APPOINTMENT OF INDEPENDENT DIRECTOR TO HK FUTURES EXCHANGE

\* \* \* \* \*

THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, SIR PIERS JACOBS, ANNOUNCED TODAY (MONDAY) THAT THE GOVERNOR HAS APPOINTED MR TAKASHI MORI AS AN INDEPENDENT DIRECTOR TO THE BOARD OF THE HONG KONG FUTURES EXCHANGE (HKFE) WITH EFFECT FROM JUNE 21, 1990, THE DATE ON WHICH THE EXCHANGE HOLDS ITS FIFTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (AGM).

THE SUCCESSFUL RECONSTITUTION OF THE HKFE IN MAY 1989 PROVIDES THAT ITS BOARD SHOULD BE BROADLY-BASED AND REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARKETS, THEIR USERS AND THE PUBLIC INTEREST, IN LINE WITH THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SECURITIES REVIEW COMMITTEE.

"THE APPOINTMENT OF MR MORI WILL ENHANCE THE REPRESENTATIVENESS OF THE BOARD OF THE EXCHANGE, AND HELP PROMOTE AND DEVELOP THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE JAPANESE FINANCIAL COMMUNITY AND THE EXCHANGE," HE SAID.

MR MORI IS THE MANAGING DIRECTOR OF SANWA INTERNATIONAL FINANCE LTD. BEFORE COMING TO HONG KONG IN 1987, HE WAS WITH SANWA IN TOKYO AND LONDON.

UNDER ARTICLE 73(B) OF THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE EXCHANGE, THE GOVERNOR HAS TO APPOINT THE FIRST FOUR INDEPENDENT DIRECTORS TO THE BOARD AS VACANCIES ARISE. THE FIRST THREE INDEPENDENT DIRECTORS WERE APPOINTED IN JUNE 1989.

THE COMING AGM REPRESENTS THE LAST PHASE OF MEMBERSHIP REFORM OF THE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NEW CONSTITUTION.

"CREDIT SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE EXCHANGE MEMBERS, WHO HAVE DEMONSTRATED THEIR SUPPORT FOR THE REFORMS, WITH WHICH THE EXCHANGE IS BETTER EQUIPPED TO DEVELOP THE FUTURES MARKET IN HONG KONG," SIR PIERS SAID.

INTEREST IN AIRPORT LEGAL WORK INVITED

\* \* \* \* \*

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S CHAMBERS ARE INVITING EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST FROM FIRMS OF SOLICITORS TO PROVIDE LEGAL SERVICES FOR THE GOVERNMENT IN RELATION TO THE PORT AND AIRPORT DEVELOPMENT PROJECT.

THE AIRPORT PROJECT IS EXPECTED TO GENERATE A CONSIDERABLE VOLUME OF LEGAL WORK. AT PRESENT ALL SUCH WORK IS BEING HANDLED BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S CHAMBERS.

HOWEVER, RESOURCES WITHIN THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S CHAMBERS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT TO COPE WITH THE INCREASED WORKLOAD AS THE PROJECT PROGRESSES. THE GOVERNMENT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERING ENGAGING SOLICITORS IN PRIVATE PRACTICE TO HANDLE SOME OF THAT WORK.

/ANY DECISION .....

ANY DECISION WILL BE DEPENDENT UPON THE APPROVAL OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL. A CONSIDERABLE AMOUNT OF THE LEGAL WORK INVOLVED WILL CONTINUE TO BE DEALT WITH WITHIN THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S CHAMBERS.

THE CROWN SOLICITOR HAS WRITTEN TO SOME 30 LARGE AND MEDIUM SIZED FIRMS OF SOLICITORS INVITING EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST. THE FIRMS ARE ASKED TO RESPOND IN WRITING BY JUNE 29 THIS YEAR.

IT IS EXPECTED THAT THE MAIN AREAS OF LAW IN WHICH SERVICES WILL BE REQUIRED WILL BE CONSTRUCTION, PROJECT FINANCE AND CONTRACT.

### NEARLY 17,000 PRIVATE BUILDINGS IN NEED OF ATTENTION

FINDINGS OF AN EXTERNAL SURVEY ON STRUCTURAL CONDITIONS OF PRIVATE SECTOR BUILDINGS CONDUCTED BY THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE INDICATE THAT ABOUT 16,700 BUILDINGS ARE IN A SUSPECT STRUCTURAL CONDITION, REQUIRING A MORE IN-DEPTH SURVEY TO ASCERTAIN THE EXTENT OF DETERIORATION.

ANNOUNCING DETAILS OF THE SURVEY AT A PRESS CONFERENCE TODAY (MONDAY), THE PRINCIPAL GOVERNMENT BUILDING SURVEYOR OF THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE, MR ANTHONY SAMSON, SAID OWNERS OF THESE PREMISES WOULD BE ORDERED TO CARRY OUT NECESSARY REPAIRS.

THE SURVEY HAD TAKEN EIGHT MONTHS TO COMPLETE AND COVERED THE EXTERNAL INSPECTION OF 55,500 BUILDINGS IN THE URBAN AREAS ON HONG KONG ISLAND, KOWLOON AND THE BUILT-UP AREAS OF THE NEW TERRITORIES.

ABOUT 38,590 BUILDINGS WERE CONSIDERED TO BE IN A REASONABLE CONDITION AND WERE UNLIKELY TO REQUIRE ANY MAJOR REPAIRS WITHIN THE NEXT FIVE YEARS, MR SAMSON SAID.

"ANOTHER 210 BUILDINGS HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED AS IN A DANGEROUS STRUCTURAL CONDITION REQUIRING URGENT ATTENTION.

"OF THESE, A TOTAL OF SEVEN TO DATE HAVE BEEN CLOSED UNDER COURT ORDERS AND HAVE ALSO BEEN SERVED WITH DEMOLITION ORDERS," HE SAID.

APART FROM TWO PRE-WAR BUILDINGS, THE REMAINING FIVE WERE CONSTRUCTED IN THE MID TO LATE 1950'S.

ACCORDING TO MR SAMSON, NEARLY 200 RESIDENTS HAD BEEN REMOVED FOLLOWING THE DEMOLITION OF THESE SEVEN BUILDINGS.

A FURTHER 10 BUILDINGS WHICH WERE ALSO CONSTRUCTED IN THE MID TO LATE 1950'S WERE IDENTIFIED AS BEING IN A SIMILAR DILAPIDATED CONDITION, WARRANTING CLOSURE AND DEMOLITION VERY SOON. THIS WOULD RESULT IN THE REMOVAL OF ABOUT 350 RESIDENTS FOR THEIR SAFETY, MR SAMSON SAID.

/"THE COMPLETION .....

"THE COMPLETION OF THIS PRELIMINARY EXTERNAL INSPECTION REPRESENTS ONLY THE FIRST PHASE OF THIS SPECIAL PRIVATE BUILDING INSPECTION EXERCISE AND IT IS NOW NECESSARY IN A FIVE-YEAR PERIOD TO FOLLOW UP AND INVESTIGATE ALL THOSE BUILDINGS FOUND TO BE IN A SUSPECT CONDITION.

"EFFORTS ARE FIRSTLY BEING CONCENTRATED IN DEALING WITH THE REMAINING 193 BUILDINGS WHICH ARE CLASSIFIED AS IMMINENTLY DANGEROUS," HE STRESSED.

MR SAMSON DID NOT RULE OUT THE POSSIBILITY OF MORE BUILDINGS IN THE GROUP BEING SUBJECT TO CLOSURE AND DEMOLITION ORDERS.

"THE BUILDINGS THAT ARE CONSIDERED TO WARRANT FURTHER DETAILED SURVEY WILL THEN BE INVESTIGATED, WITH A VIEW TO SERVING REPAIR ORDERS UPON THE OWNERS," HE SAID.

HE SAID IT HAD LONG BEEN KNOWN THAT THERE WAS A PROBLEM REGARDING THE DETERIORATION OF CONCRETE STRUCTURES, ESPECIALLY THOSE ERECTED IN THE EARLY POST-WAR ERA.

"THE REASONS FOR THE RAPID DETERIORATION OF THESE CONCRETE BUILDINGS, IN SUCH A SHORT TIME SPAN OF LESS THAN 40 YEARS, MAY BE DUE TO INFERIOR QUALITY MATERIALS, IMPURITIES IN WATER CONTENT AND POOR WORKMANSHIP IN THE ORIGINAL CONSTRUCTION," HE POINTED OUT.

"THE CONDITIONS MAY ALSO BE AGGRAVATED BY OVERLOADING, WEATHERING IN A POLLUTED ATMOSPHERE AND AN ALMOST COMPLETE NEGLECT OF MAINTENANCE AFTER CONSTRUCTION," MR SAMSON ADDED.

RELATIVELY DRY IN MAY

A WET APRIL WAS FOLLOWED BY A RELATIVELY DRY MAY THIS YEAR, ACCORDING TO THE MONTHLY WEATHER REPORT RELEASED BY THE ROYAL OBSERVATORY TODAY (MONDAY).

THE MONTHLY RAINFALL OF 102.4 MILLIMETRES WAS JUST OVER ONE-THIRD OF THE MAY NORMAL OF 298.1 MILLIMETRES. AS A RESULT OF THE LATEST SHORTFALL OF NEARLY 200 MILLIMETRES, THE SURPLUS ACCUMULATED OVER THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF THE YEAR WAS SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCED.

RAINFALL SINCE JANUARY 1 NOW STOOD AT 633.1 MILLIMETRES, ONLY 13 PER CENT ABOVE THE NORMAL OF 561.1 MILLIMETRES FOR THE SAME PERIOD.

TROPICAL CYCLONE SIGNALS WERE HOISTED FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS YEAR FOR TYPHOON MARIAN, BUT MARIAN FAILED TO BRING ANY SIGNIFICANT RAIN TO THE TERRITORY.

THE SUNNY WEATHER TOWARDS THE END OF APRIL CONTINUED INTO EARLY MAY. HOWEVER, VISIBILITY WAS POOR AT TIMES, PARTICULARLY IN THE MORNINGS AND EVENINGS. FOG WAS REPORTED OFFSHORE ON MAY 1 TO 3 AND SOME MIST PATCHES ALSO DRIFTED INSIDE THE HARBOUR.

THE WEATHER BECAME CLOUDY WITH SOME INTERMITTENT LIGHT RAIN ON MAY 4 FOLLOWING THE PASSAGE OF A WEAK TROUGH OF LOW PRESSURE THE PREVIOUS NIGHT.

THE ADVECTION OF SLIGHTLY COOLER AIR FROM THE NORTH RESULTED IN A MINIMUM TEMPERATURE OF 19.9 DEGREES ON THE MORNING OF MAY 5, THE LOWEST FOR THE MONTH.

AFTER THE MODERATION OF THE COOL NORTHERLY AIRSTREAM, BRIGHT AND CALM CONDITIONS PREVAILED OVER THE NEXT FEW DAYS.

THE WEATHER TURNED CLOUDY ON THE NIGHT OF MAY 8 AS A MOIST EASTERLY AIRSTREAM SET IN. SCATTERED THUNDERSTORMS OCCURRED THE NEXT MORNING AND CONDITIONS BECAME EVEN MORE UNSETTLED OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF DAYS.

FROM AN AREA OF LOW PRESSURE NEAR BEIBU WAN, RAIN CLOUDS DEVELOPED AND SWEEPED EASTWARDS TO AFFECT THE TERRITORY FROM TIME TO TIME. THE RAIN WAS HEAVIEST ON MAY 11 AND ANOTHER OUTBREAK ON THE NIGHT OF MAY 12 WAS ACCOMPANIED BY SOME THUNDERSTORMS.

THE RAIN EASED OFF THE NEXT DAY. LONG SUNNY PERIODS OCCURRED ON MAY 14. BUT THE FRESHENING OF EASTERLIES THAT NIGHT BROUGHT THE CLOUDS BACK ALONG WITH SOME MORNING AND EVENING DRIZZLE ON MAY 15 TO 16.

RAIN BECAME HEAVIER LATER ON MAY 17 AS A TROUGH OF LOW PRESSURE MOVED ACROSS SOUTHEASTERN CHINA. THE NORTHERLIES BEHIND THE TROUGH AGAIN BROUGHT RELATIVELY COOL WEATHER TO THE COASTAL AREAS.

MEANWHILE, MARIAN HAD DEVELOPED INTO A TROPICAL STORM IN THE VICINITY OF NANSHA AND INTENSIFIED FURTHER TO A TYPHOON WHILE MOVING NORTH TOWARDS XISHA.

A TROPICAL CYCLONE SIGNAL WAS HOISTED FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS YEAR ON MAY 17. CONDITIONS WERE MAINLY CLOUDY AND WINDS WERE OCCASIONALLY STRONG OFFSHORE AS MARIAN TURNED NORTHEASTWARDS AND HEADED TOWARDS DONGSHA THE FOLLOWING DAY.

WHILE MARIAN WAS MOVING AWAY IN THE DIRECTION OF TAIWAN, DRIER AIR FROM THE CONTINENT AFFECTED THE SOUTH CHINA COASTAL AREAS. THE WEATHER TURNED SUNNY ON MAY 19 AND REMAINED GENERALLY FINE FOR THE NEXT FOUR DAYS APART FROM THE INCREASE IN CLOUDINESS TOWARDS THE END OF THE PERIOD.

AFTER THE PASSAGE OF A TROUGH OF LOW PRESSURE EARLY ON MAY 24, THE WEATHER TURNED CLOUDY AND RELATIVELY COOL. LIGHT RAIN BECAME NEARLY CONTINUOUS FROM THE EVENING OF MAY 25 TO THE AFTERNOON OF MAY 27 WHEN FRESH EASTERLY WINDS WERE BLOWING.

/A LULL .....

A LULL IN THE EASTERLIES RESULTED IN A BRIGHTER DAY ON MAY 28.

THE WINDS FRESHENED AGAIN THE NEXT DAY AND THE CLOUDS ALSO RETURNED. AFTER SOME MORNING RAIN ON MAY 30, THE EASTERLIES SUBSIDED AND THE WEATHER TURNED BRIGHTER.

SUNNY CONDITION ON MAY 31 CAUSED THE TEMPERATURE TO CLIMB TO A MAXIMUM OF 30.7 DEGREES, THE HIGHEST FOR THE MONTH AND THE HOTTEST SO FAR THIS YEAR.

DURING THE MONTH OF MAY, TWO TROPICAL CYCLONES OCCURRED OVER THE WESTERN NORTH PACIFIC AND THE SOUTH CHINA SEA. TWO AIRCRAFT WERE DIVERTED DUE TO ADVERSE WEATHER IN THE MONTH. THUNDERSTORM WARNINGS WERE ISSUED FOR MAY 3, 4, 9, 12 AND 13. A YELLOW FIRE DANGER WARNING WAS IN EFFECT ON MAY 5.

DONATION SETS UP SELF-FINANCING HOME FOR THE ELDERLY  
\* \* \* \* \*

A NEW SELF-FINANCING HOME FOR THE ELDERLY WILL BE ESTABLISHED IN TIME TO RECEIVE RESIDENTS IN THE MIDDLE OF NEXT YEAR, FOLLOWING A GENEROUS PRIVATE DONATION OF \$10 MILLION RECEIVED BY THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT TODAY (MONDAY).

THE DONATION WAS MADE BY AN ACADEMIC AND RETIRED RESEARCHER DR HUI WAI-HAAN. IN ACCORDANCE WITH DR HUI'S WISHES, A CHARITABLE TRUST UNDER HER NAME HAS BEEN SET UP UNDER THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE INCORPORATED TO PROVIDE SERVICES FOR THE ELDERLY, PRIMARILY RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES, TO BE NAMED AFTER HER LATE MOTHER MRS HUI MOK TAK-YU.

SPEAKING AT A CHEQUE PRESENTATION CEREMONY THIS MORNING AT THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR M.D. CARTLAND, SAID THERE WAS AN ACUTE SHORTFALL OF CARE AND ATTENTION PLACES IN HONG KONG.

"THIS GENEROUS DONATION HAS MADE IT POSSIBLE TO ESTABLISH AN ADDITIONAL SELF-FINANCING HOME AT SHORT NOTICE.

"THIS PROJECT WILL SUPPLEMENT OUR EXISTING PLANS AND WILL COME ON STREAM MORE QUICKLY BECAUSE IT WILL MAKE USE OF EXISTING ACCOMMODATION TO BE PURCHASED AND ADAPTED, RATHER THAN PURPOSE-BUILT ACCOMMODATION WHICH CAN TAKE A VERY LONG TIME TO COMPLETE.

"IT WILL THUS HELP TO BRING SOME EARLY RELIEF TO THE DEMAND FOR PLACEMENTS FOR THE ELDERLY," HE SAID.

MR CARTLAND SAID IF EVERYTHING WENT SMOOTHLY, THIS SELF-FINANCING HOME FOR ELDERLY PERSONS WOULD PROVIDE ABOUT 100 ADDITIONAL CARE AND ATTENTION PLACES BY THE MIDDLE OF NEXT YEAR.

"RESIDENTS OF THE HOME WILL MAINLY COME FROM THE CENTRAL WAITING LIST MAINTAINED BY THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT," HE SAID.

MR CARTLAND STRESSED THAT WHILE THE GOVERNMENT UNDERTOOK TO PROVIDE MORE SERVICES FOR THE ELDERLY, IN PARTICULAR RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES, MORE FACILITIES COULD BE PROVIDED AT A FASTER PACE WITH THE HELP OF PRIVATE DONATIONS.

HE PAID TRIBUTE TO DR HUI FOR THE GENEROSITY AND REMARKED THAT SHE HAD SET A GOOD EXAMPLE FOR THE COMMUNITY.

SWD STAFF WERE NOW ALREADY LOOKING FOR SUITABLE PREMISES IN PRIVATE DEVELOPMENTS FOR THE SETTING UP OF THIS HOME FOR THE ELDERLY, WHICH WOULD BE RUN BY A NON-PROFIT-MAKING AGENCY," HE SAID.

AFTER GRADUATING FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG IN THE EARLY 30'S, MAJORING IN CHEMISTRY, DR HUI HELD A SERIES OF KEY TEACHING POSTS IN HKU UNTIL HER RETIREMENT IN THE EARLY 70'S.

SINCE THEN SHE HAS BEEN ENGAGED IN RESEARCH WORK WITH THE UNIVERSITY AS AN HONORARY RESEARCH ASSOCIATE.

EARLIER, DR HUI ALSO MADE A GENEROUS DONATION TO HKU IN MEMORY OF HER LATE FATHER MR HUI PUN-HING.

ACCOMPANYING DR HUI AT THE CHEQUE PRESENTATION CEREMONY WAS THE DIRECTOR OF THE HONG KONG COUNCIL OF SOCIAL SERVICE, MR HUI YIN-FAT, WHO ALSO PAID TRIBUTE TO DR HUI FOR HER GENEROUS ACT.

FERRY PASSENGERS URGED TO CO-OPERATE IN SURVEY

A SURVEY ON THE TRAVELLING CHARACTERISTICS OF FERRY PASSENGERS WILL BE CONDUCTED BY THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT FROM TOMORROW (TUESDAY) TO THURSDAY (JUNE 14) AT VARIOUS FERRY PIERS THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY.

DURING THE SURVEY, TRANSPORT INSPECTORS OF THE DEPARTMENT WILL INTERVIEW FERRY USERS ON INFORMATION PERTINENT TO THEIR TRAVELLING PATTERN.

THE INFORMATION TO BE COLLECTED WILL INCLUDE THE ORIGIN AND DESTINATION OF PASSENGERS, TRIP PURPOSES, ACCESS AND EGRESS TRANSPORT MODES AND THE REASONS FOR CHOICE OF FERRY SERVICES.

A TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED THAT THE INFORMATION COLLECTED WILL BE USED AS A BASIS FOR STUDIES IN DEVELOPING FUTURE FERRY SERVICES.

ALL DATA COLLECTED WILL BE TREATED IN STRICT CONFIDENCE AND WILL BE USED FOR REFERENCE ONLY, HE ADDED.

HE URGED FERRY PASSENGERS TO CO-OPERATE WITH INSPECTORS OF THE DEPARTMENT WHO WILL CARRY WITH THEM GOVERNMENT IDENTIFICATION.
