HK IS A VITAL LINK IN WORLD POSTAL NETWORK

HONG KONG IS A VITAL LINK IN THE UNIVERSAL POSTAL NETWORK AS REFLECTED BY THE HUGE VOLUME OF AIR MAIL HANDLED BY THE POST OFFICE.

OVER A QUARTER MILLION POSTAL ITEMS ARE PROCESSED DAILY AT THE POST OFFICE'S AIR MAIL CENTRE AT KAI TAK AIRPORT AND THERE ARE INDICATIONS THAT THE AIRBORNE POSTAL TRAFFIC VIA HONG KONG IS STILL GROWING, IN PARTICULAR, MAIL ITEMS IN TRANSIT.

THE ASSISTANT CONTROLLER OF POSTS IN CHARGE OF THE AIR MAIL CENTRE, MR. LEE KIM-LEUNG SAID: +THERE WAS A NINE PER CENT GROWTH IN OUTWARD AIR MAIL TRAFFIC FROM 55 MILLION ITEMS IN 1977/78 TO 60 MILLION LAST FINANCIAL YEAR AND THE TREND IS CONTINUING IN THE FIRST HALF OF THIS FISCAL YEAR.+

+THERE WAS SIGNIFICANT GROWTH IN THE WEIGHT OF TRANSIT MAIL HANDLED WHICH SHOWED A 40 PER CENT INCREASE IN 1978/79 COMPARED WITH THAT IN 1977/78,+ MR. LEE SAID.

TO COPE WITH THE INCREASING WORKLOAD, PLANS ARE IN HAND TO CONSTRUCT A NEW MECHANISED MAIL PROCESSING CENTRE AT THE AIRPORT.

AND TO MAKE ROOM FOR FUTURE EXPANSION, IT IS ALSO PROPOSED THAT THE AIR LETTER SECTION BE RESITED AT THE INTERNATIONAL MAIL CENTRE IN HUNG HOM DUE FOR COMPLETION NEXT YEAR.

AT PRESENT ALL OUTWARD-BOUND AIRBORNE POSTAL ITEMS ARE DELIVERED TO THE AIR MAIL CENTRE VIA THREE MAIN POST OFFICES - THE GPO, THE KOWLOON CENTRAL POST OFFICE AND TSIM SHA TSUI POST OFFICE.

ON RECEIVING THEM, POSTAL WORKERS AT THE CENTRE HAVE TO WORK AGAINST TIGHT DEADLINES TO PROCESS THE MAIL AND PUT IT ON THE FIRST AVAILABLE FLIGHT BOUND FOR A PARTICULAR DESTINATION.

+THE WORK INVOLVES DATE-STAMPING, SORTING, DOCUMENTATION AND FINALLY PUTTING THE ITEMS INTO MAIL BAGS,+ MR. LEE SAID.

+SOMETIMES THE WORK HAS TO BE COMPLETED IN LESS THAN 30 MINUTES BECAUSE THE MAIL MUST BE HANDED OVER TO THE RESPECTIVE AIRLINES AN HOUR BEFORE THE SCHEDULED DEPARTURE TIME.

+AND IN THE CASE OF A FLIGHT CHANGE, WE WILL HAVE TO MAKE ALTERNATIVE ARRANGEMENTS TO GET THE MAIL ON TO ANOTHER CARRIER TO AVOID OR MINIMISE ANY DELAY,+ HE SAID.

THERE IS A SEPARATE SECTION IN THE AIR MAIL CENTRE FOR HANDLING SPEEDPOST PACKAGES. THESE PACKAGES BYPASS THE NORMAL SORTING PROCESSES AND ARE GIVEN SPECIAL TREATMENT TO ENSURE THAT THEY RECEIVE THE BEST POSSIBLE SERVICE. FOR EXAMPLE, A SPEEDPOST ITEM POSTED IN HONG KONG ON A MONDAY CAN BE DELIVERED TO CENTRAL LONDON BY TUESDAY AFTERNOON AND ANYWHERE IN THE UNITED KINGDOM BY WEDNESDAY MORNING. +THIS SERVICE CALL FOR SPEEDY AND THOROUGH PROCESSING AT ALL STAGES RIGHT UP TO DELIVERY,+ MR. LEE SAID.

TAI MEI TUK COUNTRY PARK INFORMATION CENTRE OPENS

* * * * *

THE FIRST COUNTRY PARK VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE OPENED TODAY (SATURDAY) AT THE ENTRANCE TO THE PLOVER COVE COUNTRY PARK AT TAI MEI TUK.

A SECOND VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE WILL BE OPENED AT ABERDEEN COUNTRY PARK NEXT MONTH AND MORE ARE PLANNED FOR OTHER COUNTRY PARKS.

AT THE OPENING CEREMONY TODAY, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE HEUNG YEE KUK, MR. STEPHEN WONG YUEN-CHEUNG SAID THAT THE KUK WAS IN FAVOUR OF COUNTRY PARKS PROVIDED THAT THE TRADITIONAL RIGHTS OF LOCAL PEOPLE IS LOOKED AFTER.

HE SAID THAT IT WAS ALSO NECESSARY TO PROVIDE ADEQUATE FACILITIES AND SERVICES IN COUNTRY PARKS SO THAT THE PLACE WOULD NOT BE POLLUTED AND THAT THE VISITORS WERE PROPERLY GUIDED AND EDUCATED. THIS WAS TO ENSURE THAT VISITORS WOULD RESPECT THE PROPERTIES OF THE LOCAL PEOPLE.

+ I AM GLAD TO SEE THAT CONSIDERABLE PROGRESS HAS BEEN MADE BY THE COUNTRY PARKS AUTHORITY IN THESE DIRECTIONS. A WELL DESIGNED TOILET/REFRESHMENT KIOSK HAS RECENTLY BEEN COMPLETED NEAR THE PLOVER COVE DAM AND I AM PLEASED TO LEARN THAT LOCAL VILLAGERS WERE GIVEN PRIORITY IN TENDERING FOR THE OPERATION OF THIS KIOSK,+ SAID MR. WONG.

THE PLOVER COVE COUNTRY PARK IS THE MOST POPULAR OF THE 21 PARKS MANAGED BY THE AUTHORITY. LAST YEAR MORE THAN 1.15 MILLION VISITORS WERE RECORDED IN THE AREA — REPRESENTING 22.6 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF VISITORS TO HONG KONG'S COUNTRY PARKS.

THE VISITORS INFORMATION CENTRE AT TAI MEI TUK CONSISTS OF ILLUSTRATIONS AND PHOTOGRAPHS OF HISTORICAL, ENVIRONMENTAL AND ECOLOGICAL ASPECTS OF THE PLOVER COVE AND ADJOINING PAT SIN LENG COUNTRY PARKS.

THE COUNTRY PARKS AUTHORITY, MR. TED NICHOLS ALSO ATTENDED THE OPENING OF THE CENTRE. HE STRESSED THAT THE COUNTRYSIDE EDUCATION PROGRAMME IS PART OF THE COUNTRY PARKS DEVELOPMENT.

+ITS PURPOSE IS TO ENABLE THE VISITORS TO KNOW THE LAND, WATER, PLANTS AND ANIMALS OF THE AREA THEY VISIT- TO APPRECIATE THEIR IMPORTANCE TO THE COMMUNITY AND TO PROMOTE A DESIRE TO CONSERVE THESE VALUABLE RESOURCES.

+A VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE, LIKE THIS ONE, IS AN IMPORTANT FACILITY TO ACHIEVE THIS GOAL,+ SAID MR. NICHOLS.

NEW ROAD MARKING TO GUIDE MOTORISTS
* * * * *

A NEW TYPE OF ROAD MARKING TO IMPROVE ROAD SAFETY AND PROVIDE A BETTER MEANS OF GUIDANCE TO MOTORISTS WILL BE INTRODUCED ON HONG KONG ROADS.

THE NEW MARKING, WHICH MAY SAVE LIVES, WILL BE LAID ON A TRIAL BASIS FROM MONDAY (OCTOBER 22) UNTIL JANUARY NEXT YEAR.

ALTOGETHER ABOUT 10 000 SQUARE METRES OF REFLECTIVE THERMOPLASTIC ROAD MARKING WILL BE +HOT LAID+ BY MACHINE.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE HIGHWAYS OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (SATURDAY) THE NEW MARKING LASTS LONGER THAN PAINT AND IS MORE DISTINCT TO ROAD USERS.

+THE CONTRACT WITH WIMPEY ASPHALT HONG KONG LTD ALSO COVERS THE REMOVAL OF THE MARKING SHOULD THIS BE REQUIRED,+ SAID THE SPOKESMAN.

HE EXPLAINED THAT THERMOPLASTIC IS A RESINOUS MATERIAL WITH MINUTE GLASS BEADS ADDED TO MAKE IT MORE REFLECTIVE. IT RANGES IN THICKNESS FROM 1.5 MM TO 5 MM.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT ROAD MARKING WOULD START IN THE NEW TERRITORIES BETWEEN SHA TIN AND TAI PO, THEN MOVE INTO KOWLOON AND FINALLY TO HONG KONG ISLAND.

+NATURALLY THE MACHINE MOVES RATHER SLOWLY AND THERE MAY BE TIMES WHEN MOTORISTS WILL HAVE TO BE PATIENT. BUT THEY SHOULD REMEMBER THAT THE NEW MARKING IS FOR THEIR BENEFIT, AND IF THERE IS A LITTLE INCONVENIENCE ON A FEW OCCASIONS IT IS WELL WORTH IT,+ HE SAID.

PROJECT TO INCREASE OUTPUT OF RED HILL WATER WORKS

THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT WILL BEGIN WORK SOON ON AN EXTENSION TO THE RED HILL WATER TREATMENT WORKS AT TAI TAM BAY.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE PWD SAID TODAY (SATURDAY) THAT THE EXTENSION WAS REQUIRED TO COPE WITH THE INCREASED DEMAND FOR WATER FROM THE STANLEY-REPULSE BAY AREA.

HE SAID, THE PROJECT WOULD INCREASE THE OUTPUT OF THE TREATMENT WORKS FROM 6 300 CUBIC METRES TO 10 900 CUBIC METRES A DAY.

THE WORK, TENDERS FOR WHICH ARE BEING INVITED, INCLUDES THE CONSTRUCTION OF A FLOCCULATION TANK, TWO RAPID GRAVITY FILTER BEDS AND A CHEMICAL HOUSE.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT WORK WOULD BEGIN IN DECEMBER AND TAKE ABOUT 14 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

CHUNG YEUNG FESTIVAL IS A STATUTORY HOLIDAY
* * * * *

A LABOUR DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN TODAY (SATURDAY) REMINDED EMPLOYERS THAT THE CHUNG YEUNG FESTIVAL WHICH FALLS ON OCTOBER 29 IS ONE OF THE 10 STATUTORY HOLIDAYS APPOINTED UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE.

UNDER THE ORDINANCE, ALL MANUAL EMPLOYEES WITHOUT DISTINCTION, INCLUDING DOMESTIC SERVANTS, IRRESPECTIVE OF THEIR EARNINGS AND ALL NON-MANUAL EMPLOYEES EARNING NOT MORE THAN \$3 500 A MONTH, ARE ENTITLED TO THE HOLIDAY. THEY MUST ALSO BE PAID FOR THE DAY OFF IF THEY HAVE WORKED CONTINUOUSLY FOR THEIR EMPLOYERS FOR THREE MONTHS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE STATUTORY HOLIDAY.

IF AN EMPLOYEE IS REQUIRED TO WORK ON THE HOLIDAY, HE MUST BE GIVEN AN ALTERNATIVE DAY OFF WITHIN 60 DAYS BEFORE OR AFTER THAT DAY.

IF THE ALTERNATIVE HOLIDAY IS TO BE GRANTED BEFORE THE STATUTORY HOLIDAY, THE EMPLOYER MUST NOTIFY THE EMPLOYEE 48 HOURS IN ADVANCE OF THE ALTERNATIVE HOLIDAY. IN THE CASE WHERE AN ALTERNATIVE HOLIDAY IS TO BE GIVEN AFTER STATUTORY HOLIDAY, THE EMPLOYEE MUST BE NOTIFIED OF THE ARRANGEMENT AT LEAST 48 HOURS BEFORE THE STATUTORY HOLIDAY.

IF BOTH EMPLOYER AND EMPLOYEE AGREE, ANY DAY WITHIN 30 DAYS OF A STATUTORY HOLIDAY OR ALTERNATIVE HOLIDAY MAY BE TAKEN BY THE EMPLOYEE AS A SUBSTITUTED HOLIDAY.

THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT TODAY (SATURDAY) ANNOUNCED THAT THE PUBLIC DUMP AT AREA 14J TO THE NORTH OF THE SHA TIN TEACHING HOSPITAL SITE, WILL BE CLOSED AS FROM MONDAY (OCTOBER 22).

ON THE SAME DAY, AN ALTERNATIVE DUMPING AREA WILL BE OPENED IN AREA 36D, EAST OF THE SHA TIN TEACHING HOSPITAL SITE.
