MANUFACTURE OF ELECTRONICS COMPONENTS A HK FIRST  
\* \* \* \* \*

HONG KONG'S ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY HAS TAKEN THE FIRST STEP IN REDUCING OVER-DEPENDENCE ON THE EXTERNAL SUPPLY OF COMPONENTS FOR ITS ASSEMBLY-TYPE OPERATIONS WITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A LOCAL FACTORY TO MANUFACTURE HIGH-GRADE COPPER-CLAD LAMINATES, THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, MR PIERS JACOBS SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING OF MICA-AVA (FAR EAST) INDUSTRIAL LIMITED, MR JACOBS SAID THAT CONTINUING DEPENDENCE ON THE EXTERNAL SUPPLY OF COMPONENTS COULD AFFECT THE GROWTH OF THE INDUSTRY IN THE FUTURE.

HE POINTED OUT THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE NEW COMPANY IN THAT THE ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY WOULD NOT NEED TO LOOK ELSEWHERE FOR ITS LAMINATES WITH THE AVAILABILITY OF A READY SUPPLYING BASE LOCALLY.

MR JACOBS CONGRATULATED THE DIRECTORS OF THE COMPANY FOR HAVING THE FORESIGHT IN EFFECTING THE TRANSFER OF FOREIGN TECHNOLOGY INTO HONG KONG.

+IT IS IMPORTANT THAT HONG KONG DEVELOPS ITSELF AT A NATURAL PACE IN THE FIELD OF HIGHER TECHNOLOGY,+ HE SAID.

MR JACOBS SAID HE HOPED OTHER LEADERS OF INDUSTRY WOULD FOLLOW THE EXAMPLE AND CONTINUE TO WORK FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL IN HONG KONG.

HE ALSO ENSURED THAT IT WAS AND WOULD BE THE INTENTION OF THE GOVERNMENT TO DO ALL THAT IT COULD, WITHIN THE RESOURCES AVAILABLE, TO ENCOURAGE INDUSTRIES TO ACHIEVE GREATER PRODUCTIVITY AND BETTER QUALITY.

PROVISIONAL TRADE FIGURES FOR DECEMBER RELEASED  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE STRONG GROWTH IN EXTERNAL TRADE CONTINUED IN DECEMBER 1986. THE VALUE OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS IN DECEMBER 1986, AT \$15 365 MILLION, GREW BY 24.7 PER CENT OR \$3 040 MILLION COMPARED WITH DECEMBER 1985, WHILE THE VALUE OF RE-EXPORTS GREW BY 33.4 PER CENT OR \$3 161 MILLION TO \$12 626 MILLION, ACCORDING TO THE PROVISIONAL TRADE FIGURES PUBLISHED TODAY BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT.

TAKING DOMESTIC EXPORTS AND RE-EXPORTS TOGETHER, THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS, AT \$27 991 MILLION, WAS 28.5 PER CENT OR \$6 201 MILLION HIGHER THAN IN DECEMBER 1985.

/THE VALUE .....

THE VALUE OF IMPORTS GREW BY 23.8 PER CENT OR \$5 288 MILLION OVER DECEMBER 1985 TO \$27 468 MILLION.

AS THE GREW IN THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS WAS FASTER THAN THAT OF IMPORTS, A VISIBLE TRADE SURPLUS EQUIVALENT TO 1.9 PER CENT OF THE VALUE OF IMPORTS WAS RECORDED IN DECEMBER 1986, COMPARED WITH A VISIBLE TRADE GAP (THAT IS, THE PROPORTION OF THE VALUE OF IMPORTS NOT COVERED BY THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS) OF 1.8 PER CENT RECORDED IN DECEMBER 1985.

FOR 1986 AS A WHOLE, THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS WAS \$276 526 MILLION, MADE UP OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS OF \$153 980 MILLION AND RE-EXPORTS OF \$122 546 MILLION.

COMPARED WITH 1985, THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS GREW BY \$41 374 MILLION OR 17.6 PER CENT, OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS BY \$24 098 MILLION OR 18.6 PER CENT, AND OF RE-EXPORTS BY \$17 276 MILLION OR 16.4 PER CENT. OVER THIS PERIOD, THE VALUE OF IMPORTS GREW BY \$44 535 MILLION OR 19.2 PER CENT, TO \$275 955 MILLION.

AS THE GROWTH RATE OF THE VALUE OF IMPORTS WAS FASTER THAN THAT OF TOTAL EXPORTS, THE VISIBLE TRADE ACCOUNT RECORDED A SURPLUS OF \$571 MILLION (EQUIVALENT TO 0.2 PER CENT OF THE VALUE OF IMPORTS) IN 1986, WHICH WAS SMALLER THAN THE SURPLUS OF \$3 732 MILLION (EQUIVALENT TO 1.6 PER CENT OF THE VALUE OF IMPORTS) RECORDED IN 1985.

COMMENTING ON THESE FIGURES, A GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT DOMESTIC EXPORTS HAVE STAGED A STRONG RECOVERY SINCE MARCH 1986, WITH THEIR YEAR-ON-YEAR GROWTH RATE IN VALUE TERMS ACCELERATING FROM 1 PER CENT IN THE FIRST QUARTER TO 30 PER CENT IN THE FOURTH QUARTER.

THIS WAS PARTLY ATTRIBUTABLE TO IMPROVED DEMAND GENERALLY FOR IMPORTS IN MANY OF HONG KONG'S MAJOR OVERSEAS MARKETS.

ANOTHER CONTRIBUTORY FACTOR WAS THE DEPRECIATION OF THE HONG KONG DOLLAR, IN LINE WITH THAT OF THE U.S. DOLLAR UNDER THE LINKED EXCHANGE RATE SYSTEM, AGAINST MOST MAJOR CURRENCIES, WHICH HAS ENHANCED THE EXTERNAL COMPETITIVENESS OF HONG KONG'S PRODUCES.

HE ADDED THAT THE VALUE OF RE-EXPORTS CONTINUED TO INCREASE SHARPLY IN DECEMBER. THIS REFLECTED, IN PART, CHINA'S EFFORTS IN PROMOTING ITS EXPORTS, RESULTING IN MORE CHINESE GOODS BEING CHANELLED THROUGH HONG KONG TO OVERSEAS MARKETS.

SPECIAL AIRPORT CHECK-IN AREA FOR HOLIDAY TRAVELLERS  
\* \* \* \* \*

A SPECIAL CHECK-IN AREA WILL BE SET UP AT HONG KONG AIRPORT FOR CHINA-BOUND TRAVELLERS OVER THE LUNAR NEW YEAR.

THE AREA IS AT THE WESTERN END OF THE DEPARTURE HALL OF THE PASSENGER TERMINAL BUILDING, AND WILL BE IN OPERATION FROM MONDAY (JANUARY 26) UNTIL FEBRUARY 1.

A CIVIL AVIATION DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THIS FACILITY WAS PART OF MEASURES TAKEN TO MEET THE LARGE NUMBER OF PASSENGERS EXPECTED TO LEAVE FOR CHINA BY AIR DURING THE HOLIDAY PERIOD.

MORE THAN 150 ADDITIONAL FLIGHTS PROVIDED BY THE CIVIL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION OF CHINA ARE EXPECTED, WHILE OTHER AIRLINES WILL OPERATE EXTRA FLIGHTS TO VARIOUS DESTINATIONS ABROAD.

THE BUSIEST DAY WILL BE THURSDAY (JANUARY 29) WHEN THERE WILL BE 45 EXTRA OUTBOUND FLIGHTS CARRYING ABOUT 8 000 PASSENGERS.

/OTHER SPECIAL .....

OTHER SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS WILL INCLUDE A DISPLAY OF DIRECTIONAL SIGNS AT PROMINENT POINTS TO ADVISE PASSENGERS OF THEIR SPECIFIC FLIGHT NUMBERS AND THE CORRECT CHECK-IN COUNTERS.

PERIODIC ANNOUNCEMENTS WILL BE MADE THROUGH THE AIRPORT PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEMS ADVISING PASSENGERS TO PASS THROUGH CUSTOMS CONTROLS AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE.

TAXI OPERATORS HAVE BEEN ASKED TO USE THE FAR END OF THE DEPARTURE KERBSIDE FOR OFF-LOADING PASSENGERS BOUND FOR CHINA.

+WE HOPE THESE ARRANGEMENTS WILL HELP ENSURE THE SMOOTH FLOW OF PASSENGER TRAFFIC AND BAGGAGE MOVEMENT IN THE DEPARTURE HALL,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE ALSO CALLED ON TRAVELLERS TO FOLLOW A FEW SIMPLE HINTS TO EASE CONGESTION AT THE AIRPORT.

+DEPARTING PASSENGERS SHOULD ARRIVE EARLY AT THE AIRPORT AND CHECK IN AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

+WHEN POSSIBLE THEY SHOULD ALSO USE PUBLIC TRANSPORT INSTEAD OF PRIVATE CARS TO GO TO THE AIRPORT.

+ON ARRIVAL AT THE AIRPORT THEY SHOULD LOOK FOR SIGNS INDICATING THEIR FLIGHT NUMBERS AND THE RELEVANT PROCESSING FACILITIES.

+TO AVOID CONGESTION, PASSENGERS SHOULD MINIMISE THE NUMBER OF FRIENDS AND RELATIVES BIDDING FAREWELL.+

THE VOCATIONAL TRAINING COUNCIL WILL OPEN MORE TRAINING CENTRES THIS YEAR TO MEET THE NEEDS OF INDUSTRY, THE COUNCIL'S RETIRING EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, MR MORRIS MORGAN, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

HE TOLD A GROUP OF CAREERS COUNSELLORS AND SOCIAL WORKERS THAT AN ELECTRONIC DATA PROCESSING TRAINING CENTRE WILL SOON BE OPERATIONAL, AND A JEWELLERY INDUSTRY TRAINING CENTRE WILL BE ESTABLISHED LATER THIS YEAR.
