



**PREVENTION OF THE SPREAD OF INFECTIOUS DISEASES  
(HEI LING CHAU) ISOLATION ORDER 1965.**

In exercise of the powers conferred by regulation 23A of the Prevention of the Spread of Infectious Diseases Regulations 1955, the Director of Medical and Health Services has made the following Order—

1. This Order may be cited as the Prevention of the Spread of Infectious Diseases (Hei Ling Chau) Isolation Order 1965, and shall come into operation on the day appointed for the commencement of the Lepers (Repeal) Ordinance 1965.

2. (1) Hei Ling Chau shall be an area subject to isolation in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the Prevention of the Spread of Infectious Diseases Regulations 1955 (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations) and such area shall be known as the Hei Ling Chau Isolation Area.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-paragraph (1), the Hei Ling Chau Isolation Area shall not include the Police Post situated on Hei Ling Chau.

3. Regulation 23B of the Regulations shall have effect in relation to the Hei Ling Chau Isolation Area, except in the case of—

- (a) any visitor appointed under paragraph 4;
- (b) any police officer or other public servant on duty and any other police officer or other public servant whether on duty or otherwise who is stationed at the Police Post situated on Hei Ling Chau; or
- (c) any other person to whom express permission has been granted by the medical officer in charge of the Hei Ling Chau Isolation Area.


4. (1) The Colonial Secretary may appoint visitors for the Hei Ling Chau Isolation Area.

(2) Two or more visitors appointed under sub-paragraph (1) shall, once at least in every three months, together inspect the Hei Ling Chau Isolation Area, and shall see as far as circumstances permit every person restricted there, and shall enter into a book kept for that purpose any remarks which they may deem proper in regard to the management and condition of the Hei Ling Chau Isolation Area and the persons restricted there.

5. Any person who, immediately before the commencement of this Order, was detained as a leper in the Hay Ling Chau Leper Settlement under section 6 of the Lepers Ordinance, shall be deemed to be a sick person who has been removed by a health officer to the Hei Ling Chau Isolation Area under regulation 10 of the Regulations.

*Explanatory Note.*

*(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).*

This Order and the Prevention of the Spread of Infectious Diseases (Declaration of Leprosy) Notification 1965 are complementary to the Lepers (Repeal) Ordinance 1965. It provides that Hei Ling Chau, which has been a leper settlement under the Lepers Ordinance, shall become an isolation area under the Prevention of Spread of Infectious Diseases Regulations 1955. The Police Post is excluded, and official visitors such as Justices of the Peace and certain police officers and other public servants may visit the island. But otherwise paragraph 3 prohibits movement into or out of the island without permission. Paragraph 4 makes provision for the appointment and duties of official visitors and is based on section 5 of the Mental Health Ordinance 1960.





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## RADIATION ORDINANCE 1957.

(No. 35 of 1957).

RADIATION (CONTROL OF RADIOACTIVE SUBSTANCES)  
REGULATIONS 1965.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Radiation Ordinance 1957, the Radiation Board has, subject to the approval of the Legislative Council, made the following regulations—

## PART I.

## PRELIMINARY.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Radiation (Control of Radioactive Substances) Regulations 1965, and shall come into operation on the day appointed for the commencement of the Radiation (Amendment) Ordinance 1961. Citation and commencement. (6 of 1961).

2. (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation. (24 of 1955).  
 "affected industrial undertaking" means an industrial undertaking within the meaning of the Factories and Industrial Undertakings Ordinance 1955, in or by which any radioactive substance is manufactured, used, handled, conveyed or stored;

"affected undertaking" means any undertaking whatsoever, whether carried on for gain or otherwise, in which any radioactive substance is manufactured, used, handled, conveyed or stored, other than an affected industrial undertaking;

"approved laboratory" means a laboratory approved by the Board for the purposes of regulation 10;

"Authority", in relation to an affected industrial undertaking, means the Commissioner of Labour and, in relation to an affected undertaking, or in relation to any person not engaged in an undertaking, the Director of Medical and Health Services;

"employ" and "employment" include reference to any kind of work carried out for another whether voluntarily or for consideration;

"handling" includes physical contact or contact by remote control with any radioactive substance or container containing any such substance;

"luminous compound" means luminous material consisting of or containing any radioactive substance;

"open air" means a space which—

- (a) is vertically uncovered and unobstructed;
- (b) is not less, in any horizontal dimension, than five feet; and
- (c) where such space is enclosed on four sides, has a horizontal area of not less than one square foot for every two feet of the mean height of the walls enclosing the space;

"panel" means such committee as the Board may from time to time appoint under section 5 of the Ordinance, for the purpose of advising the Board upon matters affecting or concerning the state of health of persons employed or to be employed in any work or process involving manufacture or handling of any radioactive substance;

"proprietor", in relation to any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking, includes any person for the time being having the management or control or receiving the profits of the business carried on in such undertaking or employing any person engaged in such business;

"radioactive waste" means waste radioactive substances and waste material contaminated by radioactive substances or which, having regard to its use, may have become so contaminated;

"sealed source" means a radioactive substance which is permanently enclosed in a container in such a manner that it or any part of it cannot be separated from the container unless the container is damaged, but also in such a manner as to permit of the emission of radiation;

"unsealed radioactive substance" means any radioactive substance which is not a sealed source;

(14 of 1953). "vessel" means any launch or ferry vessel within the meaning of section 93 of the Merchant Shipping Ordinance 1953, and any vessel to which the provisions of Part XIV of that Ordinance apply.

(2) For the purposes of these regulations where distance is expressed in metres the following formula shall be deemed to provide an equivalent in feet—

$$\text{metres} \times \frac{10}{3} = \text{distance in feet.}$$

## PART II.

### LICENSING, CONVEYANCE AND STORAGE.

3. Every application pursuant to any of the provisions of section 7 or 9 of the Ordinance for any licence relating to any radioactive substance shall be made in writing addressed to the Authority and shall contain, so far as may be applicable, the following particulars—

- (a) the purpose for which the licence is required;

Application

- (b) the nature and quantity of the radioactive substance in question;
- (c) the type of packing in which the substance is contained;
- (d) the type and dose rate of radiation at the surface of any package;
- (e) in the case of a licence to manufacture, use or store any radioactive substance, the place in which it is to be manufactured, used or stored, and, in the case of a licence to possess for the purpose of transport, the intended means of transport and the place from which it is to be taken and the destination;
- (f) in the case of any application pursuant to the provisions of section 9 of the Ordinance, the area in which prospecting or mining is to be undertaken; and
- (g) such other particulars as the Authority may require.

4. (1) No person shall store or convey, or cause or permit to be stored or conveyed, any container containing any radioactive substance unless such container bears—

- (a) in the case of any container in respect of which the dose rate of the radiation at any point on the external surface of the container does not exceed—

- (i) ten milliroentgens per twenty-four hours in the case of gamma or X radiation;

- (ii) the equivalent of ten milliroentgens per twenty-four hours in the case of beta-radiation; or

- (iii) those values of flux given in Table I to this regulation in the case of neutrons,

a label in the form of Label A prescribed in the Schedule (in this Part referred to as a White Label);

- (b) in the case of any container in respect of which the dose rate of the radiation at any point on its external surface exceeds the limits specified in paragraph (a) but does not exceed at any such point—

- (i) two hundred milliroentgens per hour in the case of gamma or X radiation;

- (ii) the equivalent of two hundred milliroentgens per hour in the case of beta-radiation; or

- (iii) those values of flux given in Table II to this regulation in the case of neutrons,

or if measured at a distance of one metre from any point on the external surface—

- (iv) ten milliroentgens per hour in the case of gamma or X radiation;

(v) the equivalent of ten milliroentgens per hour in the case of beta-radiation; or

(vi) those values of flux given in Table III to this regulation in the case of neutrons,

a label in the form of Label B prescribed in the Schedule (in this Part referred to as a Yellow Label).

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (1), the limits for dose rates referred to for each type of radiation shall be deemed to be equivalent in biological effectiveness.

(3) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

(2) Except with the permission in writing of the Authority, no person shall convey, or cause or permit to be conveyed, on any one vehicle or vessel at any one time more than forty containers of radioactive substance bearing White or Yellow Labels or, in the case of containers bearing Yellow Labels, such lesser number of containers as will limit the total number of radiation units indicated on such Labels to a number not exceeding forty units.

(3) For the purposes of paragraph (2), the total of the dose rates of the following types of radiation measured at one metre from the external surface of a package, at the place where the value is highest, shall be called the number of radiation units for the package—

- for gamma- and/or X-radiation of energy greater than 200 keV: the number of milliroentgens per hour;
- for gamma- and/or X-radiation of which more than twenty per cent has an energy less than 200 keV: the number of milliroentgens per hour multiplied by 3/2;
- for beta-radiation: the number of milliroentgens per hour which is equivalent;
- for neutrons: the number of radiation units, according to the flux relationship given in the Table to this paragraph.

(4) No person shall convey, or cause or permit to be conveyed, any radioactive substance on any vehicle unless there be conspicuously displayed at the front and rear thereof notices in English and Chinese indicating the presence of such substance.

(5) No person shall convey, or cause or permit to be conveyed, any radioactive substance in any vehicle or vessel except under the supervision of the owner, consignor or consignee of the substance or his representative authorized in that behalf.

(6) No person shall convey, or cause or permit to be conveyed, any passengers other than the crew of the vehicle or vessel and the owner, consignor or consignee or any representative thereof authorized in that behalf, in any vehicle or vessel which is conveying radioactive material; and no person shall cause or permit any member of the crew of such vehicle or vessel to be in the same compartment thereof as that in which the radioactive material is conveyed or otherwise nearer to such material than the distance specified in the Table to paragraph (2) of regulation 6.

(L.N. 15/64). (7) No person shall convey, or cause or permit to be conveyed, any goods classified in the Dangerous Goods (Classification) Regulations 1964, as being dangerous goods in the same vehicle or vessel as that in which any radioactive substance is conveyed unless such dangerous goods are themselves radioactive substances.

(8) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of—

- (a) paragraph (1) or (2) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars; and
- (b) paragraph (4), (5), (6) or (7) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

6. (1) No person shall store in any one place a greater number of containers containing any radioactive substance and bearing White or Yellow Labels, as referred to in regulation 4, than forty or such lesser number of containers that the total number of radiation units indicated on such labels does not exceed forty units: Storage.

Provided that the Authority may grant, subject to such conditions as it may think fit to impose, permission in writing for this number of containers or radiation units, as the case may be, to be exceeded in any particular case where the Authority is satisfied that adequate safety precautions exist.

(2) No person shall store, or cause or permit to be stored, any container containing any radioactive substance and bearing a Yellow Label, as referred to in regulation 4, nearer to any area which is used for living accommodation or as regularly occupied working space than the distance, measured in any direction, specified in the Table to this paragraph appropriate to the number of radiation units specified therefor.

(3) For the purposes of the Table to paragraph (2)—

- (a) column A applies where there are no intervening goods, walls or other material of not less than the density of water situated between the container containing the radioactive substance and the living accommodation or working space in question;
- (b) column B applies where there is situated not less than two feet of goods or other material of not less than the density of water and at least one partition composed of sheet steel of not less than one half inch in thickness, or the equivalent in density thereto if composed of other material, between the container containing the radioactive substance and the living accommodation or working space in question;
- (c) column C applies where there is situated not less than six feet and seven inches of goods or other material of not less than the density of water and at least two partitions composed of

sheet steel of not less than one half inch in thickness, or the equivalent in density thereto if composed of other material, between the container containing the radioactive substance and the living accommodation or working space in question;

- (d) column D applies where there is situated not less than thirteen feet and nine inches of goods or other material of not less than the density of water and at least two partitions composed of sheet steel of not less than one half inch in thickness, or the equivalent in density thereto if composed of other material, between the container containing the radioactive substance and the living accommodation or working space in question; and
- (e) the density of water shall be taken to be 62.4 pounds per cubic foot.

(4) No person shall store, or cause or permit to be stored, any radioactive substance in any store or in a room of any building unless there is conspicuously displayed on every entrance to such store or room a notice in English and Chinese indicating the presence therein of such substance.

(5) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1), (2) or (4) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

7. (1) No person shall dispose of, or cause or permit the disposal of, any radioactive waste from any place otherwise than by a method approved by the Board either generally by notification in the *Gazette* or in writing in any particular case.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

### PART III.

#### CONTROL OF EXPOSURE.

8. (1) No proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall cause or permit any person employed therein to be exposed to ionizing radiations exceeding the maximum permissible dose as defined in relation to irradiating apparatus in the Radiation (Control of Irradiating Apparatus) Regulations 1965.

(2) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

Disposal of radioactive waste.

Precautions with regard to exposure.

(L.N. 68/65).

9. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall maintain, or cause to be maintained, a register of every person employed in such undertaking in any work or process involving the regular handling of any radioactive substance. Register of employees.

(2) Every such register shall contain the following particulars relating to every person required to be registered therein, namely—

- (a) the name (together with any alias);
- (b) photograph (adequate for identification);
- (c) current residential address;
- (d) the date of the last medical examination made in accordance with regulation 11 or 12, as the case may be; and
- (e) the dose of radiation indicated by each certificate issued in accordance with regulation 10.

(3) A copy of every register maintained in accordance with this regulation shall be filed with the Authority and thereafter a copy of every addition to or deletion from such register of any entry therein, except an entry relating to sub-paragraph (e) of paragraph (2), shall be filed with the Authority within seven days after such addition or deletion is made.

(4) Every register maintained in accordance with this regulation shall be open to inspection at all reasonable times by any inspector.

(5) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

10. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall make arrangements for the wearing of, and shall direct every person employed in such undertaking in any process involving the regular handling or transport of any unsealed radioactive substance to wear, a suitable photographic film in an appropriate holder, or a radiation dosimeter, each being of a type approved by the Board, during any period in which such person is liable to be exposed to radiation. Recording of personal exposure to radiation.

(2) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking at his expense shall obtain the film and the film-holder referred to in paragraph (1) through the Authority, or from an approved laboratory, and shall arrange for the film, identified by reference to the wearer thereof, to be returned to the Authority or to the laboratory, as the case may be, for examination at intervals not exceeding fourteen days.

(3) Whenever a film is returned for examination to the Authority or to an approved laboratory, as the case may be, the Authority, or the person in charge of the laboratory, shall cause the film to be examined and, so soon as may be thereafter, shall issue to the proprietor who submitted the film for examination a certificate stating the dose of radiation received by such film.

(4) Every proprietor to whom a certificate in accordance with paragraph (3) is issued shall forthwith cause the dose of radiation stated thereon to be entered in the register of employees required to be kept in accordance with the provisions of regulation 9 against the name of the person by whom such film was worn:

Provided that where a radiation dosimeter is worn instead of a film, the employer shall cause the weekly dose of radiation recorded by the dosimeter to be entered in the register against the name of the employee by whom the dosimeter was worn.

(5) (a) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

(b) any person who fails to wear a photographic film or radiation dosimeter when so directed by the proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking in which he is employed shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars.

11. (1) No proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall employ therein any person in any work or process involving the regular handling or transport of any unsealed radioactive substance who—

(a) is under the age of eighteen years; or

(b) has not, within the period of four months immediately preceding his first employment by such proprietor in such work or process, undergone a medical examination by the panel, including blood examination and the taking of relevant medical and occupational histories, and has been certified fit for such employment.

(2) Any person may apply in writing to the Board for medical examination by the panel for the purpose of complying with the requirements of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) and, upon receipt of the application, the Board shall direct the panel to carry out, free of charge, such examination as soon as may be, but in any event not exceeding fourteen days, after receipt of the application and shall within ten days after the examination supply to the applicant two copies of a certificate certifying the date upon which the examination took place and whether

the applicant was found to be fit or unfit, as the case may be, for employment in radiation work.

(3) For the purpose of this regulation the expression "first employment" includes re-employment in any work or process involving the handling of any radioactive substance following a cessation of such employment for any period exceeding fourteen months.

(4) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

12. (1) No proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall continue to employ any person for any period exceeding fourteen months in any work involving the regular handling or transport of any unsealed radioactive substance unless such person undergoes medical examination by the panel, including blood examination, at intervals of not more than fourteen months during the continuance of such employment and is after each examination certified by the Board to be fit for such employment.

Conditions

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (1), the Authority may require, by notice in writing served upon the proprietor of such undertaking, that any person employed by him in any work or process involving the regular handling or transport of any unsealed radioactive substance shall undergo medical examination by the panel, including blood examination, at such time or at such lesser intervals than those specified in paragraph (1) as the Authority, having regard to the circumstances of the case, may consider expedient to safeguard the health of such person; and if such person fails to submit to examination or, after examination, is certified by the Board to be unfit for such employment, such proprietor shall, forthwith upon receipt of notice in writing to that effect, from the Authority, cease to employ such person on such work or process.

(3) Whenever a notice in writing is served upon any proprietor of an affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking in pursuance of the powers conferred by paragraph (2) a copy thereof shall also be served upon the person to which the notice relates.

(4) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) or (2) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

13. Any change in any part of the body of any person who has been engaged in any work or process involving the handling or transport of any radioactive substance which, in the opinion of the panel, is consistent with the effects of over-exposure to radiation shall be deemed to indicate over-exposure thereto.

Radiation Board to keep records of medical examinations.

14. (1) The Board shall keep a record of every medical examination carried out by the panel in accordance with these regulations and shall supply free of charge to any person so examined, and to the proprietor of the affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking, as the case may be, in which such person is employed, a certificate certifying the date upon which the examination took place and whether such person was found to be fit or unfit to be employed in any work or process involving the regular handling or transport of any unsealed radioactive substance.

(2) Upon application, and upon payment of a fee of five dollars, the Board shall issue a certified copy of any certificate referred to in paragraph (1) to the person to whom such certificate relates and to any present or past employer of such person.

Medical examination and inquiry in cases of suspected over-exposure to radiation.

15. (1) If the Authority, as a result of information received or otherwise, has reason to believe that any person employed in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking is suffering from over-exposure to radiation the Authority shall, in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) of regulation 12, require that such person be medically examined by the panel; and if after such examination the Board is satisfied that such person is suffering from the effects of over-exposure to radiation to an extent requiring medical treatment, the Board shall, in addition to any action which the Board may consider appropriate under regulation 12, issue free of charge to such person a certificate certifying as to his condition.

(2) Without prejudice to anything contained in paragraph (1), if the Authority has reason to believe that any person employed in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking is suffering from the effects of, or appears to have been subject to, over-exposure to radiation, the Authority may appoint one or more representatives to investigate the working conditions or the working habits of such person, together with any equipment used by him and to make report thereon to the Authority.

(3) A copy of any report made pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (2) shall be forwarded by the Authority to the Board.

(4) If any person wilfully obstructs or, by knowingly giving false information, endeavours to mislead any representation of the Authority appointed under paragraph (2) in the carrying out of any investigation under this regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars.

## PART IV.

### WORKPLACES AND EQUIPMENT.

16. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall cause—

Construction and cleaning of work-rooms, etc.

- (a) the floors and walls of all workrooms in which unsealed radioactive substances are used to be constructed of smooth impervious material with all interstices effectively sealed, and to be so designed as to permit of easy cleaning;
- (b) all benches and tables on which unsealed radioactive substances are used to have a hard impervious surface, with all interstices effectively sealed, and to be so designed as to permit of easy cleaning;
- (c) all workers exposed to or liable to be exposed to ionizing radiations to be provided with seats of a substantial pattern having smooth impervious surfaces capable of being readily cleaned.

(2) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall cause all benches or tables on which unsealed radioactive substances are handled and all seats used by workers engaged in the handling thereof to be cleaned at the end of each working day or shift and the floors of any workroom in which such substances are used to be cleaned not less than once in each working day and the walls thereof not less than once in each week.

(3) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

17. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking—

Use of luminous compounds.

- (a) shall cause any luminous compound whenever practicable to be applied by a wet method;
- (b) shall not cause or permit the use of brushes in any process for the application of any unsealed radioactive substance; and
- (c) shall not cause or permit luminous powder to be used in any process without the written permission of the Authority.

(2) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

18. (1) No proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall cause or permit any work involving the regular handling or transport of any unsealed radioactive substance to

Exhaust ventilation.

be carried out by any person except in a cabinet provided with exhaust ventilation of a type approved by the Authority.

- (2) (a) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.
- (b) Any person employed in any such undertaking who carries out any work referred to in paragraph (1) otherwise than in a cabinet of a type referred to therein shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars.

Tool racks and cleaning of tools.

19. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall, for the storage of tools not in actual use, provide suitable racks on all work benches on which any unsealed radioactive substance is handled and shall cause such racks and all such tools to be cleaned at the end of each working day or shift.

(2) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

Receptacles for certain substances.

20. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall provide receptacles of a kind approved by the Authority for all unsealed radioactive substances used or stored in such undertaking.

(2) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

Ventilation of drying stove.

21. (1) No proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall cause or permit the use of any stove for the drying of any unsealed radioactive substance, or for the drying of any article to which any such substance has been applied, which is not effectively ventilated to the open air to the satisfaction of the Authority.

(2) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

Provision of storage safes in certain cases.

22. (1) If so required by the Authority the proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall provide and maintain for the storage of radioactive substances, including sealed sources, one or more storage safes of a kind approved by the Authority,

and shall ensure that all radioactive substances which are not in use are stored therein and that only the minimum quantities required for immediate use are removed therefrom at any one time.

(2) Every safe referred to in paragraph (1) which contains any radioactive substance which emits any radioactive substance in gaseous form shall be provided with adequate ventilation to the open air.

(3) The proprietor shall ensure that no radioactive substance, including any sealed source, is removed from the safe referred to in paragraph (1) unless it is contained in a suitable protective container and is removed by a person having reasonable experience or training in the use of radioactive substances.

(4) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

23. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall cause all radioactive waste to be removed at frequent intervals from any workplace in which any radioactive substance, including any sealed source, is handled, and in any case at the end of each working day or shift, and shall cause such waste to be placed in one or more containers of a type approved by the Authority and thereafter disposed of in accordance with the provisions of regulation 7.

Disposal and transport of radioactive waste.

(2) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

24. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall cause all cleaning which is required to be done under these regulations to be done by a wet method and all implements used in such cleaning to be properly washed after use and kept, when not in use, in a locked cupboard kept exclusively for that purpose.

Method of cleaning.

(2) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

## PART V.

## PRECAUTIONS FOR WORKERS.

Protective clothing, etc.

25. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall—

- (a) cause every worker employed in such undertaking who is engaged in the regular handling of any unsealed radioactive substance to be supplied with, and shall direct every such worker to wear, an overall of a pattern approved by the Authority;
- (b) cause any such overall, after each occasion upon which it is used, either to be washed in such manner as the Authority may approve for the purpose of preventing the spread of contamination, or to be disposed of as radioactive waste in accordance with the provisions of regulation 7;
- (c) cause every worker employed in such undertaking who is engaged in the regular handling of any unsealed radioactive substance, in addition to the overall referred to in sub-paragraph (a), to be supplied with, and shall direct every such worker to wear, rubber or plastic gloves for protecting the hands and suitable headgear for protecting the hair;
- (d) cause all such gloves to be washed each time they are removed from the wearers' hands after use and such headgear, when in use, to be washed or renewed at least once each week in such manner as the Authority may approve;
- (e) cause every worker employed in such undertaking who is engaged in the regular handling of any unsealed radioactive substance to be supplied with a locker to be used solely for the storage of personal protective equipment;
- (f) cause every worker employed in such undertaking who is engaged in the regular handling of any unsealed radioactive substance to be provided with an adequate supply of paper handkerchiefs and shall direct every such worker not to use any other handkerchief for any purpose while so engaged;
- (g) cause arrangements to be made for the deposit in receptacles, of a type respectively approved by the Authority, of used paper handkerchiefs requiring disposal and of used articles of personal protective equipment requiring laundering;
- (h) cause receptacles referred to in sub-paragraph (g) to be at all times situated in every workroom, locker room and ablution

room used by any worker engaged in the regular handling of any unsealed radioactive substance and shall cause each such receptacle to be emptied of its contents at the end of each working day or shift and the contents thereof disposed of in accordance with the provisions of regulation 7 as radioactive waste, or, as the case may be, laundered or stored for laundering in a manner approved by the Authority.

(2) The Authority may, upon application in any particular case and upon being satisfied that adequate alternative safety precautions are taken, by notice in writing addressed to the proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking in question waive all or any of the provisions of paragraph (1).

(3) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2)—

- (a) any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars; and
- (b) any person who fails to comply with any direction required to be given pursuant to any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars.

26. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking in which any person is employed in any work or process involving the regular handling of any unsealed radioactive substance shall provide for the use of such person, and shall direct such person to use, a suitable protective screen so constructed that it is or can be placed in a position between the face and the hands of the worker so as effectively to screen the face from the work during the handling of the substance.

Protective screens.

- (2) (a) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.
- (b) Any person who fails to comply with any direction given by the proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars.

27. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall provide washing facilities with soap, towels and nail brushes and an adequate supply of water free from radioactive

Washing facilities.

contamination for the use of any person employed in any work or process involving the regular handling of any unsealed radioactive substance or any containers of such substance, and shall direct any such person to make adequate use of such facilities.

(2) (a) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

(b) Any person who fails to comply with any direction given by the proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking given pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars.

28. (1) No person shall, in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking, introduce into any workplace in which any radioactive substance is handled any article not essential to the processes performed in that workplace and, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, no food or drink, or utensil for the partaking of food or drink, or any materials or articles for smoking or for the application of cosmetics shall be so introduced.

(2) Every worker employed in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who is engaged in the handling of any radioactive substance shall—

(a) wash his hands before each meal; and

(b) before leaving his place of work, deposit all personal protective equipment in the locker or receptacle, as the case may be, provided therefor in accordance with sub-paragraph (e), (g) or (h) of paragraph (1) of regulation 25 and thereafter wash his hands.

(3) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) and any worker who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (2) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars.

29. (1) No proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall cause or permit any person employed therein in work involving the handling of any unsealed radioactive substance to operate by means of his mouth any plant, apparatus or other equipment whatsoever.

(2) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

## PART VI.

### SUPERVISION.

30. (1) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking shall appoint a person having reasonable experience or training in the use of ionizing radiations or the handling of radioactive substances to supervise any work carried on in such undertaking which involves such use or such handling. Supervision.

(2) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

31. (1) If so required by the Authority, either generally by notification in the *Gazette* or in any particular case by request in writing addressed to the proprietor, the proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking, as the case may be, shall post such notices as the Authority may require to be posted in any place in the undertaking in which ionizing radiations are used. Warning

(2) The proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to post any notice referred to in paragraph (1) when so required in accordance with the provisions of that paragraph shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

32. (1) In the event of spillage or other loss of any radioactive substance in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking or in the course of any form of transportation or of any other occurrence in any such undertaking, whether accidental or otherwise, of such a nature that the safety or health of any person is or may be adversely affected thereby, the proprietor of such undertaking, or the carrier in the case of transportation, shall, so soon as the fact of such spillage, loss or occurrence comes to his attention, cause a report of the circumstances to be made to the Authority, and, if such report is made verbally, it shall be followed by a report in writing made within forty-eight hours thereafter. Action to be

(2) In the event of spillage of any radioactive substance in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking, the proprietor of such undertaking shall immediately order the removal of all persons from the workplace affected; and shall so soon as may be thereafter cause the area to be cleansed by a wet method under the supervision of such person as the Authority may designate for the purpose; and until the workplace has been cleansed to the satisfaction of the person so designated and such person has so certified in writing, the proprietor shall permit only such persons as may be required to effect the cleansing to enter the workplace.

(3) In the event of loss of any radioactive substance in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking, the Authority may take such steps as he considers necessary and practicable for the protection of any person who might suffer injury as a result of the loss.

(4) In the event of any other occurrence of the nature described in paragraph (1) in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking, the proprietor of such undertaking shall take such remedial action as the Authority may direct.

(5) Any proprietor of any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) or (2) or who fails to comply with any direction given by the Authority pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (4), and any carrier who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1), shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

## PART VII.

### TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS.

Transitional provisions.

33. (1) Nothing contained in paragraph (1) of regulation 11 shall be construed to affect the employment of any person employed in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking at the date of the commencement of these regulations.

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (1) of regulation 12, where any person is employed in any affected undertaking or affected industrial undertaking at the date of the commencement of these regulations the period of fourteen months referred to in that paragraph shall be deemed to run with effect from such date.

(3) No person shall be convicted of any offence against any of the provisions of regulation 10 which occurs within a period of three months after the date of the commencement of these regulations.

*Explanatory Note.*

*(This Note is not part of the regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport).*

These regulations replace the Factories and Industrial Undertakings (Radiation) Special Regulations 1957, in a revised form suitable for enactment under the Radiation Ordinance 1957, applicable to all undertakings manufacturing, storing or handling radioactive substances, as opposed only to industrial undertakings within the meaning of the Factories and Industrial Undertakings Ordinance 1955. These regulations are complementary to the Radiation (Control of Irradiating Apparatus) Regulations 1965. The two sets of regulations taken together cover the whole field of control in relation to radiation which is considered necessary at the present time, and are designed to come into operation simultaneously.

## RADIATION (CONTROL OF IRRADIATING APPARATUS) REGULATIONS 1965.

RADIATION (CONTROL OF IRRADIATING APPARATUS)  
REGULATIONS 1965.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Radiation Ordinance 1957, the Radiation Board has, subject to the approval of the Legislative Council, made the following regulations—

## PART I.

## CITATION AND INTERPRETATION.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Radiation (Control of Irradiating Apparatus) Regulations 1965, and shall come into operation on the day appointed for the commencement of the Radiation (Amendment) Ordinance 1961. Citation and commencement. (6 of 1961).

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation.  
“approved laboratory” means a laboratory approved by the Board for the purposes of regulation 16;

“dental practitioner” means a person for the time being registered or deemed to be registered under the Dentists Registration Ordinance 1959; (29 of 1959).

“dental X-ray machine” means a type of irradiating apparatus specifically designed for the taking of radiographs of the teeth or jaws;

“dose” is the quantity of absorbed energy from radiation;

“dosemeter” means an instrument for measuring exposure to radiation;

“dose rate” is the dose per unit of time, usually expressed as “rads per minute” and abbreviated “rads/min.” or as “rems per minute” and abbreviated “rems/min.”;

“employ” and “employment” include reference to any kind of work carried out in furtherance of apprenticeship or any agreement for training;

“equivalent thickness of lead” means such thickness of lead as is equally opaque to a specific quality of radiation;

“exposure rate” means the exposure per unit of time, usually expressed as “roentgens per minute” and abbreviated “r/min.”;

“filter” means any substance interposed in a beam of radiation for the purpose of changing its quality or intensity, or both; and “filtration” has a meaning corresponding therewith;

"half-value layer" means the thickness of material which reduces to half the exposure rate of a particular beam of radiation;

"intensity" means the quantity of radiation passing through a unit area perpendicular to the direction of the beam of radiation per unit of time;

"ionometric method" means a method of measurement based on the ionization produced by the radiation which is being measured;

"licence" means a licence issued under section 10 of the Ordinance;

"licensee", in relation to any irradiating apparatus, means a person holding a licence for the time being in force issued under the Ordinance with respect to that apparatus;

"maximum permissible dose", in relation to persons employed in radiation work, means a dose of radiation—

(a) in the case of skin of the hands, forearms, feet or ankles, of 20 rems in any calendar quarter or 75 rems in any calendar year; or

(b) in the case of any other parts of the body, of 3 rems in any calendar quarter or 5 rems in any calendar year;

(25 of 1957). "medical practitioner" means a medical practitioner for the time being registered or exempted from registration under the Medical Registration Ordinance 1957;

"millirad" means one thousandth part of one rad;

"millirem" means one thousandth part of one rem;

"milliroentgen" means one thousandth part of one roentgen;

"panel" means such committee as the Board may from time to time appoint under section 5 of the Ordinance for the purpose of advising the Board upon matters affecting or concerning the state of health of persons employed or to be employed on, or engaged in, radiation work;

"photograph" means a photograph of approximate size neither greater than two inches by two and three-quarter inches nor smaller than one and one half inches by two and three-quarter inches;

"proximity", in relation to any irradiating apparatus, means a position in which a person may be liable to receive a dose of radiation exceeding 1.5 rems to any part of the body if such position were retained by him for one calendar year;

"quality", in relation to radiation, means the property of the radiation which determines the manner in which it affects and is itself altered by the matter it traverses, expressed quantitatively in terms of equivalent constant potential or half-value layer;

"rad" means a unit of absorbed dose of energy from radiation which is equivalent to 100 ergs per gramme of material irradiated;

"radiation" and "rays" mean ionizing radiation;

"radiation hazard" means the danger to health arising from exposure to ionizing radiation whether such danger is due to radiation arising from sources outside the human body or to radiation from radioactive substances within the body;

"radiation work" means work by any person which involves proximity to any irradiating apparatus in operation;

"roentgen" or "r" means the unit of exposure to X or gamma rays and represents such quantity of X or gamma radiation that the associated corpuscular emission per 0.001293 gramme of air will produce, in air, ions carrying one electrostatic unit of quantity of electricity of either sign;

"rem" means that quantity of radiation which when absorbed by man produces an effect biologically equivalent to the absorption by man of one rad of X-rays with average specific ionization of one hundred ion pairs per micron of water, in terms of its air equivalent, in the same region;

"sealed source" means a radioactive substance which is permanently enclosed in a container in such a manner that it or any part of it cannot be separated from the container unless the container is damaged, but also in such a manner as to permit of the emission of radiation;

"useful beam" means, in the case of X-rays, that part of the radiation from an X-ray tube that passes through the aperture, cone or other device for collimating the X-ray beam, and, in other cases, any radiations from a sealed source that can be employed for the purposes for which the sealed source is used;

"X-ray machine" means any machine that can be used for the production of X-rays.

## PART II.

### LICENCE.

3. (1) Every application for a licence in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance shall be in Form 1 of the First Schedule.
- (2) Each such Form shall be completed and delivered to the licensing authority together with the prescribed fee and two copies of a photograph of the applicant:

Provided that where a partnership or company is the applicant no photograph shall be required.

4. A licence to operate, possess, sell, manufacture or otherwise deal in, any irradiating apparatus shall be in Form 2 of the First Schedule.

5. The licence fees payable to the Board in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance shall be the fees prescribed in the Second Schedule and shall be payable twelve monthly.

6. (1) Every licensee shall cause to be exhibited in a conspicuous place in any premises in which any irradiating apparatus is situated the licence appertaining to such apparatus.

(2) Any licensee who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

7. (1) Every licensee shall within seven days after the removal of any irradiating apparatus from the address at which it is situated according to the particulars stated in the licence relating to such apparatus, report in writing to the Board the address to which such irradiating apparatus has been removed, and in the case of the sale or other disposal of such irradiating apparatus, the name and address of the purchaser, or the particulars relating to such other disposal, as the case may be:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to prevent the temporary removal from the address stated in the licence relating thereto of any portable or mobile irradiating apparatus incidental to its operation as such.

(2) Upon a report being made to the Board in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1), the licensee, if so required by the Board, shall forward the licence relating to such apparatus to the Board, either for cancellation, substitution or amendment by the Board, as may be appropriate.

(3) Any licensee who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars; and any licensee who fails to comply with any requirement of the Board made under paragraph (2) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

### PART III.

#### HEALTH.

Conditions  
for first

8. (1) No employer shall employ any person in any radiation work who—

(a) is under the age of eighteen years; or

(b) has not, within the period of four months immediately preceding his first employment by such employer in such work or process, undergone a medical examination by the panel, including blood examination and the taking of relevant medical and occupational histories and has been certified by the Board fit for such employment.

(2) Any person may apply in writing to the Board for medical examination by the panel for the purpose of complying with the requirements of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) and, upon receipt of the application, the Board shall direct the panel to carry out, free of charge, such examination as soon as may be, but in any event not exceeding fourteen days, after receipt of the application and shall within ten days after the examination supply to the applicant two copies of a certificate certifying the date upon which the examination took place and whether the applicant was found to be fit or unfit, as the case may be, for employment in radiation work.

(3) Every application made under paragraph (2) shall be accompanied by three copies of a recent photograph of the applicant.

(4) For the purpose of paragraph (1) of this regulation, the expression "first employment" includes re-employment in radiation work following a cessation of such employment for a period exceeding fourteen months.

(5) Any employer who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

9. (1) No employer shall continue to employ any person for any period exceeding fourteen months in radiation work unless such person undergoes medical examination by the panel, including blood examination, at intervals of not more than fourteen months during the continuance of such employment and is after each such examination certified by the Board to be fit for such employment.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (1), the Board may require, by notice in writing served upon the employer of any person employed in radiation work, that such person shall undergo medical examination by the panel, including blood examination at such time or at such lesser intervals than those specified in paragraph (1) as the Board, having regard to the circumstances of the case, may consider expedient to safeguard the health of such person; and if any such person fails to submit to examination or, after examination, is certified by the Board to be unfit for employment in radiation work, such employer shall forthwith, upon receipt of notice in writing to that effect from the Board, cease to employ such person in radiation work.

(3) Whenever a notice in writing is served upon an employer in pursuance of the powers conferred by paragraph (2), a copy thereof shall also be served upon the person to whom the notice relates.

(4) Any employer who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1), or continues to employ any person after receipt of a notice from the Board relating to such person to the effect that such person has failed to submit to medical examination required pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (2) or by such medical examination has been found unfit for employment in radiation work, shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

Presumptions as to exposure to radiation.

10. Any change in any part of the body of any person known to have been exposed to radiation which, in the opinion of the panel, is consistent with the effects of over-exposure to radiation shall be deemed to indicate over-exposure thereto.

Board to keep records of medical examinations.

11. (1) The Board shall keep a record of every medical examination carried out by the panel in accordance with these regulations and shall supply free of charge to every person so examined, and to his employer, if any, a certificate certifying the date upon which such examination took place and whether such person was found to be fit or unfit, as the case may be, to engage in radiation work.

(2) Upon application, and upon payment of a fee of five dollars, the Board shall issue a certified copy of any certificate referred to in paragraph (1) to the person to whom such certificate relates and to any present or past employer of such person.

Employers to report suspected cases of over-exposure to radiation.

12. (1) Every employer who has reason to believe that any person employed by him is or appears to be suffering from the effects of over-exposure to radiation shall notify the Board in writing of the facts upon which such belief is based as soon as may be, and in any event not later than seven days, after such facts have come to his knowledge.

(2) Any employer who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

Medical examination and inquiry in cases of suspected over-exposure to radiation.

13. (1) If the Board, as a result of information received or otherwise, has reason to believe that any person employed in radiation work is suffering from over-exposure to radiation the Board shall, in the manner prescribed in regulation 9, require that such person be medically examined by the panel; and if after such examination the Board is satisfied that such person is suffering from the effects of over-exposure to radiation to an extent requiring medical treatment, the Board shall, in addition to any action which the Board may consider appropriate under regulation 9, issue free of charge to such person a certificate certifying as to his condition.

(2) Without prejudice to anything contained in paragraph (1), if the Board has reason to believe that any person employed in radiation work is suffering from the effects of, or appears to have been subjected to, over-exposure to radiation, the Board may appoint one or more representatives to investigate the working conditions or the working habits of such person, together with any equipment used by him, and to make report thereon to the Board.

(3) If any person wilfully obstructs or, by knowingly giving false information, endeavours to mislead any representative of the Board appointed under paragraph (2) in the carrying out of any investigation under this regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars.

#### PART IV.

##### CONTROL OF EXPOSURE TO RADIATION.

14. (1) Except in the case of a patient who is required to be exposed to radiation in furtherance of medical treatment or investigation prescribed by a medical practitioner or dental practitioner, no person shall cause or permit any other person to be exposed to a dose of radiation to any part of the body in excess of—

Permissible dose.

(a) in the case of a person employed in radiation work, the maximum permissible dose; or

(b) in the case of any other person—

(i) if such person is of the age of eighteen years or over, 1.5 rems, or

(ii) if such person is under the age of eighteen years, 0.5 rems,

in any calendar year.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

15. (1) Every employer who employs any persons in radiation work shall maintain or cause to be maintained a register of such persons.

Register of employees.

(2) Every such register shall contain the following particulars relating to every person employed in radiation work—

(a) the name (together with any alias);

(b) photograph (adequate for identification);

(c) current residential address;

- (d) the date of the last medical examination made in accordance with regulation 9 or 13, as the case may be; and
- (e) the dose of radiation indicated by each certificate issued in accordance with regulation 16.

(3) Every register maintained in accordance with this regulation shall be open to inspection at all reasonable times by any person authorized thereto in writing by the Board.

(4) Any employer who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1), (2) or (3) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

**16.** (1) The employer of any person employed in radiation work shall make arrangements for and shall direct the wearing by such person of a suitable photographic film in an appropriate film holder or the wearing of a radiation dosimeter, each being of a type approved by the Board, during any period in which such person is liable to exposure to radiation.

(2) (a) Where such person is employed in radiation work in any industrial undertaking required to be registered under the provisions of the Factories and Industrial Undertakings Ordinance 1955, the employer shall obtain at his own expense the film and film holder referred to in paragraph (1) through the Commissioner of Labour, or from a laboratory approved by the Board, and shall arrange for the film, identified by reference to the wearer thereof, to be returned to the Commissioner of Labour or to the laboratory, as the case may be, for examination at such intervals as the Commissioner of Labour may from time to time direct.

(b) Where such person is employed in radiation work otherwise than in an industrial undertaking required to be registered under the provisions of the Factories and Industrial Undertakings Ordinance 1955, the employer shall obtain at his own expense the film and film holder referred to in paragraph (1) through the Director of Medical and Health Services or from an approved laboratory, and shall arrange for the film, identified by reference to the wearer thereof, to be returned to the Director, or to the laboratory, as the case may be, for examination at such intervals as the Director may from time to time direct.

(3) Whenever a film is returned for examination to the Commissioner of Labour, the Director of Medical and Health Services or an approved laboratory, as the case may be, the Commissioner, the Director, or the person in charge of such laboratory shall cause the film to be examined and shall so soon as may be thereafter issue to the

employer who submitted the film for examination a certificate certifying the dose of radiation received as represented by the results of the examination of the film.

(4) Every employer to whom a certificate in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (3) is issued shall forthwith cause the dose of radiation indicated thereon to be entered in the register of employees required to be kept in accordance with the provisions of regulation 16 against the name of the employee by whom the film was worn:

Provided that where a radiation dosimeter is worn instead of a film, the employer shall cause the weekly dose of radiation recorded by the dosimeter to be entered in the register against the name of the employee by whom the dosimeter was worn.

(5) Any employer who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1), (2) or (4) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

(6) Any person who fails or refuses to wear a film or radiation dosimeter when so directed by his employer in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

## PART V.

### MATERIAL PROTECTION AND SAFE PRACTICE.

**17.** (1) No licensee shall cause or permit any irradiating apparatus to be used continuously in any room unless the floors, ceilings, walls and observation windows thereof are so constructed that nowhere outside the room does the radiation dose rate, averaged over any one minute, exceed 0.75 millirads per hour:

Material protection in case of static irradiating apparatus.

Provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any floor, ceiling, wall or observation window so sited that the space immediately outside thereof is not capable of habitual occupation by any human being.

(2) All protective material, other than sheet lead, shall be indelibly marked in such a way as to show readily its equivalent thickness of lead, and protective materials which depend upon substances other than lead for their protective properties shall in addition have marked thereon the constant electrical potential used for the generation of X-rays under the conditions at which the equivalence applies.

(3) All protective glass, including lead glass or lead barium glass, or protective liquid observation windows, shall be clearly and indelibly marked in such a way as to show readily its equivalent thickness of lead.

(4) No licensee shall use any protective material, other than sheet lead, which is not marked in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (2) or paragraph (3).

(5) Nothing in this regulation shall be construed to prevent the temporary removal from the address stated in the licence relating thereto of any portable or mobile irradiating apparatus incidental to its operation as such.

(6) Any licensee who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) or (4) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

**18.** (1) No person shall use for fluoroscopy of any part of the human body any X-ray machine unless the total filtration of the useful beam from such machine corresponds to not less than two millimetres thickness of aluminium, or its equivalent where other materials are used, as determined at the maximum voltage.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

**19.** (1) The protective housing of all X-ray tubes shall be indelibly marked in such a way as to show readily the equivalent lead thickness of the protective housing for the maximum voltage for which the housing is designed to be used.

(2) If the thickness of the protective material incorporated in the protective housing is not uniform over the entire surface thereof, the marking showing the equivalent thickness of lead may be replaced by a marking showing the farthest distance in any direction, measured from the target of the X-ray tube, at which all radiation, other than the useful beam, is reduced to an exposure rate of one hundred milliroentgens per hour if the enclosed X-ray tube is energized at its highest rated continuous milliamperage and maximum voltage.

(3) Any licensee who operates, or causes to be operated, any X-ray tube which is not enclosed in a protective housing marked in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or (2) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

**20.** Any person who manufactures, sells or possesses any television set which emits radiation at a rate exceeding 0.5 milliroentgen per hour measured at any readily accessible point on the surface of the apparatus shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

Filtration of useful beam from X-ray machine used for fluoroscopy.

Marking of protective housing of X-ray tubes.

Restriction on radiation from television sets.

**21.** (1) No person shall use any irradiating apparatus for therapeutic purposes unless—

(a) the dose rate and the quality of the radiation emitted by the apparatus have been measured by a person approved by the Board for that purpose and using an ionometric or other method of measurement also approved by the Board;

(b) both the dose rate and the quality of the radiation from such apparatus are periodically so measured at such intervals as the Board may direct; and

(c) a record of all such measurements is kept by the licensee and is open to inspection by any person authorized by the Board for that purpose.

(2) No person shall use a radiation dosimeter or a radiation dose-rate meter for any determination made in accordance with paragraph (1), unless it is independent of, or corrected for, the quality of radiation within the range for which it is designed or used, and is provided with suitable arrangements for checking its ability to reproduce its readings.

(3) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) or (2) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

**22.** (1) No person shall use any time switch, exposure timer or treatment timer in connexion with any irradiating apparatus used for therapeutic purposes unless such switch or timer is tested from time to time, as may be required by the Board, for accuracy by a person approved by the Board for such purpose and when last so tested was found to be accurate to within one per cent.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

**23.** (1) Any person administering any treatment involving the exposure of any patient to radiation from any irradiating apparatus shall, during exposure to such radiation, himself keep the patient under observation and also the apparatus by means of which the treatment is being administered and shall determine the duration of the treatment either by an automatic treatment timer or by an integrating dosimeter.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

**24.** (1) In any therapeutic application of X-rays, the type of filter used for the useful beam or the half-value layer resulting therefrom shall at each treatment be entered in a treatment record of the patient by the person administering the treatment.

Determination of dose rate and quality of radiation.

Testing of timers for use in connexion with irradiating apparatus.

Supervision of persons undergoing treatment.

Recording and checking of filters.

(2) If the filter is changed before any treatment, the details of the new filter shall be checked by two persons, one of whom shall be the person administering the treatment, and the other the licensee or a person authorized thereto by the licensee.

(3) Both persons referred to in paragraph (2) after having checked any new filter in accordance with the provisions of that paragraph, shall cause the details of the new filter and the date upon which it was checked to be entered in the treatment record before any treatment is administered.

(4) Any person making any therapeutic application of X-rays who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1), (2) or (3) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

25. Any person who operates any X-ray machine in an atmosphere which contains ignitable gas or vapour shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

Prohibition of operation of X-ray machines in presence of ignitable gas or vapour.

## PART VI.

### OPERATION OF IRRADIATING APPARATUS.

26. (1) No person other than a medical practitioner or a person acting under his personal supervision shall operate an irradiating apparatus for any purpose affecting the human body:

Provided that notwithstanding the provisions of this regulation, a dental practitioner or a person acting under his personal supervision may operate a dental X-ray machine for the diagnosis of conditions of the teeth or jaws.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

27. (1) Any person who has in his possession any irradiating apparatus shall within three months after the commencement of these regulations declare to the Board, by completion of such form of declaration as the Board shall require, full particulars of such apparatus and the safety measures employed to guard against radiation hazards.

(2) Declaration forms for completion in accordance with paragraph (1) shall be obtainable from the Medical and Health Department free of charge on application.

(3) Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

Restriction on use of irradiating apparatus.

Declaration of irradiating apparatus.

28. (1) A record shall be kept by the licensee, at the place of application, of every application of X-rays, gamma rays, beta rays or accelerated subatomic particles applied for medical therapeutic purposes, and such record shall be made available for inspection on request by any person authorized by the Board for that purpose.

Records of the use of certain rays.

(2) Any licensee who fails to comply with any of the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five thousand dollars.

29. (1) The licensee of any irradiating apparatus shall, if so required by the Board either generally by notice in the *Gazette* or individually by notice in writing served upon him by the Board, keep posted in a conspicuous place on or near the irradiating apparatus such notice, in English and Chinese, as the Board may direct drawing attention to the hazards attendant upon the improper use of such apparatus.

Warning notices.

(2) Any licensee who fails to comply with any requirement of the Board notified pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

## PART VII.

### TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS.

30. (1) Nothing contained in paragraph (1) of regulation 8 shall be construed to affect the employment of any person employed in radiation work at the date of the commencement of these regulations.

Transitional provisions.

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (1) of regulation 9, where any person is employed in radiation work at the date of the commencement of these regulations the period of fourteen months referred to in that paragraph shall be deemed to run with effect from such date.

(3) No person shall be convicted of any offence created by any of the provisions of regulation 16, 17, 18, 19 or 20 which occurs within a period of three months after the date of the commencement of these regulations.

WATERWORKS (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1965.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 29 of the Waterworks Ordinance, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Waterworks (Amendment) Regulations 1965. Citation.

2. Appendix I of the Waterworks Regulations is amended, under the heading "PRICE OF WATER", by the deletion of the first, second and third paragraphs and the substitution therefor of the following— Amendment of Appendix I. (Vol. IX, p. 158).

"1. In this Table—

fresh water for—

- (a) "construction purposes" includes any fresh water used for any purpose connected with construction or alteration of any premises; or
- (b) "shipping purpose" includes any fresh water—
  - (i) supplied to any pier, wharf or seawall for use on any vessel other than a vessel required to be licensed under regulations made under sections 94 and 102 of the Merchant Shipping Ordinance 1953 and including that supplied to or for use on any vessel employed for the conveyance of water to vessels not licensed under the aforesaid regulations;
  - (ii) supplied to any pier, wharf or seawall or for use on any vessel required to be licensed under regulations made under sections 94 and 102 of the Merchant Shipping Ordinance 1953 but excluding that supplied to or for use on any vessel employed for the conveyance of water to vessels not licensed under the aforesaid regulations; or
- (c) "trade purposes" includes any fresh water used for any purpose connected with any trade, manufacture or business other than construction or shipping purposes; or
- (d) "domestic purposes" means any fresh water used for any purpose connected solely with the occupation of a dwelling-house.


2. The price of fresh water, filtered or unfiltered per unit of 1,000 gallons shall be—

HONG KONG AND YAUMATI FERRY COMPANY  
BY-LAWS 1965.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Hong Kong and Yaumati Ferry Company (Services) Ordinance 1951, the Hong Kong and Yaumati Ferry Company, Limited, has made the following by-laws—

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Hong Kong and Yaumati Ferry Company By-laws 1965.

2. In these by-laws—  
“ferry vessel” means a ferry vessel belonging to the Company.

*Interpretation.*

3. (1) No person shall—
- (a) trespass on any part of the Company's piers or other place exclusively reserved for the Company's ferries or on any part of the Company's premises;
  - (b) alight, or attempt to alight from, or enter, or attempt to enter, any ferry vessel while in motion or alight, or attempt to alight from, or enter, or attempt to enter, any ferry vessel except by the proper entrances or exits, and no person shall open or remove, or attempt to open or remove, or climb over, or attempt to climb over, any barrier or gate erected on any of the Company's piers;
  - (c) travel, or attempt to travel, or bring any vehicle, on board the deck of any ferry vessel after being warned by any servant of the Company that such deck contains its full complement of passengers or vehicles;
  - (d) travel on a special ferry vessel, unless the same is advertised as being for the public use, except by permission of the person who hired or engaged such ferry vessel;
  - (e) embark on or disembark from any ferry vessel from or to any sampans, boats or other craft if any other means of embarkation or disembarkation is provided;
  - (f) embark on or travel by any ferry vessel without having first paid the proper fare;
  - (g) spit in or from or against any ferry vessel or any of the Company's piers or premises; or

*Conduct of the public and provisions in respect of tickets, etc.*

(h) wilfully obstruct any person acting under the authority of the Company in the lawful discharge of his duties.

(2) All tickets issued in exchange for payment of the fare (with the exception of monthly or season tickets) shall be handed un mutilated to the ticket collector on the pier for checking and must be surrendered to the ticket collector on board the ferry vessel or at the place of destination. In a class or classes for which no tickets are issued in exchange for payment of the fare, each passenger must, before embarking, pass through the appropriate turnstile situate on the Company's piers.

Conduct of passengers.

4. No passenger shall—

- (a) stand upon any seat, or place his feet on any seat, on a ferry vessel or on any of the Company's piers;
- (b) smoke in any part of a ferry vessel marked "No Smoking";
- (c) smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or upon any part of any ferry vessel in such a manner as to cause a nuisance or inconvenience to other passengers;
- (d) travel in a class superior to that for which his ticket is issued;
- (e) pass from one deck to another except in cases of emergency or, for the purpose of so passing, open any grill or door on any ferry vessel;
- (f) enter or attempt to enter the engine room, wheel-house or bridge of any ferry vessel or any part of any ferry vessel which is marked "No Admittance";
- (g) swear or use obscene or offensive language while in or upon any ferry vessel or any of the Company's piers or premises, or commit any nuisance in on from or against any ferry vessel or any of the Company's piers or premises; or
- (h) stand upon or obstruct the approaches to the gangway or other appliance of any ferry vessel or impede or hamper in any way the movement of such gangway or appliance.

Luggage.

5. No person shall take in any ferry vessel as personal luggage anything other than small handbaskets, bags or parcels of a form or description not calculated to annoy or inconvenience other passengers. The personal luggage taken by any one person shall not exceed in the aggregate twenty-eight pounds in weight or one cubic foot in measurement. All such personal luggage shall be carried by hand and be under the personal care and control of the person taking the same. The Company shall not be responsible for its safe custody or any damage sustained by it. Such personal luggage shall not occupy any part of the seats.

6. (1) Every monthly or season ticket shall bear in legible form the name of the holder thereof. Monthly and season tickets.

(2) Every monthly or season ticket holder shall for the purpose of identification sign all monthly or season tickets purchased by him.

(3) No passenger shall use, or attempt to use, any season ticket which is not issued in the passenger's own name or upon the face of which the passenger's own name does not appear, and no monthly ticket holder shall sell or transfer, or attempt to sell or transfer, a monthly ticket of which he is the holder to any other person.

(4) Holders of monthly or season tickets shall not travel on any special ferry vessels which are advertised as being for the public use without paying the same fare and in the same manner as persons other than monthly or season ticket holders.

(5) All monthly and season tickets shall be produced for inspection by any of the Company's servants whenever the holder is entering upon any of the Company's piers, and every monthly or season ticket holder whenever travelling on any ferry vessel, or being on any of the Company's piers, shall on demand by any servant of the Company produce his monthly or season ticket for examination or in default shall pay the same fare for the journey as that legally demandable from a passenger who is not a monthly or season ticket holder.

7. (1) In the event of any monthly or season ticket holder contravening any of these by-laws in connexion with such monthly or season ticket, any servant of the Company shall be entitled, on being satisfied that an offence has been committed, to retain such ticket. Forfeiture and cancellation of monthly and season tickets.

(2) The Company shall be entitled, on being satisfied that an offence has been committed against these by-laws, to forfeit such monthly or season ticket and shall not be under any liability to make any refund in respect thereof.

8. No person whose dress or clothing may in the opinion of any servant of the Company soil or injure the seats or fittings of any ferry vessel or of the Company's piers or the dress or clothing of any other passenger, and no person who in the opinion of any servant of the Company may for any other reason be offensive to passengers shall enter upon any of the Company's piers or travel in any ferry vessel, and it shall be lawful for the Company's servants to prevent any such person from so doing. Dress.

9. No person shall take a dog or other animal in any ferry vessel or on any of the Company's piers except on a lead and after first having obtained the permission of a servant of the Company on duty. Any Dogs or other animals.

dog or animal taken into or upon any ferry vessel or any of the Company's piers shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the ferry vessel or pier immediately on request by any servant of the Company, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Company's servants.

## Intoxication.

10. No person who in the opinion of any servant of the Company is in such a state of intoxication as to render him or her unfit to travel on any ferry vessel shall enter upon any pier belonging to the Company or any ferry vessel, and any servant of the Company may refuse to allow any such person access to the Company's piers or ferry vessels.

## Damage.

11. No person shall wilfully damage injure or deface any of the Company's property.

## Restriction on persons who may enter vessels or piers.

12. No person except a passenger or an intending passenger, or police or revenue officers in the active pursuance of their duty, shall enter upon any ferry vessel or any of the Company's piers. Nothing contained in this by-law shall be deemed to authorize any police or revenue officer to enter upon any ferry vessel or upon any of the Company's piers except upon duty and for the purpose of performing some act in pursuance of that duty.

## Vehicles.

13. Every vehicle, before embarkation on any ferry vessel provided for the transport of vehicles, shall pass over the weighbridge and through the enclosed car park.

## Duties of drivers of vehicles on ferry vessels.

14. Every driver of any vehicle which is transported or is intended to be transported by any ferry vessel shall—

- (a) exercise all due care and precautions in the handling of the vehicle;
- (b) if the vehicle is a motor vehicle, stop the engine thereof as soon as the vehicle is on board and in position for transport;
- (c) obey all lawful instructions which may be given to him by any servant of the Company; and
- (d) pay the proper fare for the carriage of the vehicle, its freight (if any) and passengers.

## Speed of vehicles on ferry vessels.


15. No vehicle shall pass along any ramp or along the deck of a ferry vessel at a greater speed than three miles per hour.

## Power of Company's servants to demand name and address.

16. If any servant of the Company has reason to believe that any person has contravened or is contravening any of these by-laws, he may ask such person for his name and address, and such person shall then forthwith furnish to the servant of the Company his true name and his true address.

17. Any person who contravenes any of these by-laws shall be Penalties, guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of two thousand dollars.

*Explanatory Note.*

(This Note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These regulations by regulation 2 amend the principal regulations by deleting and replacing the Second Schedule with the object of—

- providing for certain increases in rents in respect of premises in Mark I, Mark II and Mark III Blocks in resettlement estates;
- defining more clearly the different types of accommodation in resettlement estates; and
- breaking down of the total amount of rents for premises in Mark I and Mark II Blocks.

In the case of domestic premises in Mark I, Mark II and Mark III Blocks there has been an increase in the rents consequent upon an increase in water charges. This increase takes effect from the first day on or after the 1st day of July, 1965 upon which rent falls due to be paid.

2. In the case of domestic premises in Mark I and Mark II Blocks there has been a further increase of rents due to an increase in the basic rents for all such premises. Regulation 3 of these regulations provides that the increase in the total rent attributable to an increase in the basic rent and, where applicable the further increase attributable to the payment of rates will become effective on the first date on or after the 1st day of November, 1965 upon which rent falls due to be paid in respect of each premises.

3. In the case of commercial and shop premises there has been no increase either in the basic rent or in the additional sum payable in respect of rates. However the total monthly rent in respect of such premises in Mark I and Mark II Blocks has been broken down in the same manner as for premises in Mark III and Mark IV Blocks. A sum attributable to the payment for water charges has been deducted from the existing rent and the basic rent is the existing inclusive rent less the sum payable in respect of water charges. There is no additional sum payable in respect of rates for commercial and shop premises in Mark I and Mark II Blocks since the basic rent includes a sum in respect of rates.
