PROBLEMS OF 'EDUCATING FOR TOMORROW'S WORLD'
* * * *

+THERE IS NO PROBLEM EDUCATING FOR YESTERDAY'S WORLD. EDUCATING FOR TOMORROW'S WORLD IS A MUCH HARDER TASK,+ SAID MR KENNETH TOPLEY, SECRETARY FOR EDUCATION (DESIGNATE), SPEAKING AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATION FOR SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS EDUCATION TODAY.

MR TOPLEY EMPHASISED THE DIFFICULTY OF DEVELOPING A CURRICULUM WHICH HELPS PUPILS TO LIVE IN A WORLD WHICH DOES NOT YET EXIST.

+WE HAVE NO WAY OF KNOWING THE FUTURE+ HE SAID.

+IF THE PRESENT RATE OF CHANGE CONTINUES, HOWEVER, BOTH IN SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AND CONSEQUENTLY IN THE EVERY DAY ARRANGEMENTS FOR LIVING, THEN EACH OF US WILL NEED A STRONG MORAL CENTRE AND A WELL DEVELOPED UNDERSTANDING OF SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNOLOGICAL PROCESSES IN ORDER TO SURVIVE IN THAT WORLD WITH A DEGREE OF EQUANIMITY.+

MR TOPLEY WENT ON TO PROPOSE THAT ATTENTION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO PROBLEMS OF CHOICE.

+HOW DO WE CHOOSE,+ HE ASKED, +BETWEEN TAKING UP TENNIS AND SITTING ON ANOTHER COMMITTEE?+.

IT WOULD BE GOOD IF WE COULD ARRIVE AT FURTHER INSIGHTS INTO HOW PEOPLE, VERY DIFFERENT FROM OURSELVES, ACTUALLY THOUGHT. THIS WOULD BE A VITAL HELP IN REALLY GETTING ALONG WITH THEM, HE SAID.

TURNING TO THE FIELDS OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, HE SAID THE METHODS AND LANGUAGE OF SCIENCE RATHER THAN THE DOGMAS AND CONCLUSIONS OF SCIENCE WOULD BE VITAL FOR HELPING PEOPLE UNDERSTAND AND MANAGE THEIR ENVIRONMENT. BOTH IN MORALS AND SCIENCE WE WOULD NEED TO CONCENTRATE MORE ON THE QUESTIONS AND LESS ON THE ANSWERS.

+CHILDREN ARE BRIGHT, AND IF WE CAN POINT TO THE QUESTIONS, THEY WILL WORK OUT THE ANSWERS,+ HE SAID.

HE CONGRATULATED THE ASSOCIATION ON THEIR WORK IN ENRICHING THE SYLLABUS AND DEVELOPING THE MINDS AND SKILLS OF TEACHERS.

+YOU HAVE SEEN CLEARLY THAT CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT STARTS WITH THE INDIVIDUAL TEACHER AND THAT IT IS ON HIS UNDERSTANDING AND ENTHUSIASM THAT ALL SOUND DEVELOPMENTS MUST BE BASED,+ HE SAID.

CHILDREN TAKE PRIDE IN ROAD SAFETY PATROL WORK

ROAD SAFETY WAS MORE THAN A SLOGAN FOR URBAN SURVIVAL, MR COLVYN HAYE, DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, TOLD NEARLY A 1 000 MEMBERS OF THE ROAD SAFETY ASSOCIATION, CELEBRATING ITS 18TH ANNIVERSARY ON FRIDAY NIGHT.

+IT IS A DISCIPLINE WHICH IS VERY MUCH NEEDED IN OUR SOCIETY TODAY,+ HE SAID.

CONGRATULATING ALL THOSE ASSOCIATED WITH ROAD SAFETY, MR HAYE SAID THAT THE PRIDE AND BEARING OF CHILDREN IN ROAD SAFETY PATROLS WAS PARTICULARLY NOTE-WORTHY.

AT THE LAST PARADE HE HAD ATTENDED, HUNDREDS OF SCHOOL ROAD SAFETY PATROLS HAD IMPRESSED HIM VERY MUCH AS THEY MARCHED PAST.

+IT WAS VERY EVIDENT THAT THESE SCHOOL CHILDREN, WHO CAME FROM EVERY STRATA OF SOCIETY, HAD A COMMON PRIDE IN WHAT THEY WERE DOING,+ MR HAYE SAID.

NOTING THAT MORE THAN 6 000 SCHOOL CHILDREN WERE INVOLVED IN THE ROAD SAFETY MOVEMENT, MR HAYE SAID IT WAS ALSO NOTE-WORTHY THAT NONE OF THESE CHILDREN HAD EVER BEEN INVOLVED IN INDISCIPLINE IN THEIR SCHOOLS AND IN JUVENILE DELINQUENCY, WHICH WAS A GROWING CONCERN OF THE COURTS.

HEADS OF SCHOOLS HAD CONFIRMED THAT WEARING THE SMART UNIFORM OF THE ROAD SAFETY PATROL AND POLICING STREET CROSSINGS AND CORNERS TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF THEIR FELLOWS, INSTILLED A SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY IN PATROL MEMBERS.

+IT IS THIS SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY THAT KEEPS CHILDREN OUT OF TROUBLE THESE DAYS,+ MR HAYE SAID.

HE PROMISED TO DO EVERYTHING IN HIS POWER TO PROMOTE THE ROAD SAFETY MOVEMENT IN SCHOOLS.

YOUTHS URGED TO JOIN SUMMER ACTIVITIES

THE COMMISSIONER FOR RECREATION AND CULTURE, MR BARRIE WIGGHAM, TODAY (SATURDAY) URGED HONG KONG'S YOUNG PEOPLE TO JOIN THE SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME WHICH, IN ITS 13TH YEAR, +REMAINS THE LARGEST SERIES OF ANNUAL EVENTS FOR YOUTH RECREATION+.

MR WIGGHAM MADE THE APPEAL WHEN HE LAUNCHED THIS YEAR'S SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME AT A CEREMONY IN THE SOUTHOHN STADIUM.

IN HIS OPENING ADDRESS, MR WIGGHAM SAID THAT FROM JULY TO SEPTEMBER, ABOUT 8 000 EVENTS WOULD BE ORGANISED AND THERE WOULD BE SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE.

+MANY OF THESE EVENTS WILL HELP THEM DEVELOP THEIR SKILLS AND INTERESTS, WHILE OTHERS WILL GIVE THEM VALUABLE EXPERIENCE IN GROUP LIVING OR ALLOW THEM TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY IN DIFFERENT WAYS.

+I STRONGLY URGE EVERY YOUTH TO TAKE PART IN THESE HEALTHY RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES,+ HE SAID.

THIS YEAR'S PROGRAMME WILL PROVIDE BOTH INDOOR AND OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES FOR YOUNGSTERS AGED FROM SIX TO 24, ALLOWING THEM TO TAKE PART IN THOSE OF THEIR CHOICE AND, WHILE DOING SO, TO BUILD UP THEIR SELF-CONFIDENCE AND TO GAIN A SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY.

TO COINCIDE WITH THE +INTERNATIONAL YEAR FOR DISABLED PERSONS+, SPECIAL EMPHASIS WILL BE PLACED ON INTEGRATING THE DISABLED INTO SUCH ACTIVITIES BY OFFERING THEM EQUAL RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES AS THE ABLE-BODIED.

AT THE CEREMONY, A CHEQUE FOR \$3 MILLION WAS PRESENTED TO MR F. DE S. OZORIO, CHAIRMAN OF THE CENTRAL CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE FOR YOUTH RECREATION BY THE HON. OSWALD CHEUNG, STEWARD OF THE ROYAL HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB, AS THE CLUB'S CONTRIBUTION TOWARDS THE SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME 1981.

IN ADDITION TO THIS GENEROUS DONATION, THE STEWARDS OF THE JOCKEY CLUB HAVE MADE AVAILABLE \$1 MILLION FOR PERMANENT FACILITIES FOR YOUTH RECREATION THIS YEAR.

ALSO, SCHOLARSHIPS WILL BE AWARDED TO OUTSTANDING YOUTHS WHO PARTICIPATE IN THIS YEAR'S PROGRAMME.

BRING BACK SELF-RELIANCE, SAYS TSUEN WAN TOWN MANAGER
* * * *

THE SELF-MANAGEMENT AND SELF-RELIANCE OF THE OLD RURAL SOCIETY SHOULD BE REVIVED FOR THE BENEFIT OF OUR COMMUNITY, TSUEN WAN TOWN MANAGER, DR JAMES HAYES, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

DR HAYES WAS SPEAKING AT A SEMINAR ABOUT RESCUING THE NEW TERRITORIES PAST, ORGANISED BY THE PENINSULA JAYCEES.

HE SAID THAT FOR THE PAST 30 YEARS, GOVERNMENT HAD DONE MORE AND MORE FOR ITS PEOPLE AND IN SOME RESPECTS EXPECTED TOO LITTLE FROM THEM BY WAY OF FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION AND PERSONAL INVOLVEMENT.

+THIS CAN BREED OVER-RELIANCE ON GOVERNMENT AND AN ATTITUDE OF MIND WHICH BLAMES GOVERNMENT FOR ANY SHORTCOMINGS OR ANYTHING THAT GOES WRONG,+ HE SAID.

HE SAID THE URBAN POPULATION, LIVING UNDER CROWDED CONDITIONS AND WITH FEW CULTURAL ACTIVITIES, HAD VERY LITTLE BACKGROUND TO PROVIDE A CONTEXT TO THEIR LIVES OR GIVE IT ANY PERSPECTIVE.

+THEY NEED ROOTS AND THE REALISATION OF A CONTINUING TRADITION TO HELP THEM LEAD MORE INTERESTING LIVES,+ HE SAID.

BY CONTRAST, THE SOCIAL ORGANISATION OF THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLE OF THE NEW TERRITORIES HAD ALWAYS BEEN STRONG.

VILLAGE LEADERS, THEN AND NOW, TOOK A VERY ACTIVE PART IN SPORTING, CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL PROMOTION AND CONTRIBUTED THEIR TIME, ENERGY AND MONEY TO BUILDING UP COMMUNITY LIFE OF THE NEW TOWNS AND GIVING THEM AN IDENTITY, HE SAID.

+THIS CONTRIBUTION SURELY SPRINGS FROM THEIR ROOTS IN THE PLACE AND FROM THE LONG TRADITION OF SELF-HELP AND SELF-INSTRUCTION IN THE VILLAGE CULTURE THAT HAS DESCENDED TO THEM AND INFLUENCED THEIR LIVES,+ HE SAID.

+WHAT HAS BEEN GOOD FOR THE 6 000 INDIGENOUS PEOPLE OF TSUEN WAN MUST BE GOOD FOR ITS 700 000 INHABITANTS.

+IF ROOTS AND A SENSE OF TRADITION BENEFIT THE OLD TSUEN WAN POPULATION, THEN THE SOONER WE PROVIDE BOTH FOR THE 700 000 THE BETTER.+

DR HAYES ALSO SPOKE ON THE METHODS USED FOR BUILDING UP A LOCAL HISTORY FOR TSUEN WAN, USING STONE INSCRIPTIONS AND RECORDS IN THE HANDS OF LOCAL FAMILIES.

THE OTHER SPEAKER AT THE SEMINAR WAS DR DAVID FAURE OF THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY HISTORY DEPARTMENT. HE HEADS A NEW TERRITORIES HISTORY PROJECT WHICH FIRST CONCENTRATED ON RECOVERING THE TEXTS OF INSCRIPTIONS ON STONE TABLETS LOCATED ALL OVER THE NT AND WHICH IS NOW CARRYING OUT DOCUMENTARY AND ORAL HISTORY WORK IN SHA TIN AND SAI KUNG.

DR FAURE ALSO SUPPLIED A PHOTO EXHIBITION FOR THE SEMINAR AND GAVE AN AUDIO VISUAL PRESENTATION OF SAMPLES OF FOLK CULTURE IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

KMB STARTS NEW SHA TIN BUS ROUTE

THE KOWLOON MOTOR BUS COMPANY WILL START A NEW BUS SERVICE BETWEEN SUN TIN WAI ESTATE AND SHA TIN MARKET ON MONDAY, JUNE 29.

BUSES ON THE SERVICE, ROUTE NO. 81, WILL RUN AT INTERVALS OF 12 AND 20 MINUTES AND TRAVEL VIA SHA KOK ESTATE.

ON THE SAME DAY, KMB ROUTE NO. 79A, PLYING BETWEEN LUEN WO HUI AND PING YEUNG, WILL BE DISCONTINUED.

AS A RESULT, ROUTE NO. 79, WHICH OPERATES BETWEEN SHEUNG SHUI AND TA KWU LING, WILL HAVE ITS FREQUENCY INCREASED TO ONE BUS EVERY 15 MINUTES INSTEAD OF 20 MINUTES AND HAVE ITS CARRYING CAPACITY RAISED FROM 150 TO 220 PASSENGERS.

A TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THIS ARRANGEMENT WOULD ABSORB THE DISPLACED PASSENGER TRAFFIC AND ACHIEVE GREATER OPERATING ECONOMIES.

THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT KOWLOON CITY OFFICE WILL MOVE TO ITS NEW ADDRESS AT HANG CHIEN COURT, 7-9 WAI KING STREET, GROUND FLOOR, WYLER GARDEN, KOWLOON, AS FROM MONDAY, JUNE 29.

THE NEW OFFICE WILL PROVIDE MOST IMMIGRATION SERVICES, SUCH AS ISSUE AND RENEWAL OF TRAVEL DOCUMENTS, ENDORSEMENTS ON PASSPORTS AND OTHER TRAVEL DOCUMENTS, EXTENSION OF STAY AND VISAS FOR RE-ENTRY TO HONG KONG (EXCEPT THOSE ENTRANTS FROM CHINA), AND VISAS TO UK AND SOME COMMONWEALTH COUNTRIES.

THE PRESENT KOWLOON CITY OFFICE AT NAM KOK ROAD WILL BE CLOSED AS FROM THE SAME DATE, A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

PRISONERS GET TIME-OFF FOR SAVING DROWNING MAN

THE ACTING GOVERNOR, SIR JACK CATER HAS REDUCED PART OF THE SENTENCES BEING SERVED BY THREE PRISONERS, IN RECOGNITION OF THEIR PUBLIC-SPIRITED ACTION IN RESCUING A MAN FROM DROWNING.

THE INCIDENT OCCURRED ON MAY 15, WHEN A GROUP OF PRISONERS FROM THE PRISONS DEPARTMENT'S TONG FUK CENTRE WERE WORKING AT TUNG CHUNG PIER, LANTAU.

A 52-YEAR-OLD MAN FELL INTO ROUGH SEAS NEAR THE PIER, AND WAS IN DIFFICULTIES.

THE THREE PRISONERS IMMEDIATELY VOLUNTEERED TO HELP AND ON BEING GIVEN PERMISSION BY THE ESCORTING PRISON OFFICER, JUMPED INTO THE SEA AND RESCUED THE MAN.

ONE OF THE THREE PRISONERS, AGED 31, DUE TO BE DISCHARGED IN JULY, HAS BEEN RELEASED. HE WAS SERVING A SIX-MONTH SENTENCE FOR ATTEMPTED BURGLARY AND GOING EQUIPPED FOR STEALING. THE OTHER TWO HAVE BEEN GRANTED THREE MONTHS REMISSION OF SENTENCE.

ONE, AGED 28, IS SERVING A FOUR-YEAR SENTENCE FOR ROBBERY AND ASSAULT OCCASIONING ACTUAL BODILY HARM AND THE OTHER AGED 35, A THREE-YEAR SENTENCE FOR ASSAULT WITH INTENT TO ROB. THEY ARE BOTH DUE FOR RELEASE LATER THIS YEAR.

HONG KONG BEAUTIES VISIT NEW TERRITORIES

MEMBERS OF THE MISS HONG KONG CLUB TODAY (SATURDAY) VISITED THE NEW TERRITORIES TO FAMILIARISE THEMSELVES WITH THE NEW DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SYSTEM.

THEY FIRST CALLED AT SHA TIN DISTRICT OFFICE FOR A BRIEFING ON THE FUNCTIONS OF DISTRICT BOARDS AND THE ELECTION OF UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS TO THE BOARDS NEXT MARCH.

THE ASSISTANT DISTRICT OFFICER, MR AUGUSTINE CHENG, TOLD THE VISITORS THAT GOVERNMENT HAD ALLOCATED \$1.07 MILLION TO SHA TIN DISTRICT BOARD THIS YEAR FOR MINOR ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AND RECREATIONAL AND SPORTING ACTIVITIES.

IN TAI PO, THE GROUP WATCHED THE LOCAL CHILDREN'S CHOIR DURING A TRAINING SESSION AT THE LIONS CLUB YOUTH CENTRE AND ALSO VISITED THE PLOVER COVE ROAD TEMPORARY PLAYGROUND.

A SECOND MARKET WILL BE OPENED IN TSUEN WAN ON WEDNESDAY, JULY 1.

BUILT BY THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AND MANAGED BY THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT, THE TSUEN WAN MARKET IS THE SECOND PERMANENT MARKET TO BE BUILT IN THE NEW TOWN TO KEEP UP WITH THE RAPID POPULATION GROWTH.

THE FIVE-STOREY MARKET IS LOCATED ON A SITE BOUNDED BY CHUNG ON STREET, HOI PA STREET, CHUEN LUNG STREET AND TSUEN WAN MARKET STREET, AND COVERS 3 100 SQUARE METRES OF SPACE.

ON THE GROUND FLOOR, THERE ARE 334 MINI-STALLS SELLING VEGETABLES, FRUITS, GROCERY, AND FLOWERS. ON THE FIRST FLOOR THERE ARE 65 MARKET-STALLS SELLING MEAT, FISH AND POULTRY, SAID A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NTSD.

EACH MARKET-STALL IS PROVIDED WITH A WORK AREA, EQUIPPED WITH A MAINS WATER TAP AND SINK AT THE BACK FOR THE STALL OPERATOR TO PREPARE HIS COMMODITIES FOR SALE.

A COMMUNAL POULTRY SCALDING ROOM FOR SLAUGHTERING AND DRESSING OF POULTRY, AN INSULATED ICE STALL, A VEGETABLE SORTING ROOM, A REFUSE COLLECTION ROOM, A MARKET OFFICE AND A LOADING BAY FOR THREE LORRIES ARE ALSO PROVIDED.

THERE ARE SIX ENTRANCES OPEN DIRECTLY TO THE FOUR STREETS ON THE GROUND FLOOR OF THE MARKET WITH TWO RAMPS FOR HANDICAPPED PEOPLE AND HANDCARTS, SAID THE SPOKESMAN.

TWO ESCALATORS AND TWO STAIRCASES ARE PROVIDED IN THE MARKET HALL ON THE GROUND FLOOR FOR EASY ACCESS TO THE FIRST FLOOR, AND THERE ARE EIGHT FLIGHTS OF STEPS LEADING FROM THE PAVEMENT.

AN OPEN AIR SITTING OUT AREA, WITH CHILDREN'S PLAY EQUIPMENT, PARK SEATS, PLANTERS AND PARK LIGHTING FACILITIES ARE ON THE SECOND FLOOR.

THE UPPER FLOORS ARE QUARTERS FOR THE MARKET STAFF, SAID THE SPOKESMAN.
