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RESULTS OF JSEA TO BE RELEASED ON TUESDAY  
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THE RESULTS OF THIS YEAR'S JUNIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION ASSESSMENT (JSEA) WILL BE RELEASED ON TUESDAY (JULY 15). A TOTAL OF 74 621 PUPILS ENTERED FOR THE JSEA SYSTEM THIS YEAR.

SOME 2 726 PUPILS ACCEPTED PLACES ON FULL TIME CRAFT COURSES IN THE TECHNICAL INSTITUTES, INDUSTRY TRAINING CENTRES AND CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY TRAINING CENTRES WHILE THE OTHER 1 470 OPTED OUT DURING THE YEAR.

OF THE OTHER 70 425 PARTICIPATING PUPILS, 74.88 PER CENT HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED SUBSIDISED FORM 4 AND MIDDLE 4 PLACES, A EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

AMONG THOSE PUPILS ALLOCATED SUBSIDISED FORM 4 AND MIDDLE 4 PLACES, MORE THAN 85.63 PER CENT HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED BACK TO THEIR OWN 'FEEDER' SCHOOLS.

A TOTAL OF 87.07 PER CENT OF PUPILS WERE ALLOCATED TO SCHOOLS OF THEIR FIRST CHOICES (86.5 PER CENT IN 1985 AND 84.6 PER CENT IN 1984) WHILE A TOTAL OF 98.57 PER CENT WERE ALLOCATED TO SCHOOLS WITHIN THEIR CHOICES (97.9 PER CENT IN 1985 AND 97.3 IN 1984).

REGISTRATION OF FEEDER PUPILS (I.E. PUPILS ALLOCATED PLACES IN THEIR OWN SCHOOLS) WILL TAKE PLACE ON TUESDAY (JULY 15). PUPILS ARE REMINDED THAT THEY SHOULD LEAVE THEIR REGISTRATION FORMS WITH THE SCHOOL OFFICE.

PUPILS WHO HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED TO OTHER SCHOOLS SHOULD REPORT FOR REGISTRATION ON WEDNESDAY, JULY 16. WHEN REPORTING FOR REGISTRATION, PUPILS SHOULD BRING THE FOLLOWING : (A) PUPIL IDENTIFICATION FORM= (B) REGISTRATION FORM= (C) INDIVIDUAL RESULT SLIP= (D) PUPIL'S HONG KONG IDENTITY CARD= AND (E) TWO RECENT PASSPORT-SIZE PHOTOGRAPHS AND A SUFFICIENT AMOUNT OF MONEY UP TO ABOUT ONE MONTH'S SCHOOL FEE WHICH MAY BE REQUIRED BY THE SCHOOL FOR REGISTRATION PURPOSES.

PUPILS WHO HAVE ACCEPTED A PLACE OFFERED BY INDUSTRY TRAINING CENTRES, TECHNICAL INSTITUTES, AND CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY TRAINING CENTRES SHOULD REPORT FOR REGISTRATION ON WEDNESDAY (JULY 16), FRIDAY (JULY 18) AND THURSDAY (JULY 31) RESPECTIVELY.

IF A PUPIL IS UNABLE TO COLLECT HIS ALLOCATION RESULT OR GO FOR REGISTRATION ON JULY 15 OR JULY 16, THE PARENT OR PARENTS SHOULD AUTHORISE, IN WRITING, A REPRESENTATIVE TO COLLECT THE RESULT OR REPORT TO THE SCHOOL FOR REGISTRATION ON HIS BEHALF. THE LETTER OF AUTHORISATION MUST HAVE BEEN ENDORSED BY THE ORIGINAL SCHOOL. IT SHOULD BE PRODUCED AT THE TIME OF COLLECTION OR REGISTRATION BY THE APPOINTED REPRESENTATIVE.

/IN REGISTERING .....

IN REGISTERING WITH A SCHOOL, A PUPIL MUST SURRENDER HIS REGISTRATION FORM TO THE SCHOOL. IN THE EVENT OF A SUBSEQUENT TRANSFER, THE PUPIL MUST RETRIEVE HIS REGISTRATION FORM FROM THE ORIGINAL SCHOOL WHICH WILL THEN CANCEL HIS REGISTRATION IN THAT SCHOOL.

+SCHOOLS MAY NOT ADMIT ANY PUPIL WITHOUT HIS REGISTRATION FORM,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

PUPILS WHO HAVE MOVED TO ANOTHER DISTRICT AND WISH TO TRANSFER TO A SCHOOL NEARER TO HIS NEW RESIDENCE AFTER ALLOCATION MUST COMPLETE AN APPLICATION FORM WHICH IS AVAILABLE FROM THE SCHOOL IN WHICH HE COMPLETED HIS FORM/MIDDLE 3. THE COMPLETED FORM MUST BE RETURNED TO THE SCHOOL FOR ONWARD TRANSMISSION TO THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT. APPLICATION FOR TRANSFER WILL CLOSE ON FRIDAY (JULY 18), BY 5 PM AND ALL APPLICATIONS MUST BE SUPPORTED BY DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE.

PUPILS REALLOCATED TO OTHER SCHOOLS WILL BE NOTIFIED BY TELEPHONE FROM 9 AM TO 5 PM ON JULY 21. REGISTRATION OF TRANSFERRED PUPILS WILL TAKE PLACE ON WEDNESDAY (JULY 23).

PUPILS WHO ARE NOT ALLOCATED A SUBSIDISED FORM/MIDDLE 4 PLACE WILL BE PROVIDED WITH AN INFORMATION SHEET OUTLINING THE ALTERNATIVE OPPORTUNITIES OPEN TO THEM. THE SHEET CONTAINS ADDRESSES AND THE TELEPHONE NUMBERS FROM WHICH PUPILS MAY OBTAIN FURTHER INFORMATION. PAMPHLETS ON COURSES OFFERED BY CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY TRAINING CENTRES AND INDUSTRY TRAINING CENTRES WILL ALSO BE ISSUED TO EACH PUPIL NOT ALLOCATED A SUBSIDISED F/M 4 PLACE.

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NEW HONG KONG EXHIBITION IN LONDON

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THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH AFFAIRS, MR TIMOTHY RENTON, WILL OPEN THE NEW HONG KONG EXHIBITION AT THE COMMONWEALTH INSTITUTE IN LONDON ON JULY 16 (WEDNESDAY).

THE EXHIBITION WILL HIGHLIGHT CONTEMPORARY HONG KONG AND DEVELOPMENTS THAT HAVE TAKEN PLACE FOLLOWING THE SIGNING OF THE SINO-BRITISH AGREEMENT ON THE FUTURE OF THE TERRITORY. IT COVERS EVERY ASPECT OF HONG KONG'S ECONOMIC, SOCIAL, POLITICAL AND CULTURAL LIFE, USING EYE-CATCHING PHOTOGRAPHS, GRAPHICS AND MODELS.

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A MULTI-IMAGE SLIDE TECHNIQUE AUDIO-VISUAL SHOW WITH SIX PROJECTORS OPERATING AT THE SAME TIME WILL ALSO FORM PART OF THE EXHIBITION.

GUESTS AT THE OPENING, WHO WILL INCLUDE MP'S., PEERS, CIVIC DIGNITARIES, LEADING BUSINESSMEN AND INDUSTRIALISTS AND MEMBERS OF THE CHINESE COMMUNITY IN THE U.K., WILL BE WELCOMED BY THE HONG KONG COMMISSIONER, MR COLVYN HAYE.

THEY WILL BE ENTERTAINED TO PERFORMANCES OF TRADITIONAL CHINESE DANCES BY THE HONG KONG SCHOOLS' CHINESE DANCE TEAM WHO HAVE BEEN SPECIALLY INVITED TO TAKE PART IN THE EVENING RECEPTION WHICH WILL BE HELD TO MARK THE OPENING. THEIR PROGRAMME WILL INCLUDE +PICKING HERBS+ +WATER FAIRIES+, +SPRING+ AND +SWORD DANCE+.

THE EXHIBITION WILL ILLUSTRATE HONG KONG'S ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY, TRADE AND INDUSTRY AS WELL AS THE EFFORTS THAT ARE BEING MADE TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE.

THE MAIN THRUST OF THE EXHIBITION, INCLUDING THE AUDIO-VISUAL SHOW, IS TO HIGHLIGHT ITS LIFE-STYLE, THE VIBRANCY OF THE TERRITORY AND ITS ECONOMIC SUCCESSES.

THE NEW HONG KONG EXHIBITION REPLACES THE LAST ONE WHICH HAD BEEN IN PLACE SINCE 1982. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT ABOUT 500 000 PEOPLE VISIT THE COMMONWEALTH INSTITUTE EVERY YEAR.

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TRADE DECLARATION FORMS BEING REVISED  
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THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT IS TO INTRODUCE NEW IMPORT AND EXPORT DECLARATION FORMS NEXT YEAR.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID THAT WITH EFFECT FROM JANUARY 1, 1987, THE EXISTING IMPORT DECLARATION FORM 1 (CED 50), EXPORT/RE-EXPORT DECLARATION FORM 2 (CED 51) AND EXPORT DECLARATION FORM 3 (CED 52) WILL BE REVISED.

THE EXPORT DECLARATION FORM 3 FOR THE EXPORT OF HONG KONG-MADE CLOTHING (INCLUDING FOOTWEAR ITEMS) IS TO BE REPLACED BY THE EXPORT DECLARATION FORM 2A. FOR THE EXPORT AND RE-EXPORT OF ITEMS OTHER THAN HONG KONG-MADE CLOTHING, THE REVISED EXPORT/RE-EXPORT DECLARATION FORM 2 WILL HAVE TO BE USED.

THE IMPORT DECLARATION FORM 1, CURRENTLY USED FOR THE IMPORT OF ALL ITEMS, WILL BE REVISED AND ITS USE WILL BE LIMITED TO THE IMPORT OF ALL GOODS OTHER THAN FOOD ITEMS AS FROM JANUARY 1, 1987 WHEN A NEW IMPORT DECLARATION FORM - FORM 1A - WILL BE INTRODUCED FOR THE IMPORT OF FOOD ITEMS.

/IN VIEW OF .....

IN VIEW OF THE IMPENDING CHANGES, IMPORTERS AND EXPORTERS ARE ADVISED TO RUN DOWN THEIR STOCK OF THE EXISTING DECLARATION FORMS, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

UNDER THE LAW, IMPORTERS AND EXPORTERS ARE REQUIRED TO LODGE IMPORT OR EXPORT DECLARATIONS WITH THE CUSTOMS IN SPECIFIED FORMS WITHIN 14 DAYS AFTER THE IMPORT OR EXPORT OF THE GOODS.

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EXHIBITION ON MORAL EDUCATION IN SCHOOLS  
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A THREE-DAY EXHIBITION ON MORAL EDUCATION IN SCHOOLS ENTITLED +THE QUALITIES OF A GOOD CITIZEN+ WILL BE ORGANISED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

TEACHERS ARE INVITED TO VISIT THE EXHIBITION WHICH STARTS ON WEDNESDAY (JULY 16) AT THE HO MAN TIN GOVERNMENT MIDDLE SCHOOL, 8 PERTH STREET.

THE OPENING HOURS OF THE EXHIBITION WILL BE FROM 10.30 AM TO 4.30 PM ON WEDNESDAY (JULY 16) AND FROM 9 AM TO 4.30 PM ON THE OTHER TWO DAYS.

IT IS AIMED AT FAMILIARISING TEACHERS WITH APPROACHES TO USE AND MATERIALS FOR MORAL EDUCATION AND TO HEIGHTEN THEIR AWARENESS OF THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN CIVIC EDUCATION AND MORAL EDUCATION.

THE EXHIBITION IS A JOINT VENTURE OF 16 SECONDARY AND PRIMARY SCHOOLS AND THE FOUR COLLEGES OF EDUCATION. THE BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB ASSOCIATION OF HONG KONG, THE ICAC AND SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT ARE ALSO AMONG PARTICIPANTS OF THE EXHIBITION.

THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION (CHIEF INSPECTOR OF SCHOOLS), MR SO FAI-CHO, WILL OFFICIATE AT A CEREMONY TO MARK THE OPENING ON WEDNESDAY.

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MR LAM WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE CENTRAL AND WESTERN SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME THIS AFTERNOON AT THE CHATER ROAD PEDESTRIAN PRECINCT.

HE HOPED THAT THROUGH THE ORGANISING OF THE FESTIVAL EVENTS, LOCAL RESIDENTS WOULD BE ABLE TO GET TO KNOW THEIR DISTRICT BETTER AND ENHANCE THEIR SENSE OF BELONGING.

ON THE SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME, MR LAM SAID THAT MOST OF THE 500 ACTIVITIES UNDER THE PROGRAMME HAD BEEN DESIGNED TO INCORPORATE THE CENTRAL THEME OF +CARE FOR THE COMMUNITY, GET TO KNOW IT BETTER+, APART FROM THE RECREATIONAL AND SPORTS ASPECTS.

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NEWS TRANSLATION COURSE FOR JOURNALISTS

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ILLEGAL SHRINES TO BE CLEARED  
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TWO ILLEGAL SHRINES AT LEE ON ROAD IN KWUN TONG, WHICH HAVE BEEN THE SUBJECT OF COMPLAINTS FROM LOCAL RESIDENTS, WILL BE CLEARED SHORTLY.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT OFFICE SAID THE TWO SHRINES WITH TABLETS WERE NOT ONLY CAUSING OBSTRUCTION TO PEDESTRIANS BUT WERE ALSO CREATING ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS AND FIRE HAZARDS.

+THEY ARE BUILT ILLEGALLY AT TWO SEPARATE LOCATIONS AT LEE ON ROAD FACING THE SHUN TIN BUS TERMINUS AND THE SHUN ON RESTAURANT.+

THE SPOKESMAN STRESSED THAT IT IS AN OFFENCE IN LAW TO BUILD ILLEGAL STRUCTURES ON CROWN LAND AND APPEALED TO RESIDENTS NOT TO RE-ESTABLISH SIMILAR SHRINES IN THE AREA.

THE CLEARANCE OPERATION WILL BE CARRIED OUT JOINTLY BY THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT OFFICE, THE BUILDINGS AND LANDS DEPARTMENT, THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT AND THE POLICE.

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USD'S +TREE DOCTORS+ PLAY THEIR PART  
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APART FROM ITS EXTENSIVE TREE PLANTING PROGRAMME, THE URBAN COUNCIL PAYS EQUAL ATTENTION TO TREE CONSERVANCY IN THE URBAN AREA AS ANOTHER ASPECT OF ITS EFFORTS IN GREENING OUR CITY.

+THE COUNCIL FIRMLY BELIEVES THAT A GOOD TREE PLANTING PROGRAMME MUST BE SUPPLEMENTED BY A COMPREHENSIVE CONSERVANCY SCHEME,+ SAID A COUNCIL SPOKESMAN TODAY.

THIS CONSERVANCY SCHEME IS CARRIED OUT BY THE USD'S TREE SECTIONS ON EITHER SIDE OF THE HARBOUR.

+A TOTAL OF 6 144 TREES WERE PLANTED AND 181 TRANSPLANTED BY THE TWO SECTIONS IN 1985/86,+ SAID THE SPOKESMAN.

+TRANSPLANTING OPERATIONS ARE CARRIED OUT WHEREVER IT IS POSSIBLE TO SAVE TREES THAT MUST MAKE WAY FOR CONSTRUCTION OF HIGHWAYS, BUILDINGS AND OTHER COMMUNITY PROJECTS.

+HOWEVER, IT IS NOT POSSIBLE TO SAVE ALL TREES BY TRANSPLANTING AS THIS DEPENDS ON THE CONDITION OF THE TREE IN QUESTION AND ITS SUITABILITY FOR TRANSPLANTING.+

THE TREE' .....

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THE TREE SECTIONS ALSO TAKE CARE OF THE HEALTH OF TREES IN ALL URBAN COUNCIL PARKS, OPEN SPACES, STADIA, GOVERNMENT COMPOUNDS, ROADSIDES AND WITHIN FIVE METRES OF HIGHWAY KERBS.

+PRUNING AND TRIMMING ARE CARRIED OUT REGULARLY TO ENSURE THAT TREES CAN GROW HEALTHILY AND BECOME LESS VULNERABLE TO STRONG WINDS AND RAINSTORMS,+ SAID THE SPOKESMAN.

+DEAD BRANCHES ARE CUT, TREE HOLES ARE MENDED AND DISEASES ARE TREATED WITH CHEMICALS AND INSECTICIDES.+

— MEANWHILE, EVEN THE DEAD BRANCHES ARE PUT TO GOOD USE — THANKS TO TWO RECENTLY PURCHASED WOOD-CHIPPING MACHINES.

THESE CONVERT BRANCHES INTO WOOD CHIPS AND THE END PRODUCT IS USED AS MULCH FOR FLOWER BEDS AND AS MATTING IN CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUNDS.

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KAI TAK AEROBRIDGES TO BE REPLACED  
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THE FIXED AND MOVING AEROBRIDGES AT THREE PARKING BAYS AT KAI TAK AIRPORT ARE TO BE REPLACED.

THE ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS TO REMOVE THE EXISTING MODELS AND SUPPLY AND INSTALL NEW ONES.

THE SUCCESSFUL TENDERER WILL SUPPLY THE AEROBRIDGES FOR BAYS NOS. 6, 7 AND 8.

THERE ARE ALTOGETHER 16 AEROBRIDGES IN USE AT THE AIRPORT, LINKING AIRCRAFT WITH THE TERMINAL BUILDING, BUT ONLY SIX NEED TO BE REPLACED BECAUSE THEIR MANUFACTURER HAS CEASED PRODUCTION.

THE REPLACEMENT WORK IS SCHEDULED TO START AT THE END OF NEXT YEAR AND BE COMPLETED BY THE MIDDLE OF 1988.
