ERA OF DYNAMIC CHANGES FOR HK ENVISAGED

* * * * *

THE RELOCATION OF PORT AND AIRPORT FACILITIES TO THE WEST OF THE TERRITORY WILL GIVE A FACELIFT TO METROPOLITAN HONG KONG BY THE END OF THE CENTURY. THE SECRETARY FOR PLANNING, ENVIRONMENT AND LANDS, MR GRAHAM BARNES, SAID TODAY (MONDAY).

BY THEN, THE TERRITORY WILL ALMOST BE FULLY CONVERTED FROM A BASIC EXPORT AND MANUFACTURING ECONOMY INTO A PORT-LED, SERVICES ECONOMY, BIG IN ASIA, BUT ESPECIALLY IN RELATION TO CHINESE TRADE AND EXTERNAL RELATIONS.

MR BARNES WAS SPEAKING ON "THE SHAPE OF HONG KONG AFTER PADS" AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE 24TH CONVENTION OF THE INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF ASIAN AND WESTERN PACIFIC CONTRACTORS' ASSOCIATIONS.

LOOKING TO THE TURN OF THE CENTURY, MR BARNES SAID MANY IMPORTANT FEATURES OF THE METROPLAN WOULD START TO SURFACE.

"WE WILL GET THE BEGINNINGS OF REAL URBAN IMPROVEMENTS IN OUR RENEWAL AND WE WILL PRODUCE MORE GLITTER," HE SAID.

BY THAT TIME, TSING YI SHOULD BE THE LANDING POINT OF FIVE BRIDGES AND ONE TUNNEL, WITH ITS SOUTHEAST COAST OCCUPIED BY CONTAINER OPERATIONS.

THE TWO VALLEYS IN TUNG CHUNG AND TAI HO IN NORTH LANTAU WOULD BE NEW TOWNS IN THE MAKING.

THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF LANTAU WOULD BE ALMOST COMPLETELY LEVELLED AND AN EXTENSIVE RECLAMATION WOULD EXTEND SOUTHWARD TOWARDS PENG CHAU IN WHICH TWO OR THREE CONTAINER TERMINALS WOULD ALREADY BE OPERATING, HE SAID.

"I BELIEVE THAT THE EXISTING COUNTRY PARKS WILL SURVIVE THIS ACTIVITY WELL, AND WILL REMAIN FOR MANY YEARS TO BE AVAILABLE FOR RECREATION," MR BARNES SAID.

HE ALSO EXPECTED THE CASTLE PEAK ROAD TOWNSHIPS SUCH AS SHAM TSENG, TSING LUNG TAU AND TAI LAM CHUNG TO BE HIGHLY URBANISED.

"THE MAI PO MARCHES WILL, HOPEFULLY, STILL BE MARSHES, BUT THE BIRDS WILL BE HAVING TO TOLERATE A MUCH LARGER AMOUNT OF BOTH ROAD TRAFFIC AT LOK NA CHAU AND RIVER TRAFFIC IN THE SHENZHEN RIVER AND ESTUARY," HE SAID.

MR BARNES SAID TAI PO AND SAI KUNG, BOTH LOW DENSITY HOUSING DISTRICTS, WOULD HAVE THEIR COUNTRY PARK AREAS WELL SECURED.

MEANWHILE, THE WEST KOWLOON RECLAMATION WOULD BECOME THE TRANSPORT SPINE OF THE KOWLOON PENINSULA, ADDING ABOUT A THIRD TO THE LAND AREA OF THE PENINSULA.

"MOST OF THE OLD YAU MA TEI WILL BE GONE AND REPLACED BY LARGER COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENTS BUILT BY THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION." HE SAID.

IN EAST KOWLOON. MR BARNES SAID. LARGER AREAS OF RECLAMATION WOULD SURROUND THE OLD KAI TAK RUNWAY AND FORM A MASS OF LAND ALMOST EQUAL TO THE SIZE OF KOWLOON PENINSULA NOW.

"IN THE AREAS BEHIND THE AIRPORT. WITH HEIGHT LIMITS THEN RELEASED AND MODIFIED. THE SKYLINE OF KOWLOON WILL BE CHANGING AND MAJOR REPLANNING WILL BE HAVING SOME EFFECT ON THE GENERAL ENVIRONMENT." HE SAID.

BESIDES. A CONSIDERABLE NUMBER OF OLDER PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES IN THE NORTHEAST KOWLOON WOULD BE REPLACED BY MODERN ESTATES WITH MORE CONCENTRATED AND BETTER SHOPPING CENTRES AND AMENITY AREAS.

THE CENTRE OF KWUN TONG WOULD LOOK MORE SHABBY AND OBSOLETE AS THE ESTATES AROUND IT WERE PROGRESSIVELY REDEVELOPED WITH MORE MODERN COMPLEXES.

MOVING A LITTLE FURTHER ON FROM KWUN TONG. TSEUNG KWAN O WILL BE ALMOST FULLY DEVELOPED WHICH COULD WELL BE THE MOST PLEASANT NEW TOWN IN HONG KONG.

ON PLANNING FOR EFFICIENT MODERN INDUSTRIAL AREAS. MR BARNES SAID: "I THINK THAT IN 10 YEARS' TIME WE WILL ONLY BE BEGINNING TO SOLVE THE MAJOR PROBLEM OF RENEWAL OF THE URBAN INDUSTRIAL AREAS."

HE SAID THIS COULD BE ACHIEVED EITHER BY EXTENSION OF THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION'S WORK TO INDUSTRY OR THROUGH SOME OTHER AGENCY AND THAT THE SITUATION IN THEM WAS LIKELY TO BE FAR FROM TIDY.

ON HONG KONG ISLAND. MR BARNES SAID THE CENTRE OF BUSINESS WOULD PROBABLY HAVE MOVED INTO THE TAMAR AREA.

"APART FROM THE CENTRAL AND WAN CHAI RECLAMATION WHICH IS VERY LARGE. CHANGES ARE LIKELY TO BE LOCAL AND MAY WELL BE IN THE HANDS OF THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION WHICH WILL TRANSFORM THE WESTERN END OF CENTRAL. AND TO A LESSER EXTENT. WAN CHAI." HE SAID.

ANOTHER IMPORTANT FEATURE. MR BARNES SAID. WOULD BE MORE HARBOUR LINKS INCLUDING RAIL LINKS.

"BOTH THE CENTRAL AND WAN CHAI DEVELOPMENT AND THE AIRPORT PREDICATE CROSS HARBOUR RAIL LINKS. WHICH WHEN DEVELOPED. WILL MAKE HONG KONG INTO A MUCH MORE RAIL-DEPENDENT CITY THAN IT IS NOW.

"EVEN ABERDEEN SHOULD HAVE SOME KIND OF A RAIL LINK BY THEN. WHICH SHOULD HELP STIMULATE DEVELOPMENT IN POK FU LAM AND BELCHER'S BAY." HE SAID.

/ON THE

ON THE ENVIRONMENT FRONT, MR BARNES SAID WATER POLLUTION OF THE SOUTHERN WATERS SHOULD BE VERY MUCH REDUCED AND THE BEACHES SHOULD HAVE GOOD BATHING ONCE AGAIN FOLLOWING THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN INTERCEPTING SEWER ACROSS THE SOUTH OF THE ISLAND AND WITH KOWLOON SEWAGE EFFECTIVELY TREATED AT STONECUTTERS ISLAND.

WITH ALL THE WATER CONTROL ZONES ENFORCED FOR SEVERAL YEARS, THE SECRETARY BELIEVED HONG KONG WATERS SHOULD BE MUCH BETTER BY THEN.

"THIS IS NOT PIE IN THE SKY: WE REALLY ARE IN REACH OF CONSIDERABLE IMPROVEMENT," HE SAID.

BILL TO STEP UP SAFETY AT WORK
* * * * *

A BILL HAS BEEN INTRODUCED INTO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO DEFINE CLEARLY THE DUTIES OF EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES IN THE AREA OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AND TO REQUIRE EACH PARTY TO PLAY A PART IN MAINTAINING A SAFE WORK PLACE, THE SECRETARY FOR EDUCATION AND MANPOWER, MR K.Y. YEUNG, SAID THIS (MONDAY) EVENING.

THE BILL, AMENDING THE FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS ORDINANCE, ALSO PROVIDED FOR CUSTODIAL PENALTIES AS SANCTIONS AGAINST SERIOUS OFFENCES.

MR YEUNG WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE "CONFERENCE ON SAFETY AND HEALTH MANAGEMENT - A JAPANESE EXPERIENCE" ORGANISED JOINTLY BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT AND THE JAPAN INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ASSOCIATION.

HE NOTED THAT THE PROBLEM OF INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENTS HAD BEEN CONTAINED IN THE MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY, WHERE THE NUMBER OF ACCIDENTS CAUSED BY POWER DRIVEN MACHINERY, THE LARGEST PROPORTION OF ACCIDENTS IN THE INDUSTRY, HAD DECREASED BY 37 PER CENT FROM 12,000 IN 1979 TO 7,500 IN 1988.

"BUT THE SITUATION IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY REQUIRES SPECIAL ATTENTION," HE ADDED.

"NOT ONLY HAS THE ABSOLUTE NUMBER OF ACCIDENTS RISEN FROM 17,000 IN 1979 TO 27,000 IN 1988, OR BY AS MUCH AS 58 PER CENT, BUT THE ACCIDENT RATE HAS ALSO SHOT UP FROM 220 PER 1,000 WORKERS TO 370.

"THIS MEANS THAT LAST YEAR MORE THAN ONE IN THREE CONSTRUCTION WORKERS WERE INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT," MR YEUNG SAID.

"ALTHOUGH THE NUMBER OF FATALITIES HAS FALLEN FROM 95 IN 1979 TO 58 IN 1988, THE RATE OF FATAL ACCIDENTS IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY IS ABOUT 50 TIMES THAT OF MANUFACTURING," HE NOTED.

MR YEUNG ATTRIBUTED THE "APPALLING SITUATION" TO GENERALLY POOR WORKING ENVIRONMENTS, THE LACK OR TOTAL ABSENCE OF SITE SUPERVISION AND THE PROFIT MOTIVE WHICH HAD DRIVEN DEVELOPERS AND CONTRACTORS TOWARDS THE ACHIEVEMENT OF VERY TIGHT TIME LIMITS.

CALLING ON EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES TO JOIN FORCES WITH THE GOVERNMENT TO IMPROVE THE SITUATION, HE SAID THE FACTORY INSPECTORATE OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT WAS CONCENTRATING ITS RESOURCES ON THE INSPECTION OF CONSTRUCTION SITES AND "THIS IS BEGINNING TO HAVE SOME EFFECT ON REDUCING THE NUMBER OF ACCIDENTS DURING THE RAINY SEASON".

MR YEUNG URGED EMPLOYERS TO REVIEW THEIR PROCEDURES TO SEE IF THE MANAGEMENT OF WORK SITES COULD BE IMPROVED IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY.

HE ALSO ASKED PRINCIPAL CONTRACTORS TO ENSURE EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION AND COORDINATION ON THE WORK SITE WHILE EMPLOYEES SHOULD COOPERATE WITH THE MANAGEMENT IN ENSURING SAFETY.

HE ALSO TOLD THE 460 PARTICIPANTS IN THE CONFERENCE THAT HONG KONG HAD A LOT TO LEARN FROM JAPAN'S EXPERIENCE AS THE COUNTRY HAD THE BEST SAFETY RECORD IN THE ASIA PACIFIC REGION, PARTICULARLY IN CONSTRUCTION.

SECRETARY FOR SECURITY REFUTES UNHCR ALLEGATIONS

* * * * *

THE SECRETARY FOR SECURITY, MR GEOFFREY BARNES, TODAY (MONDAY) REFUTED "UNFOUNDED" ALLEGATIONS BY THE UNHCR THAT UNDUE FORCE WAS USED DURING THE TRANSFER OF 48 VIETNAMESE BOAT PEOPLE FROM THE CHI MA WAN DETENTION CENTRE TO PHOENIX HOUSE.

REPLYING TO THE UNHCR ALLEGATION, MR BARNES POINTED OUT THAT THERE WAS NO TRUTH WHATSOEVER IN THE ACCUSATION THAT PEOPLE AT CHI MA WAN WERE RENDERED UNCONSCIOUS AND HAD TO BE REVIVED BY NURSES.

HE ALSO SAID THAT X-RAYS AND FURTHER MEDICAL REPORTS HAD CONFIRMED THAT NO FRACTURED RIB WAS SUSTAINED BY A VIETNAMESE AS HAD BEEN ALLEGED BY THE UNHCR.

MR BARNES' COMMENTS FOLLOWED AN EXAMINATION OF REPORTS RECEIVED FROM THE UNHCR.

"I BELIEVE THAT THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT (CSD) AND POLICE OFFICERS INVOLVED DISCHARGED THEIR DUTIES WITH GREAT RESTRAINT AND PATIENCE." HE SAID.

MR BARNES EXPLAINED THAT THE OFFICERS INVOLVED WERE DIRECTED BY THE GOVERNMENT TO MOVE THE 48 PEOPLE CONCERNED WITHOUT JEOPARDISING THE SAFETY OF THOSE DIRECTLY INVOLVED OR THE OTHER INMATES OF THE CHI MA WAN CAMP.

"THEY CARRIED OUT THIS POTENTIALLY DIFFICULT OPERATION WITHOUT SERIOUS INCIDENT," HE SAID.

"ONLY A MINIMUM DEGREE OF FORCE WAS USED. THIS WAS ONLY EMPLOYED WHEN ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY AND THE SMALL NUMBER OF MINOR INJURIES RECEIVED BY SOME OF THE CSD OFFICERS AND THE VIETNAMESE TESTIFIES TO THIS."

COMMENTING ON SOME OF THE SPECIFIC POINTS MADE IN THE UNHCR REPORTS, MR BARNES SAID THAT ALL THOSE BOAT PEOPLE MOVED WERE EXAMINED BY MEDICAL OFFICERS AT CHI MA WAN AND AGAIN AT PHOENIX HOUSE.

HE POINTED OUT THAT THE UNHCR'S OWN MEDICAL REPORTS CONFIRMED THOSE OF THE CSD MEDICAL OFFICERS IN THAT THEY GAVE DETAILS OF MINOR INJURIES RECEIVED BY FIVE VIETNAMESE.

THE MOST SERIOUS OF THE UNHCR'S INJURY REPORTS ALLEGED THAT ONE PERSON HAD SUSTAINED A FRACTURED RIB. HE SAID, AND X-RAYS AND FURTHER MEDICAL REPORTS HAD CONFIRMED THE ORIGINAL ASSESSMENT THAT THIS WAS NOT THE CASE AND THAT NO FRACTURE WAS SUSTAINED.

MR BARNES ALSO REFUTED THE UNHCR'S ALLEGATIONS THAT PEOPLE AT CHI MA WAN WERE RENDERED UNCONSCIOUS AND HAD TO BE REVIVED BY NURSES.

"NONE WAS STUNNED OR BECAME UNCONSCIOUS OR WAS KNOCKED TO THE GROUND," HE SAID.

AS TO THE TIMING OF THE TRANSFER FROM THE HUTS, MR BARNES CLARIFIED THAT THE OPERATION BEGAN AT 6 AM, NOT 4 AM, AND DESCRIBED THIS AS "NOT AT ALL UNUSUAL" FOR MOVEMENTS FROM AN OUTER ISLAND TO A MAINLAND SITE.

HE EMPHASISED THAT THE OPERATION HAD BEEN PLANNED WITH GREAT CARE AS ON A PREVIOUS ATTEMPT, SOME WEEKS EARLIER. THE CSD HAD ENCOUNTERED IMMEDIATE THREATS OF VIOLENCE AND ARSON AND A FLAT REFUSAL BY BOAT PEOPLE TO MOVE FROM THEIR HUT.

"IT WAS THEREFORE ESSENTIAL ON THIS OCCASION TO EMPLOY SUFFICIENT STAFF TO ENSURE THE SAFETY BOTH OF THE PEOPLE TO BE MOVED AND OF ALL OTHER INMATES OF CHI MA WAN."

PROCESSING OF IVORY EXPORT LICENCE APPLICATIONS EXPEDITED

* * * * *

THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT (AFD) WILL GIVE PRIORITY ATTENTION TO THE PROCESSING OF APPLICATIONS FROM IVORY TRADERS FOR EXPORT LICENCES IN ORDER TO HELP THEM EXPORT THEIR IVORY STOCKS EXPEDITIOUSLY.

A CONFERENCE OF THE CONVENTION ON INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN ENDANGERED SPECIES OF WILD FAUNA AND FLORA (CITES) PARTIES HELD IN LAUSANNE, SWITZERLAND, LAST MONTH DECIDED TO BAN THE INTERNATIONAL IVORY TRADE BETWEEN CITES PARTIES WITH EFFECT FROM JANUARY 18 NEXT YEAR.

THE BAN ALSO APPLIES TO HONG KONG'S EXISTING IVORY STOCK, WHICH AMOUNTS TO 670 TONNES. AS THE TERRITORY IS A PARTY TO CITES THROUGH THE UK'S MEMBERSHIP.

THE PROBLEM IS AGGRAVATED BY THE FACT THAT SOME CITES PARTIES WHICH ARE MAJOR MARKETS FOR HONG KONG'S IVORY EXPORTS, INCLUDING JAPAN, THE U.S. AND EC COUNTRIES, HAD CLOSED THE DOORS FOR IVORY IMPORTS SINCE JUNE.

THE GOVERNMENT HAS REQUESTED THE UK AUTHORITIES TO ENTER A SIX-MONTH RESERVATION TO THE CITES DECISION TO ALLOW LOCAL TRADERS ANOTHER 180 DAYS AFTER JANUARY 18 TO DISPOSE OF THEIR EXISTING IVORY STOCK BUT THE UK HAD YET TO RESPOND.

IN A CIRCULAR ISSUED TO IVORY TRADERS TODAY (MONDAY), AFD'S SENIOR CONSERVATION OFFICER, MR M.K. CHEUNG, EXPLAINED THAT WITH IMMEDIATE EFFECT, ALL APPLICATIONS FOR IVORY EXPORT LICENCES WOULD BE GIVEN PRIORITY ATTENTION IN ORDER TO FACILITATE THE EXPORT OF EXISTING IVORY STOCKS TO COUNTRIES WHICH STILL ACCEPTED THEM DURING THE INTERIM PERIOD.

"UNDER THIS NEW ARRANGEMENT, IT MAY NORMALLY TAKE ONE TO TWO WORKING DAYS TO PROCESS AN APPLICATION PROVIDED THAT THE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS ARE IN ORDER AND CAN CLEARLY INDICATE THAT THE IVORY IN QUESTION ARE DERIVED FROM LEGAL AND CITES APPROVED SOURCES." MR CHEUNG SAID.

IN HONG KONG, LICENCES ARE REQUIRED FOR THE EXPORT OF BOTH RAW AND WORKED IVORY UNDER THE ANIMALS AND PLANTS (PROTECTION OF ENDANGERED SPECIES) ORDINANCE. PREVIOUSLY, IT TOOK ABOUT SEVEN WORKING DAYS TO PROCESS APPLICATIONS FOR THE IVORY EXPORT LICENCES.

HEALTH EXHIBITION OPENS AT CITY HALL

* * * * *

MANY OF THE CHRONIC AND DEGENERATIVE DISEASES ARE CAUSED BY THE UNHEALTHY LIFESTYLE OF THE INDIVIDUAL. THE SENIOR PRO-VICE-CHANCELLOR AND PROFESSOR OF MEDICINE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG, PROFESSOR ROSIE YOUNG, SAID TODAY (MONDAY).

"HEALTH EDUCATION, THEREFORE, PLAYS A VERY IMPORTANT ROLE IN THE PREVENTION OF SUCH DISEASES." SHE SAID.

PROF YOUNG WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF A HEALTH EXHIBITION ORGANISED BY THE CENTRAL HEALTH EDUCATION UNIT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

WITH THE PROGRESS OF THE SOCIETY AND ADVANCEMENT IN MEDICINE, MOST OF THE INFECTIOUS DISEASES IN HONG KONG HAD BEEN BROUGHT UNDER CONTROL. PROF YOUNG SAID.

HOWEVER, THEY WERE SOON REPLACED BY SUCH DISEASES AS CANCER, HEART AILMENT AND DIABETES. SHE SAID.

TO ENABLE THE PUBLIC TO HAVE A BETTER KNOWLEDGE OF THESE AND OTHER DISEASES, PROF YOUNG SAID THE CENTRAL HEALTH EDUCATION UNIT HAD, SINCE ITS INCEPTION IN 1978, ORGANISED NUMEROUS HEALTH EDUCATION ACTIVITIES IN HONG KONG.

"THE SUCCESS OF THESE ACTIVITIES HAS TO DEPEND ON THE CO-OPERATION AND SUPPORT OF THE PUBLIC." SHE SAID.

TURNING TO PRIMARY HEALTH CARE (PHC), PROF YOUNG SAID AS TIME WENT BY, THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH SERVICES IN HONG KONG HAD UNDERGONE MANY CHANGES.
