OPEN GOVERNMENT PREVAILS IN HONG KONG

\* \* \* \* \*

AN OPEN GOVERNMENT MEANS MUCH MORE THAN THE SIMPLE HOLDING OF ELECTIONS, AND IT IS MORE IMPORTANT TO DEVISE A SYSTEM WHICH WILL WORK IN HONG KONG AND WHICH WILL COMMAND THE RESPECT AND CONFIDENCE OF THE PEOPLE, THE SECRETARY FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, MR DAVID AKERS-JONES, SAID TODAY.

HE ALSO STRESSED THAT IF HONG KONG WERE TO MAINTAIN ITS POSITION IN THE WORLD OF TODAY IT MUST ENSURE THAT ADVICE IS READILY AND DIRECTLY AVAILABLE TO THE GOVERNMENT FROM EXPERIENCED AND KNOWLEDGEABLE MEN IN SUCH FIELDS AS INDUSTRY, COMMERCE, INTERNATIONAL FINANCE, SHIPPING AND CONSTRUCTION AS WELL AS OTHER FORMS OF SOCIAL ACTIVITY.

SPEAKING ON +OPEN GOVERNMENT IN HONG KONG+ AT THE HONG KONG WEEK SEMINAR ORGANISED BY THE FEDERATION OF HONG KONG STUDENTS, HE SAID: +THUS THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF OUR SENIOR COUNCILS MUST REFLECT THESE BASIC INGREDIENTS OF OUR COMMUNITY.

+THE NAMES OF THE APPOINTED MEMBERS ARE KNOWN, THEY ARE IN TOUCH WITH A WIDER PUBLIC, THEY ARE OPEN TO DISCUSSION, THEY, TOO, ARE PART OF THE PROCESS OF OPEN GOVERNMENT.+

AT A MORE GENERAL LEVEL, MR AKERS-JONES SAID, ANOTHER LAYER WAS ADDED LAST YEAR TO THE METHODS OF CONSULTATION BY THE CREATION OF PARTLY ELECTED DISTRICT BOARDS.

ALL HONG KONG BELONGERS OVER THE AGE OF 21 HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE AT DB AND URBAN COUNCIL ELECTIONS AND THERE ARE MORE THAN 900 000 PEOPLE ON THE REGISTER OF VOTERS.

+THE NEXT DB ELECTIONS TAKE PLACE IN 1985 AND BEFORE THEN THE REGISTER OF VOTERS WILL BE REVISED,+ HE SAID.

+THE BOARDS CAN ADVISE ON ANY MATTER THEY BELIEVE IS AFFECTING THE WELL-BEING OF THE PEOPLE.

+RECENTLY THEY HAVE BEEN CONSULTED DIRECTLY ON FAR-REACHING QUESTIONS OF EDUCATION POLICY BECAUSE THIS WAS A MATTER WHICH AFFECTS THE WELL-BEING OF US ALL AND HAS A DIRECT RELEVANCE TO OUR DAILY LIVES AND THE INTERNAL ADMINISTRATION OF HONG KONG.

+ALREADY THE BOARDS ARE MAKING A DISTINCT AND DIFFERENT CONTRIBUTION TO THE OPEN GOVERNMENT OF HONG KONG.+

MR AKERS-JONES NOTED THAT THE HONG KONG STYLE OF GOVERNMENT HAS BEEN MOULDED AND CONDITIONED BY TIME AND CIRCUMSTANCES, AND SAID: +I BELIEVE IT HAS SHOWN A CAPACITY TO ADAPT ITSELF TO CHANGE, TO DEVELOP ITS OWN SYSTEMS OF OPEN COMMUNICATION WITH THE PEOPLE, TO RESPOND TO THE WISHES OF THE PEOPLE WHEN IT CAN, AND TO EXPLAIN TO THEM WHEN IT CANNOT.+

+NO GOVERNMENT CAN CONDUCT ITS AFFAIRS ENTIRELY IN THE PUBLIC VIEW AND NO GOVERNMENT IS ABLE TO SHARE ALL INFORMATION AT EVERY STEP OF THE DECISION-MAKING PROCESS WITH ITS PEOPLE.

+WHAT IS IMPORTANT IS THAT THE PEOPLE, THE CITIZENS, SHOULD KNOW HOW DECISIONS ARE ARRIVED AT AND THE REASONS FOR THEM. THE GOVERNMENT MUST BE ACCOUNTABLE TO THE PEOPLE AND WILL BE JUDGED BY THE RESULTS OF ITS GOVERNANCE.+

MR AKERS-JONES SAID THAT THE GOVERNOR STANDS AT THE SUMMIT OF THE GOVERNMENT IN HONG KONG BUT IN THE EXECUTION OF THE ULTIMATE POWER AND AUTHORITY GRANTED TO HIM +HE SHALL, IN ALL CASES, CONSULT WITH THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL+, AND IT IS IN EXECUTIVE COUNCIL THAT THE PROCESS OF GOVERNMENT BEGINS.

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL PAPERS ARE PUT TO IT FOR DECISION WHICH HAVE ARRIVED ON THE TABLE FROM A WIDE VARIETY OF SOURCES, MANY OF WHICH ARE THE OUTCOME OF PUBLIC DISCUSSION OR CONSULTATION, AND MOST OF THE REMAINDER WILL RESULT IN PUBLIC DISCUSSION AND CONSULTATION OR IN DEBATE IN THE LEGISLATURE.

+AND I SHOULD EMPHASISE, THAT THE POLICIES AND PAPERS AND PIECES OF LEGISLATION WHICH ARE PUT BEFORE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL, ORIGINATE IN HONG KONG. THEY ARE NOT WRITTEN ANYWHERE ELSE,+ HE SAID.

+IF THE DECISIONS OF EXECUTIVE COUNCIL REQUIRE LEGISLATION, THEN THE PROPOSED LAWS ARE PUBLISHED FOR PUBLIC COMMENT AND THERE FOLLOWS A VERY PROLONGED PROCESS OF DISCUSSION.

+THE PROPOSALS ARE REFERRED TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE PROCESS OF OPEN GOVERNMENT HAS BEGUN.

+LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL MEETS IN PUBLIC BUT MOST OF ITS WORK TAKES PLACE IN THE OFFICES OF THE COUNCIL.

+THERE, COUNCILLORS DISCUSS AMONG THEMSELVES AND WITH DELEGATIONS AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND ONLY WHEN THE MEMBERS, WHO ARE ALL PRIVATE CITIZENS, ARE SATISFIED THAT THE LAWS PROPOSED ARE SENSIBLE AND SOUND, ARE THEY PASSED FORMALLY INTO LAW IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER.

+NEITHER THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL NOR THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CONTAINS DIRECTLY ELECTED REPRESENTATIVES, ALTHOUGH SOME MEMBERS HAVE BEEN ELECTED TO OTHER REPRESENTATIVE BODIES SUCH AS THE URBAN COUNCIL OR DISTRICT BOARDS.

+MEMBERS BRING A WIDE RANGE OF UNDERSTANDING, ABILITY AND KNOWLEDGE TO THEIR WORK. THEY ARE REQUIRED TO THINK AND PLAN AND SPEAK FOR THE INTERESTS OF THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG AS THEY SEE IT.

+THEY DO NOT FOLLOW A PARTY LINE NOR DO THEY SPEAK FOR THE NARROW INTERESTS OF A PROFESSION OR A CLASS.

+AND BECAUSE OF OUR TRADITION OF FREE SPEECH, EVERYTHING THEY DO IS SUBJECT TO PUBLIC CRITICISM AND COMMENT.

+QUESTIONS ARE ASKED IN PUBLIC IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ABOUT ANY MATTER WHICH IS WORRYING THE PEOPLE AND THE REPLIES ARE GIVEN IN PUBLIC.

+HERE THEN YOU HAVE THE MACHINERY OF AN OPEN GOVERNMENT; IT IS NOT AN ELECTED GOVERNMENT, BUT THE OPPORTUNITY IS AVAILABLE TO THE PEOPLE PUBLICLY TO EXPRESS THEIR MINDS AND TO MAKE REPRESENTATIONS TO IT. AND THIS THEY DO.+

MR AKERS-JONES SAID THAT INSTEAD OF HAVING AN ELECTED GOVERNMENT, HONG KONG HAD DEVELOPED A PROCESS OF CONSULTATION AND THE RECONCILIATION OF DIFFERENT OPINIONS THROUGH A BROAD SYSTEM OF ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMITTEES.

+THREE HUNDRED AND TWENTY OF THEM, ALL CONTAINING MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC. THEY DO NOT FOLLOW ANY POLITICAL THEORY WHEN THEY GIVE THEIR ADVICE. THEY SEEK TO ANSWER THE QUESTIONS: WILL IT WORK IN HONG KONG? IS IT BEST FOR HONG KONG?+

HE ALSO DREW ATTENTION TO THREE ASPECTS OF OPEN GOVERNMENT WHICH ARE SOMETIMES FORGOTTEN, NAMELY:

- \* THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION AGAINST CORRUPTION IS TO MONITOR AND MAINTAIN A HIGH STANDARD OF PROBITY IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TRANSACTIONS AND TO ENSURE THAT THE GOVERNMENT ACTS FAIRLY AND WITHOUT GIVING OR RECEIVING ADVANTAGE, THAT THERE ARE NO SECRET TRANSACTIONS BEHIND CLOSED DOORS;
- \* THE JUDICIARY IS INDEPENDENT OF THE EXECUTIVE AND ANY INDIVIDUAL HAS A RIGHT TO CHALLENGE THE LEGALITY OF ANY OF THE ACTS OF THE EXECUTIVE IN AN OPEN COURT; AND
- \* THERE ARE TWO INDEPENDENT TELEVISION STATIONS, AND OVER 100 NEWSPAPERS AND MAGAZINES WHICH REPRESENT EVERY SPECTRUM OF PUBLIC OPINION- ACT AS THE ACTIVE CRITICS OF GOVERNMENT AND ENSURE THAT ISSUES OF PUBLIC CONCERN ARE FREELY AND OPENLY DISCUSSED.

#### DB TO CONSIDER SETTING UP CONCERN GROUP

THE PROPOSED SETTING UP OF A CONCERN GROUP TO HELP RESIDENTS IN WONG TAI SIN WILL BE DISCUSSED AT THE DISTRICT BOARD MEETING ON TUESDAY (AUGUST 30).

UNDER THE PROPOSAL, MEMBERS OF THE CONCERN GROUP WILL TAKE TURNS TO VISIT LOCAL RESIDENTS AFFECTED BY NATURAL DISASTERS, ACCIDENTS AND MISHAPS, AND WILL HELP ORGANISE ASSISTANCE AND RELIEF IF NECESSARY.

AT THE MEETING, MEMBERS WILL ALSO DISCUSS THE PROPOSED CONVERSION OF A SITE OFFICE AT NORTHERN LUNG CHEUNG ROAD INTO AN AIR-CONDITIONED STUDY ROOM FOR SQUATTER RESIDENTS IN DIAMOND HILL.

THE POSSIBILITY OF BUILDING BUS PASSENGER SHELTERS BY USING DISTRICT BOARD FUNDS OR DONATIONS FROM LOCAL RESIDENTS, THE LAYOUT PLAN OF THE 2.9-HECTARE URBAN COUNCIL MA CHAI HANG SPORTS GROUND, AND THE DETAILED PROGRAMME OF THE FORTHCOMING WONG TAI SIN DISTRICT FESTIVAL WILL ALSO BE TABLED FOR COMMENTS.

OTHER TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION WILL INCLUDE A REVIEW ON HONG KONG'S TAXI POLICY, THE FREE LEGAL ADVICE SCHEME IN WONG TAI SIN AND THE PUBLICATION OF A DISTRICT REPORT.

DEVELOPMENT PROJECT FOR FANLING  
\* \* \* \*

THE TAI PO AND FANLING DEVELOPMENT OFFICE OF THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR A LAND FORMATION AND ROAD PROJECT IN FANLING SOUTH AS PART OF THE CONTINUING PROGRAMME FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF FANLING AND SHEK WU HUI.

THIS CONTRACT INVOLVES THE FORMATION OF ABOUT 12 HECTARES OF LAND, THE CONSTRUCTION OF ABOUT 1.5 KILOMETRES OF DISTRIBUTORY ROADS AND ASSOCIATED DRAINAGE AND SEWERAGE WORKS TO THE SOUTH-WEST OF THE WO HOP SHEK INTERCHANGE WHICH IS NOW UNDER CONSTRUCTION.

ON COMPLETION, THE AREA WILL PROVIDE LAND, ROAD ACCESS AND DRAINAGE AND SEWERAGE CONNECTIONS TO ENABLE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A TEMPORARY HOUSING AREA AND ASSOCIATED FACILITIES BY EARLY 1985.

THE AREA WILL ULTIMATELY BE DEVELOPED TO PROVIDE A WIDE RANGE OF LAND USES INCLUDING PUBLIC HOUSING, PRIVATE AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT, INDUSTRIAL AREAS, COMMUNITY FACILITIES AND RECREATIONAL SPACE.

WORK ON THE CONTRACT WILL START IN NOVEMBER AND IS EXPECTED TO TAKE ABOUT 15 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

CARE URGED IN USE OF ELECTRICITY

FACTORY PROPRIETORS AND BUILDING CONTRACTORS WERE REMINDED TODAY (SUNDAY) TO ADOPT SAFETY MEASURES WHEN USING ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT AND APPLIANCES.

THE REMINDER WAS ISSUED BY A LABOUR DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN IN THE WAKE OF SEVERAL ACCIDENTS INVOLVING ELECTROCUTION, WHICH OCCURRED RECENTLY.

THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT THE MEASURES INCLUDED PROPER INSTALLATION, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT AND APPLIANCES, ESPECIALLY PORTABLE APPARATUS- EFFECTIVE INSULATION, PROTECTION OF CONDUCTORS, CORRECT USE OF FUSES AND CIRCUIT BREAKERS.

HE ADDED THAT THE PROPRIETORS AND CONTRACTORS SHOULD ALSO COMPLY WITH THEIR LEGAL OBLIGATIONS SPECIFIED BY THE FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS (ELECTRICITY) REGULATIONS. GUIDES TO THESE REGULATIONS ARE AVAILABLE AT BRANCH OFFICES OF THE DEPARTMENT'S FACTORY INSPECTORATE.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO URGED THE PROPRIETORS AND CONTRACTORS TO SEND STAFF TO ATTEND TRAINING COURSES ON THE SAFE USE OF ELECTRICITY OFFERED BY THE FACTORY INSPECTOR'S INDUSTRIAL SAFETY TRAINING CENTRE.

SHAM SHUI PO ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN STARTING

A MONTH-LONG ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN WILL BE LAUNCHED FOR SHAM SHUI PO RESIDENTS AT AN OPENING CEREMONY AT THE MAPLE STREET PLAYGROUND TOMORROW (MONDAY) MORNING.

JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE SHAM SHUI PO DISTRICT BOARD AND THE POLICE, THE CAMPAIGN WILL FEATURE A SERIES OF EDUCATIONAL AND ENTERTAINMENT ACTIVITIES INCLUDING A ROAD SAFETY TOWN DISPLAY, A CROSS WORD PUZZLE, AND A QUIZ.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE CAMPAIGN'S ORGANISING COMMITTEE SAID THE ROAD SAFETY MESSAGE WOULD BE MAINLY DIRECTED AT PEDESTRIANS, WHO ACCOUNTED FOR 36 PER CENT OF LAST YEAR'S ROAD ACCIDENT VICTIMS.

HE SAID A TWO-WEEK STREET EDUCATION PROGRAMME CONDUCTED BY THE POLICE AT BUSY SPOTS IN THE DISTRICT, FOLLOWED BY ANOTHER TWO WEEKS' ENFORCEMENT ACTION AGAINST JAYWALKERS WOULD BE HELD DURING THE CAMPAIGN PERIOD.

TOMORROW'S OPENING CEREMONY WILL BEGIN AT 10 AM WITH A SHOW BY POLICE DOGS, A +CAPTAIN SAFETY AND ROAD SAFETY PATROLS+ PARADE, A DRIVING DEMONSTRATION, AND MOTORCYCLE STUNT RIDING.

THERE WILL ALSO BE A FUN FAIR AND GAMES STALLS FOR THE CHILDREN.

THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MR STEPHEN IP, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE, MR STEPHEN CHENG AND THE ACTING POLICE DISTRICT COMMANDER (SHAM SHUI PO), MR R.J. IRVINE WILL OFFICIATE AT THE OPENING CEREMONY.

RECIPIENTS OF SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS ARE ADVISED TO BE ON THE ALERT AGAINST PEOPLE POSING AS STAFF OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

THE DEPARTMENT GAVE THIS ADVICE FOLLOWING A CASE IN WHICH AN OLD AGE ALLOWANCE RECIPIENT GAVE \$40 TO A MAN CLAIMING TO BE A SWD STAFF MEMBER.

THE OLD MAN WAS WALKING IN CENTRAL RECENTLY WHEN HE WAS APPROACHED FOR A LOAN BY A MAN CLAIMING TO BE AN OFFICER OF THE DEPARTMENT.

THE OLD MAN BECAME SUSPICIOUS THE FOLLOWING DAY AND ENQUIRED WITH THE CHAI WAN SOCIAL SECURITY FIELD UNIT.

WHEN IT WAS ESTABLISHED THAT THE MAN IN QUESTION WAS NOT A MEMBER OF THE FIELD UNIT, A REPORT WAS MADE TO THE POLICE.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT ADVISED SOCIAL SECURITY RECIPIENTS THAT IF THEY WERE IN DOUBT ABOUT PURPORTED SWD STAFF WHO APPROACH THEM AT HOME OR IN THE STREET, THEY SHOULD ASK TO SEE THEIR GOVERNMENT IDENTITY CARD.

+IF THEY ARE STILL IN DOUBT, THEY SHOULD TELEPHONE THEIR CASEWORKER OR THE SUPERVISOR OF THE FIELD UNIT,+ HE SAID.

+UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD THEY GIVE MONEY TO STAFF OF THE DEPARTMENT,+ THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

THE MURAL, CONSISTING OF 28 PIECES OF 1.5-SQUARE-METRE ALUMINIUM SHEETS, WAS THE WORK OF 20 STUDENTS OF THE SWIRE SCHOOL OF DESIGN, HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC.

THE STUDENTS TOOK SEVERAL HOURS TO FINISH THE ART WORK, UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF THEIR LECTURER, MISS CHOI YAN-CHI.

THE MURAL DEPICTS A NUMBER OF ABSTRACT FIGURES ENGAGED IN SPORTING ACTIVITIES.

ITS PURPOSE IS TO ACHIEVE HARMONY WITH THE NATURAL LANDSCAPE AND THE IMMEDIATE SURROUNDINGS OF THE SPORTS GROUND, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE MURAL HAS WON THE APPRECIATION OF RESIDENTS OF SAI KUNG, AND WILL LATER BE PUT UP AT OTHER SPORTS GROUNDS OR SWIMMING POOL COMPLEXES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES, THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

THE PRIMARY SCIENCE SECTION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WILL ORGANISE SEVEN IDENTICAL WHOLE-DAY REFRESHER COURSES FROM SEPTEMBER 1983 TO JANUARY 1984 FOR TEACHERS OF PRIMARY SCIENCE AND NATURE STUDY.
