GROUP LEAVES FOR PEKING
* * *

DR DAVID WILSON AND THREE MEMBERS OF THE WORKING GROUP SET UP TO CONSIDER DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE FUTURE OF HONG KONG LEFT FOR PEKING THIS (WEDNESDAY) AFTERNOON.

THE THREE MEMBERS ARE MR ROBIN MCLAREN, POLITICAL ADVISER, MR FRED BURROWS, LEGAL ADVISER, FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH AFFAIRS OFFICE, AND MR GERALD NAZARETH, LAW DRAFTSMAN.

FOLLOWING IS THE TEXT OF DR WILSON'S REMARKS TO REPORTERS AT KAI TAK AIRPORT:

+AS YOU KNOW, WE'RE GOING UP TO PEKING THIS AFTERNOON. THERE ARE THREE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE BRITISH TEAM GOING UP WITH ME -- MR MCLAREN, MR NAZARETH AND MR BURROWS. WE'LL BE MET IN PEKING BY ANOTHER MEMBER OF THE BRITISH TEAM, MR EHRMAN. WE ARE ALSO TAKING UP WITH US MR Y.P. CHENG AS INTERPRETER.

+I AM VERY PLEASED TO HAVE THIS CHANCE TO BE BACK IN HONG KONG MYSELF FOR A FEW DAYS. IT'S BEEN VERY NICE TO RECOVER FROM JET LAG. IT ALSO GAVE ME A VERY GOOD OPPORTUNITY TO TALK TO PEOPLE HERE. WE'VE HAD SOME VERY GOOD DISCUSSIONS WITH PEOPLE IN HONG KONG IN PREPARATION FOR OUR WORK IN PEKING, AND WE HAD SOME FURTHER DISCUSSIONS THIS MORNING IN THE SECRETARIAT WITH SENIOR OFFICIALS.

+I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO MEETING AMBASSADOR KE ZAISHUO IN PEKING. WE EXPECT TO START WORK TOMORROW. OUR TASK IS TO CONSIDER THE DOCUMENTS SUBMITTED BY BOTH SIDES IN THE NEGOTIATIONS.

+WE'LL BE WORKING FULL TIME BETWEEN THE ROUNDS OF THE MAIN NEGOTIATIONS. SO I EXPECT WE'RE GOING TO BE FAIRLY BUSY OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS. I HOPE THAT THE WORKING TEAM WILL BE ABLE TO MAKE A POSITIVE CONTRIBUTION TO THE WORK OF THE MAIN NEGOTIATING TEAMS.

+I SHOULD PERHAPS SAY PARTICULARLY HERE THAT THE WORKING GROUP IS VERY MUCH A BACK-ROOM ORGANISATION. SO I AM AFRAID THERE WON'T BE VERY MUCH TO SAY TO YOUR COLLEAGUES WHILE WE ARE UP IN PEKING.

+THE OVERALL CONDUCT OF THE NEGOTIATIONS REMAINS IN THE HANDS OF THE TWO CHAIRMEN OF THE DELEGATIONS -- AMBASSADOR SIR RICHARD EVANS AND ASSISTANT FOREIGN MINISTER ZHOU NAN.

+IF THERE IS ANYTHING TO SAY ABOUT THE CONDUCT OF THE MAIN NEGOTIATIONS, IT WILL BE OF COURSE FOR THEM TO SAY AFTER THE MAIN NEGOTIATING ROUNDS. THANK YOU VERY MUCH.+

WORKING GROUP TO STUDY REPORT ON TSING YI ISLAND
* * *

IT WAS DECIDED AT THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEETING THIS MORNING THAT A WORKING GROUP BE SET UP UNDER THE SECRETARY FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, DAVID AKERS-JONES, TO STUDY A CONSULTANT'S REPORT ON TSING YI ISLAND, AND REPORT BACK WITHIN THREE MONTHS. THE WORKING GROUP WILL HAVE ITS FIRST MEETING THIS WEEK.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN STRESSED THAT THE SAFETY STANDARDS ON THE ISLAND WERE WITHIN INTERNATIONALLY RECOGNISED LEVELS AND THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL HAD ACCEPTED THIS AFTER STUDYING THE REPORT ON THE SITUATION, AND THERE WAS NO PARTICULAR CAUSE FOR ALARM.

HE SAID, HOWEVER, A BORDERLINE CASE OF RISK HAD BEEN IDENTIFIED AND THE WORKING GROUP HAD BEEN SET UP TO EXAMINE ALL POSSIBLE MEASURES TO IMPROVE THE SITUATION IN THIS PARTICULAR CASE.

THE SPOKESMAN EMPHASISED THAT A GREAT DEAL HAD ALREADY BEEN DONE WHICH WOULD ENHANCE SAFETY AND REDUCE RISKS.

PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS WERE IN HAND TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO AND FROM THE ISLAND, AND COMPLETE THE CIRCULAR ROAD AND PRESSURISED WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM.

SAFETY MEASURES HAD BEEN AND WERE BEING CONSIDERED WITH OPERATORS OF INDUSTRIAL INSTALLATIONS AND MANY SUCH MEASURES HAD BEEN INTRODUCED ALREADY.

MEMBERS OF THE TSUEN WAN DISTRICT BOARD HAVE BEEN INFORMED OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL'S DECISION AND WILL BE CONSULTED BY THE WORKING GROUP.

THE VIEWS OF OTHER INTERESTED PARTIES WILL ALSO BE CONSIDERED.

PRIMARY ONE PLACES TO BE ANNOUNCED

THE CENTRAL ALLOCATION OF PRIMARY ONE PLACES FOR SEPTEMBER THIS YEAR, UNDER THE PRIMARY ONE ADMISSION SYSTEM, WILL BE ANNOUNCED ON SATURDAY (JUNE 23), A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SAID.

OUT OF THE 32 073 CHILDREN TAKING PART IN THE CENTRAL ALLOCATION, 21 792 CHILDREN OR 67.9 PER CENT WILL BE GIVEN PLACES IN SCHOOLS OF THEIR PARENTS' FIRST THREE CHOICES.

PARENTS CONCERNED ARE REQUESTED TO GO BACK TO THE DISTRIBUTION-COLLECTION CENTRE IN THEIR RESPECTIVE DISTRICTS ON SATURDAY OR SUNDAY (JUNE 24) BETWEEN 9 AM AND 4 PM TO COLLECT THE ALLOCATION SLIP.

THE SLIP WILL CONTAIN THE NAME AND ADDRESS OF THE SCHOOL IN WHICH PLACES HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED TO THEIR CHILDREN, TOGETHER WITH THE DATES FOR REGISTRATION.

IT WILL ALSO TELL PARENTS TO BRING THEIR CHILDREN TO THE RESPECTIVE SCHOOLS TO COMPLETE REGISTRATION FORMALITIES ON JUNE 27 OR 28.

HOWEVER, THE SPOKESMAN REMINDED PARENTS OF CHILDREN WHO HAVE SECURED A DISCRETIONARY PLACE AND WHO HAD ALREADY REGISTERED WITH A SCHOOL IN DECEMBER LAST YEAR, THAT THEY NEED NOT REPEAT REGISTRATION FORMALITIES.

FOR A.M. SCHOOLS, THE REGISTRATION HOURS WILL BE FROM 9 AM TO 12 NOON. FOR P.M. SCHOOLS, THEY WILL BE FROM 2 PM TO 5 PM, WHEREAS FOR WHOLE-DAY SCHOOLS THE REGISTRATION HOURS WILL BE FROM 9 AM TO 12 NOON AND FROM 2 PM TO 4 PM.

PARENTS WHO FOR PERSONAL REASONS CANNOT REGISTER THEIR CHILDREN WITH THE SCHOOLS ON JUNE 27 OR 28 MUST CONTACT THE SCHOOLS OR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT'S PRIMARY ONE ADMISSION UNIT BEFOREHAND FOR ALTERNATIVE ARRANGEMENTS. THE UNIT IS LOCATED AT LUI KEE EDUCATION SERVICES CENTRE AT 269 QUEEN'S ROAD EAST, 2/F.

PARENTS WHO FAILED TO DO SO WOULD BE DEEMED TO HAVE GIVEN UP THE PLACES ALLOCATED.

THE SPOKESMAN STRESSED THAT ALL PLACES ALLOCATED ARE FINAL AND NO RE-ALLOCATION IS POSSIBLE.

HOWEVER, IF PARENTS HAVE MOVED TO ANOTHER DISTRICT AND HAVE GENUINE DIFFICULTY IN SENDING THEIR CHILDREN TO SCHOOL, THEY CAN SEEK ASSISTANCE FROM THE PRIMARY ONE ADMISSION UNIT.

IN DOING SO, THEY SHOULD BRING ALONG SUPPORTING DOCUMENTARY PROOF SUCH AS RENT RECEIPTS, RATES DEMAND NOTES, WATER BILLS OR ELECTRICITY BILLS BEARING THE NAME OF THE CHILDREN'S PARENTS OR GUARDIANS.

IF THEIR REQUESTS ARE JUSTIFIED, THE PRIMARY ONE ADMISSION UNIT WILL TRY TO FIND PLACES FOR THEIR CHILDREN AT A SCHOOL NEARER TO THEIR NEW HOME, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THREE DISTRICT BOARDS MEET THIS WEEK
* * * *

A PROPOSAL TO SET UP A DAY RELIEF CENTRE FOR STREET SLEEPERS IN YAU MA TEI WILL BE DISCUSSED AT THE LOCAL DISTRICT BOARD MEETING ON FRIDAY (JUNE 22) AFTERNOON.

THREE SITES HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED IN THE DISTRICT FOR THE PROPOSED CENTRE: THE FORMER PREMISES OF THE YAU MA TEI KAIFONG WELFARE ASSOCIATION AT THE JUNCTION OF FERRY STREET AND SAIGON STREET, A THREE-STOREY BUILDING AT NOS. 292-294 RECLAMATION STREET, AND A VACANT SITE AT THE JUNCTION OF FERRY STREET AND WATERLOO ROAD.

AT THE MEETING, MEMBERS WILL ALSO BE BRIEFED ON THE EXISTING HAWKER POLICY, THE DISTRICT STRATEGY FOR 1984-87, AND THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SUBWAY AT THE JUNCTION OF FERRY STREET AND JORDAN ROAD.

INFORMATION PAPERS ON: THE GRADUAL INTRODUCTION OF A TRAFFIC CONTROL SYSTEM, THE CONVERSION OF CROWN LAND LICENCES TO SHORT TERM TENANCIES, TERMS OF REFERENCE OF THE BROADCASTING REVIEW BOARD, AND PROVISION OF HOUSING ACCOMMODATION FOR BEDSPACE LODGERS IN THE DISTRICT, WILL BE TABLED FOR MEMBERS' DISCUSSION.

IN THE MORNING, SAI KUNG DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS WILL BE BRIEFED ON THE PROPOSED NEW ROADWORKS IN AP TSAI PENINSULA AND YAU YUE WAN IN JUNK BAY AT THEIR MEETING.

THE NEW ROADS ARE TO PROVIDE VEHICULAR AND PEDESTRIAN ACCESS TO THE YAU YUE WAN VILLAGE RESITE AREA, THE PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES AND OTHER NEW DEVELOPMENTS AT THE HEAD OF JUNK BAY.

MEMBERS WILL ALSO BE BRIEFED ON THE PROPOSED ACCESS ROADS AT PAK KONG VALLEY AND HO CHUNG VALLEY.

TOMORROW (THURSDAY), NORTH DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS WILL REVIEW THE YEAR-LONG +MEET THE PUBLIC+ SCHEME AT THEIR MEETING.

OTHER ITEMS ON THE AGENDA WILL INCLUDE PROGRESS REPORTS ON THE BOARD'S COMMITTEES AND A BI-MONTHLY FINANCIAL STATEMENT.

\$233M HOUSING TENDER APPROVED
* * * *

A SECOND RENTAL PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATE IS TO RISE ON THE ISLET OF AP LEI CHAU OFF ABERDEEN, TO PROVIDE MODERN HOMES FOR 37 000 MORE PEOPLE BY 1988.

CONSTRUCTION WORK WILL BEGIN SHORTLY FOR THE FIRST PHASE OF THE LEI TUNG ESTATE UNDER A KING-SIZED TENDER, VALUED AT \$233.5 MILLION, JUST APPROVED BY THE HOUSING AUTHORITY'S BUILDING COMMITTEE.

+FOUR 35-STOUREY TRIDENT BLOCKS WILL BE BUILT IN THE FIRST PHASE TO HOUSE 15 000 PEOPLE IN 4 020 MODERN FLATS BY 1986,+ SAID A SPOKESMAN FOR THE AUTHORITY TODAY.

OTHER WORKS WILL INCLUDE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A PRIMARY SCHOOL, A COMMERCIAL CENTRE, A MARKET AND CARPARK BUILDING, AS WELL AS A COMMUNITY HALL WITH PARKING FACILITIES.

LEI TUNG ESTATE WILL BE DEVELOPED IN THREE PHASES ON A 16-HECTARE SITE NEAR THE AP LEI CHAU BRIDGE.

WHEN COMPLETED, IT WILL BECOME A SELF-CONTAINED COMMUNITY WITH EIGHT RENTAL AND SEVEN HOME OWNERSHIP BLOCKS, PLUS A WIDE RANGE OF FACILITIES.

THE FIRST PUBLIC HOUSING PROJECT ON AP LEI CHAU, NAMED AFTER THE ISLET, WAS COMPLETED IN 1982 AND HOUSES 19 000 PEOPLE.

EX-GRATIA PAYMENT SCHEME NOT TO BE EXTENDED
* * *

THE MARKETS AND STREET TRADERS SELECT COMMITTEE OF THE URBAN COUNCIL DECIDED AT ITS MEETING TODAY (WEDNESDAY) NOT TO EXTEND THE EX-GRATIA PAYMENT SCHEME FOR LICENSEES OF ON-STREET COOKED FOOD STALLS.

THIS IS BECAUSE THE SCHEME HAS FULFILLED THE OBJECTIVES FOR WHICH IT WAS DESIGNED.

DURING THE MEETING CHAIRED BY MR SHUM CHOI-SANG, MEMBERS EVALUATED THE SCHEME IN GREAT DETAIL.

THE CONSENSUS OF OPINION WAS THAT OPERATORS OF ON-STREET COOKED FOOD STALLS WERE FULLY AWARE OF THE SCHEME AND IF THEY HAD NOT TAKEN ADVANTAGE OF IT BEFORE ITS EXPIRY, THEY WERE UNLIKELY TO JOIN IT NOW.

/THE SCHEME:

THE SCHEME, INTRODUCED IN JUNE LAST YEAR TO INDUCE LICENSED COOKED FOOD STALL OPERATORS TO VOLUNTARILY SURRENDER THEIR LICENCES IN EXCHANGE FOR \$36 000, EXPIRED AT THE END OF LAST MONTH.

DURING THE 12-MONTH PERIOD, 307 LICENSEES OUT OF A TOTAL OF 797 HAD SURRENDERED THEIR LICENCES FOR CANCELLATION.

SO FAR SOME 280 STALLS HAVE BEEN DEMOLISHED, THUS IMPROVING SIGNIFICANTLY THE ENVIRONMENTAL AND TRAFFIC CONDITIONS IN THE AREAS WHERE THEY WERE PREVIOUSLY LOCATED.

+THE MOST NOTABLE EXAMPLE IS THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT WHICH IS NOW COMPLETELY FREE OF ON-STREET COOKED FOOD STALLS,+ A COUNCIL SPOKESMAN SAID.

+OTHER STREETS, SUCH AS GOUGH STREET, KAU U FONG, WING LOK LANE, HOLLYWOOD ROAD, SHIP STREET, TAI WONG STREET AND WUN SHA STREET, ARE ALSO RID OF SUCH STALLS.+

THE SPOKESMAN SAID ACTION WILL BE TAKEN TO RE-GROUP THE REMAINING ON-STREET COOKED FOOD STALLS SO AS TO MINIMISE THE NUISANCES THEY CAUSE TO THE PUBLIC.

THEY WERE BRIEFED BY THE DIRECTOR OF INDUSTRY, MR JOHN YAXLEY, AND REPRESENTATIVES OF THE FEDERATION OF HONG KONG INDUSTRIES, THE CHINESE MANUFACTURERS ASSOCIATION, THE HONG KONG PRODUCTIVITY CENTRE AND THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC.

RATEPAYERS REMINDED

RATEPAYERS ARE REMINDED THAT RATES FOR THE THIRD QUARTER OF 1984 MUST BE PAID ON OR BEFORE JULY 31.

DEMAND NOTES WERE BEING SENT TO ALL RATEPAYERS STARTING FROM TODAY, A TREASURY SPOKESMAN SAID.

+THE DEMANDS MUST BE PAID IN FULL, WHETHER OR NOT OBJECTIONS HAVE BEEN LODGED AGAINST THE NEW RATEABLE VALUES NOTIFIED TO RATEPAYERS IN MARCH THIS YEAR,+ HE SAID.

HE SAID OBJECTIONS RECEIVED BY THE DEPARTMENT WERE BEING STUDIED AND NO DECISIONS WERE LIKELY UNTIL AUGUST AND IN SOME CASES, UNTIL THE END OF THE YEAR.

SHOULD A DECISION BE MADE TO REDUCE THE RATES PAYABLE, A REFUND WOULD BE MADE.

+BECAUSE OF THE RATES RELIEF SCHEME, EVEN IF A REDUCTION IN RATEABLE VALUE IS MADE, THIS WILL NOT, IN MANY CASES, AFFECT THE AMOUNT OF RATES PAYABLE THIS YEAR,+ HE SAID.

AIR-CONDITIONING FOR MORSE PARK COURTS

TWO CONTRACTS TOTALLING \$462 000 HAVE BEEN AWARDED FOR AIR-CONDITIONING AND ELECTRICAL WORKS AT THE SQUASH AND TENNIS COURTS BEING BUILT AT MORSE PARK, WONG TAI SIN.

THE AIR-CONDITIONING CONTRACT VALUED AT \$122 000 HAS BEEN AWARDED TO GILMAN ENGINEERING LIMITED.

WORK WILL START IN MID-AUGUST AND BE COMPLETED IN SEVEN MONTHS.

THE \$340 000 CONTRACT FOR THE ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS, HAS BEEN AWARDED TO IU CHEONG ELECTRIC COMPANY LIMITED.

WORK WILL BEGIN TOMORROW (THURSDAY) AND BE COMPLETED IN MARCH NEXT YEAR.

A \$3.8 MILLION BUILDING CONTRACT FOR THE THREE SQUASH AND SIX TENNIS COURTS HAD BEEN AWARDED LAST MONTH BY THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT.

THE SQUASH COURTS WILL HAVE STANDS FOR 120 SPECTATORS AND THE TENNIS COURTS WILL BE FLOODLIT.

THE CONTRACT ALSO INCLUDES CONSTRUCTION OF A SERVICE BUILDING WITH SOLAR-HEATED CHANGING ROOMS, TOILETS AND STOREROOM.

A PRELIMINARY AMATEUR SINGING CONTEST WILL BE HELD IN SOUTHERN DISTRICT ON SATURDAY (JUNE 23) TO SELECT A PERFORMER TO TAKE PART IN A TERRITORY-WIDE CONTEST.

TWELVE YOUNG SINGERS CHOSEN FROM MORE THAN 200 ENTRANTS IN THE DISTRICT THROUGH A SERIES OF AUDITIONS, WILL COMPETE.

CONTEST JUDGES WILL BE THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MR K.C. KWONG; A COMPOSER, MR CHIU MAN-HOI; AND REPRESENTATIVES FROM RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG, SING TAO NEWSPAPERS LIMITED AND POLYGRAM RECORDS COMPANY.

GUEST PERFORMERS AT THE CONTEST, TO BE HELD IN THE AP LEI CHAU COMMUNITY HALL STARTING AT 8 PM, WILL BE SINGER MISS LAU YING-HUNG, AND PUPILS FROM THE TANG SHIU KIN PRIMARY SCHOOL.

A QUIZ ON DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION WILL ALSO BE HELD DURING THE CONTEST AND GIFT COUPONS WILL BE AWARDED TO THREE WINNERS.

JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE 18 DISTRICT OFFICES, RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG AND THE SING TAO NEWSPAPERS LIMITED, THE TERRITORY-WIDE AMATEUR SINGING CONTEST IS BEING ORGANISED AS PART OF AN EFFORT TO ENCOURAGE MORE RESIDENTS TO REGISTER AS VOTERS FOR NEXT YEAR'S DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS.
