SAFETY OFFICERS FOR CONSTRUCTION WORK PLANNED  
\* \* \* \* \*

SHOULD LEGISLATION ON COMPULSORY EMPLOYMENT OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY OFFICERS BE ENACTED, IT WOULD PROBABLY BE APPLIED TO THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY FIRST BECAUSE IT IS THE MOST HAZARDOUS.

SPEAKING AT THE LUNCHEON MEETING OF THE BUILDING CONTRACTORS' ASSOCIATION TODAY (MONDAY), THE ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR DAVID LIN, SAID THAT THE PROPOSED LEGISLATION WOULD SUBSEQUENTLY BE APPLIED TO OTHER INDUSTRIES WHERE THE NEED WAS EVIDENT.

HE EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT WITH THE INTRODUCTION OF THE LEGISLATION, HONG KONG WOULD EXPERIENCE WHAT HAD BEEN ACHIEVED IN SINGAPORE WHERE SAFETY PERFORMANCE ON A NATIONAL BASIS HAD IMPROVED SIGNIFICANTLY SINCE THE COMING INTO EFFECT IN 1976 OF A LAW REQUIRING A NUMBER OF TRADES TO EMPLOY FULL OR PART-TIME SAFETY OFFICERS.

+IT IS HOPED THAT THE SITUATION IN HONG KONG WILL IMPROVE SIMILARLY AFTER THE INTRODUCTION OF THE PROPOSED LEGISLATION,+ HE ADDED.

MR LIN SAID THAT LOCAL INDUSTRIAL ESTABLISHMENTS INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION SITES ALREADY EMPLOYING SAFETY OFFICERS ARE GENERALLY MAINTAINING A HIGH STANDARD OF SAFETY PERFORMANCE WITH A LOW ACCIDENT RATE.

EARLIER, MR LIN POINTED OUT THAT ACCIDENTS ON CONSTRUCTION SITES, BOTH FATAL AND NON-FATAL, CONSTITUTED 38 PER CENT OF THE ANNUAL TOTAL OF ACCIDENTS IN ALL INDUSTRIES IN 1980.

THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE KILLED IN ACCIDENTS ON CONSTRUCTION SITES ALONE LAST YEAR GREATLY OUT-NUMBERED THE FATALITIES IN ALL OTHER INDUSTRIES IN HONG KONG.

HOWEVER, STUDIES SHOWED THAT MANY OF THESE ACCIDENTS COULD HAVE BEEN PREVENTED HAD THE BUILDING CONTRACTORS EXERCISED STRICTER SUPERVISION OF THEIR CONSTRUCTION SITES AND PROVIDED ADEQUATE AND PROPER SAFEGUARDS.

WORKING AT HEIGHT SEEMED TO POSE THE GREATEST RISK TO CONSTRUCTION WORKERS, MR LIN CONTINUED.

IN 1980 THERE WERE 34 DEATHS AS A RESULT OF FALLS FROM HEIGHTS, REPRESENTING 39 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL FATAL ACCIDENTS OCCURRING IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY.

TO AVOID THESE ACCIDENTS, OPEN PITS, FLOOR EDGES, OPENINGS, WORKING PLATFORMS AND OTHER DANGEROUS PLACES OF BUILDINGS UNDER CONSTRUCTION SHOULD BE SECURELY FENCED OR, IN SITUATIONS WHERE FENCING IS NOT POSSIBLE, SAFETY BELTS SHOULD BE USED BY WORKERS AT HEIGHTS.

TO ATTRACT ATTENTION TO THE PROBLEM, THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT HAS PUBLISHED ONE POSTER ON THE DANGER OF +FALL OF PERSONS+ AND THREE OTHERS ON THE USE OF SAFETY BELTS, ALL OF WHICH MAY BE OBTAINED FROM THE INDUSTRIAL SAFETY TRAINING CENTRE.

MR LIN POINTED OUT THAT THE MAXIMUM FINE FOR FAILING TO PROVIDE ADEQUATE AND PROPER SAFEGUARDS AGAINST FALL OF PERSONS FROM SKIP HOISTS AND WORKING PLATFORMS HAD BEEN RAISED FROM \$10 000 TO \$50 000 SINCE LAST APRIL.

THE INCREASED MAXIMUM WAS THE RESULT OF A GENERAL REVISION OF THE LEVEL OF FINES UNDER THE CONSTRUCTION SITES (SAFETY) REGULATIONS AIMING AT PROVIDING A MORE EFFECTIVE DETERRENT TO BUILDING CONTRACTORS WHO DID NOT GIVE THE CONSIDERATION TO SAFETY AT WORK, HE EXPLAINED.

### LABOUR RELATIONS WORKSHOP OPENS

\* \* \* \* \*

LACK OF OPEN-MINDEDNESS, A COMMUNICATION GAP AND UNSOUND MANAGEMENT STYLES AND PRACTICES ARE THE MAJOR CAUSES OF LABOUR DISPUTES IN HONG KONG.

THIS WAS STATED BY ACTING ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR DONALD S.T. CHAN, AT THE OPENING OF THE SECOND LABOUR RELATIONS WORKSHOP AT QUEEN ELIZABETH STADIUM TODAY (MONDAY).

THE WORKSHOP IS THE SECOND IN A SERIES OF ACTIVITIES ORGANISED BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT AS PART OF A YEAR-LONG PROJECT UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME.

THE PROJECT AIMS AT PROVIDING TRAINING TO PERSONNEL MANAGERS AND TRADE UNION LEADERS ON LABOUR RELATIONS AND RELATED SUBJECTS TO STRENGTHEN THE SYSTEM OF INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS IN HONG KONG.

IN HIS OPENING REMARKS, MR CHAN SAID THE TWO SIDES OF INDUSTRY - MANAGEMENT AND LABOUR - HAVE AN IMPORTANT AREA OF MUTUAL INTEREST, THAT IS, PROSPERITY FOR THE ENTERPRISE. BUT MANY EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES HAVE LOST SIGHT OF THIS COMMON INTEREST IN THE PURSUIT OF THEIR SEPARATE INTERESTS.

HE SAID THAT THEY SHOULD BE WORKING TOGETHER FOR THEIR COMMON GOOD INSTEAD OF TRYING TO EXCEL AT THE OTHER'S EXPENSE.

MR CHAN WENT ON TO SAY THAT A COMMUNICATION GAP EXISTS BETWEEN MANAGEMENT AND LABOUR BECAUSE, AMONG OTHER REASONS, TRADE UNIONS ARE STILL LARGELY NOT RECOGNISED BY THE EMPLOYERS AND THAT ONLY SOME 30 BUSINESS ORGANISATIONS ARE KNOWN TO BE OPERATING FORMAL JOINT CONSULTATION.

IN THE FACE OF THIS COMMUNICATION GAP, MANY EMPLOYERS AND WORKERS +SEE THE JUSTICE OF THEIR VIEW TOO CLEARLY AND PERHAPS TOO CLOSELY THAT THEY HAVE BECOME IMPERIOUS TO THE LEGITIMACY OF THE OTHER'S POINTS OF VIEW+, HE NOTED.

MR CHAN URGED EMPLOYERS TO ADOPT MANAGEMENT STYLES CONDUCTIVE TO GOOD LABOUR RELATIONS AND AN OPEN-DOOR POLICY IN STAFF MATTERS- TO ESTABLISH CLEAR AND SIMPLE TWO-WAY CHANNELS OF COMMUNICATION AND TO ENCOURAGE AND UTILISE STAFF PARTICIPATION IN MATTERS THAT AFFECT THEIR WELL-BEING.

SPEAKING ALSO AT THE OPENING SESSION WERE MR NG SEK-HONG, A LECTURER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT STUDIES, UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG, AND LABOUR OFFICER CHOW TUNG-SHAN.

MR NG SPOKE ON COLLECTIVE BARGAINING IN HONG KONG, WHILE MR CHOW ON EMPLOYMENT CONTRACTS AND THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE.

THE WORKSHOP'S THREE OTHER EVENING SESSIONS WILL BE HELD ON THE MONDAY OF THE FOLLOWING THREE WEEKS.

SPEAKERS AT THE OTHER SESSIONS WILL BE MR GILBERT Y.Y. WONG, ANOTHER LECTURER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT STUDIES, MR ERIC LI, PRESIDING OFFICER OF THE LABOUR TRIBUNAL, MR WILLIAM F.K. CHAN, REMUNERATION ANALYST, HUTCHISON WHAMPOA LTD., MR JAMES C.K. YEUNG, SENIOR LABOUR OFFICER, AND MRS ANITA W.B. SIN, LABOUR OFFICER.

#### MANPOWER SURVEY OF INSURANCE FIRMS STARTS

THE HONG KONG TRAINING COUNCIL TODAY (MONDAY) BEGAN A MANPOWER SURVEY OF ALL INSURANCE COMPANIES, BROKERS AND AGENTS.

PLANNED BY THE INSURANCE TRAINING BOARD OF THE HONG KONG TRAINING COUNCIL, THE SURVEY IS DUE TO BE COMPLETED ON JUNE 19.

QUESTIONNAIRES, EXPLANATORY NOTES AND A DESCRIPTION OF PRINCIPAL JOBS IN THE INSURANCE INDUSTRY WERE SENT TO ALL INSURANCE COMPANIES, BROKERS AND AGENTS.

OFFICERS OF THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT WILL VISIT THESE ESTABLISHMENTS DURING THE SURVEY PERIOD TO ANSWER QUESTIONS AND ASSIST IN COMPLETING THE QUESTIONNAIRES.

INFORMATION IS BEING SOUGHT ON THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE BEING EMPLOYED, FORECASTS OF ADDITIONAL EMPLOYEES, PERIOD OF TRAINING FOR EMPLOYEES AND OTHER PERSONNEL AND TRAINING MATTERS.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD, MR ANTHONY KAN, SAID THAT THE INFORMATION COLLECTED WOULD BE HANDLED IN STRICT CONFIDENCE AND WOULD BE PUBLISHED IN STATISTICAL SUMMARIES ONLY, WITHOUT REFERENCE TO ANY INDIVIDUAL ESTABLISHMENT.

THE INFORMATION REQUIRED FROM THE SURVEY WAS IMPORTANT FOR FORMULATING TRAINING PLANS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE BUSINESS, MR KAN SAID.

### AUTOPAY OFFER TO SOLVE RATEPAYERS' WORRIES

RATEPAYERS WILL BE ABLE TO SETTLE THEIR QUARTERLY RATES BY AUTOPAY AS FROM NEXT MONTH, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TREASURY ANNOUNCED TODAY (MONDAY).

+THIS WILL PUT AN END TO THEIR WORRIES ABOUT HAVING TO QUEUE UP TO PAY RATES OR FORGETTING TO PAY THEM ON TIME,+ HE SAID.

+ANYONE WHO HAS A CURRENT OR SAVINGS ACCOUNT WITH ANY LICENSED BANK IN HONG KONG CAN MAKE USE OF THIS SERVICE. ALL HE HAS TO DO IS TO FILL IN A DIRECT DEBIT AUTHORISATION FORM,+ HE SAID.

THESE FORMS MAY NOW BE OBTAINED IN PERSON FROM ANY TREASURY COLLECTION OFFICE, BY WRITING TO DIRECTOR OF ACCOUNTING SERVICES, P.O. BOX 8 000, HONG KONG OR BY TELEPHONING 5-221394, 5-258845 OR 5-232741. COMPLETED FORMS SHOULD BE RETURNED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO THE TREASURY AS INDICATED IN THE FORM.

AS THE AUTOPAY APPLICATIONS TAKE TIME TO PROCESS, RATEPAYERS ARE ADVISED TO CONTINUE TO PAY THEIR RATES IN THE USUAL WAY UNTIL THEY SEE THE WORDS 'PAYMENT BY AUTOPAY AS AUTHORISED' PRINTED IN THE BOX ON THE LOWER LEFT-HAND CORNER OF THEIR DEMAND NOTES.

THE SPOKESMAN STRESSED THAT IF THERE IS ANY CHANGE IN THE DESCRIPTION OF THE RATEPAYER'S NAME OR DELETION OF A RATING ASSESSMENT OF A TENEMENT, THE PREVIOUS DIRECT DEBIT AUTHORISATION IN RESPECT OF THE SAME TENEMENT WILL AUTOMATICALLY BECOME INVALID.

+THE RATEPAYER MUST, IN THIS CASE, FILL IN ANOTHER DIRECT DEBIT AUTHORISATION FORM AND SUBMIT IT TO THE TREASURY,+ HE SAID.

### REPULSE BAY ROAD PUBLIC TRANSPORT PRIORITY SCHEME

\* \* \* \* \*

THE REPULSE BAY ROAD PUBLIC TRANSPORT PRIORITY SCHEME WILL BE RE-INTRODUCED THIS SUMMER WITH THREE MINOR CHANGES.

ANNOUNCING THIS TODAY (MONDAY), A TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE SCHEME WOULD OPERATE ON FINE SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS FROM JUNE 14.

+THE FIRST CHANGE IS THAT THE SECTION OF WONG CHUK HANG ROAD BETWEEN NAM FUNG ROAD AND THE WESTERN ARM OF SHOUSON HILL ROAD WILL REMAIN OPEN TO TWO-WAY TRAFFIC,+ HE SAID.

+THIS WILL PROVIDE DIRECT ACCESS FOR MOTORISTS HEADING FOR SHOUSON HILL ROAD FROM WONG CHUK HANG AND ABERDEEN.

+BUT IT WILL NOT PROVIDE A SHORT-CUT TO REPULSE BAY FROM WONG CHUK HANG ROAD BECAUSE THERE IS NO DIRECT ACCESS TO REPULSE BAY FROM SHOUSON HILL ROAD.

/+THE SECOND .....

+THE SECOND CHANGE IS THAT MOTORISTS TRAVELLING FROM THE HONG KONG CRICKET CLUB ON WONG NAI CHUNG GAP ROAD WILL BE PERMITTED TO USE THE WONG NAI CHUNG GAP ROAD ROUNDABOUT TO GET TO HAPPY VALLEY, CAUSEWAY BAY OR CENTRAL.

+HOWEVER, NO DIRECT ACCESS WILL BE AVAILABLE FROM WONG NAI CHUNG GAP ROAD TO BLACK'S LINK.

+THE THIRD, AND FINAL, CHANGE IS THAT THE SCHEME WILL OPERATE FROM 2 PM TO 7 PM INSTEAD OF FROM 2 PM TO 8 PM.+

THE SPOKESMAN RECALLED THAT WHEN STARTED LAST SUMMER THE SCHEME ENABLED FRANCHISED BUSES AND PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES TO COPE MORE EFFICIENTLY WITH THE THOUSANDS OF COMMUTERS SEEKING PUBLIC TRANSPORT FROM REPULSE BAY TO CENTRAL ON HOLIDAY AFTERNOONS BY ALMOST HALVING OVERALL JOURNEY TIMES.

+LAST YEAR, THE AVERAGE ROUND-TRIP JOURNEY TIME FOR BUSES TRAVELLING BETWEEN REPULSE BAY AND CENTRAL DROPPED TO ONLY 70 MINUTES, COMPARED WITH TWO-AND-A-HALF HOURS BEFORE THE SCHEME WAS INTRODUCED,+ HE SAID.

+IN ADDITION, THE ONE-WAY SYSTEM OF TRAFFIC ALONG ISLAND ROAD AND A SECTION OF WONG CHUK HANG ROAD ENABLED OTHER VEHICLES TO PROCEED SMOOTHLY.+

THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC COMING FROM ISLAND ROAD WAS EXPECTED TO IMPROVE FURTHER ON JUNE 14 WITH THE OPENING OF A NEW ACCESS ROAD JOINING WONG CHUK HANG ROAD (EAST) WITH NAM FUNG ROAD.

+PEOPLE LIVING ALONG THE BUS-ONLY SECTION OF REPULSE BAY ROAD WILL BE ALLOWED TO USE THE BUS LANE WHEN TRAVELLING NORTH FROM THEIR RESIDENCES,+ HE SAID.

+HOWEVER, IF THEY ARE COMING FROM REPULSE BAY, THEY WILL HAVE TO OBSERVE THE DIVERSION ALONG ISLAND ROAD AND NAM FUNG ROAD.+

THE SPOKESMAN EMPHASISED THAT THE SCHEME WOULD ONLY OPERATE ON FINE SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS WHEN LARGE NUMBERS OF PEOPLE ARE AT REPULSE BAY BEACH.

+RADIO ANNOUNCEMENTS WILL BE MADE AS NECESSARY,+ HE SAID.  
+BUT PEOPLE VISITING REPULSE BAY ON THESE DAYS SHOULD AVOID USING THEIR CARS AND TAKE FULL ADVANTAGE OF THE IMPROVED PUBLIC TRANSPORT SERVICES RESULTING FROM THE SCHEME.+

CONTRACT FOR SHA TIN RESERVOIR SIGNED

A THREE-MILLION DOLLAR CONTRACT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A FRESH WATER SERVICE RESERVOIR AT PAI TAU HANG IN SHA TIN NEW TOWN, WAS SIGNED TODAY (MONDAY) BY MR LEE GUN-CHEUNG, CHIEF ENGINEER (CONSTRUCTION) OF THE WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT AND A REPRESENTATIVE OF SANG LEE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY LIMITED.

THE RESERVOIR WILL HAVE A STORAGE CAPACITY OF 1 000 CUBIC METRES, AND WILL FORM PART OF A PROJECT TO SUPPLY WATER TO HIGH LEVEL AREAS IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE NEW TOWN.

WORK ON THE CONTRACT WILL START THIS WEEK AND TAKE ABOUT 15 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

MORE RECLAIMED LAND FOR TAI PO

ANOTHER NINE HECTARES OF LAND WILL BE RECLAIMED UNDER THE TAI PO NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME.

A \$37-MILLION CONTRACT FOR THE WORK WAS AWARDED TODAY (MONDAY) BY THE TAI PO AND FANLING NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE OFFICE SAID THAT THE RECLAMATION, NEXT TO THE HONG KONG INDUSTRIAL ESTATE, WOULD PROVIDE LAND FOR AN EXTENSION OF THE TAI PO SEWAGE TREATMENT WORKS TO COPE WITH THE DEVELOPMENT IN THE NEW TOWN.

WORK ON THE CONTRACT WILL START NEXT WEEK AND TAKE ABOUT 12 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

WINNERS OF FIVE SPORTS EVENTS ORGANISED BY THE NEW TERRITORIES SCHOOLS SPORTS ASSOCIATION (YUEN LONG) WERE TODAY (MONDAY) PRESENTED WITH PRIZES BY THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MR FUNG KWOK-KEUNG, AT YUEN LONG TOWN HALL.

MORE THAN 800 CHILDREN FROM 42 LOCAL PRIMARY SCHOOLS TOOK PART IN THE COMPETITIONS IN TABLE-TENNIS, BADMINTON, SOCCER, VOLLEY BALL AND BASKETBALL.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ASSOCIATION, MR CHEUNG KWAI-LUNG, SAID THE COMPETITIONS ARE HELD EVERY YEAR, WITH FUNDS PROVIDED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

IF THERE ARE SUITABLE VENUES, IT IS HOPED THAT OTHER SPORTS LIKE TENNIS AND SWIMMING, AND POSSIBLY WOMEN'S SOCCER, WILL BE HELD IN THE FUTURE, HE SAID.

THE NEW TERRITORIES SCHOOLS SPORTS ASSOCIATION, SET UP IN 1954, NOW HAS THREE SECONDARY AND 11 PRIMARY SCHOOL BRANCHES.

DOUBLE TREAT FOR ELDERLY PEOPLE

ELDERLY PEOPLE IN HONG KONG RECEIVED A DOUBLE TREAT THIS AFTERNOON WHEN THEY MET FILM AND TELEVISION ACTRESS FUNG PO PO AND RECEIVED \$30-LAISEES IN THE CUSTOMARY RED PACKETS FROM HER.

MISS FUNG HANDED OUT 470 OF THE PACKETS THIS AFTERNOON, AND WILL BE CONTINUING HER VISITS TO NEARLY 40 HOMES FOR THE AGED ALL OVER HONG KONG FOR THE REST OF THE WEEK, TO GIVE OUT SOME \$140 000 DONATED BY PHILANTHROPIST SIR SHIU-KIN TANG IN CELEBRATION OF HIS RECENT BIRTHDAY TO NEARLY 4 600 PEOPLE.

ACCOMPANIED BY SIR SHIU-KIN, HIMSELF, MRS EVELYN DOE, ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, AND MRS C.B. CHIU, WIFE OF A FORMER CHAIRMAN OF THE PO LEUNG KUK, MISS FUNG PO PO STARTED THE DAY WITH A VISIT TO THE DAVID TRENCH HOME FOR THE AGED AT ABERDEEN. SHE THEN WENT ON TO ST. MARY'S HOME IN WONG CHUK HANG AND THE SALVATION ARMY WOMEN'S SHELTER IN WAN CHAI. DURING HER VISITS, SHE DEVOTED A LOT OF TIME TO CHATTING WITH THE ELDERLY PEOPLE.
