THE DIRECTOR OF CIVIL AVIATION, MR B.D. KEEP, WILL BE LEAVING HONG KONG TOMORROW (FRIDAY) TO ATTEND A MEETING OF HEADS OF CIVIL AVIATION IN ASIA AND THE PACIFIC IN FIJI NEXT WEEK.

THE FIVE-DAY MEETING SPONSORED BY THE INTERNATIONAL CIVIL AVIATION ORGANISATION WILL PROVIDE A USEFUL CHANNEL FOR THE EXCHANGE OF VIEWS BETWEEN HEADS OF CIVIL AVIATION AUTHORITIES AND GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS IN THE REGION.

TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION WILL INCLUDE AIRPORT SAFETY, OPERATION AND ECONOMY.

WELFARE CHIEF VISITS SPASTICS CENTRE

THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR SELWYN ALLEYNE, CONTINUING HIS NEW ROUND OF VISITS TO VOLUNTARY AGENCIES, WENT TO WO CHE ESTATE IN SHA TIN THIS (THURSDAY) AFTERNOON TO TOUR THE SPASTICS ASSOCIATION'S WORK CENTRE AND HOSTEL.

THE WORK CENTRE AND HOSTEL, WHICH ARE SUBVENTED BY THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, BEGAN OPERATING IN NOVEMBER LAST YEAR, PROVIDING SIMPLE MANUAL TASKS FOR MULTIPLE-HANDICAPPED ADULTS WHO FAIL TO BE ADMITTED TO OTHER WORKSHOPS.

THE CENTRE HAS A CAPACITY OF 100, WITH RESIDENTIAL SERVICE FOR 36.

TRAINING IS TO HELP THE PEOPLE BUILD UP THEIR PERSONAL AND SOCIAL CONFIDENCE AND FREE TRANSPORT IS PROVIDED FOR DAY WORKERS AND FREE LUNCH FOR ALL IN THE CENTRE.

THERE IS A RECREATION CENTRE WHERE THE DISABLED ARE ENCOURAGED TO INTEGRATE WITH THE ABLE-BODIED.

MR ALLEYNE WAS ACCOMPANIED DURING THE VISIT BY THE DISTRICT SOCIAL WELFARE OFFICER (SHA TIN/TAI PO/NORTH), MR CHEUNG HON-LEUNG, AND OFFICIALS OF THE SPASTICS ASSOCIATION.

SEMINAR TO ACQUAINT TEACHERS WITH NEW SYLLABUS

GEOGRAPHY TEACHERS IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS ARE WELCOME TO TAKE PART IN A SEMINAR ON THE NEW HONG KONG HIGHER LEVEL GEOGRAPHY CURRICULUM TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 28.

THE AIM OF THE SEMINAR IS TO FAMILIARISE TEACHERS WITH NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN GEOGRAPHY AS WELL AS WITH SOME OF THE MODERN GEOGRAPHICAL CONCEPTS LISTED IN THE 1983 HONG KONG HIGHER LEVEL GEOGRAPHY EXAMINATION SYLLABUS.

LECTURES WILL BE CONDUCTED BY DR YEE LEUNG OF THE DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY, THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG.

TOPICS OF THE LECTURES WILL INCLUDE NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN GEOGRAPHY, MODERN CONCEPTS IN INDUSTRIAL LOCATION ANALYSIS, AND AN EXPLANATORY NOTE ON THE 1983 HIGHER LEVEL GEOGRAPHY EXAMINATION SYLLABUS. EACH LECTURE WILL BE FOLLOWED BY A DISCUSSION SESSION.

INSTRUCTION WILL BE MAINLY IN CANTONESE.

THE SEMINAR WILL BE HELD FROM 9.15 AM TO 12.30 PM AT THE LECTURE THEATRE OF GRANTHAM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION IN KOWLOON.

SIX NT SITES FOR AUCTION
* * *

THE NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION IS TO OFFER SIX SITES TOTALLING 22 256 SQUARE METRES FOR SALE BY PUBLIC AUCTION AT THE END OF THIS MONTH.

THE AUCTION WILL BE HELD AT THE SHOUSON THEATRE, HONG KONG ARTS CENTRE, ON NOVEMBER 27 (FRIDAY) STARTING AT 11 AM.

ONE SITE IS IN TAI PO, THREE ARE IN TUEN MUN AND TWO ARE IN YUEN LONG.

THE TAI PO SITE, MEASURING 5 204 SQUARE METRES, IS FOR NON-INDUSTRIAL USE AND IS IN WHAT WILL BE THE NEW TOWN CENTRE. THE PLOT RATIO FOR RESIDENTIAL AREAS IS 4.74 AND FOR NON-RESIDENTIAL AREAS 0.49. THE BUILDING COVENANT IS \$32 MILLION TO BE COMPLETED WITHIN FOUR YEARS.

ANOTHER NON-INDUSTRIAL SITE, LOCATED IN THE FUTURE TUEN MUN NEW TOWN CENTRE, MEASURES 3 512 SQUARE METRES. IT HAS A FOUR-YEAR BUILDING COVENANT OF \$45 MILLION. THE TOTAL FLOOR AREA OF RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS TO BE ERECTED ON THE SITE SHOULD NOT EXCEED 17 560 SQUARE METRES.

ONE OF THE YUEN LONG SITES AND THE OTHER TWO TUEN MUN SITES ARE FOR INDUSTRIAL/GODOWN DEVELOPMENT.

THE YUEN LONG SITE, MEASURING 7 271 SQUARE METRES, IS IN THE INDUSTRIAL AREA. THERE IS A LIMIT OF 36 355 SQUARE METRES ON THE TOTAL FLOOR AREA TO BE DEVELOPED AND THE BUILDING COVENANT OF \$35 MILLION IS TO BE COMPLETED WITHIN FOUR YEARS.

BOTH THE TUEN MUN SITES ARE SITUATED NEAR SHEK PAI TAU AND MEASURE 1 630 SQUARE METRES AND 1 459 SQUARE METRES. THEY HAVE A MAXIMUM PLOT RATIO OF 9.5 AND THE BUILDING COVENANT FOR THE LARGER SITE IS \$15.14 MILLION AND FOR THE SMALLER SITE \$12.77 MILLION, BOTH TO BE FULFILLED WITHIN FOUR YEARS.

THE REMAINING SITE, IN YUEN LONG INDUSTRIAL AREA, IS FOR GODOWN PURPOSES. IT ALSO HAS A MAXIMUM PLOT RATIO OF 9.5 AND A FOUR-YEAR BUILDING COVENANT OF \$29 MILLION.

MENTAL HEALTH DISPLAY

AN EXHIBITION TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ON HOW TO ACHIEVE GOOD MENTAL HEALTH WILL BE MOUNTED BY THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT FROM TOMORROW (FRIDAY) AT TSUEN WAN TOWN HALL TILL THE FOLLOWING MONDAY (NOVEMBER 9) BETWEEN 10 AM AND 4 PM DAILY.

CO-SPONSORING THE EXHIBITION ARE THE HONG KONG PSYCHIATRIC ASSOCIATION, THE MENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION AND THE NEW LIFE PSYCHIATRIC REHABILITATION ASSOCIATION.

THE PURPOSE OF THE EXHIBITION IS TO ILLUSTRATE, THROUGH AUDIO-VISUAL MATERIALS, THE CAUSES OF MENTAL ILLNESSES, AND THE AVAILABILITY OF TREATMENT FACILITIES AND REHABILITATIVE SERVICES FOR THE MENTALLY HANDICAPPED.

THIS IS THE THIRD SUCH EXHIBITION TO BE HELD WITHIN TWO MONTHS IN SUPPORT OF THE INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF DISABLED PERSONS. A SIMILAR EXHIBITION WAS HELD IN CITY HALL AND THEN KWAI CHUNG HOSPITAL LAST MONTH ATTRACTING THOUSANDS OF VISITORS.

TWO PAMPHLETS ENTITLED +THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES IN HONG KONG+ AND +DEALING WITH STRESS+ WILL BE DISTRIBUTED AT THE EXHIBITION.

ELECTRONICS JOB MANUAL REVISED

THE ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY TRAINING BOARD OF THE HONG KONG TRAINING COUNCIL HAS REVISED ITS MANUAL OF JOB STANDARDS PUBLISHED IN 1976.

THE REVISED MANUAL CONTAINS RECOMMENDED JOB STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR SEVEN TECHNOLOGIST, EIGHT TECHNICIAN AND 10 CRAFT JOBS IN THE ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE BOARD SAID TODAY (THURSDAY) THAT THE MANUAL IS AIMED AT ESTABLISHING STANDARDS OF KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS FOR PRINCIPAL JOBS IN THE ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY, HELPING EMPLOYERS TO DRAW UP SYSTEMATIC AND PRACTICAL ON-THE-JOB TRAINING PROGRAMMES FOR THEIR APPRENTICES/TRAINEES AND PROVIDING GUIDELINES FOR TECHNICAL INSTITUTIONS IN THE PLANNING OF RELEVANT COURSES.

THEY ARE FUNG WING-KIT AND PAK WING-HANG FROM THE RECREATION AND CULTURE DEPARTMENT'S MUSIC OFFICE, JOHN CHENG FROM THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, AND ISAO MURAMATSU OF THE SHUJITSU GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL BAND OF JAPAN.

THE TWO BANDS ARE THE HONG KONG YOUTH SYMPHONIC BAND AND THE SHUJITSU GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL BAND.

THE HONG KONG SYMPHONIC BAND WILL PLAY THE FANFARE FROM +LA PERE+ BY PAUL DUKAS, ONE OF THE MOST SPARKLING FANFARES COMPOSED THIS CENTURY.
