

ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 220).

ROAD TRAFFIC (REGISTRATION AND LICENSING OF VEHICLES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1967.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Road Traffic Ordinance, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Registration and Licensing of Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1967.

Citation.

2. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is amended, in paragraph (2), by deleting "in writing".

Amendment of regulation 8. (Cap. 220, sub. leg.)

3. Regulations 19, 20 and 21 of the principal regulations are revoked and replaced by the following regulations—

Revocation and replacement of regulations 19, 20 and 21.

"Licensing of motor vehicles.

19. (1) Except as provided by these regulations or any other Ordinance, no motor vehicle shall be used on any road unless such vehicle is licensed under this regulation.

(2) Any person who wishes to have licensed a motor vehicle of which he is the registered owner shall—

(a) deliver to the Commissioner—

(i) an application in such form as may be determined by the Commissioner, signed by such person and containing such particulars as may be required thereby; and

(ii) the registration book in respect of the motor vehicle; and

(b) subject to paragraph (9), pay to the Commissioner in respect of the application for a licence for the motor vehicle for—

(i) twelve months, the appropriate fee specified in the third column of the Third Schedule; or

(ii) four months, an amount equal to thirty-five per centum of the appropriate fee specified in the third column of the Third Schedule and an additional fee of fifteen dollars.



(3) Before a motor vehicle is licensed, the Commissioner may require the registered owner thereof to produce the motor vehicle for inspection or weighing at any place within the Colony.

(4) A motor vehicle shall not be licensed within any class of vehicle other than the class of vehicle within which it is registered.

(5) On receipt of an application under paragraph (2), the Commissioner, if he is satisfied with the particulars contained in the application, shall, subject to paragraph (7) and regulation 27, license the motor vehicle for such period as is stipulated in the application, calculated from the first day of the month in which the application is delivered to him:

Provided that the Commissioner may refuse to license a motor vehicle for a period of four months.

(6) On the licensing of a motor vehicle the Commissioner shall return to the registered owner his registration book marked with the payment of the licence fee and a vehicle licence in such form as he may determine.

(7) On receipt of an application under paragraph (2) in respect of a motor vehicle which is licensed under this regulation, the Commissioner may, at any time during the period of four months immediately preceding the date of expiry of the licence, license the motor vehicle for the further period stipulated in such application and such licence shall take effect from the date of expiry of the existing licence.

(8) Where, after the expiry of the licence issued in respect of a motor vehicle, the Commissioner receives an application under paragraph (2) to license the motor vehicle, he may license the motor vehicle for the further period stipulated in such application and such licence shall take effect from the first day of the month in which he receives the application.

(9) Where the Commissioner licenses a motor vehicle pursuant to paragraph (8), the fee payable to the Commissioner for the issue of the licence shall be the appropriate prescribed fee and an additional fee of ten *per centum* of the appropriate prescribed fee for each month since the previous licence expired:

Provided that the additional fee shall not be payable if the Commissioner is satisfied that the motor vehicle has not been used on a road during the period

when it was not licensed, and in such a case the licence shall take effect from the first day of the month during which the Commissioner receives the application.

(10) For the purpose of this regulation "registered owner" includes any person authorized in writing by the registered owner of a motor vehicle to do anything in order to comply with the provisions of this regulation.

20. (1) Notwithstanding regulation 19, a motor vehicle may be used on a road in Lantau only, if the vehicle is licensed under this regulation.

(2) Any person who wishes to have licensed for use only in Lantau a motor vehicle of which he is the registered owner may deliver to the Commissioner an application in such form as may be determined by the Commissioner and the registration book in respect of the vehicle and shall pay to the Commissioner one quarter of the fee payable under regulation 19 for the licensing of a motor vehicle.

(3) Where the Commissioner issues a licence for which application was made under paragraph (1), he shall cause the licence to be endorsed with the words "PERMITTED TO BE USED ONLY IN LANTAU" and the characters "祇准在大嶼山使用" in such manner as he shall think fit and shall cause such endorsement to be made on the registration book of the motor vehicle if he thinks fit.

(4) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, the provisions of regulation 19 shall apply in respect of the licensing of motor vehicles for use in Lantau."

4. Regulation 23 of the principal regulations is revoked and replaced by the following regulation—

"Cylinder capacity.

23. (1) For the purpose of these regulations, the cylinder capacity of any motor vehicle deriving its motive power wholly from an internal combustion engine worked by a cylinder or cylinders or by a rotary pistons shall be—

- (a) in the case of a single-cylinder engine, the cylinder capacity attributable to the cylinder of the engine;
- (b) in the case of an engine having two or more cylinders, the sum of the cylinder capacities attributable to the separate cylinders;

Revocation and replacement of regulation 23.

Licensing of motor vehicles for use in Lantau only.

- (c) in the case of a rotary-piston engine having a single rotor, the capacity of one of the stator lobes multiplied by the number of lobes attributable to the stator; and
- (d) in the case of a rotary-piston engine having two or more rotors, the sum of the capacities of one of the stator lobes attributable to each stator-rotor multiplied by the number of lobes attributable to one stator.
- (2) The capacity attributable to any cylinder or any stator lobe of an internal combustion engine shall be deemed to be equal to—
- (a) in the case of a cylinder having a single piston, the product, expressed in cubic centimetres, of the square of the internal diameter of such cylinder, measured in centimetres, and the distance measured in centimetres, multiplied by 0.7854; through which the piston associated with that cylinder moves during one half of a revolution of the engine;
- (b) in the case of a cylinder having more than one piston, the sum of the products, expressed in cubic centimetres, of the square of the internal diameter of each part of the cylinder in which a piston moves, measured in centimetres and the distance through which the piston associated with that diameter moves during one half of a revolution of the engine measured in centimetres multiplied by 0.7854; and
- (c) in the case of a rotary-piston engine, the volume of the space enclosed between one working face of the rotor and one lobe of the stator at its maximum, expressed in cubic centimetres, less the volume of the space enclosed between one working face of the rotor and the stator at its minimum, expressed in cubic centimetres.
- (3) In measuring cylinders or stator lobes for the purpose of calculating capacity, and in calculating cylinder capacity, fractions of centimetres shall be taken into account.”.

5. Regulation 24 of the principal regulations is amended in paragraph (1) by deleting “No person shall drive or, as registered owner, permit to be driven any motor vehicle” and substituting therefor the following—

Amendment of regulation 24.

“No motor vehicle shall be driven or remain parked, and no registered owner of a motor vehicle shall permit his motor vehicle to be driven or remain parked on any road.”.

6. Regulation 26 of the principal regulations is amended—

Amendment of regulation 26.

- (a) by being renumbered as paragraph (1);
- (b) by deleting “the Second Part of” from paragraph (1); and
- (c) by inserting at the end thereof the following new paragraph—

“(2) Where—

- (a) any vehicle is broken up, destroyed or sent permanently out of the Colony and the licence issued in respect of that motor vehicle is thereby lost or destroyed; and
- (b) the registered owner of the motor vehicle has, within seventy-two hours of such motor vehicle being broken up, destroyed or sent out of the Colony—
- (i) notified the Commissioner thereof; and
- (ii) delivered to the Commissioner the registration book in respect of the motor vehicle,

the Commissioner shall refund a portion of the fee paid for the issue of the licence for the motor vehicle in accordance with the table set forth in the Fourth Schedule.”.

7. Regulation 39 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) and substituting therefor the following—

Amendment of regulation 39.

“(b) four months, an amount equal to thirty-five *per centum* of the appropriate fee set forth in the Third Schedule.”.

8. Regulation 42 of the principal regulations is amended in paragraph (2) by deleting “chair, tricycle or trailer” and substituting therefor the following—

Amendment of regulation 42.

“chair or tricycle”.

Amendment of
regulation 44.

9. Regulation 44 of the principal regulations is amended in paragraph (1) by deleting "paragraph (5) of regulation 19" and substituting therefor the following—

"paragraph (1) of regulation 19".

Amendment of
Fourth
Schedule.

10. The Fourth Schedule to the principal regulations is deleted and the following Schedule substituted therefor—

Explanatory Note.

(This Note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

Regulation 3 revokes and replaces regulations 19, 20 and 21 of the principal regulations in order to consolidate these provisions dealing with applications for the licensing of motor vehicles. The new regulation 19 restricts the periods for which licences may be issued to twelve months and four months and clarifies the law in respect of the renewal of licences. The new regulation 20 consolidates the existing provisions dealing with the licensing of vehicles for use in Lantau. The amendment of regulation 44 is consequential upon the amendment of regulation 19.

Regulation 4 revokes and replaces regulation 23 of the principal regulations and includes in that regulation provision for the calculation of the cylinder capacity of rotary-piston internal combustion engines used in motor vehicles.

Regulation 5 extends the operation of regulation 24 of the principal regulations and regulation 6 amends regulation 26 to provide for a proportionate refund of licence fees in specified circumstances. Regulation 7 amends regulation 39 of the principal regulation to provide for the registration of rickshaws, sedan chairs, tricycles and trailers for periods of four months. Regulation 8 effects a formal amendment of regulation 42 by deleting references to trailers.

Regulation 9 effects a formal amendment of regulation 44 of the principal regulations consequential upon the revocation and substitution of regulation 19.

Regulation 10 deletes the Fourth Schedule and substitutes therefor a new Schedule setting out the percentages of licence fees that may be refunded on the cancellation of a licence under the amended regulation 26 of the principal regulations.


1. These regulations may be cited as the Emergency (Amendment of Magistrates Ordinance) Regulations 1967.

2. Paragraph 2 of Part III of the Second Schedule to the Magistrates Ordinance is amended by deleting "except an offence against section 40, 42 or 46 of the Larceny Ordinance or section 17 of the Offences against the Person Ordinance or an offence punishable under section 30 of the Arms and Ammunition Ordinance" and substituting the following—

**EMERGENCY (PRINCIPAL) (AMENDMENT) (NO. 4)
REGULATIONS 1967.**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Emergency Regulations Ordinance, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Emergency (Principal) (Amendment) (No. 4) Regulations 1967. Citation.

2. Regulation 88 of the principal regulations is revoked and replaced by the following— Revocation and replacement of regulation 88. (Cap. 241, sub. leg.)

"Criminal proceedings may be held in camera, and non-disclosure of identity of witnesses in certain cases.

88. (1) Notwithstanding any other law—

- (a) if it appears to a court that it is or may be expedient so to do in the interests of justice or public order or security or for the safety or well being of any witness or for any other reason; or
- (b) if a court is satisfied on the information of any person or otherwise that a witness is apprehensive as to what may happen to him or to any member of his family or a friend or to his property or business if he gives evidence in open court,

the court may order that the whole of the proceedings before it in respect of any offence shall take place in a closed court.

(2) Notwithstanding that proceedings are taking place in a closed court pursuant to an order under paragraph (1), if the court is satisfied that a witness is apprehensive as to what may happen to him or to any member of his family or a friend or to his property or business in consequence of his giving evidence, the court shall not permit any question to be put to the witness or any other witness if the answer thereto would lead, or would tend to lead, to disclosure of the name or address of such first-mentioned witness, but the court may require such witness to record his name and address in writing and deliver the same into the custody of the court."

Revocation and replacement of regulation 136A.

3. Regulation 136A of the principal regulations is revoked and replaced by the following—

“Modification of District Court Ordinance increasing Court’s power of sentence for certain offences.
(Cap. 5.)
(Cap. 206.)

136A. (1) Section 36 of the District Court Ordinance shall have effect in relation to the offences to which this paragraph applies as if there were substituted for the words “five years” in each place where they occur the words “ten years”.

(2) Paragraph (1) shall apply to the following offences—

- (a) any offence under these regulations;
- (b) any offence under the Explosive Substances Ordinance; and
- (c) an offence under section 28, 29 or 30 of the Offences against the Person Ordinance.

(Cap. 212.)

(3) Paragraph (1) shall have effect whether the offence was committed before or after the commencement of this regulation and whether or not, in the case of an offence committed before the commencement of this regulation, proceedings for such offence had been instituted before its commencement.”

Explanatory Note.

Regulation 2 extends the cases in which a court may order that criminal proceedings before it be conducted in camera.

Regulation 3 permits a District Court to impose a sentence of imprisonment exceeding five years for offences against the Explosive Substances Ordinance and offences against section 28, 29 or 30 of the Offences against the Person Ordinance.



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HONG KONG AIRPORT (REGULATIONS) ORDINANCE.
(Chapter 292).

HONG KONG AIRPORT (TRAFFIC) REGULATIONS 1967.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Hong Kong Airport (Regulations) Ordinance, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

PART I.

CITATION, INTERPRETATION AND APPLICATION.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Hong Kong Airport (Traffic) Regulations 1967 and shall come into operation on the day appointed for the commencement of the Hong Kong Airport (Regulations) (Amendment) Ordinance 1967.

Citation and commencement.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation.

“authorized person” means a person authorized by the Director in writing for the purposes of the Ordinance and any police officer;

“car” means any motor vehicle constructed or adapted only for the carriage of not more than nine passengers and their effects;

“car park” means a place designated by the Director as a car park in accordance with regulation 7;

“meter car park” means a public car park in which parking meters are erected;

“monthly pass” means a pass issued in accordance with regulation 19;

“omnibus” means any motor vehicle constructed or adapted only for the carriage of more than nine passengers and their effects;

“owner” includes the person in whose name a vehicle is registered and the person by whom the vehicle is kept and used and, in relation to a vehicle which is the subject of a hiring agreement or hire purchase agreement, means the person in possession of the vehicle under that agreement;

“parking meter” means an apparatus constructed and designed to receive and indicate payment for the use of a parking space in a public car park;

“parking space” means a space delineated in a car park as a space in which a vehicle may be parked or caused to wait;

"public car park" means a car park designated as a public car park under regulation 7;

"quarterly pass" means a pass issued in accordance with regulation 19;

"register" means a register in such form as may be prescribed by the Director, in which an attendant shall enter the registration mark of vehicles in accordance with regulation 12;

"road" includes every highway, thoroughfare, street, lane, alley, court, square, archway passage, path, way and place to which the public have access, either continuously or intermittently and either of right or by licence, but does not include a car park;

"ticket" means a ticket issued to the driver of a vehicle in accordance with paragraph (1) of regulation 17;

"travel agent" means any person carrying on a business in the Colony which consists, either wholly or in part, in organizing and conducting tours for or in supplying guides to visitors in the Colony, and any person whose business consists, either wholly or in part, in providing, or arranging the provision of, services for visitors to the Colony by way of transport or accommodation, whether or not such service is provided within the Colony, and includes the agent of any such person;

"vehicle" means any vehicle whether mechanically propelled or otherwise intended or adapted for use on roads and includes a rickshaw and a chair but does not include a perambulator or any conveyance for use solely on railways or tramways.

3. These regulations do not apply to any road within the airport.

PART II.

CONTROL OF VEHICLES.

4. (1) No person shall, without the permission of the Director or an authorized person—

- (a) drive a vehicle within the airport elsewhere than in a place provided for the passage or accommodation of such a vehicle;
- (b) take a vehicle into a hangar within the airport used for the maintenance or storage of aircraft; or
- (c) park any vehicle or cause or permit any vehicle to be parked or remain within the airport elsewhere than in the appropriate car park or the appropriate parking space provided for that purpose.

Exclusion of roads.

Use of vehicles in airport.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

5. Any person who within the airport drives or places a vehicle carelessly or dangerously or without due consideration for persons using the airport or who fails to comply with any traffic sign or notice erected by the Director or by the Commissioner of Police, or who fails to comply with any direction for the regulation of traffic given by an authorized person, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

Careless or dangerous driving, etc.

6. The Director or any authorized person may move within the airport any vehicle which in his opinion constitutes a danger or an obstruction.

Director's power to move vehicle.

PART III.

DESIGNATION OF CAR PARKS.

7. (1) The Director may designate any place within the airport as a car park and may designate any car park as—

Designation of car parks.

- (a) a public car park for the use of vehicles driven by any member of the public; or
- (b) a car park for the use of tenants of premises in the airport and their employees; or
- (c) a car park for the use of hotels and travel agents.

(2) The Director may cancel or vary any such designation.

8. The Director may cause a car park to be divided in such manner as he thinks fit into parking spaces.

Parking spaces.

9. The Director may cause to be erected at, in or outside any car park such signs as he considers necessary for the regulation of parking therein, and in particular signs indicating the place where vehicles may enter and leave the car park, and the type or class of vehicle permitted to be parked in the car park or the particular class of persons who may use the car park.

Signs.

10. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of these regulations, the Director may close—

Power of closure of car parks.

- (a) a public car park for any period of time; and
- (b) any other car park for a period not exceeding twenty-four hours.

(2) The Director shall forthwith cause to be displayed within the airport a notice of any closure made under paragraph (1).

Offences when
car park closed.

11. (1) No person shall park any vehicle or cause or permit any vehicle to be parked or remain in a car park during any period when the car park is closed under paragraph (1) of regulation 10.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

PART IV.

PUBLIC CAR PARKS.

Keeping of
register.

12. (1) At 8 o'clock each morning an attendant on duty in a car park shall enter in a register the registration mark of every vehicle in the car park at such time and shall date and sign such register.

(2) The register shall be retained at the car park for not less than two months from the date thereof.

(3) In the calculation of any fees payable under these regulations, such register completed and signed by an attendant shall be *prima facie* evidence that the vehicles whose registration marks are recorded in the register were in the car park at the date and time set forth on the register.

Parking meters.

13. (1) The Director may cause parking meters to be erected in any public car park for the purpose of charging for the parking of vehicles in parking spaces in the public car park at any time on any day.

(2) Every parking meter shall bear a notice showing in English and Chinese characters—

(a) the period during which a charge is made for the use of a parking space; and

(b) the fee, being a fee at the rate specified in the First Schedule, payable for the use of a parking space and the denomination of coin to be used for the payment of such fee.

First Schedule.

Conduct of
drivers at
parking meters.

14. (1) When the driver of a vehicle parks his vehicle in a parking space in a metered car park, he shall forthwith pay the fee shown on the notice on the parking meter by inserting or causing to be inserted a coin of a denomination shown on the parking meter (hereinafter referred to as an appropriate coin).

(2) Subject to the provisions of regulation 28, a vehicle may remain in a parking space in a metered car park while the parking meter continuously exhibits a sign showing that payment has been made for the parking space.

15. (1) No person shall park any vehicle or cause or permit any vehicle to be parked or remain in a metered car park otherwise than in a parking space at which there is a parking meter exhibiting a sign showing that payment has been made for the use of the parking space.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars:

Provided that it shall be a good defence to any charge under this regulation to prove that an appropriate coin was inserted in the parking meter and that if the parking meter had been working satisfactorily the sign referred to in paragraph (1) would have been exhibited but that owing to a defect in the parking meter no such sign was displayed.

16. Any person who unlawfully interferes with any parking meter, or operates or attempts to operate a parking meter by inserting any object other than an appropriate coin, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

17. (1) No person shall park a vehicle in a public car park which is not a metered car park until he has been issued by a car park attendant with a ticket bearing the date on which and the time at which the vehicle entered the public car park.

(2) Subject to the provision of regulation 28, the driver of a vehicle shall, upon removing the vehicle from a public car park which is not a metered car park—

(a) surrender the ticket to a car park attendant, who shall mark the ticket with the time of surrender; and

(b) pay the fee, being a fee at the rate specified in the First Schedule, payable for the use of a parking space between the time of entry marked on the ticket and the time when the ticket was surrendered.

(3) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

18. (1) For the purposes of this regulation, a daily parking period (hereinafter referred to as the period) means a period extending from 8 o'clock in the morning of one day to 8 o'clock in the morning of the following day.

(2) If at any time during a daily parking period any person wishes to remove a vehicle from a public car park which is not a metered car park but is unable to produce the ticket issued in

respect of such vehicle, he may remove such vehicle if he satisfies a car park attendant that a ticket was issued to him or that he is authorized to remove such vehicle by the person to whom a ticket was issued, and he pays the fee for a replacement ticket calculated in the following manner—

- (a) if the registration mark of such vehicle does not appear in the register at the commencement of such period, it shall be deemed that such vehicle has remained in the car park since the commencement of such period; or
- (b) if the registration mark of such vehicle appears in the register at the commencement of such period, but not in the register at the commencement of the period immediately preceding such period, it shall be deemed that such vehicle has remained in the car park since the commencement of the period immediately preceding such period; or
- (c) if the registration mark of such vehicle appears in the register at the commencement of such period and of one or more periods immediately preceding such period, it shall be deemed that such vehicle has remained in the car park since the commencement of the period immediately prior to the first of such preceding periods.

PART V.

SPECIAL CAR PARKS.

19. (1) On payment of the appropriate fee prescribed in the Second Schedule, the Director may issue to any tenant of premises in the airport or his employee a monthly pass or a quarterly pass in such form as the Director may determine.

(2) On payment of the appropriate fee prescribed in the Second Schedule, the Director may issue to any hotel or travel agent a monthly pass for an omnibus, or a monthly pass for a car, in such form as the Director may determine.

(3) A monthly pass shall expire on the last day of the month in respect of which it is issued.

(4) A quarterly pass shall expire on the last day of the last month of the quarter in respect of which it is issued.

20. (1) A monthly pass or a quarterly pass shall entitle the driver of the motor vehicle described in the monthly pass or quarterly pass to park that vehicle at any time during the currency of the monthly pass or quarterly pass in such car park as is set forth in the monthly pass or quarterly pass if space is available in such car park for the due parking of the vehicle.

Monthly passes and quarterly passes. Second Schedule.

Display of monthly passes and quarterly passes.

(2) The driver of a vehicle in respect of which a pass has been issued shall cause to be displayed on the left-hand side of the windscreen of the vehicle the monthly pass or quarterly pass at all times when the motor vehicle is in a car park by virtue of such monthly pass or quarterly pass.

(3) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

21. If a monthly pass or a quarterly pass has been lost, destroyed or accidentally defaced, the Director may, on application and on payment of a fee of two dollars, issue a duplicate monthly pass or quarterly pass, as the case may be.

Replacement of monthly passes or quarterly passes.

22. The Director may, on application and on payment of a fee of two dollars, amend a monthly pass or a quarterly pass to enable it to be issued in respect of the vehicle specified in the application instead of the vehicle specified in such pass.

Transfer of monthly pass or quarterly pass.

23. (1) No person shall park any vehicle or cause or permit any vehicle to be parked or remain in a car park designated for the use of tenants of premises in the airport and their employees or a car park designated for the use of hotels and travel agents unless there is displayed on the vehicle a valid monthly pass or quarterly pass issued in respect of such vehicle for the car park in which the vehicle is parked.

Offences.

(2) In the event of a contravention of any of the provisions of this regulation the owner of the vehicle shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

PART VI.

CONDUCT IN CAR PARKS.

24. (1) The driver of a vehicle in a car park shall comply with all lawful directions given to him by any car park attendant or authorized person.

Offences by drivers.

(2) When a vehicle has been parked in a car park, the driver and all passengers shall leave the car park as soon as is practicable thereafter by such means of exit from the car park as is indicated by signs erected under regulation 9.

(3) The driver of a vehicle in a car park shall, when so requested, give his name and address to any car park attendant or authorized person.

(4) No person shall sound a warning instrument in a car park.

(5) No person shall park a vehicle in a car park in such a manner that the vehicle unnecessarily projects over any line or other mark which divides the parking space in which the vehicle is parked from any other parking space or from any other part of the car park.

(6) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

Offences in
car park.

25. (1) No person other than—

- (a) a car park attendant or any person employed at a car park in the course of his duties;
- (b) a person driving a vehicle into a car park or a person entering a car park to remove a vehicle therefrom;
- (c) a passenger in a vehicle entering a car park or a person intending to leave the car park as a passenger in a vehicle; or
- (d) an authorized person,

shall enter a car park without the permission of the car park attendant on duty at the entrance to the car park.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

Repair of
vehicles.

26. (1) No person shall carry out on any vehicle in a car park any maintenance or repair or be in any car park for the purpose of carrying out such maintenance or repair:

Provided that it shall be a good defence to any proceedings under this regulation to prove that such maintenance or repair was necessary to enable the vehicle to be removed from the car park.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

Limitation of
liability.

27. The Government shall not be responsible for nor shall accept any liability in respect of—

- (a) any damage caused to a vehicle in a car park or caused to a vehicle which is being or which has been removed from a car park under the provisions of regulation 28; or
- (b) any injury or damage to any person or thing in a car park.

PART VII.

REMOVAL OF VEHICLES.

28. (1) The Airport Commandant or any person authorized in writing by him may request a police officer not below the rank of inspector to remove any vehicle from the airport which has been parked or allowed to remain within the airport—

Director's
power of

- (a) in contravention of any of the provisions of subparagraph (c) of paragraph (1) of regulation 4; or
- (b) in a public car park for more than forty-eight consecutive hours,

and upon receipt of such request such police officer may cause such vehicle to be removed from the airport.

(2) Any vehicle removed from a car park under paragraph (1) may be detained by the Commissioner of Police until either—

- (a) there is paid to the Commissioner of Police a removal charge of fifty dollars and a storage charge of one dollar for every day after the second day during which the vehicle is detained and any parking fees incurred in respect of the period during which the vehicle was parked or allowed to remain prior to the removal therefrom; or
- (b) the vehicle is released by order of a court or magistrate in accordance with paragraph (3).

(3) Where a vehicle is detained in accordance with the provisions of this regulation and proceedings have been taken in respect of the offence by reason of which the vehicle was removed away, the court or magistrate in such proceedings may order that the vehicle be released and by such order may require that the appropriate removal and storage charge be paid to the Commissioner of Police before the vehicle is released.

(4) When a vehicle is detained in accordance with the provisions of this regulation, the Commissioner of Police shall, if the name and address of such owner is known to him, give notice in writing to its owner of the detention, and if such vehicle is not claimed by the owner within three months of the date of its detention the Commissioner of Police may sell by public auction or otherwise dispose of such vehicle and may apply the proceeds, if any, from the sale or disposal of the vehicle—

- (a) in payment of any parking fees incurred in respect of the period during which the vehicle was parked or allowed to remain in a car park; and

- (b) in payment of any removal charge, storage charges and charges, if any, incurred in respect of the sale by public auction of the vehicle,

and any balance remaining thereof shall be transferred to the general revenue of the Colony at the expiry of twelve months from the date of such sale or disposal if not previously claimed by a person who satisfies the Commissioner of Police that he was the owner of the vehicle at the time it was removed from the airport.

PART VIII.

REPORTING OF ACCIDENTS, IDENTIFICATION, ETC.

Notification of accidents.

29. Any person who, being the driver of a vehicle which is involved in an accident within the airport, fails forthwith to stop and give his name and address and the name and address of the owner of the vehicle to the Director or to an authorized person shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

Explanatory Note.

(This Note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These regulations have a twofold purpose. First, to make provision for car parks within the Hong Kong Airport. Secondly, to cover other traffic matters which were previously contained in the Hong Kong Airport Regulations.

Carriageways within the Airport, to which members of the public have access, will remain under the Road Traffic Ordinance. The Director of Civil Aviation, under these regulations, will control traffic in car parks and in the restricted parts of the Airport.

HONG KONG AND YAUMATI FERRY COMPANY
(SERVICES) ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 266).

HONG KONG AND YAUMATI FERRY COMPANY
(AMENDMENT) BY-LAWS 1967.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Hong Kong and Yaumati Ferry Company (Services) Ordinance, the Hong Kong and Yaumati Ferry Company, Limited, has made the following by-laws—

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Hong Kong and Yaumati Ferry Company (Amendment) By-laws 1967. Citation.
2. By-law 4 of the principal by-laws is amended— Amendment of
by-law 4.
(Cap. 266, sub. leg.)
 - (a) by deleting paragraph (e) and substituting therefor the following new paragraph—
 - “(e) except in cases of emergency—
 - (i) pass from one deck to another unless he is the driver or passenger of a vehicle that is being carried on a ferry vessel in which he is travelling; or
 - (ii) open any grill or door on any ferry vessel in order to pass from one deck to another;”;
 - (b) in paragraph (g), by deleting “or” at the end thereof;
 - (c) in paragraph (h), by deleting the fullstop at the end thereof and substituting therefor a semicolon; and
 - (d) by inserting the following new paragraphs after paragraph (h)—
 - “(i) gamble or attempt to gamble on any of the Company’s piers or on any ferry vessel;
 - (j) throw or attempt to throw any life buoy or any equipment on or from any of the Company’s piers or on or from any ferry vessel except in cases of emergency;
 - (k) throw or attempt to throw any rubbish from any of the Company’s piers or from any ferry vessel;
 - (l) beg or attempt to beg on any of the Company’s piers or on any ferry vessel; or

(m) hawk or attempt to hawk, sell or attempt to sell any article or service, distribute or attempt to distribute any pamphlet on any of the Company's piers or on any ferry vessel unless written authority has been obtained from the Company."

Amendment of by-law 6.

3. By-law 6 of the principal by-laws is amended—
- (a) in paragraph (1) by inserting the following after "thereof"—
"and a recent photograph of the holder"; and
- (b) in paragraph (3) by deleting "does" and substituting therefor the following—
"and photograph do".

Amendment of by-law 13.

4. By-law 13 of the principal by-laws is amended by inserting the following after "weighbridge"—
"(if provided)".

Cancellation and replacement of by-law 14.

5. By-law 14 of the principal by-law is cancelled and replaced by the following—

"Duties of drivers of vehicles on ferry vessels.

14. Every driver of any vehicle which is transported or is intended to be transported by any ferry vessel or is proceeding to or from any ferry vessel shall—

- (a) drive with due care and attention and with reasonable consideration for other persons using the ferry or approaching to or from the ferry;
- (b) proceed at slow speed along any ramp and along the deck of a ferry vessel;
- (c) obey all lawful instructions which may be given to him by any servant of the Company;
- (d) if the vehicle is a motor vehicle, stop the engine thereof as soon as the vehicle is on board and in position for transport; and
- (e) pay the proper fare for the carriage of the vehicle, its freight (if any) and passengers."

Cancellation of by-law 15.

6. By-law 15 of the principal by-laws is cancelled.

Explanatory Note.

(This Note is not part of the by-laws, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

By-law 2 amends paragraph (e) of by-law 4 of the principal by-laws to provide that, except in cases of emergency, it is prohibited for passengers other than the driver and passengers of a motor vehicle carried on a ferry to pass from one deck to another.

By-law 2 also inserts new paragraphs (i) to (m) at the end of by-law 4 of the principal by-laws. These paragraphs prescribe additional matters prohibited under the principal by-laws.

By-law 3 amends by-law 6 of the principal by-laws to provide that every monthly or seasonal ticket issued by the Company shall bear a recent photograph of the holder thereof.

By-law 4 amends by-law 13 of the principal by-laws by providing that every vehicle shall, before embarkation on a vehicular ferry, pass over a weighbridge if such weighbridge is provided.

By-law 5 cancels and replaces by-law 14 of the principal by-laws. The new by-law prescribes in detail the duties of drivers of vehicles carried on the company's vehicular ferries.

By-law 6 cancels by-law 15 of the principal by-laws, which prescribed the maximum permissible speed of vehicles on ferry vessels.





EMERGENCY (GENERAL HOLIDAY) REGULATIONS 1967.



**ROAD TRAFFIC (INTERNATIONAL CIRCULATION)
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1967.**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 5A of the Road Traffic Ordinance, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (International Circulation) (Amendment) Regulations 1967. Citation.

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting in paragraph (1), after the definition of "registration authority", the following definition—
"“visitor” means any person who satisfies the Authority that he will be staying in the Colony for a period not exceeding one year from the date of his arrival in the Colony;”. Amendment of regulation 2.
(Cap. 220, sub. leg.)

3. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is amended in paragraph (1) by deleting "person resident outside the Colony" and substituting therefor the following—
"visitor". Amendment of regulation 5.

4. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is amended—
(a) in paragraph (1) by deleting "person making only a temporary stay in the Colony" and substituting therefor the following—
"visitor"; and
(b) by deleting paragraph (5) and substituting therefor the following—
"“5) An international circulation permit shall not be granted for any period exceeding one year from the date on which the motor vehicle was last brought into the Colony.”". Amendment of regulation 7.

5. Regulation 9 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting, after paragraph (3), the following new paragraph—
"“4) The holder of an international circulation permit shall, if he leaves the Colony before the expiration of the permit or before the exportation of his vehicle, surrender the permit to a registration authority and thereupon the permit shall cease to be valid.”". Amendment of regulation 9.

Regulation 4(b) amends regulation 7(5) of the principal regulations to provide that an international circulation permit may be granted for a period not exceeding one year from the date on which the motor vehicle was last brought into Hong Kong.

Regulation 5 provides that the holder of an international circulation permit shall surrender such permit to a registration authority in specified circumstances.

This order revokes the Emergency (Prevention of Intimidation) Regulations 1967 in consequence of the incorporation of the substance of the Regulations in the Public Order Ordinance 1967.

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(b) the period of employment shall—

(i) in the case of any young person under the age of sixteen, not exceed nine hours in any day and shall neither begin earlier than six o'clock in the morning nor end later than seven o'clock in the evening; and

(ii) in any other case, not exceed eleven and a half hours in any day and shall neither begin earlier than six o'clock in the morning nor end later than eight o'clock in the evening;

(c) no woman or young person shall be required or permitted to work continuously for a spell of more than five hours without thereafter an interval of not less than half an hour for a meal or rest:

Provided that in the case of any young person under the age of sixteen years such interval shall not be less than one hour;

(d) except with the permission in writing of the Commissioner, the period of employment and the intervals allowed for meals and rest in accordance with the provisions of this regulation shall be the same for all women and young persons employed in such industrial undertaking, except in the case of young persons who have not attained the age of sixteen years;

(e) no woman or young person shall be required or permitted to work during any such interval allowed for meals or rest.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation, employment shall be deemed to be continuous unless interrupted by an interval of at least half an hour, or, in the case of young persons under the age of sixteen, one hour.

(3) Notwithstanding paragraph (1), the proprietor of an industrial undertaking shall not, without the consent in writing of the Commissioner—

(a) increase the period of employment of women and young persons in the industrial under-

taking beyond the period of employment fixed for such women and young persons in a notice posted under paragraph (1) of regulation 10 and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967; or

(b) reduce the intervals for meals or rest allowed to such women and young persons below the intervals fixed in a notice posted under paragraph (1) of regulation 10 and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967.

(4) For the purposes of paragraph (3), any document purporting to be a copy of a notice posted under paragraph (1) of regulation 10 and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967 and purporting to be signed by the proprietor of an industrial undertaking or his duly authorized agent shall be admitted in evidence in proceedings before any court on its production by a public officer without further proof, and—

(a) until the contrary is proved, the court before which such document is produced shall presume—

(i) that the document is a true copy of a notice posted under paragraph (1) of regulation 10 and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967; and

(ii) that the document is signed by the proprietor of the industrial undertaking or his duly authorized agent; and

(b) the document shall be conclusive evidence of—

(i) the period of employment fixed by the proprietor for women and young persons in the industrial undertaking and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967; and

(ii) the intervals allowed to such women and young persons for meals or rest fixed by the proprietor and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967.

Transitional provision.

9A. (1) On the application of the proprietor of any industrial undertaking and subject to such conditions or restrictions as he may think fit to impose, the

Commissioner may direct that, until the 31st day of May 1968, paragraph (2) shall apply to the industrial undertaking.

(2) Where the Commissioner has made a direction under paragraph (1)—

(a) regulation 9 shall apply in relation to the industrial undertaking as if—

(i) sub-paragraph (a)(ii) of paragraph (1) were replaced by the following—

“(ii) in any other case, neither exceed ten in any day nor exceed sixty in any week;” and

(ii) sub-paragraph (b)(ii) of paragraph (1) were replaced by the following—

“(ii) in any other case, not exceed twelve hours in any day and shall neither begin earlier than six o'clock in the morning nor end later than eight o'clock in the evening;” and

(b) regulation 11 shall apply in relation to the industrial undertaking as if “one and a half hours” were deleted from the proviso to paragraph (1) and the following substituted therefor—

“one hour”.

4. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is revoked and replaced by the following—

11. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of this Part relating to hours of work and periods of employment, pressure of work in any industrial undertaking may be dealt with by the overtime employment of women and young persons who have attained the age of sixteen years:

Provided that the overtime employment for the undertaking shall not exceed in the aggregate, calculated in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (10), one hundred and fifty hours in any year or one and a half hours in any day.

(2) The overtime employment of a woman or young person shall be subject to the following conditions—

(a) the total hours worked by the woman or young person shall not exceed eleven in any day; and

(b) the period of employment for the woman or young person shall not exceed thirteen hours in any day and shall not extend outside the hours specified in regulation 9 for the beginning and ending of the period of employment except that it may extend to nine o'clock in the evening.

(3) Before employing in any industrial undertaking any woman or young person in overtime on any day, the proprietor thereof shall—

(a) cause a notice containing particulars of the hours of work and the intervals for meals or rest applicable to those women or young persons to be employed overtime to be posted and kept conspicuously posted at a place conveniently accessible to such women or young persons in the industrial undertaking until completion of such overtime; and

(b) if any part of the overtime to be worked will be in excess of the working hours specified in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of regulation 9, or either earlier or later, as the case may be, than the hours prescribed for the beginning and ending of the period of employment specified in sub-paragraph (b) of that paragraph, send to the Commissioner and enter into a register, in the appropriate prescribed form, to be kept by the proprietor for such purpose, particulars of such overtime employment including particulars of any interval for a meal or rest allowed under paragraph (4).

(4) Where in any industrial undertaking a proprietor allows any women or young persons who are to be employed overtime on any day an interval for a meal or rest in addition to any interval fixed

for the day by a notice posted under regulation 10, he may employ during that interval any women or young persons who are not to be employed overtime on that day, but save as aforesaid the provisions of these regulations relating to continuous employment and intervals for meals or rest shall apply to overtime employment in like manner as they apply to other employment.

(5) If the Commissioner is satisfied that overtime employment in any industrial undertaking of women or young persons, in accordance with the provisions of this regulation, in any process will prejudicially affect the health of such women or young persons, or any class of them, he may by notice in writing served upon the proprietor thereof either prohibit the overtime employment in that process of such women or young persons, or such class of them, or make such further restrictions as to the amount of such overtime employment or otherwise as he thinks fit.

(6) Where the Commissioner is satisfied that work in any class or description of industrial undertaking is subject to seasonal or other special pressure, he may by order published in the *Gazette* as respects any class or description of industrial undertaking—

- (a) increase for women or young persons, employed in any specified process, during any period of such pressure, the hours of work and the period of employment allowed in a day under this regulation, so, however, that the increase shall only take place in such number of weeks, not exceeding eight in any year, as may be specified in the order;
- (b) increase the hours of overtime employment allowed for an industrial undertaking under this regulation in a year to an aggregate not exceeding two hundred hours.

(7) The Commissioner may authorize in writing the increase of the aggregate number of hours of overtime employment allowed for an industrial undertaking under this regulation if he is satisfied that the increase is necessary by reason of unforeseen pressure of work due to sudden orders, or by reason of a

breakdown of machinery or plant or other unforeseen emergency.

(8) For the purpose of this regulation, the employment of women or young persons in different parts of any industrial undertaking or the employment of different sets of women or young persons in different processes may, with the authority in writing of the Commissioner and subject to such conditions as he may by such authorization specify, be treated, for the purposes of reckoning hours of overtime employment, as if it were employment in different undertakings.

(9) If the Commissioner is satisfied that the nature of the business carried on in any industrial undertaking involves the overtime employment of different women or young persons on different occasions to such an extent that the provisions of this regulation limiting overtime employment by reference to the industrial undertaking would be unreasonable or inappropriate, he may grant permission in writing that such undertaking may, in lieu of complying with the said provisions, comply with such provisions limiting overtime employment by reference to the individual woman or young person as may be specified in such consent:

Provided that no woman or young person shall be employed overtime in such undertaking for more than one hundred and fifty hours in any year.

(10) For the purposes of this regulation—

- (a) the expression "overtime employment" means, in relation to any woman or young person, any period during which that woman or young person is at work in the industrial undertaking outside the period of employment fixed for the day for that woman or young person by a notice under regulation 10; and
- (b) in reckoning the aggregate hours of overtime employment, account shall be taken only of any period during which any woman or young person is employed in that industrial undertaking beyond the maximum hours prescribed in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of regulation 9 or either earlier or later, as the case may be, than the hours prescribed

for the beginning and ending of the period of employment specified in sub-paragraph (b) of that paragraph.”.

Amendment of regulation 45.

5. Regulation 45 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting “regulation 9(1)” from paragraph (c) and substituting therefor the following—

“regulation 9(1) or (3)”.

Revocation and replacement of regulations 9 and 9A.

6. Regulations 9 and 9A of the principal regulations are revoked and replaced by the following—

“General conditions as to hours of employment of women and young persons.

9. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Part, no proprietor shall employ any woman or young person in any industrial undertaking unless the working hours, the period of employment and the intervals for meals and rest for such woman or young person conform to the following conditions, namely—

- (a) the total hours worked shall—
 - (i) in the case of any young person under the age of sixteen, neither exceed eight in any day nor exceed forty-eight in any week; or
 - (ii) in any other case, neither exceed nine in any day nor exceed fifty-four in any week;
- (b) the period of employment shall—
 - (i) in the case of any young person under the age of sixteen, not exceed nine hours in any day and shall neither begin earlier than six o'clock in the morning nor end later than seven o'clock in the evening; and
 - (ii) in any other case, not exceed eleven hours in any day and shall neither begin earlier than six o'clock in the morning nor end later than eight o'clock in the evening;
- (c) no woman or young person shall be required or permitted to work continuously for a spell of more than five hours without thereafter an interval of not less than half an hour for a meal or rest:

Provided that in the case of any young person under the age of sixteen years such interval shall not be less than one hour;

- (d) except with the permission in writing of the Commissioner, the period of employment

and the intervals allowed for meals and rest in accordance with the provisions of this regulation shall be the same for all women and young persons employed in such industrial undertaking, except in the case of young persons who have not attained the age of sixteen years;

- (e) no woman or young person shall be required or permitted to work during any such interval allowed for meals or rest.
- (2) For the purposes of this regulation, employment shall be deemed to be continuous unless interrupted by an interval of at least half an hour, or, in the case of young persons under the age of sixteen, one hour.
- (3) Notwithstanding paragraph (1), the proprietor of an industrial undertaking shall not, without the consent in writing of the Commissioner—
 - (a) increase the period of employment of women and young persons in the industrial undertaking beyond the period of employment fixed for such women and young persons in a notice posted under paragraph (1) of regulation 10 and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967; or
 - (b) reduce the intervals for meals or rest allowed to such women and young persons below the intervals fixed in a notice posted under paragraph (1) of regulation 10 and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967.
- (4) For the purposes of paragraph (3), any document purporting to be a copy of a notice posted under paragraph (1) of regulation 10 and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967 and purporting to be signed by the proprietor of an industrial undertaking or his duly authorized agent shall be admitted in evidence in proceedings before any court on its production by a public officer without further proof, and—
 - (a) until the contrary is proved, the court before which such document is produced shall presume—
 - (i) that the document is a true copy of a notice posted under paragraph (1) of regulation 10 and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967; and

(ii) that the document is signed by the proprietor of the industrial undertaking or his duly authorized agent; and

(b) the document shall be conclusive evidence of—

(i) the period of employment fixed by the proprietor for women and young persons in the industrial undertaking and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967; and

(ii) the intervals allowed to such women and young persons for meals or rest fixed by the proprietor and in effect on the 1st day of October 1967.

Transitional provision.

9A. (1) On the application of the proprietor of any industrial undertaking and subject to such conditions or restrictions as he may think fit to impose, the Commissioner may direct that, until the 31st day of May 1969, paragraph (2) shall apply to the industrial undertaking.

(2) Where the Commissioner has made a direction under paragraph (1)—

(a) regulation 9 shall apply in relation to the industrial undertaking as if—

(i) sub-paragraph (a)(ii) of paragraph (1) were replaced by the following—

“(ii) in any other case, neither exceed nine and a half in any day nor exceed fifty-seven in any week;” and

(ii) sub-paragraph (b)(ii) of paragraph (1) were replaced by the following—

“(ii) in any other case, not exceed eleven and a half hours in any day and shall neither begin earlier than six o'clock in the morning nor end later than eight o'clock in the evening;” and

(b) regulation 11 shall apply in relation to the industrial undertaking as if “two hours” were deleted from the proviso to paragraph (1) and the following substituted therefor—

“one and a half hours”.

7. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is revoked and replaced by the following—

Revocation and replacement of regulation 11.

“Overtime employment of women and young persons over sixteen.

11. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of this Part relating to hours of work and periods of employment, pressure of work in any industrial undertaking may be dealt with by the overtime employment of women and young persons who have attained the age of sixteen years:

Provided that the overtime employment for the undertaking shall not exceed in the aggregate, calculated in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (10), two hundred hours in any year or two hours in any day.

(2) The overtime employment of a woman or young person shall be subject to the following conditions—

(a) the total hours worked by the woman or young person shall not exceed eleven in any day; and

(b) the period of employment for the woman or young person shall not exceed thirteen hours in any day and shall not extend outside the hours specified in regulation 9 for the beginning and ending of the period of employment except that it may extend to nine o'clock in the evening.

(3) Before employing in any industrial undertaking any woman or young person in overtime on any day, the proprietor thereof shall—

(a) cause a notice containing particulars of the hours of work and the intervals for meals or rest applicable to those women or young persons to be employed overtime to be posted and kept conspicuously posted at a place conveniently accessible to such women or young persons in the industrial undertaking until completion of such overtime; and

(b) if any part of the overtime to be worked will be in excess of the working hours specified in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of regulation 9, or either earlier or later, as the case may be, than the hours prescribed for the beginning and ending of the period of
