CUSTOMS OFFICERS HAVE SEIZED A FURTHER 1 000 BOTTLES OF AUSTRIAN WINES OF THE TWO BRANDS IDENTIFIED EARLIER AS CONTAINING DIETHYLENE GLYCOL IN A WAREHOUSE IN KWAI CHUNG IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE NAMES OF THE WINES ARE: TRAUSDORFTER WELSCHRIESLING TROCKEN BEERENAUSSLESE 1982 AND FELFER SCHILLINGSBERG GRUNER VEELTLINER EISWEIN-OSTERREICH 1983.

INVESTIGATIONS ARE STILL CONTINUING IN ORDER TO RECOVER AS MANY BOTTLES AS POSSIBLE.

THE YIN NGAI SPIRIT OF NEIGHBOURLINESS IS AN ENCOURAGEMENT TO WOMEN TO MAKE FULL USE OF THEIR LEISURE TIME AND TO DEVELOP THEIR POTENTIAL TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY, SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR EDDY CHAN, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

THREE PATROL LAUNCHES COMMISSIONED
* * * *

THREE HIGH-EFFICIENCY PATROL LAUNCHES, THE LATEST ACQUISITIONS OF THE MARINE POLICE, WERE TODAY (SATURDAY) COMMISSIONED BY THE ACTING COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, MR JAMES MORRIN, IN JOSS HOUSE BAY.

BUILT IN HONG KONG BY CHUNG WAH SHIPBUILDING AND ENGINEERING COMPANY, THE NEW DAMEN CLASS LAUNCHES-- KING SHUN, KING TAK AND KING CHI -- HAVE TAKEN THE MARINE POLICE TO MORE THAN HALF WAY THROUGH THEIR PROGRAMME OF BUILDING 15 DAMEN LAUNCHES BY JANUARY 1, 1986.

THE NEW LAUNCHES BRING TO NINE THE TOTAL NUMBER OF DAMEN LAUNCHES EMPLOYED IN THE IMPORTANT TASK OF MAINTAINING LAW AND ORDER AND SECURITY IN THE WATERS OF HONG KONG, THEREBY CONTINUING THE HIGH TRADITIONS THE MARINE POLICE HAVE ESTABLISHED FOR MORE THAN 100 YEARS.

SPEAKING AT THE COMMISSIONING CEREMONY, THE ACTING COMMISSIONER SAID THE NEW LAUNCHES BROUGHT BACK MEMORIES OF HIS ASSOCIATION WITH THE MARINE POLICE IN 1965, WHEN HE WAS PRESENT AT THE COMMISSIONING OF THE POLICE LAUNCHES NO. 1 AND 2, WHICH ARE STILL RENDERING VALUABLE SERVICE AFTER 20 YEARS.

EXTENSIVE DEVELOPMENT HAD TAKEN PLACE WITHIN THE MARINE POLICE THROUGHOUT THESE YEARS AND, TODAY, POLICE PATROL LAUNCHES WERE EQUIPPED WITH THE MOST UP-TO-DATE MACHINERY AND FITTINGS, MR MORRIN SAID.

EACH OF THE NEW LAUNCHES, MEASURING 27.8 METRES AND CAPABLE OF SPEEDS OF UP TO 25 KNOTS, WILL BE MANNED BY HIGHLY-TRAINED AND EXPERIENCED MARINE POLICE OFFICERS.

EARLIER, MR MORRIN, LIT JOSS STICKS AND TOOK PART IN TRADITIONAL CHINESE CEREMONIES ABOARD THE NEW LAUNCHES, ACCOMPANIED BY THE REGIONAL COMMANDER, MARINE, MR JOHN MACDONALD, THE DIVISIONAL COMMANDER WEST MARINE, MR RICHARD BELL, THE DIVISIONAL COMMANDER SOUTH MARINE, MR KONG SHING-SHUN AND THE DIVISIONAL COMMANDER NORTH MARINE, MR RICHARD WORRALL.

MR MORRIN ALSO PRESENTED COMMISSIONING PLAQUES TO THE OFFICERS IN CHARGE OF THE NEW LAUNCHES : SENIOR INSPECTOR CHEUNG WING-KEE, AND INSPECTORS TSE CHUN-NAM AND YEUNG WING-YIU.

AFTER THE COMMISSIONING, THE NEW LAUNCHES CAST OFF AND SALUTED THE QUEEN OF HEAVEN BY COMPLETING THREE FIGURES-OF-EIGHT IN THE WATERS OF JOSS HOUSE BAY.

MORE QUARTERS TO BE BUILT

QUARTERS FOR SENIOR MEDICAL STAFF ARE TO BE BUILT ON A 1.7-HECTARE SITE TO THE SOUTH OF TUEN MUN HOSPITAL NOW UNDER CONSTRUCTION.

THE WORK WILL INVOLVE THE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO 21-STOREY BLOCKS AND ONE 26-STOREY BLOCK, COMPRISING A TOTAL OF 136 UNITS, AND TWO TENNIS COURTS AND ONE BASKETBALL COURT.

CAR PARKING FACILITIES WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE PROJECT, WHICH WILL TAKE 24 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

MEANWHILE, A SIX-STOREY QUARTERS BLOCK FOR STAFF OF THE KWAI CHUNG INCINERATION PLANT IS TO BE BUILT AT KWAI LUEN ROAD, KWAI CHUNG.

THE BLOCK WILL HAVE 55 UNITS, AND A CAR PARKING AREA WILL ALSO BE PROVIDED.

WORK ON THE PROJECT WILL BE COMPLETED IN AUGUST NEXT YEAR.

THE ARCHITECTURAL OFFICE OF THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR BOTH PROJECTS WHICH WILL START IN OCTOBER.

COMPUTER PROGRAMMES FOR ROAD SAFETY BUS CHOSEN

SIXTEEN WINNING ENTRIES IN THE ROAD SAFETY COMPUTER PROGRAMME DESIGN COMPETITION WERE SELECTED TODAY (SATURDAY), AFTER THREE DAYS OF DELIBERATION.

THE PANEL OF ADJUDICATORS COMPRISED SIX REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE HONG KONG COMPUTER SOCIETY — MR DEREK CHEUNG, MRS AGNES MAK, MR GEORGE MOK, MR WILLIAM LUI, MR LEUNG KIN-PING AND MR LAW HING-CHEUNG— THE CHIEF INSPECTOR, ROAD SAFETY SECTION, TRAFFIC WING, ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE, MISS MEAGE CHOY— AND TRANSPORT OFFICER, ROAD SAFETY AND STANDARDS DIVISION, TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT, MISS ESTHER CHAN.

DURING THE ADJUDICATION, EACH PROGRAMME DISK OF THE PARTICIPANTS WAS INSERTED INTO A COMPUTER TO TEST ITS FEASIBILITY, PROFICIENCY AND THE DESIGN CONCEPT.

THE PRINCIPAL ADJUDICATOR, MR DEREK CHEUNG, SAID, +WE ARE PLEASED WITH THE RESPONSE TO THE COMPETITION, TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION THE FACT THAT ONLY PEOPLE WITH TECHNICAL KNOW-HOW OF COMPUTER PROGRAMMING COULD TAKE PART, AND THE STANDARD OF THE ENTRIES WAS SO HIGH THAT WE HAD TO RE-EXAMINE THE DISKS BEFORE DECIDING ON THE WINNERS.

THE WINNING ENTRIES WILL BE FED INTO AN APPLE II E COMPUTER INSTALLED IN THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE'S ROAD SAFETY BUS.

THE BUS, EQUIPPED WITH DISPLAY BOARDS, A TELEVISION SET AND A VIDEO TAPE RECORDER, REGULARLY VISITS SCHOOLS, COMMUNITY HALLS, HOUSING ESTATES THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY TO SPREAD ROAD SAFETY MESSAGES TO THE PUBLIC, PARTICULARLY YOUNGSTERS.

THE ROAD SAFETY COMPUTER PROGRAMME DESIGN COMPETITION WAS ORGANISED BY THE ROAD SAFETY PUBLICITY COMMITTEE IN CONJUNCTION WITH CATHAY PACIFIC AIRWAYS, HANG SENG BANK, HONG KONG COMPUTER SOCIETY AND SOUTH CHINA MORNING POST, AS A PART OF THIS YEAR'S ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN.

THE COMPETITION WAS DIVIDED INTO A SENIOR AND JUNIOR SECTION. THE FORMER WAS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC, INCLUDING POST SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS WHILE THE LATTER WAS RESTRICTED TO SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS UP TO F. 7 LEVEL.

THE ENGINEERING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT PLANS TO CLOSE THE SECTION OF CLEVERLY STREET BETWEEN DES VOEUX ROAD CENTRAL AND CONNAUGHT ROAD CENTRAL TEMPORARILY TO FACILITATE WORK ON A SECTION OF DES VOEUX ROAD CENTRAL.

THIS WILL INVOLVE THE RECONSTRUCTION OF THE CARRIAGEWAY AND PART OF THE FOOTPATHS WITHIN DES VOEUX ROAD CENTRAL, BETWEEN WING WO STREET AND MORRISON STREET.
