMPAIGN WHICH ENDED AT MIDNIGHT YESTERDAY.

ABOUT 60 PER CENT ARE ESTIMATED TO BE APPLICATIONS FOR NEW ELECTORS.

OTHER DETAILS ARE NOT YET AVAILABLE AT THE MOMENT.

HE EXPECTED THAT A DETAILED ANALYSIS WOULD BE COMPLETED LATER IN THE MONTH.

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VOTE AT DISTRICT BOARD POLLS: SHA

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THE SECRETARY FOR HOME AFFAIRS, MR MICHAEL SUEN, TODAY (SATURDAY) CALLED ON ALL ELIGIBLE VOTERS TO CAST THEIR BALLOTS IN SEPTEMBER'S DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS.

HE PARTICULARLY APPEALED TO THOSE AGED BETWEEN 18 AND 21 TO EXERCISE THEIR VOTING RIGHTS.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE CIVIC EDUCATION EXHIBITION THIS AFTERNOON, MR SUEN SAID THE GOVERNMENT HAD SO FAR RECEIVED 846,000 REGISTRATION FORMS AND OVER 40 PER CENT OF THE 200,000 ELIGIBLE PEOPLE AGED UNDER 21 HAD RESPONDED TO THE REGISTRATION CALL.

PLEASED WITH THE MATURITY AND COMMITMENT SHOWN BY THESE NEW VOTERS, HE, NEVERTHELESS, CONTENDED THAT THIS WAS ONLY THE FIRST STEP IN THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS.

"REAL POWER AND INFLUENCE COMES WITH EXERCISING THE RIGHT TO VOTE," MR SUEN SAID.

HE ADDED: "IT IS A VALUABLE OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO EXERT AN IMPACT ON THE COMMUNITY: TO HAVE A SAY IN HOW OUR WAY OF LIFE AND LIFESTYLE SHOULD DEVELOP.

/"IN VOTING,

"IN VOTING, WE MAKE A CONSCIOUS CHOICE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE GOVERNMENT PROCESS.

"WE WILL BE CHOOSING PEOPLE NOT ONLY TO REPRESENT US, BUT ALSO TO SERVE US."

NOTING THAT FOR THE FIRST TIME IN ITS HISTORY HONG KONG WILL HAVE A FULLY-ELECTED REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT, MR SUEN DESCRIBED IT AS AN IMPORTANT STEP TO TAKE.

STRESSING THE IMPORTANCE OF THE DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS ON SEPTEMBER 18, HE SAID THE BOARDS REPRESENTED THE BASIC LEVEL OF THE REPRESENTATIVE SYSTEM.

UNDERTAKING A VARIETY OF COMMUNITY PROJECTS SUCH AS ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT AND CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES, THE 18 DISTRICT BOARDS TO BE SET UP ARE IN A GOOD POSITION TO RESPOND TO LOCAL NEEDS.

MOREOVER, HE NOTED, SINCE THE ELECTED BOARD MEMBERS WILL FORM AN ELECTION COMMITTEE TO RETURN 10 LEGISLATORS IN 1995, THEY WILL CONTINUE TO PLAY AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT IN THE TERRITORY.

TURNING TO THE COMMITTEE ON THE PROMOTION OF CIVIC EDUCATION, MR SUEN PRAISED THE BODY FOR ESTABLISHING A REPUTATION FOR THE QUALITY AND STANDARD OF ITS WORK SINCE ITS INCEPTION IN 1986.

HE ALSO SAID A HUMAN RIGHTS EDUCATION UNIT WOULD BE SET UP UNDER THE COMMITTEE AND \$20 MILLION WOULD BE INJECTED OVER THE NEXT THREE YEARS TO ENABLE IT TO MEET THE CHALLENGES OF PROMOTING CIVIC EDUCATION IN GENERAL AND HUMAN RIGHTS EDUCATION IN PARTICULAR.

THE EXHIBITION AT THE SPECIAL EXHIBITION HALL, HONG KONG SCIENCE MUSEUM IN TSIM SHA TSUI EAST INCLUDES PANEL DISPLAYS, VIDEO SHOWS, GAMES STALLS, DRAMAS, A "TIME TUNNEL" TRACING THE DEVELOPMENT OF HUMAN RIGHTS CONCEPT AND ALSO FEATURES WINNING ENTRIES IN THE OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION PROJECT AWARD.

THE WINNING PRESENTATIONS COME FROM: (FIRST PRIZE) "ESSENCE OF ELECTIONS AND THE RULE OF LAW" BY MINZHU DAXUE; (FIRST RUNNER-UP) "HOW TO CONVENE AND PARTICIPATE IN SMALL GROUP MEETINGS" BY THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG'S FACULTY OF EDUCATION, JOINTLY WITH CHUNG TAI EDUCATIONAL PRESS; AND (SECOND RUNNER-UP) "YOUTH AWARENESS MOVEMENT" BY THE HONG KONG FEDERATION OF YOUTH GROUPS' MEI LAM CENTRE.

NORTHEAST NT LANDFILL CONTRACT AWARDED

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THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DEPARTMENT HAS AWARDED THE CONTRACT OF THE NORTHEAST NEW TERRITORIES LANDFILL TO FAR EAST LANDFILL TECHNOLOGIES LIMITED, A CONSORTIUM COMPRISING FRENCH WASTE MANAGEMENT CONTRACTOR SITA, NEW WORLD DEVELOPMENT LIMITED AND GUANGDONG ENTERPRISES (HOLDINGS) LIMITED.

SITUATED IN AN UNINHABITED VALLEY NEXT TO WONG MAU HANG SHAN IN TA KWU LING ON THE NORTHEASTERN PART OF THE NEW TERRITORIES, THE LANDFILL IS THE LAST OF THE THREE STRATEGIC LANDFILLS TO BE DEVELOPED FOR THE LONG-TERM WASTE MANAGEMENT OF HONG KONG.

THE ACTING ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, MR JOHN ROCKEY, SAID: "ITS OPERATION WILL PROVIDE A LARGE-SCALE ENVIRONMENTAL-FRIENDLY DISPOSAL GROUND FOR MUNICIPAL AND CONSTRUCTION WASTE IN NORTHEAST NEW TERRITORIES FOLLOWING THE CLOSURE OF SHUEN WAN LANDFILL IN 1995."

"STATE-OF-THE-ART TECHNIQUES WILL BE USED TO PREVENT LEACHING OF CONTAMINATED WATER INTO THE GROUND WATER, AND LANDFILL GAS MANAGEMENT SYSTEM WILL BE INSTALLED TO COLLECT LANDFILL GAS FOR UTILISATION.

"AIR, NOISE AND GROUND WATER QUALITY WITHIN THE LANDFILL AND IN ITS NEIGHBOURHOOD WILL BE CONTINUOUSLY MONITORED WITH A VIEW TO ENSURING HIGH ENVIRONMENTAL STANDARDS," HE SAID.

SIMILAR TO THE OTHER TWO STRATEGIC LANDFILLS, THIS \$2.3 BILLION CONTRACT ADOPTED A DESIGN-BUILD-OPERATE ARRANGEMENT UNDER WHICH THE CONTRACTOR WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF THE LANDFILL AS WELL AS FOR ITS RESTORATION AND AFTERCARE.

THE OVERALL CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT WILL BE TAKEN UP BY THE DEPARTMENT WHO WILL ENSURE PROPER DISCHARGE OF THE CONTRACTOR'S DUTIES.

THE LANDFILL WILL BE DESIGNED TO RECEIVE A MINIMUM OF 35 MILLION TONNES OF WASTE FROM BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE WASTE COLLECTORS AND IS EXPECTED TO RECEIVE ITS FIRST LOAD OF WASTE IN JULY 1995.

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PAMPHLETS EXPLAIN CHILD CARE CENTRE FEE ASSISTANCE

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MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHOSE CHILDREN ARE ENROLLED IN CHILD CARE CENTRES INCLUDING DAY CRECHES AND DAY NURSERIES ARE INVITED TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

TO HELP THEM APPLY, THE DEPARTMENT HAS PRODUCED A PAMPHLET ENTITLED "FEE ASSISTANCE SCHEME FOR CHILD CARE CENTRES".

"THIS PAMPHLET OUTLINES THE CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH THEY MAY BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE ASSISTANCE AND THE APPLICATION PROCEDURES," A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

"TO BE QUALIFIED FOR FEE ASSISTANCE, A CHILD IN A CHILD CARE CENTRE MUST BE AGED BELOW SIX YEARS," HE SAID.

"PARENTS OR GUARDIANS WHO WISH TO APPLY MUST DEMONSTRATE THAT THEY CANNOT AFFORD THE FULL COST OF THE FEES CHARGED.

"THEY MUST ALSO DEMONSTRATE THAT THEY ARE UNABLE TO PROVIDE ADEQUATE CARE FOR THEIR CHILDREN AT HOME DURING THE DAY, FOR REASONS SUCH AS BOTH PARENTS HAVING TO WORK TO EARN A LIVING, THE CHILD BELONGING TO A SINGLE-PARENT FAMILY OR FAMILY WITH PRESENCE OF AN AGED OR DISABLED MEMBER WHO NEEDS SPECIAL CARE," THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

APPLICATIONS MAY BE MADE THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, BUT SHOULD PREFERABLY BE LODGED THREE MONTHS BEFORE THE DATE OF THE CHILD'S ADMISSION TO A CHILD CARE CENTRE.

HOWEVER, STAFF FROM THE SOCIAL SECURITY FIELD UNITS WILL, FROM JUNE TO AUGUST, GO TO THE CHILD CARE CENTRES TO HELP THE PARENTS PROCESS APPLICATIONS FOR FEE ASSISTANCE IN BATCHES.

APPLICANTS WHO HAVE ENQUIRIES ABOUT THE FEE ASSISTANCE SCHEME CAN APPROACH THEIR RESPECTIVE SOCIAL SECURITY FIELD UNITS OR CONTACT THE CHILD CARE CENTRE ADVISORY INSPECTORATE ON TEL 836 3114.

COPIES OF THE PAMPHLET, IN BOTH ENGLISH AND CHINESE, CAN NOW BE OBTAINED FROM CHILD CARE CENTRES, SOCIAL SECURITY FIELD UNITS OF THE DEPARTMENT AND ALL DISTRICT OFFICES OF THE CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION.
