FULL MILITARY HONOURS FOR SIR EDWARD YOUDE  
\* \* \* \* \*

A FUNERAL SERVICE, WITH FULL MILITARY HONOURS, WILL BE HELD FOR THE LATE GOVERNOR, SIR EDWARD YOUDE, ON TUESDAY (DECEMBER 9).

THE CEREMONY WILL START WITH SIR EDWARD'S COFFIN BEING DRIVEN TO ST. JOHN'S CATHEDRAL FROM GOVERNMENT HOUSE ON A CARRIAGE, ESCORTED BY A CEREMONIAL PROCESSION COMMANDED BY COMMANDER GURKHA FIELD FORCE, BRIGADIER RAY PETT.

BEFORE THE COFFIN IS PLACED ON THE CARRIAGE, THERE WILL BE A FLYPAST BY AIRCRAFT OF THE ROYAL AIR FORCE, THE ARMY AIR CORPS, AND THE ROYAL HONG KONG AUXILIARY AIR FORCE AT 10.28 AM. A 17-GUN SALUTE WILL BE FIRED AT HMS TAMAR.

THE CEREMONIAL PROCESSION WILL MOVE FROM GOVERNMENT HOUSE TO THE CATHEDRAL VIA UPPER ALBERT ROAD, LOWER ALBERT ROAD, AND THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES CARPARK. THE ROUTE WILL BE LINED BY ABOUT 1 000 POLICE OFFICERS.

LEADING THE PROCESSION WILL BE A DETACHMENT OF ABOUT 500 MEN FROM THE ROYAL NAVY, THE ROYAL MARINES, THE 1ST BATTALION COLDSTREAM GUARDS, THE 1ST BATTALION 2ND KING EDWARD VII'S OWN GURKHA RIFLES, THE 10TH PRINCESS MARY'S OWN GURKHA RIFLES AND THE BAND OF THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE.

BEHIND THEM WILL BE THE CARRIAGE, WHICH WILL BE FLANKED BY 16 PALL-BEARERS AND EIGHT COFFIN BEARERS DRAWN FROM THE COLDSTREAM GUARDS.

THE 16 PALL BEARERS WILL BE THE CHIEF JUSTICE, SIR DENYS ROBERTS; THE COMMANDER BRITISH FORCES, MAJOR GENERAL ANTHONY BOAM; THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, MR PIERS JACOBS; THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, MR MICHAEL THOMAS; SIR S.Y. CHUNG; MR OSWALD CHEUNG; SIR MICHAEL SANDBERG; MR Q.W. LEE; MR S.L. CHEN; MR ERIC HO; MR DONALD LIAO; MR ALLEN LEE; MR PETER C. WONG; DR CHIU HING-KWONG; DR DANIEL TSE; AND SIR ROGER LOBO.

THEY WILL BE FOLLOWED BY THE INSIGNIA BEARERS, WHO WILL INCLUDE THE PRIVATE SECRETARY, GOVERNMENT HOUSE, MR RICHARD HOARE, THE GOVERNOR'S ADC, SUPERINTENDENT PAUL COLLIER, AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE ROYAL NAVY.

FOLLOWING THEM WILL BE THE CAR CARRYING LADY YOUDE AND HER TWO DAUGHTERS.

THE ACTING GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, THE QUEEN'S REPRESENTATIVE AT THE FUNERAL SERVICE, AND LADY AKERS-JONES, WILL FOLLOW ON FOOT.

FOLLOWING WILL BE A PROCESSION CONSISTING OF FAMILY FRIENDS OF SIR EDWARD AND LADY YOUDE, MISS LYDIA DUNN, MISS MARIA TAM, OTHER MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE NCNA, THE COMMONWEALTH COMMISSIONERS, THE DOYEN OF THE CONSULAR CORPS, JUDGES AND SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, AND REPRESENTATIVES FROM VARIOUS SECTORS OF THE COMMUNITY INCLUDING THE CHAIRMEN OF THE 19 DISTRICT BOARDS.

ALSO PRESENT WILL BE THE MINISTER OF STATE AT THE FCO WITH SPECIAL RESPONSIBILITIES FOR HONG KONG, MR TIMOTHY RENTON- PERMANENT UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE AT THE FCO, SIR PATRICK WRIGHT- THE BRITISH AMBASSADOR TO PEKING, SIR RICHARD EVANS, AND THE ASSISTANT UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE (ASIA) AT THE FCO, DR DAVID WILSON.

COMPLETING THE PROCESSION WILL BE ANOTHER 500 SERVICEMEN DRAWN FROM THE 10 TH PRINCESS MARY'S OWN GURKHA RIFLES, THE QUEEN'S GURKHA ENGINEERS, THE QUEEN'S GURKHA SIGNALS, THE GURKHA TRANSPORT REGIMENT, THE HONG KONG MILITARY SERVICE CORPS, THE ROYAL AIR FORCE AND THE ROYAL HONG KONG AUXILIARY AIR FORCE, THE ROYAL HONG KONG REGIMENT (THE VOLUNTEERS) AND THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE.

A LINING PARTY OF 24 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE HONG KONG MILITARY SERVICE CORPS WILL AWAIT THE FUNERAL PROCESSION AT THE CATHEDRAL.

ON ARRIVAL, THE PROCESSION WILL BE MET AT THE DOOR BY THE BISHOP OF HONG KONG, THE RT REV PETER KWONG KONG-KIT. GUESTS WILL BE TAKEN TO THEIR SEATS BY A GROUP OF 50 USHERS DRAWN FROM HONORARY ADC'S, THE ROYAL NAVY, THE HONG KONG MILITARY SERVICE CORPS, THE ROYAL HONG KONG REGIMENT, THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE AND THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT.

THE SERVICE, STARTING AT 11.30 AM, WILL INCLUDE EULOGIES TO BE DELIVERED BY SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, AND THE SENIOR MEMBER OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL, SIR S.Y. CHUNG.

THE SERVICE WILL LAST FOR ABOUT 35 MINUTES, AFTER WHICH SIR EDWARD'S BODY WILL BE BORNE BACK TO THE CARRIAGE AND DRIVEN TO THE CAPE COLLINSON CREMATORIUM WHERE IT WILL BE CREMATED.

A SECOND 17-GUN SALUTE WILL BE FIRED AT HMS TAMAR WHEN THE CORTEGE LEAVES THE CATHEDRAL.

THE CARRIAGE WILL BE ESCORTED BY SIX LANDROVERS OF THE ROYAL HONG KONG REGIMENT AND BY POLICE OUTRIDERS.

ONCE THE CARRIAGE LEAVES THE CATHEDRAL, THE SERVICE WILL BE PRIVATE FOR SIR EDWARD'S FAMILY AND CLOSE FRIENDS.

ABOUT 700 GUESTS, REPRESENTING A WIDE CROSS-SECTION OF THE COMMUNITY, HAVE BEEN INVITED TO ATTEND THE FUNERAL SERVICE AT THE CATHEDRAL.

OTHER INVITED GUESTS WILL BE ABLE TO WATCH THE SERVICE FROM TELEVISION MONITORS IN THE TWO SIDE-HALLS OF THE CATHEDRAL.

ARRANGEMENTS HAVE ALSO BEEN MADE FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO FOLLOW THE PROCEEDINGS FROM THE TELEVISION MONITORS AT THE HONG KONG COLISEUM IN HUNG HOM.

DUE TO TECHNICAL DIFFICULTIES, IT HAS NOT BEEN POSSIBLE TO PROVIDE A LIVE VIDEO FEED AT THE CITY HALL CONCERT HALL. HOWEVER, A LIVE RADIO FEED WILL BE PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO FOLLOW THE SERVICE.

IN ADDITION, THE FUNERAL SERVICE WILL BE BROADCAST LIVE ON TELEVISION AND RADIO. COVERAGE WILL START WHEN THE PROCESSION LEAVES GOVERNMENT HOUSE AND END WHEN THE PARTY LEAVES THE CATHEDRAL.

RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG WILL PROVIDE LIVE SOUND AND VIDEO FEEDS FOR THE ELECTRONIC MEDIA. COVERAGE WILL INCLUDE THE FUNERAL PROCESSION FROM GOVERNMENT HOUSE TO THE CATHEDRAL AND THE FUNERAL SERVICE ITSELF. IT WILL END WHEN THE PARTY LEAVES THE CATHEDRAL FOR CAPE COLLINSON.

OTHER FACILITIES FOR THE MEDIA ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. A FIXED POSITION INSIDE HMS TAMAR TO COVER THE FIRING OF THE 17-GUN SALUTES. MEDIA REPRESENTATIVES COVERING THE EVENT SHOULD ASSEMBLE OUTSIDE THE MAIN GATE OF HMS TAMAR AT 9.45 AM.
  2. A FIXED POSITION OUTSIDE GOVERNMENT HOUSE TO COVER THE START OF THE FUNERAL PROCESSION FROM GOVERNMENT HOUSE TO ST. JOHN'S CATHEDRAL. MEDIA REPRESENTATIVES SHOULD ASSEMBLE OUTSIDE THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE GUARD ROOM AT 10 AM.
  3. A FIXED POSITION AT LOWER ALBERT ROAD TO COVER THE PROCESSION. MEDIA REPRESENTATIVES SHOULD ASSEMBLE AT THE CGO CARPARK AT 10 AM.
  4. A FIXED POSITION OUTSIDE THE MAIN ENTRANCE OF ST. JOHN'S CATHEDRAL TO COVER THE ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF THE FUNERAL PROCESSION. MEDIA REPRESENTATIVES SHOULD ASSEMBLE OUTSIDE THE MAIN ENTRANCE TO THE CATHEDRAL AT 10.30 AM.
  5. A TOTAL OF 35 SEATS INSIDE THE CATHEDRAL HAS BEEN RESERVED FOR REPORTERS TO COVER THE FUNERAL SERVICE. IT IS STRESSED THAT THESE SEATS ARE FOR REPORTERS ONLY AND PHOTOGRAPHY WILL BE STRICTLY PROHIBITED. BECAUSE OF THE LIMITED NUMBER OF SEATS AVAILABLE, EACH NEWS ORGANISATION SHOULD ONLY NOMINATE ONE REPRESENTATIVE TO COVER THE SERVICE.
- \* EDITORS WISHING TO BID FOR THESE SEATS SHOULD PHONE IN THE NAMES OF THEIR REPORTERS TO THE GIS DUTY OFFICER BEFORE 4 PM TOMORROW (MONDAY). THEY WILL BE INFORMED LATER BY THE GIS DUTY OFFICER WHETHER OR NOT THEY HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED A SEAT.

PLAN FOR CITY POLYTECHNIC BLOCK APPROVED

AN EIGHT-STOREY ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATION BLOCK FOR THE CITY POLYTECHNIC IN TAT CHEE AVENUE, KOWLOON, WAS AMONG 49 PLANS APPROVED BY THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE IN OCTOBER.

ALSO APPROVED WAS AN EIGHT-STOREY ADMINISTRATION AND SCHOOL BUILDING IN PHASE III OF THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC DEVELOPMENT AND A FIVE-STOREY ACADEMIC BUILDING FOR THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY AT SHA TIN.

A 576-ROOM HOTEL OF 23 STOREYS IN PHASE II OF THE COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT AT KORNHILL WAS APPROVED FOR HANG LUNG (R.E.A.) LIMITED. IT WILL INCLUDE SHOPPING ARCADES AND A CAR PARK.

THE LARGEST NUMBER OF APPROVALS - 24 - WERE GIVEN FOR APARTMENT COMMERCIAL AND APARTMENT DEVELOPMENTS. THEY INCLUDED TWO APARTMENT BLOCKS, ONE OF 38 STOREYS AND THE OTHER OF 33 STOREYS, AT KOTEWALL ROAD, EIGHT THREE-STOREY APARTMENT BLOCKS AT REPULSE BAY ROAD, TWO FOUR-STOREY BLOCKS ALSO AT REPULSE BAY ROAD.

DURING THE MONTH A TOTAL OF 54 PROJECTS WERE GIVEN CONSENT TO PROCEED, INCLUDING A SCHOOL AND QUARTERS AT HORNSEY ROAD ON HONG KONG ISLAND, A HOTEL IN PHASE IV OF THE CITY GARDEN DEVELOPMENT IN ELECTRIC ROAD AND A FERRY TERMINAL, OFFICE AND COMMERCIAL PROJECT AT CANTON ROAD, KOWLOON.

THE NUMBER OF BUILDINGS CERTIFIED FOR OCCUPATION WAS 23, OF WHICH 18 WERE IN THE NEW TERRITORIES, WHILE 21 CONSENTS TO DEMOLISH 56 BUILDINGS WERE ISSUED.

THE TOTAL DECLARED COST OF BUILDINGS COMPLETED DURING THE MONTH WAS ALMOST \$250 MILLION, BRINGING THE TOTAL FOR THE FIRST 10 MONTHS OF THE YEAR TO OVER \$12 BILLION.

THE CONTROL AND ENFORCEMENT DIVISION OF THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE RECEIVED 498 COMPLAINTS ABOUT ILLEGAL STRUCTURES AND ILLEGAL BUILDING WORKS AND CARRIED OUT 893 INSPECTIONS.
