BUSY DAY FOR LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
* * * *

IT WILL BE A BUSY DAY AT THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY) WHEN 11 NEW BILLS, INCLUDING THE LANDLORD AND TENANT (CONSOLIDATION)(AMENDMENT) BILL, ARE INTRODUCED FOR THEIR FIRST AND SECOND READINGS.

IN ADDITION, FOUR UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS ARE EXPECTED TO SPEAK ON +THE GOVERNMENT'S SOCIAL WELFARE SUBVENTION POLICY+ TO BE RAISED BY DR THE HON HARRY FANG DURING AN ADJOURNMENT DEBATE.

UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS WILL ALSO ASK SEVEN QUESTIONS ON A VARIETY OF MATTERS AFFECTING THE PUBLIC.

THE HON LYDIA DUNN WILL ASK A QUESTION AS TO GOVERNMENT'S POLICY IN REGARD TO THE INCREASING NUMBER OF VIETNAMESE BOAT PEOPLE ARRIVING IN HONG KONG SO FAR THIS YEAR.

ON THE MATTER OF SUICIDES AND ATTEMPTED SUICIDES AMONG SCHOOL CHILDREN, DR THE HON HO KAM-FAI WILL ASK IF THE GOVERNMENT WILL CONSIDER INCREASING THE PROVISION OF GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING SERVICES FOR PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL CHILDREN.

DR HO WILL ALSO ASK IF THE GOVERNMENT IS SATISFIED THAT EXISTING REGULATIONS AND MONITORING CONTROLS ARE SUFFICIENT TO ENSURE SAFETY OF DEMOLITION WORKS.

ON ANOTHER ASPECT OF SAFETY, THE HON WONG PO-YAN WILL ASK IF THE GOVERNMENT WILL MAKE A STATEMENT ON THE PROGRESS MADE ON THE MATTER OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY DURING THE LAST THREE YEARS.

THE HON PETER C. WONG WILL ASK IF GOVERNMENT HAS ANY POSITIVE PLAN TO RELIEVE +THE SERIOUS TRAFFIC CONGESTION IN THE CROSS HARBOUR TUNNEL.+

IN RELATION TO PUBLIC INTEREST ON THE ISSUE OF CAPITAL PUNISHMENT, THE HON CHAN KAM-CHUEN WILL ASK ABOUT THE NUMBER OF REPORTED HOMICIDE CASES, WHEN THE LAST CONVICTED MURDERER WAS EXECUTED IN HONG KONG, AND HOW MANY PERSONS WHOSE DEATH SENTENCES HAVE BEEN COMMUTED TO TERMS OF IMPRISONMENT HAVE SINCE BEEN RELEASED.

THE HON ANDREW SO KWOK-WING WILL ASK WHAT EFFORTS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNMENT TO PROMOTE FAMILY, SCHOOL AND SOCIAL LIFE EDUCATION.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TRADE INDUSTRY AND CUSTOMS DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED TODAY (TUESDAY) CHANGES IN DIRECTORATE POSTS TAKING PLACE OVER THE NEXT FEW MONTHS.

THE DIRECTOR OF TRADE INDUSTRY AND CUSTOMS, MR BILL DORWARD, PROCEEDS ON LEAVE TOMORROW (JUNE 24), AND DURING HIS ABSENCE THE COMMISSIONER OF INDUSTRY MR LAWRENCE MILLS, WILL BE APPOINTED ACTING DIRECTOR OF TICD.

AT THE SAME TIME, THE DEPUTY COMMISSIONER OF INDUSTRY, MR ALEX PURVES WILL BE APPOINTED ACTING COMMISSIONER OF INDUSTRY.

WHEN MR DORWARD RETURNS FROM LEAVE ON AUGUST 23, MR MILLS WILL TAKE UP THE POST OF COMMISSIONER OF TRADE.

THE PRESENT COMMISSIONER OF TRADE, MR PETER TSAO, WILL PROCEED ON LEAVE IN AUGUST, AND ON HIS RETURN IN LATE OCTOBER, WILL TAKE UP THE POST OF COMMISSIONER OF INDUSTRY.

YUEN LONG SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME LAUNCHED

* * * *

A FEATURE OF THIS YEAR'S YUEN LONG DISTRICT SUMMER YOUTH ACTIVITIES PROGRAMME WILL BE A TWO-DAY RECREATION CAMP FOR THE ABLE AND THE DISABLED.

DEPUTY SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR AUGUSTINE CHUI KAM, SAID THIS TODAY (TUESDAY) WHEN LAUNCHING THE PROGRAMME AT THE LUT SAU HALL.

HE SAID THE CAMP WAS BEING HELD IN RESPONSE TO THE INTERNATIONAL YEAR FOR THE DISABLED.

IT WILL TAKE PLACE ON JULY 4 AND 5 AT THE PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED AND ABLE BODIED CENTRE AT POK FU LAM. OF THE 100 PEOPLE TAKING PART 60 WILL BE HANDICAPPED.

+THIS SHOWS THAT THE DISABLED ARE NOT BEING NEGLECTED, BUT ARE BEING ENCOURAGED TO TAKE PART IN COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES,+ MR CHUI SAID.

MORE THAN 160 SPORTS, RECREATIONAL AND OTHER ACTIVITIES WILL BE HELD AT SCHOOLS, VILLAGE OPEN SPACES, YOUTH CENTRES, THE TOWN HALL AND PLAYGROUNDS IN THE DISTRICT OVER THE COMING TWO MONTHS.

ABOUT 50 000 LOCAL YOUNG PEOPLE ARE EXPECTED TO TAKE PART IN BALL GAMES, SPORTS COMPETITIONS, VISITS, SKILL TRAINING, CAMPING, CULTURAL SHOWS AND OUTINGS.

MR CHUI SAID THE AIMS OF THE ACTIVITIES WERE TO RELIEVE TENSION AND ENCOURAGE YOUNG PEOPLE TO MAKE THE BEST USE OF THEIR SUMMER HOLIDAYS BY ACTIVELY PARTICIPATING IN HEALTHY PURSUITS.

+SUCH ACTIVITIES CAN HELP THEM BUILD UP CONFIDENCE, LEARN USEFUL SKILLS AND CULTIVATE NEW INTERESTS,+ HE SAID.

+A SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY AND A SOUND PERSONALITY CAN ALSO BE DEVELOPED.+

PROVISION OF RECREATIONAL FACILITIES IN YUEN LONG WOULD BE IMPROVED AND EXPANDED IN THE NEXT FEW YEARS, MR CHUI SAID.

MAJOR PROJECTS WOULD INCLUDE A COVERED SPECTATOR STAND AT THE STADIUM, A SWIMMING COMPLEX, A LIBRARY AND SQUASH COURTS.

SUITABLE SITES WERE ALSO OUTLINED FOR BUILDING SKATING RINKS, A MINI-SOCCER PITCH AND BASKETBALL, BADMINTON, AND TENNIS COURTS.

HE SAID IN THE NEAR FUTURE THE LUT SAU HALL WOULD BE HANDED OVER TO THE CULTURAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT WHICH WOULD PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL MANAGEMENT AND ARRANGE CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL PROGRAMMES FOR LOCAL PEOPLE.

HE EXPRESSED HOPE THAT THE DISTRICT BOARDS, APART FROM IMPROVING ADMINISTRATION AT THE LOCAL LEVEL, WOULD ALSO ENCOURAGE PARTICIPATION IN LOCAL AFFAIRS, ESPECIALLY RECREATIONAL AND CULTURAL FUNCTIONS.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT TODAY'S OPENING WERE THE CHAIRMAN OF YUEN LONG DISTRICT YOUTH RECREATION CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE, MR TAI KUEN- THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MR FUNG KWOK-KEUNG- AND THE DISTRICT SOCIAL WELFARE OFFICER, MISS CHAN JOY-YIN.

THIS YEAR, THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT AND THE ROYAL HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB HAVE PROVIDED NEARLY \$47 000 FOR THE PROGRAMME. A FURTHER \$50 000 WILL BE PROVIDED THROUGH LOCAL DONATIONS.

TSUEN WAN ENQUIRIES CENTRES TO REMAIN OPEN IN EVENINGS * * * * *

TWO OF TSUEN WAN'S BUSIEST PUBLIC ENQUIRIES SERVICE CENTRES WILL REMAIN OPEN TWO EVENINGS A WEEK STARTING NEXT MONTH.

THE CENTRES, AT BLOCK 14 OF SHEK LEI ESTATE IN KWAI CHUNG AND AT 93, HOI PA STREET IN TSUEN WAN, WILL STAY OPEN UNTIL 9.15 PM EVERY TUESDAY AND THURSDAY.

AT PRESENT, ALL EIGHT PUBLIC ENQUIRIES SERVICE CENTRES IN THE DISTRICT OPEN FROM 8.45 AM TO 5.15 PM ON WEEKDAYS AND FROM 9 AM TO 12 NOON ON SATURDAYS.

A DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID IF THE ADDITIONAL EVENING HOURS PROVED POPULAR, CONSIDERATION WOULD BE GIVEN TO EXTENDING THE SERVICE TO OTHER CENTRES.

+WE HOPE RESIDENTS, PARTICULARLY WORKING MEMBERS OF FAMILIES, WILL FIND AN EVENING SERVICE MORE CONVENIENT FOR LODGING COMPLAINTS OR SEEKING HELP,+ HE SAID.

FACILITIES PROVIDED AT THE TWO CENTRES IN THE EVENING WILL INCLUDE ADVICE AND GUIDANCE ON ALL GOVERNMENT SERVICES AND POLICIES, DISTRIBUTION OF PAMPHLETS AND FORMS, RENTAL MATTERS AND PROCESSING APPLICATIONS FOR FREE LEGAL ADVICE.

STATUTORY DECLARATIONS, HOWEVER, WILL ONLY BE PROVIDED DURING DAY TIME.

IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF THIS YEAR, STAFF AT THE EIGHT TSUEN WAN PUBLIC ENQUIRIES SERVICE CENTRES HANDLED OVER 146 000 ENQUIRIES AND DISTRIBUTED MORE THAN 204 000 FORMS AND PAMPHLETS.

EMPLOYERS REMINDED TO REPORT WORKERS' INJURIES

* * *

THREE EMPLOYERS WERE FINED A TOTAL OF \$2 400 BY THE COURTS LAST MONTH (MAY) FOR FAILING TO INFORM THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT OF ACCIDENTS INVOLVING THEIR EMPLOYEES WITHIN THE STATUTORY PERIOD OF SEVEN DAYS.

TWO OF THE EMPLOYERS WERE EACH FINED \$1 000 - THE MAXIMUM FINE PROVIDED BY THE EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION ORDINANCE.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (TUESDAY) THAT IF AN EMPLOYEE IS INJURED AT WORK AND IS GIVEN SICK LEAVE BY A DOCTOR FOR MORE THAN THREE DAYS, THE EMPLOYER SHOULD NOTIFY THE DEPARTMENT OF THIS IN THE PRESCRIBED FORM WITHIN SEVEN DAYS.

THE EMPLOYER SHOULD DO SO WHETHER OR NOT THE ACCIDENT GIVES RISE TO LIABILITY FOR COMPENSATION.

THE THREE COURT CASES WERE AMONG A TOTAL OF 822 TAKEN OUT BY THE DEPARTMENT'S PROSECUTIONS UNIT LAST MONTH FOR BREACHES OF LABOUR LEGISLATION.

A TOTAL OF 797 CASES RESULTED IN CONVICTIONS, WITH FINES TOTALLING \$732 500.

OF THESE CASES, 269 CONCERNED VIOLATIONS OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY REGULATIONS WITH FINES OF \$416 500, INCLUDING 126 (WITH \$240 600 IN FINES) FOR BREACHES OF THE CONSTRUCTION SITES (SAFETY) REGULATIONS AND 103 (WITH \$132 000 IN FINES) FOR BREACHES OF THE FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS (GUARDING AND OPERATION OF MACHINERY) REGULATIONS.

OFFENCES IN CONNECTION WITH EMPLOYMENT OF WOMEN AND YOUNG PERSONS ACCOUNTED FOR 435 CASES, AND \$240 650 IN FINES.

OF THE OTHER CASES, 31 (WITH \$32 050 IN FINES) RELATED TO FAILURE TO KEEP OR PRODUCE FOR INSPECTION RECORDS OF EMPLOYEES.

WORKMEN WARNED OF NEED TO WEAR SAFETY HELMETS

* * *

WORKMEN WHO REFUSE TO WEAR SAFETY HELMETS PROVIDED BY EMPLOYERS AT CONSTRUCTION SITES RISK BEING PROSECUTED AND FINED UP TO \$10 000, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).

HE WAS COMMENTING ON A RECENT COURT CASE IN WHICH A CARPENTER WAS FINED \$100 FOR BREACHING THE CONSTRUCTION SITES (SAFETY) REGULATIONS BY FAILING TO WEAR A SAFETY HELMET PROVIDED BY HIS EMPLOYER.

REGULATION 69, THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT, STATES THAT +ANY CONTRACTOR OR WORKMAN ENGAGED IN CONSTRUCTION WORK WHO WILFULLY AND WITHOUT REASONABLE CAUSE DOES ANYTHING LIKELY TO ENDANGER HIMSELF OR OTHERS SHALL BE GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND SHALL BE LIABLE ON CONVICTION TO A FINE OF \$10 000+.

THE SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED: +BY INTERPRETATION OF THAT REGULATION, THE CARPENTER ENDANGERED HIMSELF BY NOT WEARING A SAFETY HELMET PROVIDED BY HIS EMPLOYER.+

AN INSPECTOR VISITING A CONSTRUCTION SITE IN SHA TIN IN JANUARY THIS YEAR HAD FOUND THE CARPENTER WITHOUT A SAFETY HELMET AND TRIED TO GET HIM TO WEAR ONE. BUT THE ADVICE WAS IGNORED.

WHEN THE CARPENTER IGNORED A SIMILAR REQUEST MADE BY THE SITE MANAGER, HE WAS ISSUED WITH A SUMMONS.

TEACHER TRAINING COURSES OFFERED

* * * * *

APPLICATIONS ARE NOW INVITED FOR THE THREE-YEAR AND TWO-YEAR TEACHER TRAINING COURSES COMMENCING THIS SEPTEMBER AT THE THREE COLLEGES OF EDUCATION.

ALL THREE COLLEGES ARE OFFERING A THREE-YEAR COURSE IN ENGLISH, WHILE GRANTHAM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION IS ALSO OFFERING A THREE-YEAR COURSE IN CHINESE, AND NORTHCOTE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION IS OFFERING A TWO-YEAR COURSE IN ENGLISH.

+THE OBJECTIVES OF THESE INITIAL COURSES OF TEACHER EDUCATION ARE TO TRAIN STUDENTS TO BECOME QUALIFIED TEACHERS TO TEACH GENERAL SUBJECTS AT THE PRIMARY SCHOOL LEVEL AND TO TEACH THREE ELECTIVE SUBJECTS TO THE LEVEL OF FORM 3,+ AN EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE TWO FULL-TIME THREE-YEAR COURSES WILL COMPRISE A CORE CURRICULUM OF A COMPULSORY PROGRAMME OF STUDIES, TWO SUBJECTS ELECTED ON A MAJOR ELECTIVE BASIS AND ONE SUBJECT ON A MINOR ELECTIVE BASIS.

APPLICANTS FOR THE ENGLISH COURSE SHOULD HAVE COMPLETED THEIR SECONDARY EDUCATION AT AN ANGLO-CHINESE SCHOOL AND THOSE FOR THE CHINESE COURSE SHOULD HAVE COMPLETED THEIR SECONDARY EDUCATION AT A CHINESE MIDDLE SCHOOL. THEY SHOULD HAVE REACHED 17 YEARS OF AGE BY SEPTEMBER 30, 1981.

THEY SHOULD HAVE TAKEN AT LEAST SIX DIFFERENT SUBJECTS AT THE HONG KONG CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION EXAMINATION (HKCEE) LEVEL. GRADES OBTAINED SHOULD BE AT LEAST GRADE C IN TWO SUBJECTS, PLUS AT LEAST GRADE D IN ONE OTHER SUBJECTS AND AT LEAST GRADE E IN ANOTHER THREE SUBJECTS.

+CHINESE LANGUAGE AND ENGLISH LANGUAGE MUST BE INCLUDED AMONG THE SIX SUBJECTS,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE COURSE STRUCTURE OF THE FULL-TIME TWO-YEAR COURSE IN ENGLISH IS BASICALLY THE SAME AS THAT FOR THE THREE-YEAR COURSE.

+THE ENTRY REQUIREMENT FOR A MAJOR ELECTIVE SUBJECT IS NORMALLY A PASS IN THAT SUBJECT AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

APPLICANTS FOR THE TWO-YEAR COURSE SHOULD HAVE COMPLETED TWO YEARS OF EDUCATION BEYOND FORM 5 IN AN ANGLO-CHINESE SCHOOL, AND SHOULD HAVE REACHED THE AGE OF 18 BY SEPTEMBER 30, 1981.

THEY SHOULD HAVE TAKEN AT LEAST SIX DIFFERENT SUBJECTS IN PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS, INCLUDING GRADE E OR ABOVE AT ADVANCED LEVEL IN AT LEAST TWO SUBJECTS, PLUS AT LEAST GRADE D IN ONE OTHER SUBJECT AT HKCEE LEVEL AND AT LEAST GRADE E IN ANOTHER THREE SUBJECTS AT HKCEE LEVEL.

CHINESE LANGUAGE AND ENGLISH LANGUAGE MUST BE INCLUDED AMONG THE SIX SUBJECTS.

+APPLICANTS WHO ARE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR THE FULL-TIME TWO-YEAR COURSE MAY ALSO APPLY FOR A FULL-TIME THREE-YEAR COURSE, BUT A SEPARATE APPLICATION MUST BE MADE FOR EACH COURSE,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

TUITION FEES FOR THE COURSES IS \$800 PER ANNUM.

+STUDENTS CAN APPLY FOR AN INTEREST-FREE LOAN OF UP TO \$2 400 PER ANNUM, REPAYABLE MONTHLY OVER A PERIOD OF FOUR YEARS AFTER COMPLETION OF THE COURSE- AND ALSO A MAINTENANCE GRANT OF UP TO \$2 000 PER ANNUM,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

UPON SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF THE COURSE, COLLEGE GRADUATES ARE ELIGIBLE TO HAVE THEIR NAMES ENTERED INTO THE OFFICIAL REGISTER OF TEACHERS, BUT NEITHER THE GOVERNMENT NOR THE COLLEGES CAN GUARANTEE EMPLOYMENT FOR THEM, HE ADDED.

SELECTION OF STUDENTS TO THE COLLEGES IS ADMINISTERED BY THE COLLEGES OF EDUCATION JOINT SELECTION BOARD.

FOR STUDENT APPLICANTS, THE PRINCIPALS OF THEIR SCHOOLS ARE REQUESTED TO OBTAIN THE REQUISITE NUMBER OF APPLICATION FORMS OF EACH TYPE OF COURSES AND RETURN THEM TO SIR ROBERT BLACK COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, 6 CALDECOTT ROAD, KOWLOON.

APPLICANTS WHO HAVE ALREADY LEFT SCHOOL CAN OBTAIN THE FORMS AND INFORMATION SHEETS FROM THE THREE COLLEGES OF EDUCATION- THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT HEADQUARTERS AT LEE GARDENS, THIRD FLOOR, HYSAN AVENUE, HONG KONG- AND THE KOWLOON SUB-OFFICE AT 405 NATHAN ROAD, KOWLOON.
