GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT GROWS HALF MILLION PLANTS

* * * * *

THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT PLANTED SOME 500 000 PLANTS LAST YEAR AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS IN THE NEW TOWNS AND RURAL AREAS.

THE PLANTS INCLUDED TREES, SHRUBS, CREEPERS AND FLOWERS, MOST OF WHICH HAD GROWN WELL, AN NTSD SPOKESMAN SAID.

IN ADDITION, VARIOUS LANDSCAPING PROJECTS DEVELOPED BY THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT'S ARCHITECTURAL OFFICE, THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT AND THE HIGHWAYS OFFICE HAVE BEEN HANDED OVER TO THE NTSD FOR MAINTENANCE.

TO MAINTAIN THESE PROJECTS, THE NTSD HAS SPECIALISTS IN LANDSCAPE DESIGN, PLANT NURSERY MANAGEMENT, HORTICULTURE AND OTHER RELATED FIELDS.

MEANWHILE, TWO PHOTOGRAPHIC EXHIBITIONS ON LANDSCAPE WORKS WILL BE HELD THIS MONTH.

THE FIRST EXHIBITION WILL BE STAGED AT THE SILVER BALLROOM OF THE SHERATON HOTEL IN TSIM SHA TSUI FROM TUESDAY (MARCH 6) TO SATURDAY (MARCH 10). THE EVENT, WITH THE NTSD AND OTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS AS PARTICIPANTS, COINCIDES WITH THE 3RD EASTERN REGIONAL CONFERENCE ORGANISED BY THE INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTS.

THE SECOND EXHIBITION WILL BE HELD FROM SATURDAY (MARCH 10) TO TUESDAY (MARCH 13) BY THE NTSD AT THE FANLING RECREATION GROUND IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE NORTH DISTRICT FLOWER SHOW.

A RECORD HIGH OF MORE THAN 100 000 RESIDENTS ATTENDED THIS YEAR'S SHAM SHUI PO ARTS FESTIVAL FEATURING OVER 50 CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES, THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MR SYLVESTER TSE, SAID THIS (SUNDAY) EVENING.

SPEAKING AT THE FESTIVAL'S CLOSING CEREMONY, MR TSE SAID THE THREE-WEEK PROGRAMME INCLUDED POPULAR AND CLASSICAL MUSIC, FOLK SONGS, CHOIR SINGING, CANTONESE OPERAS, FILMS, MODERN DANCES, CALLIGRAPHY AND PAINTINGS, PUPPET THEATRES, PHOTOGRAPHIC EXHIBITIONS, CHESS COMPETITIONS AND VARIETY SHOWS.

+THIS HAS MADE IT POSSIBLE FOR PEOPLE OF DIFFERENT AGES TO CHOOSE THE EVENTS SUITED TO THEIR TASTES.

VALUE OF VOLUNTEER HELP IN SPORTS STRESSED * * * *

THE IMPORTANCE OF VOLUNTEERS IN HELPING PROMOTE SPORTS AND RECREATION FOR THE MASSES WAS STRESSED TODAY (SUNDAY) AT A SEMINAR ORGANISED BY THE RECREATION AND CULTURE DEPARTMENT.

MORE THAN 300 PART-TIME INSTRUCTORS IN RECREATION AND SPORTS ATTENDED THE SEMINAR HELD AT A TSIM SHA TSUI EAST HOTEL.

THE ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER FOR RECREATION AND SPORTS, MR DICKEN YUNG, SAID THAT SPORTS AND RECREATION, LIKE THE SOCIAL SERVICE, DEPENDED HEAVILY ON THE PARTICIPATION AND ASSISTANCE OF VOLUNTEERS.

HE SAID CONTRIBUTION BY VOLUNTEERS ENABLED THE RECREATION AND SPORTS SERVICE (RSS), FOUNDED IN 1974, TO ORGANISE RECREATIONAL AND SPORTS ACTIVITIES FOR MASS PARTICIPATION.

CITING ANOTHER EXAMPLE, HE SAID THE MANY SPORTS ASSOCIATIONS UNDER THE CENTRAL CO-ORDINATING BODY OF THE AMATEUR SPORTS FEDERATION AND OLYMPIC COMMITTEE OF HONG KONG WERE RUN BY VOLUNTEERS.

IN SOME COUNTRIES IN EUROPE AND AMERICA, MILLIONS OF PEOPLE OFFER VOLUNTARY SERVICE IN SPORTS, HE SAID.

+ALTHOUGH WE HAVE MADE SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS IN THE LAST FEW YEARS, THERE IS STILL AMPLE ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT,+ HE ADDED.

ANOTHER SPEAKER AT THE SEMINAR, THE CHIEF RECREATION AND SPORT OFFICER (DISTRICT OPERATIONS), MR RAYMOND CHAN, SAID THE PART-TIME INSTRUCTORS OF THE RSS PLAYED THE PART OF +AMBASSADORS+ BY OFFERING THEIR SERVICES TO THE PUBLIC.

HE ALSO EXHORTED TEACHERS AND TRAINERS TO STEP UP IMPROVING THEIR OWN SKILL SO AS TO KEEP ABREAST WITH PROGRESS.

MR CHAN SAID THEIR ROLE WAS IMPORTANT BECAUSE VERY OFTEN TALENT WAS DISCOVERED AMONG THE THOUSANDS WHO TOOK PART IN ACTIVITIES SUPERVISED BY THEM.

A SENIOR RECREATION AND SPORT OFFICER, MR TSIN YAN-PUI, SAID THAT INSTRUCTORS, LIKE SCHOOL TEACHERS, ARE INDISPENSABLE.

HE SAID THAT IN THE CURRENT FINANCIAL YEAR, THE RSS HAS EMBARKED ON A PROGRAMME TO TRAIN MORE PART-TIME INSTRUCTORS IN AN EFFORT TO MOBILISE MASS SPORTS MOVEMENT IN HONG KONG.

LAST YEAR, WITH THE SUPPORT OF VARIOUS SPORTS ASSOCIATIONS, THE RSS ORGANISED 80 TRAINING PROGRAMMES AND 30 SEMINARS FOR THE INSTRUCTORS, HE SAID.

SINCE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE RSS, MORE THAN 34 000 PROJECTS HAD BEEN ORGANISED ATTRACTING ABOUT FOUR MILLION PARTICIPANTS.

FOLLOWING THE SEMINAR, MR YUNG, PRESENTED THE RSS SERVICE AWARD TO 21 MEN AND WOMEN VOLUNTEER INSTRUCTORS.

SIXTY-SIX CASES, OR MORE THAN 90 PER CENT, HAD BEEN SATISFACTORILY DEALT WITH.

+A CONSIDERABLE NUMBER OF CASES WAS ON HOUSING PROBLEMS, BUT QUITE A NUMBER CONCERNING SUCH MATTERS AS TENANCY AND HOUSEHOLD DISPUTES, TAXATION, RELOCATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNS AS WELL AS COMPLAINTS ABOUT HAWKER AND NOISE NUISANCE, WERE RECORDED,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

COURTHOUSE TO BE BUILT IN SHA TIN

THE FIRST STEP IN BUILDING A COURTHOUSE AT SHA TIN HAS JUST BEEN TAKEN WITH THE SIGNING OF A PILING CONTRACT BETWEEN THE ARCHITECTURAL OFFICE OF THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT AND GAMMON (HONG KONG) LIMITED.

THE EIGHT-STOREY BUILDING WILL OCCUPY A 3 510-SQUARE-METRE SITE CLOSE TO THE TOWN PARK AND THE CULTURAL COMPLEX, BOTH OF WHICH ARE NOW UNDER CONSTRUCTION.

THERE WILL BE A TOTAL OF EIGHT COURTROOMS, INCLUDING TWO DISTRICT COURTS, ONE PLEA COURT, THREE MAGISTRATES' COURTS, ONE JUVENILE COURT AND ONE SMALL CLAIMS COURT.

OTHER FACILITIES WILL INCLUDE A PRESS ROOM, TWO LIBRARIES, JUDGES' AND MAGISTRATES' CHAMBERS, A LEGAL AID REGISTRY, A SOLICITORS' ROOM, A TEMPORARY CUSTODIAL AREA AND A CANTÉEN.

CAR PARKING SPACES WILL BE PROVIDED ON THE GROUND FLOOR AREA WHICH WILL BE LANDSCAPED.

THE TOTAL FLOOR AREA WILL BE 12 550 SQUARE METRES.

WORK ON THE PILING CONTRACT, WHICH IS VALUED AT \$7.1 MILLION, WILL BEGIN IN THE MIDDLE OF THIS MONTH AND BE COMPLETED IN FIVE MONTHS.

THE COURT BUILDING WILL BE READY BY SEPTEMBER, 1986.

FIVE HUNDRED MUSIC OFFICE TRAINEES WHO HAVE COMPLETED ONE YEAR OF HARD WORK WILL BE SHOWING THEIR TALENTS IN A GALA CONCERT ON MARCH 18 IN THE ACADEMIC COMMUNITY HALL.

THE TRAINEES, WHO ARE BETWEEN SEVEN AND 23 YEARS OF AGE, HAD BEEN ATTENDING THE FULL-SCALE INSTRUMENTAL TRAINING PROGRAMME RUN BY THE MUSIC OFFICE, RECREATION AND CULTURE DEPARTMENT.

THE CONCERT PROGRAMME WILL INCLUDE PERFORMANCES BY THE HONG KONG CHILDREN'S SYMPHONIC BAND, THE CHINESE FOLK SINGING CHILDREN'S ENSEMBLE, AND THE MUSIC OFFICE TRAINEES' CHINESE ORCHESTRA.

ORGANISED BY THE GEOGRAPHY SECTION OF THE DEPARTMENT'S ADVISORY INSPECTORATE, THE SEMINARS ARE DESIGNED TO FAMILIARISE TEACHERS WITH THE REVISED SYLLABUS AND TO ASSIST THEM IN ITS IMPLEMENTATION.

THESE SEMINARS, EACH LASTING THREE HOURS, WILL BE HELD ON APRIL 26 AND 27 AT THE GRANTHAM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AT GASCOIGNE ROAD, KOWLOON.
