NEXT ROUND OF TALKS TO BE ANNOUNCED

THE NEXT ROUND OF TALKS ON ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS WOULD BE ANNOUNCED TOMORROW, THE GOVERNOR, THE RT HON CHRISTOPHER PATTEN, SAID THIS (SATURDAY) EVENING.

SPEAKING TO REPORTERS BEFORE ATTENDING A PUBLIC FUNCTION, THE GOVERNOR SAID : "THERE IS AN AGREEMENT ON THE NEXT ROUND BUT FOR TECHNICAL REASONS THE CHINESE WERE NOT ABLE TO ANNOUNCE IT TODAY.

"WE KNOW WHEN THE NEXT ROUND IS GOING TO BE AND IT WILL BE ANNOUNCED TOMORROW.

"THE AMBASSADOR MADE THE POSITION PERFECTLY CLEAR WHEN HE WAS IN PEKING."

UNDERSTANDING TO BE MADE AVAILABLE TO HK PEOPLE

* * * * *

WHEN AN UNDERSTANDING HAS BEEN REACHED WITH THE CHINESE IN THE NEGOTIATIONS OVER THE ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE ELECTIONS IN 1994/1995, IT WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND TO THE HONG KONG PEOPLE, THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH AFFAIRS WITH SPECIAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR HONG KONG, THE RT HON ALASTAIR GOODLAD, SAID THIS (SATURDAY) AFTERNOON.

SPEAKING TO REPORTERS UPON ARRIVAL AT THE AIRPORT FOR A FOUR-DAY VISIT, THE MINISTER SAID THAT THE GOVERNOR AND THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT HAD LISTENED TO MANY VIEWS AND THEY WOULD CONTINUE WITH THESE TALKS WITH PATIENCE, PERSISTENCE AND IN A POSITIVE AND PRODUCTIVE MANNER.

ASKED ABOUT THE FORTHCOMING AIRPORT COMMITTEE MEETING, MR GOODLAD SAID: "WE WANT TO GET THE SPEEDIEST RESOLUTION OF THE AIRPORT ARRANGEMENTS."

ON HIS VISIT TO HONG KONG, HE SAID: "IT'S GOING TO BE CENTRED PREDOMINANTLY ON AN ENVIRONMENTAL THEME. I WANT TO GET TO GRIPS AT FIRST HAND ON ALL YOU ARE DOING HERE IN THAT VERY IMPORTANT SPHERE."

THE MINISTER ADDED THAT HE WOULD ALSO BE HAVING TALKS ON A VERY WIDE RANGE OF SUBJECTS WITH THE GOVERNOR, THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL AND MANY OTHERS.

TRANSIT SERVICE AREA TO BE RESCINDED

* * * * *

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED TODAY (SATURDAY) THAT THE EXISTING BOARDING AND ALIGHTING RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED ON FRANCHISED BUSES WITHIN THE NORTH-WEST TRANSIT SERVICE AREA (TSA) WILL BE RESCINDED WITH EFFECT FROM JUNE 1 (TUESDAY).

AS A RESULT, THE TRAVELLING PUBLIC CAN USE BUSES OF THE KOWLOON MOTOR BUS COMPANY FOR MAKING TRIPS WITHIN TUEN MUN AND YUEN LONG DISTRICTS.

AT THE SAME TIME, KMB WILL INTRODUCE ADDITIONAL SECTION FARES ON THE TUEN MUN/YUEN LONG BOUND BUSES WITHIN THE TSA.

THE SECTION FARES ON ORDINARY BUSES RANGE FROM \$2.50 TO \$3.60, WHICH ARE 20 TO 30 PER CENT BELOW THE LIGHT RAIL TRANSIT FARE. THE SECTION FARES ON AIR-CONDITIONED BUSES WHICH RANGE FROM \$3.00 TO \$4.30 ARE COMPARABLE TO THE LIGHT RAIL TRANSIT FARES.

THE TUEN MUN AND YUEN LONG DISTRICT BOARDS HAD BEEN CONSULTED AND THEY WELCOMED THE DECISION TO LIFT THE BOARDING AND ALIGHTING RESTRICTIONS ON BUSES.

THIS WILL PROVIDE MORE CHOICES FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORT AND COMPETITIVE FARES FOR LOCAL RESIDENTS THERE.

EARLY PLAN FOR WORK IN TYPHOON AND RAINSTORM URGED

* * * * *

THE ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR ALFRED CHAN, TODAY (SATURDAY) ADVISED EMPLOYERS TO REACH PRIOR AGREEMENTS WITH THEIR EMPLOYEES ON WORK ARRANGEMENTS AND CONTINGENCY MEASURES IN TIMES OF TYPHOONS AND RAINSTORMS.

"EARLY AGREEMENTS ARE NECESSARY TO AVOID MISUNDERSTANDINGS AND DISPUTES BECAUSE IT WOULD BE IMPRACTICABLE TO INTRODUCE STATUTORY REGULATIONS ON WORK ARRANGEMENTS RELATING TO TYPHOON AND RAINSTORM DUE TO THE DIVERSITY IN NATURE AND REQUIREMENTS OF JOBS IN VARIOUS TRADES AND INDUSTRIES," MR CHAN SAID.

HE SAID CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH EMPLOYEES WERE REQUIRED TO REPORT FOR DUTY OR TO STOP WORK SHOULD BE CLEARLY STATED IN THE AGREEMENTS.

FOR EXAMPLE, IT SHOULD SPECIFY THE TYPHOON SIGNAL NUMBER OR THE COLOUR CODE OF RAINSTORM WARNING UNDER WHICH EMPLOYEES ARE TO STOP WORK OR NOT REQUIRED TO REPORT FOR DUTY, WAYS OF CALCULATING WAGES AND CIRCUMSTANCES IN WHICH EMPLOYEES SHOULD RETURN TO WORK, HE ADDED.

MR CHAN POINTED OUT THAT DUE CONSIDERATION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO EMPLOYEES' SAFETY IN THE WORK PLACE AS WELL AS THEIR JOURNEY TO AND FROM WORK.

"NORMALLY, WHEN TYPHOON SIGNAL NUMBER 8 IS HOISTED OR PUBLIC TRANSPORT SERVICES ARE TO BE SUSPENDED SHORTLY, EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE NOT REPORTED FOR DUTY SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO STAY AT HOME.

"FOR THOSE WHO ARE ALREADY AT WORK, THEY SHOULD BE RELEASED AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE," MR CHAN SAID.

HAVING REGARD TO THE WEATHER CONDITIONS, MR CHAN SAID PRIORITY TO LEAVE THE WORK PLACE SHOULD BE GIVEN TO EMPLOYEES WHO LIVE IN REMOTE AREAS OR WHERE PUBLIC TRANSPORT WAS NOT EASILY ACCESSIBLE.

THE BLACK RAINSTORM WARNING INDICATES THAT THE WEATHER CONDITIONS ARE INCLEMENT AND THE ROADS ARE SERIOUSLY FLOODED, HE SAID.

"IF SUCH WARNING IS ISSUED DURING WORKING HOURS, EMPLOYERS SHOULD LET THEIR EMPLOYEES REMAIN IN A SAFE PLACE UNTIL THE WARNING IS CANCELLED AND TRAFFIC CONDITIONS HAVE IMPROVED.

"FOR THOSE WHO HAVE NOT YET REPORTED FOR DUTY, THEY SHOULD FOLLOW THE ADVICE OF THE ROYAL OBSERVATORY TO STAY AT HOME OR TAKE SHELTER IN A SAFE PLACE UNTIL THE RAINSTORM HAS PASSED.

"PERSONAL SAFETY SHOULD BE THE PRIME CONSIDERATION WHEN DECIDING ON THE APPROPRIATE WORK ARRANGEMENTS," HE ADVISED.

IF EMPLOYEES HAVE TO WORK DURING TYPHOONS OR RAINSTORMS, SUCH REQUIREMENT SHOULD BE CLEARLY STATED BEFORE THE EMPLOYMENT STARTS.

EMPLOYERS SHOULD PROVIDE THESE EMPLOYEES WITH ADEQUATE FACILITIES TO ENSURE THEIR SAFETY AT WORK UNDER SUCH CIRCUMSTANCES.

THE AGREEMENTS SHOULD ALSO SPELL OUT THE METHOD OF WAGE CALCULATION UNDER THE VARIOUS CIRCUMSTANCES.

MR CHAN APPEALED TO EMPLOYERS NOT TO DEDUCT ATTENDANCE BONUS FROM EMPLOYEES WHO CANNOT REPORT FOR WORK OR ARE LATE FOR WORK DUE TO TYPHOONS OR RAINSTORMS.

"EMPLOYERS SHOULD ALSO SPECIFY THE CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH EMPLOYEES SHOULD RETURN TO WORK WHEN THE TYPHOON SIGNALS OR RAINSTORM WARNINGS ARE LOWERED DURING WORKING HOURS.

"IN DRAWING UP AGREEMENTS ON WORK ARRANGEMENTS IN TIMES OF TYPHOONS AND RAINSTORMS, EMPLOYERS SHOULD CONSIDER THE NEEDS OF THE EMPLOYEES IN ADDITION TO THEIR OWN, AND SHOULD ADOPT A FLEXIBLE APPROACH WHEREVER POSSIBLE," HE SAID.

COPIES OF A LEAFLET ON ARRANGEMENT OF WORK IN TIMES OF TYPHOONS AND RAINSTORMS, PRINTED IN CHINESE AND ENGLISH SEPARATELY, ARE AVAILABLE FOR COLLECTION AT THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT'S 11 LABOUR RELATIONS DIVISION OFFICES THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY.

"IF ASSISTANCE IS REQUIRED, STAFF OF THE LABOUR RELATIONS DIVISION ARE ALWAYS READY TO OFFER ADVICE," MR CHAN ADDED.

UNHEALTHY EATING A GROWING PROBLEM

* * * * *

UNDERNOURISHMENT IS NO LONGER A PROBLEM IN HONG KONG, BUT UNHEALTHY EATING HABITS ARE A GROWING PROBLEM, MRS PATTEN SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF THE CHILDREN'S MONTH, MRS PATTEN SAID OBESITY WAS A NEW PROBLEM AMONG THE CHILDREN OF HONG KONG.

SHE EXPLAINED THAT CHILDREN BECAME OBESE BECAUSE THEY OVERATE OR ATE THE WRONG KINDS OF FOOD.

BESIDES, HONG KONG CHILDREN TENDED TO EAT TOO MUCH MEAT, FAST FOODS, INSTANT NOODLES AND SWEETS.

"WHEN I WAS GROWING UP, CHOCOLATE WAS WHAT YOU GOT IF YOU WERE GOOD AND YOU FINISHED YOUR CEREAL. TOO OFTEN THESE DAYS, YOU GET CHOCOLATE INSTEAD OF CEREAL," SHE SAID.

MRS PATTEN ADVISED CHILDREN TO EAT MORE FRUIT AND VEGETABLES AND LESS FAT.

"WE NOW HAVE TO TURN OUR ATTENTION TO TEACHING PARENTS AND CHILDREN ABOUT A BALANCED DIET AND HEALTH EATING," SHE SAID.

SHE SAID HEALTHY EATING SHOULD START AT BIRTH. SHE MADE A PLEA TO MOTHERS TO TRY BREAST FEEDING THEIR BABIES - EVEN FOR A SHORT TIME.

IT HAS BEEN PROVED BEYOND DOUBT THAT IT IS MORE NUTRITIOUS FOR BABIES TO START THEIR LIVES ON BREAST MILK, AS OPPOSED TO FORMULA MILK. BREAST MILK PROVIDES MORE PROTECTION AGAINST MANY COMMON DISEASES, MRS PATTEN SAID.

"I BREAST FED ALL MY THREE CHILDREN AND IT WAS A MARVELLOUS EXPERIENCE," SHE SAID.

CUSTOMS PRAISED FOR ROLE IN TRADING ACTIVITIES

THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT FULFILLS AN EXTREMELY IMPORTANT ROLE IN MAINTAINING HONG KONG'S INTEGRITY AS A COMMERCIAL AND TRADING CENTRE.

TO DO THIS, IT HAS TO ADAPT CONSTANTLY TO MODERN TRENDS AND TO MAINTAIN THE FLEXIBILITY TO FACE NEW CHALLENGES.

SPEAKING AT THE CUSTOMS PASSING-OUT PARADE IN TAI LAM CHUNG THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING, LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL MEMBER, MRS MIRIAM LAU KIN-YEE, SAID SHE TOOK A KEEN PERSONAL INTEREST IN THE WORK OF THE CUSTOMS AS CHAIRMAN OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON DISCIPLINED SERVICES SALARIES AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE.

"ONE OF THE UNIQUE FEATURES OF CUSTOMS WORK IS THE COMBINED REQUIREMENT FOR PHYSICAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AND THE ABILITY TO DETECT COMPLICATED FRAUDS, IN PARTICULAR WITH REGARD TO TRADE DOCUMENTATION," SHE SAID.

SHE POINTED OUT THAT CUSTOMS PARTICIPATION IN THE ANTI-SMUGGLING TASK FORCE WAS AN EXAMPLE OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT ROLE, AND THE NEED TO PROTECT INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AND ENFORCE TEXTILE QUOTAS INVOLVED THE OTHER SIDE OF ITS WORK.

"IT IS ESSENTIAL TO FULFIL ALL THESE FUNCTIONS FOR THE BENEFIT OF HONG KONG PARTICULARLY DURING ITS TRANSITION PERIOD," SHE ADDED.

THE PASSING-OUT PARADE INSPECTED BY MRS LAU COMPRISED NINE INSPECTORS AND 63 CUSTOMS OFFICERS WHO HAVE COMPLETED A 27-WEEK AND A 13-WEEK RESIDENTIAL TRAINING RESPECTIVELY.

MRS LAU SAID THIS YEAR'S RECRUIT INTAKE WAS GREATER THAN THAT OF LAST YEAR. SHE WAS PLEASED THAT THE DISCIPLINED SERVICES WERE WILLING TO ACCEPT ADDITIONAL CHALLENGES.

THE COMMISSIONER OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE, MR CLIVE OXLEY; DEPUTY COMMISSIONER, MR TONG KANG-SING AND OTHER SENIOR OFFICERS ALSO ATTENDED THE PASSING-OUT PARADE.

BEWARE OF FOOD-BORNE DISEASES
* * * * *

SAFE FOOD, GOOD PERSONAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE ARE THE STRONGEST WEAPONS AGAINST GASTRO-INTESTINAL DISEASES, THE ACTING ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF HEALTH (HYGIENE), DR T H LEUNG, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

DR LEUNG WAS APPEALING TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO TAKE SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS AGAINST THE DISEASES WITH THE APPROACH OF SUMMER.

HE POINTED OUT THAT CHOLERA, VIRAL HEPATITIS A, DYSENTERY, TYPHOID AND FOOD POISONING WERE COMMON IN SUMMER AS A RESULT OF EATING UNCLEAN FOOD OR DRINKING UNWHOLESOME WATER.

"MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ARE STRONGLY ADVISED NOT TO PATRONISE ILLEGAL HAWKERS AND UNLICENSED FOOD PREMISES," HE SAID.

"DO NOT BUY CUT-OPENED FRUIT FROM ILLEGAL FRUIT VENDORS AS IT CAN EASILY BE CONTAMINATED."

"PEOPLE TRAVELLING TO TROPICAL COUNTRIES ARE ADVISED TO TAKE EXTRA PRECAUTIONS IN CHOOSING THEIR FOOD AND DRINKS," HE SAID.

DR LEUNG LISTED 10 POINTS FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO OBSERVE TO GUARD AGAINST GASTRO-INTESTINAL DISEASES:

- KEEP THE KITCHEN CLEAN;
- CLEAN THE CHOPPING BLOCK AND KNIFE BEFORE USE ESPECIALLY AFTER CUTTING RAW FOOD, PARTICULARLY MEAT AND POULTRY;
- USE CLEAN COOKING UTENSILS;
- WASH HANDS AFTER VISITING THE TOILET AND BEFORE PREPARING AND EATING FOOD;
- STORE IN THE REFRIGERATOR PERISHABLE FOOD NOT MEANT FOR IMMEDIATE CONSUMPTION. COOKED FOOD STORED IN THE FREEZER SHOULD BE SEPARATED FORM RAW FOOD ITEMS;

- DEFROST FOOD ONLY WHEN NEEDED;
- WASH VEGETABLES THOROUGHLY BEFORE COOKING;
- COOK FOOD, ESPECIALLY MEAT AND SHELLFISH, THOROUGHLY BEFORE CONSUMPTION;
- FOOD TO BE KEPT OVERNIGHT SHOULD BE PUT IN A REFRIGERATOR AND REHEATED THOROUGHLY BEFORE EATING; AND
- ALL GARBAGE AND WASTE SHOULD BE STORED IN A COVERED CONTAINER BEFORE DISPOSAL.

DR LEUNG STRESSED THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, THE URBAN SERVICES AND REGIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENTS WOULD CONTINUE TO TAKE POSITIVE MEASURES TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF GASTRO-INTESTINAL DISEASES THROUGH FOOD HYGIENE EDUCATION GIVEN TO LICENSEES AND STAFF IN THE FOOD TRADE.

PUBLICITY HAS ALSO BEEN STEPPED UP TO PUT ACROSS HEALTH MESSAGES TO THE PUBLIC ON FOOD, PERSONAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE, HE ADDED.

PUBLIC REMINDED OF ANTI-DRUG BADGE DESIGN CONTEST DEADLINE

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO ARE INTERESTED TO JOIN A BADGE DESIGN COMPETITION ORGANISED BY THE ACTION COMMITTEE AGAINST NARCOTICS ARE REMINDED TO SEND IN THEIR ENTRIES BY JUNE 5.

THE BADGE SHOULD BE DESIGNED ON THE THEME OF EITHER ADVISING YOUNGSTERS NOT TO ABUSE DRUGS OR REMINDING THEM OF THE IMPORTANCE OF A POSITIVE ATTITUDE TOWARDS LIFE.

THE CHAMPION OF THE COMPETITION WILL HAVE HIS OR HER DESIGN ADOPTED TO PRODUCE A CIRCULAR BADGE FOR WIDE DISTRIBUTION TO YOUNGSTERS, IN ADDITION TO A CASH AWARD OF \$10,000.

THE FIRST AND SECOND RUNNERS-UP WILL EACH BE AWARDED CASH PRIZE OF \$5,000 AND \$3,000 RESPECTIVELY WHILE 10 OUTSTANDING AWARDS WILL EACH BE GIVEN A \$300 BOOK COUPON.

"THE OBJECTIVE OF THE COMPETITION IS TO CALL FOR PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN DESIGNING A BADGE TO REMIND YOUNGSTERS OF THE DANGERS OF DRUG ABUSE, AND ENCOURAGE THEM TO TAKE UP HEALTHY PURSUITS AND SAY 'NO' TO DRUGS," A SPOKESMAN FOR THE GOVERNMENT'S NARCOTICS DIVISION SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).
