MORE SCHOOLS NOW USING +ACTIVITY APPROACH+
* * * * *

MORE THAN 30 000 PRIMARY PUPILS ARE NOW RECEIVING THEIR EDUCATION IN AN INFORMAL AND STIMULATING ATMOSPHERE THROUGH THE +ACTIVITY APPROACH+.

THIS APPROACH IS DESIGNED TO ENCOURAGE SPONTANEOUS LEARNING THROUGH PURPOSEFUL ACTIVITIES.

+THE APPROACH IS PARTICULARLY SUITABLE FOR PUPILS IN PRIMARY I WHO ARE STILL FRESH FROM LEARNING THROUGH PLAY IN THE KINDERGARTEN,+ A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SAID.

THE ACTIVITY APPROACH HAS GAINED WIDE ACCEPTANCE SINCE ITS INTRODUCTION IN 1972.

TODAY, A TOTAL OF 900 CLASSES IN 106 GOVERNMENT, SUBSIDISED AND PRIVATE PRIMARY SCHOOLS ARE USING THIS APPROACH, COMPARED WITH 16 CLASSES IN SIX PRIMARY SCHOOLS IN 1972.

ABOUT 300 CLASSES MORE WOULD ADOPT THE APPROACH IN THE 1983-84 SCHOOL YEAR, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

WITH THE ACTIVITY APPROACH, A CLASS IS DIVIDED INTO GROUPS PURSUING DIFFERENT ACTIVITIES CAREFULLY DESIGNED BY THE TEACHER ACCORDING TO THEIR NEEDS AND ABILITIES.

+IN THIS WAY, PUPILS CAN LEARN AT THEIR OWN PACE ACCORDING TO THEIR ABILITIES WHILE THE TEACHER CAN PAY MORE ATTENTION TO INDIVIDUAL PUPILS,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

USUALLY THE CLASS TEACHER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR TEACHING MOST OF THE SUBJECTS. VARIOUS SUBJECT CONTENTS ARE INTEGRATED INTO CLASS ACTIVITIES WHERE APPROPRIATE, AND BROAD TIME-TABLES ARE USED.

A SCHOOL IN THE PUBLIC SECTOR ADOPTING THE ACTIVITY APPROACH RECEIVES AN INITIAL GRANT OF \$3 000 PER CLASS FOR THE PURCHASE OF CLASSROOM EQUIPMENT, AND A RECURRENT ANNUAL SUBSIDY OF \$600 PER CLASS FOR THE PURCHASE OF CONSUMABLES AND TEACHING MATERIALS.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT IN-SERVICE TRAINING WAS PARTICULARLY HELPFUL TO TEACHERS ADOPTING THE ACTIVITY APPROACH.

THE ADVISORY INSPECTORATE OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT PROVIDES SHORT IN-SERVICE COURSES FOR TEACHERS USING OR PLANNING TO USE THE APPROACH.

THE COLLEGES OF EDUCATION IN CO-OPERATION WITH THE ADVISORY INSPECTORATE ALSO ORGANISE EIGHT-WEEK SYSTEMATIC RETRAINING COURSES FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHERS, WITH AN EMPHASIS ON THE ACTIVITY APPROACH.

TO PROVIDE BETTER LINKAGE WITH THIS EDUCATIONAL METHOD, THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDS A THEMATIC APPROACH IN KINDERGARTEN TEACHING THROUGH THE DRAFT +GUIDE TO THE KINDERGARTEN CURRICULUM+ ISSUED RECENTLY.

CHILDREN WILL LEARN THROUGH VARIED AND INTERESTING GAMES WHICH CENTRE ROUND THEMES CLOSELY RELATED TO THEIR DAILY EXPERIENCES.

+KINDERGARTEN CHILDREN WILL THUS GO THROUGH A NATURAL TRANSITION FROM 'LEARNING THROUGH PLAY' TO THE NEXT STAGE OF 'LEARNING THROUGH ACTIVITIES' IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS,+ THE SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED.

THE NEW KINDERGARTEN CURRICULUM ALSO TAKES INTO ACCOUNT THE WIDENING EXPERIENCES OF THE CHILDREN AND DOVETAILS INTO THE PRIMARY SCHOOL SYLLABUSES.

TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS IN CENTRAL AND WESTERN * * * * *

THE NUMBER OF TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS IN CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT LAST YEAR CONSTITUTED A THIRD OF THE TOTAL FIGURE IN THE HONG KONG ISLAND, THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MISS LOLLY CHIU, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

LAST YEAR, THERE WERE 4 699 TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS RESULTING IN 5 957 CASUALTIES IN THE HONG KONG ISLAND. AND IN CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT, THERE WERE 1 327 TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS WITH 1 685 CASUALTIES.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE DISTRICT'S ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN, MISS CHIU SAID DIFFERENT AREAS OF THE DISTRICT POSED TRAFFIC HAZARDS TO DIFFERENT SECTORS OF THE COMMUNITY.

THE HEAVY TRAFFIC FLOW IN CENTRAL COULD EASILY BRING ABOUT CONFLICTS BETWEEN PEDESTRIANS AND DRIVERS OVER THE USE OF ROADS.

IN THE MID-LEVELS WHERE MOST SCHOOLS WERE LOCATED, THERE WAS A HIGH RISK OF ACCIDENTS INVOLVING STUDENTS.

SHE SAID THE MONTH-LONG CAMPAIGN WAS TO DRIVE HOME AND THE ROAD SAFETY MESSAGE TO PEDESTRIANS AND DRIVERS.

TODAY'S PROGRAMME ALSO INCLUDED A VARIETY SHOW, GAME STALLS, A MINIATURE ROAD SAFETY TOWN, A MOBILE ROAD SAFETY BUS DISPLAY AND A BRASS BAND PERFORMANCE.

ALSO PRESENT AT THE CEREMONY WERE THE DISTRICT POLICE COMMANDERS, MR LAU TO-YEE AND MR D.M. HODSON, AND OTHER DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS.

BOARD TO LEARN ABOUT TRAFFIC PROBLEMS

REGULAR DISTRICT TOURS TO LOOK INTO THE DIFFERENT TRAFFIC PROBLEMS IN KOWLOON CITY WILL BE MADE BY MEMBERS OF THE DISTRICT BOARD'S TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT COMMITTEE BEGINNING LATER THIS MONTH.

THE COMMITTEE'S CHAIRMAN, MR WONG WING-PIU, SAID TODAY THAT THE TOURS WOULD BE CONDUCTED ONCE EVERY TWO MONTHS TO ENABLE MEMBERS TO GET TO KNOW THE DISTRICT AND THE TRAFFIC PROBLEMS THERE.

+MEMBERS WILL BE BETTER EQUIPPED TO SUGGEST VIABLE SUGGESTIONS FOR IMPROVEMENT IF THEY ARE FAMILIAR WITH THE ACTUAL SITUATION OF THE ROADS, IN PARTICULAR THOSE PROBLEMATIC SPOTS, IN THE DISTRICT,+ HE SAID.

HE ADDED THAT DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS AND URBAN COUNCILLORS WHO WERE NOT COMMITTEE MEMBERS WOULD BE INVITED TO JOIN THE TOURS.

STUDENTS OF POST-SECONDARY COLLEGES, TECHNICAL INSTITUTES AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS WHO WISH TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE 1983-84 ACADEMIC YEAR FROM TWO STUDENT LOAN FUNDS MAY NOW OBTAIN APPLICATION FORMS FROM THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT'S OVERSEAS AND SCHOLARSHIPS SECTION.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID THAT COMPLETED FORMS SHOULD BE RETURNED TO THE SAME OFFICE AT LEIGHTON CENTRE, 15TH FLOOR, 77 LEIGHTON ROAD, CAUSEWAY BAY BY AUGUST 31 FOR CONSIDERATION BY A JOINT COMMITTEE FOR BOTH FUNDS.

THE INTEREST-FREE LOANS ARE OFFERED ON A YEARLY BASIS.

MAXIMUM LOANS VARY FROM \$2 200 A YEAR FOR A POST-SECONDARY STUDENT TO \$1 400 A YEAR FOR A SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENT.

PRIORITY WILL BE GIVEN TO APPLICANTS WHO ARE NEARING COMPLETION OF THEIR STUDIES.

SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO REPAY THEIR LOANS BY INSTALMENTS OF AT LEAST 10 PER CENT OF THEIR MONTHLY SALARY FOLLOWING THE COMPLETION OF THEIR STUDIES.

THE TWO FUNDS ARE THE HONG KONG ROTARY CLUB STUDENTS' LOAN FUND AND THE STANDARD-SING TAO FAT CHOY DRIVE STUDENTS' LOAN FUND.

STUDENTS ATTENDING OR INTENDING TO ENTER THE TWO UNIVERSITIES, THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC OR THE HONG KONG BAPTIST COLLEGE SHOULD APPLY DIRECTLY TO THE RESPECTIVE INSTITUTIONS BEFORE OCTOBER 16.

THE OFFICIALS OR OFFICE TAKING CARE OF THESE APPLICATIONS ARE THE DEAN OF STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG; THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY, STUDENT AFFAIRS OF THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY; THE STUDENT WELFARE OFFICER OF THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC; AND THE STUDENT FINANCIAL AID OFFICE OF THE BAPTIST COLLEGE.

ANTI-NARCOTICS DRIVE LAUNCHED IN SOUTHERN
* * * * *

THE PROBLEM OF DRUG TAKING AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE IN SOUTHERN DISTRICT WAS NOT SERIOUS, AS REVEALED IN A RECENT SURVEY, THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR LAWRENCE MILLS, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

HE NOTED THAT OF THE 657 YOUTHS INTERVIEWED IN THE SURVEY, ONLY NINE OR 1.3 PER CENT CLAIMED TO HAVE TAKEN DRUGS.

+WITH NO COMPARABLE FIGURES IN OTHER DISTRICTS AVAILABLE, THE LOW INCIDENCE OF DRUG TAKING WOULD TEND TO INDICATE THAT DRUG ABUSE AMONG YOUTHS IN SOUTHERN DISTRICT IS NOT SERIOUS,+ HE SAID.

MR MILLS WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF A TWO-WEEK SOUTHERN DISTRICT ANTI-NARCOTICS CAMPAIGN HELD AT REPULSE BAY THIS AFTERNOON.

+THIS NOTWITHSTANDING, THE SURVEY DID IDENTIFY A SIGNIFICANT PROPORTION (7.5 PER CENT) OF YOUTHS WHO COULD BE CLASSIFIED AS FALLING WITHIN THE +HIGH RISK+ CATEGORY, THAT IS YOUTHS WHO HAVE LITTLE KNOWLEDGE OF DRUGS, WHO MAY HAVE ACCESS TO DRUGS AND WHO HAVE A HIGH MOTIVATION TO TAKE DRUGS.

+THESE YOUTHS ARE GENERALLY THOSE WHO HAVE A LOW LEVEL OF EDUCATION, LIVE IN OVER-CROWDED CONDITIONS, RECEIVE LITTLE CONCERN FROM THEIR FAMILIES AND USUALLY ENGAGE IN NON-CONSTRUCTIVE LEISURE ACTIVITIES,+ HE SAID.

MR MILLS SAID IN PLANNING THE CAMPAIGN, THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE HAD TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT THE RECOMMENDATIONS ARISING FROM THE SURVEY.

THE SERIES OF RECREATIONAL, ENTERTAINMENT AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES HELD IN THE COMING FORTNIGHT WOULD TRY TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ON THE DANGER OF DRUG ABUSE AND THE WAYS TO GET AWAY FROM IT. HE SAID.

APPLICATIONS FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM TWO SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS ADMINISTERED BY THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT WILL CLOSE ON FRIDAY (JULY 8).

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (SUNDAY) THAT MORE THAN \$370 000 WOULD BE AVAILABLE TO SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS WHO WANT TO PURSUE STUDIES IN SUBJECTS WHICH MAY INCLUDE AGRICULTURE, VETERINARY SCIENCES, BOTANY, ZOOLOGY OR ANY APPLIED SCIENCES RELEVANT TO AGRICULTURE.

THEY MAY ALSO STUDY SUBJECTS LIKE FISHERY BIOLOGY, MARINE BIOLOGY, FOOD TECHNOLOGY, ECONOMICS, MANAGEMENT OR ADMINISTRATIVE STUDIES, MARINE ENGINEERING, NAVAL ARCHITECTURE OR ANY APPLIED SCIENCES CONSIDERED RELEVANT TO MARINE FISHERIES.

APPLICATIONS ARE OPEN TO PEOPLE WHO ARE EMPLOYED IN AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES AS WELL AS MARKETING INDUSTRIES, OR THEIR FAMILIES AND DEPENDENTS WHO WISH TO PURSUE EDUCATION OR TRAINING IN ANY SUBJECT APPROVED BY THE TRUSTEE OF THE FUNDS.

THE FUNDS ARE THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS SCHOLARSHIP FUND AND THE MARINE FISH SCHOLARSHIP FUND.

TECHNICAL INSTITUTE GRADUATES IN DEMAND

* * * * *

TECHNICAL INSTITUTE GRADUATES WERE READILY ACCEPTED BY COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY LAST YEAR DESPITE THE RECESSION.

THIS WAS THE CONCLUSION DRAWN BY THE EMPLOYMENT SURVEY HELD AMONG 1 979 FULL-TIME STUDENTS WHO GRADUATED LAST YEAR FROM THE FIVE TECHNICAL INSTITUTES MANAGED BY THE VOCATIONAL TRAINING COUNCIL.

BY OCTOBER 1982, 1 297 GRADUATES, OR 70.5 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL, HAD OBTAINED JOBS MOST OF WHICH WERE RELATED TO THEIR COURSES OF STUDY.

COMPARED WITH THE FIGURES IN 1981, THERE WAS A 15 PER CENT INCREASE IN THEIR STARTING SALARIES.

THE INCREASE, BY 30 PER CENT, WAS PARTICULARLY NOTICEABLE AMONG GRADUATES IN COMMERCIAL AND SERVICE COURSES RUN AT THE POST-FORM THREE LEVEL.

ALMOST 60 PER CENT OF THE CRAFT GRADUATES JOINED THE APPRENTICESHIP SCHEME FOR FURTHER TRAINING.

THE SURVEY WAS CONSIDERED MORE ACCURATE WITH A TRUE RESPONSE RATE OF 96 PER CENT.

FOLLOW-UP INTERVIEWS OF NON-RESPONSE GRADUATES BY TELEPHONE HELPED TO IMPROVE THE ACCURACY.

OVER 85 PER CENT OF THE GRADUATES WHO HAD OBTAINED EMPLOYMENT WERE EARNEST TO ENHANCE THEIR QUALIFICATIONS AND KNOWLEDGE BY ENROLLING IN PART-TIME COURSES RUN BY THE TECHNICAL INSTITUTES OR THE POLYTECHNIC.

PRINCIPALS URGED TO SPREAD CLEAN HK MESSAGE

SCHOOL PRINCIPALS WERE URGED TO SPREAD THE CLEAN HONG KONG AND MEI FA (BEAUTIFICATION) MESSAGE TO THEIR TEACHERS AND STUDENTS TO HELP MAKE THE ENVIRONMENT CLEAN AND GREEN.

THE APPEAL WAS MADE BY THE ASSISTANT STAFF OFFICER (GARDEN) OF THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT, MR HO MAN-CHEUNG, AT A SEMINAR HELD AT THE GRANTHAM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION TODAY.

MR HO WAS SPEAKING TO A GROUP OF 400 SCHOOL HEADMASTERS ATTENDING THE SEMINAR ON +VICARIOUS LIABILITY AND MEI FA PLANTING+.

AN INTER-SCHOOL POTTED PLANT COMPETITION WILL BE HELD IN THE NEW TERRITORIES LATER THIS YEAR TO ENCOURAGE MORE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS TO JOIN THE CAMPAIGN.

THE CONTEST WOULD BE JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND NTSD, MR HO SAID.

MR HO REPORTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN GOOD PUBLIC RESPONSE TO THE FREE HORTICULTURE COURSES OFFERED BY NTSD IN SHA TIN AND TUEN MUN.

WITH THIS SUCCESS, THE DEPARTMENT WILL RUN MORE HORTICULTURE COURSES IN MORE DISTRICTS LATER THIS YEAR.

ON THE MEI FA SCHEME, MR HO SAID THAT MORE THAN THREE MILLION PLANTS HAD BEEN PLANTED IN NEW TOWNS ALONG HIGHWAYS AND AT RECREATION SPOTS, LANDSCAPED AREAS, PARKS, BEACHES AND PLAYGROUNDS DURING THE LAST PLANTING SEASON.

ANOTHER TWO MILLION PLANTS, INCLUDING TREES, FLOWERING SHRUBS, CREEPERS, GROUND COVERS, CLIMBERS, BAMBOOS AND SEASONAL FLOWERS, WILL BE PLANTED DURING THIS CURRENT SEASON.

AMONG OTHER MEI FA PROJECTS, NTSD WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG, HAS LAUNCHED A SERIES OF 13 EDUCATIONAL RADIO PROGRAMMES ON ENVIRONMENTAL AND HOME IMPROVEMENT.

MEANWHILE, ENFORCEMENT ACTION HAD BEEN STRENGTHENED AGAINST LITTERING OFFENDERS, MR HO SAID.

ISLANDS TO HOLD TREE PLANTING DAY

THE ISLANDS DISTRICT WILL HOLD A DISTRICT-WIDE TREE PLANTING DAY ON TUESDAY (JULY 5) IN SUPPORT OF THIS YEAR'S MEI FA (BEAUTIFICATION) SCHEME.

THE TREE PLANTING DAY, ORGANISED BY THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT, IS AIMED AT ENCOURAGING COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT IN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT.
